SRDS Presents U.S. Farm Market Data Detailed by States and Counties

EXPLANATION OF CONTENTS

Farm Population

All estimates of farm population are as of January 1, 1958, and include all persons residing on farms. In general, these estimates are comparable to Department of Commerce rural farm population data. The sources of data used to prepare SRDS farm population estimates include the estimates prepared by the Bureau of the Census and the Department of Agriculture.

Farm Households

The SRDS definition of a household is identical to that used by the Bureau of the Census, namely, that a household is synonymous with an occupied dwelling unit. It consists of one or a number of persons living together under the same roof. It differs from the term "family" in that the latter consists of a group of persons living together who are related by blood, marriage or adoption. Thus a household may consist of one or more families.

The January 1, 1958, farm household estimates were obtained by using procedures similar to those used to estimate population and were keyed to government reports on household growth. Data on farm population were a basic part of the estimating procedures.

Farm Income

SRDS provides estimates for five kinds of farm income data. *Gross Farm Income* (1957) includes cash receipts from farm marketings, income in kind (value of items grown and consumed on the farm) and government payments. No expenses or taxes are deducted from the figure. *Gross Income per Farm* is the arithmetic mean obtained by dividing the Gross Farm Income (1957) by the number of Farms (1954).

The remaining three items of Farm Income are gross cash receipts expressed as *Farm Livestock Income*, *Farm Crops Income*, and *Farm Poultry Income*, which is a part of the total in Livestock Income. Livestock Income and Crops Income do not add up to the total shown as Gross Farm Income because the value of products grown and consumed on the farm, and government payments are not included.

1—SRDS estimates of Farm Crops Income include receipts from sales of horticultural specialties and forest products as well as field crops, vegetables, and fruits.

2—Farm Livestock Income consists of receipts from sales of domestic animals and by-products (wool, pelts), poultry and dairy products.

3—Poultry Income covers the sales of chickens, eggs, turkeys, and other poultry products.

Farm Poultry Income, which is a part of Livestock Income is provided for each state.

The sources of data for Farm Income were the 1950 and 1954 Censuses of Agriculture and the Department of Agriculture current estimates of cash receipts by source, government payments, and income in kind.

Total Farms, 1954

These are taken directly from the 1954 Census of Agriculture. "Places of 3 or more acres were counted as farms if the annual value of agricultural products, exclusive of home-garden products, amounted to \$150 or more. Places of less than 3 acres were counted as farms only if the annual sales of agricultural products amounted to \$150 or more."

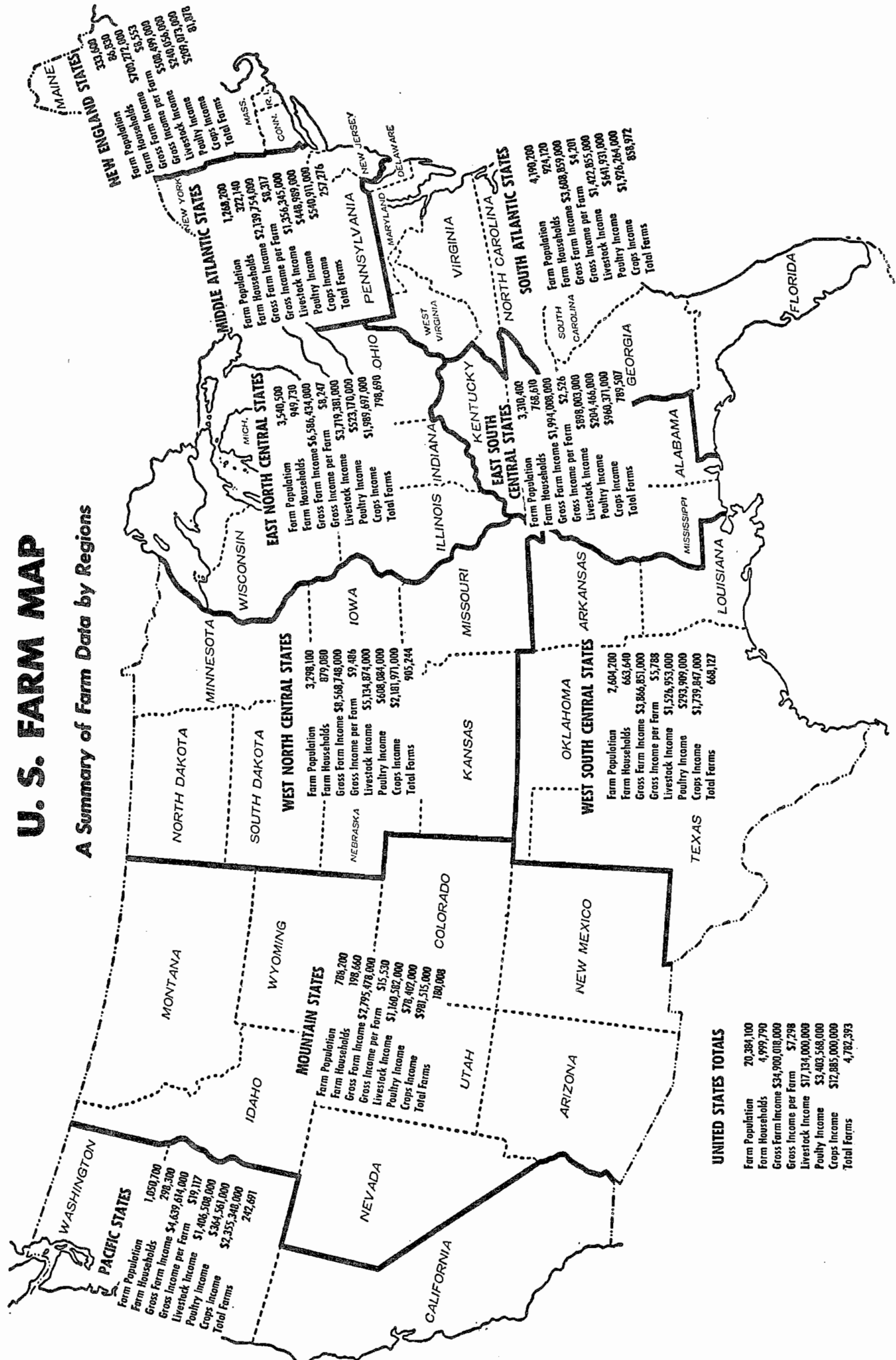
