Welcome again. Sources: DXW - DX Window (Danish SW Clubs International); CDX - Cumbre DX; Hauser/SWDXR - Glenn Hauser's SW DX Reports. 'Various reports' indicates the item is an amalgam of sources sifted and sorted by the contributor. I'm an interventionist editor: condensing, collating, and cross-checking, rather than just rehashing great slabs of info from sources and leaving it for you to decipher!

**Belgium:** RTBF has started a 'Radio Balkan' service in French and Albanian, 2100-2200 on 7345 via Julich. (RTBF/Francis)

**Bolivia:** Radio Mosoj Chaski, Cochabamba is a new station which has been widely heard on 3310 since mid-April. from 0900 sign-on. Transmitter is 10kw. (Various sources/Francis)

China: CRI new schedule for English to Pacific: 0900-1100 11730, 15210; 1200-1300 6950, 7265, 11675; 1300-1400 11675, 11900. SE Asia: 1200-1300 9715, 11660; 1300-1400 11660, 11980, 15180. South Asia 1400-1500 11825, 15110; 1500-1600 7160, 9785. (CRI/ Francis) Interesting that CRI which for many, many years used the same frequencies without change now makes regular and sometimes inexplicable frequency movements.

Cuba: Lots of interesting activity to report. Radio Rebelde has an expanded schedule on SW to Latin America and the Caribbean: 6140, 9600 1100-1400, and 0300-0400 6120. These frequencies are additional to long-time 5025. Reception reports can be sent to Radio Rebelde, PO Box 6277, Habana, Cuba 10600, or via email to Arnie Coro at Radio Habana Cuba. Commenced May 8. (DXW, CDX and info from RHC web site). Meanwhile China Radio International appears to have started relays via Cuba: 0100-0157 English, and 0200-0300

Chinese on 9570. These services do not appear in CRI's latest official schedule. Also using 9570 1200-1400 for Chinese but nothing to suggest it is from Cuba. Also noted on 5990 from 2300. (Francis/various reports)

**United Kingdom:** Merlin Network One has rationalised its usage of frequencies on shortwave: it appears that 13720 for Oceania from 0600-0900 has been deleted. (Francis)

Yugoslavia: There has been much reporting in the international DX press about the on-again, off-again movements of broadcasts from Radio Yugoslavia and Radio Televizija Srbije (Serbian Radio and Television home service). The dramas began on April 23 when the RTS building in Belgrade was bombed by NATO (and several people were killed). Radio Yugoslavia also went off air although its studios were in a different part of Belgrade, and its transmitters are at Bijeljina in Bosnia. However, it appears that the external service programming was fed to the transmitter through the bombed RTS building. The latest state of play seems to be that the home service in Serbian is intermittently on air on 7200 from its trans-

mitter at Stubline in Serbia in the period from 1600-0700, while Radio Yugoslavia also seems to be operating depending on whether the program feed can be linked to the transmitter site. A recent item carried on Radio Yugoslavia's news service said that NATO had bombed repeater stations used for its broadcasts (probably a reference to the microwave links that carry programming feeds) but they had been quickly restored by technicians. English is scheduled at 1830 6100 and 9720, 1900 7230, 2100 6100 and 6185, 0100 and 0430 9580, (Various reports/Francis)

From experience over many years it is very difficult to pick the various languages used, particularly in Central and Eastern Europe and Asia .

Brrrrr... It's getting chilly out there! And it's a good time of the year to check out those early-morning signals - recently heard Vatican Radio at 1900 on 1611kHz and Frontline Soldiers Radio from N Korea on 1613 around the same time... who knows what other goodies are lurking around?

Chris Martin, Ormeau, Qld. "Well finally got down to some antenna repairs whilst at Boreen Point mid April. The pine forest takes its toll on the wires you know with the storms we have been having. Anyway on the first night I was there 20/4 I had a wow of a time on the X Band. Yes folks it was the X Band parade - very civilised with most of the stations presenting themselves individually from east to west for their local sunrise. Highlight for me was logging WHKT Virginia on religious. A new state at last. The following day I ran out a short beverage of 300 meters towards the south west for southern Africans. Mainly aiming for Venda 1035 but ZB is such a pest and it hangs in until after 2300z! Anyway the catch of the morning was VOA Botswana 909 // 7414, 4935 and reliable 1530 at 2000z. Back at Ormeau a few Latins keep their nose above the noise on 730, 760, 960, 1370, 1380, 1460, 1470 & 1500. Logs this month are WRUU 1660, WHKT 1650, WJNZ 1680, KCNZ 1650, KBGG 1700, WTDY 1670, KDDZ 1690, KDIA 1640. & VOA Botswana 909. Noticed whilst scanning across 2BY a promo for: "2CR Western Plains and on Lord Howe Island FM 100 ...". What Lord Howe Is and the NSW Western Plains have in common beats me. One is the most southern coral island in the world and the other is sheep and wheat country. Anyway it seems they are networked for breakfast! Keep your ears on and good DX till next month." 

