The Future for Voice of Russia

In recent months, there have been reports in the radio hobby press, that Voice of Russia plans to discontinue shortwave broadcasting this year. Following a query to my contacts at the station, I received the following response today.

Dear Ms. Van Horn,

Thank you very much for your letter. At the moment, the Voice of Russia continues to broadcast on all the frequencies, including shortwave ones. The station has been broadcasting on these frequencies since the beginning of 2013. The only exception was made to AM frequency 1430 kHz in New York where the broadcasting was stopped due to poor quality of transmission.

As far as shortwave broadcasting is concerned, there are many plans for its further development. However, I can neither confirm nor deny mass media reports relating to the claims that the Voice of Russia is to discontinue shortwave broadcasting. Besides, I cannot give you any details regarding this matter since no decision has been made yet.

Thank you very much for your letter. I look forward to further cooperation with you in the future.

HFCC-ASBU B13 Coordination Conference in Bratislava

The conference took place at the Sheraton Bratislava hotel on Aug 25-30, 2013, with nearly 100 SW frequency planners from about 48 stations and organizations from around the world... In his opening remarks, HFCC Chairman Oldrich Cip said: "We strongly believe that broadcasting by means of terrestrial SW transmitters remains relevant for a large critical audience around the world"...

Oldrich pointed out that 50 percent of the world's population -- about three billion people -- live on an income of less than two-and-a- dollars per day. "Their first choice of communication devices," he said, "will be either a mobile telephone or a radio, or both, and listening to a local FM or community station or an international broadcast will be more affordable to them than a computer, TV set or video or other new technology"... Oldrich also mentioned the important humanitarian role of terrestrial radio. "It is capable of reaching across the Digital Divide to the most disadvantaged and marginalized societies. By drawing attention to these aspects we are trying to keep it alive. International radio has been frequently called "crisis" radio. All communication and information channels that are needed most, when a disaster strikes, are destroyed or overloaded, and the affected population suffers from an information blackout. Long distance wireless radio remains the only source of information.... That is why the HFCC in cooperation with the Arab States and Asia-Pacific broadcasting unions are working on an International Radio for Disaster Relief project that is based on the system of online coordination of frequencies managed by the HFCC in accordance with International Radio (DSWCI/DX Window 490)

Jonathan Wood of Mosgiel writes "After programming the Department of Conservation's 25 frequencies between 3 and 6 MHz into the radio last night, I picked up the Wanaka office calling up Aspiring Hut this morning (2 Dec 1910z on 4880 MHz). I'd been hunting for this one for years on the FRG-7. This adds to the list of 3336 (Te Anau calling huts at 1915z on the Kepler, Milford, W end of Routeburn, and, in season, workers in the Takahe area) and 4619 (Stewart Island calling the Te Anau/ Campbell Island at 1900z weekdays/ 2000z weekends; also Queenstown DOC calling Greenstone, Caples, end of Routeburn and sometimes Dart huts at 1920z). All NZ registered frequencies (except a few secret ones) can be found at www.rsm.govt. nz. The site is a wee bit awkward to use, but comprehensive. I've noted that the DOC dial frequencies range from 1kHz below, to 2 kHz above their registered frequencies, so I programme in DSB and switch to SSB when located. I've also been receiving South American air traffic on 10024 fairly clearly in evenings - while a small amount of the calls are in English, most are not, so haven't worked out exactly where they're from. Thanks Jonathan, I will certainly be checking out some of those DOC frequencies. You might like to send some loggings during this summer period. Arthur

This morning (3/12, 1900utc) I logged Stewart Island DOC on 4619 KHz calling Campbell Island , and Te Anau at Enderby Island. Te Anau reported a weak signal from Stewart Island - likewise for me at Mosgiel. Yet Te Anau's signal was the strongest I've ever got on SSB, from any source at any time! Nearly attenuator material! Their listed frequency is 4617, and every other ssb dial frequency I get included from DOC is around 1kHz below the listed frequency, except for this one. Bit of a mystery. Jonathan. PRIME temporarily re-instates original satellite signal

Prime has temporarily re-instated its satellite signal (this took place at 2am, on WED 16 OCT). The temporary signal will cease broadcasting in November 2013 (Prime has not yet advised a date). If you did not lose Prime since following Prime's change to its satellite signal (week of Mon 7 Oct), this means your approved satellite receiver automatically updated and you don't need to do anything further.

