What's in a name?

Ray Crawford recently sent me a piece from the American Radio Relay League (ARRL). It says: Recently there was a name change for Z3 - Macedonia, which used to be called the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia. The new name is **North Macedonia**. The ADIF country code number remains 502. There will be no changes, other than the name, as to the DXCC status of Z3. There remains 340 countries/entities on the ARRL DXCC (current) List.

As one who has heard Skopje on mediumwave (albeit when staying in Vienna one Christmas), the change of name will not make a blind bit of difference to their refusal to verify reports, written in English or Macedonian (using cyrillic script)!! It remains a very frustrating station in a newly named country.

The other country which changed name recently of course, is Swaziland, which is now known as **eSwatini**. Apparently the King changed the name and it means the land of the Swazis.

Bryan Clark, Mangawhai has reported and QSLed Radio Piranha International 6030.1. Traces of reactivated Radio Apintie from Surinam noted on 4989.983 but to date it has been too weak for a reception report.

Medium Wave has been abuzz with Latin American signals and new logs of Radio Nacional de Paraguay 920, Radio Nuevo Mundo Chile 930 and Super Radio Tupi Brazil 1280, plus extensive recordings on other frequencies still to be analysed for verifiable material. [Yes, and the night you invited me around to listen to the Brazilians/ Paraguayans/ Uruguayans and Argentinians they were all having a siesta! I don't believe a word of it except I have heard the recordings!]

Dene Lynneberg, Wellington QSL's in so far this month from: CJWI-CPAM 1410. Short email QSL in French received after a f/up report to info@cpam1410.com in English and French together with an email message in French via their website asking them to check my report and confirm it if it is correct. No verie signer's name given in email. VOAR 1210 Friendly email received from VOAR Manager, Sherry Griffin for a f/up report for 2016 reception via the Global Tuners Portrush, Northern Ireland receiver. She thanked me for my report and said she had passed it on to their Engineer for further action then a couple of days later an email arrived from Brian Matthews, VOAR Engineer verifying my report of 25 October 2016. Nice one to finally get as they are due to move to FM. Radio Waves International 6070 and 7440 via Rohrbach-Waal and 6055 via Sitkuni, Lithuania (after f/up report for reception of 11 November 2011). Also received several info sheets about RWI and a digital transfer file of the RWI show broadcast on 10 February 2019. Reports have been sent to WDHP 1620 (with a relay of WAXJ 103.5 the Reef), Voice of Guyana 560 and Harbour Light of the Windies 1400 (all heard on the TWR Bonaire sdr), WPTX 1600, CKZW 1650 La Gospel Radio (ex CJRS Radio Shalom) and WMDD 1480 (last three heard on the Bjargtangar, Iceland sdr). CKJH 750 and VOA Pinheira, São Tomé 1530 (Arctic sdr Norway). Follow ups have gone out to: KGU 760 (found another email address at salemhawaii.com so giving that a try), VOWR 800 Saint John's, NL (for 2016 report heard on the Portrush, Northern Ireland Global Tuners receiver). On shortwave reports out to Radio Pirana International 6930 and Radio Enterhaken 6930 (relayed via Radio Pirana International) and a f/up to PPE Observatório Nacional 10000 (thanks to Edward Kusalik for giving me another email address to try for this one). FM wise reports to AREC FM 87.6 Porirua and Paraparaumu. [Your usual fine collection of exotica, Dean. I remember Timm Brevel hearing São Tomé 1530 from his back garden in northern KL. I heard the recording - incredible. His set was a Trio (I think) with a whip antenna. As for KGU, where is Alan Roycroft when you need him!]

Douglas Johns of Christchurch comes to call: It's been a little while since I appeared in mailbag, but odd trips to Dunedin, and Westport have seen QSLs roll in from Brian FM Omarama 104.5, RNZ Concert Dunedin 92.6, NewstalkZB Westport 95.7, TAB Radio

