A Little Hitler in Chicago Bans the Movie "Pastor Hall"

HERR HITLER has called us a nation with an elastic-band spine. If he is right, we had better find out about it. It would be no trouble for him, he asserts, to cause confusion, indecision, and to start a revolution. Well, let's find out about that, too.

A good place to start is in Chicago. Here is why? The City of the Stockyards is the nation's first municipality. New York belongs to the world, but Chicago belongs to America, and in Chicago a curious un-American decision was made recently. It was made by a high-ranking cop who happens to be the censor of Chicago's films. He decided that the film-play "Pastor Hall" was too dangerous for showing.

"Pastor Hall" is British made. It parallels the story of Martin Niemoeller, the German preacher who defied Hitler until he was locked up in a concentration camp. It reveals Brown Shirt brutality and the ruthless tyranny of a dictator who bows to no god. Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt was so impressed by the picture that she made a film prolog in order to introduce it to American audiences. No one denies that the picture shows authentic Nazi conditions.

Chicago's nightstick censor says it is "dangerous."

When any "little Hitler" with dictatorial power lives in our front yard, we had better take notice. When he admits that the truth is dangerous, we had better beware. More particularly, when he permits to be shown for weeks on end a picture made in Germany and called "Blitzkrieg in Poland," which pounds home the story of Germany's invincible might, which shows Nazi tanks and troops vanquishing all before them, and which causes American citizens of German blood to cheer themselves hoarse, we had better turn a microscope on our own small-fry dictators and their loyalty as well as their common sense.

by a talent agent who saw the possibilities in the youngster. But it was not until after the Temples undertook their own management of Shirley that she soared to stardom. During the eight and a half years that the tiny star appeared in films, she earned more than twenty million dollars for her studio, a neat \$3,500,000 for herself. 

Can Chaplin Get Away With It?

WHAT will "The Great Dictator" do to the career of Charles Chaplin? MOVIE AND RADIO GUIDE, which was the first publication to bring its readers the inside story of what the Chaplin film is about, frankly wonders if even the great genius of Chaplin can so completely reverse itself and get away with it. Chaplin, in this picture, has thrown overboard all of the comic props which have come to be his trademark. The battered derby he has worn so long and so effectively gives way to a trim military cap; the inevitable cane is replaced by a swagger stick; the baggy trousers and ragged coat are forgotten for impeccably-tailored uniforms, and shining, immaculate boots cover the Chaplin feet in place of the worn, over-size shoes upon which he marched to one after another triumph and which made him the idol of the man in the street. War, with its uniforms, is not new to Chaplin. In "Shoulder Arms," he wore a uniform, but it was the ill-fitting uniform of a common soldier and not unlike the tramp's outfit with which he is associated. It is a far cry

from the soldier of "Shoulder Arms" to the Dictator of "The Great Dictator." Can Chaplin—without destroying himself along with the illusion and character he has labored years to create—successfully bridge that gap? Then, too, there is this matter of kidding the dictators. At the time Chaplin conceived his idea, four years ago, it was unquestionably a grand idea—the sort of thing that either Chaplin or the late Will Rogers might have done so superbly. It has taken Chaplin a long time to record his idea in celluloid, however—time which, in its passing, has witnessed the fall of Czechoslovakia, the bloody conquests of Norway, Poland, Holland, Belgium and France. Now, almost overnight, we no longer feel like laughing. We wonder, quite frankly, if even a Chaplin satire on the creators of such chaos can bring back laughter to the hearts of men, and at the same time we sincerely hope that "The Great Dictator" accomplishes all that Chaplin has dreamed and planned for his great, one-man crusade against the dictatorships and all that they stand for.

IT SEEMS to me that in saddle-mad Hollywood where horses are so numerous and horse-sense is so rare that somebody should make book on the Gene Raymond-Jeanette MacDonald marriage. You know, offer odds as the race-track bookies do. For there are more noses poked into the private lives of the Raymonds than were poked into the private life of Helen of Troy.

Inevitably, on those pleasant but infrequent days when there's a drought of gossip about less fortunate folks, some of the monger brethren will confide to the world that the Raymonds are busting up.

Well, they have been married more than three years and they're making it work, although Hollywood says it can't be done. In the movie business when a wife outshines her husband they are supposed to tell it to the judge. Of course, the fact that history is crammed with couples who managed to live together even though the wife outshone the husband cuts no ice in Hollywood. Without looking it up, name quickly the husbands of Victoria, Jenny Lind, Marie Antoinette.

According to Hollywood standards, double, triple or what have you, Jeanette MacDonald is a star and Gene Raymond is not. He faced that problem before he married her. An intelligent, sensitive man, he surely thought it all out. He knew what to expect. What has probably never entered anybody's head is that Mr. and Mrs. Raymond are in love. Which explains everything to the satisfaction of about one hundred thirty million Americans who still cling to the rather silly notion that when a man and woman fall in love they get married and stay married, even though the wife is more famous than the husband.

Mr. Raymond and his wife began their careers on the legitimate stage, and there he was the star. Born in New York City in 1908, Raymond went on the stage when he was five. That was 1913. Gene Raymond didn't reach Hollywood until 1929, and in between he did a lot of first-class acting.

Jeanette MacDonald was born in Philadelphia in 1907 and was a red-haired, buck-toothed, gawky kid. She began studying music when she was four, and as a child she sang and danced for her supper. Gradually she grew beautiful and became rather well known on Broadway. She and Gene did not meet in New York, however. She went to California in 1929, too.

Because she starred so often with Nelson Eddy, folks began linking their names. She soon reached the top, while Mr. Raymond was plugging along.

Back in 1935, she was reported married to Robert Ritchie, and Miss MacDonald said some very silly things in denying the report. I'll bet she wishes she had kept her mouth shut, because here is what she said:

"I shall never marry until I am ready to retire from public life. Marriage itself is a career and few people are clever enough to manage two careers. I'm not clever enough, I am sure."

Shortly after uttering that wad of wisdom, Miss MacDonald was invited to a party and arrived late, as usual. Mr. Raymond arrived late, too. It's a habit with both of them. They met on their host's porch. Nobody introduced them. They just met and walked into the party together. The folks thought they had arrived together. A few weeks later the same thing happened again. It's all right to be late for parties in Hollywood. It's a good way to get your name in the papers, but everywhere else it's bad manners.