If you have already successfully re-tuned your satellite receiver to the SKY satellite signal for Prime since Mon 7 Oct, you do not need to do anything further.

If you have not yet restored Prime since losing that channel following Prime's change last week, you will see an on-screen message on Prime advising that the signal is temporary and that you need to re-tune your receiver. Please do so as soon as you can.



BRAZIL According to the TV news, President Dilma has signed a decree which enables all Brazilian MW/AM stations to switch over to FM. As of January 1, 2014 the stations can apply for switching to FM. Associação Brasileira de Rádios e Televisão believes that around 90% of the 1784 stations currently broadcasting on MW/AM in Brazil will be switching over to FM. Initially, the stations will be able to broadcast both on AM/MW and FM. After five years the stations must decide whether to switch to FM permanently or to continue on FM. They may also decide to stay on MW/AM and are allowed to expand their presence in this band. Some of the motives for the decree are better audio quality and less interference plus the fact that FM transmissions, contrary to AM/MW radio, can be received on cellular phones. RUSSIA All Russian State Television and Radio Broadcasting Company (VGTRK) will completely stop broadcasting R. Russia on long wave and medium wave in the regions in 2014, per an industry source Digit.ru. This will be another step to reduce the broadcasting of public radio in the regions of Russia. As previously reported by Digit. ru, radio station Mayak stopped broadcasting on long and medium wave, and is now heard only in a few dozen cities, where works few transmitters on FM. Deputy General Director Sergei Arkhipov of VGTRK confirmed plans on switching off broadcasting Radio Russia on long wave and to reduce broadcasts on medium wave. He said that Radio Russia in the NE will be turned off where the radio station is broadcasting on SW & FM. TONY KING writes from Greytown: "Wet day so have started playing back my cassettes back to April. On 31 October however I sat on 1690 listening to back-to-back frenetic tempos mixed with others. The ID I wrote down from a male announcement was 2BLE then 2JLO. Then on a web search CJLO Montreal! Have just tuned into their web stream and it is likely to be CJLO. Its' a University station, and following the ID a YL followed with announcements very similar to the feed I have just listened to. Not bad for 1kw. Have saved the clip. Now transcribing CHHA at its boom a couple of weeks ago." [Yes, your CJLO recording impressive Tony – a NZ first I'm sure! BC]

ANDY GARDNER in Christchurch says he now has all the lab gear he needs to start experimenting, and has just a few parts left to arrive from China to get going with construction. "I'm playing with different versions of a amplified broadband loop, set up in the (tiled roof) garage at the back of the rental property we're in, fed via (balanced) Ethernet cable to my shack at the front of the house. Once the rest of the parts arrive, I will be building a custom SDR specifically designed for < 2MHz, that can interface with

either the broadband loop or a remotely tuned FSL, with a 2.4GHz wireless connection to the shack, so there is ZERO interference "picked up in the coax" (there is none!). The digital output of the SDR is streamed wirelessly to the computer with no loss or interference. Since the parts for the radio are less than \$50, and suitable 2nd hand wireless routers can be had off Trademe for under \$10, the long term plan would be to have such a device connected to each antenna available, at the antenna. That way, instead of switching between antennas while monitoring with one radio, you switch audio feeds instead, and of course you can record each one full time so you don't miss anything. You also start to get into the realm of digital signal phasing for nulling of stations from certain directions and diversity reception - antennas/radios physically separate so signal fades can be minimised. The sky is the limit!" [Sounds awesome Andy! Can't wait to read what you're hearing down there. BC]

BRYAN CLARK in Mangawhai has started 'learning the ropes' on his Afedri SDR but, to date, MW capability has been unimpressive alongside the 7030+. He has just one MW log for the month – KFQD Anchorage on 750 at good level with CBS news at 0802 followed by local news at 0804 UTC.

2013 AGM REPORT

The 65th AGM in Auckland on 20 October began with acknowledgement of those who had travelled from outside Auckland to attend the meeting, the Waikato contingent – SUTTON BURTENSHAW, CHRIS HATTAN & JIM BENZONI, and ARTHUR DE MAINE from North Otago. A minute's silence was observed in memory of members who had passed on in the previous year – foundation & Life member KEN MACKEY, also RAY DEVEREUX and TERJE NEILSEN.

