Tony Ward checks in from Toronto, Canada, indirectly. He emailed Bryan Clark recently and the email was forwarded to me. I thought I would share bits of it - I hope Tony doesn't mind

I have added the AirSpy HF+ and now the AirSpy HF+ Discovery model to the Perseus, and am still doing more or less daily. They are astonishing value, and not significantly inferior to the Perseus. The accompanying software is also under intensive development, whereas the Perseus's is more or less dead in the water — although it is still a fine unit.

The old NZRDXL Convention articles have given me much pleasure, and I thank you for your part in bringing them to light once more. I started listening (mostly SW) about 1954, as a 12 yr old. Possible earlier. Dad was headmaster at Peria school (inland from Taipa) and spent some serious money on an Ultimate-Ecco Golden Knight. 200 miles from the nearest radio station (before Whangarei, Kaitaia, Kaikohe came on the air meant we needed a real antenna, and it was I who made the discovery that longer and higher = better! Which brought in other stuff on the medium wave band of course.

But it was SW that got me going a few years later. We moved next to Pahoia, halfway between Katikati and Tauranga and it overlooked the harbour, with great oceanside reception. At some point I wrote to Radio Australia and Keith Glover read the letter on air and I discovered the joys of QSL cards.

I don't know when I joined the League, but it was before I went to Auckland in 1960 to University. At my first Auckland Branch meeting I met Lloyd Clayden and Barry Williams, and the rest is history. Lloyd drove me home and we talked astronomy, radio, everything till' 4 am. I soon became a regular at Whangaparaoa. It seriously affected my academic career, but I made it back on track and taught at U of Auckland (Geography) before moving to Canada and the University of Guelph in 1968. It was great to read Lloyd's listing of the remarkable antenna farm in the labelled 1963 Convention account, and you and I discussed this when we visited with you. I was described as being from Mangakino, which would have been home during the holidays, and just before my parents moved to Howick later in 1965. Auckland was my long-term residence, but I was working on my M.Sc. and doing much less DX! [Wonderful to hear from you, Tony. Don't be a stranger to us - memories, thoughts, experiences - they are all important and valued.]

Bryan Clark, Mangawhai reports another DXciting month with new catches on long wave, medium wave and a tentative reception of the rarely heard Congo DR station Radio Kahuzi on 6210.2. Listening on the League SDR at 1815 UTC on 20 September I found weak audio traces and decided to check some overseas SDRs to see if that would help identification. The TWR Swaziland SDR yielded nothing but listening on an Iceland based device I was

able to hear an African language until abrupt closing just after 1820 UTC. I verified this low powered operation in 2009 but it remains one of the most difficult DX targets from NZ - on this occasion, the frequency and time matches with recent overseas loggings.

The unexpected passing of Kelvin Brayshaw hit hard as we had been in regular email contact up till the week before. Kelvin retired to my home town of Levin so I was able to catch up with him personally when visiting Levin up until 2014 when my father died there. Kelvin was a gentle and gracious gentleman, always keen to help others and try to improve his DX opportunities. Radio and our hobby meant a lot to him. RIP good friend. Another fine DX person Henrik Klemetz of Sweden died on 21 September - I will contribute some personal memories of Henrik next month. [Thanks, Bryan, and bon voyage].

Bryan then added a post script: We enjoyed a flying visit to Greytown mid-September to catch up with Tony King for his 80th birthday celebrations. I first met Tony at the 1964 League Convention and we subsequently worked and flatted together, became next door neighbours and, of course, DXed together. Also attending the birthday was Claire Mazengarb who was I think the first presenter on WNTV1 when it commenced transmissions in 1961. Claire also worked for NZBC radio and the BBC at Bush House London. She recalled how the BBC General Overseas Service shortwave news bulletins used to be fed down live from Quartz Hill. Bulletins were also recorded so that, if reception conditions were too bad, they could instead play an earlier bulletin.

John Durham in Tauranga sent a note with his column: Sad news regarding Kelvin. Hardly any time radio wise this month. I can't say it was great to get back to cold wet Tauranga after a few weeks in the North of Aussie. [No, it is times like this that the tropics have a distinct advantage! These are the only months I iss Malaysia.]

Your Chief Editor in Mangawhai has a couple of veries back - I had forgotten what they look like, for Romania 11990, KDLG 670. I have also sent a report out to KLO 1430.

DENMARK

In a completely unexpected move the Danish authorities has withdrawn the permission to use out of band frequencies (on a non interference basis) for World Music Radio (WMR). This means that WMR will be ceasing operations on 5840 and 15805 kHz tomorrow Sunday September 15th 2009 at 2200 UTC.

