**INFINITY GETS A "STERN" SLAP ON THE WRIST. . .** If you'd like to avoid "time consuming litigation" with the FCC, take a lesson from Infinity Broadcasting. In exchange for a \$1,715,000 "voluntary contribution" to the U.S. Treasury, Howard Stern's off the hook for all pending indecency complaints against him at the Commission, with NO admission of wrongdoing or liability. The Commission decided "the settlement agreement will end the time consuming litigation that would be required to resolve the outstanding enforcement actions." The order dismisses all pending complaints against Infinity and the pending Notices of Apparent Liability totaling \$1,700,000.

FCC Chairman Reed Hundt says the Commission can now settle many of the more than 100 indecency cases pending because the U.S. Court of Appeals upheld the indecency standards and procedures in two separate cases. According to Inside Radio, Hundt says the recent decisions "cleared the way" to settle with Infinity and the dozens of other cases pending.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK

Howard Stern and Infinity Broadcasting are off the hook for indecency charges this week. The company settled with the FCC for a \$1,715,000 "voluntary contribution" to the U.S. Treasury in exchange for the dismissal of all pending indecency complaints against Stern and Infinity at the Commission. The order dismisses all pending complaints against Infinity and the pending Notices of Apparent Liability totaling \$1,700,000.

Infinity has also agreed to issue a "policy statement" to all on-air personnel "directing them to be cognizant of the prohibition against the broadcast of indecent speech. . . and will establish a program designed to educate and update on-air personnel regarding FCC indecency actions." In a written statement, Infinity President Mel Karmazin says even though he has never believed Stern's statements would be found indecent by a court, the agreement "will conserve the time, expenses, and human resources of the parties." Because the indecency proceedings will be expunged from the record, Karmazin says, "Infinity's twenty-one year pristine forfeiture record at the agency" will be maintained.

ELSEWHERE

Last week, we ran a story about a triopoly deal in Coastal North Carolina by Taylor Communications, but we weren't sure how it would be approved under current FCC rules. We reported that Taylor Communications President Steven Taylor is buying WKQT, Newport, NC from New East Communications to combo with WIKS, New Bern. Turns out what we thought to be WIKS' sister--WTND, Grifton, NC--is actually owned by Steven's son and is in an SMA with his father, which would make the deal legal. We also found out that Steven Taylor is the founder of Tulsa-based Taylor Satellite Talk, the new satellite-delivered, subscription-based talk radio service targeting home dish owners. Since WTND will be carrying some of the programming on TST, including Dr. Harvey Reuben, it sounds like TST will be in the radio syndication business, as well.

Patterson Broadcasting and Americom are stirring up things in Fresno by creating two new duopolies there. For \$6.25 million, Patterson is buying KBOS and KKTR from CenCal Broadcasting, Inc. At the same time, it will sell KTHT to Americom for \$2.2 million. The deal will give Patterson three stations in the market--churban KBOS, Tulare; news-talker KUTR, Fresno; and rocker KRZR, Hanford, CA. Americom bumps its total there up to four--talk/oldies KTHX and oldies KFSO, Visalia; jazz KEZL, Fowler; and hot AC KTHT, Fresno.

Patterson is also doubling up in the Savannah, GA market as it will buy Tri-City Broadcasting's soft AC WYKZ, Beaufort, SC. Patterson owns news and sports WCHY (AM) & country WCHY-FM, Savannah. The company has purchased 20 stations since its formation in May of this year.

Central New York's Radio Corporation is buying up two more stations that serve the Syracuse market, bringing their presence in that market to five. It's buying adult standards WSGO and AC WGES, both Oswego, NY, from Gessner Communications for an undisclosed amount. Robert Gessner owned the stations for twenty-five years. Radio Corporation already owns standards WTLA, North Syracuse, classic rocker WTKW, Bridgeport, NY, and rock WKRL, North Syracuse, all serving Syracuse, and three other stations in the Utica/Rome market.

Secret Communications is doubling up in Pittsburgh with the purchase of Pittsburgh Radio Partners' new rock WWKS, Beaver Falls, PA. Secret's album rocker WDVE will begin an immediate LMA with the station. No terms were disclosed.

A new, Cincinnati-based group has purchased a duopoly in Louisville. Blue Chip Broadcasting is buying urban WGZB-FM, Corydon, IN, and urban AC WLSY-FM, Jeffersontown, KY, (both Louisville) for \$7.3 million. WGZB-FM is licensed to Power Communications while WLSY-FM's licensee is Channel Chek, Inc, however, both stations currently have common ownership. Blue Chip also owns urban-formatted WIZF, Erlanger, KY (Cincinnati).

