

MAILBAG

Editor Theo Donnelly email mailbag@radiodx.com Burnaby, BC, Canada



This is a short and sweet month it seems, a speed-read between all the hot DX! Some might say that's a relief after the Punch and TD Show in September.

Richard Jary in **Sydney** (the NSW version) reminded me early in the past month about another of the 'one' calls across The Ditch, in a welcome comment as the outgoing Chief Editor of the Australian DX News. "Hi Theo. As the previous Australian editor of the WRTH entries, I just thought I would write a quick note regarding lan Wells' logs of 1EA in Canberra. This used to be listed as 1SBS on the ACMA website where I compiled the original information, and it seems to have changed to 1EA on their listings now. Interestingly the only other Canberra station to use a 1 prefix on MW is 1RPH 'Radio for the Print Handicapped' on 1125 kHz, though all the FM Community stations also use a 1 prefix. Commercial 'Mix FM 106.3' also has an official call of 1CBR though this would never be used on air. The other station they own 'hit104.7' has the call 2ROC despite being from the same transmitter site. The ABC and other commercial stations on both AM and FM use 2. I can't explain the logic behind this!" *(Thanks, Richard... rhyme and reason, not! Hope your 'retirement' gives you plenty of listening time and brings other comments for 'Mailbag'.)*

Ian Cattermole, Blenheim comes up with more than just a tally of one, but that's not unusual. "Here are my SW veries received during September. Trying the <radiodx> address again so hopefully it will get to you OK: RFA Tinian 5830; WRMI 5765; RDW Trincomalee 15255; Overcomer Kostinbrod 6000; RRI 15170; NHK Singapore 11685; R. Ranginkaman, Grigoriopol 7575; and BBC Meyerton 11945 & 12095 kHz. That's all for this time." (But they are still arriving... as are your messages to the official email address. The gremlins weren't at work this time.)

Ian Wells, Mosgiel squeezes out a small submission. "Hi Theo. The only recent activity from my corner of the world has been an email confirming reception of Radio Revival, Sweden, with 10kW on 6060 kHz. In the email, Ronnie Forslund <info@rock.x.se> offered me a QSL for 3 IRCs or \$3.00, but I think the email will suffice." (*Two points: gee, that's a long-time notable frequency from the days of Sveriges Radio from Hõrby... and IRC's? They're still around?*)

Jonathan Wood, Mosgiel (how far up the road are you two from each other?) admits to a challenging time since his last report. "A quiet month; went back after a six-month absence to Long Beach to find (a) drizzle, (b) the stream had shifted restricting the dipole setup and (c) horses on the beach meaning extra care with the BOG antenna! And, as usual for that location I have plenty of sand in the wires, in the car, and in the joints of the Spiderbeam as a momento!" (And like lan C's, both reports appeared in the mailbox.)

Bryan Clark, Mangawhai is wearing out the word 'interesting'. <grin> "Another interesting month DXwise, with highlights being returns to shortwave from Eritrea and Vladivostok, and another low powered German shortwave station logged (Europe 24). Reports out to Europe 24 6150 and VOBME Eritrea 7175. Rarely heard AIR Gangtok from Sikkim was also heard on 4835 during an extended shutdown by the ABC Northern Territory SW stations." (*And nothing of note from MW? I guess I'll have to wait to read Broadcast News.*)

Günter Jacob in Passau, Germany remains our anchor. "Ms Ying of China Radio International's English Service writes: 'Thank you for your reception reports. We are sorry we can't send QSL cards by post owing to budget cuts. Therefore, we send you two e-QSL cards by attachment.' Along with the transmitter site, she also gives the name of the administrative district or the autonomous region. Confirmed was my reception on 9675 kHz via Jinhua, Zhejiang, and 11610 kHz via Kashi, Xinjiang. Both QSLs are of Lake Namtso, Tibet, one looking across the water and the other one with a mountain range in the distance. Another e-mail QSL comes from Sergey Omelchenko, Technical Director of Pridnestrovsky Radiotelecentr (Moldova), verifying Radio Sedaye Bahar on 7495 kHz. The Radio-Television Broadcasting Committee of the DPRK verified their German program on 6170 kHz."

