

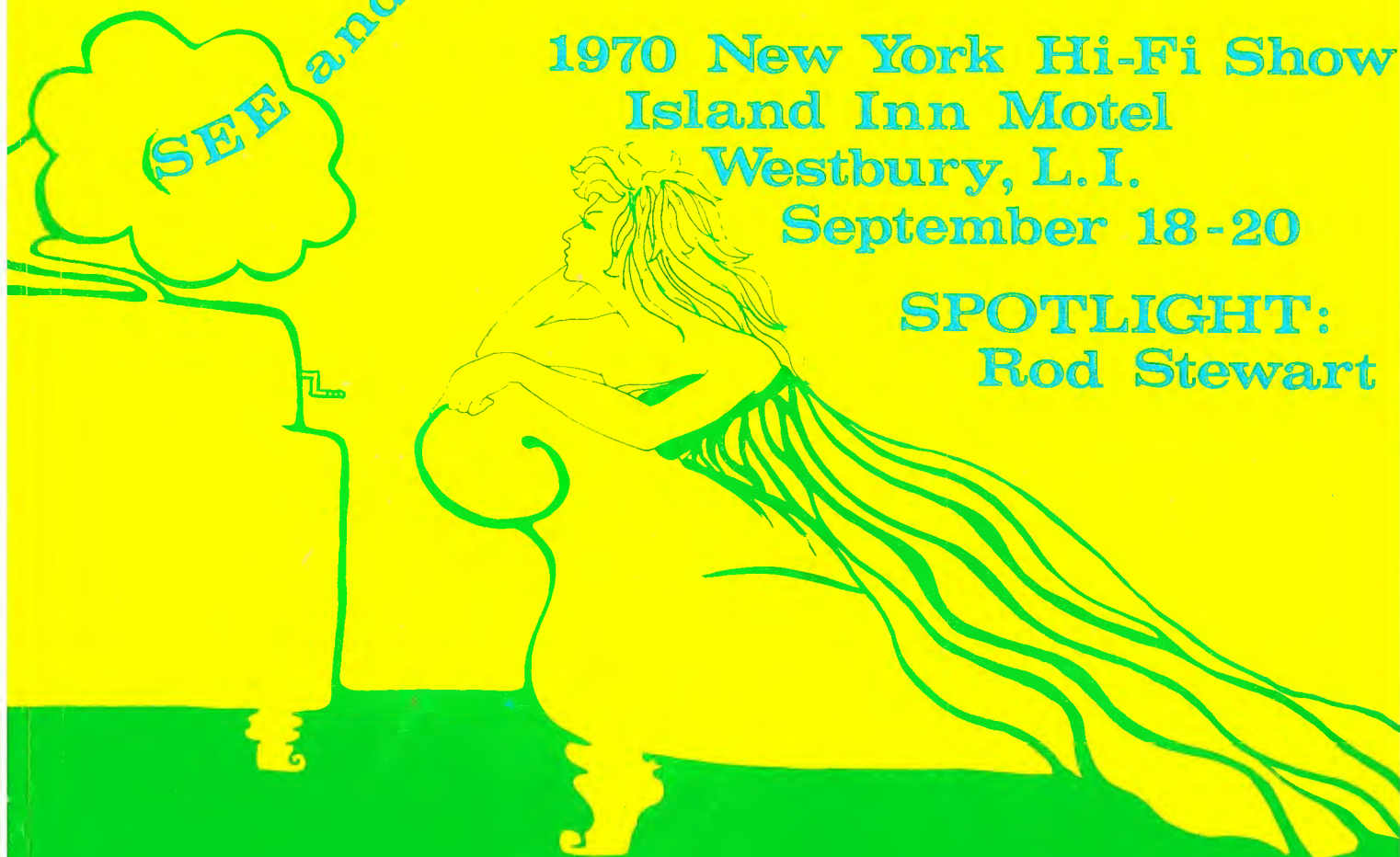

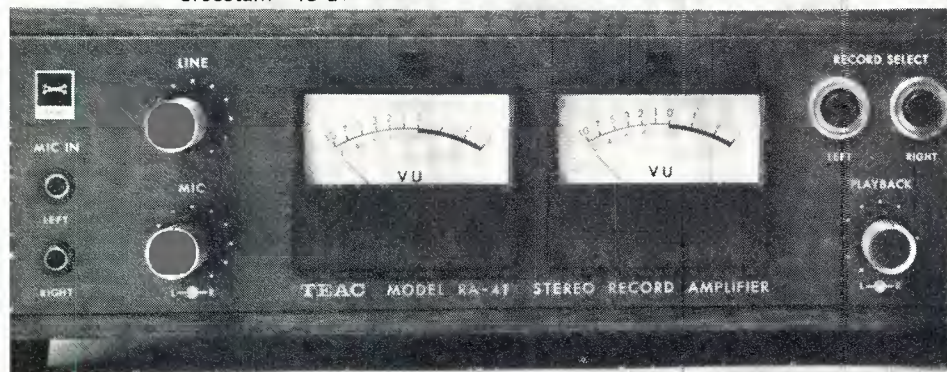

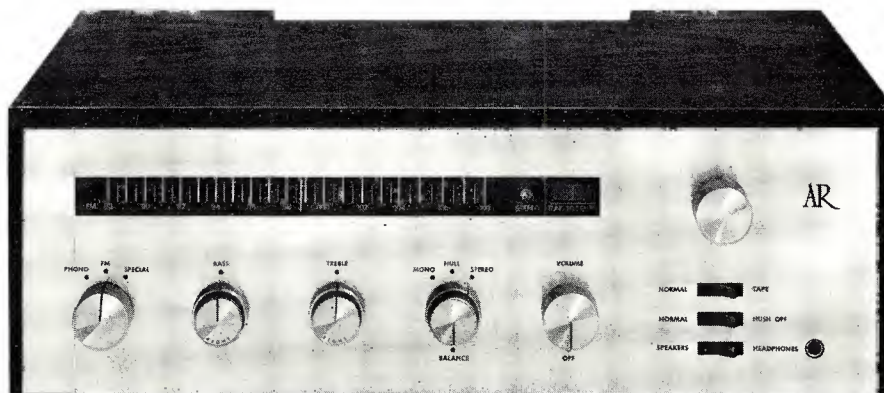

Stereo Review

"From 0.1 watt to 60 watts (both channels driven into 8-ohm loads), the harmonic distortion with a 1,000-Hz input signal fell from less than 0.2 per cent to less than 0.03 per cent . . . IM distortion was under 0.1 per cent from 0.1 watt to well over 60 watts . . . Previous experience with the AR amplifier suggests that the receiver's maximum 4-ohm output for normal operation on program material is in the vicinity of 100 watts per channel . . . The tone controls of the AR receiver are certainly among the best we have ever used. They are meant to be used, and do not destroy musical values at any settings . . . The FM sections measured IHF sensitivity was 1.8 microvolts (better than AR's specified 2 microvolts). Distortion was under 0.5 per cent - which is as low as our test equipment can measure . . . In short, the AR tuner section is, in a number of areas, simply better than we can measure . . . The FM sound was notably clean, and tuning was non-critical. The flywheel tuning mechanism ranked with the best we have used . . . Considering that their amplifier at \$250 is a very good value, one is effectively buying a first-rate FM tuner for \$170 more. We have yet to find a component tuner at anywhere near that price that can compare to the tuner section in the AR receiver."