Anyway, after their second tardiness, Mr. Raymond asked Miss MacDonald for a date. They did the town, but Miss MacDonald apparently wasn't having much fun until midnight. Then she said, "It's my birthday now. We can have fun."

Mr. Raymond never forgets his wife's birthday and usually sends her sweetheart roses.

Their wedding, you recall, got more newspaper space than a first-class hanging. More than eighteen thousand persons milled around the Wilshire Congregational Church for a gawk at the couple. It was a blowout all right. They said Miss MacDonald didn't want it that way, but you know how those nasty old studios are. A star simply must get married in a manner befitting her rank. The Hollywood papers first said the tie-up cost twenty-five thousand dollars and later the ante was raised. A few crotchety

old editors suggested that it was sort of bad spending a small fortune on a wedding when a lot of haggard women and barefoot brats in the world were hungry.

Life magazine had something to say about how much the wedding cost, and the remark is reported to have hurt Miss MacDonald's feelings. She wrote the editor a letter and said the affair had cost less than the average society

wedding. Which proves what? Anyway, the editor ran her letter. She had signed it Jeanette MacDonald Raymond and the editor deleted Raymond. Some folks thought the editor was being spiteful.

After getting off to a bad press on their overly publicized wedding, the Raymonds became an ideal couple and commanded the admiration of everybody.

Mr. Raymond has always been a hard worker and saved his money. While he was courting Miss MacDonald, he bought and furnished a home. It is Twin Gables, an English style house in Bel Air. He gave it to her as a wedding present and carried her across the threshold. She is supposed to have known nothing about it until he took her in his arms, toted her in and said, "It's yours."

Perhaps he called her "darling" then. He seldom does now. The Raymonds have no mushy pet names for each other, and when they say dear they mean it.

They live rather conservatively. Mr. Raymond drove the same Packard for four years.

Mrs. Raymond drives a Packard and she also has a MacDonald-plaid Chrysler Highlander. Mrs. Raymond is very proud of her MacDonald blood. Her car has the clan colors. Her music-room in the music-house is done in MacDonald plaid. The horn on her new Highlander plays "The Campbells Are Coming."

Hoot mon!

MR. RAYMOND likes boats and horses and is a very good sailor. Once he wanted to retire to an old Virginia plantation and raise thoroughbreds.

If they ever move to the southern highlands, Mrs. Raymond should hock that automobile. It would cause a feud. Folks in the South take their Scotch seriously.

Mr. Raymond rides a beautiful horse, a jumper that his wife gave him. His name is Black Night. She rides a white horse that he gave her. Her name is White Lady. Our idea of something different would be White Night and Black Lady.

Incidentally, Mrs. Raymond rides side-saddle.

Their friends are the folksy type and the Raymonds are not kowtows. They entertain their friends at small dinner parties. Mrs. Raymond's family is in Hollywood, but unlike many Holly-

wood families, her folks do not make nuisances of themselves.

The Raymonds are very loyal and mind their own business. Neither of them is a gossip and they ignore gossip about themselves. Recently, at a party at their house, a radio gossip was talking about them and hinting that all was not well. The Raymonds didn't tune him off but just cut down the volume.

Mr. Raymond never has had many good roles. He's a good man if he could get a good story. After the wedding, Mr. Raymond had just worked out what he considered an unsatisfactory RKO contract and had announced that he was going to free-lance and compose music. Immediately rumors went around that the marriage was cracking because Raymond wasn't working. Some folks said Mrs. Raymond was supporting him.

That wasn't true. Mr. Raymond had saved enough money to take care of himself and his wife during his layoff. He wouldn't take small parts. As long as he was not on the screen in small parts, he knew folks could not compare his and his wife's careers. He worked hard at his music, and his "Let Me Always Sing" was written especially for his wife.

His "Will You?" also was a success. While her husband was among the unemployed and the gossips were nibbling, Mrs. Raymond simply ignored them.

In Hollywood, if you are good and have money, you can force the studios to give you good parts. Most performers are broke and cannot afford a layoff. Raymond had dough and he wouldn't play until they gave him a good part. His last job was "Cross Country Romance," and the chances are now that he'll get some good roles.

His wife has never used her influence to help him. She's too smart for that. She's among the tops at M-G-M and she might have got him for a vacancy in "Northwest Passage" if she had gone to bat. But studio politics has no part in their life. They keep their careers separate. That's why he didn't go on her last concert tour. It was her show.

Once a year they always go away together for a vacation-honeymoon.

Mrs. Raymond comes from an strict Presbyterian family, and every year on their wedding anniversary she and her husband attend a party at the home of the minister who married them.

OF THE WEEK

ended in happy wedlock.

Vivien Leigh and Laurence Olivier slipped away and, without anybody but two other figures of the magical city of dreams being the wiser, stole a march on Hollywood.

The fact that they were in love was no secret; nor was their intention to wed. Hollywood had been expecting word these two would marry in the more or less near future. Certainly, though, it did not expect an elopement, to awaken one fine morning and read that Vivien and Larry had motored to Santa Barbara the night before and had been made man and wife by a local justice of the peace as the minute-hand of the clock passed the midnight hour.

Their marriage was solemnized just as the green-eyed Vivien said last February that it would be: "With a minimum of fuss, and as soon as we possibly can."

ON MONDAY, August 26, word reached the star of "Gone With the Wind" that her English barrister-husband, Herbert Leigh Holman, had been granted an absolute divorce decree in London, leaving her free to marry again. Olivier already had received notification of his wife, Jill Esmond, the English actress, winning her absolute decree of divorce on August 5.

Thursday evening, August 29, Katharine Hepburn and Garson Kanin, the director, dined with the couple in Beverly Hills.

"Let's take a ride," Olivier suggested after dinner, as they climbed into his car. "It's so balmy..."

Miles up the Malibu, the warm summer evening fanning their faces, he shouted back to Katy and Garson, "You're going to a wedding."

FOUR years ago, they met. They were to play together in a London stage production called "The First and the Last." At that time Vivien was the wife of Herbert Leigh Holman, a young barrister, Olivier the husband of actress Jill Esmond. As they were introduced both knew, that moment, they were in love—Vivien, the pert, revolutionary daughter of an English cavalry officer of India; Olivier, moody, disillusioned.

