My apologies to Will Shakespeare for the following:

"What's in a name? That which we call 'DX' By any other name would sound the same."

But it wouldn't to some! And that in spite of the term implying no more than 'distant'. The dedicated, the hard-line 'DX-er' inclines to look on himself as a purist and to distain the 'SWL-er'. You may well ask - 'So what?' - but the issue is very live in European DX circles and there are those among our own League members who are very emphatic on the point. The best definition of the difference I have seen is that given by Jonathan Marks in an article in the 1980 WRTVH in

"The 'DX-er' is primarily a technical person who enjoys watching propagation conditions in order to hear a new station. He or she is not interested in programme content but merely in the technical quality of reception and in some cases the procurement of a QSL card from the station. In contrast the Short Wave Listener is interested in a signal for its programme content and thus reception of the station must be reasonable in order to understand what is being said."

Marks goes on to say that few listeners appear to be either pure DX-ers or pure Short Wave Listeners.

Judging by letters and discussions I have had recently we have both here in New Zealand but, as they grow older, the DX-ers tend to become more moderate and I quote from a letter from Roy Knox, who with 40 years DX-ing behind him, writes:

"One of the real gems of DX is that one can do just as one wishes in order to get the most for oneself from the hobby - be it reporting listening - keeping logs in any shape or form - one can do it or not as one wishes and no one has the right to say it is right or wrong just because it happens to be 'not the same' as anyone else does it, (except where reporting for the almighty QSL is concerned) and as long as it stays that way DXing will remain alive and well."

So where do we go from here. The essence of the hobby is listening to transmissions from 'distant' stations and whether they be long, medium or short wave or from commercial, utility, FM, TV or whatever broadcasters, we are brothers and sisters under the skin and - surely - DX-ers.

While on holiday in Norfolk Island recently I took the chance to call in and and have a look at Radio Norfolk Island VL2NI.

Apart from the large masts in the front of the building there is very little Apart from the large masts in the front of the building there is very little to indicate that the single storied building, behind the library is the home of VL2NI. The duty announcer George Smith gladly answered my questions and then put me in contact with the Broadcasting Officer, Kathy Lecren who added to the details. VL2NI broadcasts on a frequency of 1566 kHz with a power of 50 watts, transmission hours, usually 6.30 am to 10.30 pm Monday to Saturday Norfolk time and 12.30 until 11.00 pm on Sundays. During the afternoons kadio Australia is carried in relay. The station has a staff of 22, with the morning announcers being paid, and the rest of the time announcing is done on a voluntary basis. The station is financed by the horfolk Island Administration. Programming is a The station is financed by the korfolk Island Administration. Programming is a pleasant blend of music and serials, with requests being very popular.

The station is suprised to receive reports and will verify correct ones. So far reports have come from NZ, East Australia, Japan and one from Italy, not bad for 50 watts. Why not have a listen for them, early evening appears to be the best time. I am sure your report would be welcome. S.G.

If you happen to be listening to a broadcast from the New Hebrides at 1245 hrs. GMT on 30 July 1980 and continue listening through to 1315 hrs.GMT on the

same date, you will have heard 'two' radio countries - and if you send two reports and get back two QSLs you will, if you have not already had a verie from New Hebrides, be able to increase your total of 'countries heard' by two. The reason for this extraordinary situation is that - unless the time and date of the event are changed again - this is when the New Hebrides will become an independent nation with the name VANUA ATU.

Remarkably few letters in response to our request for feedletters: back. Paul Ramsay wrote to tell us he hopes to get back into DX-ing after a lapse of 12 months. He sent us details of a folded dipole antenna which is being checked out with a view to publication. Thanks, Paul and good listening. - Ray Hobman, Wainuiomata, takes me to task for saying TV/FM DX has limited appeal and suggests a possible reason is the poor summer in N.Z. He also tells of having written to Radio Australia about the possibility of using their domestic satellite. The answer came back that the N.Z. Government did not want to share in this venture. And still on TV/FM, John Allchin tells us that both he and Mark Nicholls have verified Radio Auckland One - 92.5 and Radio Auckland Two - 89.5. Nice work chums. Then we have a note from A.C. Verry, Lower Hutt, who suggests a list of members names and addresses. That would present some problems as there are numerous changes and keeping up to date is a problem. He would like to contact other League members in the area so over to you. I've already referred to a letter from Roy Knox of Hamilton. His main criticism of the times is that there is not enough 'Bandwatch' and station schedule information. Thought we did fairly well there anyhow and do not think we can do much more. And lastly, from Frank Crow in Los Angeles. 

