

Now that winter has arrived, a warm fire, great DX and dreams of tropical islands should help you enjoy our contributions this month.

George Rolton, Hampden, North Otago sends in news about DRM (Digital Radio Mondiale) from the May 2001 *Practical Wireless*: One of the problems that some engineers have predicted and that DRM may still have to contend with is that the digital tests on a.m. may create interference on nearby channels. The (February 2001) Juelich (Germany) tests were on 5900 and a very experienced listener, using high-end equipment, reported that the digital signal on 5900 totally killed 5895 and 5905, and interfered with 5890 and 5910 kHz.

The article goes on to say that cheap receivers are coming on the market already, and that DRM expect many new services to be operating within a year or so. On the one hand, a broadcaster may need to use less assigned frequencies. But, on the other, they may then ruin reception on adjoining frequencies. A lot of disruption to reception is expected (on both AM and SW) as digital radio is phased in.

Advance announcements of future digital tests can be found at the DRM website www.drm.prg. (Have any members noticed interference to adjoining channels from digital transmissions?)

David Miller, Dunedin writes about the **FRG7 receiver**: In an old Practical Wireless magazine, I've found an article about modifications to the FRG7. Satellite Radio's 'Roll' satellite launched in early May, following 'Rock' a month or so earlier. Carrying 100+ channels of radio programs, the first signals were heard in Perth just 70 minutes after launch. The transmitters on board pump out 18kW of power. (PIR)

Solomon Islands a slowly disintegrating nation where government agencies have no telephones and most of the income is now foreign aid wants something to take local minds off the looming disaster. Their government has called for tenders to introduce a free to air **TV service**. Home of the infamous 'cargo cult' following WWII, the 21st century version obviously includes color TV sets.

(Other Australian commercial stations will be rolling out similar anniversaries over the coming years, generating considerable interest in the heritage of radio. DXers have a story to tell as part of the growth of radio, as early DX reports helped the

stations improve coverage and service.)

Community Radio in Australia has grown in the past 20 years, and is bigger than many DXers may realise. There are 200+ stations and 135+ more waiting for licences. Over 60% have a general format, others include ethnic, aboriginal, religious, sports, print handicapped and classical music. They employ 20,000 volunteers and over 60% of them are located outside the big cities. NSW has the most with 36%, followed by Victoria with 23% and Queensland with 17%. Many are on FM and are heard here in NZ during the summer FM season. (AMT)

David Norrie, Auckland encourages members concerned about the **closure of BBC shortwave services to Australia and New Zealand** to lodge their views with Martin Williams, High Commissioner, British High Commission, PO Box 1812, Wellington. Emails can be sent to bhcpress@xtra.co.nz as well.

The BBC is closing the service in favor of local FM rebroadcasts, internet audio streaming and satellite audio service. Whilst this may be fine for the USA, Canada and even Australia (where some community stations rebroadcast the BBC), New Zealand is currently served only by a weak AM signal in Auckland (1476) and an audio channel on the Telstra-Saturn

cable TV service which reaches a relatively small number of households in Wellington and Christchurch.


Graeme Dixon, Auckland adds 'If the BBC think they'll serve the Pacific by internet, tell them to think again. If they guarantee an audio streaming service that is net congestion free, then I'd consider listening to them on the net.

Listeners coming across 'net congestion' and audio drop-outs will get very annoyed, go listen to another station or dig the spuds. It's time to get real, only listening to the BBC on the internet with constant net congestion is not acceptable.

There's something unique about shortwave radio, the audio, the fades; but, on the hour on SW, the famous 'This is London'. Come on BBC World Service, stick with SW, a transmission system you're very good at.'

40% of Americans listen to Internet Radio by 2003 is the prediction from Webnoize, as broadband services allow smooth audiostreaming, and no net congestion problems. This is expected to have a major impact on standard AM/FM stations, where digital radio and concentration of ownership and national brands or 'networks' are seen as one answer. (AMT)





This is short sighted in the extreme cutting off the BBC's continuous service to the majority of New Zealand. Aucklanders are fortunate that 1476kHz continues on medium wave, but unless you wish to be glued to the internet on real audio, tying up your phone line, possibly running up a bill, the BBC will end. Its shortwave servicehas served NZ forthe last 70 years.