July was another good month for radio as the industry posted a 6% increase in combined local and national spot advertising over the same month in 1994. The Radio Advertising Bureau report shows local revenue was up 7% while national was flat for the month. It's the 35th consecutive month of revenue growth. RAB President Gary Fries says he expects the industry to finish out the year up eight to nine percent over last year.

The first L-Band DAB licenses in Canada could be issued by next summer, according to RadioExtra, a Canadian DAB newsletter. The CRTC released a proposal last June that would eventually replace all AM and FM licenses with DAB. The two-stage approach to the introduction to DAB would first establish a three-year experimental DAB license phase, followed by a public comment period, which should begin sometime in the fall of 1996. Existing radio broadcasters will have priority access to the L-band. Broadcasters will simulcast their current AM or FM service, but will be allowed to originate two hours of programming on the DAB service. Other key points of the CRTC proposal will restrict ancillary capacity to datacasting during the first phase, ownership of transmitters is not restricted to station operators, and the news experimental licenses will use a streamlined application process. The Canadian DAB initiative is being driven by a non-profit consortium of Canada's largest radio broadcasters, including the CBC.

DG Systems has added a new service to its digital distribution network. It will debut music delivery services over its web of 600 digitally-connected radio stations on September 2. The first to use the service will be MCA Records, which will deliver Reba McEntire's "On My Own," the first single from her new CD, which will be released October 3. DG Systems will also use their network to distribute artist profiles, interviews, and sound bytes. In order to utilize satellite distribution capabilities, DG recently inked a joint marketing deal with ABC Radio Networks.

M STREET BAZAAR. . . PEOPLE, PRODUCTS, AND PROGRAMMING

TM Century has added several new programming packages to its extensive radio fare. Roger Clinton morning show jingles include comical tunes and song parodies and can be produced for any format. Bob Rivers Twisted Tunes also features song parodies for TM's Morning Show Services. Country House Band is a new production library package for country stations. Big Time Radio is the latest hot AC jingle package designed for WPLJ, New York. Their new gospel jingle package is called Hallelujah! It's Morning! and features twelve traditional gospel parodies with full orchestra sound. TM even takes a shot at the mobile DJ industry by introducing Mobile Beat Top 200, a twelve CD package of top 40, dance, country, and oldies selections for mobile DJ's and roller rinks.

Westwood One will soon offer morning prep services for CHR/modern rock and classic rock stations. The prep service will be two to three printed pages with two to three audio cuts each day and will include entertainment news, tour schedules, interviews, and entertainment history. WWI plans to add services for country and AC/oldies in early 1996.

Westwood One Radio Networks has reorganized its affiliate relations department by combining its affiliate sales and marketing of both its news networks and format sales. With the move, two regional directors earn VP stripes--Bob Hoffmaster takes over as VP/Affiliate Sales-East and Rob Magaziner handles VP/Affiliate Services. Bill Kreutz moves from VP/Affiliate Relations to VP/Affiliate Sales-West.

President Bill Clinton will be the featured guest for the premiere of Westwood One Entertainment's Larry King Super Specials. The radio program, which is being billed as a Radio Town Hall Meeting, will air Thursday, Sept. 21 at 6 pm ET.

ABC Radio's Senior Director of MIS, Jasmine Alexander, has been promoted to VP/MIS & New Technologies. She joined the company as an analyst in 1985. She'll be responsible for data transmission, Internet, and other online service projects. The company has also promoted Country Coast-to-Coast PD Becky Wight to operations manager of ABC Radio International. She joined the company in 1990.

ABC Radio's Bob Brinker has reupped for another long-term contract with the web. Brinker has hosted his "Moneytalk" program on ABC for ten years. Brinker will also launch his own America OnLine page located within the ABC AOL section.

Seiko Communications has tapped former Katz Radio Group President Gordon Hastings to run the newly-formed FM Superhighway, Inc., a wireless communications network that utilizes Seiko's subcarrier datacasting and messaging technologies. The company is in the process of acquiring the FM subcarrier space to operate its network.

The new structure eliminates the AM and FM branches, as well as the auxiliary services branch, and divides them into work groups by task rather than by type of service. The four groups are Processing Support, Legal Processing, Petitions and Appeals, and Technical Processing. They've also created customer support teams. More details are on page eight.

