The Taliban now roam at will in some rural districts, ruling villages by night while the government exerts nominal power by day. Taliban radio stations broadcast daily and hypnotic chants exhorting jihad (holy war) dominate Kunar's airwaves.

Intelligence officials say the Taliban operate radio stations from transmitters loaded on the backs of donkeys. "The donkeys are always mobile and they are guarded by armed insurgents," one spy told me.

It is a potent weapon for insurgents, they argue. A number of Kunar youth are being recruited as suicide bombers and there is evidence of militant training camps in areas where the US used to patrol.

WHY ARE AMATEUR RADIO OPERATORS CALLED "HAMS"?

The main part of this article is based on one in the FLORIDA SKIP 1959! In 1908 the Harvard (Massachussetts, USA) Radio Club was operated by Al Hyman, Bob Almy & "Poogie" Murray. Originally their call was, HYMAN-ALMY-MURRAY. Tapping that out in morse code was just too much...so they shortened it to "HYALMU". In 1910, a Mexican ship had the callsian "HYALMO" and there was some confusion about who was being worked! So, they decided to shorten it yet again to the first letter of each of their family names..."HAM", which didn't need approval from the government, as all radio stations just assigned themselves a callsign! In 1911, one of the team, Al Hyman wrote a thesis for his masters degree on the Wireless Regulation Bill. His Professor insisted that a copy be sent to Senator David Walsh who was a member of the committee hearing the bill. Al Hyman was invited to appear before the committee and make a speech. He told the committee that if the bill passed, and fees were introduced, that they, and many other 'experimentor's' would have to shut down. Congressional debate began on the Wireless Regulation Bill and the little station known as 'HAM' became the symbol for all of the little amateur radio experimentor stations that were trying to be closed down by the big 'commerical' radio stations. The outcome isn't important, as, there was a great deal of publicity for the little station known as 'HAM' ... and that's how amateur radio operators got the nickname 'HAM'... this is a TRUE STORY, and is part of the U.S. Congressional Record of 1911 (from WIA newsletter via Ray Crawford)





FM Contribution from Bryan Clark

Bryan Clark Mangawhai reports a 4th LPFM on-air in Mangawhai - on 106.8 a relay of Times FM from Orewa, complete with RDS displayed identification. This is audible from SH1 at Kaiwaka but appears to be transmitting from somewhere around Mangawhai. I am unsure whether relays of a full power FM station are a legitimate use of the LPFM service.

Whilst in Wellsford on 2 December I found just 2 LPFM signals - a local UNID on 88.1 and a surprise with strong signals on 88.3 identifying as "Waiheke Radio 88.3 and 107.4 FM". According to their website http://www.waihekeradio.org.nz/ the 88.3 transmission comes from Surfdale/Onetangi which is towards the eastern end of the island. I must try for this from home!

The FM DX season is just underway with New Caledonia 88.0 popping up at 2304 UTC on 22 November. The RDS display read "Cal Iere". Also observed again briefly

Radio Live Lyttelton

Radio Live have a repeater located in Lyttelton using 100.5 with a power of 1 KW. According to Radio Spectrum Management the licence fee was paid on 20 May 2011 so I guess it has been on air since then. Its appearance was probably in response to Newstalk ZB appearing on 100.1 rather than earthquakes because the licence fee was paid a week after Radio Network paid the fees for Newstalk ZB. Two 'good' new channels for Freeview

Freeview says it is confident for the first time that at least a million people are using its digital television service to watch free-to-air television.

The broadcaster-owned company made the estimate based on sales of Freeview-

capable televisions and set-top boxes and by then using survey data to subtract the number of viewers believed to have access to Sky Television. About half of homes have signed up to Sky.

Freeview chief executive Sam Irvine said broadcasters planned to add two "good" new channels to Freeview's line-up some time after January next year, which would take the number of available channels on its service to between 17 and 20, depending on where viewers lived.

Sky Television and Television New Zealand have continued to send conflicting signals over whether their soon-to-be-launched joint venture might provide access to Freeview channels only, in addition to a service costing about \$20 a month that will bundle Freeview with up to 12 channels supplied by Sky, possibly including a delayed sports channel.

