- KNNH639 OR **Ashland** – 12/22 0850 – Oregon DoT HAR. Information on I-5 at CA/OR border: "You are approaching Siskiyou Pass... the speed limit is 55 miles per hour. For a list of closed roads call 1-800-977-6368." Easily recognized this station since we spent a few days in that area about 6 months ago. (TRH-CA1)
- 1710 Pirate -- 1/12 0206 – Soft strumming guitar music, a pirate other than Baton Rouge LA? Announcement at 0210 sounds like SS, and I hear a "siete" mentioned, perhaps referring to their 107.1 FM frequency (not really busted and off?). By 0218 voice changes to something more strident, which would be the usual gospel huxter from Radio Retén lo que Tienes. Certainly holding on to what they've got, legal or not. (GH-OK)
- 1810 WKYW KY **Frankfort** – 1/10 1949 – Carrier, seems to be pulsing a bit. Thanks to Don Moman who forwarded a current Topband thread about this; soon IDd as WKYW-1490, OLD format, somehow radiating in the 160m ham band, with many hams on the case, hearing it much stronger all over east America. Another thread figured it was someone relaying WKYW, gone an hour later. (GH-OK)

Tim also notes: There is a new TIS station on 1710 kHz near Los Alamos, NM! (White Rock, NM – Bandelier National Monument, operated by the National Park Service). I found them all over my Border Inn recordings. I haven't heard any call letters, but the announcer seemed to say something like "this is WRSV" on one of my Border Inn recordings.

- 1300 UnID -- 12/29 0912 – Old-fashioned gospel huxter wrapping it up with a prayer, program ID as "Word of Prophecy," address Jacksonville FL. Program web site at wordofprophecy.org has everything but a station list! Definitely loops east/west, but format doesn't fit the TX, AR, or even CO stations on 1300. Maybe WNQM-1300, which does not post a schedule online, but does have a list of programs (not including Word of Prophecy). (GH-OK)

Mike.*
- WCHE PA **West Chester** – 1/2 1645* – Heard mixing with WTNE, with ID for WCHE, West Chester, and a full data sign off followed by instrumental SSB, new here! **(TF-NH)**
- 1540 WACA MD **Wheaton** – 1/1 1500 – Good over WWGK Cleveland, OH with Spanish ad cluster and legal ID: "Doh-ble-vay Ah Seh Ah quince-cuarenta Ah Eh-may. Radio America transmittiendo desde Wheaton Maryland." Woman talking in SS until abruptly lost at 1515 with probable switch to critical hours power. Previously logged as WDON in December 1963 and as WMDO in March 1989. **(REH-ON)**
- 1540 WADK RI **Newport** – 1/2 1625 – Discussion about attracting customers, ads for Dwyer's Insurance, Relief facts, and a furniture store at 56 Main Street in downtown Newport. Mixed with CHIN, and WXEX, with powerhouse WDCD silent, 1540 has been opened up a little here. **(TF-NH)**
- 1570 WBGZ IL **Alton** – 1/2 2252 – Heard talk in station mix, clear ID at 2254 "1570 WBGZ," more talk. Very poor in station mix. **(PS-ON)**

- WFLR NY Dundee** – 12/31 0326 – Mentions of Finger Lakes and a local ad touting customers from Rochester and other nearby NY cities. Then into C&W music. Very nice ID at 0336, "W-F-L-R" and then a mention of Blake Shelton. **(JW-PA)**
- 1590 WHGT MD Maugansville** – 1/12 1700 – Through local WSMN open carrier; "This is a beacon of hope...Cumberland Valley, WHGT Maugansville, Maryland, 1590 AM," and address for listener support, "WHGT, 16221 National Pike, Hagerstown, Maryland 21740," into SRN news. **(BC-NH)**
- 1610 CHHA ON Toronto** – 1/8 0347 – Non-stop dance music. Choppy with significant fading at times. No IDs, news, announcements or ads right on through 0500. Seamless transitions from song to song, all with same beat and basic structure. "Alright" by Jeff Afrozila, "So Long" by Dahi Hates Disco, "No Time to Fall" by Radiolab, "Send Me" by Distant People and Stephanie Cooke, amongst many others. Took a while to identify, finally found the internet stream on their website. Likely CHRN underneath with subcontinental music. **(JW-PA)**
- 1650 KCNZ IA Cedar Falls** – 12/30 0529 – CBS Sports promo, poor under multiple thingies. **(TLK-FL)**
- 1690 WPTX MD Lexington Park** – 12/31 0419 – Again clearly on day power, with ID's, station promos, national product ads, into Oldies. Crushing WMLB at times. **(TLK-FL)**