Their personal lives were not flourishing, long had been in sorry state. (The very antithesis to their professional lives, which were progressing to the degree that Vivien was popular and well known on the British stage and Olivier was London's most distinguished young actor.) The result is a black spot on each cheek if the cameraman isn't careful, because red photographs black in Technicolor. So when Linda blushes, the cameraman has to wait until the blush fades before the scene can be shot. That means delay, delay means money in the motion-picture industry. In "The Californian," in which Tyrone Power kisses Linda eight times, the budget has been increased \$4,000 to pay for what might be described as "blushing time."

"Rangers of Fortune"

TOUGHER but softer-hearted rascals than Fred MacMurray, Albert Dekker and Gilbert Roland in "Rangers of Fortune" cannot be imagined—and it is with their adventures in the once wild and woolly West that this picture deals.

With the ghosts of all the pals-of-the-screen hovering over them, with sure-fire situations and plenty of action, heart-tugs and comedy, this trio provides ninety minutes of entertainment technically described as "western melodrama"—which it certainly is.

MacMurray, a glib-tongued black sheep who drinks whisky; Roland, a fiery Mexican who drinks tequila, and Albert Dekker, a punch-drunk ex-fighter who drinks only beer, make a dramatic escape from a firing squad (it seems their crime was gun-running) as the picture opens. They hike across country, taking over a waterhole held by some bandits who were charging fifty cents a pail for water (the robbers!), and immediately raise the price to one dollar.

The arrival of "Squib" Clayborn (Betty Brewer) and Mr. Prout, a persecuted newspaper publisher (Arthur Allen), at the waterhole gives the triumvirate some troubles to iron out, which they do. The ironing-out process includes selling copies of the paper at "one buck a copy" (with force) and battling it out with Lewis Rebstock (Joseph Schildkraut) and his gang of family retainers, who have been leading the persecution against the newspaper publisher and other citizens.

"Rangers of Fortune" is significant for several things: It marks the comeback of Gilbert Roland, the introduction of a newcomer, Betty Brewer, a youngster who was discovered by director Sam Wood singing in Hollywood streets for pennies (the girl is marvelous), and Wood's own sally into a new type of direction.

For the first time on the screen, Fred MacMurray fails to get the girl (Patricia Morison), who marries the more steady Johnny Cash (Dick Foran). And it's on this theory that MOVIE AND RADIO GUIDE predicts "Rangers of Fortune" will be the first of a series starring these three characters.

Which, if "Rangers of Fortune" is a sample, would be a very good idea.

"No Time for Comedy"

Cast: James Stewart, Rosalind Russell, Genevieve Tobin, Charlie Ruggles, Allyn Joslyn, et al. A Warner Bros. picture, produced by Robert Lord; directed by William Keighley, who also directed "The Fighting 69th." From the stage play of the same name by S. N. Behrman.

JUST as the stage play rose above its content with the acting of Katharine Cornell, the movie version of "No Time for Comedy" is entertaining because of the performances of James Stewart and Rosalind Russell, cast as a hick playwright and Broadway actress, respectively.

Fast-paced and amusing during the early reels, the picture loses some of its hilarity in its closing stages when the lightness of its theme turns serious.

The story concerns the adventures of Gaylord Easterbrook (James Stewart), who writes a comic play which

takes him from a small newspaper office in Redfield to the top of Broadway's dizzy theatrical whirl.

Romance is born between Gaylord and Linda Page, a famous stage star (Rosalind Russell), when she manages to have his play produced after its original producer backs out of putting it on.

Gaylord and Miss Page marry, after which he writes successful light comedies until he falls under the influence of Amanda Swift (Genevieve Tobin), who encourages him to do something "really

worth while."

Although Mrs. Swift brings out his "latent talents" as she describes them, Gaylord's serious play is a miserable flop; through this failure he regains his peace of mind and his wife, whom he decides is the most important thing in the world after all.

Charlie Ruggles, of whom far too little has been seen in recent months, turns in an outstanding supporting performance as the understanding husband of the crusading Amanda Swift, while the acting of James Stewart and Miss Russell is of a quality which goes far to keep the picture interesting when its plot and action begin to lag at several intervals.

Interesting situation: The night this picture was previewed in Hollywood, reviewers faced the problem of deciding which of two pictures, both starring Rosalind Russell, to see. At one theater, Universal previewed "Hired Wife," starring Miss Russell and Brian Aherne; a few blocks distant, Warners unreeled "No Time for Comedy." Critics tossed coins as to which picture to attend; Miss Russell, as far as can be determined, stayed at home!

MARRIAGE and the cement business, mixed with bright dialog and good acting, harden into a composition best described as solid entertainment in "Hired Wife," latest of the boss-marries-his-secretary comedies to be produced in Hollywood.

Although there is nothing startlingly new or different about the plot, the acting of Rosalind Russell as Kendal Browning, the secretary, Brian Aherne as Stephen Dexter, the big businessman, Robert Benchley as his lawyer-

adviser, and Virginia Bruce as a beautiful model who happens also to be the "other woman" of the triangle, whips this Universal picture into one of the most amusing froths of the year.

Although audiences will have the feeling they've seen all this before, and while it's easy to figure out how the story will end from the very beginning, the romance between Aherne and Miss Russell, the battles between Miss Russell and Miss Bruce will keep audiences weak with laughter.

WALLACE BEERY'S familiar face and antics are the backbone of "Wyoming," a just-after-the-Civil-War saga of bad men and good women in which beautiful scenic effects almost run off with top honors.

Tailored to the Beery format, with Beery in almost every scene, the only weak spot in this picture is the dialog, and this is not a serious fault.

This time Beery is the brains, Leo Carrillo the worker in a two-man bandit combination. When Beery outsmarts himself in a train robbery, Carrillo departs with the spoils, and Beery, finding himself in a bad spot, throws in with an ex-rebel rancher on his way back to Wyoming. When they arrive, Beery steals his benefactor's outfit, planning to head for California, but he turns back when a gang, in the employ of Joseph Calleia, kills the

rancher in order to steal his cattle.

