Rich D'Angelo in Wyomissing, Pa, USA is a member of NASWA and sends contributions around the world to the various clubs he is associated with. Rich is a regular contributor to our magazine. He had this to say about Kelvin: I was saddened to read about the sudden, unexpected passing of Kelvin Brayshaw in October's DX Times. Although I haven't been as active on the DX dials as much this year as in years past, my regular interactions with Kel were always enjoyable experiences being associated with the club. We would regularly exchange e-messages after my monthly logging contributions to the Over 9 Bandwatch column talking about family, friends, the state of the radio hobby, the weather and almost anything else that just came up in passing conversation. It is wonderful to start off this month with **Life Member Ken Baird**, over the hill in **Wainuiomata**. He writes: Been a while since I last contacted you since I have given up the Below 9 Bandwatch. As I have previously indicated I was having severe problems catching Intl SW B/C stations. The local noise level was 50dB here in Wainuiomata.

Arthur DeMaine suggested I use the DXL SDRs which I hadn't considered. Since 11/10/2018 I have been a very regular user of SDR1 plus some KIWI SDRs from <sdr.hu> when conditions are poor in NZ. A year has now passed and the results of my listening are :

Countries: 50

90/75M :4 ; 60m :16 ; 49m : 166 ; 41m : 179 ; 31M :85 ; 25M : 133 ; 22M : 40 ; 19M : 55 ; 16M : 23

A total of 701 broadcasts received from 11/10/2018 to 10/10/2019 which I think shows how good the SDRs are.

Contrary to opinion the SW Intl B/C stations are well alive particularly the 49, 40 & 25m bands However a lot of China!! Bro Stair still going strong as is Dr. Gene Scott?? (I understand he died several years ago)[*Indeed he did - Ed.*]. My best regards, Ken
[Wonderful to hear from you, Ken, and yes the SDRs are a wonderful, wonderful thing. It is a great innovation from Adcom and a magnificent testimony to Peter Mott and his dedication to good DX. Don't be such a stranger in the future, it is great to learn about what you are hearing.]

Mike Smith in Opunake sent me a contribution last month, which didn't arrive - it is probably still lost in the ether! I've been spending a bit of time at the dials - or computer - and got a report away to KALL 700 heard on the Northland SDR with a subsequent e-qs1. The Latins were still making appearances here at home on the SSE EWE during Sept, but have dropped off a bit now. The SDR was hearing some interesting Asians later in the evening. Of note, DYSS on 999 popped up one night, while 1602 produced NHK2 English lessons also. There about a dozen NHK2 sites there, all 1kW.

Just as an aside, the kids recently gave Wendy an Amazon Alexa "ask me anything internet gadget" so I've been asking it to play various radio webstreams . The station of choice lately has been "WSM 650 AM" - still sounds much like it did 40 years ago and still carries the Grand Ol Opry on Friday nights their time. Had it booming out on the front lawn while gardening one Saturday. Hope the neighbours enjoyed it!

Health is slowly improving - will be a while yet before I'm running on all cylinders but all going OK at the moment.*[Always good to hear from you, Mike. Glad things are on the improve. Haven't heard a Filippino from NZ in quite a while. Used to hear them in Malaysia, but they wouldn't reply!]*

Earlier in October, Mike wrote: Quiet on the radio front, I changed the Brazil EWE back to

looking at Japan but little spare time at the moment and I tend to go lights out a bit earlier than I used to! I joined the Dxing.info group on fb – they use 1000m beverages above the Arctic circle and are exclusively MW. Interesting to see what they hear, including NZ. If they can hear us, then we should be able to hear them – just need 1000m of copper wire and a big paddock... *[Yes, it is incredible what they can hear - mind you with 24 hour darkness it shouldn't be hard!]*

Bryan Clark in Mangawhai had limited time at the radio dial in October as he and Sandra were travelling in more exotic locations - Qatar, Switzerland, France and Germany.

“While in Doha, I managed to fit in a medium wave bandscan and locate a new English language FM broadcast from Al Jazeera which has been added to the 2020 WRTH listings. In Switzerland we stumbled on a big collection of Hallicrafters receivers at the Museum of Military Aviation outside Geneva, and in Berlin I had plenty of radio and DX-related moments, such as the RIAS 6005 transmitter on display at the Deutsches Technikmuseum. A more detailed report for the magazine when time permits.

