Super Entertainment Season Starts on the Air and Screen

BOMBS may fall, destroyers may be traded, and Senators may argue, but neither heaven, hell nor high water can stop the avalanche of good entertainment rushing toward the great American audience.

Already Charlie McCarthy is back in stride, and the "First Nighter" has made his appearance at "The Little Theater Off Times Square." Bob Hope and his spitfire gags are with us. So is "Those We Love," which will cause wide rejoicing. Kate Smith is back with a full hour of variety entertainment and more stirring "God Bless America" solos.

On the screen, scheduled for release during the next ten days, are: "Before I Die"; "Strike Up the Band," with Mickey Rooney and Judy Garland; "Knut Rockne—All American," starring Pat O'Brien; "Spring Parade," with Deanna Durbin; "They Knew What They Wanted," with Carole Lombard and Charles Laughton; "Brigham Young," with Tyrone Power and Linda Darnell; "Rangers of Fortune," with Fred MacMurray and Ellen Drew; "The Westerner," with Gary Cooper; "The Thief of Bagdad," with Sabu; "The Great Dictator," with Charlie Chaplin.

THE GIRL ON THE COVER: When M-G-M announced that it would film the famous novel "Escape," an industry-wide search for a star to play the role of Emmy Ritter followed, with Nazimova eventually getting the part. But there was never a question as to who should play the part of Countess Ruby von Treck. Norma Shearer was born to the part of the gentle, American-born wife of the nobleman. Miss Shearer was one of a family of three, born in Montreal, Canada. Her sister, Athole, is married to movie director Howard Hawks. Her brother, Douglas, is chief recording engineer at the M-G-M studios. Her people, for many years, have been leaders in the development of Montreal's cultural and industrial life. Andrew Shearer, her father, was a prominent sportsman and president of a large lumber and contracting firm, and it was only in the press of

difficult financial troubles which followed the World War that he consented to let Norma and her mother go to New York to seek a place on the stage. Nine days after their arrival in New York, Norma did get a minor part, but when the play closed, her streak of luck seemed to have ended. Finally she obtained a few important parts, which led to a contract with M-G-M. General production manager at M-G-M at that time was Irving Thalberg, and while Norma admits that it was love at first sight on her part, it was four years later that their marriage occurred. It was a colorful marriage, and the couple, working together, proved that marriage and careers could mix. The case of Bill Holden is one of the cockeyedest in a cockeyed business. His studio says things are going to be different from now on and that the boy will be done all right by, but since he's been in the movies Mr. Holden has taken a worse beating from life than he suffered in "Golden Boy." The Golden Boy has been paid in pennies. His stand-in made more money than he did. Of course, however, there are two sides to the story.

Bill Holden is pay dirt in any show, but no young actor ever has had such stories in so short a time. Mr. Holden was a gamble and, times being what they are, the movies do not gamble millions any more. There are those who will say Mr. Holden is the luckiest man alive. Others will say he's been pushed around. Here's his story and you can judge for yourself.

He was born William Franklin Beedle in O'Fallon, Illinois, April 17, 1918. His father, a chemist, moved his family to Pasadena, California, when Bill was four. There was nothing unusual about Bill as a boy. He was not brilliant or dumb. He was just a run-of-the-mill fellow. He wanted to be a chemist, but at Pasadena Junior College he played in a school show just for the fun of it. It was a two-bit role and he acted the part of an old man, whiskers and all. Milton Lewis, Paramount scout, spotted him and the next day Brother Beedle was given a contract. It was one of those "beginner" things and called for possibly \$50 a week. Now, fifty bucks a week isn't peanuts for a kid. But wait a minute.

Bill's screen test was filed away, his name was changed and he began hanging around. He didn't even get extra parts.

Meanwhile, Columbia had sunk a bankroll in Odets' "Golden Boy" and was looking for a new face to play it. There was a lot of ballyhoo about it. Hundreds of tests were made. The studio also was seeking a girl to play the "Golden Boy's" sister. In the natu-

The 'Golden Boy' of 'Our Town'

Bill Holden's road to screen success has been easy so far—but he has his troubles, too!

IF "OUR TOWN" is not the best movie I've ever seen, then I'm still too much under its spell to remember any better. Which brings us to the strange tale of Bill Holden, the high-school baseball pitcher in "Our Town," who loved the land and became a farmer and father, and the kind of solid, God-fearing American citizen understood by no people except Americans.

Mr. Holden is the Golden Boy of Hollywood, public Cinderella man number one, but actually he's too poor to get married and between pictures, until recently, he had to work in a fertilizer factory for his bread and butter.

The movies have a trite way of ex-

plotting their young hired hands as typical American boys. Of course, there's no such thing as a typical American. The melting-pot doesn't spew out just one pattern. But if American boys have any things in common they are poverty, pride and ambition. And that makes Mr. Holden the same sort of fellow as about ten million other Americans around the age of twenty-two. Mr. Holden is broke and in debt. That makes him a typical American boy. Oh, I don't mean he misses meals. He may have postponed a few in his life, but now he eats on time. But there are boys in our town of Old Lyme, Connecticut, who make more money than Mr. Holden.

ral course of events they borrowed some tests from Paramount. Among those was one of Margaret Young. Columbia thought perhaps she might be a find, so they looked her over. They looked at her for just a minute and then sent for the boy who had made the test with Miss Young. He was Holden. Bill bet a friend \$5 that he wouldn't get the role.

So Mr. Holden became the Golden Boy. Columbia bought half of his contract. Paramount made a profit, and Bill Holden was starred with Barbara Stanwyck and Adolphe Menjou in his first show. Now, gentlemen, there's a record. In his first professional appearance this boy worked in one of the biggest hits of the year. Mr. Holden was making about \$50 a week. His stand-in was getting a hundred. After "Golden Boy," he was farmed out to Warners' for "Invisible Stripes," and then he made "Those Were the Days" for his home studio.

Hollywood was talking about Holden, but didn't see much of him because he couldn't afford to go out.

When Sol Lesser selected him for a lead in "Our Town," the town gasped. Santa Claus must be his patron saint. The critics went into spasms over "Our Town," and Bill was upped to about \$150 a week and cast in "Arizona." Now he's doing "I Wanted Wings."

Mr. Holden said, "I want more dough."

His present salary is reported to be either \$200 a week or \$350 a week. Neither is any money in Hollywood. RKO is reported to be after him for "Kitty Foyle."

Great day in the morning! Three of the greatest roles of all times and yet he can't afford a big car or a wife.