Beery then finds himself as the protector of the rancher's children, Lucy Kincaid (Ann Rutherford) and Jimmy Kincaid (Bobs Watson). He routs Calleia and his band of cutthroats with some quick hip-shooting and the aid of General Custer (Paul Kelly), who is quite a guy himself.

Romance, such as it is, blooms between Beery and Mehitabel (Marjorie Main), who plays the role of a female blacksmith. Miss Main has been signed to a term contract by M-G-M as a result of her work in this picture and probably will be seen with Beery again soon.

Beery has been in bigger pictures and he has turned in more polished performances, but his work in "Wyoming" is at least up to standard.

Background for the picture is authentic and beautiful. A company spent thirty days in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, filming its scenes.

The Great Profile Turns His Other Cheek

It's a reformed John Barrymore who approaches the sixties sedately—and Ariel's to blame!

A GA-GA little female tourist visited the set of "The Great Profile" in Hollywood during shooting. She ducked her guide and rushed up to John Barrymore. John, in flannelette nightgown, was parked on a chair and guzzling a bottle of soda pop.

"Oh, Mr. Barrymore," cooed the girl, "are you really forty years old?"

The great profile himself, erstwhile Don Juan, Crown Prince of Broadway, Caliban and so forth, loosed a surprised, carbonated belch and turned to her with a Mephistophelian leer.

"It is true," he replied sweetly. "I am forty years old. I have been forty for a good many years, my dear."

John Barrymore has been much, much younger than forty for a good many years—that is, if you can judge by the incredible cut-ups and tempestuous takings-on which have marked his utterly inimitable career. Especially during the frantic fifties, to which he is about to bid adieu, has the Barrymore flair for the spectacular in life, love and the labors of his art come to full flower. But now that he pushes along the last mile toward the sixties, it begins to look—Heaven forbid!—that they might be serene, or at least sedate.

Something is happening to John. There isn't any doubt about it. He ain't what he used to be. The main reason seems to be a very capable and long under-rated young lady whom the Great Lover used coyly to call "Ariel"—and to whom he now refers as "that tall, dark dame, my wife." In other words, Elaine Barrie Barrymore is the woman who knew what she wanted and got it, if only after a series of marital blitzkriegs which for the past year have struck John with Hitlerian effect in scattered centers of this land, to wit: St. Louis, Chicago and New York. Elaine obviously has the situation well in hand and is now dictating her *pax matrimonia* in Hollywood.

That old town, which knew John in his Tower Road mansion and million-dollar-yacht days when anything was likely to sprout from his eccentric whims and usually did, is a little relieved but secretly chagrined, too. Hollywood has never cared in a big way for Elaine, nor Elaine for Hollywood. In fact, Mrs. B. once went on

record in print as a girl whom the movie colony "treated like a leper." To lose Bad Boy Barrymore to Elaine's good influence is probably constructive but sad. It's like having a picnic called off on account of rain.

You see, John has been away from Hollywood for quite a time, and the reports that scorched the wires led the home folks to believe that when the prodigal son returned he would take the fatted calf and swing it around by the tail—especially since John returned to burlesque his own amazing self in a slam-bang screen take-off on his classic theatrical tantrums called "The Great Profile."

The tip-off on the new order came early—but nobody caught its significance. It came after 20th Century-Fox timidly dispatched a wire to John in Manhattan, still stumbling owlishly around the Broadway stage in his mercuric personal circus, "My Dear Children." They explained the plot of "The Great Profile," ready to duck. Like this: *Evans Garrick*, a gifted but erratic Shakespearean great, does a terrible play so his pretty blond wife, who is an even more terrible actress, can get a break. To stand it, he gets

crooked and—the play's a howling success. Then the great Thespian shakes his wife, is reformed by another tootsie—and the play takes a nose-dive. They have to get him drunk again, as before, and as his wife is the only one who can drive him to drink it's a happy reunion.




Their Faith Goes Marching On

The Howards were simple folk who believed in liberty; their life and love is a symbol of America


SELDOM are motion pictures filmed against such a magnificent backdrop of drama as is contained in those years when the United States of America, hewn out of the wilderness, came into being. These are the years against which the love-story of Matt Howard (Cary Grant) and Jane Peyton (Martha Scott) is played in "The Howards of Virginia." During the time which elapsed between the meeting of Matt Howard and Jane Peyton and their death, a new nation, conceived in liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal, was born. The Howards had their full share in this nation's creation. The love-story of the Howards is unfolded before the canvas of Colonial Wil-

liamsburg, Virginia, where John D. Rockefeller, Jr., at a cost of \$20,000,000, has reconstructed the historic city as it was in the 1700's. It is not often that history leaves its settings behind for posterity's motion-picture companies to use in filming her epochal events. The love-story of the Howards is a simple, heart-stirring tale of an aristocratic girl who loves and weds a poor pioneer. In that, it is the eternal story of America. Cary Grant and Martha Scott are supported by an excellent cast, which includes Sir Cedric Hardwicke, Alan Marshall, Richard Carlson, Paul Kelly. It is the type of picture which instills a deep appreciation and reverence for liberties we enjoy. It is a "must" picture.

She stayed with Aunt Emily and the girls for one week, but spent most of the time in Westbridge where she played with Bobby and her best girl friend, Linda. She is now back at school—in the third grade.

BEFORE Dr. Eduard Benes sailed for London, the writer showed him transcripts of radio speeches made on American radio stations by Nazi broadcasters and their American friends. They were the same speeches quoted in the preceding four articles, in which we showed how Herr Goebbels' operatives in the United States were using radio to spread a vicious anti-American, pro-Nazi propaganda.

Dr. Benes was the last president of Czechoslovakia, a land which crumbled under just such subversive attacks as those leveled today at the United States combined with the ill-considered advice of the appeasers who ruled Czechoslovakia's powerful allies. Dr. Benes was frankly amazed at the material I placed before him.

"Even in the Sudetenland," he said, "where the population was almost entirely German and German-speaking, the Nazis did not dare to go so far. Quite frankly, unless steps are taken, America will make the same mistake England made, and I fear for the future."

