WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC has conditionally renewed the license of KESZ Phoenix AZ, and approved the proposed sale of KESZ to Arizona Television Co., licensee of KTVK (Channel 3) in Phoenix. Transfer of the station required waiver of the FCC's one-to-a-market rules under provisions that allow cross-ownership in top 25 markets. In addition to the conditional license renewal, the FCC assessed the station's former owner, Duffy Broadcasting, \$15,000 in fines for EEO violations.

The effective date for new FM Translator rules and the lifting of the current freeze on major translator applications has been deferred until June 1. The date was extended from its original March target to allow for Office of Management and Budget (OMB) approval of the new requirements. The FCC has continued to be deluged with filings by parties hoping to amend or reverse part of the 1990 Commission decision, which effectively erased hopes that low power FM translators would be able to originate programming or commercial content.

In its weekly self-affirmation, the Commission upheld a Review Board decision granting Sandpiper Broadcasting's application for a new station in Englewood FL.

ELSEWHERE

Warren Potash has resigned as President of the Radio Advertising Bureau (RAB). An RAB search committee has promised to have a new President on board sometime in 1991; Potash will stay until the new exec is found.

Arbitron has rejected service improvement requests from its Radio Advisory Council. The RAC, in a March meeting, passed two resolutions calling for additional increases in sample target size and to reduce from four to three the number of annual surveys in a market, without an overall loss in annual sample target. Arbitron's response, paraphrased: "We can't do that."

Long-time zoo-keeper Scott Shannon, most recently of Pirate Radio in Los Angeles, has signed to go up against his former employees at Z-100. He'll take over the PDship and morning show at WPLJ New York. No word yet on the fate of current PLJ morning host Rocky Allen.

In the latest curious twist to this year's rash of lease agreements, CSB Communications' WMJW Magee MS (outside Jackson) has leased itself to WKXI-1300, and will simulcast WKXI's urban oldies format. It's unclear how this arrangement will affect CSB's construction permit for WZQA-1240 in suburban Flowood MS. It's even more unclear how CSB reconciles the arrangement with the petition it and Gaylord Broadcasting filed last month in objection to Capstar Communications' lease arrangements in Nashville and Jackson - a petition widely seen as challenging the basic legality of lease agreements such as the one CSB has now signed.

The Imagination Stations, a children's programming network that died last month with only two affiliates after a year of operation, has come back to life. The new network, which will lease the name and programming material from the network formerly based in Orlando, moves to the home of WXJO-95.5 in suburban St. Louis.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

Tom Gammon has taken a new tack in a petition filed this week with the FCC to bolster his attempted move-in of WHMA-FM-100.5 from Anniston AL to suburban Atlanta. An FCC announcement last November that it would crack down on applications to change communities of license to suburbs that would actually serve a larger market, not just the "underserved" suburb, seemed to bode poorly for Gammon and several others who have filed well-publicized move-in proposals. Now Gammon is asking that his proposed WHMA-FM to Sandy Springs GA be considered as a move to metropolitan Atlanta, and claims that Atlanta is badly underserved by FM radio and needs a new station. His filing cites similarly sized markets, such as Miami and Houston, that have nearly double the number of both FMs and total stations providing city-grade coverage to their metro areas; notes that Atlanta's market population has more than doubled since the last time an FM facility was added; and claims that the Communications Act's call for "fair, efficient and equitable distribution of radio service" justifies adding the facility to the Atlanta market. The changes are being represented as a regional re-allocation of FM signals.

The FCC has granted several requests for declaratory rulings in three cases where non-co-owned stations in the same markets want to enter lease agreements of various types. In the cases, KKFM Colorado Springs would become the broker for the sale of advertising time on KKMGM Pueblo; KAMG Victoria would provide programming from 6 AM to midnight, 7 days a week, to KPLV in Port Lavaca TX (which

is currently silent); and WSVA/WQPO Harrisonburg VA would enter into a time brokerage agreement with the owners of WPKZ Elkton VA. Now that we apparently have the FCC's blessing on these arrangements many more stations "waiting in the wings" should adopt these type of arrangements. Still to come will be the inevitable license challenge on public interest grounds. **M Street** wonders why we put new station applicants through the test we do if they are allowed to turn around and give the stations to someone else to run?

