Hello and Welcome to the June edition of the DX Times.

We are almost halfway through the year - where has the time gone? In this month's magazine there is an interesting article by Bryan Clark about a low powered Italian station, **Key Channel Radio**, being heard in New Zealand. As Bryan points out that whilst the BBCs, CBCs, VOAs, DWs et al. cut back or eliminate their services on shortwave, there are still stations out there to be found if we but look. It's a challenge for us all.

We have a new member! A very warm welcome is extended to **Jörg-Clemens Hoffmann** of Alsbach, Germany (50km south of Frankfurt). He made contact after hearing David Miller's DX League Special Convention broadcast via Radio Northern Star. We hope you enjoy your League membership and please take the time to contribute to the DX Times -I know Theo, in particular, would enjoy contributions to Mailbag.

For those on DX Dialog you will know that we get regular bulletins from The SWLing Post via **Paul Rawdon**. Thank you Paul for sharing these. There was a recent item, which took my eye. Last year the ABC in the Northern Territory was rocked by the closure to its shortwave frequencies and much controversy raged over it. The only benefit I could see, living here in Malaysia, was that I could receive AIR Gangtok much more easily, before Ozy Radio moved there; never mind the needs of Australians in the Top End!

We have just had our budget in New Zealand - I have seen it described in a number of ways. However, its effect pales somewhat when compared with the recent Australian Federal government's budget, in which 'the ABC came out worst off, with a freeze in its indexation funding amounting to a reduction of \$84 million over three years.

The government says the reduction is aimed to ensure the national broadcaster "finds efficiencies." The ABC says there are no more efficiencies to find and that the cuts will mean job cuts.

Overall, the ABC will receive \$1.117 million in allocated funds, while SBS has been allocated \$386 million, an increase in last year following the government's inability to pass legislation that would have allowed SBS to broadcast more advertisements.'

Don't you just love it when number crunchers, who know nothing about the industry, demand greater 'efficiencies'. They don't realise what a treasure they have. At least Radio New Zealand still has a shortwave service and long may it do so! Thanks to Paul Rawdon, the SWLing post and www.radioinfo.com.au

70 YEARS AGO



The June 1948 edition of 'DX Bulletin (NZ) is headlined with the long-awaited announcement on the New Zealand-Australian Wavelength Reshuffle. "So many new stations and increases in power must be detrimental to dxing but on examination our reaction is one of satisfaction - thankfulness that it is not as bad as we had envisaged. The extension of Australians up to 1560kcs is the main handicap as at present that portion of the broadcast band is wide open for North American reception. However, many stations in Eastern USA on these channels will be heard in the early evening before the Aussies come in while Pacific coasters (and in summer C.ST.) will be there after the Commonwealth broadcasters sign off. Senior dxers will bemoan the severing of 1340 kcs by 2XN Nelson, but against this the 1400 kcs channel is cleared allowing a new 250-watt field. And 2XN current schedule is 7 to 10pm. All NZ highpowered transmitters have moved to the lower frequencies where Yanks are also powerful, but not so numerous. This leaves the higher channels, where opportunities abound, more free. Harmonics and intermediate frequency whistles will, however, add to our difficulties. It will be several months before all the new stations take the air, there are building shortages and constructional difficulties to overcome. In the interim, many vacant channels will provide happy hunting grounds."

Elsewhere in the magazine was a list of the new stations, new powers, call and frequency changes - very significant as the only Kiwi medium wave stations not changing frequency or call on 1 September 1948 were 2YA and 1ZB.

In the DX Trail, Keith Robinson reported WGAR Cleveland Ohio opening on 1220 at 9.30pm and WHBF Rock Island Illinois 1270 closing at 5.30pm Sundays after news. He was also hearing WDSU New Orleans 1280 occasionally at 9pm. Ken Mackey heard tests from WFUR Grand Rapids Michigan 1570 on the first Saturday of the month at 8.45pm. Merv Branks had WALA Mobile Alabama 1410 with NBC network till 7 on Sundays. Frank Wilson heard WACO Texas 1460 closing at 6pm and WBYS Illinois 1560 testing with 250 watts at 9.34pm.

On shortwave, the magazine featured the latest list of Colombian SW stations, 29 in total [compared with just 2 today.BC] and lots of South American trail items including CE622 Santiago Chile logged by Arthur Cushen and Graham Mercer in Invercargill, with English announcement promising verifications at 4.15pm closedown; TGJA Radio El Mundo Guatemala City 6230 closing at 4.30pm; and LRY Radio Belgrano reported by Ron Gray closing at 4pm on 9440 and opening at 10pm on 9540kcs.