THE AMERICAN **record guide**

"Power? There is plenty. AR advertises 60 watts into 4-ohm loads, 50 watts into 8 ohms, and 30 watts into 16 ohms . . . I found AR to be extraordinarily *conservative* in its rating . . . at 4 ohms, my sample delivered *90 watts* per channel over a 50-20,000 Hz range, *60 watts* at 9 ohms, and *48 watts* at 16 ohms. That is a lot of power! . . . I have painted a purely technical picture. But that does not tell the whole story. Let me say that in practical performance, with *music*, it was simply flawless. I was also impressed by many little things, such as the fact that the unit really *is* flat at the indicated flat settings on the tone controls, and the fact that the tuning meter really *does* indicate the center of a channel accurately.

To sum up: AR's receiver is a handsome, impressively-powered unit that delivers fine performance at a reasonable price."

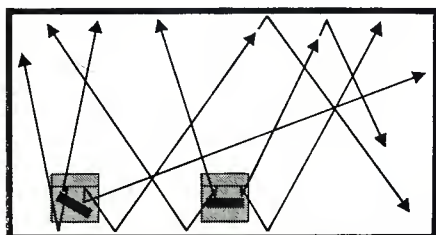

There was none of the splatter or surround effect associated with omnidirectional systems. We had to admit this was a "first" for all of us and we found it difficult to restrain our excitement.

Third, do it yourself.

"Now," they suggested, "you try it." It looked like fun. We each took a turn adjusting the speakers. Only one thing bothered us. The W80 makes everybody with finger tips an instant expert. Then they asked us questions.

What acoustical problem is solved?

A very important one. Since almost all rooms are acoustically unbalanced, fixed directional systems, conventionally placed, are too rigid to overcome this deficiency. Only the amazing flexibility of the new Variflex Speaker Systems can provide "all over" balanced stereo.

What will women say?

"It's about time," probably. W80's are a woman's dream. They are never unwelcome intruders. Since they are reflective systems, the front of the cabinets resemble fine pieces of furniture. Because they permit placement versatility, they can be inserted

decoratively or unobtrusively into any room scheme... even as built-ins with an optional roll out base.

What about quality?

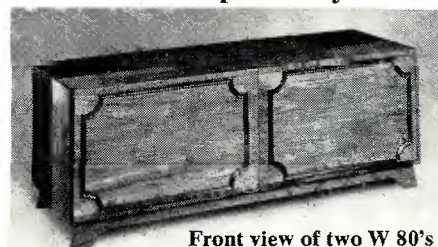

The Many Voices of FM

The medium is the message, according to Marshall McLuhan. Perhaps McLuhan overstates it. But certainly the medium has a powerful effect on the quality and acceptance of any message. As many prominent psychoacousticians have pointed out, Stereo FM simply provides much more information than ordinary FM.

Some of our cultural elitists are currently ringing their hands on hearing the diversity of today's FM programming. FM no longer means "Fine Music", i.e., all classical music programming. Thank God, FM also no longer means "forget money." Today FM means many things. FM means rock and roll; FM also means middle of the road—its most popular format. FM means evergrowing numbers of commercial advertising messages. FM today means many new program formats.

Mr. Jack Gould of the NEW YORK TIMES dissents:

"In cities of over 100,000 population and particularly in an area with 90 stations, the need for greater diversity would not seem inordinately pressing. The conversion of FM stations to rock 'n' roll and "young sounds" already on AM seems dubious progress."

The editors of FM Program Guide disagree; even rock 'n roll which is not everybody's sound, sounds better on Stereo FM.

Stereo FM is the superior medium and improves any musical message. (And judged by current ratings, all radio musical formats are expanding their ratings on FM. Only talk formats are expanding their ratings on AM.)

Q.E.D.—It is now clear that an evergrowing number of people regardless of their musical tastes, do care and are aware of the quality of the medium.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

This year in Institute of High Fidelity history could well go down as "The Year Of Transition"—in shows and other activities. No New York show was held in 1969. Instead a committee was appointed to study the feasibility of a multi-market show program that would bring the IHF and its members to millions of Americans via suburban shows in major areas around the U.S.

The Committee's activities resulted in the Board of Directors endorsing many aspects of the committee's program—suburban markets, motel locations, lower admissions, dealer participation, community activities, and greater show coverage. To this end, the Board designated the first two locations recommended by the committee—Westbury, New York (September 18-20) and Newton, Mass. (October 30-November 1)—for the 1970 New York and Boston Shows, respectively. The locations—The Island Inn Motel in Westbury and the Marriott Motor Lodge in Newton—are the exact locations checked out and recommended by the committee, and except for minor changes the dates themselves are almost identical.

We expect that these two shows will open up new vistas for consumers who seek the new in sound equipment.

In our efforts to supply the public with information on component stereo, the IHF has aimed its educational efforts at a wide segment of the public.

The past year has seen a fifteen minute IHF segment (in color) of the Ed Nelson Morning Show over ABC-TV in twelve major cities, including New York, Los Angeles and Chicago. Over a dozen stereo supplements in such cities as Boston, Washington, Philadelphia and Indianapolis appeared last year carrying the story of components to those who may never have had the opportunity to be exposed to "quality" sound equipment. Many of you may have indeed enjoyed some of these fine informative supplements in the major newspaper in your city. These same activities are being carried on with major magazines.

To add to the information and knowledge of the much valued youth market, we have assisted in the production of a show entitled "The Marvel Of Sound" that will be shown at high schools and junior highs around the country. Through the fine cooperation of many of our members in supplying quality stereo components, the show demonstrates the marvel of sound and how enjoyable good sound can be. Three road shows will be touring the Eastern, Central and Western U.S. this year, playing to audiences of about 800 at each performance—three shows a day.

As our industry expands and other industries begin to overlap, we are seeking to provide more helpful buying information. We have opened communications channels with the EIA to develop new standards which will be agreeable to both associations. The initial net result should be a wattage rating technique that will allow direct comparison of any power amplifier sold in the U.S., thus benefiting you in your selection of products.

We anticipate that the next few years, with the development of new types of products and techniques—four channel stereo, viewer programmed television, etc.—will add to the excitement and enjoyment of sound as part of the total home entertainment spectrum. More and more people every day are learning to appreciate the joy and satisfaction that can be derived from listening to stereo components. And just around the corner are the rewarding opportunities to extend this enjoyment through the boldly imaginative and promising new developments that are inalienably part of the stereo component system.

Stereo Revisited

If component high fidelity means big black bulky things to you, with tubes sticking out of them and wires running all over the place, you're in for a surprise. Even the places where you buy it have changed. Once upon a time, you'd have had to climb a flight or two of stairs to a loft on a back street to find anybody to sell you an amplifier or a turntable—and chances are you'd have to wait while the dealer finished a philosophical discussion with a friend about intermodulation distortion or the signal-to-noise ratio of various kinds of tape.

If that's the way you remember it, you can be forgiven, says the Institute of High Fidelity (IHF). High fidelity was like that once—back in the late 1940's, when high fidelity components made it possible to have music in the home sound lifelike.

But a lot has happened in recent years. For one thing, components are easier to

buy and operate than they used to be. You don't have to poke around a dusty showroom on a back street anymore. Today's audio salon is more likely to be located conveniently in a shopping center, on Main street, or in your favorite department store—and instead of an array of ugly electronic gear, you're likely to find a comfortable, well-lit, tastefully decorated salon.

Early audiophiles gave the impression that you needed a degree in electrical engineering to play a record or tune in an FM station on their equipment. Today's high fidelity components are so simple to operate that even a child can do it. Without eliminating the knobs and switches which give the serious listener maximum control over the kind of sound his system produces, some manufacturers have tucked all but the essential controls out of sight.