The FCC has reversed its previous decision in granting a new major FM facility in Des Moines IA. In granting the decision to the previously rejected Midwest Radio, Inc., the FCC decided that its Review Board had erred in treating local residency and civic activities as separate enhancement factors. Combining the factors gave Midwest the decision over competing applicant Ronald Sorenson.

In other actions, the FCC dismissed a petition by Mableton Broadcasting Co. seeking a declaratory ruling on whether the ALJ in the proceeding lacked authority to compel MBC's full participation in the remanded hearing for a new FM in Mableton; and upheld its previous grants to Horace E. Perkins for a new FM in Columbus OH and to W & B Broadcasting, Inc. for a new FM in Radcliff KY.

Mark Pierce has been denied a Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request for FCC files. Pierce, a reporter for Ace magazine, had sought information on targets of ongoing FCC investigations regarding the operation of pirate radio stations.

New FCC people: Karl Kensinger has been named a Special Assistant to the Chief of the Mass Media Bureau. Kensinger has previously held a variety of positions within the MMB and the FCC's Legal Branch. Michael C. Ruger has been appointed Assistant Chief of Allocations Branch within the Mass Media Bureau; he also moves up from the Legal Branch. And, Andrew J. Rhodes has been appointed Chief of the Allocations Branch. He was previously serving as Acting Chief of the branch.

ELSEWHERE

In one of the better promotional stunts accompanying a format change recently, Entercom's KBRD Tacoma-Seattle is set to become KMTT, "The Mountain," at 2 PM on Wednesday, April 10. Ahead of the change, KMTT ran spots promoting the imminent debut of "The Mountain" on its competitor, Bonneville's KSEA. Says one KSEA staffer: "We thought it was for a movie." The spot did contain the legal sponsors name "Entertainment Communications, Inc."

The Radio Advertising Bureau has announced that radio industry revenues were down 4.9% nationally in January 1991, compared to the same month in 1990. Hardest hit was the Southwest region, where national revenue was off by 23.1%. Faring better were the West, where national revenue was down by only 1.3%; and the Southeast, whose local revenue fell by only 0.4%.

The state of Virginia has enacted into law a proposal to give tax credits to state broadcasters that run public service announcements opposing substance abuse. The legislation becomes available July 1, 1991. The law is thought to be the first of its kind in the country.

The NAB has filed a petition to urge the FCC to implement broad federal regulations that would supersede local ordinances governing uses of satellite dishes, radio and television antennas. The petition is in response to a local New York zoning ordinance restricting outdoor satellite dishes; however, local initiatives have also been aimed in recent years at placement of radio and television antennas, particularly in densely populated areas where RF radiation dangers are cited as a concern.

The 80-year-old owner of WCRB-FM Waltham (Boston) MA has signed an agreement that will insure the fine arts station will be his legacy for - well, for a long time. Jones has announced that he has set up a trust fund to administer the station after his death. The fund is obligated not to sell the station or change its format for the next 100 years - possibly long after the station's format and even current radio technology is obsolete.

UPI has reportedly stopped severance pay to a number of former employees. The troubled broadcast and wire service has been for sale since late 1990, and is currently in bankruptcy proceedings.

The British Broadcasting Service's short-wave "World Service" has announced an expansion of programming and staff for the coming year. Some \$1.7 million will be

added to the budget to cover the additions. Meanwhile, Canadian Parliament is expected to act soon on the CBC's proposal to eliminate or drastically reduce services at its flagship short-wave service, Radio Canada International.

TV Marti is back. The U.S.-operated propaganda station returned to the air last week after being off since late January, when the hot air balloon carrying its transmitter broke away from its tether and crashed in the Florida Everglades.

The Radio Advertising Bureau (RAB) is co-sponsoring two seminars at next week's NAB convention in Las Vegas. The workshops, on niche marketing and automotive industry advertising, are designed in conjunction with current RAB campaigns to increase radio's share of advertising dollars. Incidentally, if you're planning to be in Las Vegas, look for **M Street** as well - we'll be at the RRN, Inc. booth in the convention center's exhibit hall.