**REED BLASTS RADIO.** . . . The 1995 NAB Radio Show in New Orleans wrapped up this past Saturday with broadcasters walking away a bit overwhelmed by the amount of new marketing opportunities. FCC Chairman Reed Hundt's tirade over the pending elimination of ownership caps left a few scratching their heads. Hundt has vowed to explore options to maintain diversity, even if Congress lifts ownership caps. He also mentioned minimum programming requirements and the possibility of reinstating the Fairness Doctrine.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK**

**AM MEETS FM FOR FIRST TIME AT FCC.** . . . The new structure at the Commission's Audio Services Division of the Mass Media Bureau should streamline the operation and allow applications that belong together to stay together. The new structure eliminates the AM and FM branches, as well as the auxiliary services branch, and divides them into work groups. The Legal Processing Group and the Petitions and Appeal Group will be responsible for all AM, FM, and FM translator applications for assignment and transfer applications, renewals, extensions of time, main studio waivers, authority to remain silent and other non-technical STA's. The Technical Processing Group will handle AM, FM, and FM translator applications for new stations, modifications to existing stations, license applications, and requests for technical STA's. The Process Support Group and the Administrative and Computer Support Staffs will provide assistance necessary for the "smooth flow of work." In a move that's long overdue, the division now has Customer Service Teams to help wayward callers find their way through the phone maze. Here are the new phone numbers for information:

The Commission has denied another petition for reconsideration from the NAACP, this time against WMAX, Kentwood, MI. The station got a \$7,500 fine and a short-term renewal for EEO violations. The Michigan state NAACP alleged the Commission omitted information in its original decision to renew the station's license.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

Also in trouble for EEO violations is WQPW, Valdosta, GA. The Commission upheld a fine of \$15,000 for repeated EEO violations. WQPW argued that a forfeiture was inappropriate because the Notice of Apparent Liability concluded that there was no evidence of discrimination and the Commission misread WQPW's financial information. The Commission rejected WQPW's arguments, stating the forfeiture was based on the station's repeated failure to comply with the rules and that the station's financial information did not prove it is unable to pay the forfeiture.

If you've still got that list of stations that will be migrating to the AM expanded band taped up on your wall, you can throw it away now. The Commission rescinded the list of stations, as well as all of the improvement factors used to come up with the list, after several petitioners asked the FCC to reconsider because of errors in the Commission's engineering database. The Commission also found the plan overprotected some traveler's information stations. Still other petitioners were arguing over what was to be used for the Canadian border--the land mass or the water boundary. The Commission verified that database errors did exist and decided the U.S.-Canadian border is defined by the land mass. It went on to further clarify the standards used to implement the allotment plan.

The Commission is now taking comments on the revisions. Once all the comments have been considered and adjustments are made, it will redo the improvement factors to come up with a new list. Comments are due 30 days after the Order is printed in the Federal Register.

ELSEWHERE

Cox Broadcasting will have a Louisville combo soon as the company announced it will buy oldies WKRA, St. Matthews, KY and WAJE, a construction permit in New Albany, IN (Louisville market) from Excelsior Communications. WAJE is in the process of being sold to Excelsior from New Albany Broadcasting Co. Terms weren't disclosed.

Randy Michaels' Critical Mass Media is buying a stake in Duncan's American Radio--currently, a partnership between Jim Duncan and Emmis Broadcasting. Radio Business Report's VP/Editorial J.T. Anderton is leaving the publication to head up the new partnership, which will move Duncan's Indianapolis offices to Jacor's Cincinnati headquarters.

Infinity Broadcasting is nosing around for new station acquisitions as it has filed to issue 8.5 million shares of class C common stock with an option to purchase additional shares to cover over-allotments. The proceeds--between \$250 and \$275 million--will be used to "fund future acquisitions" and for "general corporate purposes." In the press release, Infinity was quick to point out that it has not reached agreements to buy any stations, but "periodically engages in discussions with acquisition candidates." Infinity stock closed up 1 1/8 after Tuesday's announcement.

Did you know that 30% of Americans do not have cable TV? Commercial airline travelers spend 60% more time with radio from 6 am to 6 pm than with television? These are just some of the key findings from "Media Targeting 2000," a study profiling consumers and media produced by Arbitron and sponsored by the Radio Advertising Bureau. The study provides consumer profiles on 116 products and services. These are divided into 10 segments and include profiles based on demographics, media usage, shopping habits, product consumption and ownership, and entertainment and leisure activity.

