Fox Farm is actually “Fox Farm-College” a suburb of about 3500 people next to Laramie, WY. **(TF-NH)**

- 1220 WLPO IL **LaSalle** – 1/16 2103 – Poor with Eddie Money's "Baby Hold On," through a weak WKRS. ID as "Classic Hits 103.9 WLPO." **(JJR-WI)**
- 1230 WFER MI **Iron River** – 1/14 2129 – Very poor, "Just You and Me" by Chicago, calls, and lost in mess. **(JJR-WI)**
- KELY NV **Ely** – 1/17 0759 – ID for Nevada Talk Network: "Where Nevada comes to talk ... KNNR Sparks-Reno-Carson City, KNNT Battle Mountain, KELY Ely, KAVB Hawthorne, KPKK Amargosa Valley, making radio great again." Relog, but has been fairly rare in the past. **(TRH-CA)**
- 1240 KVSO OK **Ardmore** – 1/22 1610 – ESPN sports with ID. While listening to ESPN I heard a weak repetition of the signal about a half-second later. - 1440 WJLL NY Niagara Falls** – 1/16 2036 – Poor with calls after a few oldies, through presumed WROK. (JJR-WI)

- KLBM OR La Grande** – 1/14 0959 – Guy with legal ID at 0959:50: "Eastern Oregon's home for news, talk, weather, and sports, this is KLBM La Grande and KBKR Baker City - Super Talk Radio, The Talk of Eastern Oregon;" news followed. Only the second time heard, and still the only Oregon GY logged here. (JW-CO)
- KBBS WY Buffalo** – 1/18 0959 – LID: "We mean business - 1450 AM and 103.5 FM KBBS Buffalo, Wyoming, a Bighorn Mountain Radio Network station"; network news at 1000 was followed by news from the Cowboy State Network at 1004. Fair, occasionally good. (JW-CO)
- KVOW WY Riverton** – 1/15 0959 – "You're listening to the Talk of Fremont County - AM 1450 KVOW Riverton;" not sure what followed. Rough copy, battling with several others. (JW-CO)
- 1460 KUTI WA Yakima** – 1/17 0759 – Fighting with heavy slop from local XERCN-1470, "ESPN Yakima" and into ESPN Sports Center update. New, WA #45, station #1415. (TRH-CA)
- 1470 WMBD IL Peoria** – 1/24 1750 – Traffic reports from Peoria, under a sports station. (JR-OK)
- 1480 KVNR CA Santa Ana** – 1/21 0858 – Woman with Vietnamese talk; ID at 0900, probably LID, but heard only "KVNR ... California ...," followed by more Vietnamese talk. Very spotty in QRM over the next 10 minutes or so. A needed call change here, last heard as KWIZ. (JW-CO)
- KHQN UT Spanish Fork** – 1/22 0940 – Dramatizations from "Tales from the Mahabharata," which ended at 0950 with an ID and "become a vegetarian" PSA; non-stop sitar music followed until fadeout at 1008. Fair and occasionally on top, mixing with KVNR and others. Vietnamese mixing with sitar music is an interesting sound! (JW-CO)
- 1490 KKAN KS Phillipsburg** – 1/3 1901 – Simple "KKAN Phillipsburg" ID in the mix. Barely thru QRM. (JW-CO)
- KRSN NM Los Alamos** – 1/6 0900 – Otis Redding's "Sittin' on the Dock of the Bay;" legal ID at 0901:50 by man: "KRSN AM 1490 Los Alamos, New Mexico," followed by more music. Fair and briefly alone in KCFC null. (JW-CO)
- KRTN NM Raton** – 12/30 1959 - Legal ID by man; "Classic Country 1490" slogans. New format, ex-AC. (JW-CO)
- 1560 KCAA SD Aberdeen** – 1/22 0852 – Presumed with North Dakota news, Fargo ads, ID's as "Thunder 106-1 and 98-3," as well as "Ag News 890". These all apply to KQLX-890 so it appears that someone on 1560 is relaying them. KCAA, which had been silent, is the only logical choice, although no ID's were heard, other than the aforementioned slogans. (JW-CO)

 ++ 1/22 0803 – Presumed with ad after ad, including Toro Generators with stores in Stillwater, Tulsa, and others, and a T-shirt store in Stillwater. No CKDO. Been a while on this one. (JJR-WI)
- 1590 KVGB KS **Great Bend** – 1/12 0059 – With male with “... Dan Holiday with latest weather on KVGB ...,” Top of the Town slogan, mixed with KMIC. At 0100, woman with “News-weather and Lubbock Christian ... AM 1590 the Spirit, KDAV Lubbock.” Relog. (JN-TX)
- KWEY OK **Clinton** – 1/21 0702 – Coming out of a country song, male says: “You are listening to the greatest country songs of all times, KEWY 1590 AM and KWEY-FM-HD2 Clinton,” fair signal. New. (JN-TX)
- 1600 KOKE TX **Pflugerville** – 1/12 0807 – With ID “KOKE, Tejano 1600, today’s best hits.” (RV-TX)
- 1620 KOZN NE **Bellevue** – 1/14 0736 – With ads of Omaha businesses and back to sports; station promo at 0755 “... on 16-20 The Zone,” legal ID together with slogan at 0759. (RV-TX)
- WTAW TX **College Station** – 1/14 0736 – Real Family Life program, “16-20 WTAW Colleg Station-Bryan” at 0759 after HD Radio promo, Fox News, followed by the Town Hall Review program. (RV-TX)
- 1640 KBJA UT **Sandy** – 1/20 0800 – ID “You’re listening to the all-new K-Talk Media, KBJA 16-40 AM Sandy-Salt Lake, and the entire Wasatch Front.” (RV-TX)
- 1660 KQWB ND **West Fargo**– 1/14 0100 – Mixed with KRZI with TOH ID, good signal when KRZI was in dead air. Relog. (JN-TX)

