### "Citizen Kane" Is "Naturalized"

It seems, after all, that Orson Welles' provocative first motion-picture effort, "Citizen Kane," may have a country and a release date despite all the heat turned on the RKO-Radio lot where it was produced. A large chain newspaper publisher reviewed its plot and threatened litigation on the

basis that it too closely resembled his personal life, thus putting RKO between two fires, for Welles likewise threatened to file suit against the lot unless the company gave him assurance of release of his picture. Result: Wonder-Boy Welles arrived in Hollywood March 22 to remake a number of scenes in the picture, and the announcement was given out that "Citizen Kane" would be shown on the nation's screens with those changes in May. Top newspaper and magazine reviewers who have seen the original version proclaim it a great motion picture, newsworthy, extraordinary, and one that blazes the trail for Hollywood producers for five years to come. ## Reviews

### "Meet John Doe"

Cast: Gary Cooper, Barbara Stanwyck, Edward Arnold, Walter Brennan, James Gleason, Rod La Rocque, Regis Toomey, et al. A Warner Bros. picture, produced and directed by Frank Capra, who also directed "Mr. Deeds Goes to Town" and "Mr. Smith Goes to Washington."

HOLLYWOOD—and, from box-office reports, America—always awaits anxiously the unveiling of another Frank Capra picture, and he doesn't let them down with "Meet John Doe."

In it, reporter Stanwyck, advice-column conductor on a newspaper, is given notice of dismissal when a new publisher and his editor (James Gleason) take over an old-time newspaper to streamline it for circulation purposes and to further the political ambitions of millionaire D. B. Norton (Edward Arnold). But before she cashes her severance paycheck she writes a phony letter, signs it "John Doe."

The letter is pathetic. It states that the writer, disgusted with conditions which keep him jobless, intends to jump off the city hall tower on Christmas Eve.

Great is the confusion which follows its publication. A rival paper charges it is strictly a fake; editor Connell (Gleason) of the *Bulletin* seeks Stanwyck to prove the letter genuine. She can't, of course, but suggests the plot which snowballs into national proportions when the "John Doe" (Gary Cooper) they hire to make good catches public sympathy and sparks into being John Doe Clubs throughout the land. Meantime, Norton nourishes the clubs to promote his own selfish interests—but to tell the rest would spoil the story. Does John Doe jump from the city hall tower? Does he? Go see for yourself.

### "That Hamilton Woman"

ALEXANDER KORDA has taken Vivien Leigh and Laurence Olivier, thrown in one of the best Hollywoodized sea battles ever filmed, and has come forth with "That Hamilton Woman."

Miss Leigh and Olivier, whose off-screen romance is history, supply all the love interest needed to make a good story. Their affair plus a thrilling climax showing the mighty battle of Trafalgar provide two hours of absorbing entertainment for the audience.

Miss Leigh, of course, is "that Hamilton woman," who is in Naples with her husband, Sir William Hamilton (portrayed by Alan Mowbray), the British ambassador to Naples. It is there that she meets Olivier as Horatio Nelson, then captain of a British man-o'-war, who is destined to become leader of Britain's mighty navy. Nelson, having been separated through war from his wife (Gladys Cooper) for some three or four years, is quite ready to welcome a woman in his life, and it is the enviable Lady Hamilton who goes not only into his life but also into his arms.

Every time Nelson gets up a proverbial blind alley it is Lady Hamilton who comes to the rescue—and quite believably. The result is a combination of love and adventure which will lure millions into the theater—and send them away satisfied that they have seen a grand picture.

For many years Norman Kerry was one of the most popular and colorful figures on the Hollywood scene. He starred in such productions as "Merry-Go-Round" and "The Phantom of the Opera" and was co-starred with such glamorous personalities as Mary Pickford, Lillian Gish, Marion Davies, Constance Talmadge and Corinne Griffith. At the peak of his career from 1925 to 1930 he was the Errol Flynn of his day—the dashing, romantic hero and gay, swashbuckling adventurer. In 1934 he left the screen to live many of those adventures in real life, and since that time has made his home on the Continent. He joined the French Foreign Legion in 1939 and intended to remain with it indefinitely. A frozen leg and a severe case of pneumonia altered those plans. His considerable fortune and property in France and Belgium were "blocked" by the Nazis when they invaded those countries. He left France on January

10 of this year, spent seven days standing up in a train en route to Lisbon, and crossed the Atlantic on a steamer, the Siboney, which once had been junked as unseaworthy. The ship carried three times its normal passenger capacity, and Kerry was forced to sleep on an open deck with only his overcoat for protection against the constant rain. It brought on a relapse into the pneumonia contracted while in the Legion. Now back in Hollywood, his health is on the mend and he plans a return to the screen in the near future.—The Editors.