Other key findings include radio is reaching 52% more men 18-34 per day than newspapers, American-made car owners who use their cars to go shopping have their radios turned on an average of 32 minutes, and radio is more likely than other media to reach the new-home shopper.

The study was based on a sample of 1504 persons surveyed in February, 1995. The 300+ page book was then mailed free to Arbitron subscribers and RAB members. Arbitron first did this type of study for the RAB in 1986. RAB President Gary Fries says "a lot has changed since that study. . . despite the rise in media options, radio is still the best way to reach and influence consumers when they're most likely to purchase a product or service. Inside Radio reports more than a couple of radio group heads are upset about the inclusion of all that Scarborough data in the Spring Arbitron books. Several complained that they are paying for info their competitors now get free. To passify them, Arbitron will drop three of the five Scarborough categories that are printed for the Summer book. Arbitron's Advisory Council is investigating the actions taken so far. Arbitron claims most group heads are happy with the data.

Arbitron is reissuing the Spring '95 Salisbury-Ocean City, MD radio market report. It found five diaries that were attributed to the wrong counties, moving the listening from the metro to the TSA. Three diaries were also removed from the TSA in-tab. No reason was given for the deletion.

The NAB wrapped up another Radio show this past week in New Orleans. Marketing and new technologies seemed to dominate many conversations. Many of the new marketing angles presented at the show focus on data technologies that will take a while to become available and accepted in the consumer marketplace. Seiko's new ACTIVE data technology, RDS, RBDS, the Internet, and other methods present great ways to promote your radio station or bring in alternative revenue, but broadcasters shouldn't lose sight of what makes radio the most popular medium--good programming, serving the community, and delivering customers to advertisers.

At the show, NAB President Eddie Fritts blasted a plan proposed by Congress to fund public broadcasting with a 2% tax on the transfer of broadcast properties, allowing public broadcasters to offer limited advertising on their stations, and auctioning advanced television spectrum space. Fritts said that the plan would damage the relationship between commercial and public broadcasters but noted the plan has not been endorsed by the Corporation for Public Broadcasting.

The show wrapped up with the Marconi Radio Award banquet. Twenty-two awards were presented, recognizing outstanding personalities and stations. Legendary station of the year goes to KGO, San Francisco. Other winners include:

Even the deals are bigger in Texas as SFX Broadcasting doubles up in Houston by announcing it will buy Texas Coast Broadcasters' news/talker KNUZ and one of only a couple true MOR stations left--KQUE-FM. SFX will pay \$38 million cash for the privilege of owning three stations in the market. They already own soft AC powerhouse KODA there. KNUZ also has a synchronous transmitter serving the western part of Houston part of the day.

Osborn Communications is doubling up in the Ft. Myers/Naples market. It's buying adult standards WKII and oldies WEEJ, Port Charlotte from Kneller Broadcasting for \$3.6 million. The combo will give Osborn three-and-a-half stations in that market. They already own oldies WOLZ, Ft. Myers and half of a construction permit for a new station, WRWX, Carlos Park, FL. The LMA begins immediately. It expects WRWX to be on sometime this fall. In addition, Osborn will sell off its properties in Jacksonville and Daytona Beach to Renda Broadcasting for \$6.5 million--contemporary Christian WWRD, Brunswick, GA (Jacksonville) and CHR WFKS, Palatka, FL (Daytona Beach/Jacksonville). This creates a duopoly for Renda in Jacksonville as it already owns soft AC WEJZ. They've entered into an LMA as well.

Network radio's report card, RADAR 51 (Spring '95), shows overall network radio listening is down 4.2% with 10 of 14 networks declining. ABC's Sr. VP/R&D Bill McClenaghan reports that the ABC Excel Network posted the biggest gain of 24.4%, followed by American Urban Network, up 21.0%. The biggest losers were Westwood One's Country down 21.7% and Westwood's Young Adult down 11.3%. As usual, Paul Harvey lead the list in listenership, reaching 5.1 million listeners a week with his 8:30 am ET newscast. CBS Radio listening was up 8.7%.

Premiere Radio Networks bought yet another company--this time it's Broadcast Results Group, which produces music libraries and jingles in exchange for spots. BRG's CEO Andrew Mark will stay on to run the company. Purchase price was \$2.75 million.