Unreported Domestic Stations

Seven stations reported to DDXD this issue were reported for the first time since at least Volume 67 (1999-2000): CFCW-840, KURY-910, KVSM-1380, KCNR-1460, KOSJ-1490, WFXV-1490, and KWBC-1550. That drops the number of currently licensed stations in the United States and Canada that haven't been reported to DDXD in that timeframe to 383. The full list was last printed in issue 84-18. Can you log and report one next issue?

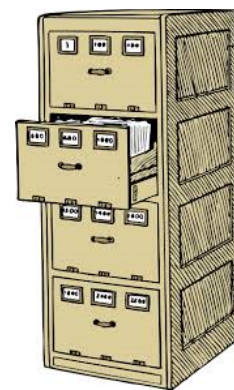
75 Years Ago – From the January 9, 1943 issue of *DX News*: A couple of juicy Canadians on the DX Test Calendar: CHPS-1450 ON & CJFX-580 in beautiful Antigonish, NS. Four graveyarders on the docket: WGIL-1400 IL, WTCM-1400 MI, WSRR-1400 CT, & KBUR-1490 IA. New Mexico's Norm Maguire logged TAs Hilversum-995, Bordeaux-1070, Toulouse-913/778, & Moorside Edge-668. The Foreign DX Contest was cancelled because it's feared the Post Office censors will confiscate overseas veries! (WWII ongoing.) Bulletin had 3 pages of SW DX highlighted by receptions of Palau, Caroline Islands in the Pacific and Aden on the Arabian Peninsula by Bud Kopp in IL.

50 Years Ago – From the January 13, 1968 issue of *DX News*: 100-watt WSAJ-1340 PA, which only broadcasts 5 hours a week (!), is DX Testing for NRC Member Dennis Waters, a newsman/DJ at WLCY-1380 FL said they've received letters on NRC letterheads & CPC mastheads threatening to report WLCY to the FCC for NOT verifying reports! VOUS-1480 NF-CAN 50 watter among GENE Delorenzo's MA loggings on his brother Mark's HQ129X. Ken Chatterton (NYS) heard the 4VEC-890 Haiti DX Test, as did many others; Ken says he does not send tentative reports.

25 Years Ago – From the January 18, 1993 issue of *DX News*: DX Tests from KEYZ-600 ND & KOFI-1180 MT give DXers a rare opportunity for two rare states. KCNO-570 CA test logged by Rick Dau in Iowa, his first 'regional' CA catch. (R1000 rx & Radio West loop). Shawn Axelrod MB-CAN snagged MT GYs KRBN & KCVK-1450, as well as Utahans KEYY & KBFI-1450. Karl Forth in IL caught the WNTK-1020 NH DX Test thru KDKA. (Karl-HQ160/R70 loop). Mike Brooker-ON, CAN provided a picture of the Toronto/Hamilton AM Radio Market: 1930- 8 AM frequencies (1120 kc the highest). 1948- 7 frequencies (1150 highest) & 1992 16 stations (highest 1540).

10 Years Ago – From the January 11, 2008 issue of *DX News*: William J. Prater of Grimsley, TN reported a number of Latin American stations, specifically Costa Rica & Colombia with Christmas Morning broadcasts. Sadly, he died in a Federal penitentiary having been convicted in a union murder plot (Editor's note – I had corresponded with him in his pre-prison days; he couldn't have been nicer to this than teenage DXer). John Wilkins reports 15 Denver area AM stations running IBOC rendering 45+ frequencies un-DXable! Dave Larrabee of MD DXed from East Corinth, ME & listed these ME stations to drool over: WFST-600, WJAE1440, WEGP-1390 & NHs WEZS-1340, WMYF-1380, & WLTN-1400.