**I** SAW France fall before the crushing weight of Hitler's forces on that fateful June 15, 1940.

It was not the exciting, dramatic experience you might expect. It was dreary, sickening and bitterly depressing.

It was terrifying, too, but the real

terror lay in seeing a once-proud people so hopelessly expecting defeat, and so unmoved by it when it came. They were like dumb cattle, patiently waiting to be pole-axed and uttering no complaint when the lethal blow fell.

"It is to be," was their fatalistic attitude. "Why try to stand against it?"

Knowing the French people as I have known and loved them for many years while making their country my home, I have tried to find some explanation of this astounding reversal of national honor and courage. So far I can see only one answer: They were sold down the river and knew it. Knew it too late.

Yet even more amazing to me is their attitude today, the viewpoint of humble worker and thinking man alike. The only bitterness in the French mind is against the British, not the corrupt communistic regime which was the French government, and which, I believe, traitorously delivered them into the hands of their enemies! They harbor no hatred of the Germans but abominate the Italians with a loathing beyond expression! Frenchmen never believed Italy would stab them in the back, and never, in their hearts, will forgive the betrayal. Then, too, the behavior of the German conquerors in fallen France has been exemplary compared to the Italians. Where the Germans go quietly and efficiently about their business in civilian dress, the Italians swagger the streets in full military uniform, making a vulgar and offensive display of their new authority.

However, this is neither a defense nor an attack on other nations' political principles and moral decadence. It is a simple account of what I saw, felt and heard in those last days of a free France, and what life is like there today. If conditions there have changed in the few weeks since I returned to America, I can promise it is for the worse, for France as a nation is in a desperate plight.

First let me sketch in a bit of personal background, since it was this background which gave me access to knowledge I might not otherwise have

# I SAW THE FALL OF FRANCE

Back in Hollywood after harrowing experiences abroad, Norman Kerry tells his story!

had, and enables me to evaluate the present picture.

I retired from the movies and left Hollywood about eight years ago because I thought essaying more than fifteen years of stardom would be crowding my luck. I bought a home in Cap Ferrat in the south of France, invested my money in a business in Ostend, and set about living the life which most appealed to me.

In a sense I witnessed the beginning of the present world-wide upheaval, for I was in Berlin on the day Hitler was elected Chancellor of the Third German Reich in 1932. Among other things, it marked the first occasion in many years on which a military band in military uniform was permitted to march down the famous Unter den Linden.

I was in Cologne in 1935 and witnessed the overnight occupation of the Rhineland. We went to bed without seeing a single man in German uniform. We awoke to a city swarming with brown-shirted Nazis, completely in control of the city and every phase of civil life. It was an amazing—and prophetic—demonstration of Hitler organization and thoroughness.

I was in Munich on October 1, 1938, when the "peace in our time" pact was signed, and saw a Storm Troop band playing "God Save the King" in Neville Chamberlain's honor. He was the hero of the hour; the people felt they would have at least twenty years of peace and rejoiced. They did not want war, the older ones. You knew that by their conversation. Only the youth, trained from babyhood in the doctrine of hate and conquest, were champing for battle.

Those words "trained from babyhood" are not an exaggeration, believe me. I have seen the Streicher kindergarten books from which they learned their alphabet. "J" was for *Jude* (Jew) and was pictured by a Jew attacking innocent school-children!

War clouds were gathering again when I left Germany in May of 1939. You knew it from the tense, strained looks on the people's faces and the new furtiveness in what they said and did. They were on guard and arming

mentally and spiritually for the ordeal ahead. Oddly enough, it was not a new war to them, but only the second phase of the old one which had been concluded so ingloriously for them in 1918.