ABC Radio Networks and Keystone Communications Corp. have entered into a marketing agreement where ABC will handle the sales, marketing, and management of Keystone's Audio Satellite Services division. Keystone provides satellite distribution services to about 1,000 clients through seven uplink facilities located throughout the U.S. Under the new agreement, ABC will convert Keystone's space segment to SEDAT and MPEG compression, creating 17 additional channels for resale.

The Radio Advertising Bureau will serve as co-sponsor of the Third Montreaux International Radio Symposium scheduled for June 6-8 in Montreaux, Switzerland. The RAB has been actively involved in the conference since its inception. The event is sponsored by the RAB, the NAB, the European Broadcasting Union, and the Association of European Radios. It's designed to be sort of an international NAB Radio Show, featuring seminars and information on radio sales, marketing, programming, management, and broadcast-based technologies.

**FCC OPENS ESCAPE ROUTE.** . . . If you're in a comparative hearing over a new station, now's your chance to settle it, but you don't have much time. The Commission opened a 90-day window on September 15 that allows applicants for new stations in comparative hearings to settle for more than prudent expenses. The Commission lifted the "greenmail" ban to clear a backlog of dozens of cases pending after the 1993 *Bechtel v. FCC* decision that threw out the Commission's management integration criterion. More details are on page seven.

**SUN UP, SUN DOWN.** . . . After the fall of investment advisor/broadcaster Sonny Bloch's IBN network, Sun Radio Network, seizing an opportunity to fill a need, quickly expanded from weekends only to a 24-hour, seven day talk forum. Its commentators, such as liberal T. J. Walker and conservative Rick Gaidis, spanned both ends of the political spectrum. Noble attempt, but the Florida-based network has been forced to retrench significantly and is back to weekends only, with the exception of 9 pm to midnight weekdays. The program lineup for the surviving dayparts is essentially unchanged from the prior full schedule.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK**

If you're in a comparative hearing for a new station, now's your chance to settle, but you'd better hurry. Beginning September 15 for the next ninety days, the Commission has waived rules which limit terms for settlement among applicants competing for broadcast facilities. This will allow dozens of current cases to be settled. Two years ago, the Commission imposed a freeze on stations involved in comparative hearings as a result of Bechtel v. FCC, which threw out the Commission's "integration of ownership into management" criterion. The FCC believes recent Supreme Court cases involving the legality of minority ownership credit may also delay proceedings on mutually exclusive applications.

According to the Commission release, "The Commission recognizes that many applications that are subject to the freeze on comparative proceedings were filed during a lengthy period of time when the applicants could have had no reasonable expectation of profiting from their proposals. The delays in proceedings...have caused hardship to those applicants and disserved the public interest... Given the additional fact that these pending applications could not have foreseen the ramifications of the limitations heretofore imposed on settlement agreements would either reward improper speculation or encourage the filing of abusive proposals in the future." It made clear, however, that it is not "lessening" support for the rules and that settlement agreements must continue to include "only legitimate and prudent expenses."

Who would have ever thought getting a \$50,000 EEO fine would be getting off easy? The Commission slammed Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod-owned KFUE-AM & FM with the fine for not following EEO policies, although the Commission found no evidence of discrimination. The FCC had threatened a \$250,000 fine when the licenses were designated for hearing last year because of lack of candor allegations. The licenses were renewed for a full-term subject to reporting conditions.

The Commission has denied an application for review of Daryl L. Bordelon's request for the allotment of 102.1 C2 to Blanchard, LA. Arkansas Wireless Company filed a counterproposal to Bordelon's application requesting the allotment to Stephens, AR. When the Blanchard app. was granted, Arkansas Wireless filed a petition stating Stephens has no local service. The Commission noted that although Bordelon's application didn't offer "evidence to distinguish their proposal," a Commission analysis showed that both communities are well-served. It based its decision on the fact that Blanchard is a larger community. Blanchard is approximately 15 miles from Shreveport.

The NAB is trying to nudge FCC Chairman Reed Hundt toward making a decision on an EEO Inquiry that has been sitting on Commission desks for fifteen months. Current FCC rules relax EEO reporting requirements for broadcasters with five or fewer employees. The NAB is asking the Commission to raise the threshold to twenty employees. It also asks the Commission to focus on results, not the process. The outcome of the case, which will result in a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking regarding EEO policy, may now affect hundreds of radio stations that are currently in the renewal process or will apply for renewal soon.

WASHINGTON THIS WEEK (cont'd)

David Furth has been appointed interim legal adviser to Commissioner Rachelle Chong. Furth was Deputy Chief of the Commercial Wireless Division of the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau. Furth replaces Jill Luckett, who is leaving the FCC to become VP/Program Network Policy at the National Cable Television Association.

