#### comings & goings

By the time you read this Radio Nacional de Brasilia, Brazil's popular international voice, will have left the air. Transmissions were to cease on 12th June for 'technical reasons', according to announcements broadcast recently. According to BBC World Radio Club of 4/6 however, it is understood that the 250kw transmitter is to be used for another service, and it is hoped that the International Service will resume in July 1978. Meanwhile, a magazine article quoted by Sweden Calling DXers 17/5, says that Radio Nacional, Brasilia has had 9 transmitters of 250kw in storage for the last 3 years. Hopefully we will soon have official confirmation of the Brazilian governments future plan -s for the International Service, and hopefully the news will be good! Thanks to Ian Hitchiner for info on this. To the United States, where President Carter is expected to ask Congress shortly for US\$48 million, for additional transmitters for <u>VOA</u> and <u>Radio Free Europe/Radio Liberty</u> - 11 for RFE/RL in Europe, 5 for VOA in Europe, 4 for VOA Africa and 8 for VOA in the Western Pacific. This per Sidel, contributing to NASWA Listeners Notebook 5/77. Finally the good news from across the Tasman: An independent inquiry into Radio Australia has recommended the expenditure of more than A\$69 million in upgrading the overseas broadcasting service over a 6 year period. \$21 million has already been earmarked by the Government for Radio Australia in the coming budget. This will be spent on improving transmission facilities at the Shepparton site, and in determining whether the Cox Peninsula station at Darwin is reconstructed, or relocated to an alternative site. The enquiry, headed by Sir Keith Waller, former Head of Australia's Foreign Affairs Dept, recommended an expanding role for Radio Australia, with extensions and additions to present language services and development of a permanent transmitting station on the North West Cape of Australia, to replace the temporary site at Carnarvon. The committee found that Radio Australia had shown it's ability to serve a valued and substantial audience in Asia and the Pacific, and a need existed for this to continue. Thanks to Bruce Williams for this item - it's heartening to see this recognition of the value of international broadcasting.

A mixed bag this month, with the usual mid-year lull for some of us. Some interesting Philippino signals are reported and Radio La Cronica Peru 1320 seems to be the best Latin at present. Main headlines are from NZ but first:

Some items from Australia - Keith Robinson notes Tasmanian news at 0750 GMT on 1570kHz, so it looks like ABC station 7SH St Helens with 100w has commenced operations. Other newie 7FG 1160 runs // to 7NT 710 (Greer ADXN). According to Ian Stanley (ADXN), 3CR 840 broadcasts 2000-0300 and 0630-1400 Monday to Friday, and 2000-1400 Sat/Sun. 2XX 1010 300w is temporarily using 2CA's old antenna tower. Hours are 2030-1500 Mon-Fri and 2200-1500 Sat/Sun. Their address is P.O.Box 4, Australian National University, Canberra ACT 2600. Sam Dellit, reporting to NRC, says that forthcoming tests of the new 1978 frequency plan by Australian stations are expected during the day only, while directional stations will test at night.

Since the granting of a licence to Wainuiomata College's <u>Festival Radio</u>, we understand that the Post Office have a 'flood of transmission applications' to consider. Station Manager of Festival Radio, Rex Widerstrom advises that they hope to go on-air again, possibly next year. Radio Active's 100w screen modulated valve transmitter and a 150ft long antenna were used for the transmissions on 1260kHz in late April. Robin Chamber's DX report from Opunake was by far the most distant received - the balance came from the Wellington area. The organisers believe they are the first people of their age (pre-University) to be granted a licence in NZ and possibly the world. Anyone aware of public broadcasting operations by other college or high school groups overseas, please let your Ed know.

Active members Neville Henry and Arthur Williams are currently touring the Continent after a tour around Britain, DXing along the way. Neville advises that Radio Caroline are now broadcasting in EE on 953kHz, and the Dutch programmes are on 1562kHz (Updates p9 last month). Well-known Scots DXer George Brown has written regarding their recent visit to his location, and an enjoyable and wide-ranging discussion with the tourists. We look forward to hearing more on the British & European DX scene during the coming year fellahs!