Mike Smith, Opunake, sends us this news. Down at Ozanam House PN this week, here for another four having chemo and radiation. Going ok so far but expect it to get harder as it goes on. But, the last couple of weeks at home have seen a lot of latins heard on the 150 degree EWE. I've still got several recordings to decipher, wrote a report for ZP1 R.Nacional del Paraguay on 920, but the published email address bounced, so I'm now badgering them on their facebook page. If that doesn't work it'll be good old NZ Post. I've been chasing 780khz as well, there are often two or three latins there in the mix. Pretty sure one is Argentina, if not more, due to some references to "R.Nacional de Exterior" heard. Also been hearing something on 760, mentioned "Uberlandia" so looking at the possibilities in Minas Gerais state in Brasil, it's north of Rio but there are a couple of stations listed there, but not specifically in Uberlandia town. R. Bahia Blanca on 840 has been a regular, except for one night when there was a signal audible with mostly talk, with poor audio, completely different to RBB format. Yet to spend time on the recording but there was a "Radio Victoria" ID, and the only one I can find on 840 is in Puerto Rico, WXEW. So some work to do in the next week or two's downtime. I'll be heading back to Opunake for the weekends, so hopefully will catch a bit more of the latin season before it changes again. [Firstly, all the very best wishes from all of us on the success of your treatment. WXEW would be a lovely catch to get, particularly with 1kw nights. Good luck with sorting it all out.]

John Durham in Tauranga says: Not a lot to report this month - a couple of veries to hand .

Radio Pirana International 6945kHz a tentative qsl until Gorge Garcia, the station operator, returns to Europe and prepares the official version.

Unique Radio Gunnedah 5045kHz a proper postcard received via John Wright. Not often you get these nowadays, much appreciated. *[See John's column for details about this station. Goodness, John, a unique experience receiving a proper QSL these days!]*

Your Chief Editor has done very little listening, but items heard appear in the trail. The evening of 30 March was interesting. It is the quietest I have experienced on MW since moving to Mangawhai. 1640 KDIA was booming in, which it doesn't usually at my place. Earlier it was mixed with KDZR. I realised I have never verified KDIA, in fact I have never reported them, so, now I have. There were Yanks on every 10 kHz frequency, although it got a little ropey below about 700. It is worth noting the next evening, the conditions were awful.

As mentioned above, **Douglas Johns and I** have been communicating and talking about a verification I issued to him in 1979. I remember it for a couple of reasons, which are not relevant here. However, it took him ages to find the card, which he eventually did. It reminded us both of what it was like 30 (or 40, yikes) years ago when there were summertime short term AM stations. They usually verified and were fun to get. Here are some cards from that time (thanks to Douglas for providing them).



CNN Radio Argentina will operate from their studies in the centre of the city of Buenos Aires and with a transmitting plant in the town of Hurlingham, province of Buenos Aires, from where it is authorized to issue with category B-III (daytime power of 25 kw and night of 5 KW). In addition, the station can be heard through a wide network of stations in 120 cities in the country, ensuring coverage of almost 80 % of the Argentine territory. Listeners of commercial radio stations 2EC in Bega, 2XL in Cooma and 2GN in Goulburn may soon be retuning their radios if the ACMA accepts proposals by the stations. The proposals would see 2EC, 2XL and 2GN swap from AM to FM transmission in Bega, Cooma and Goulburn respectively. 'FM radio provides improved audio quality for listeners in regional areas and can be more cost-effective to operate than AM radio,' said ACMA Chair Nerida O'Loughlin. 'A number of regional commercial radio stations are seeking to convert their services to FM under an industry-led conversion program. The ACMA will facilitate a conversion after taking a number of issues into account. These include availability of suitable spectrum and being satisfied that audiences in regional areas do not lose radio services under that proposal,' Ms O'Loughlin said (Martin Greer, Tasmania)

BENIN Trans World Radio is raising money for a second transmitter at their West Africa medium wave station. "Northern Nigeria is a spiritual battleground. For 10 years or more, radical religious movements have ravaged the land with horrific acts of violence. But there is hope in the gospel of Jesus Christ. We now have an opportunity to take the good news farther into Nigeria and strengthen the Church there. We're launching a powerful new 200,000-watt transmitter broadcasting hope into all of Nigeria, as well as parts of the neighbouring countries of Cameroon, Benin and Niger. We have already begun by faith, with a prayer goal of launching programming with the new transmitter by the end of 2019. The Japan Commercial Broadcasters Association asked the communications ministry to implement a system revision by 2028 in order to allow radio broadcasters to focus on FM broadcasting. Under the law, broadcasters are obliged to broadcast on both AM and FM. The request, made at a meeting of a panel of experts at the ministry, reflects the heavy burden placed on broadcasters stemming from updates to facilities and other forms of investment at a time when radio stations' advertising revenues are diminishing as the number of listeners falls. STEVEN GREENYER Timaru writes: "Unfortunately work is taking up a few of my nights but managed to listen on 22 March when a few weak Argentineans made it through. 29 and 31 much better, 31st was characterised by an early opening but only to the bottom of the band. 660 and 670 with obvious Argentines and good signals but no ID before they faded before the hour. Have changed my portable 3x7 metre ewe to a 4.5x 13m while signals are a bit stronger the null off the back end is less. Heading to Catlins Lake on 15 April so hoping the deep South Americans hang on for a couple more weeks. I have signed a contract to build by the lake so may have a good out of town Latin location next year. The site is a bit further north and east than Tiwai room for a EWE and possibly a longwire to SA if the neighbour agrees."