High fidelity components take up less room. A typical component system in the late 1950's might have included a separate turntable and tone arm to play records, a magnetic cartridge, a preamplifier and separate power amplifier, and a four-foot-high corner loudspeaker system. Such a system might have cost as much as \$685. An FM tuner, at \$169.50 and a tape deck for \$113 were available as optional extras. Altogether, such a system occupied a large amount of space in a cabinet or on table tops all over the living room. That system played monaurally only.

A system with comparable features and performance today costs about \$410 and includes stereo FM as well as full stereo tape and record facilities. During this same period, incidentally, the cost of just about everything else went up about 25 per cent. Both systems include four separate pieces of equipment—but all of today's are compact enough to fit on bookshelves and good-looking enough to enhance the decor of almost any room. And instead of having to make seven or more separate buying decisions, you need make only three (and a good high fidelity component dealer can simplify even that).

What makes the difference? Transistors, for one thing. They enabled manufacturers to combine preamp and amplifier—even an FM stereo tuner—on a single chassis with no loss in quality. In fact, the small circuits made possible by transistors have made it possible for manufacturers to offer you stereo receivers (stereo amplifier and tuner combined) much more powerful than even the biggest tube mod-

els of a decade ago with more refinements. Because manufacturers don't have to worry about tubes and the heat they generate any more, and because they've eliminated the wires that used to connect two or three separate units, they're able to concentrate on making their equipment attractive. A stereo receiver today may have a tuning dial which blacks out when the power is turned off, a burnished brass faceplate which looks striking in the right room setting.

Loudspeakers have changed, too. These days, you can get every bit as good sound from an attractively-designed speaker system taking up only two cubic feet of space as you once could from a corner horn standing four feet high. Today's bookshelf loudspeaker system is designed not only to sound good, but to add to the appearance of any room in which it's placed. There are a wide variety of bookshelf models in oiled or rubbed wood finishes, with a selection of attractive grille cloths. Or you can buy marble-topped or columnar models which serve as end tables in addition to providing stereo sound. There are even some mini-models which occupy one cubic foot of space or less and are designed to fit in with decors ranging from mod to Mediterranean.

One of the most important factors in playing records—not only in determining the sound quality of an audio system, but also in determining how long records will last—is the pressure, or tracking force, the cartridge and stylus exert upon the record. The less pressure, the less record wear and, often, the better the sound. In 1957, even the best cartridges used in the best arms exerted pressures of four grams or more. Today, even an ordinary automatic turntable with a good cartridge exerts pressures of 1½ grams or so; and better automatics and manuals can track as low as ¾ grams. That means records today can last two or three or more times longer than they once could—and they sound better each time they're played.

While the engineers were figuring out how to reduce tracking force, designers were busy reducing the size of turntables and arms, and both the size and weight of stereo pickups. The result is the automatic turntable, a precision-made record changer which fits conveniently on a bookshelf or in a cabinet, provides the convenience of automatic record changing and actually outperforms the bulky manual turntables of a decade ago. Today's streamlined automatic turntable takes up only a little more than one square foot of space, can be mounted in a pull-out drawer for convenience, or can sit on a shelf, hidden by a protective smoked plastic cover.

Of course, if you want the finest sound system available today regardless of cost, you can still find state-of-the-art manual turntables, full-size loudspeaker systems (including one 84 inches long and costing \$2100), separate preamps, and

the like. But convenience and compactness distinguish the more popular receivers and automatic turntables. Because there are fewer units to select and connect than there once were, the average music lover is able to put together his own component system in minutes, rather than hours. Because there are fewer connections, there are fewer cables to mar the appearance of a room. The few remaining wires can be tucked conveniently out of sight.

These days you don't have to be an electrical engineer, to buy or operate a high fidelity component system. You don't even have to be a millionaire to afford one. The beauty of today's stereo equipment is that the perfectionist can find in a component system the flexibility and control over the sound which emerges that he desires, while his wife can use the same system for quiet listening or background music when the girls play bridge. Today's stereo systems don't have to be played at top volume to sound good—though some males still like the idea of hearing 60 watts' output per channel in the loud passages of music. Stereo today sounds good even at very low levels.

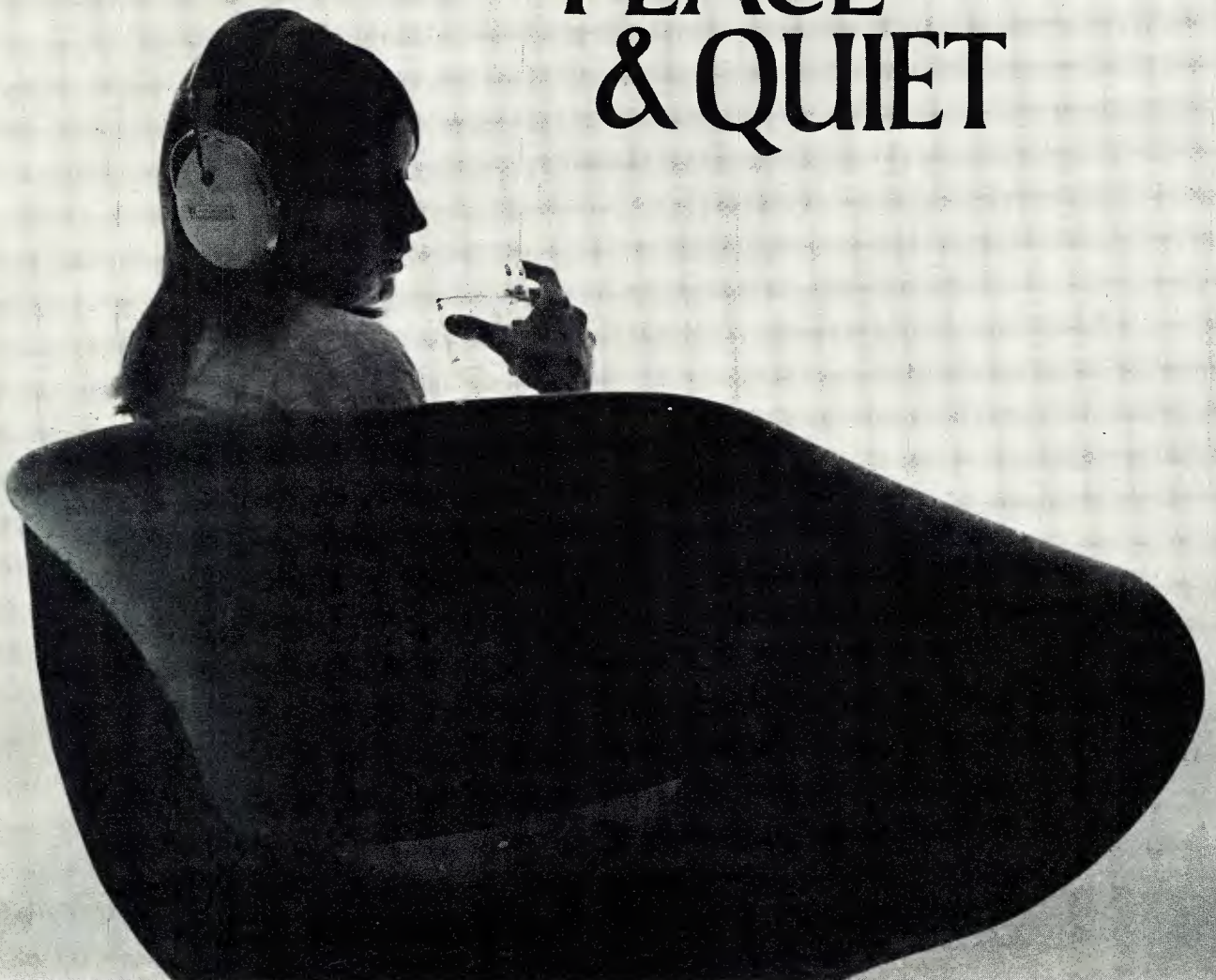

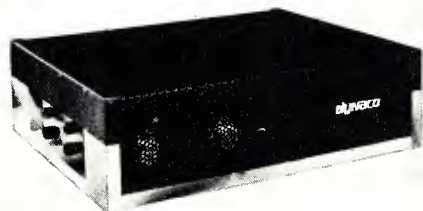
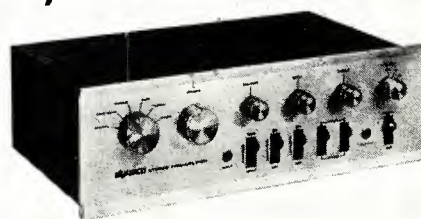