Back to NZ, and news of the <u>Canterbury Broadcasting Company</u>, P.O.Box 1825, Christchurch, which conducted tone tests for warrant application purposes on 1260kHz between 5 and 8 May. Effective radiated power from the Marshland's site was 90 watts. The Post Office allocated the frequency, but no callsign, for the test. Managing Director R.D.McKay hopes to have the station operating by the end of 1977. This very interesting news from sole verification holder David Ricquish: David also reports that, according to the Minister of Broadcasting, the BCNZ will provide a repeater at <u>Reefton</u> in the Buller region of Westland, to relay Greymouth programmes. The station will be on air by the end of <u>June 1977</u>. South Westland will also get a repeater when finances permit. Tests for this were carried out at Okarito earlier this year. A group has been formed in Wanganui to plan for a private non-commercial station in the city, reports Phil Brooks. A low-power operation akin to that of 4XD in Dunedin seems to be the aim.

Back to Christchurch, where RNZ stations underwent extensive format changes on 9 May in response to Radio Avon's average audience of 55% of the total market. 3ZM 1400 is now Radio Nova (Avon spelt backwards!) with format said to be Beautiful Music, though to those of us familiar with American or Australian operations (eg 2CH 1170) it would be more accurately described as an easy listening format. Super 3ZB is now uptempo Top 40 in direct competition with Avon. Many racing and sports network programmes have been dropped, as has most talk and community oriented programming. Our reporter David R.

FM CAPPING RADIO IN AUCKLAND John Allchin reports: FM Capping Radio was organised and run by a group of senior students from Auckland University as a Capping stunt to show the benefits of FM broadcasting, and to raise funds for the Society for the Int-

ellectually Handicapped, the Laura Ferguson Trust, and the Student Trust for Handicapped Persons. The station broadcast from several transmitters in the Central Auckland area, on a frequency of 91.5mHz with a power of 30 watts, over the two weekends of Capping Week - the hours of broadcast were 8pm till midnight Friday 29 April, 11.30am Saturday to 12 noon Sunday of the ensuing weekend, and from 9pm Friday 6 May through to 2am Monday 9 May, a total of 81 hours and 30 minutes on air. FM stereo coverage was achieved from Whitford, Henderson and Torbay, indicating a radius of reception of between 20-30 miles. Drury is about 27 miles south of Auckland Central. The total amount pledged during this capping stunt was \$560.40, and the organisers were kept on their toes as Post Office authorities were hot on their trail. Ian Hitchiner says he found them on a frequency of 95.5mHz with very weak signals and fading every 90 seconds or so, during the first weekend on air. The signal was much stronger during the second weekend, with the frequency changed to 91.5mHz. Polarity was vertical and transmissions in stereo. The broadcast consisted of all types of music, from the latest through to light classical.

TELEVISION RECEIVERS (Part 8 of a series on TV/FM DX by Brian Oliver, Kerikeri) An elaborate receiver is not needed to DX on TV. The set should be in good working order so that you don't miss some prize reception when those weak trops stations are coming in: If you own a valve set, give some thought to having it checked over. Valves are being phased out this year (1977), with 2 leading world manufacturers having already ceased production.

The set's sensitivity may be down, perhaps showing a slight increase in snow on the local station, or if it's over 6 years old I suggest you have the RF valve in the tuner replaced. This is the one closest to the ribbon aerial lead entering the tuner. Sometimes the first IF valve on the main chassis may need replacing. This is identified by being near the point where the round coax cable from the tuner enters the main chassis. The tuner should be free of intermitant contacts when selecting a change in channel. If not, have it removed, and each contact carefully cleaned using 'Brasso' applied with cotton buds, and polished off. (Important: These jobs should be attempted only by suitably qualified persons, and of course the set must be unplugged from the mains before the cabinet rear cover is removed.) Modern transistor sets incorporate tuners which do not suffer from these disadvantages and should need no attention. The Vertical Hold control (not present on most modern colour sets) should be set to a position just before the picture slowly rolls, and not to the flickering multiple pictures end of it's range. (This should be easy to do, with a definite shift in the control between these two states.) The set should now easily lock on weak snowy signals. If not, have it serviced for 'sync' problems.

Your set is now capable of receiving NZ and Australian stations without bother, although NZ manufactured sets do not cover Aust Ch3, 4, 5, 5A and 11. This can be overcome by fitting a suitable Australian tuner to your set, or fitting those channel cards into the spare positions of your existing tuner. This will have to be done professionally. You will also be able to receive Conclusion page 10.

