Win Some, Lose Some

The American Forces Radio & Television Service in Washington DC was almost closed down on shortwan last month. Since 1966 the Voice of America has provided AFRTS with SW transmission facilities at no cost. but is now seeking reimbursement. Following a review of US Forces overseas, it was established that most overseas AFRTS stations received their programming by superior quality cable and satellite circuits, and on 8 December, a closedown of the SW operation was announced, effective 1 January 1978. This was subsequently postponed till 17 January. Apparently due to a large amount of listener protest, the decision was rescinded at the eleventh hour, and AFRTS has advised it will be remaining on the air. VOA are seeking a \$400,000 yearly transmitter rental fee following cutbacks in their own budget. Let's hope the problems have been resolved and that the SWL can enjoy the distinctive programming of AFRTS Washington for many years to come:

In recent years the protests of SWLs and DXers have been instrumental in restoring several major shortwave operations. Not so, for the shortwave service of the tiny Indian Ocean island of Reunion, which closed it's 4kw SW station a few years back. Apparently only 3 or 4 people wrote in to query the closure: Another loss, as yet undone, was Radio Australia's popular DXers Calling programme. Responding to a protest letter, Allen Hull, Assistant Director of English Language Programmes, writes that "the dropping of DXers Calling was not an easy decision to make. We knew of its high standing in DX circles, and were concious of its history. With only one English Language Service, we constantly have to review our programme output to ensure we are making the best use of the programme time available. It was within this context that we decided to combine the specialist programme DXers Calling with our other weekly programme for shortwave enthusiasts - Club Forum. This change allowed us to introduce the new and significant science series called Insight." Mr Hull concludes - "While I can appreciate that no amount of explanation will make you feel any happier about the loss of DXers Calling, I hope you can at least understand the reasons behind our decision."

Radio n was the name given to an experimental station which was licenced from 19 December 1977 until 2 January 1978. The station used the callsign of 2XN and operated on the frequency of 1300kHz, broadcasting holiday information and beautiful music' for young people in Wainulomata, a suburb of Wellington.

The transmitter power was 100 watts, but only about 20% of this was radiated due to the lack of height of the antenna. The antenna used was a 20 foot high T, similar to that currently used by 2ZM Wellington. 5 earth radials buried in the ground helped with radiation, as well as stopping RF burns from the transmitting unit.

The carrier travelled some distance, but modulation was difficult for the first week due to RF getting into the modulator, and in the second week a mixer fault prevented 100% copy.

Despite these problems, 2XN was heard in Palmerston North, Carterton, Wanganui and Blenheim, as well as in suburban areas of Wellington. A report was receive -d of reception on a car radio in Hawera. All these reports were for reception during daylight hours.

The hours of broadcasting were: weekdays 8am-11am, then 1pm-8pm. Christmas Day 8am-8pm and New Years Eve 6am through to 1am New Years Day.

The station was operated by the Wellington Broadcasting Association Inc, from their mobile studio, transmitter and antenna site in Wainuiomata. Organiser of the station was 15 year old Wainui College student Rex Widerstrom, who also operated Festival Radio at the college in April 1977. The station technician was 17 year old John Wysocki, a League member, with assistance from 16 year old David Mainwaring, a new League member, who helped in many a rushed repair.

At this stage the group are not sure about any future broadcasts.

From Asia's premier DX club, the Union of Asian DXers, comes their 1977 Tropical Band Survey, compiled between September & December last year. There are 7 foolscap pages of top DX info, covering all frequencies between 2290 and 5095 kHz. With the longer nights approaching, and improved reception on the lower frequencies, this is a valuable guide to the DX to be heard in the months to come. Members can obtain a copy by sending 5 IRCs to Union of Asian DXers, c/- Victor Goonetilleke, 32/4a Malwatte Rd. Dehiwala, Sri Lanka. For just one extra IRC, that's 6 in all, they'll send along a copy of the UADX bulletin too. They've just published their 50th edition. so have truly established their place as a leading DX group.

In North America you can't go far in the DX/SWL hobby without striking the name of Glenn Hauser. You can hear him on Radio Nederland and Radio Canada, and read him in NASWA's FRENDX magazine (12 pages plus, monthly). Now he's brought a new dimension to the hobby - the Review of International Broadcasting, a stimulating monthly with the primary purpose of providing an open forum for discussion of Shortwave programming, and other topics related to the hobby. The 36 page 1/78 issue contains a wealth of comment from both listeners and broadcasters, eg Dick Speekman explains why he plays music on "DX Jukebox", a blow-by-blow report on the threatened closure of AFRTS SW, answers to criticism of HCJB's "DX Partyline", and comments from the first American to set up his own terminal to receive TV satelite transmissions (only \$13,000!).