MEN OF HI-FI

FM

TODAY AND TOMORROW

FM listeners, reveling in the wide-range and noise-free sound that enhances the enjoyment of their favorite programs (and provides a source of clean off-the-air material for private tape recording), can rest easy. FM is not about to be cut back, or otherwise hampered in its continued growth—as it was in the conflict-ridden days of yesteryear. Not only has FM arrived as a consumer staple, but it still has many places to go, including outer space where it will serve as the carrier for satellite communications.

FM's pre-eminence as *the* high quality transmission medium is readily discerned. Consider some facts.

- Sales of FM only and FM/AM sets represent in dollar volume fifty per cent of all radio sales in the U.S.
- Today there are over sixty million FM sets in use. A major study of consumer buying habits recently reported that a stereo FM receiver was the number one answer to the question: "What luxury item do you intend to purchase first, after you have purchased what you consider the essentials?"
- In most major markets, FM's audience penetration has reached seventy per cent.
- By the end of 1971, over 1,000 FM stations will be broadcasting in stereo. Right now, there is a huge backlog of stations awaiting stereo transmitting equipment.
- Recent studies, and the consensus of insiders, indicate that FM will soon become the dominant radio broadcast medium. The heyday of AM is over. FM, already having outstripped AM technically and in terms of new communication uses, will—by the late 1970s—have beaten it commercially too.
- Beyond commercial broadcasting, FM's technical virtuosity has been an integral part of many recent electronic advances, including the spanning of the globe as the carrier wave for all satellite and space communication, the sound medium for the recent trip to the moon, satellite broadcasts in stereo, microwave relay communications, and tropospheric scatter transmission used by military networks.

FM AND STEREO

Although FM, from the time of its initial demonstration by inventor Edwin H. Armstrong (who earlier had invented the regenerative or feedback circuit, and the superheterodyne circuit that made modern radio and TV possible), was accepted by sound enthusiasts and the technically minded generally, its birth and growth were impeded by a maddening series of commercial and governmental setbacks. The "agony and the ecstasy" of FM's early days have been superbly narrated by Lawrence Lessing in his biography of Armstrong, *Man of High Fidelity*, now available in paperback for one dollar from the Armstrong Foundation, Box 211, Brooklyn, New York 11202. [Ed. Note: we heartily recommend Lessing's book as one of the best ever published about our field.]

There's no need here to detail FM's history, but an idea of what the new medium had to overcome can be gleaned from recalling such events as the time when its broadcast band was shifted and turned over to television, thereby rendering obsolete some 7.5 million sets overnight.

Despite this and other nightmares, FM prevailed through the 1950s and began showing genuine signs of ascendancy in the 1960s. A major breakthrough was the FCC decision (after interminable delays and debates) that resolved how FM was to be multiplexed, i.e., transmitted stereophonically. The FCC finally picked the GE/Zenith method, even though it was not considered, in some circles, technically the best solution. It did have one financial virtue for the FM medium in that its sub-carrier portion could be utilized to transmit private subscription music (SCA), a service that forms an important part of some FM stations' revenue.

Stereo, in any event, really put FM into the mass media orbit. Since no one has been able to separate sound from music, and since we normally listen to all sound stereophonically, even the most sonically illiterate have been going for stereo. All sound is usually improved by stereo because of the far greater information it provides for our ears. The eye can handle but one octave of information, but normal ears are so acute that they can process up to ten octaves of information. The ear can

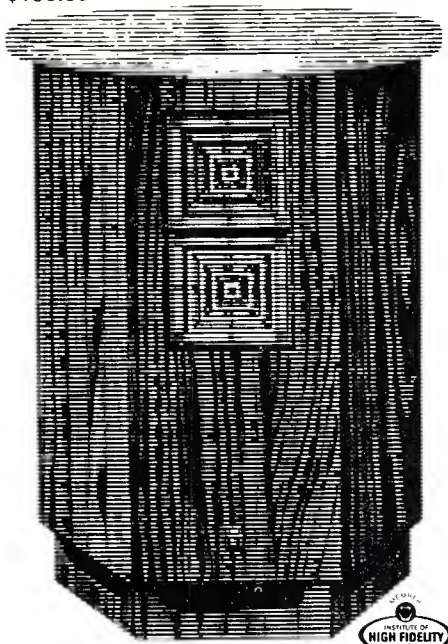

detect the most subtle differences in sound, and stereo FM provides not only a wide frequency range (FM ideally gives 50 to 15,000 Hz), but it gives us many important spatial-sonic clues too.

A good musical performance is, of course, enhanced by improved sound. Edward Tatnall Canby, one of America's leading record and music critics, summed up the current attitude of the musically literate when he said: "I, myself, am a music lover and a musician who is so thoroughly convinced of stereo's values in purely musical terms that I rarely hear any recorded music in other than the stereo form these days. When I listen to a monophonic disc now, it honestly sounds strange to me, false and lacking in realistic impact until, of course, I've readjusted my ears to its musical values."

Apparently, the general public agrees with Canby. FM stations, responding to the public rush for FM stereo tuner/receivers, are now going stereo at the rate of five a week.

Another important decision was the FCC order in 1965 (after years of debate), for the major broadcasters to schedule at least fifty per cent original programming in cities of over 100,000 population. Today, most FM stations are programming almost one hundred per cent original programming. Up to 1965 most major station complexes had their FM station simply mouth their AM programming.

In its early years, FM was usually a classical jukebox—when it was programmed independently—but with very few commercials. This is changing; today you will find the entire musical and programming spectrum on FM and an ever growing number of commercials.

Not surprisingly, AM radio is programming less and less music and more and more talk. In a major market like Chicago there is no all-classical programming on any AM station. And some FM listeners are complaining that they are being neglected because of the lesser amount of classical programming on FM. Actually, as FM has grown successful it has been accommodating itself to more "mass audience" tastes. Despite this, the abundance of high quality music available on *some* FM outlet in just about any locale is greater today than ever before.

FM AND THE CABLE

Without a doubt, one of the main future paths of FM lies in the direction of cable FM (CAFM), either as an independently set up service, or as part of a cable TV (CATV) system. The reason for cable, serving a large

community instead of an individually owned antenna serving one household, is simple. Color TV and stereo FM both demand much more in their transmission and reception than monochrome TV or monophonic FM—both being essentially line-of-sight media and both subject to essentially the same problem of “multipath degradation.”

Multipath degradation shows up as ghosts on your TV set, and is even more critical if you have a color TV set. In stereo FM reception, multipath degradation may be heard as uneven and fuzzy sound.