#### **DXCURSION**

The itinerary for the League's second DXcursion to Australia centred around a 10-day camping holiday in the outback of Victoria, South Australia and the Northern Territory, with almost 2000 miles of coach travel over mainly dust tracks into the country's heart - Ayers Rock and Alice Springs. This adventure was shared with 40 others - Australians and Americans of all ages, and will be long remembered by all who participated. The busy programme meant that DXing was limited, but Bryan Marsh with his new National DR22 and Bryan Clark with a Realistic TRF both found time to listen in along the way. More importantly, there were friendships to be made and renewed with DXers and radio people from Melbourne, Adelaide and Sydney.

From our arrival in Melbourne on 4 May, we were royally treated by local League members and by Radio Australia. Keith Glover caught each DXcursioner for a 'Club Forum' interview and we were also entertained by duty announcers Helen Jackson and Michael Cole, and by Marylou Jelbart. In the Correspondence Section, Officer-in-Charge Les Gould showed how a staff of 5 (reduced from 12!) was coping with 225,000 items of listener correspondence - 1000 letters each working day: Japanese mail made up 46% of all mail received in the 1975/1976 year, compared with 26% in 1973/74. Later, Theo Donnelly - news director of ethnic radio CJVB Vancouver, Canada visited Melbourne counterparts 3ZZ and 3EA. Incidentally, Theo was easily identifiable as a DXer, even without a receiver in tow - he was usually sporting one of a colourful range of T-shirt-s, promoting CJVB, KJR Seattle or the CBC!

Harry and Maroline weatherley hosted a memorable evening at a secluded restaurant in the Dandenong Ranges, south of Melbourne. This was followed by an enjoyable supper at the home of Keith and Gwen Glover. For these functions we were also accompanied by the Whittingtons, the Schenks, the Cooks, John Newman from Tasmania, and Geoff Cosier of DUDXC. The following day, Harry, John, Dick & Noel Whittington joined us for a day-trip to northern Victoria and Shepparton - home of Radio Australia's main transmitting base. Four 100kw, three 50kw and one 10kw transmitter were seen in operation, along with a special demonstration of the giant antenna-switching complex. The various antenna arrays were toured by mini-bus. Before returning to Melbourne, we called into 3S (1260kHz). Following a tour of studio facilities, Tony King was interviewed on-air, and explained the DX hobby and DXcursion to listeners in Shepparton and the Goulburn Valley areas.

DX listening in Melbourne included 2YA Wellington and RRI Surabaya 585, both heard on the Realistic regularly without external antenna. In fact, these two stations remained with us throughout the trip, although 2YA was covered by 4JK through most of the Northern Territory listening. The 1000 GMT National News kept us up-to-date with happenings at home on many nights.

Our Camper Tour commenced 7 May, and on our first night on the road, we rendevoused at Murraybridge South Australia with Southern Cross DX Club members Keith Barton, Roger Gammon and John williams. An enjoyable evening was spent discussing DX and related topics. Next overnight stop was at Port Augusta, 200 miles north of Adelaide, and stations noted here at 1800 GMT on the TRF included 4ZB, 4YC, 3YZ, 2ZB and Radio Windy. Coober Pedy, source of 95% of the world's opals, was an interesting stopover, with our sleeping quarters some 15 feet below the surface in a large man-made cave. Even so, Australian stations between 530 and 900kHz were well heard. Bryan Marsh noted Radio NZ 6105kHz at very good level 0900 GMT. At Ayers Rock there were no readable daytime signals on MW (Alice Springs 200 air miles away), and night reception was hampered by continuous electrical storms. Our next and final outback stop was Alice Springs itself. As we approached the town, a tune around the band at 6pm local time revealed 44G 590 (1100 miles) as the strongest signal. 5AA 1390 (900 miles) was good, 5AN 890 very good, and 3S 1260 fair.

On 16 May it was back to the 'big smoke' and hospitality from Jack Buckley and Chris Martin in Sydney. Although DX conditions at Chris' location were not up to scratch, it was interesting to hear NZers all over MW at...Concluded Page 18

Trouble may be experienced in locking the picture from a 'tearing' state, although the sound should be readable in most cases. Remember to use your fine tuning for best results, and if you own a colour set with preset channel selection, become thoroughly familiar on how to tune it from the handbook instructions.