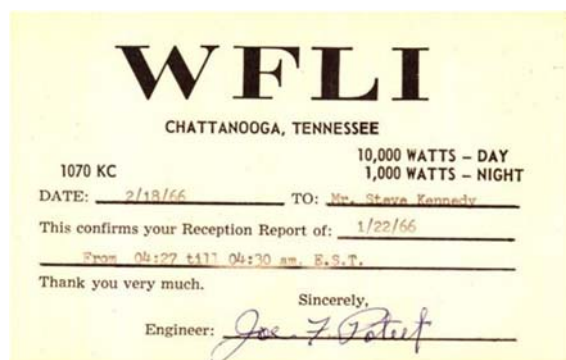

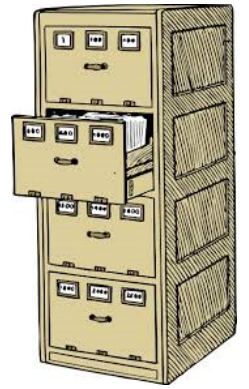

75 Years Ago – From the January 23, 1943 issue of *DX News*: Massachusetts' Stan Morss reports KFPY-920 Spokane, WA "in clear @ 3:05 s/off". New York State's Grant Batson logged another Spokane station: KGA-1510. George Luther of Kerrville (in the "Hill Country" SW of Austin, TX) doesn't count a logging unless he hears their "call letters unmistakably". (Note: He'd be in a world of hurt with today's broadcasters!) His prize catch is 4YA-780 'Down Under'. Charles Lippincott of MD lamented the demise of his favorite DX publication Radex. Re recommended White's Log (15 cents!) to partially fill the void. Dave Thomas (OH) had KWJB-1240 AZ among his latest veries.



50 Years Ago – From the January 27, 1968 issue of *DX News*: Wyoming is on the DX Test Calendar thanks to IRCA's scheduling of KATI-1400, KOWB-1290, & KMER-950. Mike Levinton in Berkeley, CA said aloha with these fine Hawaiian catches: KMVI-550, KLEI-1130, KAHU-940, as well as 4QE-1550 AU. Two pages in the bulletin were devoted to thoughts of how to make the CPC more productive in view of poor responses to requested DX Tests (less than one in ten responded). Ernest Wesolowski (NE) presented an excellent "sample" reception report for new and prospective members to see.

25 Years Ago – From the January 25, 1993 issue of *DX News*: "X Band" (1610-1700 kc) start date delayed by squabble over TIS stations – whether to allow them access to all "X Band" frequencies or keep them strictly to 530 & 1710. In my renewal note to Wayne Heinen I mentioned that I was in need of information on what to do about a local station that was preventing me from hearing other stations on the same frequency. For me it is WKOK 1070 Sunbury, Pa. I know that when I am out of the area I can hear Canada, Charlottesville, Va. and others with ease. Wayne suggested that a note in "Musings" might generate some useful tips from members who are far advanced in this matter I am. I find nothing in the NRC publications list that would be helpful.

Any assistance the members could provide me would be appreciated.

Phasing technology can be quite helpful here – strong locals can be phased into almost nothing. The key is that you need to be close enough to the station that you are receiving only groundwave and not skywave as well. I use a Quantum Phaser from Gerry Thomas, see www.dxttools.com for information. There are other commercially available models, as well as DIY plans available through NRC Reprints. – David Yocis

Gary Siegel – 2955 115th Street – Toledo OH 43611

It is with sadness and regret that I report a local radio legend, Harvey J. Steele, passed away on December 28, 2017 due to complications from diabetes. Harvey was one half of the famed Shores & Steele morning team which has dominated Toledo AM drive since 2000. He, along with partner Gary Shores, were a formidable pair on WKKO-99.9 FM (K-100) that not only had the top-rated morning show from 2000 to 2017 upon taking over that slot, but also were number 1 in the afternoon drive portion at K-100 from 1994 to 2000. Their ongoing success carried WKKO to the continuous top spot in Toledo radio since at least 1996.

Harvey was someone I could call friend since making his acquaintance back in 1982 when he worked alongside then-program director Gary Shores at WTOD-1560 AM here in Toledo. It was Mr. Shores who hired Harvey out of a small station in Illinois and the rest became Toledo radio history when Harvey arrived in Toledo in 1981. Mr. Shores started WTOD in 1975, the same time I was a competitor at WTUU-1520 AM.

In 1982, I caught up with both at a local remote. I told Gary about my time in radio and how we were both seeking the same radio audience. Harvey overheard that and was pretty interested. Shortly thereafter the conversation turned to DXing as Gary had indicated that he did some of that back in the day. It was then that Harvey mentioned his dad did that, too. I asked him who his father was, and he said, "Sid Steele." I immediately told him I knew his father via the various radio clubs for over a decade. This connection forged a familiar relationship such that anytime I would see either Gary or Harvey we could talk radio shop or about things in general. It was not uncommon to see Harvey at local Toledo hockey games.

His passing is not only a personal loss, but also a huge community loss. Harvey's life story played out very personally for many listeners due to life-saving liver transplants he had back in 1997. He became a strong advocate for organ donor causes. His daughter Kara heads the local Life Connection for Ohio organization. Our cubs and the radio industry lost a real original, for me a true friend in the radio world. Harvey grew up in Illinois but lived most of his adult life in Toledo. He was only 60 years old.
