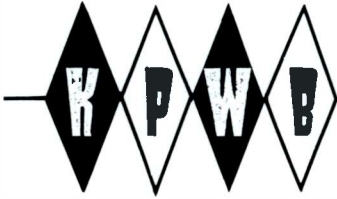

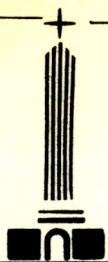
Your proof of reception was compared with our log and found to be identical.



Dear Kermit,

I am pleased to confirm your written/taped report of KOKO radio during our DX broadcast of Monday morning, January 21, 1974 at 2:25 A.M. CDT on 1450 KHz. We were operating with a power of 1,000 watts during the experimental period. As I can hear from the tape, we just barely made it in, but no doubt you had us.

Yours was one of four reports received from a distance of about 1,000 miles. I hesitate to say which one is the most distant, not knowing exactly where each DXer is located, and having only a flat map to judge by. The other three 1,000 milers were David Thomas in Tampa, Fla., Tom Sundstrom in Willingboro, N. J., and Daryl Belanger of Swan River, Manitoba. Thomas and Sundstrom, like you, were able to hear only CW, but Belanger got some good audio and sent a tape of it. Thomas heard the same CW ID you heard, while Sundstrom caught us right after sign-on at 2AM.

We were pleased to get a total of 23 reports from 12 states plus Manitoba. The most came from Illinois (5), with Nebraska (4), Indiana (3), and Ohio (2) following. Single reports, in addition to the states previously mentioned, came from Texas, Louisiana, Minnesota, Missouri, and Oklahoma.

Congratulations on a fine catch, and I hope to be reading of your DX activities in DX News! Best of DX and thanks for listening.

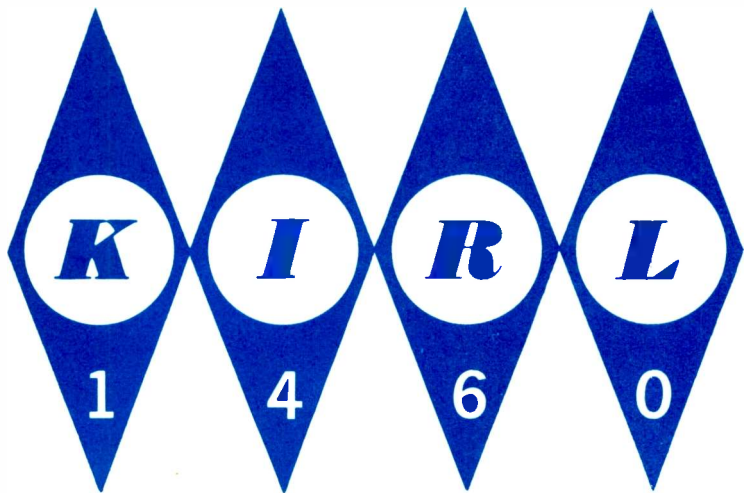
Thank you for your letter of March 2, 1949. This is to confirm your reception of K. I. R. X. of the morning of March 2, 1949.

Thank you for your reception report of KIRL Radio, which has been compared with the daily operating logs and found to be substantially correct.

KIRL is a 5000 watt AM station on 1460 kHz, licensed to operate daytime and make certain unscheduled tests between midnight and dawn. Our programming is generally contemporary hit records and large selling hits of the past, together with local news and news from the ABC Contemporary Network.

Equipment at KIRL is from many various companies, with a Collins 21E-1 transmitter into a two-tower directional antenna array. The directional pattern is not too much different than the circle of a non-directional station, except that the center has been shifted somewhat to the west.

KIRL is a new station in 1968, operating in the St. Louis suburb of St. Charles, Missouri. Our normal coverage is roughly the eastern half of Missouri and the southwest quarter of Illinois, although we have been heard on occasion on both coasts of the United States, Canada, and in several other foreign countries.

We appreciate and confirm your reception report, and regret that we do not have any regularly scheduled after-midnight frequency tests or the like, although we are frequently on the air during the testing period. Thank you for your interest in KIRL.

Please accept this letter as confirmation of reception of signals from this radio station during the time period 1:06:30AM CDT to 1:20AM CDT on the morning of Wednesday, October 22, 1958. For your information, our carrier was on from 1:05AM CDT to 2:33:30AM CDT on this particular morning. We transmitted program material and sine wave tone intermixed between these two times. Our engineering staff, by the way, was conducting a "proof of performance" on the engineering equipment this particular morning in connection with filing our renewal of license for this station with the FCC.

As you already know, this station operates on 1460 KC with 5000 Watts of power, daytime only. Our studio and transmitter building is located on Missouri Highway 94 at the intersection of County Highway B in St. Charles County, 3 miles north of St. Charles, Missouri, and just across the river (Missouri River) from St. Louis County. We operate with a Collins 5KW/10KW transmitter and two element antenna system. Our audio equipment lineup is completely Collins; including the largest Collins control board manufactured, three Collins turntables, and both a Collins compression amplifier and a Collins limiter-amplifier. We also have a Magnecord and a Presto tape recorder-playback unit. We have one main studio and also a control room-studio combination.

For your further information, we began commercial broadcasting on April 3rd of this year. Although we are just a "daytimer", you will be able to hear us any early Wednesday morning, since this is our regularly scheduled transmitter maintenance time

Thank you for your interest, and please excuse this typewriter- it's the worst one in the whole building.

KTGR-AM operates at 250 watts non-directional sunrise to sunset. Our antenna is a 150' (155' overall) series fed guyed tower. Our transmitter is a 17 year old Gates BC250-GY which amazes us every time we take a proof. Its good performance led us to try supermodulation (negative peaks limited sharply to 99%, unlimited positive peaks - often as high as 120%) using the Gates limiters. It has worked out very well. The limiters were in circuit at the time of the voice ID.

Your report stands as one of the very few we have received from so far east.

We received with great interest your reception report of the transmission of Sept. 25, 1955. Yours is the second such report we have received as a result of this test. The reason for the test was that we had had a very severe hum and some other distortion on the carrier most of the day and I was trying to check to see if we had eliminated the trouble. The limiter which we use is a Gates Sa-39. This unit has in the past given much trouble and the difficulty was again traced to this unit.

You may be interested in a few facts concerning our installation. The transmitter is a Gates BB-500GY using a single 833a as a final rf tube. The modulation consists of pp 6L6's driving pp 810's this is applied to the carrier by means of plate modulation of the 833a. The antenna system consists of 120 95' radials spaced the standard 3 degrees apart. The tower is 95' high excluding the base insulator and the pier on which it sets. The overall height is 98'. The radiation resistance of the antenna system is 12.7 ohms. The lower radiation resistance allows us to load 6.28 amps. of rf into the antenna system. Our transmitter is remote controlled from our downtown studios. All of our equipment is of the Gates manufacture. This equipment is used very extensively in this part of the country as well as several other parts.

My monthly freq. check comes in October the 9th at 12:00 to 12:15. This is on next Sunday morning. I will if you like stay on for a half hour or so so that some of the other club members could try to copy our signal. I hope the info contained herein is helpful should you desire any further info I shall try to supply it if I can. I have enclosed a copy of our coverage map. This was taken from our Engineering brief filed at the time of application.