Ray Crawford from Hodgeleigh, QLD (which he says is close to Kingaroy) was one of the two Rays at Mangawhai. "Hi Theo: I had a great time at the Convention and it was good to catch up with all those I haven't seen for some time. I didn't do any listening but used the time to talk. I must have got inspired a bit by the DX that was heard and have sent reports to 4KZ 5055 and OZY Radio 4835. Reported KUAU 1570 heard at 0900 and sent a report via the Contact page on their web site <www.kingscathedral.com>. Had a reply from Alex Betsill at <alexbetsill@kingscathedral.com> in the mail box next morning. Also a QSL card from Al Kirton for 4KZ 5055." (Someone should have had a voice recorder planted surreptitiously for all the tall tales.)

lan Cattermole, Blenheim should give us all inspiration to keep active. "Hi Theo. Herewith my SW veries received during May. small.com> for Radio Kiribati, Tarawa, 1440 kHz, reported using the Northland SDR and sent directly to Babera's email address." (Good stuff, but I'll be working at pronouncing that last name for the rest of the month.)

Hang on... the South Island and the West Island... and nothing from the North? We'll do some scrounging for next time. Thanks to all. 73. Theo

LOW-POWERED ITALIAN STATION HEARD IN NEW ZEALAND

On several recent weekends, including Easter, DXers in New Zealand were able to hear a low powered hobby broadcaster on shortwave from Italy called KCR Radio or Key Channel Radio. This station has a quite unique multi-ethnic format and has a mission to "know through the cultures and traditions of the music of the earth peoples so promoting peace and brotherhood".

I heard KCR on 6915 kilohertz on Easter Sunday between 0535 and 0604 UTC and received a prompt and comprehensive QSL response. KCR wrote "Greetings from the north of Italy! Yes, you have heard Key Channel Radio, the free station broadcasting from Italy in a special Easter transmission. Thanks Bryan for your important reception report, we hope you can hear KCR again in future! Many compliments for your incredible reception. We broadcast with only 20 Watts in carrier and 100 PeP!!"



The following information about KCR Radio is paraphrased from KCR's Italian language website: http://thekcrteam.simplesite.com

Massi writes - I have been a DX listener since 1975. Having had several good experiences with the first Italian Free Radios I have always had a hidden dream to operate a truly free radio station. The origins of KCR date back to a warm August evening in 2015. After a nice dinner, a nice drink, in the cool of the terrace, I said "Girls, why do not we have a nice radio?" The subject was debated until late at night, and between one limoncello and another we became "The KCR Team". From the beginning, our idea of a multi-ethnic radio station was born, Lille is a Swiss citizen, Jasmine is an Algerian and I am Italian, so could not have done otherwise. By December 2015, we already had 2 transmissions ready, a fabulous location on the Apennine Hills, 10 station jingles and everything needed to go on the air. After an unsatisfactory broadcast debut in January 2016, the March 2016 broadcast was heard all over Europe. After 13 weekends of broadcasting, KCR has been heard in most European countries, Canada and the United States, and on the SDR-WEB from virtually every continent.

Each of us, according to their personal abilities, is in charge of various activities:

Massi manages the technical side, both the transmission system and the production of programmes, jingles and promos.

Lilla, Massi's fiancée, takes care of the general organisation, to her is entrusted all the preduring-after transmission roles, from the timing of the promos, handling Facebook, E-Mail and data management.

Jasmine, herself a DXer since 2012, is KCR's QSL Manager. She deals with art design, producing photomontages, QSLs, schedules and selection of music tracks.

Apart from the pure pleasure of operating the station, KCR seeks to promote, through ethnic music, knowledge and friendship among peoples.



KCR transmits 24 hours at weekends from the top of a hill about 800 metres above sea level in the Apennines, near Modena on the border between North Italy and Germany.



The transmitting set-up consists of a Fox commercial transmitter with 110 watt PeP. A second Fox transmitter capable of 300 watts PeP is currently non-operational. The KCR antenna is an Inverted "V" & Choked Balun.