WELL get to that love business later. Let's look at the studio's side. Mr. Holden has never made a killer-diller for his home studio. He's made only one show for the home folks and it was fairish. If a rookie comes to the big league and knocks a homer in the World Series, as Holden did in "Golden Boy," there's no hard-headed reason why he should be given a long, fat contract. He might strike out the next time. Young actors and young ball players are gamblers. Paramount has been playing them close to the chest. That's one reason Paramount has been successful recently while some other studios were taking a licking. You might argue that "Our Town" should have convinced Paramount that Holden is tops. Perhaps so, but remember that this boy has clicked in great stories. Great actors are the ones who can carry weak stories. That's why there are so few great actors. Hollywood pays off on the long haul. Mr. Holden hasn't made the long haul yet.

Artie Jacobson of Paramount, who gave Bill his first break after the scout rounded him up, is the man who spotted Ardis Ankerson in New York. Miss Ankerson was born on the island of Negros, in the Philippines, and Jacobson took her to Hollywood, where she became Brenda Marshall. That's another favor Jacobson did for Holden, because reports insist that Holden and Brenda Marshall are in love. Mr. Holden was asked if he expected to marry her and he said, "Marry? Why, I can't even support myself, let alone Brenda."

Now, remember that when Holden is not working he doesn't get paid. He stays busy now, but until recently he went home during lay-offs and worked for \$30 a week in a fertilizer factory. He simply couldn't afford not to work. Last Christmas, rumor has it, his gifts to some executives at Columbia and

Paramount were small bags of fertilizer.

Holden is one of those fellows who gush personality and pep. He likes a good joke, but is not a practical joker, thank heavens. Actors who give hot-foots and act like juveniles in other ways are bores. Holden's hair is straight and stringy and simply will not stay put. He hasn't been in the business long enough to be spoiled. He is a rather gentle, good-natured fellow.

Columbia insists that he was so young in "Golden Boy" a make-up man had to put false hair on his chest. They'll do anything for a line in Hollywood. At the Hollywood Athletic Club, where Mr. Holden took boxing lessons for "Golden Boy," they say they had to shave the hair off his chest. There's nothing glamorous about hair on the chest and, too, it doesn't photograph well.

As the Golden Boy, Mr. Holden had to be a prize-fighter and a violinist. He studied the violin when he was a kid, but had to learn how to handle it again. Not that he played it in the picture. Good gracious, no! He merely went through the motions.

He also had to drop his western drawl and pick up a soft Italian accent. He had to learn how to box. It was hard work. However, he says his hardest jobs were having his hair waved and kissing Barbara Stanwyck.

The make-up department used bobby pins and curlers to make Mr. Holden's hair wavy for "Golden Boy." "Suppose somebody sees me in here," he protested.

It is funny to think of the tough Golden Boy sitting in a beauty parlor with bobby pins in his hair. But the height of something or other came one day when Mr. Holden had to rehearse several kissing scenes with Barbara Stanwyck. After he finally kissed her to the satisfaction of the director, Mr. Holden walked over and sat down by Bob Taylor, who had called for his wife.

"Whew!" said Mr. Holden. "That's the hardest day's work I ever did."

A guy who says kissing Miss Stanwyck is work doesn't deserve big dough. He ought to pay for the privilege.

He calls Miss Stanwyck the Queen, and says without her help he could not have succeeded in "Golden Boy."

Years ago he played hooky one day from grammar school and the truant officer nabbed him. Bill had no alibi. The officer confronted him in front of his parents and put him on the spot. He asked Bill if he had any outside activities.

"I sing in a choir," said Bill, hopefully.

The officer said that was swell and that a boy who sang in the choir must be a pretty good fellow. He let Bill off and the boy's parents didn't scold. But they saw to it that he sang in the choir.

When he first came to Hollywood he shared a small furnished house with a friend, but recently he moved into a four-room bungalow, where he lives alone. It's cheaper that way, he says. Also he's on location a lot and sees no need of maintaining a house in Hollywood when he's not there. He cuts every corner possible. One night he spent \$15 and rebuked himself for being extravagant. He figured he could have bought three thousand shells for his .22 rifle with that \$15.

Holden is enthusiastic about guns and is a good shot. While making "Arizona," down in Arizona, there was a scene in which a number of candles were suspended from an old wagon wheel. After the scene was shot Bill spun the wheel and knocked off the candles from a hundred yards.

Such shooting endeared him to the natives. He acted like home folks at Tucson. He explored the country and enjoyed life. It was down there, working in that \$2,000,000 epic, that Mr. Holden got the idea he wanted to play Billy the Kid. We'll bet he never gets his wish, because he wants to play the Kid as the Kid really was, a cowardly rat who died with a slug in his stomach. Hollywood will not let such a valuable property as Mr. Holden play the role of a rat. If they do the Kid at all—you just watch—he'll be portrayed as a poor, misunderstood youngster instead of a feeble-minded butcher.

EVERYTHING Holden does he does with vitality. He plays hard, eats hard and sleeps hard. He likes to excel in everything he does—badminton, eating, shooting, squash. In Arizona he fell in love with horses and is determined to become an excellent horseman.

His business is handled by a manager who allows the boy \$20 a week for pin money. To augment his spending allowance, he rents out his Ford at a dollar a night when he's not using it.

Holden came from good American stock. His father works every day and is neither rich nor poor. Bill's mother takes care of his fan mail and

takes her work very seriously. She gets indignant at the mush letters. Recently, Bill got a letter from a "former fan" that took him apart. Mrs. Beedle got "riled" and wrote a blistering reply. Bill happened to hear about it and persuaded her not to mail it.


He is exactly six feet tall and weighs one hundred and sixty-five. He's robust, all right. While doing "Invisible Stripes" with George Raft, he hung a shiner on Raft. He didn't know how to pull his punch. It takes a good man to hit Raft.

Mr. Holden blushes when he recalls that he was named the ideal Leap Year date by a sorority. He has the distinction of having given Bonita Granville (now there's my choice of a real actress) her first screen kiss. Miss Granville says she doesn't remember how it felt. Her corset was hurting at the time.

Brenda Marshall has no such complaints.


Paramount says there's going to be an adjustment in Holden's salary. When he gets the raise, it's a pretty safe bet that he will marry Miss Marshall.

Paramount's chief: Frank Freeman

Here's a tour built to order for radio-movie enthusiasts—a tour of Paramount, the lot with a corner on the talents of radio's big names

THE studio gate through which radio-listening visitors to Hollywood gaze most wistfully is the wrought-iron gate of Paramount Studios, nestling snugly against the RKO lot on Marathon Street, where most of the great names of radio who have entered pictures are under contract.

In "dressing-room row," the long, gray three-story building near the main gate, visitors may find such stars of the air as Bing Crosby, Bob Hope, Fred Allen, Jack Benny, Dorothy Lamour, Eddie "Rochester" Anderson, Charles Boyer, Cecil B. DeMille, Mary Martin, Dick Powell, Basil Rathbone, Lillian Cornell and a host of others.

