KTWR continues its DRM tests. Mike Sabin from KTWR sends the following message: During KTWR's DRM broadcasts to ANZ, we have noticed that we have no audience living down under. Those who are hearing our DRM broadcasts to the region are people who live elsewhere who hear our back-lobe in Japan or who tune in via a KiwiSDR in Sydney or some other place in the region. While this shows that we can reach the area, it seems that we are not reaching regional listeners.

I had begged for more time to get more relevant reports, but none have come from listeners within the region. It is likely that KTWR will terminate the DRM shot to ANZ/SP to conserve funds for broadcasts to India, China, and Japan/SK. We have not committed to this change yet, but I wanted to let you know that it will likely happen. I am sorry for the bad news. I know listeners in your region have felt abandoned by most SW broadcasters. It seems that TWR was not able to help in the area of DRM broadcasts.

We will continue to do our analog broadcasts to ANZ/SP for the foreseeable future. I hope those are reaching folks there. If there are other programs you would like us to broadcast, please let me know. I can forward the info to our content management folks. See the Shortwave Report for frequencies.

RADIO FREE ASIA ANNOUNCES 23rd ANNIVERSARY QSL SEPTEMBER 2019

Radio Free Asia (RFA) announces its 23rd anniversary QSL. Bringing free press to closed societies, RFA's first broadcast was in Mandarin on September 29, 1996 at 2100 UTC. RFA is a private, nonprofit corporation broadcasting news and information to listeners in Asian countries where full, accurate, and timely news reports are unavailable. Acting as a substitute for indigenous free media, RFA concentrates coverage on events occurring in and/or affecting Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar, North Korea, the People's Republic of China, and Vietnam. In some Asian cultures, bamboo represents integrity, elegance, modesty and loyalty. This is RFA's 71st QSL and is used to confirm all valid RFA reception reports from September – December 2019. The design was created by RFA's Brian Powell.

I then heard from Mike again... After a couple of friendly follow ups to LS11 1270 via fb messenger, this arrived this morning – "Hello Michael! We have received the mp3 files and powerpoint. I pass this contact to the people of the technical team. They will be very happy to receive your contact. Thank you for contacting us." So that looks promising, hopefully will have a qsl to report next month. [It would be a nice verie to have. There would be those who would claim that as a positive contact and claim it as a QSL. I guess the jury is out on that. Good luck with a more affirmative response.]

Bryan Clark in Mangawhai is next up. I have had another month concentrating on medium wave DX, with some interesting new catches from Latin America including a Venezuelan rarely heard nowadays. Busy preparing the New Zealand country listings for the 2020 World Radio TV Handbook, as well as some Pacific Islands. The lack of response from some broadcasters continues to disappoint, so observations from DXers play a valuable role in maintaining the accuracy of what is published. Thanks to my fellow League members who are currently busy validating the handbook data for other parts of the Pacific.

The Chief Editor, from the other end of **Mangawhai**, has done almost no listening. I did manage one night and heard WGIT on 1660 - a first from home. I too have been busy with WRTH listings - mine are the French speaking Pacific countries.



World Music Radio 15805 kHz now beaming south. World Music Radio (WMR) is now broadcasting on 15805 kHz (Saturday-Sunday 07-20 UT) with 200 W into a 3 element yagi beamed south for DXers in Southern Europe, Central Europe (however sometimes the signal will skip over), Northern Africa and perhaps also the Middle East.

Reception reports are welcome at this address: wmr@wmr.dk - or by snail mail (please include return postage for a QSL-card) to World Music Radio, P.O.Box 112, DK-8960 Randers S+, Denmark, Europe.

Besides 15805 kHz, WMR conti nues broadcasting on 5840 kHz (24 hours a day - 7 days a week) with 100 W into an inverted V aerial. Transmitter site for 5840 and 15805 kHz is Randers, Denmark. Best 73s Stig Hartvig Nielsen, World Music Radio - <www.wmr.radio> (hcdx Aug 24)

SHORTWAVE & STATION NEWS

BBC World Service extends shortwave broadcasts in Hindi, English & Urdu.

The Director of the BBC World Service, Jamie Angus, says: "The provision of independent and trusted news in places of conflict and tension is one of the core purposes of the World Service.

"Given the shutdown of digital services and phone lines in the Kashmir region, it's right for us to try and increase the provision of news on our short wave radio services. Audiences in both India and Pakistan trust the BBC to speak with an independent voice, and we know that our reporting through several moments of crisis this year has been popular and valued by audiences who turn to us when tensions are highest."

BBC News Hindi radio output (9515 and 11995 kHz) will be extended by 30 minutes from Friday 16 August. The full one-hour news programme will be on air from 7.30pm to 8.30pm local time.

On Monday 19 August, BBC News Urdu will launch a 15-minute daily programme, Neemroz. Broadcast at 12.30pm local time on 15310kHz and 13650kHz, the programme will focus on news coming from Kashmir and the developments around the issue, and include global news roundup tailored for audiences in Kashmir.