Also on the conference horizon, the National Association of Radio Talk Show Hosts is planning its third annual conference in Seattle, June 7-9. The focus of the conference will be on seminars to improve the substance and style of talk radio. For details & registration info, call NARTSH's Carole Nashe: 617-945-3320.

BCFM MAY CALENDAR NOTES

By May 31, all stations with five or more full time employees must file Annual Employment Reports (FCC Form 395-B). A new 1991 version of Form 395-B contains new reporting requirements; previous years' versions of the Form may not be used. And, the New Mexico Broadcasters Association holds its annual meetings May 16-18.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

More, much more, in the ever-unfolding soap opera of digital audio broadcasting. The Canadian Association of Broadcasters is set to begin tests in May utilizing the NAB-endorsed Eureka 147 DAB system in the high-frequency "L-Band" where American proponents have assumed the system would be located. To date Eureka has only been tested in much lower spectrum ranges. The test results may not matter, though: word from the FCC is that the White House is firmly opposed to using the L-Band for radio broadcast purposes. The L-Band's current user is the Pentagon, which in recent months has discovered that the high-tech weapons systems that use L-Band frequencies to track and lock onto targets are spectacularly effective. Whoops. Meanwhile, the ACORN DAB system, whose cause is being championed by Gannett Broadcasting along with several other group owners, conducted initial tests of the system using the current AM and FM bands early this month - and reported much better results than expected. Assuming the technical results hold, ACORN has several pragmatic advantages over Eureka: no new spectrum space or frequency moves, much lower power consumption, and - perhaps most importantly - by simultaneous transmission of analog and digital broadcasts, it perpetuates some existing signal disparities and thus avoids playing havoc with market coverages and station sale values. That's not good news for AM station operators hanging on in hope that DAB will "save" AM - but the money and political influence on DAB ride with big broadcast groups that have enormous investments to protect.

The FCC also voted last week to give preference in licensing procedures to innovators who develop new communications services and technologies. Pioneer preference recipients would be guaranteed a license to operate a new service without facing competing applications, but would not necessarily be able to enter the market before competitors. To be eligible for the preference, one must file a petition for rulemaking requesting either an allocation of spectrum for a new service or amendments to permit use of a new technology in an existing service.

Diamond Broadcasting of Chicago has requested an FCC waiver to allow Diamond to purchase now-silent WPNT-820 Chicago. Diamond currently owns WXRT-FM and WSBC-1240 in Chicago. WSBC is a unique limited operation that shares 1240 KHz with two other stations; it is licensed to operate only eight hours a day, in two four-hour segments. Diamond wants a year to be able to operate both AMs while it attempts to find a buyer for WSBC - or hopes the FCC, in the interim, will repeal its rules barring ownership of multiple AM stations in the same market.

KCEP-88.1 Las Vegas NV has been given a Notice of Apparent Liability for \$3,000 for violation of promotional announcement rules. KCEP is one of a number of larger noncommercial stations that makes extensive use of underwriting announcements from commercial "supporters;" such announcements, in KCEP's case, included lengthy and specific information about sponsor services, products, special sales and other material generally found in paid commercials.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (Cont'd)

The FCC has decided not to adopt a proposal to relax requirements for technical review of most types of broadcast equipment to permit their use. The reversal came after examination of manufacturer data revealed that essential data was often missing; and after recent FCC inspections of AM stations suggested (among other things) that stations are likely to misuse the equipment they do have.

In other actions this week, the FCC: denied the application for review of a rejected station upgrade of KHEN-95.1 Caldwell TX; denied Herbert Regenstreif's request for reconsideration of a Review Board decision in the proceeding for a new FM in Midway KY; ordered WDAX AM/FM McRae GA to forfeit \$1,800 for violation of sponsorship identification rules; fined Dean L. Kinzel of Auburn WA \$750 for attempting to obtain an FCC Radiotelephone Operator License by using falsified documents; and granted a waiver to allow overlapping signals by upgrading the facilities of WCPE-89.7 Raleigh NC and WCCE-90.1 Buie's Creek NC.

