The Editors' Note:

THIS WEEK: In past summers, radio listeners have shut off their sets, forgotten about getting a new tube to replace that shaky one and turned to other pleasures. Things are different in this July, 1941. True, many "big shows" are on vacation, but the stars are on the air in greater numbers than ever before. For instance, there's the big "Treasury Hour—Millions for Defense" program which had its premiere on Wednesday, July 2, the first production starring Fred Allen, Judy Garland, Mickey Rooney and other ace entertainers. The second program was equally amazing in its wealth of talent, including Bing Crosby, Bob Hope, others.

Movie-Radio Guide vigorously applauds the stars who have given up their time to rehearse and appear without pay in this important cause, as well as the Texas Company, which has donated the time on behalf of the sale of defense bonds.

Keeping abreast the times, the editors this week present a new expose of a foreign propaganda agent in the short-wave department on page 35. Those who insist that oceans keep us safely apart from Europe's wars should spend more time listening to the poison which is being broadcast to this country by short wave. In an early speech made several years ago in Japan, the then Colonel Charles A. Lindbergh had this to say: "With the advance of radio and aircraft, the mystery of distance can no longer exist. There are no longer distant countries. The dis-

tances of today will become just as insignificant in the years of future generations." Today Lindbergh insists we are safe from invasion. This speech was made on August 28, 1931. How he reconciles his present position with this statement of ten years ago in view of amazing strides of the mechanized age, he has been explaining to the people. Some say satisfactorily, some say not. Because they are not experts, the editors of Movie-Radio Guide are not prepared to discuss this point. However, one thing neither Lindbergh nor his adversaries have touched on more than sketchily is the tremendous force of invasion by short-wave propaganda agents. The editors want you to know the type of human being behind these broadcasts and to listen. While men squabble over whether or not New York can be bombed, there is a more dangerous enemy. The turn of a radio switch can bring him into your home.

You can temporarily isolate a nation with the aid of oceans and planes, but only the most stern patriotism can defeat the suave, insidious thoughts aimed for a bull's-eye in American minds from across the same body of water which to many seems such a bulwark of protection. The simple answer is: We are already being attacked!

Usually MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE publishes only the reports of its own hard-driving staff. On this rare occasion, a veteran publicity man with a sense of humor supplies the most amusing fictionalized version of a picture the editors have ever seen. We hope you like it.—The Editors.

WELL, here we go again!

Dorothy Lamour—an island—a sarong—and all in Technicolor! Who could ask for more?

Dorothy is the heroine, Aloma; Jon Hall, Tanoa; Lynne Overman, "Corky"; Philip Reed, Revo. Here's the story:

On a Tahitian-type South Seas island a group of ten-year-old girls is dancing for the chief and high priest, who will select one to be betrothed to his young son, Tanoa.

Tanoa and his cousin, Revo, perched on a ledge above the village, are watching. Revo, jealous of Tanoa, who some day will be chief, attacks him. Tanoa defends himself, dares Revo to stab him. Revo backs down.

Meanwhile Aloma, toughest little tomboy wildcat on the island, is selected by the chief as his son's future bride. At the betrothal ceremony she whales the daylights out of Tanoa, who is happy when "Corky," a white man, takes him to U. S. A. to be educated.

Fifteen years later Tanoa and Corky return. Aloma and Revo, who hopes to succeed the dying chief, aren't happy about it, as Aloma thinks she's in love with Revo, who is in love with her but cannot resist another girl, Kari.

Aloma and Tanoa meet by accident,

but don't recognize each other until they get into an argument and Aloma again whales the tar out of Tanoa. Then each realizes who the other is, decide the chief was smart after all in having them get engaged.

The old chief dies and Tanoa becomes head man. His first acts as chief do not set well with Revo. Revo threatens Tanoa.

Meanwhile Kari discovers that Tanoa and Aloma are meeting at the Sacred Pool. This is taboo, as they aren't married yet. Kari tells Revo of their forbidden meetings. Revo searches out Aloma, threatens Tanoa, proves his prowess by murdering a shepherd with the only gun on the island.

Aloma finds Tanoa and tells him to go back to the States, as she's in love with Revo, hoping to save his life. Angry, Tanoa is about to leave when Kari tells him Aloma is sending him away to keep him from getting shot. She asks Tanoa to banish Revo from the island, hoping to win his entire love. Revo refuses to go. Again Tanoa calls Revo's bluff when Revo threatens him with the gun. There's a short, quick fight and Revo and his gang with Kari sail away. Just as Aloma and Tanoa are to be married on a sacred volcano mountside, Revo and his gang of cutthroats return. Corky insists the wedding go on, attempts to stave off the intruders.

A bullet from Revo's gun, meant for Tanoa, kills the priest. The sacred mountain, long an inactive volcano, erupts. The lava finally gets Revo and Tanoa gets Aloma. —R. H.

"Puddin' Head" Gets Her Man

OUT at Republic they say they're going to make another Judy Canova picture soon entitled "The Corporal Takes a Wife." The idea for the story was supplied a fortnight ago by Judy herself, who, while vacationing in Honolulu, took a husband named Corporal James H. Ripley, U. S. Army auditor for army engineers there and nephew of Robert "Believe It or Not" Ripley.

Corp. Ripley made headlines by going A. W. O. L. to say his "I do" with Miss Canova. Later, since he went absent without leave, he will do a stretch in the guardhouse to celebrate his honeymoon. This, naturally, will be a part of the picture.