- 1521 **SAUDI ARABIA** *SBC R.Riyadh, Duba* DEC 15 2130 - Soft-voiced man, "Bali Hai" tune from "South Pacific" on violins with percussion accompaniment; good. [Connelly-MA]
- 1548 **MOLDOVA** *TWR Grigoriopol* DEC 21 2100 - *TWR* musical box interval signal; fair.{A} [Connelly-MA]

PAN-AMERICAN DX

- 540 **MEXICO** *XEHS La Mejor, Los Mochis, Sin.* DEC 22 1358 - AM/FM ID by male announcer. Still uses slogan "la mejor, aquí nomás." This is one of several syndicated "formats" which appear to be more of a marketing/branding service (pre-recorded ID's, standard look and feel for website, etc.) as opposed to a 24-hour feed of network programming. Soon lost to Mexican anthem presumably from XESURF. [Hall-CA1]
- 560 **MEXICO** *XESRD La Tremenda, Santiago Papasquiaro, Dgo.* JAN 5 1202 - Appeared suddenly in the middle of instrumental (orchestral) anthem, as if they had just gone to day power. Still uses "la tremenda" slogan. [Hall-CA]
- 560 **MEXICO** unID JAN 5 1200 - Mexican anthem played by brass band. At 1202:20, right after the anthem had finished, a male announcer said "Buenos dias, a____" and was immediately clobbered by XESRD. Checked the web streams of other stations to see who has the brass band version of the anthem. So far, I have heard no morning anthem on XEOC's web stream, nor on XEMZA's (and I suspect they have finished moving to FM). XEGIK runs a choral version of the anthem. That only leaves unneeded XEYO, which should run the anthem an hour later. Need to keep monitoring XEOC and XEMZA web streams. [Hall-CA]



