

The Bette Davis Marriage Brings a Letter from a Skeptic

THE publication which permits its readers to be hoaxed by inept or inaccurate reporting is not worth the ink and paper on which it is printed. That is why our writers are such stalwarts as James Street, Kay Proctor, Cornelius Vanderbilt, Jr., Lupton A. Wilkinson, and others of similar responsibility. We have believed for a long time that our readers have faith in the things they read in Movie-Radio Guide.

A letter which crossed our desk the other day, however, caused us some worry. It said:

The story of Bette Davis driving through storm and strife to reach her expected husband and wedding party makes very romantic reading, but I wish someone would tell the real true story for a change. My father, Marcus E. Rawlins, runs the Clemenceau Airport. Justin Dart often lands there, especially when it is raining and the field near his ranch is muddy. On December 29, just before dark, he came in. . . . Quite a number of us went out to see him land. A very small woman got out of the plane and stood with her back to the crowd. A few moments later Justin Dart got out, and after all the boxes and packages had been removed from the plane and placed in a covered pick-up truck, Jane Bryan Dart also got out. They have landed here many times and no one ever pays any attention to them, but some of us did wonder who their friend was. The two women got in the truck and my dad went over to talk to Jane Dart. The minute he saw the other woman's face he recognized her. He said, "Well, hello." She smiled and said "Hello" and then quickly put one finger to her mouth, silently asking him not to reveal her identity. He didn't tell anyone who she was until after they came back to get the plane the day after the wedding.

That woman was Bette Davis. She flew in here with Jane and Justin Dart, and I wish someone would tell what really happened instead of feeding the gullible people with fairy-tales of Bette's bravery in driving over stormy roads to marry the man she loved. Sincerely, Mrs. J. B. Tissaw.

Well, we were considerably worried. We wired Kay Proctor for an explanation. We got it.

Our Davis marriage story corroborated in detail by Bette Davis and others in wedding party. Woman who arrived in plane with Mr. and Mrs. Dart was Barbara Pelgram, Bette's sister, who is frequently mistaken for Bette even in Hollywood. Darts piloted Barbara to Arizona from Hollywood for ceremony. Her identity as their passenger can be confirmed by Mrs. Tissaw upon Dart's return to Arizona in March. TODAY THE CORNERSTONE of our democracy is based on the theory of freedom of the press, free speech, and complete information in the hands of every citizen. The average citizen here is better equipped to cope with the problems that confront our nation than the citizens of any state since time began.

But more and more, as we talk to our neighbors, we find puzzlement and confusion. Men are informed but they are bewildered. A great statesman whom they respect, such a man as Senator Wheeler of Montana, says that President Roosevelt is power-crazy and a would-be dictator. A great Republican, Wendell Willkie, says the President should be given every power he asks. Men of much experience take opposite sides on the Town Meeting broadcasts. Round Table discussions turn into dogfights.

Who is right? If experts whose experience is vastly greater than our own, if these men cannot agree, how can we who only labor and listen come to valid conclusions?

Democracy is a process of determining the public will and putting that will into practise. But now, hedged about by such mighty dilemmas, what is your will or my will? Many of us do not know; and the extent to which we do not know is the extent of our danger.

Dictatorship knows! It knows with a savage, lustful decision. Its will is to conquer, conquer, conquer. We must know, too, or we will perish.

Can we know? We have asked our leaders for an answer and they say that we can know. We can know by thinking. They mean sheer, hard brow-furrowing thinking. Perhaps we have gone too long without thinking. Perhaps we have become too soft-headed. Now is the time to learn if we can resolve all of our vast knowledge into hard-driving decision. If we can turn vacillation into determination, if we can strain from the truths that we know the harsh, ineluctable residue of our own destiny, and know that neither hell nor highwater can swerve us from the last-man defense of our democracy, then the knowledge that has been brought to us from the earth's four corners by radio will be a blessing without peer since man began to reason for himself.

NOT so long ago Olivia de Havilland was a lady the like of which was never seen before on land or sea.

An animated doll more than anything else, she cavorted over the Warner lot like a character out of Walter Scott—an ivory-tower princess who didn't know what time it was, beautiful in a languid way but hardly exciting.

She believed in fairies, rhapsodized over beauty, chirped constantly about how wonderful life could be if you'd let it, flitted here and yon totally innocent of the art of make-up or the greater art of dressing, and spread her sweetness and light on director and gaffer alike. She was alternately kittenish and whimsical. You won't believe it, but she used to appear—maybe alight is the better word—in the Green Room where the Warner stars eat their lunch and go to barking like

a Scottie. Anything to make folks happy.

Writers who were granted audience went back to their typewriters and wrote dreary pieces on such themes as "Sweet Is the Word for Olivia," telling about her breathlessness, her maiden modesty and her eternal eagerness to blush.

They went on to explain how Miss O. was the last of the old-fashioned glamour girls, the kind of beauty you'd like for a sister, a cherub who slept in white-and-pink nightgowns, thought pajamas were definitely unfeminine, and confessed she was "different." She slumbered (bedecked in these same white-and-pink jobs) in a large antique bed, using one pillow, a swansdown comforter and three blankets. Or so she confided to the writing gentlemen. Maybe she had grown tired of doubling for Snow White. Anyhow, one morning on the set she blew a line and said, “-*&!!*(.)” You could have heard London Bridge come toppling down all over the lot.

