The Sony Award



In recognition of the Iremendous support from **Sony N.Z. Ltd.** for the NZRDXL's 50th Anniversary Convention, the North Otago Branch have instituted a new award based on a contest as detailed below. There will be two prizes, each of a year's subscription to the League; one for the first-placed New Zealander and one for the first-placed overseas DXer. For those that weren't at the Convention, Sony N.Z. Ltd. made a very generous donation of goods worth over \$3000 at retail prices. Most of these items were sold at auction and realised a tidy sum, enough to cover the operating expenses with a tidy sum left over. This has now been put on term deposit and will be used to fund annual Sony Awards. So, now to the Conditions of Entry for the inaugural **Sony Award**!

The Contest involves listening to a certain area of the short-wave band between specified times and dates, and listing all the stations you here, then submitting a list of what you've heard. Here are the specifics for the first contest, one that doesn't involve QSLs, all you have to do is listen!:

Frequencies: 15000 - 15700 kiloHertz

Time: 0600 - 1000 UTC

Date: From now to July the 31st. Please note, entries must be postmarked by no later than August 10th and received by August 24th. The closing date for Overseas DXers is August 14th.

Points are awarded as follows: 3 points for the first time a station is logged and one point every other time. For example – if you hear Radio Australia on four frequencies, it's worth a total of 6 points, 3 + 1 + 1 + 1 = 6 points. If you hear VOA relayed via several different countries, it's 3 points for every relay base plus one point for every other log from that site!

To enter, please supply your loggings in the same format as used in the DX Times, i.e. in columns of Frequency, Time (in UTC), Country, Station Name, Language. Then send your entry to Paul Ormandy, NZRDXL Competitions Secretary, 33 Greta Street, Oamaru 8901, New Zealand.

Editorial

Andy (andy@navigator.co.nz) joined the League in 1981 and is an inactive MW DXer.

Welcome to the new look version of the DX Times. Those of you who have been members for a while will remember me being the Chief Editor back in the late Eighties. To give you an idea of my background, and to pad my first editorial out a bit, I'll give you a rundown of my first involvement in the hobby. I hope it doesn't bore anyone too much.

My first memory of having an interest in radio was at the age of 8, when I distinctly remember sneaking into my parents bedroom after being sent to bed, and sitting on their bed listening to the shortwave bands on my Dad's portable 3 band Philips transistor radio. Unfortunately for Dad, around the age of 12 I also discovered my love of electronics. At that stage I was better at dismantling than construction, and that Philips radio was the first object to fall prey to my screwdriver. (Sorry Dad!). Also at 12, I saved up my pocket money and purchased a surplus army 4-section vertical aerial (as advertised in the Listener - from the surplus store in Hamilton - used with ZC1's?). The folks graciously allowed me to erect it in the back yard, but not knowing much about aerials at that stage, I had it planted straight into the grass with my unshielded lead connected at ground level. I think I can safely say that the aerial wasn't doing much, but it was fun anyway.

In 1980 I started to listen to shortwave regularly, using old valve radios, pouring over Arthur Cushen's articles in the Listener and trying to pick-up the stations he listed. Late in 1980 I took the plunge, and wrote to Arthur requesting information on the DX League, which always got a mention in his column. My very first edition of the DX Times, December 1980, has "SAMPLE" stamped on the front. I was so impressed with the content that my joined immediately and have received the magazine every month since then.

I have meet many friends through the DX League. When I joined, David Ricquish was the Chief Editor, a position he handed to Michael Pollard in March '84. Mike edited the DX Times through to February '86 when I took over the role. Arthur de Maine became Chief Editor in April '87. Now I don't know if you've noticed an important factor there. Mike did the magazine for around 2 years. I did it for 14 months. Poor old Arthur did it for over 11 years! This man deserves either a medal, a rest, or both!

Arthur probably thought he was about to get a rest, but you'll see he's been roped in as guest editor for the SW+9 Bandwatch this month. Heh heh. You'll never get away Arthur!!! Editing the DX Times is quite a time-consuming task and I salute Arthur for hanging in there for such a long time. I'll tell you one thing now, if I'm still Chief Editor in 10 years time, I'll be handing Paul Ormandy a gun and pleading with him to put me out of my misery!