In his <u>Patrons Report</u>, **FRANK GLEN** reported on advocacy in the past year for the hobby in both Australia and NZ, the valuable DX archive at the Hocken Library Dunedin which is regularly being consulted for academic research, the camaraderie he experienced at Convention 2013, and the possibility of a DXpedition to an isolated part of Stewart Island.

In the <u>Presidents Report</u>, **BRYAN CLARK** paid tribute to the fine people who had contributed to our club and special hobby over the past 65 years, and acknowledged the contributions of members, magazine editors and his Adcom colleagues in the past year. For many members, the magazine keeps them in touch with long-held friends and a hobby that they can no longer actively participate in. At the 2012 AGM, it had been agreed that a definite decision be made at the 2013 AGM regarding moving the DX League to a electronic magazine approach. Feedback from members at the Convention in March and subsequently from members without email capability had led to Adcom being of the view that it should continue a paper magazine option for loyal members for some time to come. But the club was critically reliant on key volunteers for its survival and Bryan particularly mentioned **MARK NICHOLLS** who has been our Chief Editor for 13 years in October. He also acknowledged **PHIL VAN DE PAVERD** who had agreed to return as treasurer for another year.

The <u>Treasurer's Report</u> showed an operating loss of \$1439 for the year and a net loss of 19 members. 87 members now subscribe to the paper magazine and 56 receive the electronic edition. Bryan explained the Review of Accounts, a lesser level of annual audit, undertaken by **DAVID CROZIER** and he acknowledged David's assistance with this.

In the <u>Chief Editors Report</u>, Mark thanked the DX Times sub-editors, contributing members and our printer Pro-Copy Ltd of Wellington. He welcomes any feedback or suggestions on improving the magazine, or articles suitable for publication.

PAUL ORMANDY in the <u>Webmasters Report</u> advised of the major relaunch of the radiodx website, with a new Content Management System (CMS) and a new host provider with

more features and capacity at a lower cost. Special mention was made of **BILL MARSH** JR who has undertaken considerable historical research for articles on the early days of our club and which are now available online. Bill is keen to secure back copies of the DX Times in order to preserve more of the League's history and make it easily accessible online. Anyone willing to donate back issues should contact Paul Ormandy. Likewise any material that members think would be interesting to have published at radiodx. com. Paul's <u>Publicity Report</u> covered advertising in the NZART "Break In" magazine and World Radio TV Handbook. The revamp of radiodx.com has made it easier for visitors to find out about the DX League and how to join.

Bryan said Adcom's reasoning was to incentivise members to consider a change to receiving the magazine electronically, which would lessen our operating loss.

There was unanimous support for subscription rates continuing to be reviewed and agreed annually at the League's AGM.

The remit to change the registered office of the DX League to 162 Tern Point Road, Mangawhai Northland, and advertise a new postal address, was also agreed.

<u>Life Membership</u> was conferred on **ANDREW GARDNER** and **PHIL VAN DE PAVERD** for services to the DX League. Andy has served as Chief Editor and was instrumental in the magazine's move to electronic publication and the website. Since joining the League in 1985 Phil has served as Treasurer at branch and national levels, as well as editing the Bandwatch column in the magazine. Bryan said that the club's survival over 65 years

In General Business. the meeting considered member enquiry α about advertising on the League's DX Dialog online discussion group, in light of some content being considered as 'spam'. The meeting agreed that advertising members' of hobby sale equipment for was appropriate but



soliciting - requests for money - should not be allowed.

Another member highlighted recent newspaper publicity about restrictions on selling electrical equipment like radios, where certification by a registered electrician was required. It was agreed to monitor this, for any impact on equipment to be sold in the DX Times 'Marketsquare' column or through DX Dialog. [Editor's Note: Trade Me states "all secondhand electrical items sold in New Zealand must be electrically safe. A way of demonstrating this is to have them tested to Australian and New Zealand Electrical Safety Standard (AS/NZS) 5761, or disabled and tagged in accordance with AS/NZS 4701. An electrician can do this for you." So it appears that compulsory testing is not yet a requirement. BC]

