

First non-official A-04 monitoring: Radio Ecclesia, 7205 Meyerton, at 1910, interview, Portuguese 32342 (Silvain Domen, Belgium, Sun. 28 March, DX LISTENING DIGEST)" Radio Ecclèsia is as "non-official" or "official" as any other religious station;) The background of this station seems to be widely misunderstood. Even though Radio EcclEsia is not especially "liked" by the current government, it is a licensed Catholic station in Angola since 1997 (originally active in the country since 1954), broadcasting from studios in Luanda 24h a day via a 5 kW FM transmitter in the Angolan capital. In order to reach remote areas of the country, the station would like to broadcast also on SW from Angolan territory, but the Angolan broadcasting laws did not provide this possibility for a private station so far. That is the reason why Radio Ecclèsia has been renting air time on SW transmitters outside of the country in the last years, most recently via Meyerton, RSA. However, the laws were due to be changed, so that Radio EcclÈsia will have the chance to use its own SW transmitter in Angola: "In June 2003, Media Minister Hendrick Vaal Neto announced plans to change the existing Press Bill, to allow private TV channels as well as privately-run short wave radio stations. While financial considerations will limit the number of applicants for short wave broadcasting, Radio Ecclesia will certainly be a candidate. The Episcopal Conference of Portugal has purchased equipment for Radio Ecclesia to begin short wave operations from Angola, but the station still needs authorization from the Angola government [for the SW facilities -BT]. Funds had been collected in the annual communications campaign of the Bishops Conference in Portugal (DXLD)

New Radio Station in Wanaka

Radio Wanaka owner Ed Taylor will launch Wanaka Rox 97FM on April 1, in a bid to get the edge in the resort's highly competitive broadcasting market. The station will be owned and operated by Radio Wanaka Ltd, which broadcasts Radio Wanaka on 92.2FM. (Otago Daily Times Sat 20 March via George Rolton, Dunedin)

Singleton, Branson to join forces in radio

John Singleton's Macquarie Radio Network has joined forces with Sir Richard Branson's Virgin Group in a partnership they hope will shake up Australia's FM radio network.

The two men, and Macquarie's chairman Sam Chisholm, yesterday announced they would create a new FM radio network by bidding for all three FM radio licences to be auctioned this year, or by merging with or buying their competitors.

The new network could begin operations within four months and is likely to be just the first step in a much bigger expansion of Mr Singleton's media business.

"This is really just the beginning of what we hope is going to be a long-term partnership

[that will] establish a brand new set of rules for the radio industry in this country," Mr Chisholm said

"This is a combination the market should sit up and take notice of, and think about carefully."

Yesterday's announcement comes four months after the collapse of a proposed partial merger of Macquarie's Sydney talkback stations 2GB and 2CH with rival station 2UE.

Macquarie and 2UE's owner, Southern Cross Broadcasting, had hoped to cut costs by sharing their newsrooms and sales forces.

Critics said that plan looked like the first step in a bid by Mr Singleton to eliminate its Sydney competitor.

The partnership with Virgin is far more ambitious. Long-term, it could include a bid for a fourth commercial television licence if the government reviews its current cap of three licences. A review of the regulation is expected this year.

Macquarie may be forced to sell 2CH because Australian Broadcasting Authority regulations prohibit a company owning more than two radio licences in any one market.

However, Mr Singleton said there were "a myriad of ways of complying with the ABA laws", such as Virgin owning 85 per cent of 2CH with the balance held by Macquarie. ABA regulations stipulate ownership above 14.9 per cent represents control of a station.

Virgin's push into the Australian market will increase the competition in an already aggressive industry.

In 2000, DMG, which owns the Nova network, paid \$155 million for a licence in Sydney and \$70 million for a Melbourne licence. Last October it paid \$24 million for a new licence in Adelaide.

DMG Australia's chief executive, Paul Thompson, declined to comment on his new competitors.

