



Dear Mr. Geary,

I'd like to thank you for the report sent us recently. The information logged by you is correct and has been checked by our program director against our program logs.

Enclosed is a copy of our pattern as measured by us and filed with the F.C.C. We're licensed to operate daytime with 1,000 watts on 1,000 kilohertz. We use two $\frac{1}{4}$ wavelength towers spaced 80 degrees (218 feet). The towers are oriented 330 degrees true North and operate with 3.05 amperes into the North tower and 4.50 amperes into the South tower. The electrical phase relationship is a negative 128 degrees. The power ratio is 68%. Our common point operates at 4.65 amperes.

We use a Gates BC 1 T for the main transmitter and a Gates BC 500 T for the auxillary. We have an 11 thousand watt standby generator for power failures.

If you are in this area, please feel free to stop in for a visit and tour of our facility.





The New Jersey Turnpike Highway Advisory Radio was introduced in 1992 with three permanent stations on 1610 KHz located in Elizabeth, Cranbury and Mount Laurel. There was also one transportable HAR which could be set up at any suitable location for broadcast on either 1610 KHz or 530 KHz. The Highway Advisory Radio was recently expanded to cover the entire Turnpike with the addition of six new sites and one additional portable HAR.

The six new sites are as follows:

1. John Fenwick Service Area - Oldmans Township
2. Interchange 3 - Woodbury
3. Interchange 7 - Bordentown
4. Interchange 11 - Woodbridge
5. Interchange 14B - Jersey City
6. Route 95 near Fort Lee Road - Leonia

The new sites operate on the same frequency as the previous stations, 1610 KHz with the exception of two sites at Interchange 14B and the site on Route 95. These two stations operate on 590 KHz. The station you may have been listening to was the Turnpike's HAR station located at Interchange 7.

At the present time, the stations are operating under temporary FCC licenses and station call letters. The temporary station ID for the site you heard is KPD-688. I hope you find this information helpful for your records, please feel free to contact me if you need any additional information.




We at the new WGHT! were pleased and excited by your recent letter and are glad to confirm your reception of the station at 7:06 AM on September 14. Your comments regarding signal strength and audio quality are also appreciated.

I noted that you use a Hammarlund HQ-180 receiver for DX'ing. I use a similar (but not as sensitive) vintage Knight R-100A with a long wire antenna but have not received the station at my home in southern New Jersey.

WGHT operates with an antenna input power of 1080 watts into a three tower directional array. We are currently licensed for daytime operation only. We recently replaced the modulator and final tubes in the transmitter and increased modulation strength which probably explains your ability to receive the station at this time.

Thanks for your letter and your kind words. I hope we can continue to deliver a signal into your area and provide you with some pleasant DX time.



Dear Kermit,

First, let me thank you for your reception report of our new frequency on the expanded AM band. Believe me, it was a long and slow process from conception to completion, but we've finally made it. Reports such as yours have been arriving daily from all parts of the globe. This has both surprised and pleased us.

Next, I'd like to let you know that what you reported hearing on Dec. 13 was accurate, so please accept this letter as a formal verification. Ownership of the frequency has since been assumed by the Children's Broadcasting Corporation who program an innovative format known as "Radio Aahs (pronounced "Oz"). Should you continue to tune in WJDM 1660, this is what to listen for.

Now a little technical information about our station: 1660 kHz shares the same folded unipole antenna as our 1530 kHz transmitter. The tower itself is only about 80 feet tall and was newly skirted back in September when the new 1660 transmitter arrived. The tower and transmitters are housed in an elevated shack in a watershed area in Union, New Jersey. The new transmitter is a Harris DX10 which is authorized to run at 10,000 watts non-directional between the hours of sunrise and sunset. Otherwise it runs at 1,000 watts non-directional. The 1530 transmitter is a Broadcast Electronics AM-1 and is operated at 1,000 watts when 1660 is at 10,000. 1530 is a day-timer and shuts down at sunset.