BBC World Service English broadcasts (11795kHz, 9670kHz, 9580kHz, 7345kHz, 6040kHz) will be expanded, with the morning programming extended by an hour, ending at 8.30am local time; and the afternoon and evening programming starting an hour earlier, at 4.30pm local time.

The shutdown has left people with very few options for accessing news at this time. However, news services from the BBC continue to be available in the region - through shortwave radio transmissions in English, Urdu, Hindi, Dari and Pashto. As well as providing an important source of news to the region, the South Asian language services have brought added depth to the BBC's coverage of the Kashmir story.

The recent introduction of four new languages services for India - Gujarati, Marathi, Punjabi and Telugu, following additional investment from the UK Government - has enabled the BBC to offer a wider portfolio of languages and distribution methods to a region that is geographically diverse as well as politically tense. This year's Global Audience Measure for the BBC showed that India is now the World Service's largest market, with a weekly audience of 50m.




FALKLAND ISLANDS

Recently the Chief Editor asked if I had ever received logged the Falkland Islands and received a QSL. Yes, who could forget logging the Falkland Islands and receiving their QSL back. From one of my file boxes I found QSL Card No 113 along with a copy of the reception report.

We had just moved to Lyall Bay, Wellington and the only antenna I had erected was a 20 foot wire around our upstairs lounge. On the night of Thursday 3rd of March 1983 while tuning around the 75m band using my Yaesu FRG-7700 receiver. Just before 0900 UTC I came across a good signal on 3958 KHz where the male announcer was saying "A very good morning to you, you are listening to FIBS, the Falkland Islands Broadcasting Station on 3958 KHz, Shortwave and 96.5 FM". I could not believe what I was hearing, all on a 20ft piece of wire strung around the ceiling of our upstairs lounge. QSL and part reception report below.

SYNCHRO AM IN BAY OF PLENTY, MEXICANS DESERTING MW?

NEW ZEALAND RNZ's transmission team provides AM and FM radio broadcast services to our audiences across New Zealand. A team of just three: Gary Fowles and Andy Anderson in Wellington and Steve White in Taupo, they manage and maintain all our transmission sites, alongside broadcast and telecommunications company Kordia. RNZ transmit AM and FM from sites such as Henderson in Auckland, with two masts and many broadcasters, to very remote leased sites that Kordia owns such as Obelisk, serving Central Otago, which are inaccessible in winter. RNZ has 25 transmitter sites ranging in size from five to 53 hectares across NZ. We manage 93 transmitters across those and other leased sites. We also host 44 transmitters on our sites for other broadcasters, from local community stations through to large commercial networks.

This last week was a milestone for RNZ as we decommissioned our Queenstown AM transmitter site at Kelvin Heights, situated on Queenstown Golf Club's course:

Kelvin Heights was established in 1974 on land leased from the Queenstown Lakes District Council, relaying national and community radio stations from Dunedin. In 1985 it served 5000 people, now days that number is nearer 20,000. We also have FM coverage from other sites in this area, so it made sense to relinquish the site and increase our FM transmitter power instead. (Extracts from RNZ's "Soundbytes" in-house newsletter)

Gary DeBock and other DXers listening at Rockwork on the Oregon coast report another down-under ultralight DX bonanza in early August including exceptional signals Magic Music and Magic Talk on 1107. ARGENTINA LT40 Radio la Voz de la Paz (AM **1550** Khz), which broadcasts from La Paz, province of Entre Rios, will cease transmissions on 30 August as confirmed by licensee Juan Carlos Marzoiini, in a meeting with employees, and in which it was announced that a new bidding will be called. LT40 is the first modulated amplitude radio of the North Ramirez. It was awarded through decree no 5500 of the year 1971 to operate in 1550 Khz with Category VII. The station officially began its broadcasts on March 8, 1973, under the direction of Mr. Juan Carlos Malvasio, and constituting the third station of the province next to LT-14 Radio General Urquiza (1260 Khz) of Paraná and LT-11 General Radio Francisco Ramirez (1560 Khz) of conception of the Uruguay. The Central Studies and administration were located

on the street Roque Sáenz Peña 1082 of the city of La Paz, province of Entre Ríos. Then, under the direction of Mr. Juan Carlos Marzoiini, also opened his FM channel called "FM LA PAZ" on 91.3 Mhz. Contact details at the moment include Emails: info@lt40.com.ar and radiolavozdelapaz@yahoo.com.ar , website: www.lt40.com.ar . The decision not to continue operating the station means an uncertain future for station staff who will be unemployed as they wait for a new licensee to take over the operation. (Argentina en AM y FM Facebook Page)