# Celebrating a Famous DX Milestone

Saturday 22 May 1999 is the 75th anniversary of a very significant DX milestone between New Zealand and South America. The event is described as follows in the excellent publication "Ham Shacks, Brass Pounders & Rag Chewers, a History of Amateur Radio in New Zealand" written by Ian Dougherty. The book was published in 1997by the NZ Association of Radio Transmitters, in association with the Historical Branch of the NZ Department of Internal Affairs. On page 39, in the chapter called 'Short Waves & Long Ways' we read:

"The boundaries for two-way contacts were pushed further in 1924, all the way across the Pacific. On the 22nd of May, Ivan O'Meara [Z-2AC] in Gisborne made the first two-way contact with South America when he communicated with Carlos Braggio [R-CB8] in Buenos Aires in Argentina. Their 10,300-kilometre morse code conversation established a world distance record for two-way radio communication. The two men exchanged cables congratulating each other on their record. O'Meara noted in his logbook, "the greatest event in my radio history."

In cooperation with the Argentine Embassy in Wellington, the NZ Radio DX League is marking this milestone with a special award certificate that will be published in early 2000, at the end of the award period.

The award requires participants to tune into Argentine radio stations—these may be on medium wave or shortwave, an international or domestic broadcaster, a utility or amateur transmission. The Argentine station operating from Antarctica is also eligible.

To qualify for the award, you need to submit either:

- a photocopy of 1 QSL verification confirming reception of an Argentine station during 1999. A copy of the reception report may be necessary to validate the date of reception, or
- photocopies of your logging notes establishing your reception of 3 different Argentine radio frequencies.

Entries are to be sent to Argentine Award, NZ Radio DX League, P.O. Box 3011, Auckland, New Zealand, to be received no later than Friday 14 January 2000. To cover printing and postage costs, entries from NZ participants must include NZ\$2.00 in mint stamps, entries from other countries 3 IRCs or US\$3.00.

This DX anniversary is also being celebrated in Argentina, where the contact date was 21 May 1924. The Radio Club Argentino has proposed a special programme of transmissions and awards for the week 16-23 May, including all Argentine amateur operators being permitted to use special ham call prefixes L2, L3 and L4, and a 24 hour CW station on the anniversary date itself. The Radio Club Argentina actually has the very receiver used by Senor Braggio 75 years ago and is attempting to restore it to working condition for the occasion. They will seek to repeat the world record ham contact s with the special callsign of L75CB operating in CW mode on 80 metres for 24 hours continuously on 21 May 1999. L75CB will operate throughout the week 16-23 May and a special QSL is offered. Full details of the awards, which are open to shortwave listeners as well as hams, may be found on the Internet at http://www.lu4aa.org

The easiest heard Argentine radio signal in the South Pacific area at present is Radiodiffusion Argentina al Exterior (RAE) on 15345kHz, audible in various languages be-

tween 2200 and 0200 UTC daily. 11710 may also be audible after 1000 UTC. On Sundays and Mondays (NZT), RAE relays the domestic service Radio Nacional. In our evenings, Radio Nacional may also be audible on 6060kHz. Much more difficult is LRA36 Radio Nacional Arcangel San Gabriel from the Argentine base at Esperanza in Antarctica, transmitting on 15475.8kHz between 1800 and 2100 UTC (to 2000 weekends). Argentine SSB utility transmissions, including occasional relays of various Buenos Aires domestic MW and FM stations can sometimes be heard on 15820kHz.

# Domestic Broadcasting Service (DBS)

NEW PUBLICATION AVAILABLE - edited by Anker Petersen for the DANISH SHORTWAVE CLUB INTERNATIONAL

The DSWCI which counts about 400 experienced DX-ers in 45 countries all over the world, has just published its annual Tropical Bands Survey for the 27th year in a row. Since most DSWCI members are devoting most of their DXing to domestic broadcasting stations, not only on the tropical bands (120, 90 and 60 mb), but also on the higher shortwave bands, the Club has decided to expand this Survey to the full shortwave spectrum of 2200 - 22000 kHz. Future surveys will now concentrate on stations broadcasting to a domestic audience or relaying such broadcasts to expatriates abroad.