Dr. Benes is no idle alarmist. He was the practical ruler of the one democracy which had no illusions about Hitler or his aims and purposes, of the one democracy which stood ready and at arms to do battle when battle might have been successful, while the other great democracies dreamed of appeasement and "peace in our time." What Dr. Benes might have to say to America would be well worth listening to, I knew.

"**W**HAT can we do about it?" I asked, "What can we do to stem this tide without destroying the freedom for which we are willing to fight?"

"There are a number of things that can—and must—be done, and you are in a better position to do them here than we were in Czechoslovakia. For example, our republic recognized the minority rights of the Sudeten Germans. We maintained, from public funds, a German-language radio station in Sudetenland, German-language schools and other institutions. Here in the United States, on the other hand, every citizen regardless of whence he comes, is supposed to become an American, to speak the common language and attend the public schools."

"You refer to foreign-language broadcasts, Dr. Benes?"

"Yes. Foreign-language broadcasts and newspapers. When an immigrant comes here, it is his obligation to learn your language and speak it. I can see no reason for foreign-language broadcasts in ordinary times and surely none in times of great emergency."

Examination of the transcripts of radio speeches given over American stations bears out the wisdom of Dr. Benes' observation. Invariably the Nazi broadcaster, speaking in German, is more violent and inflammatory in his remarks than when he speaks in English. Schwinn, in Los Angeles, actually falsified what he claimed were English translations of German speeches he delivered. While the writer feels that radio can do much to Americanize aliens within our boundaries, he feels, too, that in the current crisis, the risks far outweigh the advantages to be gained. And if the free American airwaves are to be used in attacking the American government, then such attacks should be made in English so that all may understand them for what they are.

"We also had pulpit laws in Czechoslovakia." Dr. Benes was now striking at those who used their ministerial robes and robes to spread dissent and race hatred—the Winrods and Coughlins and Jeffers. "Such laws prohibited preachers from using the pulpit to preach political and economic doctrine

and inflammatory propaganda. If they wanted to exercise their prerogative of participating in political discussion, then they must clearly disassociate themselves from the pulpit in doing so." Dr. Benes stood up and shrugged.

"But these are all minor things. I could go on for hours giving details. Do you know what I consider the most dangerous propaganda abroad in the United States today? It is the propaganda of defeatism which Americans are accepting and passing along which says that democracies are no match

organized death and destruction of Hitler. By a practical democracy, I mean a realistic democracy with its feet firmly planted on the ground, alert and ready to meet more than half-way the dangers which face it. I mean a democracy that's strong because its strength comes from the heart of its people and a democracy that is prepared to meet—and overcome—its enemies whether they attack from within or without!"

The Nazi broadcaster is on the air! Here's what Americans can do to get him off

for the efficient, totalitarian nations. This is so utterly untrue—and yet so widely accepted—that it becomes extremely dangerous.

"Before Munich, when German troops were concentrating on our borders, we issued a general mobilization order. And—mark this—our troops were at their battle stations, thoroughly equipped and ready for war—seven hours before the time set for them to be there. Is that inefficiency? It is my honest belief," he added sadly, "that if our friends had permitted us to fight at that time, before Hitler was ready and before he had been bolstered by the arms and munitions he took without a struggle in Czechoslovakia, the war would have been a local war ending in stalemate instead of a world war. Stalemate then, as now, would be a Hitler defeat."

And now Dr. Benes was pointing a way to the American people—a way born of his own bitter experiences, a way deeply rooted in the happenings of current history.

"But to cope with the dictatorships, democracy must be a practical democracy. Ideological democracies, with their feet dangling in midair, are surely at a loss against the well-or-

"Every American must ask himself: Is ours a practical democracy? And if he is dissatisfied with the answer he finds, then he must ask himself: What can I do to help make it a practical democracy?"

Look at events in your own community and try to find the truthful answer to that question. Read your local newspapers, listen to your local radio stations and seek the answer. Are we practical when we permit men, paid in Berlin and trained by Herr Goebbels for their subversive activities, to use our greatest means of reaching and informing the American people? Are we practical when we permit broadcasters, speaking a language few Americans understand, to threaten good American citizens with dire consequences unless they adhere to the Nazi philosophy and help to spread it abroad in this land? Are we being practical when we permit German travel agencies, whose interests are the interests of the Third Reich, to pay for radio programs which spread Nazi philosophy? Are we practical when we permit German diplomats within our borders to direct radio programs throughout the nation designed to undermine and weaken the

government to which they are accredited? Are we being practical when—without raising a finger to prevent—we permit the long fingers of Nazism to reach tenuously into millions of American homes and insidiously feed and grow strong as they sap the very strength of the nation?

Every American owes it to himself, to his family, to his past and his future to seek out the answers to these questions, and if he is dissatisfied with the answer he finds, to protest vigorously to his local radio-station manager who permits such broadcasts; to his congressmen and to the Federal Communications Commission, who are the legal guardians of the airwaves.

Between the American who owns and listens to a radio set (there are fifty million radio sets in the United States) and the gray building along the Wilhelmstrasse which houses Herr Goebbels' propaganda ministry stand three lines of defense. First, the Federal Communications Commission; second, the management of radio stations, and, third, public opinion.

The Federal Communications Commission, under its life- and-death power of licensing radio stations, could effectively end subversive radio activities once and for all through a wise and firm administration of the Communications Act. That act provides that radio stations must broadcast "in the public interest."

The writer challenges the Commission to show how, by any possible stretch of the imagination, radio programs such as those of the Einheitsfront, the German-American Bund, Father Coughlin are in the "public interest." Such programs, on the contrary, are daggers aimed at the very heart of democracy!

If the Commission exerted half as much energy to the enforcement of the "public interest" phrase of the broadcasting act as it did to threatening and censoring stations over which Mae West broadcast her now notorious "Adam and Eve" skit, radio stations in the United States could never be used as tools of the Nazi Fifth Column.

The second effective line of defense against the Nazi broadcaster is the radio-station manager. For the most part, station managers have already fallen into line with those who are determined to fight Nazism and they have hastened to ban programs of this type. But, as is evidenced by the great number of these programs still in existence throughout the land, many station managers, either through ignorance of the crime against their country they abet or, because such programs are good sources of income, have continued to give comfort and aid to their country's enemies.