Recent challenging reception conditions aren't preventing some of the North American crowd reporting an exceptional year with logs of stuff from Down Under. Bryan mentioned last month about V7AB/1098 from the Marshall Islands giving Newstalk ZB in Christchurch a bad time. Well, in the other direction, it's made it to Kaz/Neil Kazaross, about 55km NW of Chicago. Tim Tromp in Michigan has identified 2NR/738. Nigel Pimblett in southeastern Alberta had one blistering morning recently with 3HA/981 from Hamilton, Vic. and 2QN/1521 in Deniliquin, NSW... as well as Newstalk ZB on 1026, though he omitted to find any offset to prove either Kaitaia or Whangarei. <g> Those 2kW'ers are earning their keep. And just as I was about to send this off to Stu, I see Bill Whitacre in the Washington, DC area is reporting that he has a probable with 3LO/774. Who said MW DX is dead? 73, Theo

PS. Late addition from the **Chief Editor in Cyberjaya.** It has been a quiet month however, a couple of loggings have been made: Radio Sedaye Bahar 7495 and Voice of Armenia 4810. A verie has come in from Radio Romania International 11825 and email verie from Myanmar RTV 9730.

EKKO Stamps

Recently in the DX Dialog, Mailbag Editor, Theo Donnelly, informed members that there are EKKO stamps on sale on Ebay. In fact there are a couple with New Zealand call signs.

This led me wonder what Ekko stamps are. I had heard of them naturally, but had never really bothered to find out more. So, I did a little research and this is what I discovered.

It started out as an advertising gimmick designed to help promote public interest in specific radio stations. The EKKO Company of Chicgo, II. contracted the American Banknote Company to design, and produce to order, stamps of the same high quality as current postage printings, to be used by commercial broadcasters in promoting their stations and radio shows to the listening public.

The stamps, framing the American Bald Eagle with two radio towers in the background and a station bar where the broadcast station call letters could be imprinted, measured in frame height 35mm and in frame width 22mm. With perforation (12) and plate cuts, the finished stamps measured approximately 40mm in height and 25mm in width, like a common postage stamp.

These stamps would be purchased by the radio stations from the EKKO Company and then the station would send the listener a VERIFIED RECEPTION STAMP (VRS) with the station's call letters.

What came as a complete surprise to the EKKO Company was that collecting these stamps became almost as great a sensation as listening to the radio broadcasts, and the demand for Verified Reception Stamps increased dramatically as this new hobby swept the world! In an effort to legitimize the hobby, and as an additional means of gaining revenue by selling advertisement space, the EKKO Company published a hardback stamp album in 1924, and several different paperback versions beginning in 1926 and continuing into 1927.

When the EKKO Company published their hardback album in 1924, they were selling stamps to 592 stations in the United States and Canada, and at the height of the collecting craze they were selling their stamps simultaneously to slightly more than 650 broadcast stations located throughout North America and the Caribbean (and New Zealand)!

(Sei-ichi Hasegawa via Glenn Hauser's DXLD Yahoo Group 9/16) Subsequent research by Sei-ichi has determined that these reactivations are a temporary response following the devastation caused by Typhoon 'Layonrok' in thePrimorsky Region. JOHN DURHAM, Tauranga has just received a QSL from Radio Caroline North 1368kHz via Manx Radio. This was via the online SDR at Twente in the Netherlands. John says that, for members in urban areas, listening to MW via remote receivers provides a way of maintaining interest in the DX hobby. In their response Radio Caroline North wrote: "We have been making monthly broadcasts since September 2015, live from the radio-ship MV Ross Revenge which is anchored in the River Blackwater in Essex. They have been made possible by Manx Radio on the Isle of Man who 'lend' us their AM/MW transmitter for the weekend. We send our output via 4G to our Studio hub in Strood in Kent and then via the internet to the IoM and then out on 1368Khz. Sadly, the arrangement only lasts until November this year so you'll only be able to catch us again during the last weekends of October and November. We hope that the arrangement may be extended but we will have to see." John says the 1368kHz signal peaked around 0500 UTC - before that IRRS co-channel was dominant. [Thanks John – Adcom is working to establish a remote SDR in NZ so our urban members can continue get their Kiwi DXing 'fix'. BC]

TVNZ to re-brand channel names

TVNZ have announced plans to re-brand the channel TVONE to TVNZ 1.

The national broadcaster announced the bold move on Thursday afternoon, during their new season launch.

Following in the footsteps of rival network MediaWorks - that changed 3News to Newshub in February of this year - TV2 will be renamed TVNZ 2 and One News will become 1News.

"Our focus at TVNZ is all about sharing the moments that matter to New Zealanders," said the network's chief executive Kevin Kenrick in a statement issued Thursday.