Austereo chairman Peter Harvie, who runs the 2Day and MMM networks, said he had not had any talks with Macquarie or Virgin about a sale of Austereo's struggling MMM network.

"You never discount anythina but we have no intention of sellina MMM." Mr Harvie said.

It was hard to comment on the new partnership until their plans became clearer, he said. However, he conceded that if they won licences they would have an impact.

Virgin Radio is expected to keep its costs down by adopting a heavy-on-music, light-on-talk format.

APRIL 2004

Mai FM website (www.maifm.co.nz) carries a statement End of Era for Maori Radio Pioneer detailing history of the contract (which gave impetus to acquiring 1179 AM) and effect on staff. There's also a link to a separate Ruia Mai website which includes audio streaming for those interested in listenina.

They're been playing extended versions of 'Ruia Mai' station ID's, some of which run for several minutes and explain (in Maori and through music) their tribal heritage. A subtle challenge to the funding decision which has favored a non-tribal broadcaster (Wagteg) on Nagti David Ricauish. Whatua's home around.

SOLOMON ISLANDS

Lata currently relays the National Service from Honiara //5020 SW, but is investigating local programs once housing for local staff arranged. SIBC is using a standby generator because of poor local power supplies in Lata. This signal should easily aet into Australia, but the 10kW Radio Tarana on 1386 in Auckland makes NZ reception difficult. Another indication that things are getting more stable in the islands after the Australian/NZ intervention force took control - UCB's Christian FM station in Honiara is also now about to come on air according to the SIBC website. SIBC also uses 1035 AM from Honiara (10kW) and 945 AM from Gizo (10kW) as well as Radio Wantok on FM in Honiara. David Ricauish

According to a report in the Sydney Morning Herald on March 7, ABC's Radio National network may be silenced. It's future is on the agenda of budget talks over the next two months, as the ABC struggles to fund cuts of A\$26m which have already seen several popular TV shows dumped.

APOLOGY In preparing **MIKE BUTLER**'s Propagation Survey for last month's magazine (page 44), there were data and formatting errors. We regret this and hope that an improved format can be found for future surveys in the series.

WHERE ARE THEY NOW? We occasionally hear of former members. For example, in an item from the 11 March issue of Canada's "Globe and Mail" newspaper, a former Wellington DXer RAY GOLDIE is quoted. Speaking at the Prospectors and Developers Association of Canada convention, Ray, a Toronto-based metals analyst, said there is a growing gap between production and demand for Nickel, which means rationing is likely inevitable. The newspaper said that the tight market has sent nickel prices soaring over the past two years, fuelled by a recovering global economy and strong demand from China. That means higher costs for heavy users of stainless steel, everything from cars to appliances. (via Theo Donnelly). This magazine exists on the contributions of members — preferably radio-related, so lets here what you've been listening to.

FLANDERS TODAY is the name of Radio Vlaanderen Internationaal's English language programme. Just to hand is the broadcast schedule valid until 30 October 2004. COLOUR TV MILESTONE 50 years ago, on 25 March 1954, the Radio Corporation of America (RCA) began manufacturing the world's first colour television sets. That first production run was just 500 units of the 12-inch screen CT-100 model, with a retail price of US\$1000, a huge amount for the time. But having all broadcasts in colour took another 10 years —for example in 1954 the NBC network only carried 68 hours of colour programming. In an anniversary feature entitled 'Different Hues' on Radio Netherlands 'Media Network' internet feature, ANDY SENNITT comments on the lost opportunity for an international standard for colour TV. The US adopted the NTSC (National Television System Committee) standard nationwide but one of the oldest jokes in the business is that NTSC actually means "Never Twice the Same Colour". In the UK and Europe differing standards were developed and from 1963 the German-developed PAL system solved the problems of colour hue that had beset

NTSC from the outset. As Andy notes, "the absence of a worldwide standard for colour TV is one of the biggest technical failures of the 20th century, and has led to higher costs and loss of quality because of the need to convert between different standards." (via Radio Netherlands) And we can't forget the VHS/Beta video debacle. Ed