Redio Moscow over recent years had a policy of entering only the date .time and frequency on their QSL cards . Naturally after verifying a few frequencies there is no great interest in gathering more of their innumerable outlets that they broadcast on . However over recent months it appears that they have changed their verification policy and they are now also entering their transmitter sites on the cards. This immediately gives the serious DXer a new interest and the oportunity to verify some of the Soviet Republics they may

In a letter from Radio Moscow , they say they will only verify reports written in the language of the transmission heard . Therefore it is doubtful whether a verification will be received for a report of say :their Swahili transmission ,unless the reception report is written in Swahili . This still leaves plenty of scope with their English transmissions for Australasia . South East Asia , Africa , Great Britain and East and West Coasts of North America . Radio Moscow will readily supply program schedules for these broadcasts upon request . Unfortunately not all list frequencies , some give only metre bands. This is because they do alter frequencies regularly occasionally without warning . On some transmissions they do announce frequencies at commencement and sign off and this is a great help . Normally however it is only with careful tuning of the bands that one will pick up their broadcasts .

One of the interesting aspects with reporting Radio Moscow is that one is never shure what transmitter location you have heard as there are often several transmitter locations through the USSR using the same frequency at one time or another . So until the QSL comes back it is never definate as what station

vou have verified .

A start would be kadio Moscows transmissions to Australia and New Zealand These can be heard at 0800 - 0900 and repeated again at 0900 - 1000 GMT. The following frequencies are currently in use ;

15385 Chita 15130 Petropavlovsk 11690 Khabarovsk 11940 Krasnovarsk

9780 Chita

These frequencies and probably locations are current till March 4th . next easiest transmission to hear in NZ is the South and South East Asia broadcasts at 1000 GMT . The African , Creat Britain and North American transmissions are more difficult to hear . Usually a frequency is picked up after carefully tuning . Just because it is Radio Moscow does not mean that it can always be easily heard . Because of propagation , location and frequency they can be very difficult loggings . Just at present the African and Great Britain transmissions are tending to use the lower bands of 41 and 49 metres and it is doubtful whether much will be heard till the winter months .

Very generally speaking , it appears that the Australasian transmissions are transmitted from Soviet Far East sites . The African and Asian transmissions from Central Soviet sites and the North American and British transmissions from Western Soviet locations . This is the pattern emerging from the veries

received so far .

For those after new countries keep a check for English transmissions on the following frequencies .

Kazakh SSR ,17850 khz Alma Ata Tadzhik SSR , 15220 khz Dushanbe

Latvian SSR , 15220 khz Riga Georgian SSR , 7280 khz Tbilisi These are a few I have come across so far but there are many more and you may find them before I do . If so please let other DXers know through the " TIMES " . All reports are addressed to Radio Moscow and I normally address them for the attention of the particular Serice . Radio Moscow does appreciate comment regarding programs and they will always acknowledge correspondence .

There are 16 Soviet Republics so here is the oportunity to build that country total up . Good DXing .

On the day after our arrival in Sydney, we experienced a most enjoyable reunion with League members Jack Buckley and Chris Martin, at Chris' home in Harbord on Sydney's North Shore. We took the opportunity to hear tapes made at Coolum Queensland on a recent DXpedition. I don't think Chris had logged so many 'Yanks' in one place before. Well Chris, do you think the Latins will come in at Coolum as they do at Tiwai? hi!

Thursday 15th, we drove to the site of Radio Australia's main transmitter complex, 6 miles north of the City of Shepparton, where I was taken on a conducted tour of the main Control Room and Transmitter Hall. In the Hall I saw two 100kw transmitters uncrated. They were originally destined to go to Cox Peninsula, Darwin, but Cyclone Tracy put paid to that. After some building alterations are effected, the transmitters will be operational about mid-year. The new transmitters are certainly much smaller than their predecessors currently in use at Shepparton.

I am pleased to say that Titahi Bay put a very good signal into the various towns and cities we stayed in. Of all the places we stayed and where I managed to do any DX, I found that Mt Gambier was about the best location for DX.