Paramount was a pioneer in using big radio names for picture-making, an innovation which has paid Paramount big dividends. But this is not the first innovation introduced by Paramount, with its long and fine history in filmland. Founded in 1912 by Adolph Zukor as "Famous Players Corporation," the "Paramount" was added later when the studio decided not only to produce films but to distribute them to theater-owners as well. Famous Players made the films, Paramount sold them. A short time later, still another precedent was set when Paramount bought and built theaters of its own as an outlet for their films and pioneered the theater-chain business.

Today the water-tank near the west wall of Paramount Studios, with its familiar emblem of the cloud-girdled mountain-peak with the banner, Paramount, emblazoned upon it, is visible from any spot in the twenty-seven-acre enclosure which is Paramount Studios today as a symbol of its contributions to a leading American industry.

From the main gate of the studio visitors may see the maze of buildings which constitute a \$6,000,000 investment in physical property alone. There are, in all, some fifty-eight buildings within the carefully guarded compound, and a close-up of what goes on behind those gates is not a close-up of gaiety and glamour as might have

been expected. The impression, quite on the contrary, is of a giant industrial plant in which every cog is meshing accurately. Which is the correct impression.

Each year, from forty to seventy pictures are made on this lot. This year, thirty-four of the films being made there will cost in excess of \$25,000,000. The daily pay-roll, varying with the production schedules, is never less than 2500 workmen, often more than 5000. There is nothing frivolous about figures like these.

The first building visitors entering through the main gate see is the low, yellow stucco administration building, with its cheery red-tile roof. It is here that Frank Freeman, guiding light of Paramount production, has his office, and just under his window, in the garden, is a special pen built for his pet boxer pup. Once Freeman, who likes soft drinks and is one of the few Hollywood executives who does NOT play golf, was a theater-operator down south. He attributes his success to the fact that he knows at first hand what theaters have to have in a picture to make customers like it.

THE writers' and directors' building, a yellow stucco, four-story building which towers over the low administration building, is just to the right of the office annex, and it is here that such Paramount writers as Frederick Hazlett Brennan, popular screen and magazine writer; Preston Sturges, writer-director responsible for "The Great McGinty"; Charles Brackett, Billy Wilder, Frank Butler, Virginia Van Upp and Frank Wead turn out their scripts. Here, also, is the headquarters for Paramount's directors—such megaphonists as Stuart Heisler, James Hogan, Louis King, Mitchell Leisen, Joseph Santley, Victor Schertzinger.

This building is located convenient to the administration building so that writers and directors may be easily contacted by producers while films are being shaped up. The producers—men like Cecil B. DeMille, William LeBaron (who is also Freeman's

right-hand man), Edward H. Griffith, Henry Hathaway, William A. Wellman—at Paramount have their offices in the administration building. The administration building also houses the publicity department, presided over by Cliff Lewis, sun-tanned, sports-loving executive who rose from the ranks in a single decade.

To the left of the administration building is the dressing-room building. Once this unpretentious pile gave shelter to such bright names of the movie world as Gloria Swanson, Wallace Reid, Wallace and Noah Beery, Marie Dressler, Charles Chaplin, Douglas Fairbanks, Mary Pickford, Nita Naldi, Thomas Meighan.

Current occupants of "dressing-room row" are worthy successors to such names. Besides the long list of radio celebrities already named, there are Claudette Colbert, Fredric March, Fred MacMurray, Gary Cooper, Akim Tamiroff, Brian Donlevy, others.

Behind the dressing-room building is a yellow building which houses the "still" department, and three smaller buildings housing, in turn, the cutting-room, the studio projection-room, and the private projection-room.

Beyond this cluster of buildings—and visible from the main gate—are five fifteen concrete buildings, monolithic cubes of concrete, heavily walled against heat and noise. These, spotted all over the lot, are the sound-stages. In between them are the open sets where outdoor scenes are made on contrived sets. A street of New York tenement houses may stand next door to a snow-covered stretch of Canadian wood in this man-made fairyland. Most elaborate of the sets are those used on the DeMille three acres, where

"North West Mounted Police" is just being completed.

The visitor, by this time, has circled the lot and is within a stone's throw of the main gate. Here is that great barn-like testimonial to Hollywood's sentimentality—the building in which DeMille made "The Squaw Man," first feature film to be made in Hollywood twenty-four years ago. There is no reason for its being kept there, DeMille admits, except sentiment, although it's used as a gymnasium by those few newcomers to the lot who cannot yet afford their own gymnasium.

It is significant of Hollywood—and of the historic Paramount lot in particular—that these youngsters explain, "We're just using it as a gym temporarily . . ."



"THE HOWARDS OF VIRGINIA" tells of simple folk of history

"Foreign Correspondent"

Cast: Joel McCrea, Laraine Day, Herbert Marshall, George Sanders, Albert Basserman, Robert Benchley, Edmund Gwenn, Harry Davenport, Eduardo Ciannelli, Eddie Conrad and a cast of eighty-three. A Walter Wanger-United Artists picture, produced and directed by Alfred Hitchcock, who also directed "Rebecca." Original screen play by Charles Bennett and Joan Harrison, with dialog by James Hilton and Robert Benchley.

ALFRED HITCHCOCK has delivered herewith a speedy, two-hour-long melodrama of the first water about an American police reporter who almost solves and stops the threatening war in Europe by his dogged nose-poking into the intrigue behind the scenes. Originally planned to be called "Personal History" and based on Vincent Sheean's book of his experiences as a European correspondent, the resultant drama of excitement and crackling surprises is so far removed from the novel that it is not even mentioned in the credits.

It is just as well, however, for the speedily changing scene overseas is rapidly outdating Sheean's work every twenty-four hours. The story, which will not be told sufficiently here to spoil the climax, is this:

Joel McCrea, American newspaper police reporter, is assigned by his dissatisfied publisher, Harry Davenport, to go to Amsterdam and get some honest-to-goodness news of the European power politics. McCrea's approaches as a novice foreign correspondent are unique but effective. He is assigned to interview Van Meer (wonderfully played by Albert Basserman and spontaneously applauded), a Dutch cabinet minister who holds a key to peace in his brain. Van Meer, in his endeavors, is seemingly being assisted by peace frontist Stephen Fisher (Herbert Marshall), who has a lovely daughter, Carol (Laraine Day), whom McCrea meets and woos at once.