WMR may return to shortwave – using frequencies inside the official SW bands– but this may take several months.

Meanwhile WMR continues being available via internet streaming at www.wmr.dk and hopefully also soon on medium wave 927 kHz in Copenhagen. (Via Stig Hartvig Nielsen)

Radio OZ-Viola has updated his Facebook page. He said: "Unfortunately, our good friend and colleague had to stop his broadcasts on 5840 and 15805kHz. since he cannot get his licenses renewed from the authorities.

The same can happen for us when we try to renew ours in a few months." Jan who runs OZ-Viola said in the comments section that the Danishauthorities had issued him and WMR with a temporary 'trial frequency' which had to be renewed annually.

He usually operates on weekend afternoons and some weekday evenings. You can check his Facebook page for latest updates of when he will be on air.

North Korea has returned to digital radio broadcasting after an absence of nearly two years. The latest Digital Radio Mondiale (DRM) shortwave transmissions began mid August. The country has had periodic DRM broadcasts for many years. It appears unclear at this time however whether the current series of transmissions will soon end or be the start of a regular service.

Thus far, all of the latest test transmissions have taken place on 3560 kHz, which is actually allocated for amateur radio use. According to radio enthusiasts in the region, the signal has been clear and very audible.

In 2012, 2016, and 2017, the country's international service, The Voice of Korea, trialed DRM. Those tests involved a professional grade DRM modulator, which identified itself as being from the Engineering Research Center of Digital Audio and Video (ECDAV) at the Communications University of China in Beijing.

Pyongyang Broadcasting Station, a Korean-language service for Koreans living in China, Japan, and South Korea, has been carrying out these latest broadcasts, which appear to implement two DRM modulators.

Based on settings and parameters, the first is the open-source, software-based Dream DRM transmitter.

Developed at Germany's Darmstadt University some 15 years ago, technicians continue to tweak various parameters, such as bandwidth, as they test and learn about the system. In spite of its age, the Dream DRM transmitter is compatible with any DRM receiver. North Korea could easily put on multiple DRM North Korean operators also appear to be using a professional-grade DRM modulator, which is most likely from private Chinese manufacturer Beijing Broadcasting Equipment Factory (BBEF). BBEF is best known for selling North Korea a number of shortwave transmitters ranging in power from 20 to 150 kW in 2011.

A professional DRM modulator is more capable than Dream. But North Korea probably cannot manufacturer its own and a single modulator can easily cost many thousands of dollars.

A lot has changed since North Korea last aired DRM broadcasts two years ago. Broadcasters in China and Guam have started regular DRM services and Russia is set to begin a service for Russia Far East. With so many DRM programs coming on air in the region, North Korea may finally decide to remain on the air for good using the digital radio standard.(Via Hans Johnson.Sept 12 2019. LATINS STILL RULE! AUSSIE X-BAND CLEANOUT

AUSTRALIA Effective 22 August, due to the high cost of broadcasting and technical maintenance, Rete Italia closed down a number of MW frequencies and MF-NAS (medium frequency narrowband area service stations (in the X-band).

The MW frequencies dropped are Perth WA on 657, Newcastle/Gosford NSW 801 and Wollongong NSW 1575.

The frequencies which will continue to transmit Rete Italia programs are Sydney NSW on 1539 AM and Melbourne VIC on 1593 AM.

[That's good news Steven – look forward to comparing the results from my new antenna farm then. BC]

BILL MARSH in Blenheim writes "There are some good openings on MW at moment so long may it last. Some new logs for me recently; KREA 1540, KATY 970, 2AP 540, WLW 700, CBU 690, KRAK?? 910, KEAR 610, KTWO 1030 all on the DX League's SDR #1. Need to get a little more serious." [Not sure what your 910 would be Bill – what format? Would the 970 be KHTY – a regular here? BC]

TONY KING (one of our most senior members with 65 years in the League!) of Greytown (apparently vying with Nelson for the title of 'centre of NZ! BC) writes on 21 September: "A pity I dismantled my southeast EWE last week. So am now on the E and NE EWE's. Today I heard 1170 KLOK in Hindi with KFAQ on talk at 0610 UTC, 1190 has 2 Latins at good strength, possibly Cordillera Bogota and Radio Nacional Cordoba, Argentina at 0615. Yet to replay recording for ID. And on 1270 Radio Provincias Buenos Aires 0630. It's still the season from the S/East. [Indeed, it is Tony! An hour after I got home from Greytown I logged a new Argie on 1290! BC]