REFUSAL of the public to listen to such stations, and of businessmen to patronize them, is the best weapon to be used here. Which brings us to the matter of public opinion as a last line of defense against Nazi inroads.

Perhaps the last—and best—word on this phase of our defense against Nazism was spoken by another leader of a people defeated because they failed to take preliminary steps to counter the underground Nazi offensive. Former premier Paul Reynaud, of France, two weeks before France fell, spoke these gloomy—and yet, for us, strangely hopeful—words:

"In their governments, democracies long lacked clear-sightedness and courage. The ideal of patriotism was neglected. We must close this chapter of the world once and for all with the indomitable energy of those whose eyes were opened."



A SIEGE of illness gave authoress Irna Phillips the setting for her serial, "The Woman in White" (NBC, Mon. through Fri.). Miss Phillips said: "That long siege of illness, keeping me in the hospital, made me realize how important doctors and nurses are to all of us, and how quickly they are forgotten when pain is over." The leading character of Miss Phillips' radio serial is Karen Adams (played by Betty Ruth Smith, pretty Wichita,

Kans., actress) and through her, the authoress strives to show that nurses do more than serve the sick; that they serve also as friends and counsellors and that their private lives may be highly colorful in contrast to the pure white of their uniforms. Karen, who has recently begun her married life as the wife of Dr. Kirk Harding (Karl Weber), is faced with two great problems: One is the precipitate marriage of her brother, John (Harry Elders) to

Janet Munson (Lesley Woods), a former receptionist for Dr. Harding. Janet is still infatuated with Dr. Harding, thus complicating Karen's own life and happiness. Janet, about to become a mother, has fled to a nursing-home in New York, leaving no word of her whereabouts. Matters have been further complicated by a letter John has received from Janet explaining her affair with Dr. Harding. John cannot bring himself to believe her infatua-

Trying to help both John and Karen is Dave Talbot, an ex-gangster, who is in love with Karen and who has never believed Dr. Harding worthy of "The Woman in White." Talbot is played by Lester Damon. "The Woman in White," heard Mon. through Fri. over NBC, made its debut in radio on Jan. 3, 1938.

The Business

THE one-night stand is a jumping-off place for tomorrow's big-name bands and the place where bands without "oomph" stay, year after year. Oddly enough, the one-night stand is where the biggest of big-name bands earn the most money. It's the top and bottom of band business and the very backbone of the \$110,000,000-a-year industry designed to keep America—literally—on its toes.

One-night stands consist mostly of public ballrooms of the pay-as-you-enter type; civic and club functions, college proms and private dates—debutante parties, weddings, charity dances sponsored by socialites. The one-night season usually begins in April, right after Lent, and runs through the early fall. In the deep South, the one-nighters are at their height in mid-winter.


Most bands, from the smallest up, play one-nighters on a guarantee-percentage basis. Guarantees run from, in the case of small, unknown bands, mere union wage scale plus traveling expenses to, in the case of the biggies, \$2,000 per night with sixty per cent of the gate receipts above the guaranteed figure. All of the big bands play the one-nighters, and often a big band will play a hotel engagement for several months, just breaking even, in order to have their band broadcast and thus build a following for the profitable one-nighter tour to follow.

College proms and private parties are booked on a flat rate. Prices at proms range from \$1,250 to \$2,000, according to the band's reputation. Once, for a coming-out party for a

Chicago debutante, the ten-piece Coon Sanders organization was paid an all-time high figure of \$7,000 for four hours of music. Another fancy price was that paid Hal Kemp's band, playing for her New Year's Eve party in 1938, by Mrs. Evelyn Walsh McLean, Washington socialite.

Modes of transportation for bands on a one-nighter tour vary with the weather, season and distance of "jumps." The average "jump" is 200 miles, and the favorite means of getting around for bands is in buses, with a truck to carry the instruments. Many bands own their own buses and trucks. For longer "jumps," the train is used and, when the date is important enough, such bandleaders as Guy Lombardo, Benny Goodman, Glen Gray, Tommy Dorsey, Jimmy Dorsey and Orrin Tucker have even chartered planes in order to play a date. On short "jumps," the bandleader frequently permits the men to use their own cars. Under such an arrangement they can find time for a game of golf, a swim or an extra few hours of shut-eye.

Band preferences are different in every section of the country. New England is a hotbed of swing. Chicago and the Midwest vote for sweet music, and in the South sweet music is the preference of dancers, although southerners unbend for an occasional swing band that can give out with good dance tunes to boot. South Carolina is the notable exception to this. South Carolinians like their music raw and wild. The West Coast is a strange mixture of swing and sweet.

Meet the one-night champs—big names that mean big money wherever they play

The Champions

WITHOUT a doubt, the hottest all-around musical attraction in the country today is Kay Kyser's band. Kay has hung up all sorts of records across the one-night stands and he attributes it almost entirely to the radio build-up he has had. Playing at the Civic Auditorium in Pasadena, Calif., he grossed a one-night record of \$9,000 in paid admissions, adding it to records he had already hung up in Atlantic City, Milwaukee, Scranton, Providence. Short jumps by the Kyser band are made in a bus and once, when they were en route from Pittsburgh to the U. of Alabama, they ran into a blizzard and were unable to get their bus up a two-mile hill. Backing to the nearest village, they bought shovels and every manjack of a musician pitched in to throw dirt under its wheels until they got over the summit.

Orrin Tucker, with Wee Bonnie Baker, is another of the hot one-nighters of the moment and an example of how a stand-out vocalist adds to a band's drawing powers. Previous commitments, however, have kept Tucker from playing many of them, but when he played the Variety Club, in Milwaukee, not long ago, he grossed an all-time high of \$6,530.85 for one night. Artie Shaw is another who, if he had continued with his band, would have made a good thing of the one-nighters.

A consistent money-maker rather than a sensational record-setter is Tommy Dorsey, who has a number of ballroom records chalked up to his

credit nevertheless. Dorsey likes to recall that when he was struggling on the one-nighters with his first band and arrived in Johnstown, Pa., for a date, he was paid a hundred dollars not to play because the promoter thought a blizzard would keep the crowd away. Playing that same ballroom two years later, Dorsey accepted a check for \$1,400 from the same promoter for a night of music.