In an attempt to query Van Meer, McCrea attends a peace meeting the minister is supposed to address but at which he never arrives. The mystery begins. Soon after, the Dutch cabinet meets, but en route to its meeting "Van Meer" is assassinated before McCrea's eyes. But McCrea finds out that a double instead was shot, and Van Meer is being held prisoner in an old windmill. Here the drama is stark and scary. McCrea attempts a rescue, but Van Meer is spirited away. Then, suddenly, McCrea detects a falsity of Fisher, and immediately bad men Ciannelli and Edmund Gwenn try to do away with the reporter (while the audience hangs onto its seats in terror!). McCrea traces the kidnaped Van Meer and conquers over all.

THE Ritz Brothers, ably supported by the Andrews Sisters, are the main props of "Argentine Nights," which has Constance Moore and George Reeves as an amusing love interest in a film which, if you like wacky comedians and jive-singing comediennes, will delight you.

A gang of American entertainers are stranded at a hotel in an isolated part of the Argentine, with prospects of their stay there being a long one due to a total lack of guests. "THE Howards of Virginia" is one of those magnificent pictures which tell a human, understandable story against the backdrop of history.

Wisely, director Lloyd focused his cameras not upon the Jeffersons and the Hamiltons and the Franklins in telling his story but upon those simple people who produced the Jeffersons and the Hamiltons. The great events leading to the American Revolution are mirrored in the lives of Matt Howard (Cary Grant) and his wife, the former Jane Peyton (Martha Scott). Matt is a Virginia backwoodsman. Jane Peyton is the belle of Williamsburg, daughter of the aristocratic and landed Peyton family. The leveling of great wealth and extreme poverty in the Howard family is a smaller version of the leveling of classes which gave birth to the new nation.

WHEN they tossed Bing Crosby into "The Road to Singapore" with Bob Hope, he astonished everyone on the lot by out-Hoping the King of ad-libbers himself. So, director Victor Schertzinger, who dreamed up that little fun fest, decided to toss Bing into a film with Oscar Levant, whose acid remarks on "Information, Please" have made him almost a Broadway legend. What happens? 

MOST common, and most vicious, of the legends told about Brigham Young is the one about the chalk-mark he was supposed to make on the door of the apartment of the wife he intended to visit on a certain night. The best refutation of such calumny is the character of the man himself, for it is beyond credence that a man of his dignity, courtesy, refinement and personal integrity ever could

be guilty of such an indelicate gesture! Besides which, what possible necessity could there be for it?

Stupidest of the legends is the one about the lavish Gardo House, commonly called the Amelia Palace, being built especially for his wife, Amelia, because she was "the favorite." I say it is stupid because records prove the building was not even completed until after Grandfather's death, and that Amelia and another wife lived in it then only long enough to clear title to it!

The third well-known legend concerns the "secret underground passage" which Grandfather was supposed to use (a) when hiding from raids on his life for practising polygamy; or (b) as a convenient route to Amelia's home. It's a good story either way, but unfortunately recent excavations, which disclosed the existence of such a passageway, proved it to be only part of the old canal which was used

to carry water to various sections of the rapidly growing city. Such a dull climax for such an exciting story!

Typical of Grandfather's love of children and his generosity was the day he took two of his daughters shopping. With them was one of their little playmates, and as the storekeeper unwound the bolt of brown velvet for their new capes, Grandfather noticed her eyes grow big with suppressed longing.

"**B**ROTHER HASLAM," he said. (All Mormons address each other as Brother or Sister.) "I wouldn't be surprised if Clarissa would like a new brown velvet cloak too. Cut off a length for her."

One of the most cherished keepsakes in the family is a lovely old wax doll which still wears the fashionable clothes (including a "modesty" petticoat copied from one of Aunt Amelia's) made for her by her tiny owner. The

doll was a bribe for a trip to the dentist. For some time Grandfather had pulled one of his daughter's baby teeth whenever necessary by the ingenious method of giving her a piece of taffy to chew. Invariably the loose tooth would get stuck in the candy and poof! the extraction was accomplished under the pleasantest of circumstances.

One of her double teeth, however, proved stubborn and a dentist was indicated. Frightened, the child clung to Grandfather's coat tails, crying that she wanted her father to take care of it. Finally she agreed to go to the dentist when Grandfather promised her the choice of any doll which had just arrived in a shipment of merchandise from the East.

Nowadays we are inclined to think of child psychology as something very new, yet Grandfather seems to have been well versed in its application.

The agent promptly offered it to Vick Chemical, which said it was definitely interested. Time was reserved on CBS. Talks about terms started. Then two obstacles loomed. First, there was a mix-up about starting date and restrictions as to the manner of the program's presentation. Then the news leaked out, and certain big-shots of the movie company involved, who hadn't previously been consulted, started yelling. They yelled because they knew they had millions of dollars tied up in "Gone With the Wind." Already it has grossed millions, and they know that more millions are coming. These big-shots claimed that a radio program would hurt the movie box-office receipts. They claimed it would hurt book sales. "If," they argued, "we already have a sure thing, why take a chance?" Unwilling to give up, Vicks and its agents had conferences far into several nights. But nothing could be done to bring 1940's best entertainment to the air. As far as the near future is concerned, it is off—but positively.



Meet the Parker Family—
and hear the pulsebeat
of down-to-earth America

THE quiet, chuckling sort of amusement found only in commonplace things is the kind of amusement which greets listeners to "The Parker Family" (NBC) each Sunday night. Here is a family of average Americans encountering the average difficulties which confront the average household. Since July 7, 1939, the Parkers have been bringing their home into thousands of our homes, and it is a tribute to the human quality with which they

invest each performance that listeners never tire of them. Motivating character for most of the action is seventeen-year-old Richard (Leon Janney), in whom listeners frequently recognize themselves at seventeen. The difficulties which confront Richard—and tragic they can be, too—are matters having to do with getting Dad's car for an important evening or earning a quick couple of dollars to take the best girl to a dance. Father Parker

(Jay Jostyn) is recognizable for most listeners, too. Lovable, forgetful, he is the type of father whose pretense at sternness to maintain discipline fools no one—least of all, Richard. Mother Parker (Linda Carlon) is an understanding soul who understands that there is little difference—except in years—between Richard and Father. Sister Nancy (Mitzi Gould) has her troubles with romance, too, and an occasional sister-brother spat crops up

between her and Richard as such quarrels occur at the best-regulated hearthside. Elly (Pat Ryan) is the charming, schoolgirl friend of Richard's. Their romance is certain to bring back nostalgic memories of almost forgotten puppy-loves. In all, "The Parker Family" (Sunday night, NBC, 9:15 EDT, 8:15 EST, 8:15 CDT, 7:15 CST, 9:15 MST, 8:15 PST) is a sympathetic, chuckle-provoking portrait of home life in a great democracy.

"WHO woulda thought it?" That's the startled question radio listeners asked themselves after hearing the first airing a few months ago of "Truth or Consequences" (formerly on CBS, now heard over an NBC network every Saturday).