While the number of 'official' international broadcasters on shortwave is in slow decline, there are still DX opportunities such as KCR Radio out there for us to track down on the radio dial! (Bryan Clark)



That's one of the topix on the AWR Wavescan rundown for #480 from May 6, during another HFCC Kuala Lumpur discussion. There is nothing to be found on the RVA website about its closing: http://www.rveritas-asia.org/about-us

So I listen to this week's WS. Segment recorded at KL in January: Jeff White says "breaking news", about RVA. He visited studios & offices in Quezon City several years ago. They had lots of studios and languages. But as of June 30, 2018, RVA is going off the air from SW.

All languages, per Ludo Maes, BRB, and the RVA frequency manager. Going internet only. Despite not so much internet access in rural Philippines, Asia. Maybe a financial thing? Internet is cheap compared to SW, and internet "stations" are easy to set up.

Nevertheless, all PUG registrations in HFCC A-18 claim they are valid till the end of the season, 28 October! Here's the schedule for what we now know to be its final sesquimonth:hfcc.org/data/schedbyfmo.php?seas=A18&fmor=RVA (Via Glenn Hauser-OK-USA, dxld May 11 / 15)

GUINEA

Radio Television Guineenne [RTG], the government broadcaster in Guinea Republic (Conakry), now has a new quadrilingual website at <www.rtgkoloma.info> streaming live radio and TV. The radio stream is observed identifying on air as 'Radio Guinee' and found to be in // with the shortwave outlet on 9650 kHz when checked via a Brazilian web SDR at 11:55 UT today on 24 May 2018. The site gives options to view textual content in either Arabic. Chinese. English or French.

ETA: Observing the stream for the past few days it's apparent the station now broadcasts round the clock, with no sign-on/sign-off formalities at all at the former sign-on/sign-off times (0600 & 2400 UT UT/local time). A regular jingle with voice-over announcement in French states that they broadcast in French, English and local languages. No English programming observed by me so far. Dave Frantz had informed us that four of his five SW transmitters have been demolished, and was about to demolish or take down all but one antenna, in downsizing of WWRB to make room for more aeronautical activities on the site. (ia Glenn Hauser-OK-USA, dxld May 15)

WINB

America's oldest commercial shortwave station, is testing in DRM mode via two transmitters. The test transmissions are directed to both parts of Europe and North America.

A new ASI transmitter, a CE-50000WS, is on the following test schedule: Monday-Friday 1100-1700 UT on 15670 kHz. The transmitter is rated at 15 kW and is using a rhombic antenna at 62 degrees. {mainlobe Spain, Sicily, Egypt, Ethiopia, Somalia ...}

At times when the ASI transmitter is not being tested, WINB will be testing in DRM via its existing Continental 417B transmitter on 9265 kHz via a rhombic antenna beamed 242 degrees. {mainlobe Louisianna, Mexico, New Zealand, Hobart Island, South Australia ... }

Programming is from WINB's Internet audio stream and is in English and Spanish. WINB is America's oldest commercial shortwave station, having come on the air in 1962. The station is located in Red Lion, Pennsylvania, USA.

This could be a hoax, but if it is, it's very elaborate.

KNOM Nome on **780** has applied to extend STA, reduced power (unspecified). (NRC)

AUSTRALIA Following the inauguration of 6KA-FM Karratha & 6KA-FM Roebourne on 23 May, 6KA-AM Karratha **1260** kHz will switch off permanently at the conclusion of its 28-day simulcast period.

CANADA

- 610 CKYL Peace River AB has moved to FM. (NRC)
- 680 CJOB Winnipeg MB has new "Global News Radio" slogan (Shaun Axelrod via NRC)
- 860 CBWA Ashcroft BC has approval to shut down once CBKS-1450 moves to FM (call letters not yet assigned) and provides coverage to area. (Jon Pearkins via IRCA)
- 1130 CKWX Vancouver BC A Vancouver engineer suspects their antenna system is the cause of their many transmitter outages, usually short, but a day-long outage did occur on 04/23 at 1133 when the 50KW transmitter was off the air for about a minute, with the next day or so from the backup transmitter. XEGAJ 790 changed from ORF1 to ORF3. ORF1 = "primera cadena" news/talk; ORF3 = "tercera cadena," also known as Trión, which plays some music. (http://radioformulaguadalajara.com/categorias/programacion via Tim Hall via NRC) XENT Radio Formula at La Paz has been slightly off-frequency for years - **789.9** kHz. (John Wilkins-CO and Glenn Hauser-OK via NRC)

NORTHERN MARIANAS KCNM Saipan has had CP granted for U1 500 watts day & night on **1080**. (via National Radio Club's 'DX News')