During our stay in Melbourne, we contacted members Harry Weatherley and Dick Whittington, am on December 22nd there was a gathering at Harry's Mt Waverley home - a very pleasant occasion indeed. If you get too close to the pet Galah, watch your fingers! On Boxing Day we were the guests of Keith & Gwen Glover at their North Balwyn home. When we arrived, one of RA's announcers Brian Bogle, and his wife Maureen, were there to meet us. As it turned out, Brian and yours truly went to the same school! Later in the week we went to Broadcast House and saw the 'Cottage' where Radio Australia started their services. Keith told us that it is still used as a standby studio, and it is said that it's equipment does not break down as often as the more modern equipment in the rest of the buidings does. During our tour of the ABC we met Dick Paterson and Barry Seeber, who used to do the breakfast programme to Asia & the Pacific Islands. Now they present a similar programme at 1100 GMT. We also met the alternate presenter of 'Club Forum', Warren Moulton. The night before we left Melbourne there was another gathering, this time at the home of Dick and Noel Whittington in Blackburn. During the evening, Dick, who also dabbles in CB, showed us how cluttered the channels are in Aussie, hi:

RADIO SWEDEN has been sending out 'no-data' cards resembling their normal QSL card. To earn a QSL, listeners must list date, time, frequency & details of the programme - 'news', 'man talking', 'Sweden Calling Dxers', is not enough. You must also ask for a QSL card, otherwise you will receive the no-data card. There is a possibility that Radio Sweden may have to discontinue issuing any card some time next year, for economic reasons. SCDX

ARTHUR CUSHEN'S SHORTWAVE REVIEW

The month's interesting signals include Surinam which has been heard on its new frequency and higher power while New Hebrides the latest country to gain independence has extended its schedule. March 5 sees many frequency changes and already some have been notified. This information was first broadcast on the YA station of Radio New Zealand Sunday, February 5. All times are GMT, 13 hours behind NZDT, and all frequencies in kHz.

Australia: Radio Australia on March 5 will use a new 13 metre band frequency to Africa 0400-0630GMT. They will use 21525 and also 15260kmz.

Ecuador: HCJB Quito on 11955kHz heard to Europe 1900-2200 also on 15300kHz. 9585kHz has been heard to Europe 0500-0700GMT.

Germany: RBI have been testing 9535kHz with a new programme with Portuguese to Africa to 0345 and then Spanish to 0430, programme first noted January 14.

Guam: KTWR heard opening at 1100 on 15195kHz and also using 11730. The channel of 9640kHz, 0915-1100GMT is good and the DBC use 9640 up to 0915, but the frequency is shared without any interference.

International Red Cross: Tests will continue during 1978 from Geneva on 7210kHz from 0600-0700, 1130-1230, 1700-1800, 2200-2300GHT with English on March 27, May 22 and July 24.

Iraq: Baghdad heard with a service to Europe 9745kHz English 2130-2230, French 1930-2030 and German 2030-2130. A new service to North America on 11905kHz is broadcast 0300-0400GMT with light interference from Rome Radio.

Kuwait: Broadcasts on 9840kHz of the Home Service have been noted at 1900 with news in Arabic closing 1910GMT.

Masirah: BBC Relay station which was put out of action by a cyclone on June 13 is now testing on 1412kHz and relaying the world Service 1300-2000GAT. Four shortwave transmitters of 100kW are being installed and should be in operation by the middle of the year.

Nederland: Hilversum using 11835kHz 0700-0720GMT in English, this frequency replacing 11875kHz. The DX Jukebox programme is back again with its reports in all transmissions instead of being regionalised so that the Pacific Report is on the first Thursday on all transmission. Dick Speckman is keen to learn the reaction from listeners to the return of the old form of programme. You should write to him at DX Jukebox, Radio Nederland, P.O. Box 222, Hilversum, Holland.

New Hebrides: Villa on 3945kHz has extended its schedule since the country became independent. Pidgin is heard up to 0845 then French to 1000GHT, but the station does not close with any anthem.

Seychelles: FEBA 9605kHz opens 0200GMT but mixed with Radio Canada.

Surinam: Paramaribo 4850kHz now 10kW heard on this new frequency with strong signals opening at 0830GMT, Indonesian to 0930 including devotional and commercials and Dutch from 0930GMT.

Sweden: Stockholm will use 9605kHz from March 5 to New Zealand in Swedish 0630-0815GMT. 9745kHz replacing 5995 on January 19, 0300-0330 in Spanish and 11850kHz replacing 11705 in English 0230-0300GMT.

Turkey: Ankara has a new service to Asia with English 1200-1300GAT and using the frequency 9665kHz.

U.S.A.: WINB Red Lion is heard on 11775kHz at 2130GMT. The full schedule is 15340kHz, 1700-2100GMT, 11775 2100-2300, 15170 2300-0000, 11710 0000-0330.

(Reif SCDX) Radio Nacional de Brasilia hopes to resume the International Service this year. (Schoffa SCDX). Brasilia will soon have 100kw on 4845 to cover remote areas lacking local radio. (Medin -a via Hauser NASWA LN). Adventist World Radio is to operate two 100kw and one 250kw tx from it's own station in Asia by 1979. (Dean WDXC via NASWA IN). Deutsche Welle has had the go-ahead for it's Sri Lanka relay base at Trincomalee. The station is expected to be ready in a year, and we can expect two 250kw tx to beam to Asia and Oceania. (O.