Judy Isn't Sure

Judy, according to press reports, wasn't sure whether or not she had married Corp. Ripley. She first denied it. Later confronted with recorded facts that Honolulu Judge Francis Brooks had married one Juliet C. Burns, born 1917 at Starke, Fla., to the corporal, she thought maybe it was she. It seems Judy's right name is Juliet and she once was married to one William Burns. She also was born, she recalled, either in Jacksonville, Fla., or Unadilla, Ga., Nov. 20, 1916. Maybe the two cities have merged with Starke, Fla., since then. Who knows? Judy evidently doesn't.

Her mix-up was somewhat like that which happened in 1938 when she was rumored engaged to Edgar Bergen and was about to sue him for breach of promise because of alienation of Bergen's affections by Charlie McCarthy. She didn't because she was still married to Mr. Burns.

Fools New York Reporters

At any rate, Judy emerged as a hill-billy entertainer along with her brother Zeke and sister Annie, crashed New York night-clubs as such in 1931. She thought she fooled newspapermen whom she told she had never seen a train. Of course, some believed her. The fooling gag became a phobia with Judy, who next fooled Rudy Vallee. Many radio dates (1933 to 1939) followed. Judy and her kin even trained about the country doing seventy weeks of RKO vaudeville, made movie shorts, etc.

At Republic in 1940 she got her first big screen break. She was cast as star of "Scatterbrain," a big, three-star film.

Can Sing and Dance Well

"Sis Hopkins" followed, and recently she completed "Puddin' Head" before her Honolulu trip.

Judy is a clever dancer and can sing very well when she wants to. If Corporal Ripley is out of the guardhouse he may like to know his wife's hobbies are amateur movie-making, books, badminton, cooking, blows her money on clothes, jewelry, and likes to travel.

To Feature Desk:

I'VE just come back from a location trip to Big Bear Mountain, where Paramount had a huge company making their Technicolor epic, "The Shepherd of the Hills," and there was one chap who stood out, literally and figuratively—John Wayne.

He's a star of the picture and stands six feet four inches even when bare-foot. He's also two hundred pounds of brawn and muscle, eats approximately a quarter of beef at a sitting. His laugh is deep and resonant and he likes to laugh. What a guy!

You can get a pretty good idea of John Wayne from the pictures I took of him on location. I asked him to do what he likes to do and these pictures are the result.

All-American Tackle '29

A Scotch-Irishman born thirty-three years ago on a farm in Winterset, Iowa, he was christened Marion Michael Morrison. The family migrated to a ranch in Antelope Valley near Lancaster, Calif. While still a sprout he learned about horses and cactus. Intending to be a lawyer, he graduated from Glendale High School, attended the University of Southern California, where he played football and was named an All-American tackle in 1929.

A broken ankle stopped his gridiron career. While waiting for it to get strong enough to play again, he took a movie studio job as a propboy.

Becomes Long-Haired Actor

John Ford saw him carrying a table onto the set and recommended him to Raoul Walsh to be the leading man in "The Big Trail." He let his hair grow long (they haven't let him cut it much since), changed his name to Wayne, became an actor—and the picture flopped. That was in 1930. The next seven years he was ostracized to "poverty row," where he earned "coffee and cakes." The only important event that happened to Wayne in that era was his marriage in 1933 to Josephine Saenz. The ceremony was performed in the garden of Loretta Young's home. They now have four grand youngsters.

John Ford Rediscovered Him

Republic rediscovered Wayne about the time he was getting ready to become a truck-driver and signed him to a five-year contract.

Ford rediscovered his ex-propboy, borrowed him for a lead in "Stagecoach." That made money. Later Ford co-starred Wayne in "The Long Voyage Home." Ford's continual endorsement had its effect. Universal co-starred Wayne with Marlene Dietrich in "Seven Sinners." Paramount borrowed him for "Shepherd of the Hills," then made a deal with Republic to share his contract, and gave Wayne the much-desired lead in "Reap the Wild Wind."

It doesn't look as if Ford will have to rediscover Wayne again.—B. B.

The Picture Hitler Would Boycott

To News Desk:

"UNDERGROUND" was previewed last week by Warner Bros. in Projection Room No. 5 on the lot, and nothing happened. Nothing except that every ace reviewer and columnist in Hollywood attended.

We all expected something to happen, because we had been warned, or perhaps I should say "asked," not to attend the preview in a curious propaganda letter sent to everyone who received a preview invitation. It came on a letterhead purportedly from the "German-American Order for Patriotic Mobilization" (see reproduction, page 7).

But perhaps I should explain why the letter was sent.

Secrets of Inside Germany

"Underground" is a screen play dramatizing the most dangerous revolutionary movement ever attempted—the thrilling underground campaign within Germany being waged by thousands of German citizens against Hitler and their arch-enemies, the Gestapo.

Refugee ex-members of the underground movement, no longer active in Germany because their identities had become known, helped supply the facts from which the story was written and assisted in its technical direction when film was made. Astounding and melodramatic as is the picture, it is also highly authentic.

Boycott Letter Arrives

Several weeks ago it was revealed in MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE that there are Nazi spies in Hollywood. The letter which Hollywood reviewing correspondents received the eve of Warner preview is did positive. Where and how so-called German-American

Order for Patriotic Mobilization get hold of the list of correspondents? Every one of them received the letter. That's one for the FBI—and the FBI is checking.

The letter, in part, said: "In the interests of truth and fair play we ask you to remember the thousands of German-Americans, your neighbors and friends, who will be done a great injustice by that film. To the best knowledge of our always authentic sources abroad, such a movement as this film depicts is pure fiction on the part of Hollywood producers... We urge you to show your respect for truth by avoiding film falsehood. Please give such Hollywood endeavors the disregard they deserve."

It was signed by Carl Mueller. There is no Carl Mueller. There is no such organization at the address given on the letterhead. There is a "movement" office in the same building known as the American Peace Mobilization, but that outfit's officials deny connection with the letter.