Here was a breath of the living past, the old parlor game come to life again! The game we used to play when we went to kid parties in knee pants and blushing countenances. To hear that lively old game revived and rejuvenated for radio—well, who would have thought it?

Ralph Edwards is the answer. The twenty-seven-year-old announcer ac-

tually got the idea at a house party, when the grown-ups joined a group of youngsters in a session of "Truth or Consequences," and had more fun than the kids. If the old-fashioned stunt was good enough for modern adults at a party, it was good enough for radio. Ralph Edwards proved it by turning the idea into one of the maddest and merriest of audience-participation shows, with Edwards expanding his talents as producer, writer, director and genial master of ceremonies.

The formula of the show is the same as the original parlor game, with air appurtenances. If a contestant gives

the correct answer to a question, he receives \$15 in cash. If he fails, he must pay the penalty of performing a "consequence," for which he receives \$5.

These "consequences" are, of course, the bombshells that keep the program in a state of humorous hysteria. And, fortunately, Edwards chooses these stunts on the basis of their audible appeal to listeners.


One of the most riotous of all performances developed when a man had to take the "consequence" of singing "Trees" in duet with a trained dog. The dog got mike fright, just cocked his ears and listened to the contestant.

A soundman rushed up and his man-made barking started the dog. The duet that had dwindled to a solo grew into a howling trio!

Another participant was asked to make a hypothetical explanation to his wife about his whereabouts the night before. That's a tough job in any circumstances, but in this case it had to be accomplished with the added encumbrance of a mouthful of marshmallow candy.

Such are the highlights of this lively fun show, heard each Saturday night over an NBC network at 8:30 p.m. EDT, 7:30 EST, 9:30 CDT, 8:30 CST, 7:30 MST, 6:30 PST.



Tommy

Goes to Town

HERE'S TONY MARTIN, toast of the ladies from Coast to Coast for his dark, dashing handsomeness, and current rave of the public for his spirited singing of songs that please

What's underneath the flashy, cock-sure success of radio singer Tony Martin? Here's an insight into the real man

TONY MARTIN is the musical man of the hour. He is being showered with sighs, applause and down-to-earth dollars from Miami to New York to Hollywood to X-ville. His dashing tenor singing and his flashy handsomeness and his stage graciousness have made him a 1940 sensation.

Many friends and fans insist he deserves it all. Some who know him and some who don't know him think he's a spoiled egg who doesn't deserve the breaks he has been getting. That makes him a public issue and all the more intriguing, like Nelson Eddy.

Take him either way, Tony is going to town. Except for the blond ghost of Alice Faye, which undoubtedly hovers in the background, he has everything he has ever wanted.

He has just completed a personal-appearance tour that has definitely set him up alongside Bob Hope as a record-breaker. His appearances earned him as much as \$7,000 and \$8,000 per week. His latest picture, "Music in My Heart," was a hit last spring, bringing him nearer real dramatic success than at any time during the making of a dozen or so earlier pictures. It also brought him probably as much as \$50,000. He is earning \$25,000 a year from his Decca recordings. He was paid \$2,000 a show by Ethyl Gas last season for his radio services.

Not as solid as money returns but just as welcome is the wholehearted enthusiasm of the public that has finally come after many false starts up the ladder of fame. Whether you like him or don't like him as a personality, Tony is news now, and his private life in a measure is public domain. Let's put Tony under the lens and see what he really is like.

Just now he lives in a rented home in Beverly Hills, relaxing from his conquests and looking for more worlds to conquer. Several radio and movie deals are currently warm. In the meantime Tony hasn't retired with pipe and bedroom slippers. He's quite active in entertaining himself as well as the public.

THAT activity includes going around with the girls. Tony has been sobered and rendered wiser by the collapse of his first marriage, through a clash of careers and career-complexes, but he has not been soured on love. Six-foot, 175-pound, dark, handsome Tony is again eligible—for which the female populace is entirely happy.

Tony likes both blondes and brunettes. As a swain he's an artistic exponent of paying attention to the little matters in courting—attentive courtesies, gifts, noticing the lady's special hair-do and such niceties. He is himself a meticulous dresser. He buys dozens of neckties at a time, has scores of shoes and a huge wardrobe, is careful about his hair and finger-nails and prissy about the press in his trousers, even his slacks. You could almost get away with calling him a dude—a very masculine dude, though.

Thumping feminine hearts from Coast to Coast give wholesale evidence that Tony Martin knows, inherently or by practise, the psychology of public as well as private wooing. As one instance, here's what some of the writers said when Tony made his first New York night-club appearance and a return engagement at the Versailles Restaurant last March:

"That mob of girls you see on East

Fiftieth Street is battling to get into the Versailles to hear Tony Martin give out ballads in his excellent tenor and to gaze upon his handsome pan. The Alice Faye divorce has boomed his stock among the young ladies here."—Alice Hughes' syndicated column.

"... You should have seen the debutants swooning over him."—Louella Parsons.

"Tony Martin, the featured attraction at the Versailles, seems to have the qualities which please both the men and the ladies. The former like him for his singing ability and his hail-fellow-well-met personality; the ladies because he pretty much sums up all desirable qualities which go into the making of a matinee idol. Incidentally, the newspaper people took to Tony particularly because of his modest, friendly deportment."—Ted Friend in the New York Mirror.

The last item seems to refute the conception of Tony as a conceited prima donna. An incident occurred during the Versailles engagement which demonstrates further that Martin has graciousness as well as glamour. Three elderly women had written to the night-club saying they wanted to see Tony. They were allowed to violate the club's rule prohibiting unescorted ladies. They weren't adoring adolescents or gold-diggers, certainly. Just sincere, serious old ladies who admired Tony and his singing they had heard on his CBS "Tune-Up Time." An official of the night-club tipped Tony off about the special visitors. He dropped around and sat at their table and chatted as if he had been waiting especially for them to show up.

During his engagement in New York Tony bought a special-built Packard, but he seldom drove it to work for fear the cab-drivers would damage it. Between shows he often drove around Central Park and other sections of the city. He was often recognized and his autograph solicited when the car stopped at intersections or was parked, and he always granted the requests.

Most of Tony's intimate friends are musicians, the kind of friends who will drop in at any time and pound your piano. Tony buys all the symphony records as fast as they come out, and sits around home often playing them. When he and Alice Faye were married, they used to listen often to one another's records.

He is a confirmed sports devotee. He plays a good game of golf, and goes to baseball and football games as often as he can. An ambition that harks back to his school days is to own a baseball team. When he was working on "Tune-Up Time" last season, much of his spare time was spent scanning horse-racing dope, discussing selections with the musicians, placing bets.

