

DEFOREST HONEYCOMB COILS

by George Potter

Many members have written in about DeForest coils and what combinations to use for a certain application.

Recently, I came across a page in an Atlantic Radio Co. catalog and there were tables showing coil combinations for certain wave lengths.

Below are combinations for both a single and balanced primary circuit.

As a collector of DeForest equipment I've found that most all honeycomb plug-in coils are stamped some way with the number of turns. DeForest uses D or DL designations in front of coil numbers.

Other popular name brand coils were: Remler, Coto, Branston, Giblin, Radisco, Duo-Lateral and Federal. Undoubtedly, there are numerous no-name or "bootleg" coils around. Signal, DeForest and Crown made multi-coil mounts for the honeycomb coils.

Plug-in honeycomb coils are used on several factory receivers and untold numbers of home Brew sets.

DeForest seemed to favor use of coils on the exterior of many sets they produced, ie., Inter Panel, MT-200 tuner, Everyman Crystal set, RS-200, and RS-100 utility receivers. The RS-501 Commercial receiver had a DeForest 3-coil mount, housed inside the cabinet and tuning knobs on the exterior face.

No doubt, honeycomb coils do make a set impressive looking.




Almost the middle of the month, and near the middle of the year, and the finds still keep trickling in , the price generally is up and the frequency down. Here's the box score:

I've started to line up technical information for those who desire to know more than I do about the inner workings of our hobby.

In the near future I plan to make "Remembering" a monthly feature which looks into the broadcasting past of radio; a portion that I'm more familiar with and that other members have asked for.

I'm trying to share with our members some of the best of other news letters that pertain to radio and equipment.

But I'm only now finding a way to include photos in the CALL LETTER. It was the desire of members who talked to me to include some photographs. I was not readily confident that we could afford a "superhetrodyne" publication on a "crystal set" budget.

I first looked into a higher resolution photocopy method. But this didn't produce a quality photo reproduction. (It did however make our "paying " advertisers happy- they enjoy the "richer copy".)

So, I've gotten a quotation from PrintRight Inc. to <u>print</u> the CALL LETTER monthly for only fortyfive cents a copy. This would bring our monthly printing costs to twenty-eight dollars. This is a decrease of eight and a half cents over the price of commercial photocopying. It represents an increase over other available methods though.