Our large cities, with an ever growing number of tall buildings and bridges, offer many problems to line-of-sight media and will continue to do so until we put our transmission equipment into the air via satellites. However, multipath degradation problems can be, and have been, solved by placing a high antenna in a special location and feeding the signals via cable into your home. Although the capital investment is considerable, particularly in highly urban areas, CATV and CAFM are today the fastest growing businesses in commercial broadcasting. This growth can be explained by the huge investment the American public has made in color TV sets and stereo FM receivers, combined with the obvious and dramatic improvement in reception afforded by a good cable system.

The cost of the equipment needed by a cable system—to pick up signals, sort them out, equalize and amplify them, reprocess them for each channel of a carrier system, send them out on the cable trunks which must include special boosters along the way—is considerable. It relates directly to the number of stations carried by the CAFM service. Hopefully, the future CAFM services will give us the entire FM band, i.e., all the stations we would normally receive in a given area. When this is done it will be a great boon to the relatively low-powered stations often located on the outskirts of large cities. For example, WDHA (Dover, N.J.), a popular station for hi-fi buffs in the New York City area, could be brought into the New York City area sounding as good as, or better than, any station transmitting directly from the Empire State Building.

Some CAFM services (such as in San Francisco) rescrumble many stations' signals and then rebroadcast them on unused parts of the FM band. This technique has often necessitated the publishing of a special guide to the rearranged FM band. Of course, such rescrumbling would be next to impossible in a market like the New York metropolitan area where the FM band is already very crowded.

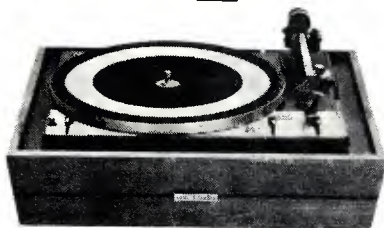

FM AND THE FUTURE

Beyond cable systems for improved local reception lies the promise of satellite systems for world-wide FM. Experts foresee the day when we will be able to tune to a satellite orbiting the earth, or hook into a cable system whose master antenna is receiving the satellite, and thus (either way) hear foreign programs—including live stereo concerts from the major music centers the world over. People living abroad will of course enjoy the similar treat of being able to listen to live stereocasts from Tanglewood, Aspen, Saratoga, Carnegie Hall. This internationalization of technical and cultural forces—despite present political and economic problems that obviate against it—is bound to occur. Also on the list of unexplored areas for FM listeners in the future is the simulcast concert. The marriage of color TV and stereo FM offers the serious music listener the best of two worlds. He will be able to listen to the sound of his FM stereo set and see the performance on his color TV set. These simulcasts actually have been tried—and with success. In the Boston area, for instance, the combined facilities of WGBH-TV and WGBH-FM have already demonstrated the feasibility of wedding the most advanced techniques of audio and video for the delectation of home audiences.

Looking even further into the (not too distant) future, we may have facsimile newspapers and magazines through the help of FM. Thirty-five years ago, in an experiment from the Empire State Building, Edwin Armstrong demonstrated that he could reproduce a facsimile of a page of the New York Times, along with two radio programs and various telegraphic messages—and broadcast all these signals simultaneously on a single FM carrier wave! The world still has a long way to go before it can catch up with the versatility, promise, and performance of FM.

Spotlight Rod Stewart

There seems to be something magnetic about the British popular singers in America. Once they are introduced to their friends and neighbors across the ocean, their popularity skyrockets. In the last couple of years, the list of British singers in America who have made indelible imprints on the American scene has grown increasingly. Should we be reminded that England has given us The Beatles, Joe Cocker, The Rolling Stones; Mary Hopkins, The Doors, and The Who; The Kinks and Eric Clapton; Hard Meat, Bloodwyn Pig, Led Zeppelin and Ten Years After; Mary Clayton, The Cream, Ginger Baker Air Force and Argent and John Mayall? Now, we must add to this prestigious list the name of Rod Stewart.

Roderick David Stewart was born January 10, 1945 in London, England of Scottish ancestry. At an early age, Rod became fascinated with the guitar. He states, "I just picked it up and there I was". His love for the guitar was greatly influenced by such country/western greats as Ramblin' Jack Elliott, the Carter Family and Darrell Owens.

Interestingly enough, Rod is a great admirer of soccer and played it well while in school. In fact, he had several offers to play it professionally. He played on the same schoolboy team as Ray Davies, who later became the leader of the Kinks. He holds such honors in the realm of soccer as being a member of the Schoolboy International Team and represented England in several international competitions.

It was not until several months of playing soccer semi-professionally that Rod decided to venture upon a career as an entertainer. Rod states: "I don't know how it happened really, I just started

doing it". His early endeavors as an entertainer included a tour of France and Spain with folksinger Wiz Jones. Those early days in Spain were not easy and Rod recalls that several nights he and Jones slept under the arches of a soccer stadium in Barcelona. The French portion of that tour was a little more profitable. He and Jones were able to make as much as 50 francs an hour. He muses that, "It wasn't bad sleeping on the beaches".

The real break for Rod came when he joined the Jimmy Powell and the Five Dimensions group and appeared with them at Ken Collyer's, an English Club. It so happens that another young group was appearing at the same club, the Rolling Stones. Rod's group played during the Stones' intermissions.

After Rod's hitch with the Jimmy Powell and the Five Dimensions group, which gave him the needed exposure, he landed a job with John Baldry's Steam Packet (it should be noted that Baldry is an "in" part of the English musical genre). At this time he also became a friend of Julie Driscoll.

Still searching for his sole identity, Rod joined an early version of Brian Auger and the Trinity and the Beck Group with which he was an integral part for two years. While with the Beck Group, he made seven American tours and two albums. Rod was not totally satisfied with himself and his work with the Beck Group. He states: "There was no balance within the Beck albums. It was all frantic and uptempo and impersonal and I couldn't stand that. When the group split up it was amenable to all of us. Ron Wood (Beck's bass player) is on both of my albums, playing bass and bottleneck guitar and has also joined Small Faces, as lead guitarist. We are both glad we made the transition."

Now, it can be rightfully stated that Rod Stewart has arrived. His first LP, Rod Stewart (Mercury SR 61237) launched him on a promising career as an entertainer and performer. His latest release, Gasoline Alley (Mercury SR 61264), is certain to establish him as one of the most inventive and talented artists around. His style and nuances are certainly indicative that he is a great admirer of the Ray Charles/Joe Cocker sound.

Upon hearing Gasoline Alley, Al Rudis, reviewer for THE CHICAGO SUN TIMES was prompted to write: "Add Rod Stewart to your list of immortal voices of today's music. Put him down next to Mick Jagger, Neil Young, Joe Cocker and Steve Stills".

Japan is coming on strong as a manufacturer of stereo component systems. Their production in 1970 will be close to 6,000,000, 35,000,000 transistor radios, and **10,000,000 tape recorders**. Almost all the major Japanese tape recorder manufacturers are producing four channel tape recorders. *Time* magazine has an impressive study which confirms FM GUIDE's study (and three other major studies on the tape recording industry) showing taping stereo FM radio is by far the biggest use of a tape recorder, cassette, or reel to reel. Even with fine microphones, and a very high quality tape recorder, consumer recorders cannot match the **expensive acoustics of a professional recording studio**, even though today's fine consumer recorders come close to matching standards of professional recorders—so people record stereo FM and record recorded sound that was already recorded in a professional sound environment.

Cassette recorders should aim marketing strategies towards stereo FM listeners. I have heard the quality of today's better cassette players—Wollensak, Fisher's Dolbized Cassette player, Harmon-Kardon, Advent's Dolbized cassette players, and they are surprisingly good.

