Lindsay Robinson, Invercargill has something to say about pirate radio: 'regarding shortwave pirate radio stations for the Best-of-the Month competition — yes, they should be included. They play music the same as any other radio station. They do put their transmitter powers on their QSLs. If we don't believe the station engineer or operator, who do we believe? Including shortwave pirates in the BOM competition makes it much more interesting."

(Totally agree Lindsay. The BOM needs support not obstacles. I vaguely remember some suggestion that reporting pirates wasn't encouraged at all, and that some held suspicions about the accuracy of powers being reported. We have access to enough online and other material these days to know whether claimed powers are reasonable. Seems to me that all reporting and QSLs of pirates on SW, MW and FM should be encouraged in these pages.

In fact, I think they should be an integral part of the BOM, and not a separate category. If we could bring back the points system of years ago, we could have BOM for all categories, including FM and Utilities as well. Why not?)

On the subject of pirates, Laurie Boyer, Invercargill tells us that 1349 pirate radio stations in London and 1000+ in other parts of the UK were raided by the authorities in 2000.

Plenty of DX targets amongst that lot! Apparently, the British still spend their time running around like Keystone Cops trying to close down such stations, claiming the old chestnuts that such broadcasts endanger other (read tax or fee paying) broadcasters and, of course, put aircraft at risk. The article Laurie sends gives two examples of broadcasts on aeradio channels. Out of 2350 + busts. (Scottish Weekly News, January 6 2001).

Jack Searle, Haumoana says 'was intrigued by information in the recent article about Australian/NZ MW stations regarding allocated maximum permissable powers and the weird figures such as 63.0 kW for 630 kHz. These can't be the rated outputs of the transmitters in use. And the low powers of 251, 316 and 398 watts. I would've thought the maximum allowed outputs would have been set in a nice round figure. Is this the result of some imperial to metric conversion?

(I'm sure engineering inclined members can answer this better than one who shudders at the entrails of any radio! However, I gather it's rather simple. Each frequency is the subject of regional use arrangements, and technical specifications allow for maximum db radiation levels in various directions. Especially on shared frequencies, of which there are an increasing number in NZ. These radiation levels can be expressed in watts needed to deliver the signal up to the technical specification. Hence, 630 in Napier currently has a 20kW transmitter, but could pump out 63kW before exceeding interference to other stations in Australia/NZ — after utilising any directional patterns needed to protect those other stations.

As to nice round figures — they really don't exist except for convenience as a maximum allowed. So, a QSL showing 2kW may have been issued for an actual power of 1995 watts. Sometimes, stations issue QSLs with the exact power at the time of transmission. Most times I would guess they just tell us the rated power. In view of Lindsay's comments above, it seems another reason to treat all QSLs, pirate or otherwise, in the same way.)

Transmitter powers seem to be the topic of this month. Whilst in Rome last month, I read that **Vatican Radio** was under threat of closedown because of excessive electro-magnetic pollution. The station claimed it was operating within environmental and legal regulations, but local people are getting annoyed with hearing programs in their dental fillings, their washing machines and fridges as well as being exposed to the high radiation levels. The station has to make some changes if it wants to continue.

The Italians are showing an even hand. They've also forced the closure of the

AFRTS radio network in and around **Naples** for the same reason. Apparently someone did a count of transmitters (radio, TV, microwave etc) on the surrounding hills, and came up with a horrifying number. Environmentally, the electro-magnetic emissions are simply no longer acceptable, and some Italian radio networks have also lost their relays in the Naples area.

Guess that makes **Internet Radio** and audio streaming rather more acceptable? You don't need ugly towers ruining the countryside. However, the Australians seem to be taking a great leap backwards — with **Austereo (2DAY etc)** actually turning off their audio streaming and web broadcasts. They claim it costs them 'hundreds of thousands' of dollars, and put the blame on advertising agencies and advertisers for not supporting the service. Strange, live programs already carry adverts of course, so why would anyone want to pay extra for banners. We listen to radio, we don't read radio.

Austereo says it will keep it's websites for program and personality profiles, competitions etc. Very boring. Sounds like they're more concerned that listeners may migrate to the

net, and won't be counted in the ratings surveys which determine their commercial advertising rates. Here 2Day, gone tomorrow maybe. A strange decision when mobile phones are about to become the new transistor radio in Australia.