The electrician couldn't believe his ears. Had Miss De Havilland, the Campfire Girls' patron saint, really exploded with a “-*&!!*(.)” he inquired of the assistant director.

“She emphatically did,” the a. d. came back. “I'm going over and congratulate her. I think our little princess is on the verge of discovering life.”

"**S**TRAWBERRY BLONDE" will take Pa and Ma, Grandpa and Grandma back to the early 1900's when "twenty-three skiddoo" and "I love my wife, but oh you kid" were considered brash and daring slang. What's more, this Warner Bros. comedy-romance shows off Jimmy Cagney in the lightest role in years and even gives Olivia de Havilland lines that draw belly-laugh.

The third interesting feature of "Strawberry Blonde" is the excellent job of acting turned in by Rita Hayworth, playing the title role.

With the pedal pushed down rather heavily on burlesque, the story tells of the life of Cagney as Biff Grimes, correspondence-school dentist, and Jack Carson as Hugo Barnstead, ward-heeler who winds up wealthy through his political construction company. Both lads make a play for lovely Virginia Brush, the strawberry blonde portrayed by Miss Hayworth, but on first dating and subsequently at the altar Grimes finds he has been switched via the double-date route to pretty Amy (Olivia de Havilland). Biff and Amy live happily in poverty until the affluent Barnstead sidetracks Grimes' dental career with a job in the construction company.

Here Grimes is made a vice president and signs specification contracts unwittingly. Result: Grimes takes a prison rap. When he gets out of prison, his revenge is accomplished in a unique fashion. "Strawberry Blonde" is good and okay for the family.

WHEN a picture can draw applause from a projection-room audience composed solely of critics and hard-boiled studio production experts, it has to be good. And that is what happened at the preview showing of "Golden Hoofs," Jane Withers' growing-up picture. Jane's first venture into a "young lady" role is distinctly successful, and it doesn't seem at all incredible to watch her in an adolescent romance on the screen. She handles the part with skill.

In "Golden Hoofs" Jane becomes infatuated with Buddy Rogers, later

to find that he is engaged to another girl. He is the new owner of a breeding farm which for many years has been devoted to raising horses for sulky racing. Rogers is interested only in making money out of the horses, and is getting rid of all the sulky horses when Jane steps into the scene and wins him over to sulky racing. IT'S Margaret Sullavan and Charles Boyer for this month's Movie-Radio Guide Award for Distinguished Acting. They have earned it for their brilliant work in the picture "Back Street." This is the opinion of Jimmie Fidler, who each month selects the actor and actress to receive the award.

Granting that Boyer was a bit miscast as the middle-westerner who came to New York and became a great banker, we can overlook his accent and see the true fineness of his performance. "His role in the film isn't a happy one," Mr. Fidler points out. "He plays the part of a married man in love with another woman. For this you can't respect him, but he pours such reality into his role that you do feel sorry for him. Singly, I think Boyer's death scene is the highlight of 'Back Street.'"

Mr. Fidler had this to say of Miss Sullavan, who plays the other woman in the film. "Miss Sullavan is superb. I've often said that she is my choice as the most consistently good performer on the screen. I can't recall ever seeing Margaret make a false step on the screen. 'Back Street' adds much to her glory. Perhaps it isn't her best performance, but it is good enough for a lot of other so-called artists to take home and study by the hour. Miss Sullavan moves so gracefully through difficult, emotional scenes that she makes them appear easy—which, to my way of thinking, is the supreme test of fine acting."

In making "Back Street," both Boyer and Miss Sullavan had something to shoot at—the brilliantly done version of the same film made with Irene Dunne and John Boles in the leading roles as a silent film of many years ago. That they have topped these earlier performances puts their portrayals of two difficult roles well at the top of grand performances of '41.



"SCATTERGOOD BAINES" is amazingly and faithfully brought to life by Guy Kibbee in this first of a series of feature pictures to be produced by Jerrold T. Brandt, based on the lovable fiction character invented twenty years ago and kept alive to date by Clarence Budington Kelland.

Kibbee's Scattergood likes to sit shoeless in his favorite chair on the porch of his general store in Coldwater and twiddle his toes while radiating his genial personality, philosophy and keen business advice to the citizens of the community. Yes, no

METRO-GOLDWYN-MAYER advertises each of the Dr. Kildare stories, in which Lew Ayres mends bodies and breaks hearts, as "It's New." So is Lew Ayres. He may be doing business with the same sad, sweet smile and at the same stand, but he's a fresh Ayres who has blasted once and for all the silly adage that they never come back in Hollywood.

Now that his name means money in the producers' poke again, they'll tell you that Mr. Ayres has not staged one of the greatest comebacks of all times because he has never been far away. He has merely come back from obscurity—and he had to climb uphill all the way.

The man who made us hate war and loathe war-makers in "All Quiet on the Western Front" found everything quiet on the West Coast front for several years because he insisted on being what he is—a sensitive, philosophical fellow who wanted to have his own way in a business where no man does as he pleases. To be brutally frank, Mr. Ayres was professionally dead for several years, as dead as the hero of "All Quiet on the Western Front." His resurrection is an incredible story of a man who wouldn't stay dead, and, although I dislike sentimental morals in stories, the life of

Lew Ayres should be an inspiration to any man who has been slapped flat by fate. My friends, if they can come back in Hollywood, they can come back anywhere.

Mr. Ayres carries a note-book most of the time and is everlastingly jotting down poems, gems of philosophy and other things that are good for a man's mind and soul. One of his favorite bits of verbmongering is this eyedropper full of wisdom by Fannie Hurst: "Fulfillment, even the outer rim of it, is carpeted in stardust and is cheap at any price."