Tony suffers still, with all his seeming poise, from extreme nervousness before a radio show or a stage appearance. He even had attacks of nervous indigestion sometimes before broadcasts and several times was sick enough to give the directors concern. But once into a performance, he is at ease.

It is hard to reconcile this nervousness with his general virility and his specific enjoyment of a bloody boxing-bout. But that's only one of the paradoxes in the Martin make-up. Another is that he says he has always been lucky. Give his career the once-over lightly and judge for yourself.

Tony Martin was born Alfred Morris in Oakland, Calif., on a Christmas Day. By his own admission his early life was pretty uneventful. He went to school and helped in his father's furniture store, and took time out from both occupations to play around with his voice and the saxophone that a customer paid in on a delinquent furniture account.

The saxophone gave him the idea of organizing an orchestra while he was still in high school. The orchestra was quite successful, but classroom recitations were not, and the parents of the boys decided professional music could wait a few years.

WHEN Tony—that's his name to us—enrolled in football-famous Saint Mary's College, he took up football and baseball. He was proficient enough, too, to win a baseball tryout with the San Francisco Seals. But he had a habit of playing hooky from classroom, gridiron or diamond to take a solitary jaunt out of the world on his saxophone or on the chapel organ.

It was the organ, with Tony at the console, that pealed out one day and caught the benign ear of a reverend brother of the faculty. But the benign ear turned a socked pink, for it wasn't Sunday, it wasn't even chapel-time, and the organ wasn't playing "Ave Maria." The naughty notes were swinging out over the campus in one of the hottest then current tunes by the hands of the same Tony Martin who avidly collects symphony records.

Tony wasn't expelled. The faculty brothers simply agreed with Tony's resigned parents that his love for music might as well not wait longer for full expression. So Tony quit college and started playing in bands around San Francisco.

His first big professional job was with Tom Gerun's orchestra, playing the saxophone. One night the regular vocalist had a cold. Gerun asked Tony to substitute. "Go ahead," he said. "You've got the looks. Just smile and recite the lyrics." That was Tony's first experience with performance fright, but he was game, and he let his voice go. The dancers stopped dancing and crowded around to hear him. The musicians slapped him on the back. And Tony almost passed out. But, unfortunately, it was only one of many false starts up the steep success road.

He continued as regular vocalist for Gerun's orchestra, later led his own band. An engagement at the Chicago Century of Progress Exposition boosted his stock sharply. Later an NBC remote pick-up from the Bal Tabarin in San Francisco finally brought him substantial prestige—and his first big opportunity.

A Hollywood agent heard Tony singing from San Francisco and got him a screen test. The result was that

the tenor was signed by M-G-M, given dramatic training—and pigeonholed for the duration of his contract. You know Hollywood. Even Lady Luck is eccentric there.

Several years later Tony got a six-month contract with RKO, but still no action. A slump hit the musical-film boom about that time. Tony beat the studio to the punch and had his agent arrange his release from the contract. Shortly thereafter he was signed by 20th Century-Fox after Darryl Zanuck heard him sing "You Hit the Spot" at the Trocadero.

It was while Tony was making his first 20th Century-Fox picture, "Sing, Baby, Sing," that the dazzling blond beauty of Alice Faye flashed onto his horizon. Not accustomed to the movie recording technique, Tony was having trouble recording one of his songs in the laboratory. Alice, also appearing in the picture, called Tony to her dressing-room, gave him a Coca-Cola, told him to take it easy, and gave him some pointers on recording for films. Sensing that he was nervous and a shade blue, she also invited him to dinner with her and her brother Bill.

There followed a courtship, marriage, short wedded life and divorce that have been exploited to the full, because it has been a typical Hollywood romance story. It started as an ideal union and developed into a pathetic series of quarrels and reconciliations, defiance of rumor, and gallant attempts to make a go of it.

Alice Faye was becoming one of the biggest box-office names in pictures. Tony meanwhile was not setting the world on fire as an actor. He felt he was being shoved around by the picture company. Although he loved Alice intensely, his own self-assurance, ambition and pride wouldn't allow him to submerge his identity as "Mr. Faye."

Tony fought for release from his contract and got it for \$30,000. He had decided to show everybody what he could do in personal appearances. That he did with a box-office bang. In the next six weeks he had more than earned the \$30,000 on tour, and he had obtained a firm footing on the public's hair-balanced pedestal.

HE HAD already begun to establish his voice as a solid radio fixture through a series in 1937-38 with Burns and Allen on NBC. Finally he got the big spotlight assignment as singing master of ceremonies on CBS' "Tune-Up Time" during the past season of 1939-40. With Andre Kostelanetz' great music to buoy him up, he clinched his popularity with the radio public.

Tony Martin is indeed the musical man of the hour. He is on top, and therefore a target for criticism. Many have conscientiously felt that he is conceited, high-hat and cocky. They perhaps have not known the factors that have built around a naturally nervous, shy, self-conscious nature a defense shell of artificial self-assurance.

Look beneath that shell and you find the real Tony Martin that Alice Faye loved, perhaps still loves. The same Tony Martin that the public has put on its imaginary pedestal—not only for his vocal appeal, not only for his romantic appeal, but also for the real personality appeal that is finally breaking through the shell of circumstantial complexes.



TREASON ON YOUR DIAL



Unmasking our own Cliveden set—
the murky truth about Americans
who champion Hitler on the air!

THE sudden, devastating collapse of France in the face of the Nazi assault astonished everyone except the Nazi Fifth Columnists in France. They alone knew how well they had accomplished their purpose, how they had sapped the very core of French resistance. Great Britain, much more vigilant than France, has had little trouble from the Fifth Column. But if Great Britain is defeated, that defeat can be laid at the feet of a group barely distinguishable from—and even more deadly than—the Fifth Column. I refer to the Cliveden set—appeasers, isolationists, men and women who valued their own hides above their principles and the freedom of smaller nations which blindly entrusted their fate to such hands.

In the United States, we face both a Nazi Fifth Column and an American Cliveden set. It is difficult to draw a line between where one leaves off and the other begins.

That Capt. Fritz Wiedemann or the Goebbels-employed Hermann Schwinn should labor in the American vineyard on behalf of Hitler is understandable. They are, giving them the benefit of all doubt, patriotic followers of the Hitler way of life, and until they brought their perfidious purposes and methods to these shores, were perfectly within their rights. Completely beyond this writer's comprehension, however, are those American citizens who would—for love of gold or lust for power—betray their country and deliver it helpless to a foreign conqueror.

It is a grotesque—almost unbelievable—fact that the two loudest and most consistent radio spokesmen (we shall concern ourselves here only with those who use radio) for Nazism in the United States should be gentlemen of the cloth. I have not the slightest doubt that in their younger and more idealistic days, both the Rev. Charles E. Coughlin, Catholic priest of Royal Oak, Mich., and the Rev. Gerald B. Winrod, evangelist-preacher of Wichita, Kansas, must have taken as the subject for many of their sermons the betrayal of Christianity and its doctrine of sufferance by Judas to sate his own ambition and for thirty pieces of gold.