COOK ISLANDS The following was posted on the Radio Cook Islands Facebook page on 7 August: "At midnight last night the 630 khz service was turned off permanently. This morning, contractors Raro Weld were on the site to commence work on the dismantling of the 108-meter mast, which towers above the Matavera skyline. Project Engineer Esben Torget, one of two climbers for the dismantling job said they will be dismantling it from top to bottom but before getting to the top, they have to reinforce the mast from bottom up. He says there is severe corrosion 50m up in mid-section of the tower and is rusty on the inside so the job has to be done very carefully. The team will be setting up secondary stays (wires) that will replace the stays that were made in the early 90s which he says normally need to be serviced every four years. What they're pretty much going to do is set up the secondary stays that will be anchored to new concrete anchor points and while they move up the mast, they will set up secondary stays on the different fittings around the mast in case the old stays give way. Then after setting up the secondary stays, they will dismantle the mast from the bottom by segments three meters long. 85kg heavy and they will be lowered down one by one using a small portable crane that will be attached to the immediate segment below. A base will be set up just below the mast that will have a puller system pulled out to a 20ft container about 30m away and everything will be controlled from there when it comes to lowering. Torget says they will be trying to push this as fast as they can but safety is priority. They've set a timeline of four to five weeks to complete the job, weather dependent. Equipment such

as 4000m of specialized rope is also being manufactured at this moment out of various companies in New Zealand and Italy. The mast towers above the Takitumu school, who had to be relocated towards the end of June as an added precaution. The dismantling of the AM 630KHz mast leaves the country without a national radio service which is critical in times of emergencies such as during cyclones, and tsunamis. It also, leaves the country without a means of disseminating information of national interest via a single. reliable, and constant source. This concern has been echoed throughout social media and the community. The Cook Islands Investment Corporation has confirmed previously that a mast will not be re-erected in the same location due to the school below and the increase in residential housing in the surrounding area. At this stage, the Government has considered some options and will be strengthening the FM network in all of the Outer Islands. This is by far the easiest and fastest option available at this time in order to restore a national service to the country. Some preliminary costing has been obtained but full costings will be confirmed soon. In the meantime, the Pa Enua [the Outer Islands. BC] can get information via CITV which can be received in all of the islands. For radio listeners on Rarotonga, simply switch your radio to FM and tune it to the frequency 101 MHz." [One comment posted on Facebook mentions that his Japanese import car radio doesn't have coverage to 101 FM so he has lost RCI reception completely. BC]

IRELAND Due to extensive engineering work on the transmission mast infrastructure at the transmitting station at Summerhill, County Meath, the RTÉ Radio 1 LW service on **252** will be off air from 0900 on 10 September until 1700 on 17 October 2019. (RTE via Mike Terry in Glenn Hauser's WOR IO Group)

JAPAN Some observations on Japanese broadcasting while I was staying at Minakami in the mountains, 137km northwest of Tokyo in early July: The American Forces Network station on **810** identifying as 'Eagle 8-10' gave poor to fair reception during the day, but good reception at night. This was the only English-language programming heard, but an interesting aspect of NHK programming is the foreign language lessons carried throughout the day. For example, on 693 there was Russian at 1530 local time, English at 1550, Russian again at 1630, Italian at 1645. English lessons were also heard at 2115 local time (1215 UTC) on 639, 693, 747, 774 and 873 – a time when DX reception would be feasible from NZ! (BC)

As always, there is no guarantee that every station employee answered correctly, but of the 200+ responses I have received so far, only a few have been questionable. In the list of stations above, I think only XEWGR has been logged by DXers fairly recently. (Tim Hall via ABDX eGroup)

This revised list from the IFT (courtesy of Raymie Humbert) is dated. September 2018 and shows 61 stations that are supposed to stay active on AM even if they put an FM on the air. I believe several of these (marked with "*") may have defied this order and taken their AMs silent. In the case of XELBC, XEBAC and XEPAS, I really don't know if the AMs ever got on the air in the first place.

AUSTRALIA A short verification is in from Voice of Charity(VOC) broadcasting in Lebanese

on **1701** khz from Silverwater, a suburb of Sydney, New South Wales situated on the southern bank of the Parramatta River, on 1701 kHz with 400 watts.

The station was heard on October 20th, 2018 from 1521-1555Z. Reception was quite challenging as there also were three other Australian signals around 1701 kHz. Radio Brisvaani from Brisbane usually dominates this frequency, but different this time. There is also a very noisy Russian old utility radio system easily recognizable by pulses, and the Norwegian Coastal Radio Station Vardø Radio, now called Kystradio Nord is on 1695 khz from Berlevåg.

Voice of Charity https://www.voc.org.au/ is a Christian, Cultural and Ecumenical Radio Station managed by the Lebanese Maronite Missionaries. VOC is the official radio station for the Eastern Churches in Australia and New Zealand, broadcasting in Arabic and in English. It is connected to the Roman Catholic Maronite Diocese of Australia. It was very nice to find a Christian station broadcasting from Australia. I listened on a KIWI-SDR receiver called Arctic SDR in Kongsfjord antenna farm, Finnmark county in Northern Norway with 500 metres aerial pointed towards the Pacific. It is is owned by Bjarne Mjelde. He was the Transmitter Plant Supervisor at VOA-Liberia in the 1980s. The plaque itself is an impressive piece of work. It is made on an inch-thick piece of wood, about 9" tall and 13" wide. If you zoom in on the detail you can see that the paint is textured, and much of the lettering is raised, all making for a very nice presentation. Monrovia was, of course, the VOA's Liberian HQ.