There is speculation the joint venture could offer a Freeview-capable set-top box recorder without the extra Sky channels to households looking for a cheap option to upgrade to digital television, charging them about \$10 a month, in the hope of later upselling them the extra channels or video-on-demand.

That could help the joint venture attract consumers without the money to pay upfront for a digital set-top box, while getting them on a path to pay TV. Sky spokesman Tony O'Brien declined to comment ahead of an announcement next Wednesday.

You can also purchase live pay-per-view sports events and rent titles from a catalogue of over a 1,000 movies and TV episodes. On Demand films and TV episodes are streamed over your broadband connection and once purchased will be available to view as many times as you like for 48 hours.

You can opt in and out of paid content whenever you want, paying through the Igloo box or via the website for content you want to watch.

The Igloo box includes WiFi and Ethernet connections to access the On Demand content and enables you to purchase content from your couch. You will also be able to purchase content from the Igloo website www.igloo.co.nz. The Igloo box also features two USB ports, one to play your own home media like family movies, holiday snaps and music on your TV, the other to enable the live pause functionality.

"We're so excited about launching this alternative for Kiwis," says Chaz. "And we believe that if you invite Igloo into your home the world will arrive with it – from David Attenborough to Rhys Darby, from the All Blacks to Usain Bolt, from Lennon to Gaga, from Downton Abbey to The Kennedys. The 2 antenna towers will be located at 19:42:34/155:06:35. The construction permit for KXFX Honokaa on 1010 has been deleted. (both via NRC)

The Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC) announced on 21 November that it has approved two new AM radio stations for the Montreal market. TietoIman will use frequency 940 kHz, while Evanov will operate on frequency 990 kHz. The Commission also approved an application from Bell Media for a frequency change for its TSN radio station, from 990 kHz to 690 kHz.

Tietolman will offer a French-language mainly spoken word station focused on news and public affairs, intended for an audience aged 35 and over. Evanov will offer a French-language spoken word and musical station for Montreal's lesbian, gay, bisexual and transsexual community. Evanov already operates a similar station in Toronto.

"We are pleased to be increasing the diversity of voices in Montreal's radio market by offering additional choices to listeners," said Tom Pentefountas, Vice-Chairman of the CRTC. "The Commission received high quality proposals, but was unfortunately unable to approve all of them." The CRTC considered five applications following a call for applications for the use of frequencies 690 kHz and 940 kHz in the Montreal market. It analyzed them based on the following criteria: the diversity of voices; competition in the Montreal radio market and the impact on it; and the quality of the application. (CRTC

via Media Network website) (NRC DX News anticipates these will be 50kw full-time operations, as were their predecessors. *Ed*)

We have posted under "DX History/QSLs and Other Station Memorabilia" another file with station-designed stamps and seals used by American broadcast band stations for verification and other promotional purposes. In this file are: KMOX, St. Louis, MO; KOA, Denver, CO (foil seal); KRKD, Los Angeles, CA; KSCJ, Sioux City, IA; KSL, Salt Lake City, UT; KWK, St. Louis, MO; WBAL, Baltimore, MD; WCAL, Northfield, MN; WCBA, Allentown, PA; WCFL, Chicago, IL; and WCOD, Harrisburg, PA. We still have more of these stamps to post. -- And under "Specialized Resources," "Wavescan," is another entry from Adrian Peterson: "VOA Shipboard Relay Stations-VOA Ship No. 4: The Spindle Eye, Another American Radio Ship in the Pacific" (October 30, 2011).

DX tests ("Courtesy Programs") have always been a staple of the BCB (AM) DXing hobby. One such test was conducted by WWNY, 790 AM, in Watertown, NY, on Nov. 1, 1948. Under "DX History/Stations," we have posted a file with an article from the Watertown Daily Times newspaper acknowledging some of the reception reports received, the WWNY QSL letter, and selected pages from both the NNRC and NRC club bulletins regarding the test.