ELSEWHERE

Infinity Broadcasting may be facing more FCC headaches and bad PR over a morning show stunt. The uproar this time is at KROQ-106.7 Los Angeles, where last week the station's morning team, Kevin Ryder and Gene Baxter, confessed that they had concocted a routine last summer in which an anonymous listener (Doug Roberts, a Phoenix air talent later hired by KROQ) confessed to murdering his girlfriend. At the time the on-air "confession" generated tremendous publicity, hundreds of tips to police and an extensive 10-month investigation. Now Ryder, Baxter and Roberts are suspended from the station; L.A. homicide says they will bill KROQ for 149 hours of investigative work; and FCC Chair Al Sikes has reportedly personally instructed the Mass Media Bureau to investigate the incident. KROQ is up for license renewal this year. Could this be the first case where a broadcaster would bring in Howard Stern in order to clean up the morning show?

CUC Broadcasting, Ltd., owner of CKLW/CKMR Windsor Ont., is petitioning Canada's CRTC for a waiver of rules governing allowable commercial content in Canadian advertising. Canada's stringent requirements for truth in advertising cost CUC an estimated \$1 million per year in lost ads from U.S. companies that want to reach the stations' Detroit listeners. Under current regulations, for example, CKLW can't carry a Budweiser ad claiming to be "the king of beers" - because it cannot be empirically proven that Budweiser is, in fact, the king of beers. CUC execs say they discussed a possible waiver with the CRTC ahead of its filing, and are confident some new arrangement can be worked out.

Cap Cities/ABC's transition of WYZZ Chicago from Hell Radio to Hot 94.7 has drawn some additional fire. WXLC-102.3 in suburban Waukegan IL has filed seeking a temporary restraining order to keep WYZZ from using the "Hot" moniker. WXLC has been calling itself "Hot 102.3" for more than a year.

A new lease agreement, this one in Huntsville AL, has generated a listener outcry over the resulting format change. In late March WZYP signed an agreement to operate classic rock WKQD-FM, and promptly took it country as WHVK. Now a group calling itself "Radio Free Huntsville" is circulating petitions and organizing a rally to protest the lease agreement and format change. The rock format couldn't have been that essential a community institution - WKQD had switched from CHR (and direct competition with WZYP) only about a year previous.

SUN Radio Network has added a new feature. April 13 was the debut day for Tommy Powell's Fishing Show, airing from 2 to 4 PM Saturdays.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The FCC and the Federal Aviation Administration have reached an agreement that should take some FAA heat off of AM broadcast stations. The FAA has agreed not to issue hazard determinations or to require stations to use filtering beyond what is required by FCC rules to minimize electromagnetic interference to aeronautical receivers. In return the FCC takes responsibility for ensuring that interference levels are compatible with existing FCC standards. The agreement does not affect the requirement of an FCC applicant to notify the FAA of proposed construction or modification of towers - but it should speed licensing substantially in cases where the FAA had expressed concerns over electromagnetic interference levels.

In another treaty between sovereign nations, the FCC and the Department of Justice have signed a Memorandum of Understanding on the handling of obscenity and indecency complaints regarding broadcast stations. The MOU formalizes procedures for sharing investigation and resolution of such complaints. For broadcast stations, the FCC will bear primary responsibility for investigation, but retains the option of referring the complaint to the Dept. of Justice for possible criminal prosecution.

Politicians Have A Sense Of Irony, Too: FCC Chair Alfred C. Sikes, in his address to the National Association of Broadcasters convention in Las Vegas last week, lauded the "good news for Americans" that the FCC, which expects to select a new standard for high definition television transmission (HDTV) by 1993, is not hampered by having already adopted earlier and now outmoded HDTV technologies that have been available in other parts of the world for the last ten years. Sikes then went on to laud the NAB for being an "agent of change" in the NAB's efforts to establish an immediate, land-based standard system for digital broadcasting... Meanwhile, the NAB has called on the FCC to lobby for use of the L-band spectrum (the one used by the NAB-endorsed Eureka 147 system) at the upcoming World Administrative Radio Conference in 1992. And, at different workshops in Las Vegas, two of the FCC's Commissioners - James Quello and Ervin Duggan - were predicting that the FCC would eventually settle on a hybrid system, using both satellite and land-based technologies, rather than the exclusively land-based type used both by Eureka and by Gannett Broadcasting's ACORN system. Meanwhile, on the convention floor equipment exhibitors say that for the first time in years sales were looking up: manufacturers brought plenty of new toys, and people were buying them.