ANDY GARDNER Christchurch offered some helpful advice about tracking down the identity of spurious transmissions after Bryan Clark found a Maori language broadcast on the low side of 1602: "That the frequency is not bang on channel is a worry - points to transmission equipment failure rather than intermod caused by object corrosion. That being said... go to http://radiomobile.pe1mew.nl/?RF_Aids:On-Line_calculators:Intermodulation Punch 873 1440 and 1521 into the 3 frequency version. You will see 1602 listed in the 3rd order list. Can you find spuries near any of those other frequencies listed? Those 3 freqs are for the Matapihi (Tauranga, Ed) transmitter site." [Thanks for that Andy! Will check those other frequencies BC]

BILL MARSH Blenheim added: "This is usually associated with 2 stations sharing a common tower. The two frequencies add to cause an image but both signals are usually mixed. A classic example back in the 1960's was when 4ZA (820) came on air and shared the same tower as 4YZ (720) and mixed to provide a very strong signal on 1540. Took them years and a lot of pressure from Southland DXers to sort that out with filters." *[Thanks Bill. BC]*

MIKE SMITH Opunake has once again shown us his DX location is exceptional for deep South Americans! His special antenna is a EWE at 150 degrees with 7 metre verticals and about 20 metres horizontal, with 700 ohms to earth at the back end, and a 9:1 balun on the front. A bit bigger than standard but he can't complain on performance! He writes: "I think I'm just in a lucky spot where there is an "all over water" path across the South Taranaki bight, Cook Strait and beyond to South America. I recall years ago in the days of Bill Woller and Robin Chambers, that my family lived on a farm at Te Kiri where my Dad Ian (he also dabbled in a bit of DX) milked. I was only 5 or 6 years old...Bill and Robin had long wires erected there, and even though it was only 10km inland to the east from their home locations in Opunake, the reception of low powered east coast Yanks was far superior. Bill's favourite theory was that the presence of a layer of volcanic "ironstone" rock a couple of metres down had a beneficial effect on antenna performance. Who knows? 800 feet of wire connected to either an Eddystone or Hammarlund in those days was a hot set up anyway!" Mike has been trying to find a way to communicate with ZP1 920 which made a rare but very welcome appearance! Mike says their WRTH published email address doesn't work, and their website only gives contact phone numbers. He's now trying their Facebook page before resorting to NZ Post. Also writing up a log for R.Tres 780, trying to find out who the Brasilian on 760 is, and poring over the recording of what sounds to be WXEW 840 Radio Victoria. [Robin and Bill were my DX idols in the 70's and they certainly established Taranaki as special DXwise! BC1

STU FORSYTH, Mangawhai has done a little listening and logged KDIA 1640. Pretty ordinary, I will admit, but I realised I hadn't ever logged it and the signal and top of the hour id were so good that I couldn't resist! Now to get a verie. Off to the Catlins shortly, so hopefully will have more to report next month.

BRYAN CLARK, Mangawhai has been in his 'happy place', particularly over the Equinox week in late March, with new loggings of ZP1 Paraguay 920 and Nuevo Mundo Chile 930. Plenty of unidentified Latins recorded and waiting analysis.

VOLMET STATIONS

Volmet stations provide meteorological information for aircraft in flight and is a worldwide network of radio stations that broadcast weather reports on shortwave frequencies. Reports are sent using automated voice transmission in the upper sideband. Pilots on international air routes use these transmissions to determine what procedures to use for descent, approach, and landing, such as a visual approach or an instrument approach.

The Volmet network divides the world into specific regions, and individual Volmet stations in each region broadcast weather reports for specific groups of air terminals in their region at specific times, coordinating their transmission schedules so as not to interfere with one another. Schedules are determined in intervals of five minutes, with one volmet station in each region broadcasting reports for a fixed list of cities in each interval. These schedules repeat every hour or in some cases ever half hour.

Volmet stations broadcasts are great for propagation measuring, since they have set schedules and frequencies all over the world and can give an clear indication of when propagation is strong or weak in different areas. Arthur