After cleaning up Italy, environmentalists may turn their attention to towers in other countries, and some stations will be glad they're audiostreaming. Tower companies like TVNZ's Broadcast Communications Limited (who manage all the ABC and RNZ sites as well) may be sitting on a goldmine, or skating on very thin ice as emission controls become stricter

Radio NZ also halts webstreaming according to an article in Internet News (via **Ralph Sutton**) after the failure of a two year pilot with a local web developer. Rather obviously too, as it cost NZ\$250 to subscribe to the service for a year just to hear National Radio. The site was very non-user friendly in my opinion, and RNZ is light years behind the ABC in embracing the web to showcase its programs, services and RNZI as well as providing audiostreaming for global audiences including the 450,000 Kiwis living in Australia.

ABC Radio has local studios and programs (many of which are audio streamed as well as broadcast on AM and FM) whilst RNZ has shut down local studios and programs, switched off transmitters, leased part of their network, pulled down towers and its own Broadcasting House and now pulls out of webstreaming. However, this is a broadcaster in deep crisis and starved of resources and innovative thinking for too long.

WorldSpace satellite radio targets Australia with plans for both a rural and metro network. Via AsiaStar, they can deliver 120+ separate program channels, and already broadcast directly to portable satellite receivers made by Hitachi, JVC, Sony and Panasonic. They have a detachable, flat antenna and retail for about NZ\$300 in many parts of the world. AsiaStar delivers 20 channels already to China, Japan, India, Malaysia, Philippines and Thailand. They also carry BBC World, CNN Radio and now, WRN who package public broadcaster programs from several countries. (AMT)

No, it's not DX as we know it at all, but as I've said before, there's a transmitter (on the satellite) and a receiver, so when will the first AsiaStar DX reports appear in these pages? The signals are free and uncoded.

Tele Nouvelle-Caledonie is now broadcasting direct via satellite to Australia, New Zealand and other parts of the Pacific. TNC is part of the French state RFO stable, and is slowly building a pan-pacific regional TV channel in EE/FF. Again, there's a transmitter (on the satellite) and anyone with the right dish and a satellite receiver can watch it today. Again, when will the first TNC DX reports appear in these pages? Again, the signal is free and uncoded.

USA goes Latin is another challenge for DXers! Fully one-third of Texan AM stations now program fully or partly in Spanish. DXer **John Bryant** has put together a website with full details of the stations, links etc which you can find at www.bryant.ceat.okstate.edu/RADIO1 (Greyline DX).

It's official too. The US Census Bureau says the population of the top 100 metro areas in the US places 'non-whites' in the majority for the first time ever. The surge in the Latiinisation of the SW states plus Florida, and large increases in Asians have pushed the change. For DXers, learning SS or Korean or Chinese may help you log Yanks in the future!

Better learn those national anthems! **Volker Willschrey, Saar, Germany** suggests checking out www.thenationalanthems.com where you'll find 193 national anthems and songs to help ID those signals. (via GRDXC India).

At 2003 the ID and some announcements followed. **At the same time,** US DXer Glenn Hauser warns not to take a LRA36 logging for granted: If you hear Spanish on 15476, better not assume it's LRA36. April 13 at 0115 I found a weak signal in Spanish on 15476, but this proved to be a spur from R. Martí, Delano, 15330, where it was putting in an overpowering signal, also splattering 15310-15350. AUSTRALIA: The Australian Broadcasting Authority has allocated the first 2 international broadcasting licenses for shortwave broadcasts from Australia issued under the new legislative regime for international broadcasting. They have been issued to Christian Voice (which will operate from Darwin), and HCJB, which will operate from a purpose-built facility at Kununurra in the Kimberley region of north-western Australia. CV is targeting audiences in SE Asia, China and India with Chinese, English and Hindi programs. HCJB will beam towards South Asia and the South Pacific. Applicants for international broadcasting licenses commit to abide by International Broadcasting Guidelines issued by the ABA. The licenses have been issued after consultation with the Minister for Foreign Affairs on national interest considerations. (ARDXC)