## EQUIPMENT REVIEW



with BRUCE LISTER

Bryan Clark has provided the following United Kingdom (8) prices to give a relative idea of where various receivers will fall in comparison with one another. Top of the line in general coverage receivers is the new Drake R7 at pounds UK 834 For comparison the Drake SPR4 is 460 pounds. The Yaesu FRG 7000 is next at 375 pounds followed by the Kenwood R1000 at 295 pounds. The FRG7 sells at 214 pounds and then comes the Kenwood R300 selling for 189 pounds. All these prices include 15% value added tax. Doubling the above prices will give a rough conversion to \$NZ.


As a postscript to the notes printed last year about the fitting of narrow bandwidth filters to the FRG7 a letter from Fred Clements of Miramar Wellington advises that he had the job done by Radio Engineering in Dunedin. The receiver now operates with the wideband filter when switched to the AV mode while on the AM/ANL and SSB positions the set works with

the narrow band filter. Freds reaction to the conversion is very favourable and he thinks that it was worthwhile.

News of an addition to the range of McKay Dymek receivers the DR101 has been received. Similar in specifications to the models reviewd in these pages last August it has the added feature of automatic scanning. This feature allows any part of the MF or HF spectrum to be scanned automatically in 100 Hz steps at a rate variable from 100 Hz to 2MHz per second.

A good guide to the popularity of a receiver is the number of mods that are tried and successfully incorporated in the set. In recent years the FRG7 would win this race easily although it's big brother the FRG7000 is catching up, all of which leads to two notes from Leigh Morris. The first is an addition that may be fitted to any FRG7/7000 beneficial results and to quote Leigh. There has been the odd occasion when my FRG7000 suffers from song signal overloading. Generally the attenuator switch will solve the problembut the variation in the steps supplied is not always satisfactory and so I have fitted an RF gain control as shown in the diagram. The parts

required are very simple, just 1 potentiometer with a value anywhere between 10,000 & 50,000 ohms and a small length of wire. The wires are soldered to the 'pot' as shown in the diagram and fitted to the terminals on the set. To finish off a bracket to hold the unit may be fitted under the buffers on the side of the



filter in all other positions. Kenwood R1000. From Ralph Sanserino has come details of how to alter the wiring of this set to provide better selectivity on AM reception. I belive that sets being delivered now have this alteration done or else include information on how it may be done. AGC What is it? Automatic Gain Control or AGC is a control system used in receivers the purpose of which is not always understood. AGC controls the gain of the sets amplification stages prior to detection of the audio information. This is done to prevent these stages overloading which would introduce distortion and intermodulation, it helps to counteract fading and also presents the maximum usable signal to the detector so that it may opperate at best efficiency. It does all this by reducing the gain of the controlled stages in proportion to the signal strength. Typically the amount of control used to keep the output variation to a 2:1 ratio (6dB) is; domestic radios 100:1; DX receivers 10,000:1 (80dB) and top line communications receivers 100,000:1 or(100dB). In most sets The speed at which control starts and the length of time control remains in operation is out by the designer.

Radio New Zealand Shortwave Service has introduced a new programme, New Zealand Calling, first broadcast on May 5, 0530-0600GMT on 15345kHz and 17860kHz. This programme includes the DX World and Mail Box and is broadcast fortnightly on Mondays.

It means that the DX World on the YA stations at 10156MT on the first Sunday of each month has been cancelled. Plans are under way for a repeat of this special 30 minute programme for listeners in New Zealand, Australia and Japan at a more suitable listening time. This is part of the DX World script as broadcast on May 3 and May 19. All times are GMT, 12 hours behind NZST. All frequencies in kHz.

BELGIUM: Brussels has been heard in English on the new frequency of 15385kHz 0015-0100GMT. The same programme also carried on 15175.

CANADA: Radio Canada is using 9655 in place of 9605 for its transmission to North America. The schedule is 0200-0300, 5960, 9535, 9655 and 0300-0430, same frequencies plus 11845. English for the first 30 minutes including DX Digest on Mondays.

DUBAI: Tests continue to be received from Dubai now using 21485kHz from 0600-1000GMT with some English identification. Programme is a relay of the Arabic Home Service. GUAM: KTWR 11840kHz continues to be well received with English at 0830GMT.
