Wish to thank you very deeply for your fine constructive comments on reception of our AFRS outlet here in San  $J_u$ an.

On November 22nd 1951 we were operating on two hundred fifty watt, Airco Transmitter, 1470 KC's.

We were greatly surprised to hear from such a distance and our engineer Mr. Tomas Valines wishes to thank you for your comments from the engineering standpoint.

We are located at the US NAVAL Station, San Juan, P. R. with antenna stranded cable \( \frac{1}{4} \) wave on telephone poles, cable at 45 feet elevation.

The Airco Transmitter we are using is a surplus Army Signal set with lots of bugs which Mr. Valines is working on, we alternate with a Collins Model 32 RA-7 of only 50 watts on days when the bigger set is down for alterations so that is why you probably have not been receiving us more often, incidentally both transmitters are High Frequency transmitters re-designed for standard broadcast by our engineer.

Thank you again very much for your helpful information and send you the Seasons greeting from AFRS San Juan, P. R.

Dear Sir:

Thanks, very much, for your reception report(s). You heard our frequency-check transmission(s) for Feb. and Mar.: during which times we were radiating two hundred-fifty watts. Up to now, we've never attempted to transmit for this test on our assigned power of fifty (50)-watts.

Each month, just prior to our test transmission, we soup up the transmitter and touch up the tuning from tha antenna, on back. When the test begins, we attempt to hold right on the 100%-mark on the modulation-monitor indicator. During the test, AHD radiates a little more than 250-watts from a longwire, top-loaded antenna. The design of the antenna is the reason for our long skip -- We've had reports from many Eastcoast states, Ohio, Illinois, Nebraska; and even one from Albuquerque, New Mexico.

This station is completely GATES equipped and the present rig was first put on the air last May 26. Our set-up is the same as you'd find in many 250-watt B'cast. stations there in the U.S.A. We have the usual run of auxiliary equipment, which includes Freq. Monitor, Mod, Monitor, Tape Recorders, disc recorder, remote-line amp., Short-wave receivers, Limiter, etc.

You may consider this a confirmation of both your recorded receptions of AHD (Feb. 21, '52 and Mar. 20, '52) between the times 0430 and 0445 - Atlantic Standard Time.

Please excuse the delay in answering your communications we are in the process of installing some new studio facilities, and the complete staff of AHD has been rather busy.

Thanks, again, for your report. We shall be happy to reply to any correspondence you may favor us with in the future.

This letter is to confirm that the information you sent regarding the WCGB test program of December 6, 1971 at 2:00-2:30 a.m. AST conforms to our log.

WCGB is a daytime station on 1050 Khz with 1000 watts of power. Located on the south coast of Puerto Rico, near Juana Diaz, WCGB programs in Spanish with the exception of one and a half hours of English programs at mid-day. Thank you very much for your report on our signal up your way. Your letter was one of the many received from the United States and Canada. We are glad to acknowledge and verify your reception of our program.

In cooperation with the Courtesy Committee of the NRC, we are arranging a special DX Test Program on our station. The scheduled date and time is Tuesday, February 26, 1957 from 4:30 - 5:00 AST.

WIVV is owned and operated by the Calvary Baptist Mission of Puerto Rico, and operated on an assigned frequency of 1370 kc., with a power output of 1000 watts. We broadcast 17 hours a day, beginning at 6:00 a.m. Our initial broadcast was December 8, 1956.

Our equipment is all new R.C.A. The transmitter is lKW BTA-LMK, using 470 feet of RG 18U coax line feeding into a 200 foot guyed tower. The tower is in a marshy low swamp which gives us a good ground system.

Our programing is 50% religious, 40% good sweet music of the classical and semiclassical nature, and 10% public service and local reports. We broadcast 15 hours in English and 2 hours in Spanish.

Vieques is a small island, 23 miles long and 5 miles wide, east of Puerto Rico with a population of ten thousand. Pineapple, sugar cane, and coconuts are the main crops.

On survey, we find our greatest listening audience is in the Virgin Islands with a total population of 12 million, most of which are English speaking people. Our signal is heard regularly and all day by audiences nearly one thousand miles away. We are very happy about this.