But seriously. I am now working hard at using the latest technology to produce the DX Times. This will help in a number of areas. Section editors will be able to put together their contributions faster. This month, all but 3 sections were sent to me via email. This cuts the production time down. Once we reach the stage where everything arrives via email, I will be in a position to produce the magazine very quickly. We are also in the process of changing print methods. Soon the magazine will be sent via email and then output straight to a fancy laser printer (no photocopying involved), which folds and staples it, ready for posting. You should soon notice a vast improvement in readability due to this. We're also aiming at fitting more info on less pages to cut costs. Let me know what you think!


Computers in DXing

News from AdCom

WELCOME TO NEW MEMBERS - MICHAEL LEES, 920 Kahikatea Flat Road, Waitoki RD1, Kaukapakapa, MICHAEL FALKNER, 47 Weldene Avenue, Glenfield, North Shore City (introduced by DANIEL BLOOMFIELD), JACK RUYSCH, 20 Bridge Street, Edgecumbe 3082, FRANK O'RORKE, 50 Matai Road, Raumati South (via TVNZ Teletext) and MATT FRANCIS of Nunnnawal ACT 2913 Australia. This is our best new member turnout in a long time. Welcome to you all – we hope you'll share your listening highlights with the membership by contributing to the various sections of the magazine.

SUBSCRIPTION INCREASE_After a lively debate at the special general meeting in Auckland on 28 June, approval was given to increase the NZ subscription to \$35 per year, effective from August 1998, if immediate efforts to gain sponsorship funding are unsuccessful. The meeting noted that all hobby groups were experiencing declining membership but, at under \$3 per month, membership of the League was still reasonably priced and not seen as excessive against other choices for discretionary spending. Tribute was paid to the Southland and Auckland-based Administration Committees for having been able to hold the subscription level since 1991. But budget projections for the current year are for another loss and reduction in accumulated funds. Concern was expressed that the League should not be dependent on sponsorship for its financial survival and Adcom, in collaboration with new Chief Editor ANDY GARDNER, committed to continue seeking ways of reducing or holding costs.

<u>PUBLICITY INITIATIVE</u> As part of its strategy to promote the DX hobby more widely, Adcom are pleased to acknowledge the cooperation of the NZ Association of Radio Transmitters (NZART) and the efforts of member **MIKE BUTLER** in editing a new column in the NZART monthly magazine 'Break In'. Mike can also be heard in the Auckland area with his 'International Radio Report' carried on 26,550 kHz at 2030 NZ local time on the first and third Tuesdays of each month. The 21 July broadcast will be edition number 115!

<u>WITH REGRET</u> we note the passing of Northcote Auckland member **STAN LIDGARD**. On behalf of the membership, we extend sympathy to Stan's family and friends.

RADIO COUNTRIES With considerable use of relay transmitters (particularly shortwave) in countries other than where a radio programme is originated, it is timely to reconfirm that the League's traditional approach to counting countries heard/verified is to accept the country where the transmitter is located. Thus, a QSL for Radio Netherlands 0730 UTC transmission to the South Pacific on 9820 or 9720kHz is a QSL for the radio country of Netherlands Antilles. These 2 frequencies emanate from the Bonaire relay station, so the Netherlands Antilles is

the country heard/verified, not the Netherlands. Further feedback on this matter is always welcome via the 'Talkback' column

DX AUSTRALIA/DXERS CALLING We record with considerable regret the closure of our sister SPARC club based in Melbourne, on 30 June after 13 years of service to DXers in Australia and NZ. Most of our Australian members have also been active in DXA/DXC and have been welcome participants at past DX conventions in NZ.

CONGRATULATIONS Expatriate member **DAVE YETMAN** of HCJB World Radio has recently become engaged to Analucía Moreno of the Ecuadorian Campus Crusade for Christ. Dave begins his assignment at HCJB's Pifo transmitter site on 13 July, after completing Spanish language studies in Quito.