Back in Minneapolis, where he was born on December 28, 1907, the youngster was considered something of a fancy-pants by the other fellows because he actually enjoyed studying music and was kicking octaves around while the other boys were kicking footballs. His real name is Lew Ayer. His family was called "The Ayers," and he was known as the Ayres boy. The name stuck. His father was Lewis Ayer, a court reporter by day and a cello player by night. Grandma Ayer taught music for twenty-five years, and the boy spent the first eight years of his life in an atmosphere of beauty and tenderness. He lived in a world of make-believe until his father and mother were divorced.

"The court played Mother a dirty

trick," he said. "It gave me to her."

He was ten when his mother married again and moved to San Diego. In California he led a normal, happy life. The boys called him Fats because his face looked like a full moon.

"I made up my mind to go into the movies when I was just a kid," Fats said. "I said nothing about it, of course. The boys would have laughed. I laugh myself when I look back."

HE WAS graduated from high school at sixteen, and at the University of Arizona he helped organize a band. Bored with college, Fats packed his banjo, guitar and a few other trinkets and aimed for the Mexican border, a wandering troubadour playing for his supper.

"I was seventeen," he said, "and soon I hadn't an illusion left. Maybe it was good for me. If you have ideals and lose them, it causes heartaches."

Mr. Ayres talks tough and acts tenderly. He snarls at ideals, but clings to them.

His first appearance in movies was as a banjo player in a Vitaphone short, and then he began haunting the studios. It was the same old story. He got the Hollywood run-around; promises, praise and phooey, but no pay. The press-agents report now that Mr. Fats Ayres finally won because of his persistency and talent. Nuts! There was a lot of luck in it. One evening at a club a lovely lady smiled at him. Mr. Ayres is not difficult to smile at. So he danced with her. In reality, she was Lili Damita. But to Lew she was the lady known as luck. A scout saw them together and assumed Mr. Ayres was a somebody. The scout, clever and always right, never dreamed that Lili would be dancing with a nobody. Out of that came Lew's first test for Pathe and a \$75-a-week job. He didn't set the woods on fire. As an actor, Mr. Ayres was a good banjo player. But he kept playing and another lady entered his life. In reality, she was Greta Garbo, but to Lew she was the number two lady who is known as luck. Miss Garbo picked the boy to play opposite her in "The Kiss." Mr. Ayres is not hard to kiss, I have been told. Miss Garbo is. She is even hard to catch, much less kiss. Anyway Mr. Ayres put his heart and lips in the job and did all right. Or so they say. Actually, it didn't make much difference who kissed Miss Garbo in "The Kiss." She was so famous at that time that any actor who got close enough to her to smell her perfume was made.

Hollywood is prone to give Miss Garbo credit for Ayres' success. It is less romantic but quite more accurate

Dr. Kildare *and* Mr. Ayres

to report that that distinction belongs to Paul Bern, who has laid up for himself a reward in heaven—where there are real stars and a good Director—for his kindness to unknown actors, including Ayres, Joan Crawford and Jean Harlow.

Bern suggested Lew as the star in "All Quiet on the Western Front." Ayres took some punishment while making the show and at times acted like a sophomore. (Incidentally, "The Sophomore" was the first job in which he spoke a line.) The dialog director in "All Quiet" stayed on Mr. Ayres' neck. Mr. Ayres blew up. He decided to quit pictures right in the middle of a show. They lynch men for less in Hollywood. Billy Bakewell brought him to his senses, and five months later "All Quiet" and Mr. Lew Ayres were the talk of Hollywood. His salary leaped to \$2,500 a week, and on September 15, 1931, a year after he had reached stardom, he married Lola

Lane. The marriage ended in 1933.

Mr. Ayres hit his peak in "All Quiet." Perhaps his second-best job was "State Fair." But in between he turned out pictures by the gross. The studios tried to work him in juveniles. He's got a kid's face, an old man's heart and a wise man's brain. Mr. Ayres didn't like to portray baby-faced roles. So he began slipping. Most folks have forgotten it, but Jim Cagney's first break was in an Ayres' show. So was Alice Faye's. Edward Arnold, Edward G. Robinson and Jean Harlow also got their picture starts with Lew.

SSOME people trace Ayres' decline to his marriage in 1934 with Ginger Rogers. They smugly say that Miss Rogers outshone her husband and that his sensitive spirit couldn't take it.

That is absurd. There is not but a handful of people in Hollywood who are in Ayres' class for sheer intelligence. Mr. Ayres got a little fed up with the froth of Hollywood. He got weary of taking orders from directors who didn't understand him and many of whom held their jobs because of nepotism. (Many still hold their jobs for the same reason.)

Ayres decided to be a director. The craft snorted. It was treason—an actor believing he was intelligent enough to direct. Mr. Ayres went into retirement. He would either direct or he wouldn't play. Hollywood thought he was sulking. His marriage with Rogers had gone on the rocks, but instead of sulking, Ayres was in his \$15,000 hill-top home studying astronomy.

Hollywood whispered that he was broke and soon would be back begging for bits. But Mr. Ayres had done the incredible in Hollywood. He had saved

He did all right, too, and Columbia grabbed him on condition that he would act as well as direct. But they wouldn't let him direct, so Ayres walked out. He had the same experience with Paramount, and it began to look as though Hollywood had beaten him until the word got around that he always had been a flash in the pan. That hurt Mr. Ayres, so just to show the wise boys that he knew a trick or two he did the drunk in "Holiday." It was as good a job as "All Quiet."