This new Domestic Broadcasting Survey (DBS) is based upon many official sources and DX-bulletins. In order to make the DBS reliable, each station frequency has been confirmed on the air by DSWCI monitors around the world and is marked with an A or B in the list. To make this DBS up-to-date, most frequencies that have not been heard during the past year have been deleted. From this worldwide monitoring effort throughout the period May 1998 - April 1999, each entry in the Survey is classified using the following codes for their appearance on the frequencies mentioned: A: Regular. B: Sporadic. C: Likely inactive. S: Seasonal changes.

The 44 pages A-4 size DBS is available for US\$12 (Cash notes are accepted) or 14 IRCs per issue with airmail delivery. A 15% discount is given, if a DX Club orders a total of 20 copies or more. ### THE SONY AWARD 1999

Thanks to the generosity of Sony by way of product donations to the 1998 Convention, the North Otago Branch has a surplus of funds available, an amount of which has been set aside to provide prizes for the annual Sony Award. The remainder will go towards running our next Convention, tentatively in February 2002 - and it isn't too early to start planning now!

Two changes this year, the contest is only open to New Zealand residents and as with last year, there are two prizes of NZRDXL subscriptions on offer. The contest involves listening to a certain area of the short-wave band between specific times and dates, listing all the stations heard (in the following order: Time in UTC, Frequency, Station, Language, Signal Strength along with Total Points Scored) and submitting the entry by a certain date. Here are the details for the 1999 Sony Award:

Frequency range: 5900 - 6300 kiloHertz

Time: 0730 - 1015 UTC

Date: from now till July 15th.

Please note that entries must be post-marked no later than July 18th and received by July 23rd. The winner of one subscription shall be on a points basis ascertained by the following scoring method; 3 points for the fist time a station is logged and one point for every other time. For example - if you hear Radio Australia on four frequencies, it's worth a total of six points, 3+1+1+1=6 points. If you hear for example, the VOA relayed via several different countries, it's 3 points for the first log from every country followed by 1 point for each subsequent logging from that country.

The second winner will be ascertained by means of a draw - and to enter the draw a list of at least 10 stations is required - the winner of the points section will not be eligible for the draw prize as well.

#### " BEEP BEEP BEEP BEEEEEP "

It is 75 years since the BBC first broadcast the six pip Greenwich Time Signal. The "pips " have been used by millions of people in the UK and around the world to set their clocks and watches. Heard before the main news bulletin on radio, they have also preceded some of the great announcements of the 20th century, from the invasion of Poland in 1939

to the death of Diana, Princess of Wales, in 1997. To mark the special anniversary, the two original clocks that were used to time the pips have been returned to the Royal Observatory Greenwich, and will be on public display. The time pieces have been in storage for several years, but according to Jonathan Betts, the observatory's Curator of Horology, are still in perfect working order. All that is required is some light cleaning and re-lubrication. The pips system was devised by the ninth Astronomer Royal, Frank Dyson, in consultation with, Frank Hope-Jones, the manufacture of the free pendulum clock. Time was marked by two weight driven astronomical regulators - one was a back up in case of breakage. Electrical contacts attached to the pendulum sent pulses from Greenwich to the BBC's headquarters at Broadcasting House where a valve oscillator circuit converted the signal into the now famous six tones. The clocks No 2016 and 2012 were actually built in 1874 and were eventually relieved of their pip duties in 1949. Today the BBC keeps its own time with two atomic clocks sighted in the basement of Broadcasting House. These are kept in step by signals received from the Global Positioning Satellite by information received from the system and Rugby radio transmitter facility. It is an interesting fact that the Greenwich Time Signal no longer gives Greenwich Mean Time, as since 1972 all the time sig-Chave been based on atomic time. This nals in the world is far more regular drifts as the speed of the earth's rotathan GMT which tion changes. Differences between the two mean "leap seconds" occasionally need to be added to the time signal by means of an extra pip. This keeps the two types of time roughly in step. This oddity is one of the reasons why the last pip is slightly longer than all the rest. As a consequence of going over to atomic time, ever so occasionally, a seven pip time signal like there was at the end of December, is needed. The long pip indicates the last pip.

The 6 pips of GMT were first sounded before the main BBC radio news bulletin on the 5th February 1924 and have become in BBC terms an institution. In fact the pips are so hallowed that they even carry their own vocabulary, For a presenter to talk over them is called "crashing " and is the ultimate BBC sin
