
Other Society functions include guest speakers, auctions, radio show, and radio sales which are advertised in the *Call Letter* and are held in and around Portland.

WHY RADIO STATIONS ARE MOVING ON MARCH 29TH



A major improvement in broadcasting begins everywhere in the United States on March 29, 1941. At that time most stations will come in at new locations on your radio set.

This shift is called "Reallocation." The governments of the United States, Canada, Mexico, Cuba and Haiti have been planning it for over three years. It will bring better reception of programs and eliminate interference from stations broadcasting outside the United States.

If your set has push button tuning, have the push buttons reset by a service man from your radio shop. Use manual tuning until he comes.

ANOTHER AID to clear radio reception is the year-around program carried on by Pacific Power & Light Company radio specialists to trace down and help eliminate local sources of radio interference. This friendly service adds to your enjoyment of your radio.



Auction Report

On the morning of Saturday, Dec. 5, 1998, braving wind, rain, and even a little snow, collectors from at least three states gathered in a heaving, drafty tent to begin bidding on Jim Mason's extensive radio collection. Auctioneer Steve Greenwalt of Heritage Auctions, assisted by his wife Rebecca, kept the bidding moving at a lively pace, pronouncing "SOLD" on 240 items before the lunch break. Bidding ended on Saturday at about 4:30 with half the collection sold.



Bidding resumed Sunday morning and continued apace until about 4:30, with the number of bidders decreasing sharply in the last hour.

There were a total of 807 items on the bidding list, including the individual auction items and the box lots. When the bidding ended on Sunday, the sale had grossed about \$127,000.

While some items that went for higher bids, almost three quarters of the items sold for less than \$150, giving most of the bidders present a chance to acquire something for their collections.



Here is a listing of the items that sold for \$150 or more. As you can see, it goes on for another five pages and it lists just a little over one fourth of the auction items.






