Senate Passes PIRATE Act

Opponents of illegal broadcasting scored a major and long-anticipated victory today: The Senate (finally) unanimously passed the PIRATE Act Wednesday.

Short for "Preventing Illegal Radio Abuse Through Enforcement," only one hurdle remains for S.R. 1228: President Trump's desk.

In response to the act's Senate passage, National Association of Broadcasters President/CEO Gordon Smith said, "This legislation provides stronger resources to help the FCC combat illegal pirate radio operations, which not only interfere with licensed radio stations but also public safety communications and air traffic control systems. We look forward to the President signing the PIRATE Act into law."

New York State Broadcasters Association President David Donovan also released a statement thanking the legislators and saying, "We are one step closer to providing the FCC with the tools it needs to address the growing illegal pirate radio problem."

It lists the frequencies covered by the act as being between 535 and 1705 kHz, inclusive, or 87.7 and 108 MHz - **pirate shortwave broadcasters are not included**. It also creates a maximum penalty for illegal broadcasts to \$2,000,000 — but also ups the fine allowable to \$100,000 per day. OUCH!

Last month, **Ken Baird** was talking about shortwave coverage to the Pacific Islands. He said: 'After the close of Radio Australia, they now only have RNZI, a 100KW Txer running at 50KW(why?)'.

Those who follow DX Dialog will have seen a lot of discussion about this issue. However, the final word should go to the man actually responsible for the service. League Member and RNZI head honcho, **Adrian Sainsbury** responded: 'I read the recent comment by Ken Baird about RNZI Pacific broadcasts to the Pacific. It is correct we do run the transmitter at 50 KW some of the day. Early morning transmissions are always at full power and also to PNG at 11 UTC. We also have the benefit of our curtain antennas that give us a gain of 10. So even at only 50 KW provides an ERP of 500 KW'.

As a footnote I must say that when I was on holiday in Niue last July, RNZI boomed in all day - it was an excellent signal. When living in Malaysia I was also able to listen to RNZI with relative ease, particularly at night. I suspect it was the signal to PNG carrying on to Cyberjaya. I don't know that 100kw is necessary for putting a great signal into a Pacific location.

I have had an email from **Ray Babbage** in **Melbourne**, with some interesting memories. [Ray was initially commenting on the possibility of the Ladders/ Continents section being dropped, not something I am personally in favour of]. I have been "pondering" the effect that might be caused by dropping this section. I, for a time in the early 80s, edited the section and I recall that the section was well patronised at that time. Took a bit of typing up on the Old MOW electric typewriters of those days!!.

I cannot track down my Times from those years to make comparisons though. There were certainly a lot more contributors, but our membership has "shrunk", I myself used to send in entries many "moons" ago and I sort of conclude that if the majority of members want the section, keep it...

Now I was reading a 1962 Auckland DX newsletter in recent days. I used to get the newsletter being a country member in Opotiki. Was still working there in 62 and I must comment the town was far more active then. I was there last March and it's certainly gone backwards like a lot of country towns. But the newsletter by Peter Kerr commented on the coming wedding of Barry Williams to Miss Alice Woodley!

UNITED KINGDOM

The BBC has confirmed details of how it will continue to reduce costs in its news division and how it will affect the service offered to viewers and listeners.

According to the announcement, 450 jobs will be cut, with more journalists to be based outside of London, as the BBC newsroom is reorganised along a 'story-led' model, focusing on news stories more than on programmes or platforms.

The move is designed to stop staff working on different programmes potentially duplicating work. The overall number of stories covered by BBC News will be cut, but outlets including the BBC News channel will be retained, as it is using and creating content that can be used by the rest of BBC News.

There will be further investment in digital news, with a new version of the BBC News app, which will be more intuitive, more visual, and with increased personalisation.

The cuts are needed as the BBC tightens its belt to afford the cost of delivering free TV licences to over 75s with Pension Credit. The BBC has so far resisted to take on the cost for other over 75s as it would force more cutbacks.

The BBC, as public service broadcaster, is required to maintaining its news provision on a variety of platforms, which adds to its operating costs. Earlier today, it confirmed that the BBC Red Button digital text service, which provides access to BBC News and BBC Sport news articles on TVs, would be kept on-air for the benefit of elderly and disabled viewers unable to access the internet for news.

World Update on World Service English will be closed, alongside other schedule changes. This is in addition to the changes to Asian language services outlined last year. (Via RXTV-Dan Wednesday January 29 2020)

ARMENIA: Another programme with target area Middle East is now using the Gavar/Noratus site in Armenia. While Iran International (TV audio) can still be found on 1395 since weeks almost 24/7, the Arabic language outlet of Trans World Radio has begun to broadcast via 1350 AM from Armenia just recently. Their religious shows are aired via this new frequency until late at night (at least from 2100–0100 or so) from a directional antenna towards Middle East. An image at the top of their website http://www.arabicprograms.org/main.php is announcing 1350 as a new reception possibility. Before, closure of this frequency was at 1915 with the ending of the Hebrew and English program. I am wondering: Does this new offer for people speaking the Arabic language has something to do with the switch-off at 1233 Cape Greco site, Cyprus earlier this year? However, this helps to improve the reception of the Arabic TWR outlet in that region. ("Robert" via Ydun's Medium Wave Info 12/19) According to an updated list, broadcasting time of the Arabic programs on AM 1350 [TWR Gavar] for Middle East is from 1930 until 2155. They also transmit "Dardasha" which can be heard on BVB via shortwave too. (Robert D, mediumwave.info 12/19 via IRCA)