Nazi "Coup" Dismal Failure

Regardless of the polite request of the mythical Carl Mueller, "Underground" was previewed to a full house and will be released to and witnessed by millions of loyal Americans who will not alone be entertained but will also get—

An authentic story of a real and spreading movement inside Germany to get rid of Hitler and his gang; an authentic story of how the brutal, fiendish Gestapo secret police operate, torture and kill; an authentic story of the precious value of liberty in a country where no one may have it—except through the Underground.

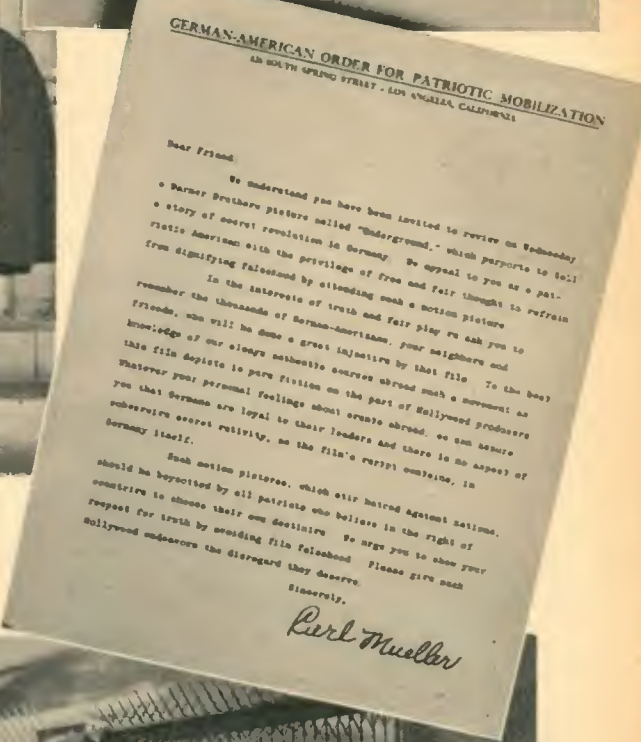

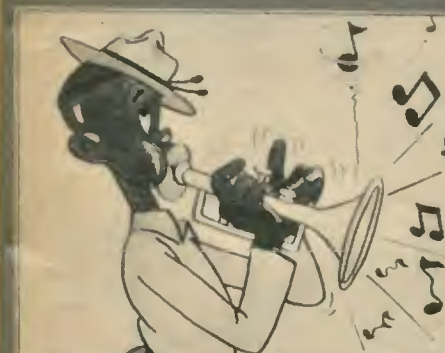

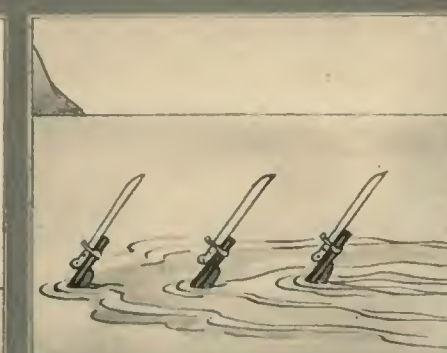

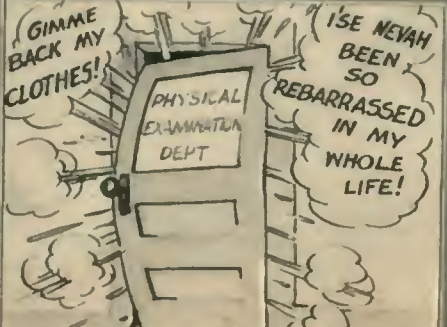

Rufe Davis Plays "Expectant Father"

To News Desk:

YOU'VE read about Errol Flynn becoming a father, but pictorial evidence of the achievement has not yet been revealed. In these exclusive photographs which Davis posed for *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE* he demonstrated what an expectant father does—or should do—in the hospital's waiting-room. The pictures appearing on this page were made one day, and the next Davis went through the actual ordeal much sooner than he had expected!

On June 4 he became the father of a seven-pound-three-ounce daughter whom he and Mrs. Davis, a former American ballet dancer whom he wed

June 3, 1940, christened Susan Caroline.

For several days Davis was not allowed in the room with the baby but finally wheedled hospital authorities into letting him don surgical clothes and mask to take pictures of Mrs. Davis and Susan Caroline. For several more days Davis could see the baby only through the nursery room windows. He solved that problem by taking a pair of field glasses with him to the hospital, which brought the infant within inches of his nose. The first

night Davis did this, dozens of other fathers borrowed the glasses from him to better view their babies.

Cast: Gary Cooper, Walter Brennan, Joan Leslie, George Tobias, Stanley Ridges, Margaret Wycherly, Ward Bond, Noah Beery, Jr., June Lockhart, Dickie Moore, Clem Bevans, et al. A Warner Brothers picture, produced by Jesse Lasky, directed by Howard Hawks. Screen play by Abem Finkel, Harry Chandler and others.

Type of Picture: Based on the diary of Sergeant Alvin C. York, American hero, this is an honest fictionized version of what really happened to a soldier.

The Story: In the mountains of Tennessee a bachelor farmer lives with his mother, brother and sister. Hardened by the thankless task of attempting to gain a living from the rocky soil, this man, played by Gary Cooper, goes on periodic sprees, eventually falls in love, reforms, "gits religion." When war starts he attempts to avoid service because "the Book" says it is wrong to kill. Eventually, reason tempers religion. He goes to France to fight, becomes a hero by capturing 132 prisoners in a desperate fight to save the lives of other soldiers. He returns to America to find heroism not to his liking, to discover that what he had was worth the fight.