Favorite band of the collegiate set at the moment is that of Glenn Miller, who last spring toured the South playing one prom after another. In addition, he found time to set all-time records for gross receipts at Pottsdam, Pa., Roseland Ballroom, in New York City, and at several county fairs.

Hal Kemp is another favorite of the collegians, and during the past ten years has played more than 400 proms at seventy different colleges. At the same time, he holds records of 3,800 paid admissions at the Coliseum, Greensburg, Pa.; 10,000 paid admissions at the National Tobacco Festival, South Boston, Va., and set a new record for this year's Florida State Fair.

There is only one king of swing, and Benny Goodman is a consistent money-maker and record-setter on the one-night stands. So is Horace Heidt, another radio-built personality, when he can find time to play them. Bob Crosby, Sammy Kaye, Glen Gray and Jimmy Dorsey are other top-fighters who make money and break records on one-night tours with consistency.

GLENN MILLER'S opening at the Pennsylvania Hotel is scheduled for October 7 . . . Benny Goodman is now in the East organizing and rehearsing a new band, and it is very likely that he will introduce the new crew in the Panther Room of Chicago's Hotel Sherman early next month . . . Eddy Duchin is now playing at the Waldorf-Astoria Roof in New York. The Roof closes October 9 but Eddy will not leave the hotel; he moves to the veddy formal Sert Room. A couple of days later Kay Kyser will show his face to New York dancers again when he opens the informal Empire Room at the same hotel on October 12 . . . Bob Crosby's picture deal with 20th Century-Fox seems to be getting hotter. If it goes through, Bob will make two pictures a year . . . Incidentally, if you're at Catalina Island and you want to see Bob Crosby's broadcast, all you have to do is walk up to the Casino Theater box-office, ask for a ticket, and walk right in for the program. My informant reports that after the show the boys in the band, including Crosby, all sit on the stage and exchange wise-cracks with those in the audience, who mob up to the front of the auditorium. All very casual and informal . . . On his broadcast this Sunday night, Bill Stern, the sports commentator, is going to give his listeners quite an unusual surprise. It is customary for genial Bill to present guest artists whose names are prominent in the world of sports. However, this time he is going to have as

his guest Gray Gordon, the ork pilot, who will tell listeners that he discovered the current patriotic hit song "I Am an American" while attending a double-header at the Yankee Stadium.

When Wee Bonnie Baker made Tin Pan Alley sit up and take notice about a year ago with her revival of the hit tune "Oh, Johnny," she was offered a movie contract but turned it down because her boss, Orrin Tucker, was not included in the deal. Now both Tucker and Bonnie are back in Hollywood, prepared to work on a musical picture for Paramount, and they're both very happy about the whole thing . . . Incidentally, one of Tucker's musicians gave the band some unsought publicity back in Buffalo, New York, when he got mixed up with a local gal who haled him into court. The musician pleaded not guilty and he was released

on bail with the case being set for a hearing next Friday . . . The sponsor of Ted Weems' "Beat the Band" program along with NBC and the Music Corporation of America (MCA manages the Weems band) will have to go to court to answer a charge brought against them that the idea of the program was the brain product of the plaintiff. Plaintiff claims he submitted it to MCA in January, 1939.

Ziggy Elman, formerly with Benny Goodman's band, has replaced Bunny Berigan as featured trumpeter with Tommy Dorsey. In the meantime Berigan has lost no time in stepping back into the role of bandleader. He is rehearsing a new band which he expects to introduce within a few weeks.

It is said that Larry Cotton, also of the Heidt organization, may walk to the altar before many months go by . . . Virginia Verrill tied the knot with Jim Breyley, Chicago band manager, on September 11. They went to northern Wisconsin for a brief honeymoon . . . One of Glenn Miller's bandsmen is singing sweet nothings into the

ear of Connie Haines, vocalist with Tommy Dorsey's crew.

EDDY DUCHIN—"Practice Makes Perfect" (Columbia 35702)—A BMI tune which has become popular enough to hit the "Hit Parade" is given a waxing, with Eddy Duchin, pianist de luxe, taking solo honors. Duchin arrangement is extraordinarily pleasing, in somewhat measured tempo. Reverse: "I'm Home Again" (Duchin and orchestra).

GLENN MILLER—"The Call of the Canyon" (Bluebird B-10845)—Zane Grey's western novel by the same name undoubtedly suggested the title for this ballad which gives vocalist Ray Eberle a chance to inject some melodic notes, in a slow, feeling tempo. Ray comes to the end of the arrangement with a vocal passage that reaches out to get you. Reverse: "Our Love Affair" (Miller band and vocalist.)

ALEC TEMPLETON—"Some of These Days" (Columbia 35697)—A piano solo with vocal interpolations by the wizard of the ivories; a revival of a jazz number that was a prime favorite in its day. Templeton steps up the tempo, although the tune was plenty "hot" for its time. Reverse: "Humming Blues" (Templeton piano solo).

The plaintiff charges that Winchell in his column warned purchasers to beware of Davidson's fur establishment because of a deal in which Penny Wise (real name Doris Fisher), Eddy Duchin's vocalist, was allegedly cheated

THERE won't be as much politics on the air this year as in the Landon-Roosevelt campaign of 1936 for the simple reason there isn't as much money available to spend. The Hatch Act limits national campaign expenditures to three million dollars per party for all purposes, which would hold down the spending even if the parties had the money. Already the Democrats and Republicans have spent one million dollars each and the fireworks are yet to come on the balance. In 1936 the Democrats spent five hundred thousand dollars on radio. This year the sum will be cut exactly in half. What the G. O. P. will actually do will be ninety percent less than what they'd like to do. The Socialists have from five thousand dollars to six thousand dollars to spend on radio, and that will probably go in one lump sum when the party puts Norman Thomas, its presidential candidate, on twenty-six Mutual stations for a quarter hour on October 20. The Communists have more money than the Socialists and plan to spend from thirty thousand dollars to forty thousand dollars on air-campaigning. The Democrats made the smartest radio move so far, buying up the 11 p.m. to 12 midnight (EST) spot on NBC-Blue, NBC-Red, CBS and MBS on election eve—assuring them of the last word in this campaign.