We recognise that shortwave will be the major way most of our audiences listen to our services for a considerable time to come and it would be wrong to portray this as a retreat from shortwave broadcasting. World Service has already announced major investment in

shortwave, such as the new transmitter currently under construction in Oman which will enhance reception quality for millions of listeners from the Middle East across Central and South Asia. We also modernising our shortwave transmitters in Cyprus and Singapore." (RN Media Network)

Auckland guardband stations Another Auckland guardband station heard for the first time today (4 June). Shore FM 100.6 is located on Auckland's North Shore. Plays mostly oldies vocals, including early rock and roll. Slogans heard include - "Timeless Radio for the Shore" and "Shore Radio, the Home of Frank Sinatra". Quite a few professional commercials, short news bulletins and weather. But the youthful announcers aren't perhaps ideal for the format - as in pronouncing Mel Torme's surname as Torm. Per their website, George FM Auckland is now relayed on 90.4 FM in Queenstown. (Bryan Clark)

Life FM in Hawkes Bay Per their 'Frequency' magazine, Rhema Broadcasting Group's Life FM is now broadcasting on 93.5 FM in the Hawkes Bay. (Bryan Clark)

Coast-Grown Coast-Wide West Coast Broadcasting Corporation, based in Hokitika, plans a 'coast-grown, coast-wide' local community station to be on air by August. Initially broadcasting to Hokitika, then north as far as Westport. Director Gary Bowering says frequencies are in place and that a new local station is viable. All programs will originate in Hokitika. (check of Frequency Register doesn't show them as owner, so they're obviously leasing) Assumed service is on FM, but Rhema outlets 1368 and 648 AM in Greymouth may be leased. (The Press via www.stuff.co.nz via David Ricquish)

Groovini in Wellington Groove 88.4 Island Bay, Wellington says it has a new aerial system and location which should increase coverage ten-fold. Currently only heard in southern suburbs with cafe/jazz/standards format. (The Groove via David Ricquish)

Radio from the free polytech Invercargill has new 24/7 FM station, located at Southland Institute of Technology . Known as Efm 100.7 the station started April 28, and plays a broad mix of music unlike most student stations which program alternative music. (The Southland Times via www.stuff.co.nz via David Ricquish)

Strawberry fields forever Waimate in South Canterbury Rainbow Dairy building, xmitter will cover 10km radius from central Waimate. (South Canterbury News via www.stuff.co.nz via David Ricquish)

Coromandel stations join forces Four small independent stations in the Coromandel region are joining forces under a new banner, the Peninsula Radio Network, in a bid to compete regionally -and nationally for advertising dollars. 98FM, Mercury FM, Beach FM and The Rhythm will remain separate and independent, says 98FM's Colin McCabe, but will begin marketing themselves as a collective and sharing resources. "Between the stations we cover the majority of the Coromandel, and all four of us have been here for more than five years - so it's not like a start-up operation. "We see this move as a way to help secure our fair share of the advertising pie, and offer our advertisers something new." (Median Strip - 8 June)

Zone88FM gets new look Queenstown rock station Zone88FM has a new-look website, making plentiful use of the splendid local scenery. Check out: www.zone88fm.com (Median Strip - 8 June)

Sydney community stations New community FM stations approved for Sydney are: 92.1 MCR (Muslim Community Radio), 15kW; 93.7 Gadigal (Aboriginal/Torres Strait Islander ethnic) 50kW; and 94.5 FBi (youth and non-mainstream arts communities) with 150kW. With these sorts of powers, they're all starters for Trans-Tasman skip. All must be on air by May 2002. Another 3 community stations may be granted after a review of Sydney's needs and 1386 MW may get one of them. Another new community licence: WOW-FM (Way Out West) granted licence for Penrith, 100.7 FM with general format which leans towards Fine Music. (AMT Newsletter via David Ricquish)

WSFM's translator service for Western Sydney Following recent ABA planning decisions, 2WS FM has been allowed to cover blackspots in its listening area by using other retransmission frequencies. So WS-FM has launched a new translator service to overcome the reception problems in Penrith, Windsor and Richmond. The translator is located in the lower Blue Mountains and operates on 99.1FM. Another translator serving Camden, Picton and Campbelltown is on 88.3FM. "These low powered local translators are an exciting opportunity for increased radio listening in these two areas and will allow the WS-FM Classic Hits format further growth," said WS-FM General Manager Stephen Pead. (AMT Newsletter)