Verdict: "Sergeant York" is a picture all Americans should see.—C. S.

Type of Picture: An odd mixture of action drama and "triangle love-story."

The Story: Marlene Dietrich is a "B Girl," that unfortunate type of woman who makes her living in cheap cabarets by urging men to buy drinks. Her father, who works on power lines, is killed and she is befriended by Edward G. Robinson, the tough little man with a heart of gold. Eddie's pal, George Raft, strikes Dietrich's fancy after she marries Robinson, and the script-writers solve the tricky situation by having Robinson killed as he and Raft battle while fighting on top a power-line tower.

Verdict: No matter how you look at this picture, it runs to what Hollywood calls "formula." This means that there are a good many familiar situations. Think this over and you get the idea that you have seen some of it before. All the performances are good and the direction fine, with the single exception that only the intense admirers of Marlene Dietrich will call her studied posing acting. —L. R.

Dear Public:

THANKS for your many letters. After tabulating all the "movie peeves" received during the last few weeks, we have some unusual observations to make. How many of the Hollywood producers who read this column will believe what it says and do something about the situations, we can't promise, but we have condensed all your movie complaints and they read like this:

TOO MANY POOR STORIES: A high percentage of your comments stated that there is "nothing new" in movies, that the same old stories are done over and over, that radio offers a greater variety of entertainment.

TOO MANY PHONY STARS: You, the public, seem convinced that it takes a long time to become a star and that a good many players now listed as stars are not stars at all—merely figments of publicity.

TOO MUCH CENSORSHIP: A potent minority of letters claims that love-scenes have become so stereotyped that they aren't as romantic as a kiss in the dark almost any young movie-goer can get for himself.

TOO FEW SIMPLE THEMES: Many letters express resentment over lavish stories. A typical movie-goer's reaction: "I'd rather see a good western cowboy opera than many of these high-society dramas."

Now, what is the answer? Simply that people will always go to see a good picture, but they resent being pulled into a bad one by hokum publicity and advertising.

That means that Hollywood is fooling itself again when the demand is made to stop publishing reviews of pictures so that movie-goers can tell in advance what they are paying for. That means that you can entertain some of the people some of the time, and all of the people some of the time, but you can't entertain all of the people all of the time. They have other things to do.

RADIO VIEWS

IT IS really heartening to this writer when he sees instances of comparatively unknown radio actors winning roles in competition with top-flight stars, for it proves that radio is not committed wholly to a policy of presenting only well-known players on its big-time programs. It also illustrates why radio has managed to be consistently successful. To refuse to gamble upon the success of a talented newcomer is a more or less fatal error in any sort of entertainment medium, and radio, least of all, can afford to take this attitude. It hasn't. Breaking into radio doesn't present half the difficulties that, for instance, breaking into the movies entails. That radio's attitude toward unknowns is liberal is manifested in the case of two minor actors who were recently given outstanding roles after prolonged auditions in which a great number of Broadway and broadcasting stars competed. The two who won out were Patrlala Ryan, the heroine of "Claudia," and Lester Damon, who received the title role in "The Thin Man."

Radio's attitude toward once popular favorites isn't so liberal, however. At any rate, so it seems. Despite the fact that many outstanding stars of yesterday still have a wide following, there is a tendency to pass over these artists in favor of others whose popularity rise is more current. Two, in particular, who have been neglected are Tito Guizar and Gertrude Niesen. Here are two radio favorites of yesterday whose talents today are practically undiminished. Guizar was only recently an outstanding success at the Rhumba Casino in Chicago and the Monte Carlo in New York. Miss Niesen's voice is as compelling as it was the day she first broadcast. And in conclusion we might add that Ralph Kirbery, the famous "Dream Singer"

of the years 1934-35, still receives stacks of fan mail from his loyal listeners, who haven't forgotten him.

GENERAL

Freedom of Speech?

NEW YORK.—When actress Tallulah Bankhead appeared as guest on Ilka Chase's "Penthouse Party" program, June 27, she discovered just before going on the air that the censorship board of CBS had been at work on her portion of the script. During Miss

Chase's interview with Miss Bankhead the program's emcee was supposed to ask "What are your pet enthusiasms, Tallulah?" In reply to this question the actress had prepared the following: "Well, Ilka, I suppose because I never lift a finger myself, I'm a fan for several pretty violent forms of exercise—baseball, as you know, and prize-fighting. Joe Louis is my hero . . . and my other enthusiasm is England. After all, I had a wonderful life there for many years playing in the English theater."

The board of censors immediately cut out the italicized portion and requested Miss Bankhead to substitute remarks of a less controversial nature. In an exclusive statement to MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE, Miss Chase said that she was completely bewildered by the board's action. "I can't understand why it is all right for us to send bombers to Britain, bundles to Britain, blood to Britain and yet it is not permissible for an actress on her radio show to say that one of her greatest enthusiasms is England."

However, the CBS censorship ban on remarks similar to those Miss Bankhead had intended making is still in force.

Bing's Nags Shoeless

HOLLYWOOD.—Bing Crosby's horse-racing has been hit by an O. P. M. ruling! Finding aluminum racing-shoes scarce, Bing planned to have a foundry operated by his brother cast some for his stables. But O. P. M. said no; the aluminum is needed for war-planes. So now Bing's nags must race in steel shoes, a handicap which probably won't make any difference in the order of their finish!

NBC Dickers with ASCAP

NEW YORK.—Following CBS' action recently, NBC has submitted a proposal to ASCAP for the use of its music. The offer, if accepted, would bind NBC to pay ASCAP two and one-half percent on network commercial business; also for NBC to pay for the use of ASCAP music on all network sustaining and public-service programs.