With other friends I became active in organizing the Anglo-American Ambulance Corps. We knew the time was not far off when it would be needed. The first gunfire I saw was with that corps; I was in Le Havre, taking delivery on an ambulance from America, when the city received its baptism of bombs. That was in November, three months after war had been declared.

Activity, however, was sporadic. That was the period, you remember, of the so-called "phony war." I wanted activity and because I could not join the French army without losing my American citizenship, I joined the French Foreign Legion. One hurdle—the Legion's hesitation to accept an American as such, in deference to the expressed wishes of our State Department—I took by enlisting "for the duration" as Heinrich Van der Kerry of Rotterdam, born 1900, father Hendrik, mother Wilhelmina. As a Legionnaire, I had to swear allegiance only to the Legion. I became number 91,203, had my head shaved and my shoes shined as per regulation, and was sent to Sidi bel Abbas, the Legion headquarters in North Africa. My pay, incidentally, was fifty centimes a day, or about a penny and a half at current exchange rates. Since one pack of cigarettes costs almost twice that much, you can see few men get rich in that organization.

**A** LOT of romantic nonsense has been written about the French Foreign Legion, and Hollywood has glamorized it in many a picture. Actually there is little romance about it. Nary a chance did I get to ride off on a fine, white charger in pursuit of an evil sheik; I was much too busy doing pick-and-shovel work! There are no whipping-posts and torture-tables; the only punishment I saw was forcing men to walk barefooted in a large circle for sixteen hours while carrying fifty-pound sacks on their backs. That was

for fighting among Legionnaires—the commonest infringement of rules. Idyllic *affaires d'amour* with dusky Arab maidens were few and far between; the dusky Arab maidens run like mad at the sight of a Legionnaire!

The men are rough and tough, but actually France uses them much as we use our U. S. Marines—a band of crack, dependable fighters which can be rushed into any emergency or where the trouble is hottest. While I was one of them, I saw service in North Africa and in backing up the Maginot Line. When France fell, I was on sick leave (on *reforme*, they call it) in Cannes, the result of a leg frozen in the front lines near Valbourne and a siege of pneumonia contracted at Camp Sathanay.

So much for background.

The French call to arms on September 3, 1939, is marked in my memory for one thing: The utter apathy and the complete lack of morale of the people. There was no enthusiasm, no cheering, no flag-waving as there was in '14. No excited, voluble crowds of men gathered around the posters proclaiming the call to arms, shouting defiance of Germany and clamoring for victory for France. Nobody seemed to care one way or the other. Men read the posters with expressionless faces, shrugged their shoulders and slouched away. Even the women showed the same amazing lack of interest; where English and American women were in a fever of knitting, making bandages and organizing soup kitchens, the French women plodded on about their every-day duties, completely unconcerned and scarcely tolerant of the others' activity.

All of us soon knew why. They knew, as we came to know, how pitifully unprepared they were, and how woeful was their lack of material and equipment. Blankets, horses, food-stuffs, tanks, guns, ammunition, clothing—all the vital military supplies—were non-existent as far as the French soldier was concerned. The fighting men at the front looked like a bob-tailed army outfitted by Woolworth's. Half of them had no uniforms and wore ragged civilian clothes, and the machine-guns issued as arms were

obsolete in 1917! Aviators were willing to fly, but they had no planes. Tanks were there, but no gasoline to run them. Naval guns were manned from Mentone to Marseilles, but there was no ammunition to fire.

No wonder, then, that the people could not believe their eyes when, miraculously, carload after carload of perfect, shining equipment and military supplies flowed across the border into Italy in a never-ending stream on the day the armistice was declared! No wonder the French man and woman today is whipped in mind, body and soul!

**N**O WONDER, either, that the French soldier had little stomach for fighting when he saw his politically appointed staff officers reeling up to the front with their women in the cars with them, and, when the Germans came, racing back to safety and leaving the men to fend for themselves as best they could.

The world's scorn has been expressed of the way the French fought. I want to say this: The regular French soldier and the St. Cyr officers (the West Point of France) stood their ground and fought bravely and well. How many of them were killed, time alone will tell, but it was a far greater number than is generally believed. They fought, however, against hopeless odds. They fought a fight which had been "thrown" from the beginning by their own government.

