

ZIMBABWE:

International shortwave station. Zimbabwe to launch international news radio by end of April - minister

News24, a new 24-hour news radio channel owned by ZBC [Zimbabwe Broadcasting Corporation] is set to start operations by the end of next month, Zimbabwe's information minister announced on ZBC's Spot FM on 22 March. Information and publicity minister Dr Sikhanyiso Ndlovu announced the launch of the station whilst conducting a tour of the ZBC studios in the midlands city of Gweru, Spot FM said.

The ZBC Spot FM report said: "News24, the 24-hour radio station which initially was under New Ziana and later transferred to ZBC ownership is set to commence operations in just a month's time. There are just a few touches that need to be made. Dr Ndlovu told ZBC management that if they present their requirements in good time, resources would be availed for the project. He emphasized that priority is to be given to the project which is fundamental in telling the true Zimbabwean story. News24 will use the Short Wave link, which means it will go international. It is hoped the new station will counter negative publicity churned out by the international media."

The station also announced that Happison Muchechetere will head the News24 channel, which would "represent Zimbabwean interests, the same way CNN and BBC news channels represent American and British interests."

Muchechetere told Spot FM that News24 would broadcast "basically 24 hours, seven days a week. We intend to reach out to SADC [Southern Africa Development Community], as far as North Africa, and as far as Europe. We are going to give a Zimbabwean perspective of news."

Free digital TV breaks Sky monopoly

Sky Television's monopoly on digital broadcasting in New Zealand has finally been broken with the launch of a new service, Freeview .

The \$75 million government-backed project means the entire country can now watch free-to-air television using digital signals provided by satellite.

Wednesday's launch of Freeview promises an even greater choice of channels and programmes for consumers. Freeview will initially broadcast TV One, TV2, TV3, C4, Maori Television, Radio New Zealand National and Radio New Zealand Concert. More channels will be added. But the new digital era comes at a cost, and viewers will have to decide whether it's worth it. It's being hailed as the most significant broadcasting event since the launch of colour television 30 years ago.

Broadcasting Minister Steve Maharey says it's financially important to make the shift. "We know that if we do this, within the next six to ten years then the financial gain for the country is around \$230 million," he says.

Channels and content

Freeview's ultimate success will hinge on new channels and content. TV ONE has promised a lifestyle channel later this year plus a news and information channel, but other broadcasters remain secretive.

"We'll advise our competitor at the last possible moment," says Brent Impey, CanWest chief executive.

Analysts say Freeview needs quality programmes to capture public imagination.

Media analyst Wilson Owen says content is king in television. "And all we're getting on Freeview is the existing free-to-air channels. Until there's some premium content on there it won't be a threat to Sky," he says.

However Sky still faces a loss of revenue. Thousands of viewers who pay Sky \$18 a month to watch free-to-air television could switch to Freeview. But Freeview expects only 20,000 viewers in its first year, compared with Sky's 690,000 subscribers.

Escher says Sky has its own market. "It's sort of untouchable, I think Sky. And Freeview appeals to people that just don't want Sky - just want simple, simple free-to-air TV."

And while people in remote areas might rush at the chance to see clearly now, city dwellers may wait until next year's launch of digital terrestrial television, which uses a UHF aerial and needs a different set-top box.

Currently on the Freeview platform, there are 5 television channels and 2 radio stations. Presently, TVNZ, CanWest, the Maori Televeision Service, and Radio New Zealand supply content.

Up to 18 channels will be available, with six each assigned to TVNZ and CanWest, and the remaining six assigned to other networks. Giving that TVNZ's and CanWest's current

free-to-air channels will be available on Freeview, they will each have four extra channels available.

Freeview also has its own eight-day electronic programme guide, named Freeview EPG. TVNZ's Teletext service is also available.

Other Networks

Another two companies have stated they will participate in the Freeview venture: Alt TV and an unspecified independent broadcaster rumoured to be Triangle TV.

There are ongoing negotiations with Prime, other regional TV operators, and overseas companies wanting to start up in New Zealand. Freeview will be open to other free-to-air broadcasters if they want to join.

Prime has said it will definitely not make a decision before 2008. Also, Prime's contracts with sports bodies preclude it from broadcasting sports programmes unencrypted on satellites, so Prime may only be available via terrestrial transmissions if it decides to join Freeview.