RED FM acquires North West Radio Network Red FM has acquired the North West Radio Network in Western Australia. Aussie Star Corporate, the operator of RED FM, announced the purchase, subject to ABA approval. The changeover date is scheduled for the end of June. This will give Aussie Star Corporate ownership of stations in Karratha, Port Headland and Broome, as well as remote satellite services in WA. General Manager lan Kennedy said the station is excited about the purchase as it opens up new markets in the booming North West of WA.î (AMT Newsletter)

AUSTRALIA Firstly, Chris Martin and Brian Dodason have been bussing ground the outback... G'Day from Darwin. During our travels up the Stuart Highway we DX'ed from various sites with beverage and box loop antenna and of course matching balun. Some new Aussies were discovered. 621 South West Australia running 'Easy Listening Australia' format. 693 6WR Kununurra with Indigenous format talk back, country music and health issues. Strona. 765 Katherine NT Hot FM (translator) from Darwin. 936 Unk location announces as "You are listening to the Packer Network in and ground the Kimberley and the Pilbara". This one could be at Broome as Broome aets most of the mentions. The fact that they are announcing a network is of interest, could have other outlets on FM. Again format is Indigenous but with far more Didgeridoo music. 1512 Unk location announcers as "FM 98 and on AM 1512 in the mid west". FM 98 operates out of Geraldton. This one is a big signal in the centre of Australia, whilst 693 is solid here in the Top End. (Chris Martin, Grevline DX) Chris Martin's unids: I did a bit of research on the ACA database after reading these and came up with the following... 936 Fitzroy Crossing, WA, 5kW. Registered to Wangki Yupurnanupurru Aboriginal Corporation, PO Box 52, Fitzroy Crossing WA 6765. Callsign 6FX. No other licences though for this, but that doesn't mean they don't relay someone else. 1512 is at Morawa, registered to Geraldton Newspapers, PO Box 128. Geraldton WA 6530. Only gives an EIRP on 8137 watts so I guess a 5kW transmitter also. (Richard Jary, ARDXC) For those who may not have logged 4MB 1161 get a move on! Last night (11/5) at 1300 and this morning at 2130 they were broadcasting a VM indicating a move to 103.5 Mhz. Programme format will be of the ubiquitous MIX-FM variety according to the tape. (John Scache, ARDXC). The future ownership of Brisbane radio stations 4BH and 4KQ is uncertain following the successful \$67 million auction of a new commercial FM licence in Brisbane yesterday. The winning bid by the stations' owners mean one will have to be sold or converted to FM within the next 12 months to meet Australian Broadcasting Authority regulations. Under ABA regulations an organisation is not allowed to control more than two licences in a licence area. Brisbane FM Radio Pty Ltd, a joint venture between British media group DMG Radio and Australian Radio Network (ARN), which is part owned by APN News Media, made the successful bid for the FM licence yesterday. ARN already controls 4BH and 4KQ in Brisbane and APN has newspapers in Ipswich, Toowoomba, other parts of regional Queensland and northern NSW. APN chief executive Vincent Crowley said yesterday it was too early to say what option they would take on the AM stations. The ABA has given the group 12 months to resolve the situation. (lan Johnston, ARDXC) As we know **2YC** started transmission on **1611** in Tamworth and Sydney. When I spoke with them they told me that they would also start transmission from Newcastle. This seemed odd and I asked about the Sydney and Newcastle transmissions overlapping. I was told that they "had done their homework and only a very small area on the Central Coast (Gosford) would be affected". 1701 Sydney was parallel to the Sydney 1611 but that is no longer the case, it is now 2NTC. This morning (Thurs 0530am 1930z), 1611 has at least two stations if not three, So I assume that the Melbourne Networks are coming in. (David Brown, ARDXC) I found a list of Aussie community broadcast stations buried deep

inside the web site for the Australian BC Authority. The URL is http://www.aba.gov.au/what/broplan/community_services.htm You'll need to scroll partway down the page until you find mention of community broadcasting licences, then click on it to download the file. It lists a whole bunch of AM/FM/TV stations operated by aboriginal, ethnic, etc groups. 6FX is among those listed, but it doesn't say much more than what's noted below. Enjoy! (Bruce Portzer, ARDXC) Received an e-mail verie from **Easy Listening 639AM** for a report sent to **2CS**. They didn't ID as 2CS so was wondering anyway. Mail came from Georgina Frogley, Station Manager. She had previously worked for 2CS and said 2CS is now FM. Same s-mail address appears to work for both. Unfortunately I didn't do a 'bookmark' and consequently the letter only shows her name and not the route. Lesson learned!! Of course, all this may show up in the new guide. I haven't ordered mine yet. (Sutton Burtenshaw).