Official word of France's capitulation to the Axis powers by suing for peace terms, the occupation of Paris, and the moving of the government to Vichy came to us in Cannes through news broadcasts from radio stations in German-occupied territory to the north. I first heard it about four o'clock in the afternoon while visiting at the home of a friend, Harry Hays Morgan, who formerly was in the diplomatic service of the U. S. government. We immediately went into the streets and cafes to see the reaction of the people to the momentous event.

There was no panic among the French, no demonstrations, no crowds, no weeping, no emotion of any kind.

## RADIO'S NEWS PICTURE *of the* WEEK

SOME of the pathos of highly emotional broadcasts comes through the microphone. Much of it must be left to the imagination of listeners—except in rare instances when a picture helps to breach the gap between the actual experience and the listening experience. Such a picture is this of announcer Ben Grauer and six-year-old David Winter, as David, an English refugee, talked to his parents on a two-way broadcast between NBC

studios in New York and BBC studios in London. David had not seen his mother and father since he had left England months before. He had gotten over the worst homesickness, and now, speaking to them, he covered a choked-up feeling with boyish bravery. His parents, in London, where they had endured months of air-raids, were anxiously trying to hide their emotion as they grasped this strange means of reunion with their son. And their

## ON THE BANDWAGON

**A**LVINO REY, originator of the singing style on the steel guitar, is one of the few steel guitarists who have resisted the "Hawaiian" urge. Instead Alvino manages to get good solid swing as well as unusually pleasant sweet music out of his band. This affable young musician is a graduate of Horace Heidt's Musical Knights, where, as a steel guitarist, he was one of the most consistently featured and highest-paid side-men in the country. However, back in Cleveland in 1920, Alvino was just one of the million-odd banjo twangers in the U. S. But in 1929 when Phil Spitalny's pre-girl orchestra played Cleveland, Alvino got a break when guitarist Eddie Peabody happened to quit, allowing the nineteen-year-old Rey lad to step into his place. Later, while he was studying with guitar virtuoso Roy Smeck, Rey met up with the instrument that was to bring him fame—the electric guitar. In 1934 he joined Horace Heidt's band, remaining with the Knights for five years, and, during that time, marrying one of the ladies, Louise King, of the vocalizing King Sisters. It was his sparkling guitar passages which served to give the Heidt band much of its style. About a year ago Alvino left the Heidt band and became music director of station KHJ in Los Angeles. In his spare time he gathered together a band of his own and, with the King Sisters as an added attraction, broke all records at the Paramount Theater in Los Angeles. Since then the band has played some of the top spots in the East, including the Biltmore Hotel in New York, and the Rustie Cabin, popular New Jersey night-spot. Members of the orchestra posed in the special MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE photo above are as follows: First row (left to right):

# MEET "JOE and MABEL"

A New York cab-  
by and his gal win  
listeners' hearts

"FELLOW citizens, here are Joe and Mabel!"

That's the introduction that greets listeners these recent Sunday afternoons. And thousands of fellow citizens—listeners weary of having persecuted heroes and long-suffering heroines for radio dramatic company—are beaming and saying, "Come in, Joe and Mabel! Come in, and stay a while!"

Joe and Mabel are here to stay a while. The loquacious cab-driver, whose heart is bigger and works faster than his brain, and his spunky girl friend, fresh from a Bronx beauty-parlor, have whetted the public's appetite for comedy serial drama.

Joe, of course, would give credit willingly to his friend Mike and grudgingly to Mabel's kid brother "Shoiman"—the little pest!—for some of the story's spontaneous appeal.

The primary credit for "Joe and Mabel" belongs to a young radio writer named Irving Gaynor Neiman. "Fourth-Wall Neiman," they call him. The nickname deserves an explanation, for behind the "Fourth Wall" tag is one of the secrets of Neiman's success with his "Joe and Mabel" sketches. Neiman, whose twenty-four years have given him enough time to do some creative thinking, believes that radio cannot and will not reach its maximum dramatic power until it divorces its technique more completely from the three-wall-stage conception. He feels that the listening audience should not be treated as if they were sitting grouped impersonally beyond phantom footlights, but that each listener should be made to feel as nearly as possible in close relationship with the characters and action of the play. This Neiman accomplishes chiefly by having Joe tell the listener parts of the story during transitional interludes and inject his personal comments about his experiences.