Fibber Double-Crossed

KANSAS CITY.—Fibber McGee doesn't know whether or not he likes the heat wave here. As co-owner with his brother of a soft-drink bottling-works, the heat has brought him a rushing business. On the other hand, Fibber doesn't like the heat, so has postponed his vacation visit.

WAR

Berlin Bans CBS Reporters

NEW YORK.—Running true to form,

the Nazis immediately placed a ban on all CBS broadcasts from Berlin following certain comments uttered here in New York by Elmer Davis, noted news analyst. Davis' comments had reference to a radio interview with novelist P. G. Wodehouse, which took place earlier that evening. Speaking for CBS, Paul White, director of public affairs for the company, stated that the network would never submit to foreign dictation on its broadcasts in this country. In the radio interview, Wodehouse said that he did not mind being a prisoner of war, that he had been recently released from a concentration camp and given a suite in the Hotel Adlon in Berlin, where he was at liberty to come and go as he pleased. Mr. Davis, in his analysis of the interview, pointed out that treatment of Wodehouse was altogether different from that accorded others whose release from a concentration camp might have less publicity value. As was to be expected, the remarks thoroughly enraged the Nazis.

Cantor Producer Leaves Show

NEW YORK.—Following the close of the Cantor show for the summer, Vick Knight, the show's producer, gave notice that when the program resumed this fall he would not be on hand to direct it. The announcement created a surprise, particularly when Knight revealed that it would be the Fred Allen show which he would direct when the fall radio season gets under way. The Allen program is opposite Cantor on the airlines!

NEW YORK.—When Jackie McDonald, seven, and his sister, Jane, eight, came to this country from Scotland last year, the two little refugees from oft-bombed Britain went to live with

relatives in Chattanooga, Tenn., where their Scotch brogue made them marked figures in the eyes of the local populace. The other day the two were privileged to take part in an overseas program. Said the little Scottish lad in answer to the question as to whether he liked cricket or baseball better now, "Why, Ah don't even know how to play cricket any moh."

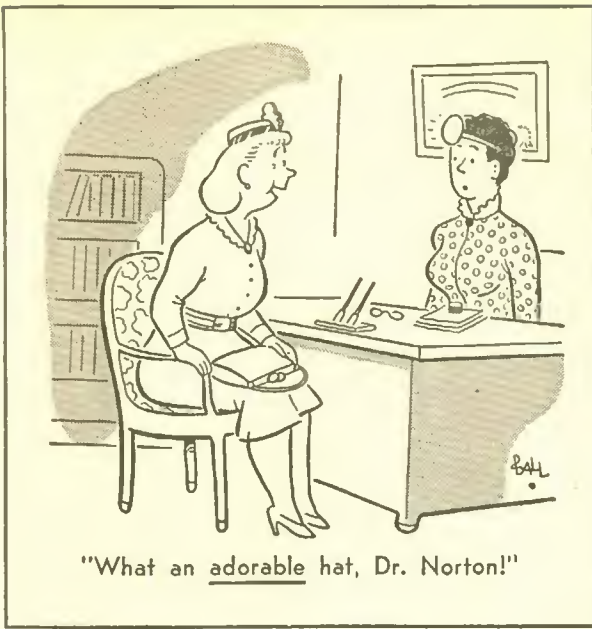

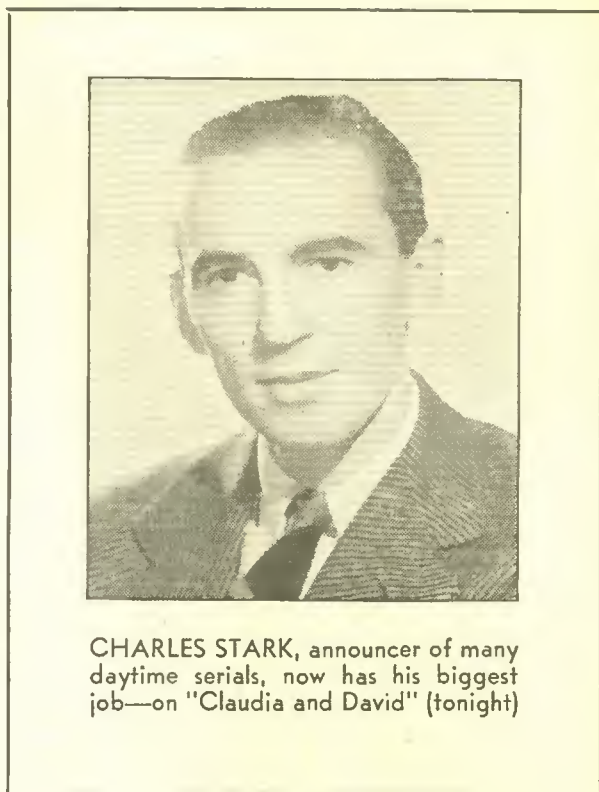

LORD HAW HAW, alias William Joyce, ex-British fascist heard Sun., Tues. and Fri. from Berlin

Berlin, Joyce became a German citizen, changed his name to "Froehlich" (meaning joyous in German), and was hired almost immediately by the German Ministry of Propaganda at a salary of \$60 a week.