The "Men of Hi-Fi" broadcast of Dynaco's compatible system was a big success: tremendous mail, 99 per cent of the listeners, by simply adding one or two speakers properly hooked up (write Dynaco or WNYC "Men of Hi-Fi" for instructions) reported great enhancement of sound.

Here are some typical quotes:

"I'm just writing to tell you what great success I'm having with the 'three channel' hookup you spoke about last night. Unfortunately I didn't have the rig hooked up during the show, but when I came home this afternoon, I hooked it up immediately. As soon as I turned the third speaker on, the walls of the room really seemed to fall away, and I indeed got the feeling of a new differentiation of the instruments that were playing. It was very similar from switching from mono to stereo with a normal two speaker set up, and when I turned the third speaker off, the music actually sounded dull, almost like mono! I think this was one of your best shows that I have listened to, mainly because it was something that the average person could try at home without really purchasing any new equipment (unlike four channel stereo). Congratulations again for a great show and thanks for presenting a great idea."

"Your record sounded like nothing I've ever heard as far as rear ambience is concerned. Alone, it was like any other stereo record through a headset."

"Well, I just wanted to let you know that it sounded just great. I couldn't believe my ears."

"I enjoyed your program on the Dynaco 3 channel stereo which was broadcast on July 26, 1970. It sounded so good that I'd like to know if the Dynaco record is available for sale." Answer—No.

"Men of Hi-Fi" will broadcast one of the first records created just for earphone listening. The record sounds better than adequate on two speakers, but on earphones they have a sound that **has all the realisms of four channel stereo and more.**

This 360-degree binaural sound is the way we normally hear. The records were produced by Robin Lanier, prominent audio expert and free lance writer in the field of Hi-Fi. A special super low noise tape recorder, custom built, was built by an engineer to lower noise levels which would have been oppressive with the super calm of binaural sound.

The broadcast will be at the usual time—10:00 to 11:00 P.M. Sunday evening, WNYC-FM, August 23. Give a listen if you want to hear some extraordinary sound.

WNYC-TV Channel 31, and WNYC-FM will collaborate on an hour long broadcast: produced by Dave Kapsack with the Institute of High Fidelity and yours truly, to highlight the New York Hi-Fi show at Westbury. The theme of the show is **DECORATING YOUR HOME WITH SOUND**. Several examples of four channel sound will be broadcast, along with **binaural sound—using the Dynaco method for the four channel sound so that as many people as possible can receive the broadcast simply by hooking up a third or fourth speaker a la Dynaco to a conventional stereo amplifier.**

This broadcast will be a first. A first in that it will be the first time that one stereo FM station will broadcast four channel sound in collaboration with one television station. San Francisco television station KPIX (Westinghouse) has already done it with two stereo FM stations just as "Men of Hi-Fi" did when it collaborated with two stereo FM stations interconnected, i.e., WNYC-FM with WKCR-FM broadcasting four channel sounds.

Television listeners (Channel 31) will be asked to turn down their audio if they care to hear the program in stereo or binaural sound, or listen to that part of the program broadcast in four channel stereo a la Dynaco.

The virtue of using the Dynaco system is that it is compatible and can be received in synthesized four channel stereo by the simple addition of a third or fourth speaker. **This can be achieved by properly hooking the third or fourth speaker with a conventional two channel stereo amplifier common to most stereo receivers and amplifiers.**

Some critics will complain that this is not true four channel stereo, i.e., four separate channels, but it is a remarkable enhancement of a surround sound effect. At the transmitting point it requires only a specially mixed tape or recorded sound source played with a conventional record player and/or cartridge and tape recorder. **At the receiving end it will require a third or fourth speaker properly hooked up. Your favorite Hi-Fi dealer will tell you how to do it. It's simple.** It requires a variable resistor (volume control) which you can get at any Hi-Fi parts store (50¢) and a third or fourth speaker. The broadcast will take place on Friday, September 18, from 8:00 to 9:00 P.M. on Channel 31, (Channel 3) on Cable TV, tied into WNYC-FM (93.9).

One of the virtues of this broadcast will be that it will be heard in the home. Four channel stereo (or surround sound) sounds best in an intimate environment, i.e., in the home and this is where it will be heard. **In my opinion, four channel synthesized sound** (surround sound) sounds far better in the home than even four separate channels in a large ambient atmosphere with too many people attending—typical of most **four channel stereo demonstrations that I have heard.** This is not to say that our goal for greater sonic realism should not be four channel or even eight channel or eventually binaural wallpaper. Let's have as our goal for the ultimate in sonic realism for 360-degree binaural sound. But I'm convinced that the increased ambient sound plus proper time delay is perhaps even more important than just more channels of information in the conventional listening environment.

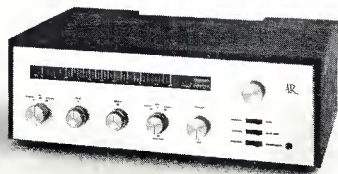

CONSENSUS: EQUIPMENT

W. ARKIN KANNER

This month's article is on receivers. The three units covered are in the \$400 range; \$70 separates the most expensive from the least. These three do not begin to exhaust the possibilities within this range. In the future, FM GUIDE will be running more articles on moderately priced receivers. These three units offer a variety of features; indeed no two of them offer the same combination. All three were used and played with in my home using an indoor antenna. I live in Manhattan where the multipath problem is a notorious (and literal) headache. I used the new Channel Master Chroma I indoor TV and FM antenna and got a significant improvement over the dipole I had been using. The antenna contains a solid-state variable inductance tuner which seems to add power to the signal.



AR Receiver

The AR Receiver is a piece of elegant simplicity from Acoustic Research, Inc. It's gold anodized front panel has been described as "almost austere."¹ The top half of the panel consists of a long, narrow tuning dial, stereo indicator, center signal meter, and a tuning knob. The dial is linear which means that the distance from one number to the next is equal. Al-

though it is not illuminated, tuning is quite easy. The dial pointer is quite visible. The red indicator goes on when a stereo program is tuned in. The meter only functions when the tuner section is being used, but when the receiver is used in other modes, the meter is lit as a pilot light. The bottom half of the AR Receiver is the main control portion. It consists of five knobs, three rocker switches, and a headphone jack. The knobs, from the left, are the selector switch which has only three positions: Phono, FM, and special for a high level input. (The AR Receiver is FM only; no AM is included). The next two knobs are for Bass and Treble. They are dual concentric with a clutch so that each channel can be adjusted separately. The fourth knob is a mono/stereo switch. This control has a middle position marked, "null." This electrically balances the signal going into each speaker; used in conjunction with the inner ring of this concentric control, it balances the system. The final knob is the on-off/volume control. The rocker switches are arranged one above the other on the right side of the receiver's panel. They are for: Normal/Tape; a muting switch called "hush," and a speaker/headphone switch. To the right of this last rocker switch, is the headphone jack.