In FCC actions this week:

Galesburg Broadcasting, licensee of WGIL/WAAG Galesburg IL and KMCD/KIHK Fairfield IA, has been fined \$25,000 by the FCC for unauthorized transfer of control. The fines stem from a period in 1989 when, during settlement proceedings for the trust fund that held majority interest in Galesburg Broadcasting, control of the trust was held for several months by a subsidiary of Bank of Montreal, a Canadian corporation. Since foreign control of a broadcast property is prohibited, the size of the fine reflected both a failure to file for transfer of control and the probability that the application would not have been granted.

The FCC has denied Wong Communications, LP, reconsideration of a Review Board decision granting license renewal to KWOD Sacramento and dismissing Wong's competing application for a new station. In addition to crediting KWOD's broadcast record, the FCC also noted of Wong Communications' 60% owner, Fay Gum Wong, that "...Ms. Wong's essentially passive role undermined the reliability of her claim that she would actually manage the station."

For the second time in two weeks, the FCC has fined a noncommercial station for violating underwriting announcement guidelines. KYQX, Springtown TX, has been assessed a notice of liability for \$5,000 for "repeated violations" which "promoted the sale of goods and services of for-profit entities."

In other decisions, the Commission: denied review of a granted upgrade to the facilities of KHYI Arlington TX and KTSR College Station TX; denied the appeal of an ALJ ruling dismissing the application of Irene Escalante in a new FM station proceeding in Orcutt CA; "denied, to an extent" an appeal by Radio Associates, Inc. of a denial of its financial amendment in a Brownsburg IN new FM proceeding;

and dismissed as moot a motion by Midway Communications, Ltd. to accept oppositions to petition for reconsideration in the proceeding for a new FM in Midway KY.

On Friday, May 3, the FCC is hosting a brown bag lunch seminar which will explain new FM translator regulations. The new regulations will go into effect when the freeze on FM translator applications is lifted June 1. The seminar will be held at noon at 1919 M Street, Room 856 in Washington DC.

ELSEWHERE

New York Newsday reports that oldies purveyor Dick Bartley has been hired by ABC Radio and will soon be launching a new syndicated oldies program. Bartley, creator of "Solid Gold Saturday Night" and "Dick Bartley's Original Rock & Roll Oldies Show," recently parted ways with his previous syndicator, Westwood One.

Effective May 1, radio loses another legend. Jess Cain is retiring after 34 years as the morning host at WHDH Boston. He will be replaced - to the extent it's possible - with a program co-hosted by Marjorie Clapprod and current HDH midday host Pat Whitley.

Willis Broadcasting Corp., which, through an array of holding companies, has quietly assembled the largest stable of stations of any commercial group owner in the U.S., has reached agreement to buy another station. The now-silent WXSS-1030 in Memphis TN is being purchased by Tennessee Christian Radio; which is run by the Church of God in Christ; which in turn is controlled by Willis. The station will be paired with KFTH-107.1 Marion AR, a Memphis-area FM already owned by Willis.

For the People has successfully made the move from SUN Network to their own, taking about 70 affiliates with them. Chuck Harder hosts the three hour consumer affairs show via satellite each day.

Bonneville has announced a new adult contemporary CD service for radio stations. Only \$49.95 a month gets stations a digitally recorded compilation disc each month from Bonneville Chartbreakers. For more info call Bonneville at 1-800-631-1600.

The Radio Advertising Bureau and the Association of National Advertisers are jointly sponsoring a seminar in New York City June 3. The Forum, which will begin at noon with a keynote address by talk host Larry King, will focus on "the value of radio as a flexible, creative, and highly targeted medium." For info and registration call the RAB's Marketing Department at 212-254-4800.