During the fall of 1939 Joyce became a staff member of the German Shortwave Station and began his now famous series of talks addressed to the people of England. No one in England at that time recognized the new unidentified Berlin commentator as the renegade traitor Joyce, and his broadcasts—because of their witty, informal nature, making fun of Nazi life and of himself as well—enjoyed great popularity with the British. It was Jonah Barrington Ward, radio editor of the *London Daily Express*, who christened the Berlin speaker "Lord Haw Haw." The title took on and Lord Haw Haw became a familiar by-word in England. (The first Berlin speaker to direct talks to England actually was first heard in April, 1939. Who this first "Lord Haw Haw" was no one has ever discovered, but Joyce, the present Lord Haw Haw, replaced him in the fall of 1939.) Meanwhile Haw Haw's ridiculous sketches, satires, puns and jokes were being followed on more than nine million British receiving-sets. Lord Haw Haw had fully established his listeners' confidence.

A few months later the tone of Lord Haw Haw's talks began to be imperceptibly altered. The jokes became less frequent. Politics crept into the discourses. Insidiously he began to undermine the confidence of the British people in the age-old traditions and institutions of their country.

It was about this time that Lord Haw Haw was identified as William Joyce by his deserted wife in England, who, hearing his voice over the radio, screamed, "That is my husband."

In April of 1940, Lord Haw Haw was first introduced to the American listening audience in the Berlin transmission for North America. But lacking the humor and punch of his earlier efforts, Lord Haw Haw's talks today are of little interest.

Knowing what we now do of this Goebbels mouthpiece, Americans are refusing to be taken in by his seeming logic; are not confused by his twisted interpretations of facts; are not scared by his predictions.

Changes in London Schedules

To celebrate the first anniversary of London's reorganized program service to North America the daily transmissions are being lengthened and certain changes made in the timing of program features. London now broadcasts to North America daily from 6:10 p.m. to 12:45 a.m. EDT over GSC (9.58) and GSD (11.75). Launching of Bill Stern's Boat

BECAUSE it was a hot day and the lovely christeners got thirsty before the ceremony, sports announcer Bill Stern's cabin cruiser was launched unusually with the breaking of empty soft-drink bottles over its bow. Dinah Shore of the Eddie Cantor show and Lina Romay, vocalist for Xavier Cugat's band, not only officiated at the launching—they also were guilty of first drinking the pop (which made this perhaps the first "empty bottle" christening on record).

Stern's twenty-six-foot motor boat, the *Wee Pete*, rides at anchor a few miles from the heart of Manhattan in the Socony Yacht Basin in the North River, the lower part of the Hudson, almost obscured by yachts owned by other radio personalities, including those of Major Bowes and Guy Lombardo.

However, because his boat is not as large as the others and is easier to handle, Skipper Stern uses the *Wee Pete* a great deal more than other yachtmen do their craft. Bill enjoys his boat immensely. When not hard at work at his sports desk in the broadcasting studios, Stern can usually be found with some of his radio friends cruising on the Hudson, Long Island Sound or along the eastern seaboard.

Purchased this spring, the ninety-five-horse-power boat was christened the day these pictures were taken. While it was a casual event, Skipper Stern, who watched the ceremonies closely, admitted feeling quite awed when Dinah and Lina broke the empty bottles over the bow. (Budd Hulick of "Quizzer Baseball" said he was more interested in seeing that the *Wee Pete* didn't break away from the dock while the ceremonies were going on.) To complete the launching of the *Wee Pete*, the christeners took a trip. Milton Cross, veteran radio announcer, was the self-appointed cook for the jaunt, taking over the galley and rustling up an appetizing meal.

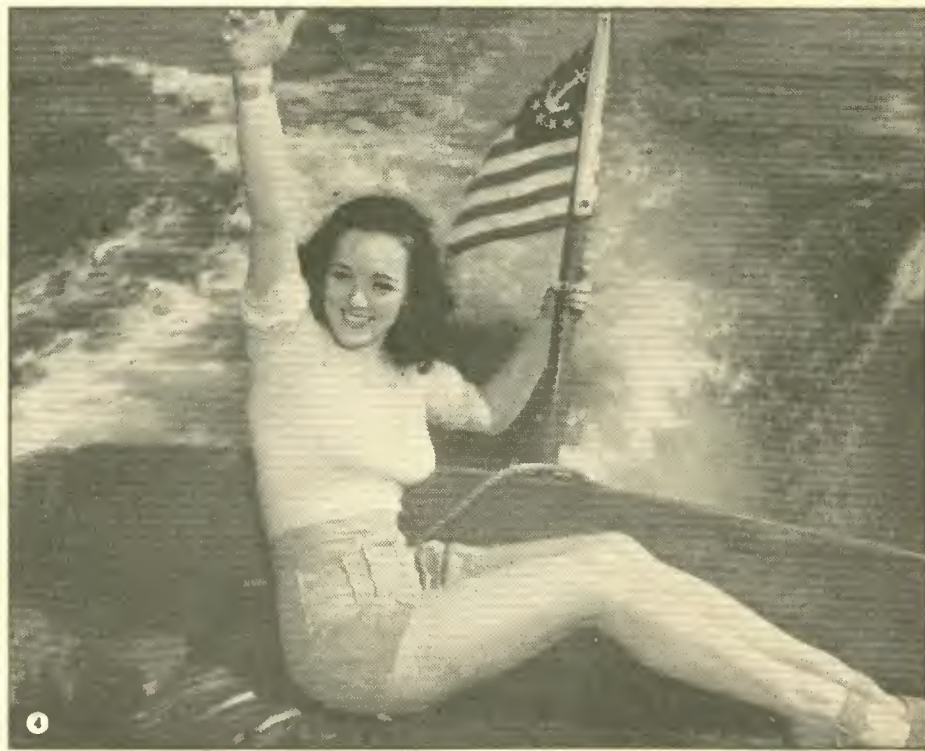
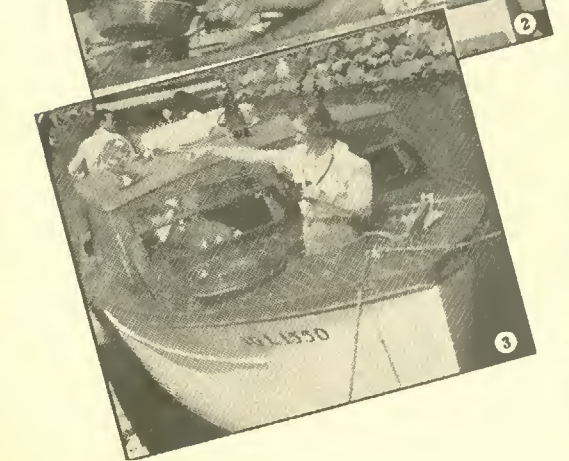