- 580 **MEXICO** XEMU Piedras Negras, Coah. JAN 3 1241 - Gal with weather, temperatures in both Celsius and Fahrenheit; then into ranchera music and "La Rancherita del Aire" slogans; ads noted later at 1254. Generally fair in WIBW null with typical fading. [Wilkins-CO]
- 630 **MEXICO** unID JAN 5 1200 - High choral version of Mexican anthem. Had noted classical music a few minutes earlier, so this is almost certainly unneeded XEPBGL. Have been trying to catch parallel 1080 XEPBPV as logged at the Border Inn a year or two ago, but 1080 is a difficult channel here due to 1070 KNX IBOC and 50 kW local 1090 XEPRS slop. [Hall-CA]
- 630 **PUERTO RICO** WUNO San Juan DEC 24 2200 - Puerto Rico news; over WPRO, Portugal. [Connelly-MA]
- 640 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, La Habana-Guanabacoa//Las Tunas-Jobabo DEC 11 2300 - ID, "Radio Progreso, cadena nacional, desde la Habana, Cuba"; mixed with WMEN Florida.{A} [Connelly-MA]
- 660 unID JAN 5 1200 - Station way under KTNN seemed to be using "Ke Buena" slogan. That's a previous slogan for XEWX, but I've been monitoring their web stream and they do not appear to still be using that slogan. XEEY is the station I would usually expect to hear under KTNN. [Hall-CA]
- 690 **CUBA** *R.Progreso*, Santa Clara//Santiago de Cuba DEC 11 2300 - ID, "Transmite Radio Progreso, cadena nacional, desde la Habana, Cuba," single chime; over WQNO New Orleans.{A} [Connelly-MA]
- 690 **MEXICO** XEMA Fresnillo, Zac. DEC 29 0430 - Spanish language Mexican style music, XEMA ID, and more music. Fair at times over CKGM to very poor. Hearing WQNO here as well tonight. Parallel to Tune In stream. [Snider-ON]
- 700 **MEXICO** XEGD Chihuahua, Chih. JAN 5 1323 - During news, time check, "6:23 en la capital del mundo, Parral." More timecheck for 6:24, 6:25, temp 4 grados. I am hearing this only by nulling much stronger XEETCH which is further west. By 1334 it's gone while XEETCH is still in. Hidalgo del Parral sunrise not until 1353 UTC. Enid LSR is now at its latest of the year, 1344 UTC. [Hauser-OK]
- 700 **MEXICO** XEETCH *La Voz de los Tres Ríos*, Etchojoa, Son. JAN 5 1300 - Unusual version of Mexican anthem (a group of children singing out of key and out of time with the orchestral accompaniment), ID by female announcer mentioned 5 kW. [Hall-CA] JAN 5 1323 - Always neat rustic fiddle and guitar music, good signal from west/southwest, 1326 pause for ad/PSA string including: Banco de México, Secretaría de Salud re vaccinations, Ricardo Anaya, PAN candidate; INE about independent candidates; full ID for XEETCH Etchojoa, Sonora, location at km 27 on road from Navojoa, "5 mil wats en 700 de AM y internet," 1333 "La Voz de los Tres Ríos," and full ID again in native language, 1334 back to rustic music. Dominant signal, and can only hear closer XEGD by nulling XEETCH, from several degrees apart. Etchojoa sunrise 1408 UTC. [Hauser-OK]
- 700 **MEXICO** unID JAN 5 1200 - High choral version of Mexican anthem, followed by male announcer. This is almost certainly needed XEDKR, but I couldn't pull up any useful details. [Hall-CA]
- 710 **MEXICO** XEDP *La Ranchera de Cuauhtemoc*, Cuauhtemoc, Chih. JAN 5 1200 - Usual long version of Mexican anthem (about 4 minutes 40 seconds), timpani, and new version of recorded ID which only mentions XHDP-FM. All my recordings in 2017 had an AM/FM ID. I wonder if this could mean that the AM might be turned off sometime soon? [Hall-CA]
- 710 **MEXICO** unID JAN 6 1211 - Mexi-tunes, faded by 1230. The next day, truncated anthem from 1203-1204, male announcer, Mexi-tunes, lost by 1250 with bad Rebelde co-channel this day. [Krueger-FL]
- 720 **MEXICO** XEJCC Cd. Juárez, Chih. JAN 1 1307 - A Mexican state national anthem. (Thanks go to Andrew Brade and Max. van Arnhem of RealDX assisting with identifying this for me.) New. [Niven-TX]
- 730 **MEXICO** XEHB Hidalgo del Parral, Chih. JAN 2 1310 - National anthem and then norteño music. Frequent announcements with the FM (107.1) and AM frequencies. "Estereo Fiesta" slogan also heard. Part of Grupo Radiorama. [Vance-TX]
- 730 **MEXICO** XESOS Agua Prieta, Son. JAN 2 1323 - Noted with "La Ranchera" slogan and FM (97.3) mentioned. [Vance-TX]
- 740 **MEXICO** unID JAN 5 1159 - High choral version of Mexican anthem. Probably unneeded XEVAY. [Hall-CA]
- 750 **MEXICO** XECSE *Romántica*, Culiacán, Sin. JAN 5 1159 - ID by male announcer, mentioned 1 kW, Grupo Radiorama Sinaloa. Rare here (and at the Border Inn) because KOAL and KAMA have such big signals. [Hall-CA]