RADIO ST HELENA Mark your calendar now to try for the elusive once-a-year broadcast from this small South Atlantic island. According to a verification card received by ALAN STUART for the station's 1997 transmission (which marked the 30th year of transmission), Radio St Helena will be on air Saturday 24 October 1998 for another special programme from 1900hrs to 2300hrs.UTC. Frequency is expected to be 11092.5kHz.

MMM.... INTERESTING.... The traditional image of DXers and computer freaks as people who would rather spend time with their equipment than a member of the opposite sex may not be deserved after all! A log report on activity for February at the Radio Netherlands Internet Web Site revealed that the least active day (i.e. the lowest number of "hits") was February 14th - St. Valentines Day! 50 YEARS AGO THIS MONTH Headlining the July 1948 issue of 'DX Bulletin NZ' are details of "a conference of prominent Southland and Otago DXers to be held in Invercargill on August 14 and 15", the return of XERF 1570 after a month off air, and a new country heard on shortwave – New Guinea, with VLT5 carrying the ABC's New Guinea Service with 500 watts on 7270kcs at night, 9520 daytime. ARTHUR CUSHEN reports tentative reception of Danish Forces Radio from Bremerhaven in Germany on 6225, and race commentaries from the Singapore Turf Club via Radio Malaya's Singapore station on 4895. A mystery Spanish language station is heard by **ERNIE** MOORE in Brisbane, opening at 0900 GMT on 4785 with the playing of the 'Star Spangled Banner' – perhaps Puerto Rica? Amongst the 15 contributors to Shortwave Mailbag, ROSS GIBSON in Oamaru has a good list of logs and QSLs including Brazzaville 11970 and Azores 11090. The medium wave column 'Kings of the Kilocycles' has 27 contributors (10 from Invercargill!). LYNDSAY GERRIE reports he has all NZers verified except non-replier 2ZM; LOFTY GARDINER has a big list of Yank QSLs including 8 NZ firsts; new member MERV SMITH has 7 new Yanks logged in one night, and a QSL from 2ZM. BERT THOMSON has extended his antenna out to 500 feet and sent reports out to 2 NZers, 23 Aussies, 2 Indiana and 15 Yanks. The Bulletin also carries quality tips from DX programmes aired by Radio Australia and Radio Sweden, and the Newark News Radio Club

Broadcast News with Bryan Clark in Auckland

NEW ZEALAND Auckland's Pacific Island station 531Pi (531kHz) has announced that its programming will shortly be available in the Waikato, Hawkes Bay, Taranaki, Wellington, Christchurch and Dunedin. Initially broadcast hours will be from 5pm Friday to 6am on Monday. In a press release Robert Jeffares says there will be broadcasts in English, Samoan, Tongan and Cook Island languages. Organisations looking to reach the Pacific Island communities in New Zealand will be able to buy programme blocks of 15, 30 and 60 minutes. (via Andy Gardner) As yet, the frequencies for this new network are not known, Ed) After 10 years on air, Aotearoa Radio Auckland 603 closed at the end of June due to a cut in funding from the Maori Broadcasting Funding Agency Te Mangai Paho, and a lack of advertisers. Difficulties. (Bryan Clark)

AUSTRALIA The Australian Broadcasting Authority (ABA) is in the process of arranging the auctioning of AM & FM frequencies throughout the nation. Many of the Open Narrowcast licences will be auctioned in 1999 as their licences expire on 31 December this year. The following info is taken from ABA's planning documents as the Frequency Allocation Plans and Licence Area Plans are produced:

Innisfail Queensland is to get an Open Narrowcaster on 801 with 2kw as 4QY has vacated to FM. 4TO 774 is to move to 102.3Mhz FM. The 774 channel will be deleted from the Townsville/Mackay plan. Agnes Water (south of Gladstone Queensland) has been alloted 1602 with 50 watts and will carry the ABC Radio Regional network. 4EB 1053 requests higher power or more effective frequency (longer wave end of band). The 783 kHz licence (formerly 2KA) has been mooted to move to Campbelltown NSW with 2kw and will be auctioned in 1999. 828 (formerly 4NA/4SS) will be allocated to an Open Narrowcast licence on Queensland's Sunshine Coast - Nambour with 5kw. 1197 (formerly 4GG) has been alloted to Brisbane/Gold Coast and will go to auction in 1999. 1386 (formerly 2EA) will go to auction in 1999 with 5kw at Homebush Bay, Sydney. 1476 (formerly 2KA/t) is to be auctioned in 1999 for Emu Plains NSW with 500 watts. 1593 (formerly 4SO) has also been alloted to Brisbane/ Gold Coast depending upon demand. It will go to auction in 1999 after the Licence Area Plan is produced. (I don't know how 1593 could be in Brisbane as 1611 is also allocated to Brisbane (currently 'warehoused' (ABA term) by the Dance Music Radio mob at Nerang who run on 1620kHz]). The following frequencies are to go to auction in 1999 as their current Open Narrowcaster licence allocations expire on 31st December 1998 - 801 Gosford. 1116 Melbourne, 1314 Woollongong, 1341 Geelong, 1422 Melbourne, 1539 Sydney, 1593 Melbourne. DXers should try to verify these stations as they could go within a year and be replaced by newer ones. Note that ABA Engineering deems the frequency of 909kHz will always to be vacant in Australia due to problems caused by some poor quality receivers with their 455kHz oscillators beating against 909 (2x455 =910 gives 1Khz beat). In the 'Melbourne Age' newspaper's Green Guide it is reported that 927 Sports Radio has taken over the old 3BA Ballarat transmitter on 1314. This is in addition to the recent takeover of 945 in Bendigo. The station has recently bought a licence in Shepparton for \$35,000, possibly for 1260 and is also looking at obtaining a licence for the Gippsland region. (Dave Onley email via Paul Ormandy) Al Kirton of Innisfail Queensland station 4KZ advises "In the not too distant future we are increasing power from 5,000 to 10,000 watts. Address: KKTR, PO Box 250028, 1500 Cotner Avenue, Los Angeles CA 90025 (Patrick Martin) A couple of interesting items on this station from the FCC database. This is a two-site installation with the day and night transmitters in different locations. The coordinates for the day site are the same as those for KLTX / 1390 licensed in the city of Long Beach. The database shows the full 10 kw with a 364 (231.2 degree) tower. A tower of this length would be considered as an 'anti-fade' antenno at this frequency and should show a good gain factor. The coordinates for the night site are the same as those for KVNR /1480 licensed in the city of Santa Ana. The database shows 930 watts into a 166' (105.6 degree) antenna at this site which is just barely over $1/\epsilon$ wave. Santa Ana and Long Beach are only about 12 miles apart. The cost of 2 transmitters and the necessary tuning/duplexing units plus the STL links to 2 sites is very high. You have

to wonder why they did this. (Pat Griffith via IRCA's AM DX NewsFlash email)

Mid-Air Collision over Namibia

Following on from the report in December 1997 DX Times, some further information has been received. The aircraft involved, a Tupolev 154 of the German Air Force and a C141B of the USAF were bound to Capetown via Windhoek in the case of the Tupolev, and to Ascension in the case If the C141B. At 1610 hours the C141B took off from Windhoek and about an hour later both aircraft disappeared. The US Defence Department reported that around that time a bright light was detected by a military satellite-this was thought to be consistent from an aircraft explosion. At the time of the supposed collision both aircraft were flying at 35,000 feet off the South West African coast, and it is believed that they were operating on different frequencies, and with the notoriously poor ATC facilities each aircraft was probably unaware of its close proximity to the other. In spite of aerial and maritime searches little wreckage was found other than a crew member's body and some airscraft parts. According to the Aerada African supplement of January 1997, Luanda, Namibia controls overflights in SW Africa on a number of AFI 4 frequencies, while Windhoek controls only two domestic frequencies.