RADIO'S NEWS EVENT OF THE WEEK

For the second time listeners are given a words-eye view of a submarine rescue attempt

ON THE afternoon of June 20 a terse, four-line bulletin came over NBC's Radio City newsroom wire. In a flash, radio newsmen were scrambling for planes, short-wave equipment and boats, for the bulletin was an announcement by the U. S. Navy that the submarine O-9, with its thirty-three officers and men, was more than two hours overdue after a practise dive off the Isle of Shoals at Portsmouth, N. H. An hour later, with the *Squalus* disaster of two years ago still fresh in their memories, NBC special-events men, headed by Arthur Feldman, were rushing by air to what had become once again the nation's news center. Carrying announcers William Spargrove and Radcliffe Hall, the plane winged up the New England coast, then veered out to sea to survey frantic rescue efforts where the O-9 had dived. Meanwhile, engineers were installing short-wave equipment at Portsmouth Navy Yard, which was to be headquarters for the dispatch of news—through Portsmouth's station WHEB—to waiting listeners. Here radiograms from the rescue ship *Falcon* were received through naval officials. By eight o'clock Saturday morning NBC listeners heard that the O-9 had been located 440 feet down, that bits of cork floating on the water indicated at least one of the sub's compartments had been crushed. Later in the day, announcer Radcliffe Hall, aboard a chartered cruiser, gave listeners the tragic, suspenseful story of vain attempts to save the O-9 and its men. This radio performed another great—though sorrowful—service.

"Plantation Party" Potpourri



The SHOW

"HELLO, FRIENDS, and howdy, neighbors!" Thus emcee Whitey Ford (with script in hand) greets the listeners and the audience in an NBC-Chicago studio as "Plantation Party" takes the air. And above is how the cast lines up as the festivities open. Basso Michael Stewart is at Ford's left and guitarist George Barnes sits at his right, with Bob Trendler glimpsed at piano behind the emcee. At the left, garbed in white western outfits, are Louise Massey and the Westerners. At the right are the Doring Sisters trio and Tom, Dick and Harry. Atmosphere in the studio during the broadcast is just as informal and merry as it seems over the air. Laughs, foot-tapping and under-the-breath humming are much in evidence among both the performers and the hundreds of spectators in audience: All have a good time at the "party"

JOLLY, breezy, informal, homespun, old-timey, corny—these are adjectives which might variously be applied to "Plantation Party," according to your own musical and humorous tastes. One adjective which can be applied without qualification is "successful." Since "Plantation Party" (now heard Wednesday on NBC) first went on the air in December, 1938, it has been highly successful in selling roll-your-own cigarette tobacco and in entertaining a huge and devoted public of the type that prefers a whoop-it-up, get-friendly radio party to a highfalutin soiree. The only one of the original cast to carry on to the present is Whitey Ford, the Duke of Paducah. But the show still carries the color and flavor of its original radio setting, a plantation of the Old South. There is no orchestra. The only instrumental aggregation is composed of Louise Massey and the Westerners—with Louise as vocalist; Allen Massey as guitarist-banjoist; Milt Mabie, bass-fiddle player; Larry Wellington, accordionist, and Curt Massey, violinist-trumpeter-baritone. Whitey Ford, master of ceremonies and comedy headliner as the Duke of Paducah, is as homespun as the back country of his native Missouri (he was born in De Soto).

Whitey appears in various outlandish costumes for his comedy routine, and is one of the very few radio performers who memorizes his act instead of reading from a script. Off the air Whitey isn't the yokel his burlesque character

makes him out to be. But he is just as jolly, friendly and unassuming as his Duke of Paducah. He writes his own comedy, but readily admits he relies extensively on his immense humor library. He says, "A gag-writer is a feller with a long memory who hopes the memory of his audience is short." Of his trade-mark line, "I'm goin' to the wagon, these shoes are killin' me," Whitey says anybody who ever spent a Saturday night in a small town of some years ago knows what the line signifies—only now it has been streamlined to "I'm goin' to the car." In preparing his comedy script, Ford has available a carefully cataloged file of some 150,000 gags. His first draft contains about eighty jokes. By show time, after "trying it out on the dogs"—that is, on the cast—the routine is trimmed down to a dozen or so best gags.

Adding plenty of zip to the show is radio's version of the Marx Brothers with a song attachment—the veteran trio of Tom, Dick and Harry. There are numerous other musical features—enough, as a matter of fact, to make "Plantation Party" one of radio's snappiest and happiest shows. All the music is under the supervision of Bob Trendler, one of the busiest and most capable musical men in the radio business.

So, come Wednesday evening, you can "come along and join the celebration down at the old 'Plantation Party'"—but you won't dare be solemn, or sophisticated.—D. M.

Movie-Radio Guide's Feminine Forum

By ALBERTA NORTH

WHEN you're spending day after day at the beach in a bathing-suit all summer, or hitting a tennis ball up and down some court in play shorts, you certainly have to give some extra thought to the appearance of your legs and feet.