The Engineering and Technology office has released a technical report on the effect of RF called "Engineering Services for Measurement and Analysis of Radiofrequency (RF) Fields." The June, 1995 report summarizes engineering studies performed for the Commission in support of the FCC's program for controlling human exposure to environmental RF. ELSEWHERE

Most broadcasters are willing to help law enforcement officials fight crime--it's part of public service. But this one went a little too far--and the station didn't even know about it. The U.S. Marshall's office set up a sting operation last month in Warner Robins, GA in a phony radio station--WLYU ("We Lock You Up")--to capture evasive criminals. The Marshall's office sent out over 800 letters (on official station letterhead) to residents of middle Georgia who had outstanding warrants, promising a check for \$150 if they stopped by the station to fill out a survey. Once the person showed up at the station, they were arrested. What the Marshalls didn't realize is that WLYU is a real radio station only 80 miles from their phony, in nearby Lyons, GA. The Georgia Association of Broadcasters has written to the Marshall's Macon office alleging criminal violations of federal mail fraud statutes, deceptive trade practices, and substantial harm to its member station, WLYU, and radio broadcasters in general. Georgia Senator Sam Nunn has promised an investigation.

Osborn Communications is getting out of the Syracuse market, selling country WNDR and CHR WNTQ to Pilot Communications for \$12.5 million. The deal will give Pilot a duopoly with its rocker WAQX. Pilot starts with an LMA immediately.

Hawes-Saunders Broadcasting is doubling up in the Dayton market by purchasing Vernon Baldwin's contemporary Christian WTRJ, Troy, OH, for \$1.1 million. Hawes-Saunders owns urban WROU, West Carrollton, OH.

In the story we wrote last week on the Cox Broadcasting purchase in Louisville, we inadvertently transposed the call letters. Cox is buying WRKA, St. Matthews, KY (not WKRA, as we reported) to combo with WAJE, a construction permit in New Albany, IN (Louisville market).

The plans of WETA, Washington, DC, to launch its own non-commercial classical network have fallen through. Last Spring, the Corporation for Public Broadcasting awarded a development grant to WETA, but before the paperwork was finished, Minnesota Public Radio decided to do one too. CPB and WETA then mutually agreed to suspend the project. MPR will continue its development plans.

Arbitron's Radio Advisory Council is gearing up to fill five seats on the council that will become available January 1, 1996. The five formats that are up for election are AC in non-continuously measured markets, AOR (all markets), CHR/Top 40 (non-continuously measured markets), gold/oldies (all markets), and Spanish (all markets). Arbitron subscribers who hold the title of General Manager or higher and are involved in the day-to-day operation of a station or group can indicate their desire to run by returning the Arbitron-provided forms to Price Waterhouse by Sept. 30. All qualifying names will be placed on the Election Ballot, which will be mailed to client radio stations in the format/market size categories on November 1, 1995. Execs. who are located in the same market as current Council members under the same group ownership are not eligible.

Interep is investing \$2 million in a "technology plan" for 1996 which involves upgrading the hardware and software utilized by its reps in the field. It's created an Interactive Services Division to handle station and market data collection. It will add an around-the-clock hotline for client stations and advertisers with a guaranteed one-hour response time. It's also adding video teleconferencing with all of its offices as well as automated fax technology and paging systems.

ELSEWHERE (cont'd)

The simulcast experiment is over in Seattle as KJR-FM and KUBE have ended the single morning show with different music on each station concept. Market institution Charlie & Ty remain on 70's oldies KJR-FM while the "T-Man" takes over morning drive duties churban KUBE. T was doing evenings on sports-talker KJR (AM).

One of ABC Radio's most successful shows hit the television airwaves this week. The Fabulous Sports Babe can be seen weekdays from 1 pm to 2 pm ET on ESPN2. The taped session will be a replay of her 11 am to 12 noon radio broadcast. ABC Radio claims over 140 affiliates for the Babe, who just added WEEI, Boston to her collection.

In the U.S., 98 percent of the population listens to the radio. In fact, we take it for granted that the radio wakes us up, is on at work, and follows us home. In some areas of South Africa, radios are a little tougher to come by, but one man may have found a solution. Reuters reports a wind-up radio has been invented that draws its power from a spring that turns an internal generator. It doesn't need batteries or electricity, making it perfect for many areas of South Africa. On one sixty-second wind the radio has power for about 40 minutes of listening time. About 60,000 of them have been ordered by aid organizations from South Africa to Bosnia. The radio is being produced in Cape Town, and was invented by Briton Trevor Baylis.