Arriving home, I turned on the SDR and almost immediately logged a new MW American! Club member Willi Westrupp had asked me to check the frequency offset of KUAU 1570 which he was trying to log from Germany. That was done but in the process I heard KTGE Salinas mixing with XERF - the broadcast band is always full of surprises. Listed as 500 watts nights but Paul O speculates it may have been on its 5kw day power because of forest fires in the area.” *[And so the big shift is about to begin and the new antenna farm with it good luck with it all]*

John Durham in Tauranga reports: Very quiet month DX wise. Antenna has been repaired after falling to the ground and once again hoisted back up about 8 metres high attached to pole at one end and into a Japanese cedar tree at the other end. High noise level in the neighbourhood these days. Bought a cheap Chinese loop antenna MLA-30 to play around with and awaiting arrival, \$70.00 to the door. Hopefully may be able to null out some noise. *[Noise is an ever increasing problem. Good luck with the new loop - when it arrives.]*

Your **Chief Editor** is also on the move. Maureen and I are building on the hills at the back of Mangawhai. This was always our plan and our little home in the village was only ever a stop-gap measure. We have now sold and by the time the magazine comes out we will be out of our house. Titirangi will be our main base for the next twelve months, where reception is not great..

I did a little listening recently and discovered the quietest night I have experienced in Mangawhai. There were Yanks everywhere. My listening activities are in the trail. No reports out and no veries back.

HENRIK KLEMETZ The hobby recently lost one of its finest exponents. Mika Makelainen in DXing.info wrote on 21 September: “One of the most famous DXers of our time, Henrik Klemetz passed away early this morning in Sweden. Henrik died in a hospital in the town of Borås as a result of a serious illness. Henrik had lived for years in Colombia, and he was known especially for his unparalleled knowledge about the radio scene in Latin America. In 1989 he wrote a book titled “Latin America by Radio”, which was and still is a fabulous guidebook for identifying Latin American stations. In recent years he has not been actively DXing himself, but he has continued to help numerous DXers to identify Spanish-language stations, doing a lot of research, and often discovering the identity of obscure local stations unlisted in any publication. Henrik will be greatly missed among the global DXing community.” Jean Burnell Founder of the RealDX Yahoo Group wrote: “I and this group will always be grateful for his help, support and generosity. Henrik alone was SINPO 66666.”

Horacio Nigro Geolkiewsky of Nigro Montevideo Uruguay: Certainly, we are very sad as many DXers here in the southern cone of Latin America about Henrik passing. He was a pivotal value between the two worlds: Latin America, with his deep knowledge of its culture and languages. And the European culture. From the hobby point of view, he linked both ways the connection among European and Latin American DXers.

There are not many cases like this. And since with radio we cross boundaries, frontiers, nations his role proved to be essential promoting friendship above all. A real gentleman, rich in intelligence and culture he will really missed.

Bruce Portzer: So sad to learn of Henrik’s passing. I had the honour of meeting him a couple of times when he visited Seattle and found him to be as friendly in person as he was over the internet. His knowledge of Spanish and Latin American cultures was amazing and irreplaceable. The DX community has lost a wonderful person.

Bruce Conti: “A man of greatness among DX’ers, “Latin America by Radio” by Henrik Klemetz has been and will always be a treasured book in my library. Henrik Klemetz’s knowledge of Latin American radio is unsurpassed. As an example of something only Klemetz would know, during the 2017 Prince Edward Island DX’pedition an interval signal was received on 960 kHz which upon posting to RealDX it was immediately recognized by Klemetz as Radio Santa Cruz in Bolivia. His contributions to the DX community will always be remembered.”

[Over the past 3 years I have had a number of interactions with Henrik, investigating the identification of mystery Latin signals on MW. Most recently he has solved UNID stations on 1410 and 1490 for me, sometimes after other DXers have been sure that I was hearing

something else. Always courteous and ever helpful to the DX fraternity. RIP Henrik! BC]

MIKE SMITH Opunake sends in a trail of stations from 11 countries heard recently from home or via the League SDR. He writes: "Latins have taken a dive, not surprising for the time of year now. Sounded parallel to CBU 690. Later in the evening something to chase is the 1kW NHKs on 1602 or DYSS on 999. I haven't heard from my Brazilian colleague yet about the PP on 1060 but still hopeful of an ID." [Subsequent to this, Rudolf Grimm in Brazil, a member of the RealDX group, was able to identify Mike's 1060 mystery – making it the furthest northern Brazilian he has heard. See trail for details.]