After "Holiday," figuratively and literally, Ayres went to M-G-M for the Dr. Kildare series. He didn't win his one-man fight against Hollywood, because he is not a director. But he didn't lose, for M-G-M is giving him stories that fit him. The Lionel Barrymore-Lew Ayres tie-up is one of the finest things that ever has come out of Hollywood, and next to the Hardy family the Kildare stories are the best bits of modern Americana on the screen.

At thirty-three, Mr. Ayres is a student and philosopher, a recluse with no illusions about happiness and women. His two unsuccessful marriages left marks on him. He is not bitter, but neither is he sentimentally sad. He simply doesn't give a darn. He lives on Lookout Mountain with his chef, Josef. He has few friends. These include Billy Bakewell, Ken Murray, Phil Harris and Clarence Locan, the unit man of the Kildare job. The only woman in his life now is Margaret McKay, and their relation is one of those brother-sister things.

He is one of the hardest men in Hollywood to know and compared with him, Miss Garbo is a publicity fiend. He shies away from people but is friendly to all animals, excepting man.

At his Lookout Mountain home a family of squirrels trails him when he walks around his yard.

Mr. Ayres is a rock collector, the result of his studies of geology. Around his mountain home is a collection of rocks that resemble gnomes. Vines and moss grow in the crevices of rocks. Mr. Ayres, the botanist, is very proud of his vines and exhibits them to his friends. One day he pointed out his favorite vine and a visitor laughed. The vine was poison oak. Mr. Ayres is the kind of man who would like poison oak because it is about the most exclusive vine in the world, a plant that men avoid and one that lives its own life.

Sometimes, in a rare burst of humor, Mr. Ayres strains himself and lifts a huge rock near his swimming-pool. His guests marvel at his strength. Then Ayres calmly tosses the rock into his pool as though it were a feather. And the rock floats. It is petrified and hollow.

HE SPENDS many of his evenings studying the skies and is something of an authority on astronomy, geology, mineralogy and philosophy. He speaks several languages and right now is studying Hungarian. Which seems a bit silly except for musical purposes. He has been taking a course in meteorology at California Tech, and is an unofficial observer for the local weather bureau. Recently Mr. Weather-Man Ayres predicted a clear day and invited some friends to an outdoor barbecue. It snowed that morning and rained that afternoon. Which makes Mr. Ayres a qualified observer.

He is a serious reader, particularly of Anatole France. And he's a fair-to-middling artist with oils and crayons. Studio publicity reports he's a pretty good sculptor. In fact, they say Mr. Ayres does everything. I assume he knows more about the arts than he does about directing, for his picture judgment is notoriously bad. Every show that he thinks is good usually flops and vice versa. Mr. Ayres even thought the Kildare series was no good!

He maintains one of the finest libraries of symphonic recordings in Hollywood. He has an electric pipe organ which he plays in the evenings.

He isn't much of an athlete and doesn't care for fast and furious sports, but he does enjoy walking and an occasional swim. His clothing taste runs to sports styles, tweeds and careless ensembles. He has worn the same old hat for many years and his hat and a beautiful Scotch plaid scarf are his favorite pieces of apparel.

He seldom drinks and never smokes.

He rarely eats meat much to the disgust of Josef, his Czech cook. Josef enjoys preparing elaborate dishes, but Mr. Ayres refuses them. However, the chef takes candid camera pictures of the food he prepares and shows the pictures to Lew's friends. When men see the beautiful things that Mr. Ayres refuses to eat they are prone to think he is a bit of a crack-pot. Mr. Ayres probably knows it better than anyone in the world, but his habit of denying himself the flesh-pots of good things is characteristic of men with martyr complexes. Many studious men who worry and fret over the stupidity of



his money and was able to sit on his front porch and thumb his nose at the world. He discovered that there was more pleasure in studying stars through a telescope than in mugging them through sweat and grease-paint. He staged a sort of one-man strike and said he wouldn't come back to work until they made him a director. For three years he stayed out, and then Republic Pictures brought him back. There is a tendency in Hollywood to look down the nose at Republic, but those boys out there are fast and unorthodox thinkers. They allowed Mr. Ayres to direct "Hearts in Bondage." He told them he would act in two shows if they would give him a chance to direct one for nothing.


"VIRGINIA" — Movie - Radio Guide Picture of the Week

UNLIKE most films made with the South as a background, "Virginia" is a tale of the South of today and, like the others, derives its conflict from the invasion of the South by wealthy northerners through the more peaceful process of purchasing ancestral—but tax-ridden and run-down—estates in Virginia's fox-hunting blue

grass. It is the conflict of money and power brought face to face with tradition. Edward H. Griffith, who directed and collaborated in writing "Virginia," is himself a Virginian and, with traditional pride of the Virginian, insisted upon shooting the film almost in its entirety in that state. "It couldn't be duplicated," he insisted. "Not for

Technicolor." A real Virginia estate—that of Mrs. Emily Nolting, thirty-five miles from Charlottesville—is used in the film. To this location, a company of more than three hundred, including such stars as Madeleine Carroll, Fred MacMurray and the new Mr. Stirling Hayden, was transported. An inn, the largest hotel in Charlottesville and a

section of the Farmington Country Club were pressed into service for housing the troupe. Trailers and old slave quarters on the estate were used as dressing-rooms. No face-lifting was done on the Nolting place. It was shot "as is." Many Virginians participated in different sequences of the film. "Virginia" was released in February.