"We know that different moments matter to different New Zealanders. To better understand these differences, we've just completed our most in-depth research study into viewer behaviour, and this is shaping our future thinking."

The network's channels will effectively be renamed TVNZ 1, TVNZ 2, TVNZ DUKE, 1 NEWS NOW or TVNZ OnDemand.

The changes will take effect October 1.

After seeing Jonathan's log of 9560 KHz I asked for more information on this station and Jonathan supplied the following from Wikipedia.

DP07 marine radio (spoken: Delta Papa Zero Seven) is a private German coast station. Operator and owner is Captain Reiner Dietzel from Hamburg. The name derives from the charging identification ago (eng. Accounting Authority Identification Code, AAIC) which of the coast station under the provisions of the Rules on international telecommunications (eng. International Telecommunication Regulations, ITR) [1] in conjunction with the ITU-T recommendation D.90 [2] for billing for paid services in marine radio has been assigned.

Since April 2000 DP07 marine radio for the German sports navigation is active. The station offers FM radio operation, travel reports, Medico-talks, international radio traffic accounting (including discussions on. Inmarsat), Seewetter via SMS or MMS, telegrams, SRC - and LRC -Education.

DP07 sends five times a day the shipping forecast the German Weather Service for East - and North Sea , and once daily for the Mediterranean . [3] The station transmits currently using eleven [4] Coastal radio relay points on the German North Sea and Baltic coasts. Before commencement of operation sounds as signature tune the minuet from the Notebook for Anna Magdalena Bach by Johann Sebastian Bach , the same melody, with the also Norddeich Radiodecades announcing the weather. Private calls can be handled via DP07 used by the company as an internationally registered and recognized settlement company for terrestrial marine radio set (FM, SSB and short wave) and for the Inmarsat-billing invoice. Since 2012 DP07 wrong again on shortwave , thus continuing the tradition of Norddeich Radio continued. [5] .Currently DP07 offers exclusively coastal radio on FM.

Since April 1, 2015 DP07 sends the shipping forecast via shortwave. The transmitter of will Uses Radio 700 in Krekel (Kall) . [6] Since the medium-wave transmitter of Germany Radio were closed at the end 2015, DP07 will then be with his shortwave frequencies of the last stations in Germany that directs a shipping forecast analogous in amplitude modulation. < www.ontheshortwaves.com> Update, September 4, 2016 -- Although several smaller Turkish shortwave stations have been heard regularly in recent years, it's easy to forget that there was a time when Turkey was host to a plethora of small, largely local stations that operated on shortwave. Some made it into the World Radio TV Handbook, but many didn't. Most were connected to educational institutions, and usually their operation was on out-ofband channels in the 6 and 7 MHz. region. Owing to their low power, most were considered "impossible" DX catches in the United States, and many were unheard even in Europe. To shed some light on this corner of the DX world, the British Association of DXers in 1972 published a list of these stations,. We have posted the list under "DX History/Stations." --Also this time, under "Specialized Resources/Wavescan," Adrian Peterson takes us back to 1989 South Africa with "The Mystery of the Unfinished Shortwave Station in South Africa" (Wavescan N392, August 28, 2016).

< www.ontheshortwaves.com> Update, September 11, 2016 -- This time, under "Specialized Resources/Radio Postcards," we have posted a group of postcards from Gurney Seed and Nursery Co. station WNAX in Yankton, South Dakota (Gurney bought the station in 1926). They are: an oldie view of the station; five views of a different site, two naming the WNAX antenna tower as the tallest in America (a third says "the world"); and a group of seven postcards showing various views of the station at its early location. -- Also under "Specialized Resources/Wavescan," Adrian Peterson takes us on a journey to the Cook Islands in "The Island with 1,000 Descendants: Cook Islands Radio Tour 2" (Wavescan N393, September 4, 2016). -- And under "Specialized Resources/American States on Shortwave," we have updated the "American States on Shortwave" file, adding a "new old station," W2XV in New York.

Peterson: "Anniversary for RRI Radio Republic Indonesia, with introduction about the Song of the Cocoanut Islands" (Wavescan N394, September 11, 2016).

Judging by the label on the photo (and by the cars), this is probably from the early 1960s, when Page Communications Engineers designed and built the station. It opened at 50 kw. in 1962 and went to 250 kw. in 1964. -- And under "Specialized Resources/ Wavescan," we go down under with "Outback Radio in Australia-1," Wavescan N395, September 18, 2016.