THE 'DX' IN DXCURSION AUSTRALIA 1977 continued from page 9. 4.30pm AEST - in 40 minutes I identified 2YA, 1YA, Noumea 670, 2ZB, 2ZW, 2ZN, 1ZE, 1ZB, 1ZN, 2ZG and Radio I all in the clear, plus 1ZC, 2ZP, 1ZD, 4ZB, 3ZB, 3YA and 1ZK, all mixed with Aussies but easily readable. SW news was the assumed RNI station off the Libyan coast with test transmissions. Jack Buckley had been hearing them on 6205kHz since early May. They gave regular reception during the Sydney stay, and their move to 6210 was noted mid-month. The real DX of the trip came when the writer (BC) and Theo Donnelly accompanied Chris Martin on a DXpedition to his beverage site at Parksbourne, near Goulburn, NSW. A 500 metre wire beamed to Southern Africa netted many African and Middle Eastern signals on broadcast, and also produced the strongest signals from Africa on shortwave that we had ever heard. Cn BCB, African countries heard included: Egypt, Kenya, Somalia, Sudan, Tanzania, Uganda, Zaire and Zambia. Australia: Radio Australia is to be upgraded ar a cost of \$2.5 million. The Minister for Posts and Telecommunications, Mr Robinson, said immediate plans provided for improvements for the transmitters at Shepparton in Victoria. These results would determine whether Radio Australia transmission facilities at Darwin would be relocated in the same area or whether another site should be sought on the West Coast.

Brazil: Radio Nacional Brasilia on 15245 is heard with English 2100-2200, Portuguese at 1900; and German and 2000. The station has announced that for technical reasons it is closing down on 12 June.

Belgium: Brussels broadcasts the home service on 9655 from 0430-0715.

Colombia: Radio Nacional Bogota on 15335 is heard with timr signal and full ID at 0000.

Cook Islands: Rarotonga is being heard on 3265 around 0630. Full schedule is 1630-0130, 0430-0830.

Cyprus: Cyprus Broadcasting Corporation has a transmission in Greek to the United Kingdom on Friday Saturday and Sunday from 2215-2230. Frequencies used are 7195 and 9755 both of which provide good reception here.

Czechoslovakia: Prague broadcasts to Australia and New Zealand in English 0730-0800 on 11855 15395 and 21700. The same frequencies are used 0830-0900, and on Saturdays and Sundays only from 0900-0930.

Ecuador: HCJB now has an amended schedule to the Pacific. The transmissions on 6130 are from 0630-1215, 9745 from 0700-0930, and 11900 0630-0830. HCJB has added additional frequencies to Europe: 9585 from 0700-0830 and 11835 from 0230-0830.

Germany East: Radio Berlin International on 11840 has English 0330-0415 and German 0415 to 0500. Also on 9650 and 11890.

Germany West: Deutschelandfunk programmes are now relayed on shortwave from the DW Sines transmitter on 7130 khz from 0530-0630. The signal is good but suffers some jamming.

Malta: The Voice of Hope is now using two transmitters from Malta on Sunday 0700-0800. 9605 and 9745 are from Malta and 9670 from Sines.

Netherland Antilles: TWR Bonaire is being heard on 11790 from 0145 to 0330 but until 0200 is blocked by Australia. 11900 is being used for the German transmission 1000-1030.

Philippines: The VOA is now using the Philippine relay base for shortwave frequencies previously served by Okinawa. These include 6010 1100-1400 and 7165 1100-1500.

Romania: Bucharest us heard with Spanish at 0400 and English at 0430 on 11735. Seychelles: FEBA has been heard on three 25 metre band frequencies. 11800 to East Africa 0400-0430; 11755 in Farsi or Urdu 0315-0345; 11845 opens at 0345

in Arabic type programming, with Canada on top until 0426.

Solomon Islands: Has been noted on 9545 at 0900 in parellel with 5020.

Spain: Madrid's English programmes to Europe from 2030-2130 and 2130 to 2230 are carried on 9505 and 11840. 11840 is blocked by Radio Australia up to 2200, and at 2229 Lisbon opens on the frequency.