There must be something in Neiman's "Fourth Wall" idea. Last fall he sold NBC a play called "Height of

Fashion," and it was produced on the "Radio Guild" series. It dealt with cabby Joe's ludicrous effort to understand women's clothes. Fan mail poured in, calling for more. Neiman complied with NBC's request for a sequel by reintroducing Joe and Mabel, the characters of the previous play, in "Women and Children First," wherein Mabel's kid brother, Sherman, became a permanent thorn under Joe's skin.

The response was even more enthusiastic than before. The network officials knew they had something. They postponed the premiere of another series to open a spot for "Joe and Mabel" to be heard in a half-hour skit each week. After a few weeks it was moved from Thursday night to Sunday afternoon, where it should be settled now for a long run. They do say, though, that already there's a sponsor who considers the escapades of Joe and Mabel a good investment, and, if so, the sketch may change time again.

Wherever and whenever they're heard, Joe and Mabel and their associates are fast becoming old friends—real people—to many listeners. They and their experiences are quite human, you see—ridiculously human, as most people are at times.

TAKE, for instance, what happened after Valentine Day. As Joe said—half to himself—half to the listener: "It ain't easy to beat the races—even if sometimes it happens. But when it comes to the women, there ain't even any odds. You just can't do it." Joe forgot to send Mabel a valentine gift. Then he tried to make up for it by writing her a valentine poem. But he didn't sign any name to it. Mabel, therefore, thought she had an unknown suitor who wanted to marry her. That scared Joe, because he wasn't ready to get married, and he was afraid to tell her he sent the poem, even after she bawled him out for forgetting Valentine Day. But "Shoiman," the little brat who's al-

ways getting in Joe's hair, found out the secret and blackmailed Joe to the tune of two bits and four bits at frequent intervals. Joe finally bought Mabel's renunciation of her dream admirer with a pair of silk hose as a belated valentine present.

Then there was the episode that added some timely chuckles to the serious national defense situation. Joe's brother, one of those inventive geniuses whose chief claim to resourcefulness is in getting others to do all the work, got a great idea for a new secret weapon for Uncle Sam. With Joe's help (Joe was to do all the manual labor, being a good mechanic) the inventor would revolutionize national defense. Joe was kept busy every night on the project, but he couldn't tell Mabel the secret. Of course, Mabel got sore because he wouldn't explain why he couldn't see her for a while. In the meantime, Joe was followed at night by what might have been, he thought in terror, foreign agents. And when he found that all the air had been let out of his taxicab tires, he just knew it was "sabbotadge."

Finally, to prove to Mabel he was on the level, Joe took the completed invention to her house for a demonstration. Sherman monkeyed around with it till it exploded. But nobody got hurt, which was, in a way, a disappointment, for it proved the revolutionary instrument a dud. It was the last straw when Joe found out that it was Sherman who had shadowed him and scared him half to death. "Sometimes," said Joe with philosophical vehemence, "the worm turns." And he proceeded to do some turning by giving Sherman a solid spanking.

The capable characterizations of Joe and Mabel are handled by Ted di Corsia, veteran radio actor, and young Ann Thomas, who is rapidly establishing herself as a radio dramatic star, especially with her tough-gal portrayals. The other main characters, Mike and Sherman, are played by

Walter Kinsella and Jackie Grimes.

Miss Thomas, who also has a part in the play "Five-Alarm Waltz," tells of this incident: "I took a taxi recently from my home in Pelham, New York, to the Pennsylvania station so I could catch an early train for Princeton, New Jersey, where our play had a tryout before a Broadway opening. The driver lost his way in the Bronx. I tried to tell him how to go, but he insisted he knew. Finally he got completely lost. He turned to me and said, 'I guess the only taxi-driver that's dumber than me is the feller named Joe in that radio program "Joe and Mabel."'"

So Joe has been accepted as one of the gang by his fellow cabbies, who are, after all, a small but important group of the thousands of those "fellow citizens" who are listening eagerly to "Joe and Mabel" and finding a soft spot in their hearts for the couple's whimsical experiences. Experiences right out of life, with just a touch of radio artistry for spicing.