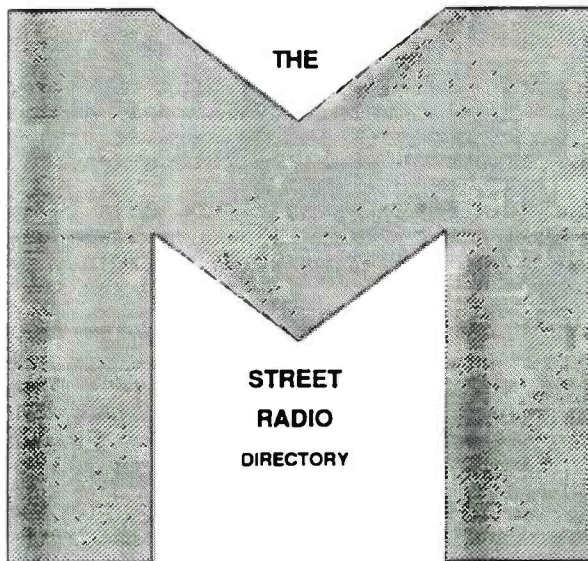

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

The political bombshell the FCC has been courting with its tacit and explicit approval of lease, co-programming, co-management and joint sales agreements, and waiver of duopoly and cross-ownership rules landed this week. The issue: de facto control of multiple licenses, and meeting standards of public interest. In an extraordinarily strongly worded letter to FCC Chairman Alfred C. Sikes, U.S. Rep. John D. Dingell (D-MI), Chairman of the House Committee on Energy and Commerce, asked Sikes for official FCC responses by May 3 to the following questions:

"1. The Commission has significantly eased its requirements for licensees engaged in time brokerage, and published reports indicate that the practice of time brokerage has increased significantly.

"a. Are you satisfied that the current policies provide adequate assurance that there has been no unauthorized transfer of control in such cases?

"...c. Does the Commission have any mechanism for knowing which licensees, or how many licensees, are engaged in time brokerage for all or significant portions of their broadcast day? If not, what is the basis upon which the Commission determines the prevalence of such practices, the soundness of its policies as to time brokerage, and whether time brokerage activities advance the Commission's statutory goal of providing service in the public interest?

"d. ...time brokerage contracts need not be filed [in a station's public file], but shall be kept at the station and made available upon request by the FCC... i.) Under what circumstances does the Commission request to review such contracts? ii.) How many such requests were made in calendar year 1990? iii.) In the absence of any affirmative reporting requirement, or an affirmative public file requirement, how does the Commission determine that a particular licensee engages in time brokerage, or otherwise develop any basis to believe that it might want to review that licensee's time brokerage contracts?

"e. Does the Commission routinely request to review any time brokerage contracts at the time of license renewal?

"f. Does the Commission consider whether an applicant for assignment or transfer of a broadcasting station intends to engage in time brokerage when deciding if grant of an application is in the public interest? If not, do you think it should be a relevant consideration under any circumstances, including where an applicant intends to broker substantially all of its air time to a single programmer?

"g. Time brokerage is often cited as an important means to insure that marginal AM radio stations can remain on the air. Would you favor a policy of limiting full-time time brokerage...to cases where a licensee has demonstrated financial distress?

"h. ...It appears that...there is an increasing number of time brokerages in which one licensee in a market becomes the broker for the entire programming schedule of another station in the same and/or adjacent markets. i.) Is this understanding correct? ii.) Is there any FCC policy or regulation which would preclude a single licensee from time brokerage on two, three or more additional stations in the same market or, indeed, on every single station in a market? iii.) Does the Commission have, or plan to have, any special means for scrutinizing activities of licensees engaged in time brokerage on other stations in the same market? iv.) Does the Commission have any means of knowing whether a particular licensee brokers time on other stations in the same market?

"i. In several recent decisions, the Commission staff has approved time brokerage arrangements which would permit licensees engaged in brokering time on a second station in the same market to simulcast programming on both stations... In at least one of these cases, such a simulcast would be permitted for 24 hours a day, seven days a week... i.) Do you think such arrangements are in the public interest? ii.) Do you think such arrangements should be approved only where financial distress can be shown? iii.) Do you think that a licensee should receive a renewal expectancy where substantially all of its time is brokered by another licensee in the same market?