NEW ZEALAND As of last Friday, 1 June, **Lite FM 94.5** has been simulcasting on the old C93 AM frequency of **1260** kHz (or for us oldies, Radio Avon). (Michael Pollard, Ripple DX)

EAST TIMOR From Chris Martin on 'DX Walkabout'... G'Day from Darwin I have been on an excellent DX'pedition up the centre of Australia. Whilst in Darwin have been in contact with the UN office here and on the phone to Dili in East Timor. The UN is running a station "Radio UNTAET" on 684 kHz 24 hours a day with 5Kw. Program is mostly in Indonesian but some English. Portuguese and the local dialect are used. I have heard the station in both English and Indonesian. The over night music program starts at 1200z and runs thru to 2100z. No announcements are made during this period. You can e-mail them at lim4@un.org (technical manager) or drurz@un.org (program manager). The term UNTAET stands for United Nations Transitional Administration East Timor. I have spoken to Lim a few times on the phone which is a local phone call for Darwin and trunks via satellite to the PABX in Dili for which you need to know the extension of the person you require. He tells me that as East Timor is not yet a country and that there is no regulatory control for radio quite a few pirates have sprung up - mostly on the FM band. Further monitoring from a DX site we visited on the Cox Peninsula turned up another station in East Timor on 1404 kHz. This station is run by the Catholic Bishop of Bacau. There is far more Portuguese heard on this station including relays of Radio Portugal. Also lots of religion with prayers by nuns and recitations. Commercials are in Indonesian with reverb. The currency there appears to be Aussie dollars. "Radio Timor" 1404 does not run 24hr. S/on seems to be at 2100z. I am making further enquiry as to the address and any e-mail for the station on 1404. Many mentions of "Timor more as'i " (sic) can be heard and I will find out what this means. To DX East Timor the strongest signal out of 684 & 1404 is by far 1404 kHz and Portuguese should be the clincher for it. East Timor is GMT +9. (Chris martin, Greyline DX).

LESOTHO The former BBC transmitter on **1197 khz** is now carrying **WYFR** programmes at night. I have heard it here in Rio de Janeiro, last night, from 22,10-23,00, with good signal, with a English phone-in. The weird thing is that at 23,00 the program in Italian ("Radio Famiglia") starts. Just wondering how many Italian speaking listeners they do have there. (Rocco Cotroneo,Rio de Janeiro, Brazil via MW DX Group, Yahoo.com) **KAZAKHSTAN** The regional state bc company in Ösqemen (Shyghys Qazaqstan oblysy) on

1071 kHz (100 kW) as this email address: <vktrk@ukg.kz>. The station broadcasts mainly in Russian and identifies in Russian as "Vostochno-Kazakhstanskava oblastnava teleradiokompaniya". DXpedition: Stuart Highway & Cox Peninsula. AUSTRALIA

What follows is an amazing trail of Mediumwave DX as heard by Brian Dodgson & Chris Martin during a 10 day trip up the Stuart Highway and out to Cox Peninsula. Results were like the good ol'days with plenty of African delights. Diego Garcia showed up as a stand out signal around 2130z on 1485. Without a doubt the most potent African signal is VOA Sao Tome 1530 which could be heard on the Sony ICF7600G's built in loop stick. VOA Sao Tome could be followed from the moment it put its carrier on at 1820 till s/off at 2200 word perfect, arm chair copy, rock steady, a joy to listen to. We were amazed to nab Spain on 1359 and we think the signal was coming via west Africa. Other highlights were the logging of East Timor on two frequencies. BBC-WS from Mauritius, two South Africa's, Lesotho, Swaziland, Angola, Ivory Coast, Niger, Mozambique, Radio Free Africa, Tanzania, Madagascar, a mystery in French mixed with Mayotte (also in French). A mystery religious station on 1449 in English, VOA Kuwait, Djibouti, Kenya, Botswana and an Asian list that just goes on

An opportunity to DX in a very remote location isn't an every day thing so when Brian Dodgson offered me the jump seat in his customised 6 tonne 4X4 International Bus travelling from Melbourne to Darwin recently how could I refuse. Well I decided to do it and jumped on the internet to grab a low low air fare. Brisbane Melbourne for just \$96 all up. I arrived on April 25th to find winter had arrived in good ol Mel bourne. On the following day we loaded everything including the kitchen sink and were off to warmer climbs points north. The vitals