You have probably taken care to select a stunning bathing-suit, perhaps you even own one of the lovely Catalina Swim Suits that Ginny Simms is wearing above; so do it justice by revealing legs that are just as attractive!

First, be sure that they are smooth and soft. Remove fuzz regularly with either an abrasive disk like Velva-Tize or a good depilatory. Imra is a quick and pleasant depilatory, sweet-smelling, and involves none of the risks of nicks, scars and stubble which make the use of a razor so hazardous.

It's a good idea to follow even the most gentle defuzzing routine with the application of a soothing lotion. Use one of your usual hand-lotions; Jergen's, for instance. This will insure your legs of a satiny finish and do much to smooth down rough heels and calluses on your feet.

For ladies whose legs are not structurally beautiful, there's a lot more to be done than despair. LeRoy Prinz, dance director of Paramount Studios, has some good advice on how to disguise spindle-shanks and knock-knees. He says, "If a woman knows how to stand and walk she can give the impression of having lovely legs, no matter how bad they may be in reality." Here are several rules outlined by Mr. Prinz:

1. Learn how to stand first. Keep your feet close together and always flex one knee while you keep the other straight. This is a graceful posture and creates a broken line which hides the real outline of your legs.

2. Never cross your legs at the ankles or at the top of the knees. Remember, if you cross your knees at all, do so well above the knee itself, so that the legs are parallel, not at sharp angles with each other.

3. Standing and walking, and even sitting, especially in a bathing-suit, the head should be up and the shoulders squared.

4. Walk in a straight line. That is, place one foot directly in front of the other.

Fashion Tips on Toes

On the beach you must also give consideration to current fashion tips for toes. Before you put one foot on the sandy shore, be sure that you have given yourself your weekly pedicure. For feet that will look as well groomed as the rest of you, start with a hot and cold soaking and a good scrubbing with Lux flakes. Dry your feet with one of those grand, thick Cannon Turkish towels, and rub them well. This will stimulate circulation and help remove that dingy layer of dead skin.

Then dab Pledge Cuticle Softener on each toe with cotton and gently push the cuticle back with an orange stick. Cut the nails, or file them if you prefer, but be careful to cut them straight across and not shaped down to the corners as this might cause trouble. Next, use a nail white to make the job look professional. To apply the polish, separate your toes with cotton, and cover the moon. Leave only a narrow tip of white showing.

In selecting the shade of polish, match your finger-nails and even your own lips, if possible. The self-feeding brush tubes of nail enamel made by Pledge are especially helpful in applying lacquer smoothly and easily to your toetips.

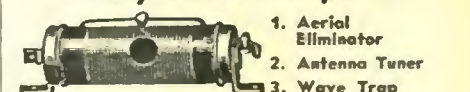

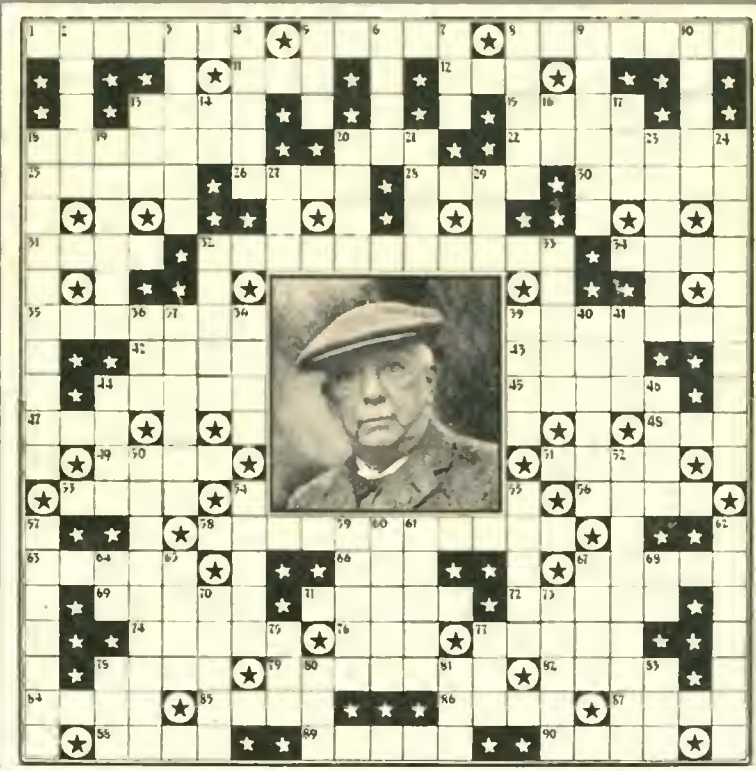

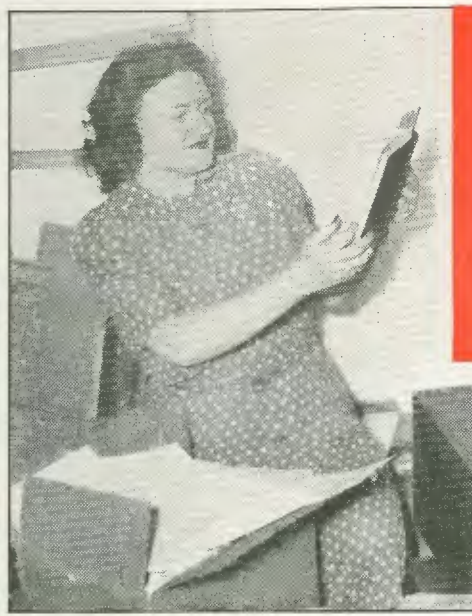
