Incidentally, a phonograph company became so excited after hearing the trick orchestra Victor Young built for this program that they recorded it on the spot without waiting to see how the radio audience liked the new trumpetless and saxless combination.

BEHIND THE "MIKE"

With EVERETTA LOVE

"Yes—and pretty! And so young—"

Sylvia Froos was the subject of the conversation. We watched her as she stood before the "mike" with all the poise of the oldest radio prima donna. She had on a bright red dress that accentuated her co-ed appearance, and was most becoming with her dark brown hair and grey-blue eyes....Her childish five feet and two inches were hardly adequate for impressing her audience that here was a very grown-up young lady who had already found her niche in the entertainment world....Yet one was conscious of the fact that she had "arrived"... that she was a radio personage....there was something about her calm assurance

and the ease with which the sang that placed her in a class with the seasoned celebrities.

She seemed to have all the irrepressible enthusiasm of extreme youth. Between her numbers, she carried on an animated conversation with the announcer, laughed and made faces at us... and in her voice as she sang, there was a fresh, buoyant quality that isn't to be found in other blues voices on the air....



SYLVIA FROOS

With her eighteenth birthday due on April 19th, she was still in proud possession of her title as the youngest star in radio. "Baby Sylvia" she was called when, after making her debut at the age of seven, she became a sensation on the vaudeville stage. She toured all over the country and theatre managers paid fines, after legal battles with child labor boards, but they didn't mind for, wherever Sylvia appeared on a bill, she meant big audiences and money for the theatres.

The Christmas holidays of 1931 brought two important events for her. She was booked for the Palace Theatre, New York, with the Four Marx Brothers and she made her initial bow over a big chain network. Now, she is the featured artist with Louis Silvers' orchestra, in the Richman Brothers program, heard over WABC and affiliated stations Tuesday and Thursday evenings at 7:30, and she has just

begun a Sunday broadcast at 7:30 p. m. with the Three Bakers over WJZ and the NBC network. Such a busy and popular lady!

After her program which I visited, I cornered her away from the admiring males who were hanging around, and asked her all about herself. You might think, from some of her pictures, that she is sophisticated. I thought so. But, after one minute with her, I quickly changed my opinion. Rarely have I found such delightful naivete as hers. She talked eagerly about her work and what she hopes to do, always showing a dimple in one cheek when she smiled. When I asked her about the other dimple, she said that her cheek got fat and the dimple went away.

"I'm sort of dieting now," she said, a little anxiously. "I don't eat candy or anything fattening."

But her mother takes good care of her and sees that she eats enough. For breakfast, Sylvia has grapefruit, wholewheat toast, a two-minute egg and milk. Maybe that's why she has a lovely clear skin.

"I never drink coffee. except when I'm reckless," she said,

Her days are always full of work and plans. After breakfast, she usually goes to the publishers' and picks out new songs, then rehearses. She makes all of her selections herself.

"I plan my radio programs as I did on the stage," she said. "I use two fast numbers and two slow ones. I think most singers use too many slow numbers, but it's hard to find good peppy ones."

She likes swimming and indoor sports, particularly ping pong, and she has two hobbies—collecting tiny pot plants and perfumes. She spends hours taking care of her plants. Nobody else is allowed to touch them.

She says she's too busy for dates-but what do you think?

LISTENING IN

With EVE

O you write fan letters when you hear a program that pleases you? You may think it's a more or less silly thing to do, but if you knew how the sponsors pore over every line written in to their artists, and how they judge them by their letters and decide they're no good if they don't get many, you'd sit right down and write to your favorite singer, actor or announcer, or maybe you'd write to a station in gratitude for a program which you have enjoyed.

I was having it out with an official of one of the big broadcasting companies the other day, about why more prominence and money aren't devoted to really good stuff on the air, and he said that he regretted it, but that they had to plan their programs to satisfy the public which wrote in and indicated its approval of a certain type of entertainment. His company, he said, received twelve million fan letters during a year, that number being a third of the listening public of the nation. But, I argued, why make the other two thirds suffer for the pleasure of the third that writes letters. Most people wouldn't bother to write a fan letter. They think it is an inane pastime.

Nevertheless, he replied, the companies must have some means of judging what the public likes and, until some better medium is found, the fan letter is elected to serve the purpose. When there is a beautiful symphony broadcust or an unusually high type of program presented, they receive scarcely a letter, he pointed out, while the crooners and popular singers are snowed under with mail. There must be a reason, he said. The majority of the people don't enjoy more serious music. I think they do. I contend that it just doesn't occur to them to So, how about backing write letters. me up and putting down your appreciation in black and white the next time you hear a fine program?

And, speaking of good music, WOR offers some of the best to be heard on the air, with its Little Symphony, the Choir Invisible, Moonbeams, Eddy Brown, violinist, and Clarence Adler, pianist... also Bernhard Levitow's Ensemble Symphonique....