THE METROPOLITAN OPERA COMPANY PRESENTS "THE BARBER OF SEVILLE" BY GIACCHINO ROSSINI: THREE ACTS, IN ITALIAN, NBC. The cast: Rosina, Josephine Tuminia, soprano; *The Count of Almaviva*, Bruno Landi, tenor; *Figaro*, John Charles Thomas, baritone; *Dr. Bartolo*, Salvatore Baccaloni, bass; *Don Basilio*, Ezio Pinza, bass; *Berta*, Irra Petina, soprano. Conductor, Genaro Papi.

This amusing comedy-opera was taken by Rossini from a play by Beaumarchais, the same source that produced the libretto for Mozart's "Marriage of Figaro," in which many of the same characters figure. The plot is farcical, the music one series of bubbling melodies, of which the most famous is Figaro's aria, "Largo al Factotum" ("Make Room for the Factotum"). The action is laid in Seville in the eighteenth century, and opens in a Seville street. Count Almaviva, deeply in love with Rosina, ward of Dr. Bartolo, brings a band of musicians to serenade her. He dismisses the musicians, but lingers for a mo-

ment and hears the approach of Figaro, the town barber and general fixer for unhappy lovers. Figaro sings of his talents ("Largo al Factotum") and boasts that no lover can get along without him. The Count persuades Figaro to arrange a meeting with Rosina, at which he shall be introduced as "Lindor" so that the girl may not be influenced by his title. Dr. Bartolo emerges from the house as the two men hide, and instructs the servant that no one is to enter except the music teacher, Basilio, who is helping the old doctor to marry his ward for her dowry. Bartolo leaves, and the Count and Figaro plan to disguise the Count as a dragoon and have him billeted in Bartolo's house. The scene of Act II is a room in Bartolo's house. Rosina reads a note from "Lindor," singing the delightful "Una voce poco fa" ("A Little Voice I Hear"), a glittering coloratura aria. Basilio tells Bartolo of Count Almaviva, and in the aria "La Calunnia" they plot to blacken the Count's character so that Rosina will reject him. Rosina gives Figaro a letter for "Lindor." Dr. Bartolo accuses his ward of flirting, and in the midst of the scene the disguised Count arrives, pretending drunkenness. Bartolo penetrates his disguise and rushes out to get exemption from quartering soldiers. The lovers are left alone for a moment. In Act Three, again in Bartolo's house, the Count has disguised himself as a music teacher, substituting for Basilio, supposedly ill. Basilio shows up in perfect health, but the Count manages to bribe him as Figaro shaves the old doctor. In the final scene Bartolo has convinced Rosina of the Count's bad character and she promises to marry her guardian. He goes off to get the notary, but meanwhile the Count and Figaro betray the whole plot to Rosina. She is overjoyed to find that the Count and "Lindor" are one, and when the notary returns he marries them.





Sometimes they're initiating an eastern tenderfoot visiting the ranch; sometimes they're saving the school-teacher and her children trapped in a ring of fire. Like Autry, other singers on the show also star in these stories. Mary Lee, fifteen-year-old black-eyed miss, with apple cheeks and curls, for instance, assays feminine roles. Three Oklahoma


cowboys—Jimmy Wakely, Dick Reinhart and Johnny Bond—who strum gee-tars and harmonize songs of the Old West, become ranch hands, or even villainous cattle-rustlers. And genial Tom Hanlon, once a football player and now the 340-pound "Tiny" of films, watches the rancheros with pleasure, giving interim announcements for the sponsor, Wrigley's gum.

In this business of being cowboy-for-the-masses, Gene Autry has no peer. When he quit his job as telegrapher at Ravia, Oklahoma, to sing western songs at station WLS in Chicago, he started something which has since landed him in the position of American public hero number one. His motion-picture adventures with "Champ," the amazing horse, bring him twelve thousand fan letters a week. His famous recording of "That Silver-Haired Daddy of Mine" has sold more than ten million copies. He is the one incomparable cowboy of broadcasting.

A HEAVEN for HORSES ?

You be the judge. Listen in to the Santa Anita Handicap Saturday and read the story of Chase Me

Is there a heaven for horses? This Saturday another group of great horses—the flower of hundreds of years of breeding and training—will go to the post to compete in the Santa Anita Handicap, richest of all horse-races. When they have run their race, when they have won their laurels and come to the end of their racing days, will that be the end? Here is the story of Chase Me, one like them, one who ran as they until a tragic fate overtook him. It is told by Sam Balter, "Inside of Sports" commentator for Phillies cigars, as he told it on his broadcast. Read it and you will wonder too, for certainly if there is a heaven for horses Chase Me is there.—Editor.

IN THE bright little suburb of Monkton, Maryland, there is today a mound of earth that marks a grave, the grave of that horse, unlike almost any other in the history of racing. To the Bosleys—Mrs. Elizabeth Bosley and her three children, Sara, Jackie and Betty—it is still a shrine, although Chase Me was lowered into it six years ago this month on May 19, 1934. On this day Chase Me was running in the Metropolitan Handicap at Belmont Park, one of America's leading features. He was making one of his famous moves towards the leaders,

running head and head with the mighty Equipoise, when he stumbled, fell in a heap, a fragile, unmendable leg broken—and was destroyed. He broke a leg in a race and had to be shot and was decently buried—and that was all. Or was it? You be the judge.