Today Father Coughlin is the number one Jew-baiter and voice of Nazism in America. Because this writer has only recently dealt with Coughlin at great length (MOVIE AND RADIO GUIDE for March 9-15 and March 16-22, 1940) we shall touch upon him but briefly here. Father Coughlin, off the air for the summer, speaks every Sunday over a nationwide network of stations to more than 5,000,000 listeners. His speeches, in many instances, are composed of word-for-word and idea-for-idea duplications in many parts of words spoken by Paul Goebbels, Nazi propaganda minister; and it is a fact that Father Coughlin leaped quickly to the defense of the German spies arrested in December, 1938, by the F. B. I., charging their prosecution was a Jewish plot. His close affiliation with the Christian Front marks him as a more

than casually interested Fascist of dangerous proportions.

Gerald B. Winrod, second only to Coughlin in his fervent philosophy of hate, was a poverty-stricken preacher without a church in Wichita, Kansas, in 1934, the year that well-heeled Nazi agents descended upon America with their plan to conquer by propaganda. Often Winrod was unable to buy the necessities of life, for his collections were small, and the coming of the Nazis with their gold must have been like the coming of the resurrection to a man who had preached the good life and found it didn't pay.

SUDDENLY Winrod began to preach of the menace of the Jews and the Catholics. Things began to look up for Winrod after that, and later the same year he had come into enough money to take a trip to Germany. When he returned in February, 1935, he had new suitcases packed with clothes and, more important, a fat bank account. Rev. Winrod now blossomed out as the publisher of a paper, *The Revealer*, which proceeded to reveal all about the honey and sweetness which was Nazi Germany, the dire threat of the Jewish bankers and a lot of other things, excepting, of course, where he got his money.

But money he had—enough to buy radio time on Dr. Brinkley's powerful radio station XERA, just across the border in Mexico, where he pursues his Jew-baiting, Nazi-loving tirades unhampered by American libel and treason laws, the Federal Communications Commission and whatever he uses for a conscience.

Perhaps the most conscientious—and misled—of all America's Cliveden set is the fallen hero, Charles A. Lindbergh. Lindbergh has never been connected in any way with the Nazi government or pro-Nazi organizations here, as have his fellow travelers, excepting one instance: when he received—and accepted—from Hermann Goering a high Nazi decoration while

on a visit to the Third Reich.

The arguments which Lindbergh brings to the airwaves in ever-increasing doses of late are little different from those expounded by Britain's Sir Oswald Mosely before his internment. He argues (1) that Hitler is invincible and we must not pick a quarrel with him under any circumstances; (2) that Hitler's cause is just in that it is a war to more fairly divide this world's goods among nations. (The writer wonders what Lindbergh's position is with regard to German-American economic adjustments, the United States being richer than England.) And (3) he argues that we must appease Hitler or suffer the economic consequences of being shut off from the world's markets.

Both Henry Ford and William J. Cameron, his personal secretary and spokesman, are well known to radio listeners, and while no hint of Nazi propaganda has yet crept into the "Ford Sunday Evening Hour," both of these gentlemen have been interested in activities which place them within the Cliveden classification.

For a long time, the national leader of the Nazi propaganda machine in America and head of the vicious German-American Bund, Fritz Kuhn, was on the pay-roll of the Ford plant at Dearborn. Mr. Kuhn is now serving a jail sentence for theft of funds belonging to the Bund he headed. During the whole period of his employment as a chemist in the Ford plant, Kuhn traveled about the country preaching anti-Semitism. It would be a minor miracle if Mr. Ford did not know of Kuhn's activities, for Harry Bennett, chief of the Ford secret service, was fully aware of them, and Mr. Bennett reports to Ford.

When Kuhn went to work for Ford, he moved the national headquarters of the Bund to Detroit, and its anti-American activities perceptibly increased. At about the same time, William J. Cameron fathered another organization—obviously designed to

give Jew-hating citizens who were not of German extraction an organization comparable to the Bund. This was called the Anglo-Saxon Federation, and its chief purpose seemed to be the distribution of the spurious "Protocols of Zion," a forged document. Mr. Ford admitted it was a forgery.

"The Protocols of Zion" is the number one primer of hate in Nazi Germany. Number two primer of hate is "The International Jew," by Henry Ford, translated into German and distributed liberally across a receptive Third Reich.

In 1938 Adolf Hitler bestowed upon Mr. Ford the highest decoration he is empowered to give a foreigner. No statement as to why Mr. Ford was so honored was forthcoming.

In sheer quantities, however, the West Coast has proved a more fertile soil for the growing of Nazi-Americans than even Detroit. And while the professional Fifth Columnist prefers to sugar-coat his doctrine with avid patriotism, the Cliveden set seems to turn to religion. In Los Angeles, at 927 South Flower Street, stands Kingdom Temple, outwardly a house of God and inwardly the spawning-ground of hate and dissension.

ASSIDUOUSLY employing the Bible, Joe Jeffers draws to his Temple thousands of souls seeking spiritual sustenance. They are attracted by his daily program over station KGER. What they get if they show up for a service is the gospel of Goebbels. When Jeffers runs out of ammunition, he manages to have guest speakers on hand to carry on—men like Harold A. Sparling, seeking the Republican nomination for Congressman from the Seventeenth District, whose platform consists of (1) anti-Semitism and (2) a one-party, fascist-type state.

Sparling, too, has his own radio program (radio station KMTR in Los Angeles), where daily he spouts his revised Nazism for radio listeners. Of the game stripe is T. E. Hughes, running for Congress in the Thirteenth District of California, who speaks Saturdays on station KFAC, Los Angeles.

Throughout the country, members of the Cliveden set are at work to soften America for the final blow. Many Americans—and many Americans who have access to radio broadcasting facilities—are simply being made the innocent tools of shrewd Nazi agents. But in too many cases they labor on Hitler's behalf for the gold they are paid or for the power which has been promised them when *der tag* comes.

To those who undermine for gold or power, nothing is sacred—neither the land which has been their home nor the love of freedom which is their heritage, nor the love of God, behind which so many of America's traitors have taken a false refuge.

Next week—concluding this series—Dr. Eduard Benes, last president of Czechoslovakia and a country which no longer exists because of such fifth-column activities—tells us how we can combat them.