That "K-7" series over WJZ on Sunday nights, secret service spy stories, is a thrilling one.... and somewhat different

from any other mystery series....Richard Gordon gave a splendid performance in one of the stories recently, taking a German role ... He told me that he perfected his accent by listening to the speech of a German waitress in one of his clubs...

Ziegfeld's Radio Show on Sundays at 9 p. m. over WABC is interesting mainly because of the idea of Ziegfeld being on the air... As for its entertainment value, well Ziegfeld girls are noted for their looks, not their voices, and we can hear the other artists on some one or other of a half dozen guest star programs...so, figure it out for yourselt....

While I'm on the subject of guest stars. I heard Frances Langford singing during Abe Lyman's broadcast over WABC the other night, and the way she did "Between the Devil and the Deep Blue Sea" should have made all the other blues singers blue, or is it green, with envy—That song was meant for her, all right.

If you're gone on somebody and are too bashful to let the Big Moment know about it, just write in to Love Letters on the Air at WOR and tell that person to listen in on Wednesday at 9:45 p. m... Maybe your letter will be read (no name attached), and everything will be all fixed up for you....Unique, isn't it?....

WRNY has some unusually good artists for a small station... Mogilol's Russian Gypsy Orchestra, on Mondays at 8:30 p. m., plays spirited music from the land of the steppes and also popular music, in a Russian manner... Edythe Handman, heard on Tuesday nights, has a voice not unlike Coanie Boswell's... like the famous Boswell's, her voice has a sweet, plaintive quality that makes it popular... And, last, but by no means least in importance, there is Ed Sammons, who is heard on Fridays at 6:15 p. m. A newcomer to radio, Ed is one of the most pleasing singers on the air, and, no doubt you'll be hearing him over a big chain before many moons....

A group of Japanese Naval officers, now in New York, were guests of the National Braodcasting Company over the weekend. The party, which included nine lieutenant-commanders and Captain Hiraoka, viewed programs in rehearsal and on the air, and listened to engineers' explanations of technical operations.

Paul Van Loan, the husky band-leader on Alice Joy's program, has discovered a novel use for the trade name of the smoking tobacco which sponsors his program. It seems that medical students are called upon every so often by their instructors to name and identify the four valves of the heart, which are in order, the pulmonary, the aortis, the mitral and the pricuspid. To stave off embarrassing moments the fledgling doctors have invented a little catch phrase to help them keep their valves straight. "I'rince," they say to themselves, thereby remembering the pulmonary valve. "Albert" is the second step, calling to mind "aortis." "My," the third, and "Tobacco" the tourth. You can't go wrong they say, if you use this system.

• •

The world would go crazy, according to New York University scientists, if the human ear were as sensitive as the microphone. In proof of their point, they broadcasted on Saturday, April ⁹th, the roar of bursting soap bubbles, explosions of a glass of beer and music as relayed by a bath towel.

These and other phenomena were broadcast over the Columbia Broadcasting System from the laboratory bench of the General Science Department in the School of Commerce of the University. The 15-minute experiment was climaxed when a professor blasted dirt from his hands.

The latter was accomplished with soap. Its capillary force, science explains, lifts particles of dirt from the human hand. The resulting noise through the microphone sounded to the listener much like dried peas dropping in a dish pan or distant machine gun fire on the Chinese front. But it merely was the professor flecking a drop of lather from his little finger.

The purpose of the broadcast was to demonstrate the force of what science calls capillary attraction. There is enough such force in a single bar of soap to lift the Empire State Building, the department says, though the experimenters did not intend to try it.

Instead they put a microphone near glasses of soda water, ginger ale and beer. Listeners heard millions of bubbles arise and burst in air, the ginger ale going "bang!" and the beer only "phoophing." The beer noise was softer. Soap bubbles were noisier and, as bits of dust punctured them, their explosions were heard from coast to coast.

The crashing noise produced by water, soaking and swelling a sliver of wood, also was heard while the professor explained that if man had as much force, in proportion, he could pick up an elephant in each arm and run up six flights of staris. Cheops of Egypt knew this 5,000 years ago when he blasted rocks from the pyramids. Slaves drove pieces of wood into drill holes, poured water on the wedges, and the rocks split.

The professors also broadcast "the noise of water rising in a towel." Further, they plucked a dry cotton thread from a towel, connected it with a phonograph and the microphone, and—did you hear the music? You did not. But the professor squeezed a drop of water on the thread and, instantly, you heard the music.

The climax came with the "stripping apart of two pieces of glued paper." This scene, according to the producers, created a bombardment much like the sound of lifting a cancelled postage stamp.

stamp.

Someday, in similar experiments, they hope to broadcast the sound of a man thinking. Right now, they say, this is impossible. They haven't found a way to eliminate such "static" as heart-beats.