The New Zealand Racing Board originally showed interest, but currently has withdrawn as a shareholder, but may join at a later date.

Future Content

With 11 spare channels available, several new digital-only television channels will be launched within the next two years.

TVNZ will produce two new channels, one each in 2007 and 2008. One will be a commercial-free news, sport and information-based channel with 90% local content, tentatively titled TVNZ News 24. The other will screen preschool, family, and arts programmes, and has been tentatively titled TVNZ3.

CanWest confirmed it will produce one extra channel each in 2007 and 2008 targeting a niche market. The BSA expects it to screen imported programmes on its first extra channel. Since CanWest will not use all six channels allocated to it, it may sub-lease the spare capacity to other companies. As of April 11, CanWest has made the transition from 4:3 broadcasting to 16:9 (on TV3), and on May 2nd C4 followed suit.

M ori TV aims to launch more channels later.

Parliament will get its own channel ("Parliament TV") soon.

Although the satellite and the terrestrial service will both have 18 channels initially, there is space for only 20 channels on the satellite transponder so fewer channels may be available on satellite than terrestrial in the future.

The 19-year-old singer-songwriter from Cambridge showcased his talent live after BackBeat 89.0 was launched in a studio overlooking Victoria Street. The Wintec music student, more usually seen performing at pub gigs, was invited to play by BackBeat announcer Matt Hicks. The pair are both former Cambridge High students. Yesterday's opening was attended by Youth Affairs Minister and Tainui MP Nanaia Mahuta and Labour list MP Sue Moroney. The station, which will be on the air about the clock, is aimed at the 16-25 years age group. (Waikato Times 2 April via Jim Berzoni)

Hauraki 'good guy' still on air

Illegal adventures aboard the country's first pirate radio station are long gone, but on its 40th birthday one of its original disc jockeys is looking forward to the station coming to Nelson.

Newstalk ZB presenter Ian Ferguson remembers the wild days of the late '60s, when the station broadcast illegally from a boat, three miles into the Hauraki Gulf, to avoid being prosecuted for breaching the Government's stifling radio monopoly.

The Auckland-based station has long since become land-bound and is now one of many commercial stations on New Zealand airwayes.

Radio Nelson now runs both Newstalk ZB and Radio Hauraki in Nelson but Mr Ferguson remembers a time when the two were in competition.

That's just one of many differences, the long-time broadcaster pointed out.

When he was one of the "good guys" on the original boat there was more freedom over what music they could play, how long they could speak and, of course, technology was different.

As the country's first commercial station, it was popular with "every New Zealander who liked to see people rebelling against the Government", he said.

Radio Hauraki will begin broadcasting on 90.6FM on Monday morning.

The frequency should be up and running this weekend, playing 48 hours of the Led Zeppelin song Stairway to Heaven, back-to-back.

Programme director Mike Regal said the station played "a mix of rock classics from the '60s to the '90s" and targeted males over 30.

Leading our mailbag this month with his first contribution to the Mailbag is **ROGER 'PRYDE OF THE SOUTH'** from Dunedin. Roger has QSLs from VOA 11705, Radio Prague 9860 and Vatican Radio 7250. The VOA card shows the Crosley transmitter that served VOA between 1942 and 1989. They also sent a 2007 VOA Calendar depicting American Waterways and a Programme Guide. Prague's QSL features the observation tower built in 1936 it received the first TV signal from the Berlin Olympic Games. Finally, the Vatican card has a photo of Pope Benedict during his first visit to Vatican Radio for a live radio interview.

Roger notes that none of these QSLs specifies the transmitter site. Thanks for the kind comments Roger – look forward to your future reports. Based on the WRTH May 2007 Update, I think you can safely assume the Czech transmitter site as Litomsyl, Vatican as Santa Maria di Galeria, but there are at least 4 country possibilities for the VOA QSL,

FRANK GLEN in Christchurch has some quality rewards from his March trip to Tiwai with **Peter Grenfell**, namely Mystery Radio (Pirate) 6220 with 200 watts, AFRTS Florida 7811 SSB, KKLF 1700 Lucas Texas with 800 watts night power, KSSX Roseville California 1690 1kw. 8 reports are still awaiting responses. Thanks Frank. That's the first time I've seen a power quoted for Mystery Radio. They sound more like 5000 watts up here. Best we can do on location is 'Southern Europe' – that's part of the mystery I guess. Will you really have more spare time next year?

