


Your verification is correct in every respect. We shall have our next DX program January 4 and 5, 1946. Best wishes for a Happy and Prosperous New Year.





Station.


We appreciate, very much, your taking the time to

spring, if present plans materialize, WNAX will be
broadcasting from the tallest tower in the Western
Hemisphere. We will erect a 927-foot tower, if the
steel is available and, thus, have the distinction
of the tallest antenna in the Western Hemisphere
and the second tallest in the World. Our engineers
advise us that with the new antenna, we will prob-
ably increase our coverage by about 40 percent.