Wendell L. Willkie has announced that if he is elected he will prosecute those who bought advertising space in the Democratic Campaign Book, on the grounds that such solicitation of funds is a violation of the Hatch Act. In view of this statement, it was with considerable speculation that radio row awaited the distribution of the books to see if any of its great were advertisers. Distribution was made in

Manhattan last week and conspicuous was a one-half page from radio star Jack Benny.

Is Brinkley Anti-Democratic?

Dr. L. M. Birkhead and his Friends of Democracy have filed a report with the Federal Communications Commission charging that Dr. John R. Brinkley's Mexican station XERA is engaging in anti-democratic activities. Birkhead said the goat-gland doctor was anti-Semitic and pro-Nazi. Brinkley, across the border, is said to be unconcerned about U. S. opinion of him.

Choice Gossip

Oscar Levant was wearing an F. D. R. button at NBC the other day when a photographer came up to snap him. "Would you remove the button until I get a picture?" said the picture-taker. "Against the rules here, you know" . . . June Allison of "The Aldrich Family" and Jackson Beck, actor, are a twosome . . . Francia White gets a weekly check from the telephone company for her work on "The Telephone Hour," then has to turn a lot of it back for telephone bills because she insists upon talking to her relatives in California . . . Agnes Moorehead takes over the duties of Barbara Weeks on "The Good Will Hour" while Barbara prepares for the blessed event she expects this month . . . Mr. and Mrs. Doug Browning (he's the announcer) have a nine-pound five-ounce daughter, Patricia, born August 31 . . . Yoichi Hiroake, NBC xylophonist, is the father of a son, eight and one-half pounds, born September 3 . . . Bill Eddy, NBC television expert who made a name for himself when he broadcast the *Squalus* disaster, has resigned from the network to work for a Chicago station.

We think that if every small town would do this the war relief would be far better off. It takes get-up and go, but that's not hard to get if you're not timid."

Football Broadcasts to Reach New High

Football broadcasts will this year reach a new high with about three million dollars going to radio for football time. Atlantic Refining leads with 112 games booked on seventy-eight stations . . . Singin' Sam (Harry Frankel) lives on a Richmond, Indiana, farm and comes to New York every second week to transcribe forty songs for his radio sponsor . . . Fourteen Arch Oboler radio plays have been put into one book under the title of "The Art of Radio Writing," and published by Random House . . . Edward MacHugh, the Gospel Singer, is again living in his Westport, Connecticut, home after making extensive repairs necessitated by a fire several months ago . . . Bess Johnson will be written out of "Hilltop House" the first week in October so she can fly to Elkins, West Virginia, to be a guest at the eleventh annual Forest Festival, in which her father, Senator Herman Johnson, is program chairman of the affair.

LONDON'S PROGRAMS FOR THE NORTH AMERICAN AUDIENCE

LONDON broadcasts to North America daily from 5:25 to 8:15 and from 8:25 to 10:35 p.m. CST over short-wave stations GSD (11.75) and GSC (9.58). GSD usually furnishes the best reception, but late evenings GSC is sometimes the better of the two frequencies.

These programs for North America are timely, informative and interesting and are broadcast with reliable precision despite the devastating air raids that are usually in progress while these transmissions are on the air. During air-raid alarms, those programs are undoubtedly broadcast from bomb-proof studios deep in the bowels of the earth. Confirming my predictions, the British short-wave station, with its extensive maze of antennae, has not been subjected to a single air raid, since the Nazis still expect to take over this huge Empire station completely intact.

The principal items broadcast nightly in the North American programs are as follows (time is Central Standard):

"Britain Speaks" is a nightly series of talks describing life in London during the air raids. On Sundays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, this feature is in charge of J. B. Priestley, noted British author, who gives his own individual views of events as they occur. Priestley prefers to give plain comment, speaking as if he were leaning back in his armchair, pipe in hand, talking to a circle of his own American friends. On Mondays, "Britain Speaks" is given by none other than our own stage and screen star, Leslie Howard. On Fridays, J. Wick-

ham Steed, famous journalist and commentator, takes over the microphone. On Wednesdays and Saturdays, guest speakers—including cabinet ministers—appear on the program.

"Radio Newsreel," a very interesting period, features political commentaries, eye-witness accounts of events in the news—illustrated by actual on-the-spot recordings made by the BBC's mobile unit—and short talks by soldiers, sailors, airmen (particularly Canadians) and by civil-defense workers. It is relayed in Canada by the Canadian Broadcasting network.

Star variety is a lively variety spot which includes "Introduction Night"—bringing a new personality to the program each week, "Songs and Syncopation," "Starlight," "Close-up," and "Off the Record," each starring artists that top the British variety bills.







Denmark with a Shakespearian company, where Vivien played Ophelia to Olivier's melancholy Dane in "Hamlet."

When they returned to England, they were as much in love as two honest people can be, and their families realized it. The principals in each case knew their respective marriages were doomed, but with true British reserve refused to do anything about it.

This passive and unhappy state of affairs held until Olivier, in the summer of 1938, left for Hollywood, there to enact the role of Heathcliff in "Wuthering Heights." Vivien followed later in the year, to visit Hollywood friends. She arrived on the eve of Olivier's departure for the New York stage, where he was to appear with Katharine Cornell in "No Time for Comedy." It was shortly after Vivien's advent on the Hollywood scene, too, that David O. Selznick selected her for his *Scarlett* in "Gone With the Wind."

In August of 1939, both Jill Esmond and Herbert Leigh Holman instituted proceedings for divorce from their respective mates, each charging desertion and naming Vivien and Olivier—as the case might be—as corespondents. This, of course, was necessary according to English divorce law.

There remained, then, but a year to pass for the two to marry.

For a brief period early in the summer of the current year there was talk that the marriage would be postponed until after the close of the war, when both were ordered back to England and war duty by their government. The day before they were to have sailed for the British Isles, orders reached them a second time . . . they were not to depart this country now but to hold themselves in readiness for the journey later.

They returned to Hollywood to prepare for their roles in "The Life of Lady Hamilton and Lord Nelson," a fitting love story. On August 5, Olivier learned his wife had obtained her final divorce decree. Three weeks later to the day, Vivien received the same dispatch in regard to her own marriage.