The AR Receiver is rated at 60 watts RMS into a 4 ohm load, 50 watts into an 8 ohm load, and 30 watts into a 16 ohm load. AR derives its figures on the basis of RMS per channel, both channels driven. This is the way *The American Record Guide* evaluates amplifiers and they found the manufacturer's specs modest. *ARG* found, "... at 4 ohms, my sample delivered 90 watts per channel over a 50-20,000 Hz range, 60 watts at 8 ohms, and 48 watts at 16 ohms."² *ARG* also found IM distortion to be low, "At 1 watt levels, where most of everyone's listening is done, i.m. distortion is 0.34%. At 60 watts (again at 8 ohms) distortion is 0.51%. (And

again, at the rated 50 watts, the amplifier produces only 0.35% i.m."³ *Stereo Review* found even better figures. "IM distortion was under 0.1 per cent from 0.1 watt to well over 60 watts. At the rated 50 watt output, harmonic distortion was about 0.2 per cent at 20 Hz, falling to less than that between 35 and 20,000 Hz."⁴

If this praise looks familiar, you may have read the reports on the AR Amplifier which forms the amplifier of this receiver. The new portion is the tuner. Its performance measures up to the standard of the amp. *Stereo Review* discovered that, "The FM section's measured sensitivity was 1.8 microvolts (better than AR's specified 2.0 microvolts). Distortion was under 0.5 per cent—which is as low as our test equipment can measure. FM frequency response was -1 dB from 30 to 15,000 Hz. Stereo separation was better than 35 dB at middle frequencies. 22 dB at 30 Hz, and 18 dB at 10,000 Hz. AR rates the stereo separation at 5 to 15 dB better than those figures, but again limitations in our signal generator prevented us from verifying these specifications."⁵ *Audio's* tests for stereo separation also taxed their equipment, but their results came closer to AR's. "Stereo separation... exceeded 40 dB (and the limits of our equipment) at mid-band, and maintained a level of at least 30 dB all the way from 50 Hz to 10 kHz—about the best we have ever measured."⁶ *The American Record Guide* also found good stereo separation, "The stereo separation as received was 26 dB at midband—certainly adequate—but minor adjustment of the alignment brought it up to 40 dB. (which I suspect is the limit of my particular test generator).⁷ Obviously, this is a unit that stretches the limits of test equipment as *Stereo Review* concludes in its comment on the FM section of the AR Receiver, "In short, the AR tuner section is, in a number of areas, simply better than we can measure."⁸

In use I found the unit to be superb. It was simple to operate, a pleasure to use, and a delight to listen to. The controls work with precision. The flywheel tuning is positive and precise. *Stereo Review* found, "... the dial calibration to be extremely accurate; in fact, the dial pointer could be set to a desired station with the receiver off and the station would be correctly tuned when the receiver was switched on."⁹ That's precision! The only "extra" I missed on this unit was a provision for a remote set of speakers. The

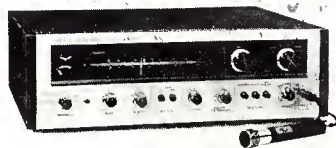
sound was clean and clear. When switching from my normal set to a new one there is usually a gap while I get adjusted to what the new one sounds like and then I can appreciate its virtues. With this receiver there was no such gap. Appreciation was immediate.

The price of the unit is \$430 with a black metal case or \$440 with a walnut case. As *Stereo Review* points out, that is not a steep price for the quality involved. "Considering that their amplifier at \$250 is a very good value, one is effectively buying a first-rate FM tuner for \$170 more. We have yet to find a component tuner at any where near that price that can compare to the tuner section in the AR Receiver."¹⁰

Pioneer SX-1500TD

The Pioneer SX-1500TD is an updated version of the 1500T Receiver. The new one is an AM/FM Stereo unit featuring a large array of controls. It sells for \$399.95 complete with piled walnut cabinet and dynamic microphone. More about that later.

The brushed, silvered front panel is attractively styled and arranged. The upper portion is devoted to the tuning dial with its signal strength and center channel meters and two knobs—one for tuning and the other for function selection. The dial is illuminated during operation and the numbers appear blue. In FM operation the center signal meter is also lit, but in all other uses the meter "disappears." That is, it goes black as the entire tuning portion is when the set is off. Each function is noted by a lit indication on the tuning dial. The different function possibilities light in different colors. Beneath the dial portion are the controls for the unit. At the left is the power switch which also controls the particular set or sets of speakers in operation. The 1500TD has provision for three separate pairs of speakers that can be

operated singly or in combination of A and B or A and C. There is also a provision for the speakers to be turned off entirely while the signal is still fed to the headphone jack immediately to the right of the speaker selector. To the right of this jack are the tone control knobs for bass and treble. They are of the dual concentric type with a slip clutch mechanism for control of one channel at a time or both together. Moving further to the right, filter buttons, both high and low. Another set of two knobs are to the right of the filters. These control the microphone level and the volume level/balance control. The latter is a concentric knob the inner ring for volume and the outer for balance. To the right of these knobs are another three pushbuttons: a loudness control, a muting switch, and a tape monitor switch. The last knob is the mode switch for selection of stereo, stereo reverse, either channel through both speakers, or L/R position for mono. At the far right is the microphone jack. The microphone can be used to make the 1500TD into a mini PA system. *Stereo Review* notes, "Although the microphone signal can

be mixed with any of the selected inputs, and appears as a mono signal at both speakers, it is *not* present at the tape outputs. / This means that it can not be used normally to record a commentary with another program. But the microphone could be useful for public-address installations that incorporate the SX-1500TD."¹ That is one of a few criticisms I have of the unit. If the manufacturer goes to all the trouble to provide a microphone circuit and a microphone, it would seem that it would be logical to make it available for the tape function.

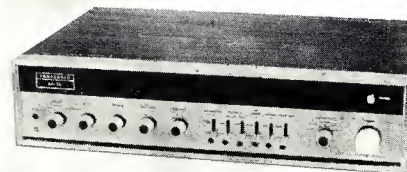
In terms of performance this unit is good. It is powerful, delivering, according to the manufacturer, 58 watts per channel continuous both channels driven. into 8 ohms. *Stereo Review*, "... measured the IHF sensitivity as 1.9 microvolts... [channel separation] was better than 35 dB at mid-frequencies and 17.5 dB at the extremes of 30 and 15,000 Hz. The FM frequency response was /0, -2.5 dB from 30 to 15,000 Hz."² *Stereo Review* also found, "The low-cut filter was no better than on the previous model, [1500T] with a rather gradual,

moderate action, but the high-cut filter was substantially improved. Its cut-off was an octave higher (6,500 Hz) and the slope was 12 dB per octave. We found it to be quite effective. The tone controls had good characteristics, especially in the bass, where considerable effect could be achieved below 200 Hz with no influence on higher frequencies."³

The Pioneer SX-1500TD is a nice unit; it sounds good to the ear. It has controls which permit for great flexibility. One feature of the unit I especially liked was the speaker connections. The speaker leads are screwed onto a separate plug-in terminal strip. The strip is then plugged into the rear of the receiver. These connections are easy and foolproof.

In conclusion, *Stereo Review* comments, "When using the Pioneer SX-1500TD, we found it to be all that was promised—an excellent, flexible, fine-sounding receiver."⁴

Panasonic SA-70

The Panasonic SA-70 is an AM/FM Stereo receiver. It is a long, low, sleek looking unit. Sitting on its rubber feet it rises only five inches above the surface on which it is placed. The front panel is brushed aluminum and it comes in a walnut cabinet. The list price for the SA-70 is \$349.95.

The manufacturer lists the output of the SA-70 as 32 watts per channel into 8 ohms RMS at at 1 kHz at rated distortion. That distortion, again at 1 kHz, is 0.8%. The spec sheet also lists these vital statistics: Frequency response for the power amplifier, 30-100,000 Hz -3dB; frequency response for the phono low, 30-20,000 Hz /3dB; frequency response for the auxiliary input 30-60,000 Hz /3dB. The tuner section of the SA-70 is listed as having an IHF sensitivity of 2.0 microvolts.