"Joe and Mabel" is heard over NBC Sundays at 5 p.m. EST, 4 p.m. CST, 3 p.m. MST, 2 p.m. PST, and is recommended for your listening pleasure by the editors of MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE.







# I SAW THE FALL OF FRANCE

(Continued from Page 9)

Perhaps by then they had been drained of all emotion. There was just dull acceptance of reality.

"C'est fini," we heard on all sides. "It is finished. Perhaps it is better. We will try to get along with them. What other choice have we?"

There was panic among the British residents. It was the first time I ever have observed this phenomenon in the traditionally calm and unruffled race. Two grimy coal barges, the only vessels apparently which could be spared, had been sent by the British government for their evacuation. Staid old ladies careened up to the dock in expensive limousines. Taxis laden with families and their hurriedly gathered possessions slid to a screeching stop and raced away for other fares. Businessmen, shopkeepers, salesmen, peddlers (infirm or too old for military service) and their wives arrived on carts, bicycles, anything that would roll. Those who could not ride ran on foot. Scrambling, elbowing, pushing, they made their way to the small lighters which carried them to the barges.

Sick at heart, I started to walk back to town when a Rolls-Royce slammed to a stop beside me. A chauffeur grabbed bags and started for the dock. An old man in formal afternoon dress started to follow and then turned to me.

"Young man," he said, "want a car?"

"Why not?" I answered.

"Then you've got one," he said and, opening a briefcase, thrust a bill of sale, gasoline permit, insurance papers and other necessary documents into my hands, signed them over to me, and dashed away after the fleeing chauffeur.

I sold the car a few days later. The money kept me in cigarettes.

Contrasted to both the British and the French man-in-the-street was the behavior of the professional soldier, and his attitude. I walked into the Carlton bar one night and was surprised to find a Georgian (Russian) whom I knew had served in the Foreign Legion for seventeen years. He was resplendent in full-dress uniform.

"What are you doing here?" I asked. "The Legion is finished," he said. "My life is finished."

He persuaded me to have dinner with him that night, insisting I, too, don my full-dress uniform of the Legion. We toasted each other's health and future.

The next morning he was found with a bullet in his brain, dead by his own hand.

It is a limited life they live in

France today, limited beyond the conception of the average American with his every-day comforts which he takes so for granted.

France is still blacked out nightly. First it was against the Germans, then the Italians, and now the British. There is no gasoline for transportation; you walk, pedal a bicycle, or ride in buses fueled by charcoal burners. Although ration cards call for specified small amounts of sugar, meat, eggs and fats, none can be purchased for love or money, and food-smuggling is a criminal offense. Daily food allowance is limited to 950 calories—a starvation diet for even a birdlike glamour girl of Hollywood. The Germans, incidentally, receive 2,500, both at home and in the occupied territories. Vegetables are fairly plentiful and coffee is made from roasted barley. Soap is non-existent.

Fuel for heating homes is strictly limited, and cooking may be done only for one hour at three specified hours during the day. Clothing of French make has been replaced almost entirely by German manufactured goods. True, there has been no looting of shops by German soldiers as such, but it amounts to the same thing; the shops have been stripped of all fine goods, the luxuries which the Germans have been denied for so long and which they promptly sent back to Germany. The goods were paid for in paper marks, printed in Paris by the Germans, which the shopkeeper had to accept. These in turn are held by the Bank of France as part payment of the staggering daily war debt. It's a neat racket, a polite form of legalized robbery.

Radio programs are confined to the spreading of German propaganda, and only German movies are shown in the theaters, with all dialog in German and French subtitles superimposed on the screen, exactly as we show foreign films in America. Formerly the reverse was true.

All in all, every phase of the Frenchman's life is limited and policed, and living costs have risen two hundred percent.

Still the Frenchman shrugs and says, "Perhaps it is better so. We will accept it." The Frenchman to whom freedom of spirit and the pursuit of his own happiness traditionally has been the sole meaning and reason for life!

Is there a lesson for us in the Fall of France?

I believe so with every breath I draw. I believe we, too, need to search out the secret enemies of democracy within our borders and deal with them before it is too late.

Otherwise, our turn is coming.