The regular issue of finding another safe and secure professional archive like Otago University's Hocken Library was discussed, as some senior members considered the future of their collections of QSLs and radio memorabilia. Bryan advised that, with the help of **MARTIN HADLOW**, some new prospects had been identified which would be explored with Martin and Life Member **BARRY WILLIAMS**. It was agreed that public access to material was important. **BRYAN MARSH** said he proposed approaching MOTAT regarding placement of the **DOUGLAS DOULL** badge collection. Douglas' Eddystone 940 receiver was already held by MOTAT. Members present at the AGM were asked to briefly explain why they were currently a member of the DX League – several said it was for nostalgic reasons and keeping in touch with people they had known for 50 years; some had the intention to return to serious DX one day, another said membership reflected a lifetime interest in the hobby and the importance of being involved in a club; for another it was the ability to be involved with others with the same interest; a member dreamed of the day when all our MW stations left the air and decent DX was possible again.

Bryan thanked Barry for organising the venue and refreshments, and members for their participation. He said that Adcom, with the addition of Chris Hattan, would do its best to keep the club relevant for members and support Mark Nicholls and his editorial team.

REDUCTIONS IN SW/MW OUTPUT BY INTERNATIONAL BROADCASTERS WRTH

International Editor **SEAN GILBERT** recently posted the following to the WRTH Facebook group: "I have just been looking at the reductions in SW/MW output by international broadcasters and SW output by domestic broadcasters (where possible) in a languageby-language form. I have been keeping records of the top 19 languages used by broadcasters, since the B10 season, and I can see a reduction in output on 18 of those 19 languages. The only language to show an increase is Tibetan.

The languages that have suffered the most reduction (since the B10 season) are:

1. German (-53%); 2. Russian (49.6%); 3. Farsi (-48.8%); 4. Spanish (-45.7%); 5. Portuguese (-43.7%); 6. Indonesian (-36.9%); 7. French (-32%); 8. English (-31.2%).

This is based on the schedules we use in WRTH and, as the data is processed in the same manner each season, this does give a reasonable portrayal of the situation. In contrast to this, Chinese is only down by -5% and Korean 1.1%, while Tibetan is UP 7.3%. The Far East languages, to be fair, tend to have a much slower decline than the more Westerly languages. October 6, 2013 -- Japanese mediumwave stations have replied to reception reports with what surely are among the best looking QSLs ever. In "The CPRV Gallery" we have posted a file containing a large group of QSLs from NHK mediumwave stations. We will also be posting QSLs from the many Japanese private stations. -- And under "Specialized Resources/Wavescan" we have posted another story from Adrian Peterson: "Radio Broadcasting on the Island of Cyprus-5: The International Radio Scene" (September 29, 2013).

October 13, 2012 -- This time we continue our look at Japanese mediumwave verifications with a file of QSLs from private (non-NHK) stations there, 1956-2003. It is posted in "The CPRV Gallery" under "Broadcast Band/Asia." -- And under "Specialized Resources," a new "Wavescan" entry: "The Story of the Torn QSL-card" (about Bechuanaland) (October 6, 2013).

October 20, 2013 -- This time, in "The CPRV Gallery," we conclude our look at Japanese mediumwave stations with another file of QSLs from non-NHK stations, these from the period 1952-2005 (but many undated). -- And under "Specialized Resources," "Wavescan," we have posted "Tribute to Shortwave WYFR-5: The Parade of New Callsigns" (October 13, 2013). Please note that you can listen to the "Wavescan" programs at http://tunein.com/radio/AWR-Wavescan-(WRMI)-p386634/ and

October 27, 2013 -- This time, under "DX History/Stations," we have some items from two religious stations. From SWL old-time favorite ELWA, Monrovia, Liberia, we have posted the "ELWA Photo Album," a folder with views of the station; a 1963 issue of the "ELWA Radio News Bulletin," the station's newsletter; and an ELWA schedule for the period December 1955-February 1956 (when the frequencies were 4835 and 11800 kc.). --And Jim Bowman, whose father was Dr. Robert H. Bowman, co-founder of the Far East Broadcasting Corp. in the Philippines, has sent us an undated article, "XMHD-China," from Interrnational Christian Broadcasters Bulletin. It contains some information about XMHD, a Chinese station of the 1930s from which we have earlier posted a 78 rpm promotional recording (under "DX History/Recordings"). Thanks to Jim for bringing us this information. -- Our usual thanks go out to Adrian Peterson for sending along another "Wavescan" script, this one "100 Years of Wireless and Radio in Bulgaria-9: Shortwave QSL Cards" (October 20, 2013). The "Wavescan" scripts can be found on the "Specialized Resources" page.