M STREET BAZAAR. . .PEOPLE, PRODUCTS, AND PROGRAMMING

ABC Radio will debut the Bernie Ward show November 11. Ward has been on KGO, San Francisco since 1992. The show will air Saturdays from 1 pm to 4 pm ET and will focus on politics and current events. It replaces the Jim Hightower show, which marked ABC's first venture into talk programming since ABC Radio ended its weekday programming. Hightower let affiliates know that his two-minute daily commentaries will continue to be syndicated by him and are available by calling (512) 477-5588.

On the heels of the announcement that MTV is getting into the radio business, Westwood One has plans to launch the "SPIN Radio Network." WWI will market SPIN Fax, daily scripts of the latest music and lifestyle news; SPIN Bites, news and interview feeds; SPIN Exclusives, special music and in-studio performances; and SPIN Sessions, ninety-minute specials from top alternative artists with interviews from SPIN's editor, Bob Guccione, Jr.

USA Radio Network is rolling out a couple of new programs. First, John Rosemond hosts "Because I Said So!," a two-hour daily show dedicated to conservative, "back-to-the-basics" parenting. The show airs from 3 pm to 5 pm ET. On weekends, USA will air "Your Health Matters" with Doug Kaufman--narrowly focused to include herbal healing, food related disorders, allergies, and taking control of your health. For more info, call (800) 829-8111.

Christian Research Report is planning a Contemporary Christian radio seminar October 14-15 at the Atlanta Airport Hilton. The workshop features mainstream radio experts like Mike McVay, Dan O'Day, and Dwight Douglas. The two day seminar is sponsored by First Center Entertainment and Myrrh Records. Premiere Radio Networks steps deeper into the research business this week by announcing it will launch a new weekly callout research service for the news/talk format. "Newstrack" interviews over 10,000 news/talk partisans to analyze levels of burn-out, interest, and familiarity on all types of talk topics. The service is available on a barter basis. The sample is done by Seattle-based Marketing Research Partners. For more info, call (818) 377-5300.

**WASHINGTON THIS WEEK**

Following the devastation of Hurricanes Luis and Marilyn, the NAB has asked the FCC to waive all FY95 regulatory fees for stations licensed to the Virgin Islands and to give broadcasters an extra two months--until December 1, 1995--to file their renewal applications. The NAB filing reports that only one St. Thomas station, WSTA, is on with full-power. WIVI, and WGOD-FM are on with reduced power. WVWI, WVGN, WIYC, and WGOD-AM are off the air.

The Commission has upheld a staff decision granting the application to assign the license of KKMx, Tri City, OR from FM Broadcasters of Douglas County to Tri City Communications, Inc., and denied the application for review filed by Douglas County Tri Casters. Douglas County contended that it was improper for the Mass Media Bureau to grant the application prior to the resolution of unauthorized transfer of control allegations then pending against the seller.

Gregory L. Robinson has been named deputy chief economist for the FCC. He'll assist the Commission in developing policies to promote competition and innovation. He was senior economist in the Office of Plans and Policy.

ELSEWHERE

After days of heavy speculation that they would announce a deal with Gannett, those crafty folks at Infinity announced that they were instead buying the seven Alliance Broadcasting stations for \$275 million. The deal would give Infinity a new FM duop in Detroit (its oldies outlet WOMC, their country WYCD), a quad-op with an AM in Dallas (its AC KVIL-FM, Highland Park, TX; oldies KLUV; Alliance's pioneering "Young Country" outlet KYNG; and their "Sunny" country KSNM, Arlington, TX. The AM is adult standards KDMN, Highland Park), and a tri-op with an AM in the Bay Area (new rock KOME, San Jose plus oldies simulcast KFRC-AM & FM and young country KYNG, San Francisco). Infinity will also pick up young country KYCW, Seattle. The Dallas deal would require an FCC waiver or an act of Congress.

Jacor has announced they have an LMA-to-buy with John Douglas' OIA Broadcasting to buy KECR-FM, El Cajon/San Diego. Jacor's Randy Michaels announced "our intention is to purchase additional San Diego properties or trade KECR for something interesting. We're standing by to evaluate any offers to buy, sell or swap at 513-621-1300." KECR was still in a religious format at press-time, making the first one of those that the Jacor folks have operated since the company's startup days in the early '80s. A new format and call letters for KECR will be announced soon.