Also from Christchurch we have **RON KILLICK** who's letterbox has produced veries from KSDA Guam 11755 (report sent to Singapore, reply from UK "AWR Europe" with transmitter location "Christchurch New Zealand". - wonder if they would do me one for Greenland?) and WYFR 7300 (3 Decades card). In additional email QSLs came in from Bible Christian Assoc-Julich 6015, Croatian Radio-Julich 11610, AWR-Julich 11755 & 15260, Polskie Radio-Julich 6140, Nauen 7140 and Wertachtal 5910, and VOA-Wertachtal 9875. Commenting on last month's reminiscences about the Falklands War and the rare QSL from LRA60, Ron says he verified the opposing Radio Atlantico del Sur using his own prepared card. His report was for 9710kHz on 2 June 1982 and the response was posted in Folkestone Kent on 17 November 1982, with a pencilled note "SP language stn beamed to Argentina during Falklands War". That's a special one Ron – remember hearing them but never tried reporting.

Phew Ian – I'm struggling

to get even 1 report away! Well done.

BRIAN PALAMOUNTAIN in Atawhai, Nelson continues to monitor the medium waves using his Sony 2001 and inbuilt antenna. His April logbook contains Radio Nouvelle Caledonie 666, Brisbane X-Banders 2RF 1629 and 4NTC 1701, plus the following Sydney stations - 2RG 1611, 2KM 1620, 2ME 1638, 2MM 1665 and 1683, and Radio Sixteen on 1644 to 1648kHz. The latter was heard with a strong signal on 19 April at 0825 UTC, giving identification and a commercial for Cross Engineering and a computer company servicing Sydney Metro. Brian says the station plays country and easy listening music. Thanks Brian!

DAVID RICQUISH of Wellington and Christchurch writes "I've put the old SuperRadio II back on the kitchen table to see what can be heard in the middle of the city, with a basic transistor, built in aerial. Last night, China 1089 demolished anything else at 1300 UTC, and 1323 was also dominant about 15 minutes later. So far, I've heard Fiji 639, 684, 927 and 1467, Noumea 666 and 729, North Korea 684, China 1089 and 1323, Peru 1470 plus Australians from 1,2,3,4,5 and 7 prefix zones and am going for 10 countries - without getting up early! In the past I've heard Port Moresby 585, Japan, Tonga, Hawaii and USA on the set from this location, so reckon it's a reasonable target. I'm also after some Aussie 6 and 8 prefixes." Thanks David for showing us that medium wave DX is still possible from urban locations.

DES DAVEY Te Kuiti advises QSLs received from RNZI 9870, AFN Guam 5765, NHK Tokyo 11840, Prague 15710 and RCI via Nauen 11870. Now I have a location away from the urban interference levels and am hearing stations so much better, I do think the increased presence of electronic appliances in suburbia means the weaker and exotic signals will never be heard like they were in the old days. las Estralles 1290, HJKY RCN 1290, HCHD2 Ecuador 1510 (highlight of the trip), and Radio Guaviyu, BA, Argentina 1610. Two nights at Waianakarua with Stu Forsyth followed and logs were taken from HJIS La Carinosa 1340, R. Tupi, Brazil 1280, and again heard. Radio Guaviyu, BA, Argentina 1610. Impressive stuff Ray – how is Kingaroy for foreign MW?

The North - South Easter DXpeditions

Over the Easter Holiday Weekend in early April, DXers congregated in Southland and Northland to try for exotic DX from electrically quiet coastal locations. The keen DXers at Tiwai near Bluff at the very bottom of the South Island were **Ray Crawford** (Queensland) with a Drake SPR4, **Steven Greenyer** (Timaru) with Palstar R30, **Arthur de Maine** and **David Headland** (North Otago) listening on an AOR7030+ and SPR4 respectively and **Paul Aronsen** (Invercargill) with a Kenwood 5000. Antennas included various Beverages, long wires and a EWE. In the far north, at Mangawhai, **Bryan Clark** and **David Norrie** were both using AOR7030+ receivers.