There was a sight none at Belmont Park that day would like to see again. Chase Me died with his owner, Elizabeth Bosley, prostrate across his body, begging them to do it to her, too—and therein lies a most amazing tale.

Chase Me, who might have become the greatest race-horse of his time, was no race-horse at all. He was a household pet, he was a member of the family and he really belonged to thirteen-year-old Sara. As we get the tale from Gerald Scott of the New York *Mirror*, Mrs. Bosley was told by veterinarians that there was some defect in the animal's physiology which made it certain he would never race. It was of small moment. Mrs. Bosley wanted Chase Me merely as a pet and a saddle-horse for the children. For four years he was that and only that. Now they say a race-horse has to be reared and trained as a race-horse. Chase Me's training was doing tricks to amuse the children.

Probably of all the horses engaged

in racing, Chase Me was the only one which could sit up and beg, roll over and play dead. In Manhattan a dowager adores her Pekinese; in Maryland—and Kentucky, too, I suppose—a horse can be a household pet. And Chase Me's heart was big enough for all—for tiny Betty, eleven-year-old Jackie, and Sara and their mother. But especially Sara. It was Sara who really owned Chase Me, owned every hair on his body, she said. It was she who had owned him since the day he was foaled and insisted she would own him till the day he died.

Perhaps all this was running through the mind of Elizabeth Bosley that fatal day in May as she wept over the body of a dead horse and wondered what she could tell Sara, wondered about the incidents of the flying days preceding this melancholy one.

THE chain of circumstances which resulted in Chase Me becoming a racer, for instance. It was sheer accident. A friend had asked to use Chase Me as a pacer for his stable of race-horses. As a pacer he was a rank failure. For, having once been allowed to set the pace by the exercise boy, Chase Me would resolutely refuse to allow the other horse to pass him. Still no one seemed to suspect that Chase

Me was a great race-horse. But when an even better horse was tried out and Chase Me again could not be slowed down enough to be passed—how the children had laughed at the spectacle—and when, after this happened a half-dozen times, it dawned on all that though he wasn't trained to race, Chase Me just didn't seem to know all that.

Most great race-horses come from large stables run by wealthy owners. The Bosley family was not wealthy and if had only one horse, Chase Me. Most horses start racing as two-year-olds and reach their heights a year later, perhaps. Chase Me was a four-year-old before he ran his first race. In his short, meteoric career he ran seven races. The number he won was seven. Just as in those tests, so was it on the turf. He refused to be passed. In his first test he ran away from a fair field. In his second, a much better field, he won by so many lengths that the timers lost count.

Then came that day at Pimlico! Could she ever forget it? In the field were the famous mare Tred Avon, conqueror of mighty Equipoise; Flagstone, the handicap star, and Chase Me had come from behind with a finish like Man o' War's and won going away, and only two-fifths of a second off the track record. Could she forget how they wept hysterically in their box at Chase Me's poor start—so poor they were sure he had been left at the post; how Max Hirsch had to calm their tears at that start and then subdue their ecstasy at that finish? Yes, tears had flowed copiously in that clubhouse box at Pimlico that

RADIO IN THE

Dustbowl

SEVERAL hundred miles away from nowhere lies one of the least-known—and best-informed—colleges in America. It is the Panhandle Agricultural and Mechanical College of Oklahoma and it is located, as the title indicates, in the Oklahoma Panhandle, in the center of the much-publicized dustbowl.

In Goodwell, the college town, there is neither a daily newspaper nor a motion-picture show. Ninety-five percent of its students come from dustbowl farms and have never seen a daily newspaper. All newspapers reaching the town of Goodwell are at least twenty-four hours late, for Goodwell lies three hundred miles northwest of Oklahoma City, four hundred miles southeast of Denver. The closest settlement of any size to it is Guyman, Oklahoma, ten miles away, with a population of about 2,500. Which adds up to near-isolation.

I first came upon this amazing college about a year ago when I was booked there for a lecture. I was astounded at the up-to-the-minute knowledge of the young people who attended this isolated college, where all of the usual media for providing up-to-the-minute information seemed so utterly lacking. Believe me, they fired questions of the moment at me, when my lecture was completed, that the most avid New Yorker, with all his fine newspapers and newsreels, would never have thought of.

I asked Ed Morrison, the former Yale football hero and now president of this unusual institution, how he managed to keep this bunch of youngsters—so obviously out of the world's swim—so up on their toes.

"Radio," he said. He didn't elaborate on it. I suppose he felt that there was no need to elaborate on it. And suddenly I understood more completely than ever before what a swell job radio was doing in keeping an America which—in former days—would have

moved largely in the dark, alert and alive to the world's happenings and what those happenings mean, or may mean, to us.

Radio is the chief source of enlightenment and entertainment at Goodwell. Ninety-five percent of the students have access to radio programs—and fifty-five percent have radios in their rooms. This, while the enrollment fee is probably the lowest in the entire United States, an amazing \$4.08 per semester! (The eight cents is for sales tax.)

A student at Goodwell does most of the radio repair work needed to keep the sets, of varied vintages and degrees of efficiency, in working order. He is Thomas Cayton, a junior in electrical engineering. Cayton is older than the average college boy. Most of the students here are, because—thanks to the reverses suffered by their parents in striving to wrest a living from the dust-consumed soil—they were late completing their high-school work.