Jacor, Take II: As part of its "intellectual property" deal that put the WOFX, Cincinnati's jazz format on Jacor's WPPT. Heritage Media now has an option to purchase Jacor's 70's oldies WMYU, Sevierville, and CHR WWST, Karns, TN (Chattanooga). No word on whether Heritage is also looking to trade those for something more interesting.

Country Airplay Monitor reports KFKF Broadcasting has announced its \$11 million purchase of Quad Cities AC outlet KMXG, Clinton, IA; oldies KUUL, Davenport, IA; and news/talker WOC, Davenport from Signal Hill Communications. KFKF Broadcasting has ties to Sconnix Broadcasting, which controls Quad Cities country combo WLLR, Moline, IL, and WLLR-FM, East Moline and classic hits KCQQ, Davenport, IA.

MidWest Family Broadcast Group's adult contemporary/talk WSJM and rock CHR WIRX, St. Joseph, MI is comboing in the Benton Harbor, MI, area by buying Dunes Broadcasting's soft AC trombo WCSY-AM & FM, South Haven, MI, and soft AC WCSE, Bridgman, MI, for approximately \$3.1 million. The LMA begins immediately.

So the folks at the new KIMN, Denver thought they had call letters that everybody could get a handle on. Then Arbitron announced another spring book goof that cost the former KMJI 263 quarter hours. KIMN would go from a 3.8 to a 3.9, but since there's no rank change and the mistake represents less than 5% of AQH, Arbitron won't reissue the book. Arbitron had a similar goof involving WJMK, Chicago last week.

First there were the DAB tests on 1660 AM at the spring NAB show. Soon there'll be some more action on 1660 when 1530 WJDM, Elizabeth, N.J., makes its move to the expanded AM band in October. Radio World reports that WJDM hasn't decided whether to simulcast on its other frequency. Elizabeth was earmarked as the first market to get expanded band service because it was the largest U.S. city with no night-time radio. WJDM will make the move compliments of a Special Temporary Authority from the Commission. Other stations must still wait for a final action on the expanded band allocations.

Seattle-based KidStar has announced five new investors which the network says will facilitate its intended growth into the top 10 markets in 1996. The five firms are toymaker Bandai America (of Teenage Mutant Ninja Turtle fame), the American subsidiary of Nippon Telegraph & Telephone, the Sega-related CSK Venture Capital, Japanese educational publisher Benesse Corp., and D.C.-based venture capital group Vulcan Ventures, Inc. Terms of the deal weren't disclosed, but the money will be used to do LMA's to fill out its large market coverage. It's expected the first LMA deal will be signed in San Francisco.

**ELSEWHERE (cont'd)**

The station swap frenzy that we see around us wasn't yet visible in the first half of '95 according to the NAB's newly issued Trends in Radio Station Sales: 1993-95. According to the Hoffman-Schutz Media Capital-compiled study, station sales in the first two quarters of '95 were off 10% from the previous year, although up 35% from the first six months of '93. The study also finds that among the stations sold to create duopolies, 33.2% are in unranked markets. Only 13.7% are in the top 25 markets. 11.6% are in markets 26-50. 19.7% are in markets 51-100 and the second largest chunk, 21.8%, is markets 101-261. A copy of this report is available through the NAB.

Canada gets another major satellite service as group owner Pelmorex launches two new formats, rock AC and country. The former is already on 30+ stations, Pelmorex says. The latter goes up in mid-October. This puts Pelmorex in head-to-head competition with the Rogers-owned Satellite Radio Network. (Group owner Telemedia also has a regional country net.) Tom Tompkins, last with Canada's satellite country video channel, is the in-house consultant for the new country service. For more info, call the Mississauga, Ontario-based Pelmorex at 905-566-9511.

UPI has announced a deal with Northwestern College Radio that puts UPI news back on the 100 news affiliates of the SkyLight Satellite Network. Besides its regular :00 and :30 casts, UPI also has a daily religious package that Skylight will market to its clients.

As part of its 75th Anniversary of Radio celebration, Chicago's Museum of Broadcast Communications is presenting tributes to WVAZ (V103), Chicago legend Herb Kent on Oct. 11 and longtime WGN, Chicago morning host Wally Phillips on Oct. 18. Both events lead up to MBC's annual black-tie celebration on Oct. 29. Phillips was inducted into MBC's hall of fame two years ago; Kent is inducted this year.