Reporting on behalf of the Tiwai DXers, Steven Greenyer writes:

Paul and Arthur arrived early on Thursday and had the coal range going and the kettle on the boil when Ray and Steven arrived. Paul had erected a couple of temporary antennas to which were added Steven's portable EWE aimed at South America. Ray and Paul had a test of Paul's Ham transmitter. The portable generator was cranked up and the house batteries given a top up until listening started about 0400. Only a few weak signals and hets were audible at this hour. By 0500 most frequencies had Latin signals with a few X band Yanks coming through; highlight being WMLB on1690. Around this time a few Mexicans also appeared. By 0800 several of the 50kw Yank channels had reasonable signals although noise levels were rising.

Friday saw the arrival of David Headland. A reasonable number of South Americans were in by 0430. Following a break for tea a return to the dials around 0700 showed a number of signals from Chile and Argentina unfortunately by 0730 the signals were beginning to flutter and dropped out shortly later, we should have eaten faster as we may have missed the best. A text from Bryan Clark indicated Spanish on 530, was he looking for Falkland Islands? Unfortunately Alexandra on 531 ruled this one out from Tiwai. Apart from a few X band stations and a couple of the stronger South Americans like Peru 1470, the b.c band was quiet for the rest of the evening.

Saturday afternoon saw the arrival of Southland branch members, **Arthur Williams and Don Collie**. A trek led by Steven over the paddocks and along the beach filled the early part of the afternoon. DX started again about 0400 and was dominated by Colombians with the highlight being the return of the 1510 Ecuadorian time signal station. Apart from a few regulars, signals faded out around 0800. Bryan Clark and David Norrie phoned in from Mangawhai with a report of what they had been hearing - this illustrated the difference in conditions between the two locations and what was being heard. This was also the night the rats started playing in the roof.

Sunday saw the group meet up with some Southland Branch members for a visit to the Communications Museum at the old Awarua Radio site. We were welcomed by Brendon Sparks and Paul MacKay who presented a slide show on the history of ZLB Awarua Radio followed by a further show on the Invercargill telephone exchange, then a look at the various historical radio and communication exhibits. Next stop was **Eric McIntosh's** for a fish and chip lunch, it was supposed to include oysters but Paul had trouble finding a fish and chip shop open, let alone oysters. After an enjoyable lunch with **Gwen, Raewyn, Phyllis and Bernice**, the DXers headed out to Southland Branch member **Colin McLean's**

home to view the impressive collection of radio and electronic equipment he has collected. Broadcast DX was a bit more promising this evening with several interesting signals from Argentina and a few new stations. Unfortunately it faded again by around 0800.

Monday the Latins were in earlier with many interesting signals especially around 1300-1400 kHz, unfortunately they experienced a lot of fading and with the exception of a small input from the USA signals dropped out by 0800.

Tuesday saw us packing up and heading home. Overall conditions were not as good as last year with earlier fadeouts and generally weaker signals, but we all had a good time and talked about whether this would really be the last Tiwai Easter get together.

Bryan Clark writes that it was most interesting to be able to compare medium wave receptions from the 2 locations in the same time periods, using mobile phones and text messaging. In the south, reception appeared to be more focussed on certain regions of South America such as Peru and Argentina, whereas in the north, stations were audible from as far north as Chicago, right down to Chile. However this probably reflects the differing antenna configurations at the 2 sites – Tiwai has longer Beverage antennas (up to 370 metres), which are far more directional than the short 100 metre BOG (Beverage on Ground) antennas used in Mangawhai. My listening highlights were both low frequencies – Morocco on 171 longwave and Voz Cristiana in the Caribbean on 530kHz. Both were unexpected, the first because longwave is generally very noisy, the second because of a semi-local station just 1kHz away! Reports have been written to both – my first sent out in over a year!

Says **David Norrie**: Thanks to Bryan for the invite up, good conditions and some nice catches but the usual frustrating fade outs.. All part of the fun!

EDDIE MACASKILL A long-time League member and Southland Branch stalwart, Eddie passed away on Friday 4 May at the Rowena Jackson Rest Home where he had been in care for some time.