Two factors decided Cayton's choice of a profession. When he was about eleven years old, his parents bought their first radio set, and Thomas became deeply interested in what made it click. He decided to learn more about it. The other factor was the fact that he had witnessed his father's struggle on the farm, knew that it wasn't a future for him.

In addition to his electrical course at Panhandle A. & M., Cayton is taking a course in television by correspondence.

Otho Porton, another older boy on the campus, is president of the sophomore class and a born leader. He is interested in social sciences and hopes to do something about them some day. Possessed of a keen native wit, he feeds it at the font of such programs as Jack Benny's, Bob Hope's, Bob Burns'. But his favorite radio programs are the news-casts. They keep him informed, he says, and help him to for-

mulate his ideas. Some day he hopes to enter Oklahoma politics.

Almost all of the students at this unique college are working their way through in whole, others in part. This applies to girls as well as boys. Margaret Brawner is a sophomore and business-training student, but early in her life she studied music. At the college she manages to pay a large part of her expenses by acting as accompanist for various musical groups on the campus. Her favorite radio programs are the musical ones.

Alyene Sapp, one of the ten students on the campus to be named in Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities for 1940, is associate editor of the college newspaper. Her parents, like others in the dustbowl area, suffered the usual reverses, and, during the long years of striving to exist in an area that challenged almost beyond endurance, they learned to turn to the radio for their entertainment and recreation. Serials of family life and radio dramatic programs have been the chief means of diversion for this family, and at Goodwell, where entertainment media are almost as sparse as they were at home, she follows the same radio programs for her entertainment, the news programs to keep up with the world.

Mac Porter, president of the senior class, expressed the belief that most

of the wind-chargers seen on Oklahoma farms have been put in more to permit farm families to enjoy radio than to provide electric lights. He enjoys variety programs the most, with news programs a close second.

The average student at Goodwell listens to radio programs on an average of twelve hours per week. Twenty-eight percent of this time is devoted to listening to dance orchestras, eighteen percent to news broadcasts, nine percent to classical music and seven percent to sports broadcasts. Most of the students there

have never seen a football game or a hockey game, but most of them, thanks to radio, can tell you the top stars and top teams in almost any field of sport.

I was completely surprised to learn that eighty-five percent of these students felt that radio was of more value than newspapers in keeping up with world affairs. Even more interesting to me was the fact only 3.02 percent of these students listened to political broadcasts during the recent campaign. They preferred to base their selection upon the straight news broadcasts.

The Panhandle A. & M. is a comparatively new college. It was set up by the state legislature in 1909, and it owns 720 acres of land which are used as a campus and an experimental station. In the college cafeteria, much of the food served was raised right on the ground.

I learned, through a questionnaire I had them fill out, that Kay Kyser's program stood at the top of the class in popularity. News reports came next, "Your Hit Parade" third, Jack Benny, Charlie McCarthy and the "Lux Radio Theater" completing the list of favorites.

Radio listening was almost unanimously the most popular pastime of these off-the-beaten-path collegians. The programs which interest them least are the instructional ones—cooking, recipes, bridge lessons, etc. This may seem odd on a college campus where students are there because they thirst for knowledge.

It isn't odd at all, in fact. Radio is the newspaper, movie show, theater, concert and nine-tenths of their recreation in this out-of-the-way school. It is all things to all students, giving them whatever they lack either for work or play.

As one Oklahoma lad referred to the set sitting in a corner of his dormitory room: "She's a honney. If the thing could cook, darned if I wouldn't marry it."



IF BURNS AND ALLEN get a contract renewal this month they automatically get a two-thousand-dollar salary raise, a provision of the existing contract with their packing-company sponsor, Hormel. That would give George and Gracie \$14,500 per week.

MRS. PETER FICK, who played Marge in the radio team of "Myrt and Marge," died February 15 in Englewood Hospital, Englewood, N. J., after giving birth to a son. The twenty-eight-year-old actress did her February 14 broadcast as usual, leaving for the hospital immediately after going off the air. The child was born at 12:42 the next morning and Marge died just eighteen minutes later. The baby is well. The death breaks up a mother-daughter team which has been broadcasting continuously since November, 1931. The mother, Mrs. Myrtle Vail Damerel (who plays Myrt in the serial), has announced that she will continue the program, as she believes that is the way Marge would want it. Marge was born in Chicago July 8, 1912, the daughter of vaudeville artists. After attending Chicago public schools until she was fifteen years old she left to join a musical-comedy chorus. Later she joined her mother and father in a vaudeville sketch. When vaudeville engagements became scarce the family moved to a farm just outside Chicago where the father died a few years later. The mother, pressed for financial assistance, conceived the idea of the "Myrt and Marge" radio program based upon the lives of struggling vaudeville artists, sponsored by a Chicago chewing-gum company. Marge is survived by two other sons, Charles Griffiths and William J. Kretsinger, by two previous marriages, her mother and her husband, Mr. Fick, Olympic swimming star to whom she was married on January 13, 1940. Funeral services were held at 8 p.m., February 17, in Manhattan.

Look at the Record, Senator

The networks are making Senator Burton K. Wheeler feel very silly. The Senator charged that radio commentators are biased especially in the matter of the Lease-Lend bill, that the microphone speakers are building up public opinion for passage of the bill, a move the Senator opposes. In their vigorous denial of the charges the networks are proving by actual recordings just what the commentators did say and the Senator is finding out that they merely reported the facts. They are proving by means of statistics that they gave the same amount of air time to the opponents of the bill as to the advocates. And they are proving by means of expert opinion that there is a whale of a lot of difference between interpretation of the news and editorializing. Such a fight is not new to radio. Every time a major issue arises, one side—the losing side—invariably charges that radio was unfair.