- 750 **VENEZUELA** YVKS, RCR, Caracas DEC 11 2300 - "RCR siete cincuenta AM" ID's; good.{A} [Connelly-MA]
- 770 **MEXICO** XEACH Guadalupe, NL JAN 6 1319 - Noted with call letter ID through KABQ interference but faded soon after. [Vance-TX]
- 780 **MEXICO** XESFT *La Poderosa*, San Fernando, Tamps. JAN 6 1203 - Male ID, slogan, into truncated anthem, then long male canned ID 1206-1207 mentioning XHSFT 103.7 FM, XESFT 780 AM and power, URL, into Mexi tunes. [Krueger-FL]
- 790 **MEXICO** XENT *R.Fórmula*, La Paz, BCS JAN 5 1200 - Mexican anthem (from national network feed), back to network programming. At 6 a.m. local time (1300 UTC in winter) they abruptly break from the national feed and insert another anthem. (The network feed also gives a full ID for flagship station 970 XERFR, a 50 kW station which almost no one ever logs anymore, around 1300 UTC.) There is also a tiny *R.Fórmula* station in Guadalajara, right on the main beam of my antenna, but XENT has a huge signal so I suspect I may never log the Guadalajara station. XENT does air a few local ads, mostly for a local Nissan dealer. [Hall-CA]
- 800 **MEXICO** XEROK Cd. Juárez, Chih. JAN 11 1300 - National anthem, followed by ID and ads and/or PSA's. Still on greatly reduced power, so tough copy and real DX now. [Wilkins-CO]
- 810 **COLOMBIA** HJCY *Caracol Radio*, Bogotá DEC 11 2301 - Ultima Hora Caracol and *Caracol Radio* mentions; good/dominant.{A} [Connelly-MA]
- 810 **MEXICO** XERSV *R.Alegría*, Cd. Obregón, Son. JAN 5 1301 - Presumed with big signal running national anthem. Recording stopped before the ID, but they are a regular catch if I happen to be listening at this hour. [Hall-CA]
- 820 **MEXICO** XEBA *La Consentida*, Guadalajara, Jal. JAN 5 1200 - All alone on channel (my south/southeast wire really gets rid of 820 WBAP and 850 KOA) with choral version of Mexican anthem, full ID mentioning 10 kW, "La Consentida" slogan and studio/office address. Unneeded but haven't heard them so clear and alone in a long time. [Hall-CA]
- 850 **MEXICO** XEMIA *850 Noticias/La 850 AM*, San Pedro Tlaquepaque, Jal. JAN 7 1200 - All alone on channel with overnight program of very light music (for people who leave the radio on all night?), "La 850 AM" between songs. Parallel web stream. New, Jalisco #21, Mexico #295, station #1408. [Hall-CA]
- 860 **PANAMA** HOL55 *R.Reforma*, Chitré/El Ejido DEC 11 2301 - Kids singing, fast-talk DJ, deeper voiced man in canned *R.Reforma* ID; over Reloj Cuban.{A} [Connelly-MA]
- 880 **MEXICO** unID JAN 5 1201 - High choral version of Mexican anthem. This is surely unneeded XEAAA, right on the main beam of this antenna. XEAAA is probably the only Mexican station left on 880 at this point. [Hall-CA]

- 950 **MEXICO** XEMEX Cd. Guzman, Jal. JAN 2 1200 - National anthem into full ID and then baladas. 104.9 FM and "La Mexicana" slogans. [Vance-TX]

- 1000 **COLOMBIA** HJAQ, RCN, Cartagena DEC 11 2300 - RCN La Radio ID, Colombian anthem; over Cuba.{A} [Connelly-MA]
- 1000 **CUBA** *R.Granma*, Media Luna DEC 11 2300 - Woman with *R.Granma* ID, 9 note tinkly Granma chimes; a bit under Colombia.{A} [Connelly-MA]
- 1010 **MEXICO** XEPA Santa María Coronango, Pue. JAN 2 0600 - Fair to good signal; ID, male with "La Ke Buena diez-diez, XEPA AM... mil wats... Puebla, la Ke Buena diez diez," then into national anthem. New. [Niven-TX]

I am trying a little something different to celebrate the 100th "DX Tool Box" column. I saw this from Patrick Martin in Seaside, OR, and want to ask all of you if you have ever had a great find like his. Send in your stories for a future column.

Today I went to Goodwill and I found in very good shape, a Sony XDRS10HDiP HD Radio. I plugged it in and it came on and seemed to work. No price on it, so I asked. 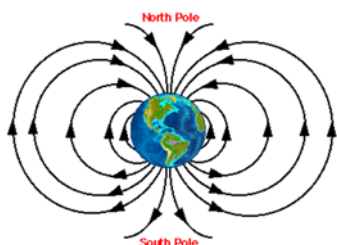

The greater than 2 MeV electron flux at geosynchronous orbit is expected to reach high levels on 14-19, 23, and 25 January in response to recurrent coronal hole high-speed stream influence. Normal to moderate levels are expected throughout the remainder of the outlook period.

Geomagnetic field activity is expected to reach active levels on 08, 15, and 20 January due to the anticipated effects of recurrent coronal hole high-speed streams. Quiet to unsettled geomagnetic field activity is expected throughout the remainder of the outlook period.