AUSTRALIA Listeners to Nowra-based Radio 2ST (999 AM) could soon be enjoying clearer and higher-quality audio under a proposed move from the ACMA. The proposal would see 2ST move from its current AM radio frequency to a new FM transmission, and 2UUU permitted to increase the power of its transmitter at Shoalhaven Heads. The changes are part of a project converting commercial radio stations in certain regional areas from AM to FM, which provides better sound quality and can be more cost effective for station operators. Submissions on the Nowra proposal are due by 28 February 2020. If the ACMA approves the conversion, the timing of the transition will be decided by the broadcaster. (Richard Jary ICDX IO Group) 2AD Armidale 1134 is also moving to FM. (Todd Emslie ICDX-AM IO Group) Rete Italia Melbourne 1593 did close, but only to be replaced by Niche Radio Network, which actually takes part programming from Rete Italia, along with other foreign language programmes. Tt is possible that when 1539 kHz Rete Italia Sydney closes, it may be replaced in a similar way.(Robert Copeman ICDX AM IO Group)

The channel is challenging, giving BBC, two commercial stations from Japan, Iran, and Saudi Arabia. I heard Micronesia once. There are also North American stations on 1450 to reckon with. My email report soon had a reply from the Chief Technical Officer saving: "It is really unexpected and surprising to know that you received our medium wave radio service on 1449khz. We just started the service as a test transmission after a long break of service roughly for one year. We have changed the transmitting site from the capital city Male' to a nearby island called Thilafushi. If you could login to Google Earth and check geo location 4°10'58"N 73°25'45"E you will notice the ground radial of the station. Just to add more to your information; we're radiating 25Kw on analogue radio service and the transmitter is ready for digital radio on DRM as well. Once we are satisfied with the coverage, we will start the digital radio service." (Svenn Martinsen via DXing.info Facebook Page)



Ray Crawford sent me a link to an interesting article on *radioinfo.com.au* about the fate or state of radio stations affected by the recent bush fires. It said:

Nearly 80 community radio stations are broadcasting in fire affected areas of Australia.

With around 450 stations in the sector, community broadcasters are represented in most larger towns in Australia. Many of them are staffed by small handfuls of volunteers who keep the station on air in normal circumstances, but during the current bush fire situation, many of those stations are facing severe pressure on their people and resources.

The Community Broadcasting Association (CBAA) has been in contact with many of the stations in affected areas and tells radioinfo that, thankfully, most don't have a lot of damage to their property or equipment, but they are struggling with exhaustion and reduced volunteers to broadcast live shows from the stations.

Many community stations are located in protected areas at the centre of their town and often have their transmitters atop their building, so the infrastructure threat has not been as serious as might be expected. However the cost to people has been high.

Several stations, some of which asked not to be named, have told radioinfo that members have resigned or taken time off due to exhaustion. In one case broadcasters were on air while their houses were burning down.

2EAR in the Eurobodalla shire, which includes Batemans Bay, was not as lucky as some. Its transmitter on **FM 107.5** was destroyed by fire on 31 December. Station Manager Kathy Shields says the station is in the process of getting a new antenna with help from the CBF for emergency grant funding. The transmitter wasn't insured as it was in a location where insurance rates were too expensive for the station to afford.

Shields told the CBAA: "Everyone at the station has been very shaken as a result of the fires,

but this disaster has also united the community."

These stations are closely linked to their communities, drawing their announcing, producing and support volunteers directly from the towns where they broadcast. Almost everyone in the worst hits areas knows someone who was injured or killed in the fires, or had their house burnt. Most are very shaken but are bravely continuing to give information as the fire threat continues.

In Mallacoota, another area hard hit by the fires, **3MGB** was off air for a short while, but is now back on air and online as the station's 20 volunteer presenters struggle to keep programming going as best they can.

In Canberra 1Way FM is reported to be off air and the station has been evacuated.

Stations in the worst hit areas report that their teams are stressed and traumatised by the events that they have had to cover. [Not surprising at all - out thoughts are with them.]

(which apparently is now Great American Products, a seller of promotional merchandise). Jonathan had been posting recordings regularly from 2010 to 2016, then paused in 2017. When he resumed in 2018 we stopped the indexing because the website format had changed, but we have picked it up again. There is a search box on the Vintage Vault website, and the index represents another way of using the search box to find programs you might be interested in. If you haven't looked at the Vintage Vault, you should. As the index suggests, there is a wealth of information here, and just being able to hear the voices of Jonathan, Diana and the rest of the Media Network gang is a treat in itself.