Radio Ezra, religion via Belgium

What seems to be a private crusade for Christianity has hit the Web and the international shortwave bands. Calling his mission Water Into Wine Ministry, John D. Hill in Stockton on Tees, UK, invites "all believers and none" to his web site, as well as to his "own private radio station" on shortwave 15440 kHz, a station scheduled to broadcast a 15 minute weekly programme every Sunday at 1100-1115 UTC. "My message, like Ezra's, is to rebuild the spiritual condition of the people of God", says John D. Hill on his web pages. Radio Ezra, starting broadcasting on March 25, has been heard by several DXers already. The station broadcasts from Wavre, Belgium, using a 100 kW transmitter. Transmissions are targeted for "Europe, North Africa, Middle East, North America". (HCDX) And the latest info via Barry Williams is that tests will conclude June 17th and reception reports are requested to P.O.Box 16, Stockton on Tees, TS18 3GN, UK. This Angolan Catholic broadcaster station first came on the air in 1954, but was nationalized by the Marxist MPLA-led government after Angola's independence in 1975. In March 1997 Radio Ecclésia was re-inaugurated in the presence of the Archbishop of Luanda and Angolan political leaders. Nonetheless the station was subjected to political pressure because of its editorial policy. Co-operating closely with Portuguese Catholic broadcaster Radio Renascenca for journalistic training and news services Radio Ecclésia breached semi-official orders to abstain from reporting on dissenting voices in Luanda, the capital of Angola and on the Angolan civil wars going on both in the South as well as in Cabinda since independence in 1975. In July 2000 Radio Ecclésia was given 2 hours airtime daily on transmitters of Radio Netherlands in order to give greater coverage to peace negotiations going on for Angola. (Dr.

Hansjoerg Biener Apr 11) Radio Netherlands ended the broadcasts after just a short time, citing technical difficulties in receiving the feed from Angola. Interesting that they would resume via Germany vice Madagascar/Netherlands as before. WORLD BEACON: World Beacon to test 9675 from UAE

Having failed to start testing as planned on March 25, the religious broadcaster World Beacon now plan to test a Merlin transmitter site in the United Arab Emirates in mid April. "We had originally planned to test a 17 MHz frequency from that location, but it has occurred to us that if we can make 9675 KHz work from Abu Dhabi, it will be a great year-round frequency that won't need to change with the seasons", Scott Westerman at World Beacon explains. Now the station plan to compare 9675 KHz from the UAE with their 9675 facility in Rampisham, England. "At this point, I'm hopeful that the test will commence on Tuesday, April 10", 1900-2100utc Westerman says, adding: "To encourage hobbyists to help us evaluate the world wide impact of this potential change, we've created a limited edition QSL card to commemorate the test. We will send this card to anyone who reports reception on 9675 from the UAE during our test period."

And the latest from Scott Westerman on this ongoing saga:- Here's an update on our test transmission project from the United Arab Emirates. We're having a minor technical chal-

lenge getting the Beacon audio feed on the air from UAE, and for the sake of moving ahead with our tests, we authorized Merlin to run a BBC feed from that site to see what coverage is like. It's intermittently on the air between 19-21 UTC on 15470 kHz and my listening posts in Accra, Nairobi, Luande, Jo'burg and Madagascar all report that it booms in like a local AM station. We'll be working on getting a Beacon audio feed on that channel and I'll shoot you a note when it's up and running. In the meantime, your reports on the BBC feed to scott@worldbeacon.net are welcome. If this frequency plan works out, the World Beacon will settle into a four hour daily schedule to Africa on two frequencies. We will likely keep our 3230 kHz tropical band channel as that does well in the South, and will pick up a second frequency to cover the northern half of the continent. We're still on 9675 kHz from Rampisham while we sort things out. Our Russian initiative is also right on schedule for a June 1 launch. I'm attending the National Association of Broadcasters conference in Las Vegas next week and will be meeting with our Merlin partners to finalize plans for a four hour daily program to Eastern Europe and the former Soviet Union. Southland Institute of Technology FM Invercargill has new 24/7 FM station, located at Southland Institute of Technology. Known as Efm 100.7 the station started April 28, and plays a broad mix of music unlike most student stations which program alternative music. C93FM to close, Solid Gold moves in Christchurchís C93FM is to cease broadcast on Monday (30 April), replaced from Tuesday (1 May) by Solid Gold (currently on AM only). RadioWorks Christchurch GM **Renata Hayward** says the change will allow the resources

currently spread across two local stations (C93 and Lite FM) to be focused on one. It is also a response to demands from Solid Gold listeners for FM-quality sound. (e-MedianStrip April 27)