LONDON SHORT-WAVE SCHEDULES AGAIN EXPANDED

"MORE news for overseas listeners whatever happens" is planned by the BBC, who in spite of attacks on Broadcasting House, London, and other centers in Great Britain where its studios are located, have arranged for additional coverage of events whether these take the form of the threatened invasion or the opening of new fronts in the Balkans or the Mediterranean.

Beginning Sunday, February 16, the six hours of regular broadcasting activities constituting the BBC's overseas service to the United States and Canada, were extended by more than half an hour. The new transmission period is daily from 4:20 to 10:45 p.m. CST.

Every precaution possible is being made that the programs from London may continue uninterrupted through air-raids, shell-fire or invasion. Most of the studios now in use are deep in the bowels of the earth. Location of these studios, which are scattered throughout England, is a carefully guarded secret. To defend this underground broadcasting system still further anti-aircraft batteries supported by machine-gun nests have been installed in the vicinity of the hidden studios. You have probably noticed the peculiar hollow tone apparent on evening broadcasts from London. This is due to the underground acoustics, which present a nice problem to the sound-engineers. The most vulnerable part of any broadcasting plant must necessarily be its aerial layout. For twenty-four hours out of each day London's powerful short-wave transmitters are busy sending out programs to all corners of the earth. To speed these broadcasts to their proper destinations, dozens of directive antennae are necessary. Beam aeriels take up a lot of room. They can not be successfully hidden or camouflaged. Thus it becomes almost inevitable that sooner or later direct hits should put one or more of these highly important accessories out of use. You may have wondered why the North American transmissions from London have been much weaker than usual of late. I sus-

pect, as does BBC monitor H. S. Campbell of Uplands, Calif., that German raiders have finally hit the bull's-eye and damaged some of the North American aeriels and that consequently makeshift substitutes are temporarily in use. Be that as it may, the programs from London are still coming over with very fair volume and are crammed with first-hand news, human interest and outstanding variety acts. A HEAVEN FOR HORSES?

November day. For it never seemed to them that it was just a horse-race. It was their brother and son, Chase Me, in a feudal duel of glory and honor.

As Henry King wrote in *Turf and Sports Digest*, if it had been proven in competition that he wasn't worth the proverbial quarter, he would still have been the best horse of any breed in the world to the Bosley family. But he was worth a hundred thousand quarters, even to non-Bosleys. For that Pimlico event was really the start of one of the most amazing careers of a race-horse known in America. At Bowie, conceding chunks of weight, he beat a good field in an allowance race. Later, as his final test of 1933, he beat Mate there, carrying the heaviest package, too. Now he was one of America's leading thoroughbreds—and he had yet to lose a single race. Next spring he started again by capturing the Baltimore Handicap at Pimlico. That race decided Mrs. Bosley. They would give Chase Me the chance he deserved—the Metropolitan Handicap at Belmont.

May 19. The mighty Equipoise and Mr. Khayyam would be in that field—and others. May 19—it was May 19 now—and Mrs. Bosley was sobbing across the chest of a horse, a chest that would never heave again. It was May 19 and Chase Me was still unbeaten. So he broke a leg in a race and had to be shot and was decently buried—and that was all. Oh, was it?

How many race-horses were there

that never, never, not once, had tasted of defeat? How many were there that did that, though they were not race-horses at all? For they always had trouble getting Chase Me back to the judges' stand for his floral horseshoe. He'd be off looking for Sara to get his lump of sugar. How many were there who could play hide-and-seek with the children? And how about his hunting? He was a champion. He had blue ribbons in his stall to prove it. Blue ribbons won in New York, New Jersey, Maryland, with Sara on his back. And what about those killing drags through the hunting districts of the Old Line State. Had he ever failed Sara at a ditch or a fence in the hundreds of times she had ridden him to hounds? How many others? How many others? Only Chase Me. Only Chase Me. A sedative for her, the doctor said, and they pulled her off the quiet, sleeping horse whose chest would never heave again. Outside the stable door, others rushed to quiet the screaming of a thirteen-year-old girl.

Yes, there's a mound of earth that marks a grave in the bright little suburb of Monkton, Maryland, today; a mound visited each May 19 by a woman and three unnaturally quiet children, for there lies the horse that might have been—no, was—one of the most amazing in the history of the American turf; of a breed that comes along just . . . once in a lifetime.

The Lew Ayres of "All Quiet" is a good actor. The Lew Ayres who came back is a good man. But the young man who lives alone on a mountain top needs a bit more faith in his fellow man. I do not believe a man can be a good director unless he loves people, unless his heart goes out for them in their stupid mistakes. A man can write a good book by living alone but he can never direct a great show. Mr. Ayres did not make a good director. Perhaps if Mr. Ayres mingled with men more he would learn enough about them to put their emotions, loves, hates and silly little ways in a picture.

The movies need a smart man like Lew Ayres. Mr. Ayres needs the movies. We hope that some day he directs a great show. Maybe it will cure him of his inhibitions. After all, a good cow named Elsie and a good dog named Promise can act, but it takes a good man with understanding, patience and sympathy to direct.


According to the *Vitamin Girl* there's many a slip between the lipstick and the lips it is intended to glorify.