RAY CRAWFORD remembers - "I first met up with Eddie in the Southland Brach in 1960 and before moving to Australia we were very close DX mates. Eddie was a very keen listener and enjoyed the radio hobby with much enthusiasm. In the early years he helped set up the Otatara DX Post which was a few miles from Invercargill on the banks of the Oreti River. Eddie was a major influence on the development of this DX site which had been found by Bill Marsh Senior. We spent many weekends there as well as Monday nights (for the US DX Tests). Over the years there were many good loggings made from all around the world by locals and a lot of DXers from around the country. In the late 60's Eddie found another site at Awarua, near the present Tiwai listening post. A small shack was erected there with several long wire aerials with the longest one being 2000 feet. A lot of stations were logged from the USA. One of the highlights was hearing Radio Caroline, a UK offshore pirate station on 1520 khz using 10kW. This Awarua site was eventually shut down because the high voltage power lines for the aluminium smelter were located right over the aerials. The Otatara site was revisited and built up again until the Branch found the present Tiwai listening site. Eddie was Branch President in Southland on several occasions and kept the members under control at the monthly meetings. I have many, many wonderful memories of my times over the years DXing with Eddie, and also socially with him, his wife Daphne and his family."

STEVEN GREENYER recalls "My first memories of Eddy are that he was often late for branch meetings due to his work driving trucks especially furniture trucks. He often had stories to tell about the people and events he struck during this work. He was involved with others in the Otatara shack when I joined. We had many meetings at the MacAskill family home in Isabella Street Invercargill, and later when he and Daphne moved to a newer unit

in Tay Street. Once Eddie retired he was a very keen supporter of the Tiwai Listening Post and he and Lindsay Robinson often went down there together. He was a keen DXer once he retired and early on was one of the first to become an official monitor, I think for Vatican Radio."

MORE TIME FOR DX? Next summer, New Zealand will have 27 weeks of Daylight Saving Time, up from the current 24 weeks. DST will start on Sunday 30 September 2007 at 0200 local time, and finish at 0300 on Sunday 6 April 2008. My experience is that getting up an hour earlier on the UTC clock is advantageous for DXing Asian and African stations on the tropical shortwave bands.

US POSTAL RATES INCREASE Our Tennessee member **JOE WOOD** advises that if you send Return Postage with your DX reports to North America, please note that effective 14 May 2007, International Postage from the US will increase to \$0.90 for a 1 ounce letter, aerogramme or postcard. International Reply Coupons cost US\$2.00.

QUESTIONING DRM In making complimentary remarks about last month's magazine, DES DAVEY writes of a conversation with a nurse from Vanuatu who wondered why Radio NZ International has digital transmissions to the Pacific Islands when the big majority of people there wont be able to afford DRM receivers. My understanding Des is that the DRM transmissions are mainly aimed at the local Pacific broadcasters that customarily relay RNZI shortwave news bulletins. They have been specifically provided with DRM receivers so that they can pick up and rebroadcast RNZI transmissions with much improved clarity. However be assured that AM broadcasts on shortwave continue for general listeners and my experience listening on a small Sony ICF7600G from various Pacific islands and the US West Coast is that RNZI provides reliable reception in that mode.

NEW QSL SERIES OFFERED BY RTI TAIWAN Radio Taiwan International has sent us a sample set of their 2007 series of 12 QSL cards, illustrating a puppet show, part of Taiwan's unique culture. With the development of technology, modern Taiwanese glove puppetry is now becoming popular on TV, with stunning light effects and flamboyant outfits. Would you like the sample QSL set? I'll send them to the first person to contact me at the above email address or via Box 3011, Auckland.

RTI broadcasts to Australia & NZ at 0800 UTC and 1100 UTC on 11715kHz. Other English transmissions include 0100 UTC on 11875kHz, 0200 on 9680, 0300 on 15215 and 15320, 0700 on 5950, 1800 on 3965, and 2200 on 15600kHz. Have a listen!

LEARNING SPANISH? Radio Exterior De Espana is another broadcaster that regularly sends us a supply of their frequency schedules, including comprehensive Spanish language coverage. If you're studying Spanish, a good way to improve your skill is listening to the language on shortwave, and REE can usually be well heard in NZ. Let me

know and I'll post you a copy of the schedule effective until 27 October. For the rest of us, English is scheduled at 2000 UTC weekdays on 9655 and 11625kHz, 2100 Saturday/Sunday on 9840, Sundays at 2200 on 11625, and daily at 0000 UTC on 6055.

NO MORE DX TUNER After 10 years this service for DX and SWL enthusiasts has been closed down by its creator Kelly Lindman of Sweden due to other business and personal commitments. Some 24 DX receivers located around the world could be accessed and tuned remotely over the Internet. (Glenn Hauser's World of Radio 4/07)