WILD Brisbane is operated by One FM Broadcasters Incorporated and is separate from WILD Sydney, which is run by Sydney Youth Radio Incorporated. Wild Brisbane told AMT: iThe high cost of broadcasting in Brisbane took its toll on the station last year and numerous attempts to revive the station have proved unsuccessful. With the full time licence applications now closed, there is little point in further attempts to revive the station. WILD Brisbane has been extremely successful and it's unfortunate that these problems have arisen so close to the license decision.î (AMT Newsletter - May 2001)

Reef FM on air this month Whitsundays community station, 89.1 Reef FM, is on track to officially go to air on the 12th May. The construction of 89.1 Reef FM's studio in the grounds of the Barrier Reef TAFE at Cannonvale in the Whitsunday coastal town of Airlie Beach, is well advanced. Installation of the equipment and placement of the antennas on Shingley Hill in Airlie Beach begin next Monday with scheduled testing on Thursday 10th May 2001, two days prior to the commencement of 24 hour broadcasting. The station has received \$43,000 in RAP funding by Federal Member of Parliament for Dawson, De-Anne Kelly, which will assist in funding the broadcast equipment. Mrs. Kelly said that the radio station would also provide an opportunity to continually promote the Whitsunday region and its unique features as the gateway to the Whitsunday Islands. "Whilst the Whitsundays are served by the ABC and commercial radio there has been no community oriented station to give priority to the social and economic interests of the local community," said Ms. Kelly. The official launch and celebrations of the Whitsundays own radio station, 89.1 Reef FM, will be incorporated into this years Whitfunday, a Whitsunday community celebration day planned for June 17th. If your receiver isn't that hot on sensitivity or you'd like to add some gain from your short antenna can I recommend the antenna amplifier kit from Jaycar Electronics in Auckland. It's a German broadband antenna amp covering 150 khz to 350 Mhz, runs on a 9v battery and generates a gain of from 5 to 20 db. Input 50-240 ohms, output 60-75 ohms. Assessing Quartz Hill: The new Te Araroa

Peter Chambers takes his DX-mobile over the hills and far away to make some reception comparisons at the old Radio New Zealand receiving station at Quartz Hill near Wellington. Te Araroa also gets a visit to see what's new.

I visited Quartz Hill from March 12 to 16 but with medium wave mediocre at best I spent most of my time on the utility bands. On my first visit to Quartz Hill I didn't think that the

existing Vee antennas were much chop for MW purposes and that a 100m groundwire would probably do much better. I was proved very wrong on the more recent visit. Comparisons were made between two Northern American groundwires and the North American (South) Vee. The Vee antenna did heaps better both on the x-band and MW North American signals. Signals were much stronger and clearer than the groundwires and the X band Aussies did not pester the North Americans as much, later at night. While I don't think the South Vee is up to beverage standard it is indeed a useful directional aerial that great North American DX could be received with good propagation. For medium wave Latin DX the Europe longpath Vee is surprisingly inferior to the rhombic switched to the south position. The rhombic is definitely the best MW Latin aerial and also for 120, 90 and 60 metre Brazilians.

Average performance communications receivers i.e. Drake R8A, ICOM, ICR70 and 71, Sony 6800W etc will collapse into a heap of intermodulation if connected direct to the Quartz Hill Vee and rhombic antennas due to the massive Wellington AM RF from Titahi Bay. An antenna tuner/attenuator is a must to get any MW and X band DX from such receivers. The NRD545 performs superbly with no outboard help required. Even with an NRD545 or suitable tuners, some intermod products remain which aren't receiver generated but caused by rectification in the farm fencing under the aerials and re-radiated. While noticeable during the daytime on MW and lower SW frequencies, they get swamped into oblivion as soon as evening propagation fires up.

The second DX trip undertaken by Neville McKenty and myself was to Te Araroa. A new motor camp has been established about 1.5 km towards Te Araroa township from the motor camp some of us have visited before. It is sited about 300 metres short of the beach. Like the other camp, beverage aerials can be erected easily across flat, grazed grass paddocks for hundreds of metres from the NE to SSE. No dreaded swamp to negotiate. Electrical noise levels are much lower than the original camping ground. The 11kv power transformer is out on the main road and only a 230V line comes to the campsite via an underground cable to the buildings. We DX-ed from the tent site kitchen block using 100m groundwires. Running the radios off mains power we had zero power noise and no significant TVI despite a TV operating in the main building. A very promising place indeed that I will do a more detailed write up on soon. North American DX was the best I've heard anywhere in the last two or three years, and that was just with a groundwire.