"2. A trade publication...has requested a declaratory ruling that the Commission require applicants to disclose the sales price of broadcast stations in connection with applications for assignment or transfer of control.

"a. It is my understanding that the FCC had always required the submission of price information, but that in several recent instances it has approved sales without receiving such data. Is this true?

"b. Do you think the Commission can make the required public interest determination on such applications without price information?

"c. Do you think the FCC should, as a matter of policy, withhold sales price information from the public?

"d. Do you think there are specific circumstances when the FCC can and should withhold such information from the public at the request of an applicant? If so, what are those circumstances?..."

"3. In 1988, the FCC abandoned a proposal to repeal the "one to a market" rule in its entirety, and instead determined only that it should adopt a more liberal policy for waiving the rule to permit radio-TV cross-ownership in larger markets...the Commission said it would look favorably upon waiver applications in the top 25 markets so long as there are at least 30 separate media voices in the market...I am concerned that the Commission has turned this waiver policy into a flat rule allowing grant of all such applications...It is my understanding that subsequent applicants have not been required to demonstrate that there would be any benefit to the public which would result from the proposed joint operation of two stations..."

"a. Does the Commission staff expect waiver applicants in the top 25 markets to make any showing beyond proving the existence of 30 media voices?"

"b. Is there an automatic policy of granting all one to a market waiver requests in the top 25 markets unless the applicant already has two broadcast properties in the market?"

"c. If not, what criteria does the Commission staff employ in deciding if the grant of a specific waiver will be in the public interest?"

"d. Has the Commission formally or informally delayed or withheld the grant of such a waiver based upon the inadequacy of a top 25 market applicant's initial justification of a requested waiver?"

"e. If so, what kind of information was provided which ultimately justified grant of the waiver?"

"f. What evidence has the Commission obtained from applications for top 25 market waivers concerning the benefits and costs of proposed mergers and...the ramifications of modifying this long-standing rule?..."

Meanwhile, the FCC moved this week to further ease multiple ownership limits. On its own initiative, the Commission initiated an inquiry which would enable spouses of station licensees to not have their stations counted as part of each other's holdings. The separation would, in theory, allow spouses to own multiple stations in the same market, and to jointly exceed FCC limits on the number of commercial licenses one owner may hold, as long as they can demonstrate that the stations are operated separately. A number of group owners already control additional stations through spouses, to obtain comparative credits for female/minority ownership in new station proceedings; this would make the practice even more lucrative. Rumors continued to circulate this week as well that the FCC is preparing to significantly modify its current 12-12-12 limits on group ownership, expanding the number of stations a single licensee may own.

In other FCC news this week:

The FCC has socked KSHE-94.7 Crestwood MO (St. Louis) with a \$25,000 fine for a late January morning show routine which uses fake EBS tones as part of a routine imitating a nuclear attack upon the United States. Despite station apologies, new internal policies and the suspension of John Ulett, the air personality responsible, KSHE was hit with the maximum fine available for a one-incident violation, in an action taken with remarkable speed - less than three months after the show aired.

The FCC has also acted with unusual haste in sending a letter of inquiry to KROQ-106.7 Pasadena CA (Los Angeles). KROQ's revelation (reported here two weeks ago) that last summer's on-air "confession" of a murder was concocted by its morning team has drawn a storm of local criticism and bad publicity. Beleaguered group owner Infinity Broadcasting, already seasoned by its broadcast of Howard Stern on three stations, is sticking by its air talent and has reinstated them after a short suspension. The whole incident was exposed after the tape was rebroadcast on "Unsolved Mysteries" and a viewer recognized the voice of the "murderer" as belonging to KROQ's evening personality. The TV show will be rebroadcasting the whole series of events this week - including the FCC's investigation of possible violations of licensee control and conduct policy.

Two more stations have been fined for indecent broadcasts by the FCC. KCNA Cave Junction OR (Medford) and WVIC-FM East Lansing MI have been assessed \$4,000 and \$2,000 respectively for offensive morning show routines.