Programs from foreign countries subject to change without notice

COLUMBIA'S INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM SERVICE

FOR more than a decade CBS has been transmitting international programs for reception in foreign lands. Within recent years, the installation of highly directional beam antennae and increased transmitter power have made it possible to broadcast a reliable daily program service to Europe and South America. These broadcasts—in seven languages—are under the supervision of Miss Elizabeth Ann Tucker, program director of the CBS short-wave department.

CBS international programs, consisting of special short-wave features and selected network offerings, are broadcast at present over two 10,000-watt transmitters, WCBX at Wayne, New Jersey, and WCAB at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. These stations provide a simultaneous program service to Europe and South America. While one station directs programs to Europe, the other delivers programs to Latin America.

The Columbia Broadcasting System will soon effect a major expansion of its short-wave facilities. Station WCBX will be moved to the new CBS short-wave transmitting site at Brentwood, Long Island, where its power will be stepped up to 50,000 watts. The Federal Communications Commission has also authorized the construction of a second 50,000-watt international station at the same site. These two new giant transmitters will cost in excess of \$300,000. They will be located on the property of Mackay Radio and Telegraph Company in a new wing to the present building, which houses Mackay's point-to-point transoceanic transmitters. The new stations will employ a total of thirteen frequencies, enabling them to operate on the most desirable frequency for any given hour of the day or season of the year in any direction. There will be plenty of room on Mackay's 1200-acre tract to install numerous directional antennae of the latest type and de-

sign. According to E. K. Cohan, director of engineering for CBS, the completed plants will be the most modern and complete short-wave units in the United States. Eventually WCAB will transfer its facilities to CBS and discontinue operation, its present schedules being assumed by the new stations.

WCBX broadcasts to Europe daily from 6 a.m. to 4 p.m. and to South America from 4:30 p.m. to 12 mid. CST. WCAB broadcasts to South America daily from 10 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (Sundays to 2:30 p.m.) and to Europe from 4:45 p.m. to close-down, this hour varying from 9 p.m. to 12 mid. CST.

THE GREATEST MAN I EVER KNEW

Looking back now, I can see where Grandfather was ahead of his time in so many ways. Education, for instance. In those first days, when the people were making a desperate struggle to keep their bodies alive, it would have been understandable if an unimportant thing like schooling for the children had been neglected. And yet, not only were schools established immediately upon arrival in that barren, desolate country, but even adult classes were formed where foreign languages and the sciences were taught. The teachers? Grandfather recruited them from among the converts—men and women who, before coming to Utah, frequently had held important posts in eastern and foreign schools.

Every one of Grandfather's twenty-five sons was offered the opportunity of a college education, and the majority of them accepted it. He made only one stipulation: that upon the conclusion of their schooling, the men return to the community to give the people in general the benefits of what they had learned.

Young ladies, in those days, were not given higher educations. Convention, I suppose, considered it a waste of time, and Grandfather was not one to deliberately flaunt established convention. Surprisingly enough, however, he did insist that each of his daughters be given instruction in typing, shorthand, and business administration! One of those rickety typewriters used in the Lion House is still preserved—a cumbersome black tin thing embellished with huge pink roses!

Grandfather's pride in his children became a by-word with every out-of-state visitor who came to his home. An important conference would be in session in his office, which was connected to both the Lion House and the Beehive House by a wide hallway, when he would glance up to see a tiny face peering through a crack in the door.

"Come in, daughter," he would say, and then lifting the child to his desk, would present her to the visitors. "Gentlemen, I want you to meet my baby daughter."

NOT that Grandfather was never the disciplinarian with his children. He was, and a firm one too. One Sunday he was preaching in the Bowery, an open-air sort of church which was used during the hot summer months. His children were allowed to attend services or not, as they wished, and on this particular day, one of his sons obviously had not wished. He was, in fact, racing up and down the lot adjoining the Bowery and playing a very noisy game of "Indians."

Without a word to the congregation, Grandfather stepped from the pulpit, caught the offending son, and gave him a sound spanking. Then, returning to the pulpit, he picked up his sermon at the exact place he had left off and calmly concluded what he had to say! To the silent cheers, I might add, of his listeners.

Then there was the night the Big Ten entertained their banes.

The Big Ten were ten of Grandfather's daughters who lived in the Lion House. All of them were approximately eighteen years old at the same time, and were pretty much the belles of the town, dictating fashions and leading the social activities. It was

conquest by might as well as right in their case, for all of them were very pretty girls and exceptionally popular with the blades of the town.

All their entertaining, of course, was done in the big parlor of their home, and in the course of their various courtships, this presented something of a problem. After all, when a room is lighted by one lamp on a table in the center of the room, there are only four dark corners; four dark corners aren't enough for ten couples who want to whisper sweet nothings in comparative privacy. With considerable of their father's ingenuity, they attacked the problem one night. Stacks of books were brought from the library and a high wall was built around the lamp with them. The result was admirable; the room now had enough dark nooks for everyone.

ALL went exceedingly well until a familiar footstep sounded outside the door, and Grandfather walked into the room. He glanced at the lamp and the books, then at the occupants of the room who were sitting upright in paralyzed silence. Without a word he removed the wall, book by book. Turning, he said in a clear voice:

"The young ladies will retire to their rooms. The young gentlemen will remain here, where I will speak with them."

He did. And how!

Strict though he was, Grandfather had a wonderful sense of humor. On one occasion General Tom Thumb, the famous English midget, was a guest in the Beehive House. After dinner the two men, so ludicrously contrasting in size, were conversing on affairs in general. Grandfather saw that the General was aching to ask certain questions about Mormonism, but was holding back out of a sense of politeness. So Grandfather himself opened up the subject. The General listened with avid interest and then sticking his thumbs in his diminutive vest, rocked back on his heels.

"President Young," he said finally. "There is just one thing about your faith I cannot understand. This polygamy."

Grandfather glanced down at the figure which barely reached his knees. Aping the midget's posture, he too rocked back.

"General Thumb," he said. "Neither could I, when I was your size!"

On another occasion, an eastern visitor wrote Grandfather a thank-you note for hospitality extended him in the Beehive House. By some mischance, enclosed was a picture of himself which Grandfather had given him upon request. Apparently the visitor had intended mailing it east to some friend, for scribbled across the back of it was the message: "Here's a picture of the old billygoat himself!"

Grandfather returned the picture with a polite note.

"Undoubtedly the enclosed was not intended for me," he wrote, "so I am returning it to you. Again assuring you of my continued good wishes, etc., I am, faithfully yours, The Old Billygoat."

There are many extraneous facts about Grandfather which combine to present the picture of the man. He liked nice things, and on his table were goblets of fine crystal with "B. Y." etched in an elaborate design, and fine china banded in solid gold. The wedding slippers for one of his daughters were made by Laird-

Grandfather looked at the list and his eyes twinkled merrily. He had spotted the trick immediately, of course, but he wouldn't give her away.
