The Northwest Vintage Radio Society is a non-profit historical society incorporated in the State of Oregon. Since 1974 the Society has been dedicated to the preservation and enjoyment of "Vintage radio" and wireless equipment.


Membership in the Society is open to all who are actively interested in historic preservation. The dues are \$25.00 for domestic membership, due on January 1st of each year (prorated quarterly).

The *Call Letter* has been a monthly publication since 1974. It was originated with the founder, Bob Bilbie, and our first president, Harley Perkins. Through several editors and with the assistance of numerous society members, the *Call Letter* has continued to be a publication that informs members of the society's business and that supports the hobby of collecting, preserving, and restoring vintage radios.

Society meetings are held the second Saturday of each month at the Abernethy Grange Hall at 15745 S. Harley Ave. in Oregon City, Oregon. They convene at or about 10 AM for the purpose of displaying radios, conducting Society business, and exchanging information. Guests are welcome at all Society meetings and functions (except board meetings).

Other Society functions include guest speakers, auctions, radio show, and radio sales which are advertised in the *Call Letter* and are held in and around Portland.

With each issue of the *Call Letter*, we remember Jim Mason, a charter member of the society who remained active until his death in 1999. A generous bequest from Jim's estate ensures the vitality of the Northwest Vintage Radio Society, and continued publication of the *Call Letter*.

Joining the E-mail Group

Most of you are aware that we have a couple of e-mail groups operating for the Society. The one I want to discuss here is the YahooGroup, nwvrs@yahooroups.com.

This started out as an “e-group” ten years ago, then became a “YahooGroup” when Yahoo bought out e-groups. At any rate, we’ve had a presence there for a long time, its advantage being that we can restrict the participants to the Society’s members.

To become part of the Yahoo group, you simply need to request membership. Go to <http://groups.yahoo.com/>, then in the “Find a Yahoo! Group” box, enter “nwvrs” and click the “search” button. You’ll get the screen shown here.

Click on the link to join the group. It is pretty much self-explanatory after that. You will, of course, be asked to sign up with Yahoo. That isn’t absolutely necessary if all you want is to take part in the e-mail traffic. However, there is a file storage area where I post printable versions of the *Call Letter*, and where members can post pictures, etc. It is extremely under-utilized, but offers great opportunities to share our latest finds, successful restorations, and other hobby-related material.

We currently have 47 members in the group. I know that there are more than 47 society members with e-mail. The traffic is low, and stays strictly on-topic. It’s a great way to keep up with what’s going on in the Society. Give it a try!

...new and recent finds by NVRS members

Tony Hauser — 1948 **Farnsworth GT-051** painted bakelite AM table radio.

1948 **GE 115W** ivory plaskon AM table radio.

Jay Johnston — **Kitcraft xtal radio**. This shiny red set from the 50s came new in the box and unassembled.

Philco 38-7. This set features a beautiful curved cabinet... and the name of a local furniture store on its large round dial. The sole Philco marking is on a tag at the rear of the chassis; the only other branding is the name Powers Furniture Company on the dial. It does not appear to be an aftermarket add-on; Philco must have offered customized dials to its retailers. By its appearance, I would estimate this set's manufacture in the late 30s or early 40s. Assuming that the set hasn't moved around a lot, this receiver is quite a performer: the dial is labeled with the call letters of many Portland stations (including Portland Police) as well as those far flung as KVI Seattle, KHQ Spokane, KFI Los Angeles, KOA Denver, KSL Salt Lake City, and the mighty KGO of San Francisco. A quick note about Powers: it opened its doors in 1866 downtown on SW 1st Ave, moving a few blocks to 3rd & Yamhill in 1911. Thanks to noted radio historian and esteemed Society member Art Redman for parting with this treasure!



The Back Page

This is the one that started it all! This is the newsletter that went out to our fledgling club 35 years ago, December of 1974.

TO THOSE DEVOTED TO THE PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION OF OLD RADIOS



- Two important agenda items for the next club meeting
Jan. 11, 1975, Buena Vista Clubhouse, Oregon City, 10AM:
- 1. Selection of the club's name
- 2. Final draft for the club constitution

No doubt there will probably be as many names as the club has members. Agreement may require our best spirit of compromise. Some important points in my opinion include simplicity, brevity and a clear identification of the hobby. The name should attract potential new members with interests like ours. It should say to the public at large that the club exists for the preservation and restoration of old radios--- that somebody really cares about that old relic they want to get rid of. Yes, that's a tall order for a brief simple name. The constitution should make clear our purpose, who we are and how we will be conducting the club's business. Certainly it can't cover everything. Bylaws add to and clarify the intention of the constitution as the club matures. Art Redman is Chairman for development of the constitution. He will be sending each of us a draft of a possible constitution which can serve as a starting point.

Bob Bilbie suggested to me that I bring over a radio set, magazine etc. to the club meeting. I believe this would be a good policy for the future meetings. It would let us do a little "knob twisting" and reminiscing so that we can all get better acquainted. If most of you are like me, there are dozens of old radios I've never heard of, much less seen, even though it is a hobby I have followed for 35 years.

We owe our thanks to Sandy Bilbie for finding such an excellent meeting room. Also, I am sure the club wouldn't have happened without her enthusiasm and the hours of phoning to get us all together.

In the first small get together we had to plan the first meeting of the club, at Sandy's house, we discussed the desirability of including spouse and family in the club membership. I personally would like to encourage couples in the club. Recognizing that mailing costs, etc. would not be greater for a husband and wife than a single member, a lesser dues for spouse will encourage an active interest in the hobby and provide an opportunity to "do things together". I wonder how the members feel about this.

Ron Waldron is Membership Chairman. He is developing an application form and coordinating publicity efforts to attract other members active in the hobby. We can help Ron by inviting hobbyists we know to the next meeting.



Meeting Location

Here is a map (thanks to Google Maps) to the Abernethy Grange Hall (the pointer marked "A"), where the Northwest Vintage Society meets the second Saturday of each month. Just follow the arrows on the map.



To get to the Abernethy Grange Hall:

1. Exit I-205 at SR-213 (Exit 10 to Molalla) and head south on 213.
2. At the first intersection (the traffic light), turn left onto Clackamas River Dr.
3. Turn right at Forsythe Rd.
4. Turn left onto Harley Ave. The Grange Hall is on the left about a block and a half.