The upper portion of the front panel of the SA-70 is black when the

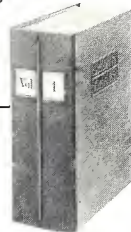

unit is off. When activated by the small silvered pushbutton in the right corner of the upper portion, a signal strength meter is revealed on the left side of the tuning dial. The tuning dial is long and uses Panasonic Lumina-Band tuning. As the tuning knob is turned, a green line lengthens as the knob moves it up the dial or shortens as the set is tuned to the lower end of the dial, until it disappears at the extreme left. This system is reminiscent of auto speedometers of some years back. Between the signal strength meter and the dial is a green light that is activated by the reception of an FM Stereo signal. Beneath this section are all the controls for the SA-70. A headphone jack is at the far left of the lower portion. Next to the jack is the speaker selector knob. The user can operate headphones only, main, remote, or main and remote simultaneously. The 'phone jack is live at all times. Then there are the tone controls. These are dual, concentric knobs for bass and treble so that each speaker can be adjusted independently. The next two knobs are for balance and volume. To the right of these are six lever switches. The first controls the loudness compensation. The next two are filters—one for low and the other for high. The next is a stereo/mono switch. The fifth is a muting switch for the FM section; The last is a tape/source switch. It is to Panasonic's credit that the normal position for all of these levers is the down position. Thus it is easy to see at a glance what is in and what is out. Moving further to the right is the function selector knob. This is used to select the desired source: Phono, FM Auto (which will automatically switch to mono if the signal is not strong enough for stereo or if the broadcast is in mono), FM mono, AM or Aux. The large knob all the way on the right is the tuning knob for the radio portion.

The SA-70 sounded quite good when I used it. The LuminaBand tuning was not only attractive, it was effective. That is, it aided in tuning by being highly visible. The FM was clear, strong and, to my ears, undistorted. When using a phonograph, the amplifier sounded quite clean. I found the SA-70 a pleasure to use and very easy to listen to and enjoy.

CLASSICAL CONSENSUS:

HANDEL: Jephtha. Reri Grist, Helen Watts; Marueen Forrester, Simon Woolf, Alexander Young; John Lawrenson; Amor Artis Chorale. English Chamber Orchestra/Johannes Somary, cond.

HIGH FIDELITY (6/70/94): Jephtha, the last of the oratorios, is not the most dramatic, but it is the most poetic, the most searching and, yes, the most religious. Well, while perhaps not the "definitive" recording of this great work, Jephtha is a fine present for all who cherish drama in song.

STEREO REVIEW (4/70/77): Here we have a splendid, splendid performance, one carefully prepared, sensitively conceived and beautifully sung and played. The Dolby-system reproduction is very good.

MOZART: Don Giovanni. Joan Sutherland, Pilar Lorengar; Marilyn Horne, Werner Krenn; Gabriel Bacquier, Donald Gramm; Leonardo Monreale, Clifford Grant; Ambrosian Singers. English Chamber Orchestra/Richard Bonyngé, cond.

HIGH FIDELITY (5/70/72): Auden's memorable line is apt: "See passion turned into rheumatism." The performance suffers from an excessive ingenuity of style. Bonyngé may be well read, but surely he misapplies his learning. Working under such inhibiting handicaps, the excellent cast does not do just to its task.

STEREO REVIEW (6/70/86): What this set offers for our edification, and frequent mystification, is a thorough rethinking of the vocal writing. I find the Bonyngized treatment infinitely less effective than the printed notation. Another issue may be raised on grounds that are logical rather than musicological: embellishments of this kind have their place in old-fashioned opera seria, but Don Giovanni is anything but that. A performance that keeps the listener in constant bafflement can hardly be expected to be transporting, and this one is not. Overall this performance is a rather bloodless affair, careful, thoughtful, and unexciting.

GRAMOPHONE (2/70/1312): This new Don Giovanni has many good things, a few not so good; but above all many different things. The first difference: that it is done with a chamber orchestra, probably very much the size of orchestra Mozart had in the small pit where Don Giovanni was originally heard, though in all likelihood somewhat smaller than Mozart himself would have regarded as ideal. The second big difference is that the score has been freshly edited. The third difference is that this set is complete, indeed more than complete. The set is mostly very well sung. A recording with many virtues, not the least of them being the exemplary clarity and truth of the recorded sound. But a lightweight version, not only in the desirable senses; Don Giovanni is a bigger work, and its theatrical blood runs stronger than this performance suggests.

FM GUIDE: Except for orchestral playing and recorded sound, this new recording is inferior. The liberties taken with the score in the name of a "new edition" are unjustified. I think, by either scholarship or dramatic expression. On the former, Mozart (following Gluck) frequently fought musicians and singers to keep unwanted interpolations and embellishments out of his music. The performance, directed by the editor of the "new edition", displays none of the spirit it must have taken to improve on Mozart. **SCHUBERT:** Piano Sonata in A, Op. Posth. **BEETHOVEN.** Andante favori. Misha Dichter, piano. *RCA LSC-3124*

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE: There is extraordinarily tough competition among the versions of the Schubert. Though [Dichter's] performances are the sort that should be encouraged, and the record is surely worth its price, if you are out to buy the Schubert I must suggest one of the others [R. Serkin and B. Hungerford].

HIGH FIDELITY (4/70/108): (Beethoven) One literally luxuriates in the beautiful pastel colors Dichter produces, while the music argument flows ahead in limpid, beautifully proportioned, completely natural fashion. (Schubert) For me, music of such stark originality and

emotional turbulence *needs* the exaggerated stress, and consequently, Dichter's reading strikes me as a bit bland and undertone.

STEREO REVIEW (4/70/96): Everything is in place but there is no lift, no charge, no special measure of thoughtfulness or insight.

SHOSTAKOVICH: Symphony No. 13, Op. 113 ("Babi Yar"). Tom Krause, baritone. Male Chorus of the Mendelssohn Club of Philadelphia. Philadelphia Orchestra/Eugene Ormandy, cond.

RCA LSC-3162

HIGH FIDELITY (6/70/77): Shostakovich's Thirteenth represents, in fact a nearly perfect setting of Yevtushenko's poems. Musically, the Thirteenth marks a new phase in Shostakovich's symphonic output. In comparing this new version by Ormandy with the recording by Kondrashin on Everest, one is immediately struck by the solemnity and grandeur of Ormandy's interpretation, next to which Kondrashin often seems rather glib. With the astonishing clarity and the perfect balance of its stereo sound, this recording should become something of a landmark.

STEREO REVIEW (6/70/73): It is, I find, a magnificent recording of an almost indescribably powerful work, certainly the most monumental artistic document of protest since Picasso's Guernica, and altogether worthy of comparison with that great painting. It is, as well, one of the most supremely telling musical works of our era. The performance is absolutely remarkable. I cannot imagine a better one, either in its details or as a whole.

TCHAIKOVSKY: Swan Lake. Moscow Radio Symphony Orchestra/Gennady Rozhdestvensky, cond.

Melodiya/Angel SRC-4106

AMERICAN RECORD GUIDE: If one's interest centers on Tchaikovsky's music, then one's choice must be the Russian performance, despite the extra cost. It is not merely the completeness of the Melodiya presentation, but Gennady Rozhdestvensky's vital conducting that most commends SRC-4106.

HIGH FIDELITY (4/70/79): This must rank as the Swan Lake for Tchaikovsky connoisseurs.

STEREO REVIEW (4/70/79): The Moscow Radio Symphony Orchestra under conductor Gennady Rozhdestvensky has met the challenge — they are out to win and win they do. The result is a full repertoire of thrills and shivers from magical start to wide-screen finish.
