


Radio Set and Phonograph Combinations



**三连接性能** 

A radio receiving set especially designed to be placed in any one of several styles of phonograph cabinets has recently been produced by the Radio Corporation of America. This set, which is illustrated in the photograph herewith, is so constructed that it is comparatively thin and therefore can be placed in the lid of a standard phonograph, as shown directly above. In this way it does not interfere with the operation of the phonograph and when the radio set is to be used, a loud speaking unit can be attached to the end of the tone arm of the phonograph and the acoustic qualities of the phonograph horn can be utilized for reproduction of music and sounds. Thousands of dollars have been spent for research work in the construction of phonograph forns and it is well to make use of the fine qualities of the units such as are now produced. In this way an excellent loud talker can be had without any very great expense. As will be seen in the photograph above, the necessary battery leads are brought out from one corner of the receiving set panel and can be brought down in back of the phonograph cabinet to the batteries, does in the cabinet provided for records. If this is not desired, or space cannot be given over to the batteries, a small box could readily be made and placed directly alongside the cabinet, where the batteries could be placed and concealed from sight. Binding posts on the top of the box would provide a convenient method of connecting.

In the center photograph above is shown a complete view of a phonograph containing the Radiola 9 in the lid. The tuning controls are readily accessible and since U. V.-1.99 tubes are used, they are not in the way when the lid is closed. The photographs directly above and to the left show the same type of receiving set included in two different types of period models of phonographs. In either of the two latter cases, there is plenty of room for the location of the batteries directly back or below the receiving set proper. This receiving set is designed to operate on an, outside aerial and only two tuning controls are used. These are seen to be two variable condensers. There is a small coupling coil placed between the primary and secondary tuning inductances and connected directly to the ground. This is found to aid materially in tuning. Instead of connecting the potentiometer in its usual position, across the "A" battery, it is connected in series with the negative side of it and thence through a variable condenser and the secondary inductance to the grid of the first radio frequency amplifier. A "C" battery of 4½ volts is used to place a negative potential on the grids of the second radio frequency amplifiers. The cores of the audio frequency amplifiers and unilaterally connected to the filament circuit. By moving the switch indicated, better control of the radio frequency amplification can be obtained.



## The "Soup-Plate"

A Novel Type of Transmitter that Reverses the Principle of the Loud Speaker

THE problem of getting a large vol-Leume of sound converted into electricity for use in modulating the highpower transmitting stations that are now being used for radio broadcasting has become of increasing importance during the last year.

Several systems have been worked out to attain this result, but most of them have this serious disadvantage: while they produce a large amount of voice-controlled electricity, at the same time they distort the voice wave that is impressed upon them. Thus the reproduction is not as clear or as faithful as it should be.

One particular method that gives a very good quality of speech and relies upon the electromagnetic principle for

The voice currents produced by the new method are remarkably true in following the complex voice vibrations as used by everybody in ordinary speech, and are remarkably effective in the reproduction of music. The current obtained from this instrument is magnified or amplified by means of vacuum tube amplifiers, somewhat similar to those used by the amateur, except that the tubes used are larger and are known as power amplifiers.

are pressed tightly together or loosely as

the voice causes them to vibrate.

The cylindrical object that is shown, supported from the rim of the coneshaped diaphragm by the three radial supports, contains the electromagnet and the moving coil.

The principle of the new transmitter is just exactly the reverse of the loud-speaker used for receiving. In the latter the electrical energy is converted into sound and in the transmitter the sound is converted into electrical energy. The same apparatus can be used for both purposes with slight modifications.

Dear Jim,

I'm writing to see if some of your readers can come up with some technical advice. I do restorations for other collectors, so I'm always in need of parts. These parts are sometimes hard to find, at least at prices that make it economical to buy in quantity. Most parts catalogs nowadays deal mainly with parts for microprocessors!

You can acquire a good collection of used tubes if you look hard enough; capacitors & electrolytic condensers with a high enough voltage rating are not as common as they used to be, but they can still be purchased new. Resistors are no problem & output transformers can be acquired by stripping them from discarded tube type T.V.s. (A push pull output transformer can be made by putting 2 regular transformers together & matching the polority).

My main worry is getting interstage audio transformers & knobs,
and that's where I need the advice.
In case the supply ever dries up,
I would like to know if there is any
way to make a simple substitute for
the typical interstage transformer
(center-tapped & non center-tapped).
How many turns, what size wire on
on what size core? There may come a
day when we don't care how it looks,
as long as it works!

The other question is that I would like to know if there is anything available that you can use to mold a plastic version of a knob, if you have one you wish to copy. I remember seeing a kit with which

you could make a rubber mold of any shape & use it to cast that shape in plastic. The answer to this question may make a good "clinic" column.

Dear Jim:

I really look forward to receiving The Horn Speaker. Your ads are the best of any antique radio publication I have seen. I also like your club and museum news features.

The price of radios seems to be continuing upwards, but every now and then one comes across a real find. This past year I managed to buy a De-Forest D-12 complete with loop antenna and 4 DeForest tubes at a flea market for \$85. With some loving care I should be able to restore it completely. The decal in the center of the loop antenna is partially worn off. Does anyone know where I can get a reproduction? As an alternative, I would pay up to \$1 for a snapshot of the decal so I could try to copy it. The decal says "DeForest Coil Antenna...." and some patent numbers, etc. Also, does anyone have suggestions on how to restore the faded leatherette cover?

The other bargain I found this past year was a Majestic console model 90 in reasonable condition with all tubes for \$9. If only one could be so lucky more often!

## CLINIC

Here's a hint that may be useful to those who do not already know it. I tried several types of detergents and cleaners for cleaning off layers of dirt, grease, and oxidation on old radio chasses. None really seemed to do a complete job. Then I discovered that muriatic acid (hydrochloric acid) which can be purchased in quart or half gallon bottles at any hardware store works very well shines up the metal. It's strong stuff, so wear rubber gloves and goggles and don't splash even tiny drops on your clothes - it burns holes immediately. Also, don't take a deep breath of the fumes - they are irritating to the lungs and throat.

I use it diluted half and half for general cleaning and full strength for tough spots. Work on a small area, rubbing with a small pad of fine steel wool or a rough cloth. Be sure to wash off the acid thoroughly with water when you are through with each area, and be careful not to get too close to fiber or rubber parts that may dissolve. Muriatic acid can also be brushed onto the contacts of

old tube sockets and other small parts to shine them up like new.