November 3, 2013 -- Roger Legge is usually remembered for his shortwave broadcast DXing, but he was also an avid DXer of amateur stations. This time, under "CPRV," "The CPRV Gallery," we have posted a compilation of some of Roger's better-looking amateur QSLs (look under "Amateur Radio" at the bottom of the page). These are mostly from the 1930s and 1940s, a few from the early 1950s. Zoom in to read the details. -- And also, under "Specialized Resources," "Wavescan," look for two new entries from Adrian Peterson: "Tribute to Shortwave WYFR-6: The Early Years At Hatherly Beach" (November 3, 2013), and "Ancient DX Report: 1905" (November 3, 2013).

November 10, 2013 -- Lots of the big stations had "clubs" of various kinds, geared mainly to solicit mail from listeners. Although the Radio Portugal DX Club, which was formed in 1964, also solicited reception reports, it provided some other useful benefits as well, including the forwarding of reports to other stations throughout the Portuguese-speaking world and the issuance of certificates rewarding the QSLing of stations in the Portuguese world. Certificates were available at the 10-station (Bronze), 20 (Silver), and 50 (Gold) station levels. The club also had two pages in Radio Portugal's quarterly listener magazine. Under "DX History/Stations" we have posted a 1966 brochure explaining how the club operated and detailing the certificate program. (Due to the difficulty of hearing many of the African stations, American listeners were allowed to submit QSLs from Brazil in order to satisfy half the African station requirement.) The cover of the brochure shows one of the certificates. Does anyone have one? We would be happy to post it on ontheshortwaves. -- And under "Specialized Resources/Wavescan" you will find a new story on SW history from Adrian Peterson: "75th Anniversary: Voice of Turkey on Shortwave" (October 27, 2013).

November 17, 2013 -- For several decades, relay arrangements have been an important part of international shortwave broadcasting. Under "DX History/Stations," we have posted several items pertaining to the start of relays of Radio Japan and Radio Netherlands. From Japan, we have posted two issues of Radio Japan News, the station's newsletter for listeners. The six-page 1986 issue celebrates the start of Radio Japan relays over RCI, Canada . (We have reproduced the English pages only.) The all-English, four-page 1991 issue relates the story of the start of Radio Japan relays from Sri Lanka, and also contains a timeline of Radio Japan's post-war development.. We have also posted a promotional item, "Radio Netherlands International Bonaire Relay Station," which appears to have been written circa 1992. - And under "Specialized Resources/ Wavescan" there is this new story from Adrian Peterson: "100 Years of Wireless and Radio in Bulgaria-10: The International Clandestine Scene" (November 10, 2013).

November 24, 2013 -- Everyone knows ELWA, but do you remember the Liberian Rural Communications Network (LRCN), which operated in 1987? The USAID-sponsored station broadcast from transmitters in Voinjama, Gbarnga and Zwedru. These were all

mediumwave. In addition, however, the station transmitted programming to the three stations by way of a 10 kw. SSB feeder transmitter in Monrovia, which operated in the 49 and 75 meter bands and could be heard in the U.S. on 3975 kHz. during a narrow window starting at 0700 UTC. Under "DX History/Stations" we have posted Don Jensen's QSL from LRCN, together with two LRCN brochures and an LRCN pin. -- Also this time, under "Specialized Resources/Wavescan," we have another entry from Dr. Adrian N. Peterson: "72nd Anniversary: International Encounter-1, Fire on the High Seas" (November 17, 2013).

December 1, 2013 -- Recently, under "CPRV/The CPRV Gallery," we posted some good-looking mediumwave QSLs from Japan. This time we have put up a compliation of 37 QSLs from Australian mediumwavers. Those bearing dates are from the years 1930 to 1972, mostly the 1950s and earlier, and all are from New South Wales. Backs of the QSLs are included when they contain interesting information. We will post more Aussie QSLs in the future. -- And under "Specialized Resources/Wavescan" you will find another history entry from Adrian Peterson, this time a timely "Tribute to the Old WR/MI" (November 24, 2013).