I've enclosed something that may be of interest to you: It's a computer projection of WJDM's 1660 kHz signal pattern. This impressed us when it was done in 1992, so imagine how it felt to start getting letters similar to yours from all over the world! You should know that Mr. Quinn had been discussing the expanded band as far back as 1988 when I came on-board.

I thank you again for your letter and hope that you'll continue to check in with 1660 once in awhile to see how we're doing.



Dear Sir,

I have pleasure in reporting excellent daytime reception of your Radio Station WJRZ here in Eastern Pennsylvania. On Tuesday, October 23, 1962, I tuned in your AM station on 970 kilocycles at 11:20 A.M., Eastern Daylight Saving Time, and listened to the Steve Hollis Show until 12:00 Noon, followed by 15 minutes of the latest news until 12:15 P.M., E.D.S.T. My location is 75 air miles due West of Newark, N.J.

WJRZ's signal in this area was strong and clear, rating a good S-9 report, with an input voltage into my receiver of 15 microvolts as measured on the signal-strength meter. No fading was detected, and there was no atmospheric static. Your frequency was entirely free of interference. As the result of such favorable conditions, your broadcast was heard with perfect clarity (Readability-5), affording 100%-enjoyable program reception at this distance from Newark. Your carrier was steady, clean-cut, and fully modulated. The tonal quality of both speech and music was excellent. It is a pleasure to hear WJRZ reaching over here into Pennsylvania in such fine shape, and you are to be congratulated on the power and efficiency of your transmitting equipment.

My receiver is a National "HRO" 9-tube communications-type superhet, 1935 model. I was using a single-wire inverted "L" antenna, 200 ft. long and 30 ft. high, extending toward the Southeast, with the lead-in to the receiver coming off the Northwest end. My ground connection is made to an iron water pump in a well 175 ft. deep.

Please confirm my reception of station WJRZ on 970 kc. I shall be happy to receive your reply, kindly verifying the fact that I heard your broadcast as reported above. Return postage is enclosed for your reply. As proof that I was tuned to WJRZ, I give the following log of the broadcast to which I listened:

After verifying the facts contained in your report with the information contained on our program logs, I can confirm your reception of WSSJ on Wednesday, December 17, 1980 between the hours of 4:56 PM and 5:34 PM Eastern Standard Time.

It's interesting to see that you received WCAM 38 years prior to this logging. I'm sure that a great deal has changed since then. First of all, when you received WCAM the first time the station was owned by the City of Camden. We are now under private ownership; Wade Broadcasting of Philadelphia is the licensee. Also, to the best of my knowledge, I don't think that the station was using the same transmitter site then, that we use now. I think that our current site was constructed in the 40's. 





I am pleased to confirm your reception of radio station WIMG, Ewing, NJ on January 8, 1982. Your report of our programming was most complete, and showed more detail for the time period between 10:23 a.m. and 11:10 a.m. than our own program sheets!

The female announcer you mentioned was "Minday", a great local favorite; the newscaster is Rich Mates, our News Director.

WIMG is one of the few stations operating with a "Critical Pattern". That is, we are responsible for maintaining very tight control over our signal contours, day and night. At the time you heard WIMG, we were operating with our full daytime power of 5000 Watts; at night we reduce our emission to 2500 Watts.

This power reduction and tight pattern at night lead to a few problem areas in our listening area; in the evening we are aware that WFBR covers us in areas we wish were clear. A simple reorientation of the radio in most cases eliminates the interference (eg., at my home in Princeton Junction) but you can't ask listeners to play games of that sort. In the morning hours, following local sign on in Albany, NY, but before WIMG is permitted to use its daytime pattern and power, WQBK often provides more signal at my home than does WIMG. So your report of clear reception was refreshing.

Our four tower antenna array and transmitting/studio site is located $\frac{1}{4}$ -mile from the Delaware River in Washington Crossing, PA. This site, being to the north of the heavily populated Trenton/Ewing/Hamilton area, means we focus most of our signal in that direction, consistent with protecting WSSJ and WJLK on adjacent channels to us.
