President Hoover and spokesmen of the liberal arts colleges of America will participate in a nation-wide "college night" rally to be heard Saturday (November 14) at 9 p. m. through WSAI and other NBC stations. Other speakers will be Dr. John H. Finley, associate editor of the *New York Times*; Dr. A. N. Ward, chairman of the Liberal Arts College Movement; Dr. C. R. Mann, director of the American Council of Education, and Dr. Robert L. Kelley, executive secretary of the Association of American Colleges.

Marshall, Van Gordon Will Sing Opera From WLS

Nearly the entire first act of Saint-Saens' Biblical opera, "Samson and Delilah" with Charles Marshall and Cyrena Van Gordon in the title roles, will be broadcast from the stage of the Chicago Civic Opera Saturday night (November 14) at 9 o'clock over an NBC network including WLS (870 kc.).

Another Unemployment Hour is Booked This Week

Colonel Lindbergh, Mary Pickford, Geraldine Farrar, General Pershing, and other famous folk have spoken and entertained on previous programs broadcast by NBC and CBS in behalf of President Hoover's Unemployment Relief Committee, although announcement of their appearance was made only a day in advance.

Now the Columbia network has scheduled another of these programs for 4:30 Sunday afternoon (November 16) with WKRC in the hook-up. Although NBC has made no announcement, it is probable that either WLW or WSAI will carry the same program. Listeners should not fail to dial this program in the hope of hearing more equally famous speakers and entertainers who are contributing their time and talents to the unemployment relief movement.

Kentucky Station Has Full Time

WSAI Can Operate With 1000 Watts In Daytime

Daytime radio reception from Greater Cincinnati radio stations will be greatly improved within the week by two orders of the Federal Radio Commission.

Full time operation has been granted to Station WCKY, Covington, Ky., to begin November 20 (next Friday week).

Newspaper dispatches from Washington, D. C., also report the Commission has granted Station WSAI permission to operate on 1000 watts in the daytime in an effort to override daylight static and make the station more available in the Greater Cincinnati district.

To celebrate the addition of the hours between 1 p. m. and 3:45, Station WCKY will operate continuously for 49 hours, beginning at 7 a. m. next Friday (November 20) and continuing until 1 o'clock Saturday night.

The Covington station also has added several NBC programs, including the Musical Appreciation Hour at 11 a. m. Friday mornings, Paul Whiteman's Paint Men at 10 p. m. Fridays, Edna Wallace Hopper's Variety Show at 10:45, Vincent Lopez orchestra at 11 o'clock the same night, and others to be announced in next week's RADIO DIAL.

Beethoven Third Symphony Will Be Played Sunday

Seldom-heard works by Handel and Berlioz, and the famous Third Symphony of Beethoven, make up the program in which Erich Kleiber will conduct the New York Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra, beginning at 3 p. m. Sunday (November 16) through the Columbia network and WKRC. The program will include the overture to Handel's "Esther" and the Scherzo "Queen Mab," from "Romeo and Juliet," by Berlioz, in addition to the "Eroica" symphony.



Radio Dial Programs Can Be Used Nationally

RADIO DIAL readers away from Cincinnati where all Greater Cincinnati stations can not be heard can adjust the schedules of the Cincinnati stations to those of their nearest network outlets. WSAI carries NBC programs that are broadcast in New York on WEAF. It is distinguished as a "red" network station. WLW's NBC programs are broadcast in New York on WJZ and throughout the country on the "blue" network stations. WKCY takes programs from both networks. WKRC's network programs are broadcast in New York and throughout the country through the Columbia network outlets.

Big news in Cincinnati radio circles this week is that the makers of Maxwell House Coffee have seen fit to sponsor the Cotton Queen Minstrels and their end-men, Hink and Dink, long considered one of the best of WLW's studio programs.


Almost five years ago Hink and Dink who are (reading left to right) Elmer Hinkle and George Ross, came to WLW from Oxford, Ohio, to try out their black-face act. They were hired immediately and for some time gave an act called "Hink and Dink in the Hotel Business." When the Crosley Burnt Corkers needed new end-men, Hink and Dink got the job. Since then they have been "laying them in the aisles," and pulling jokes that have been copied by just about every amateur minstrel show in the country.

Hinkle is treasurer of Miami university. Ross is a barber. They worked up their act for a Parent-Teacher benefit show because each had children in the Oxford schools and wanted to help raise money for the school system. If Hinkle were willing to leave Oxford, the pair undoubtedly would be as great a success on the stage as they have on the air. They figured out one day that in four years on the air they have cracked more than 8,000 jokes, or one joke for every two miles they have traveled back and forth for weekly broadcasts.