A clarification of last week's story involving an operational agreement between the FCC and FAA: the agreement applies only to AM stations. The FAA's notice of proposed rulemaking is still pending. The FAA still wants to review all FM

applications to insure there will be no interference that could harm aviation safety. The FCC and the FAA have a standing monthly meeting to work out their differences. "Real progress is being made...the level of dialogue is improving," according to Michael Marcus at the FCC.

More appeals: The FCC has granted the motion of Triad Network, reopened the record and remanded to the ALJ the proceeding involving mutually exclusive applications to upgrade WDIX-1480 Yadkinville NC and license a new AM on 1470 in Greensboro NC; affirmed the grant for a new FM in Raleigh NC to Peebles Broadcasting; denied a request for extension of time to file comments in a proceeding involving applications to change the FM Table of Allocations in Headland AL and Chattahoochee FL;

The FCC has proposed new rules which would provide for a temporary suspension of attorneys practicing before the FCC who are the subject of a final order of suspension or disbarment by a court or tribunal. The new procedures would allow for immediate suspension from practice, without a preliminary hearing, at the Commission's discretion.

The FCC has shut down another pirate radio station. Scott Gallagher, 23, of Braintree MA, had been running the 80-watt pirate FM with friends virtually every evening for the last ten years and had attracted a strong following in south suburban Boston. Gallagher has received the standard \$750 fine for operating an unlicensed radio station.

ELSEWHERE

For the first time in six years, Arbitron has fully delisted a station for ratings distortion activity. WWFE-670 Miami FL, "Radio Fe," was hit with Arbitron's most severe sanction for broadcasting announcements in Spanish which instructed listeners receiving ratings diaries to fill them out completely with the name of Radio Fe; make lines in blank spaces of each page to avoid additions; and send a copy of the survey to the station. WWFE's response to Arbitron's action was that the station was being singled out because it does not subscribe to the ratings service.

The ever-expanding Minnesota Public Radio has signed another mega-deal. On the weekend of June 1-2 MPR and Britain's BBC-3 network will carry 30 hours of simulcast, jointly produced programming from MPR studios in St. Paul. The programming is a follow-up to a similar BBC Special in June 1990, when it simulcast German Radio for a weekend during the dismantling of the Berlin Wall.

Dale Andrews, a former executive in the now-defunct Atlantic Coast Radio Network, has pleaded guilty and given a suspended eight year sentence for selling unregistered securities and misappropriating money. Andrews and two ACRN partners were convicted of redirecting investors' money, intended for escrow accounts for future radio station purchases, to covering operating expenses for the talk network. Andrews, former President Alan Christian and sales VP Grace Starmer have also been ordered to pay more than \$650,000 in restitution to investors.

Janet O. South has been elected President of the Broadcast Cable Financial Management Association, effective July 1. South is Television Group Business Manager for Nationwide Communications.

One of the most interesting, and least noted, results of Arbitron's newly released winter ratings: WWTC-1280, the locally programmed children's radio outlet in Minneapolis, showed with a 0.5. Since the 0.5 ratings is for ages 12+, and is an average figure for Monday-Sunday 6 AM-midnight, it stands to reason that WWTC's ratings are actually much higher among pre-teen listeners and during periods when children are not in school or asleep.

In the current onslaught of tasteless, indecent and/or offensive morning radio, new WEGX (Eagle 106) Philadelphia morning host John Lander may have hit a new low. WEGX has been served with a cease-and-desist order prohibiting it from using the voice of rival programmer Mark Driscoll of WIOQ. Promos of Driscoll voicing liners endorsing 106 (a different station and market) began with the sound of a beeping microwave oven, and Lander: "You're done, Mark." Driscoll has suffered serious heart problems and uses a surgically implanted pacemaker. M Street's unavoidable comment: who could possibly gain by this sort of infantile behavior? On the other hand, perhaps a way to clean up morning radio is to bring in the Guardian Angels...and that's just what WABC-770 New York has done. It's new morning show hosts are Curtis & Lisa Sliwa, co-founders of the Guardian Angels.