And in a follow-up note on 24 September Tony says he is "impressed that South Americans are still coming through in the 90-minute window 0530 to 0700. on my E EWE, .and providing a southerly weather pattern is current. Years ago, Don Reed swore by the DX results he got when there is a southerly...seemed to act as a "reflective curtain" Very scientific! [The southerly effect does seem to work for me too Tony – I assumed it somehow cleaned up the atmosphere! BC]

STU FORSYTH Mangawhai says not a lot of activity or interest lately. However, driving north a week or so ago I noticed the full moon and thought I would have a listen, albeit quite late. I logged and reported KLO on 1430 - dominant on that frequency. All the usual stations seemed to be there. It was late and bed beckoned, but I thought I would log KLO anyway. Another night while in Titirangi I decided to have a listen on the League SDR - I couldn't believe the Alaskans. KDLG was logged, but others were noted and I will try again, particularly on 650. Surprisingly, given how they were coming in, I didn't hear KJNP. It was wonderful to hear so many Alaskans and I had great pleasure in reporting and verifying KDLG on 670. KBBI was there on 890 as well. It always pays to listen to the website relay as they often play music and it is not obvious what station it might be. Similarly, KDLG's website enables you to listen to what is being aired. It also gives the names of the songs, although they didn't really match what I was hearing. I would also recommend keeping an eye on 660 kHz. KAPS in Washington State was there with C & W. The signal was up and down, with deep lows. But when it was up it was guite good. It is 10 kw days and 1kw nights, nondirectional antenna. [Envy your 670 and 660 logs Stu! And I've never heard KJNP either! BC] BRYAN CLARK Mangawhai writes: The equinox times have always produced DX surprises for me and the spring equinox was no exception with my first reception of Argentina on 1290 and a low powered American off-frequency. Also Algeria on LW for the first time. A rare reception of ZNS1 Radio Bahamas was another highlight. See the Trail for all the details. But 21 September also saw the passing of one of the greatest exponents of our great hobby - Henrik Klemetz. The 2020 WRTH will be dedicated to Henrik and I will include some reflections in the next column.

FM Bits and Pieces

Here are a few updates gleaned during my checking the NZ FM listings for the 2020 World Radio TV Handbook:

- 87.7 Star in Wanaka reported by Douglas Johns whereas RBG publish frequency as 87.6. Dudley Scantlebury of RBG (a League member many decades ago) says where possible they have standardised the Star network in some centres in Otago and Fiordland on 87.6. This is not possible in all cases owing to the frequency being used by other broadcasters.
- 90.3 Akaroa Radio had been reported silent I queried operational status with operator Dave Edwards. He confirms this frequency and parallel 91.1 are back on air.
- 97.3 Rhema at Murchison a DX League member had reported hearing Life FM on this frequency, where Rhema is listed. Dudley of RBG says this would have been because Rhema carries the Life FM breakfast show between 6.00am and 10.00am. Otherwise there is no Life FM frequency in Murchison.
- 99.2 The Basin, Te Anau this station is no longer operating but there are plans for the frequency to be reactivated next year.

Brian FM advise that they do not yet have on air dates for their licences at Mt Hutt, Twizel, Wanaka and Hanmer Springs. I hope to release an updated NZ FM List for radiodx.com in the coming weeks. (Bryan Clark, Mangawhai)

Hi - I'm John Grant and together with my wife Lynda, are the proud owners behind this 100% locally owned and operated radio station.

This has been a huge week for us which culminated with switching on our transmitter for the Hauraki Plains and Coromandel West Coast yesterday at 4:05pm. You can now listen around the Peninsula on 94.0 on the West Coast and 95.1 on the East Coast. We have a peninsula wide service and we welcome our new listeners on 94.0. We hope you enjoy it as much as we enjoy providing our version of Pure Peninsula Radio.

In a couple of weeks we will further extend our coverage on the East Coast when we switch our transmitter in Whangamata on. This will improve our coverage to this area.

With the addition of 94.0 it has meant a rethink on our name and the result will see a small change. This does not suggest a change to ownership or our routes in the Waikato and Coromandel. What's happening is that we will be dropping the '95' from our name and will now refer to ourselves as Coromandel's CFM. This isn't going to happen overnight but rather

He tuned the standard broadcast band with an Atwater Kent receiver, eventually branching out to shortwave as well (KDKA was also the first shortwave broadcaster, having started regular shortwave transmissions in 1923). Dave's BCB QSLs from the 1920s reflect the varied station ownership of the time, and provide a window into many interesting details of station operation. We hope to post more of Dave's QSLs in the future.
