## Movie-Radio Guide Applauds:

### KAY KYSER

The Ol' Professor doffs his cap and gown, dons a campaign hat!

FOR the second time in three months, MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE applauds the Ol' Professor, Kay Kyser, head man on radio's "College of Musical Knowledge" (NBC, Wed.).

Giving the palm to the same person twice within such a short space of time is an unusual procedure for MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE, but Kay Kyser is an unusual person.

No other personality of radio and screen has worked harder than Kay Kyser has to bring entertainment to the nation's armed-force camps. He was one of the first to realize what a little light-hearted amusement would mean to the men in service. Together with comic Jerry Lester (who was making a tour of eastern camps with "Hit Parade" at about the same time) Kyser shares the honor of being the first radio personality to go right into the camps themselves. He visited the United States Marine Base at San Diego, Calif., in February, where he and his singer, Ginny Simms, both were made honorary sergeants.

Followed next a trip to Fort Lewis near Tacoma, Wash., in March, and an airplane jaunt to Randolph Field near San Antonio, Texas. Upon his return from Texas, more trips followed.

Later Kyser and a group of Hollywood stars traveled throughout California, appearing at additional Army camps.

At each of these camps, Kyser conducted a three-hour program, introduced the Hollywood stars, accompanied them during their numbers, gave a full performance of "College of Musical Knowledge." What is more, he paid his own and his band's expenses for the entire trip!

Because he has entertained for the Navy, the Marines, the Air Corps and selective service camps without partiality, because his broadcasts from these camps have been of the same high caliber as always in spite of working under difficult conditions, and because of his avowed intention to continue this entertainment tour as soon as current motion-picture commitments permit, MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE again applauds—Kay Kyser!

# Cesar Romero

To News Desk:

**C**ESAR ROMERO is a brave man!

He has the nerve to name the ten best ballroom dancers from among all the glamour-girl claimants of that title in Hollywood!

Of course, Cesar, or Butch as he is known by his cronies out at 20th Century-Fox Studios, did it for the sake of publicizing his next picture to be released, very coincidentally titled "Dance Hall." But regardless, the fact that Mr. Romero would even attempt to select but ten of glamour town's ladies as the most expert exponents of Terpsichore is indeed a courageous act.

Qualified to judge by reason of being one of the three best dancers in Hollywood himself, Romero has danced with the best and the worst of filmdom's pretties, and, after a half-dozen years of ballroom testing, he pronounces as the very best:

Joan Crawford, Betty Grable, Ginger Rogers, Carole Landis (who dances with him in "Dance Hall"), Claire Trevor, Loretta Young, Mrs. Lewis Milestone, Mrs. George Murphy, Sally Blane (Loretta Young's sister) and Virginia Bruce.

But even Romero hesitates to put the ten in order of their ability. He was careful to point out to your MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE reporter that the ten he named were not listed in the order of his preference.

Left at the post were Oomph Girl Ann Sheridan and Sonja Henie, both of whom Romero not long ago gave long and intensive rushes. Perhaps he forgot them, or perhaps they aren't dancing so well lately.

Missing also from Romero's selections was Rita Hayworth, acknowledged to be Hollywood's most expert rumba and tango dancer and chosen by Fred Astaire to co-star with him in the soon-to-be-released "You'll Never Get Rich" picture.

And, given his choice of any size partner he wanted, he remarked that Kay Kingsley, a statuesque brunette who stands five feet eleven inches in her high-heeled pumps, just three inches shorter than Butch, would be about right. So, tall girls, slump no more. Romero likes 'em big.

Romero has danced little with Miss Grable, but he has ample opportunity to watch her work at his home lot, 20th-Fox, and Cesar also knows that George Raft, another of Hollywood's best male dancers, likes Betty plenty on the ballroom floor.

In "Dance Hall" Romero dances aplenty with Carole Landis and June Storey, but not the Ciro's tangos and waltzes. No, sir, the Cisco Kid does jitterbug, and his rug-cutting is something.

Jitterbugging was a new dance form for Romero at start of the picture but he proved an apt pupil of rug-cutting champions Jewel McGowan and Dean Collins. Before learning the complicated steps, Romero always said that jitterbugging was a distinctive and worth-while art form. But after he practised the steps for several weeks, his regard was even higher.

The lessons cost him a pulled tendon in one foot and a bruised shin!






Playboy Tom Duncan (Montgomery) awakens one morning to find an icebag on his head and a new wife, Nancy Adams (Miss Dunne). She married him in haste and for spite. She really loved his brother.

So there they are, two brothers, one of them suddenly and presumably wrongly married to the girl the other should have wed.

Gregory LaCava expertly handled the problem of "marry in haste and repent at leisure." Any Hollywood director (not to disparage talented LaCava's work) could have done the same, for probably in no other city do so many quickie marriages and speedy divorces occur with such regularity.

Review the past year. The most recent in-and-outers are Nancy Kelly and Edmond O'Brien. The fact they eloped was good evidence they weren't so sure of themselves. There was a problem they hadn't solved.

Taking a second thought after their vows, they quarreled, patched it up, quarreled again, made up. At last report, Miss Kelly had sued for divorce.

Lana Turner's overnight switch from the constant beaung of Gregory

Bautzer to one date and immediate elopement with Artie Shaw has been well publicized. It didn't last long.






Type of Picture: This marks an innovation for Hollywood in that it is the first of a series of streamlined Hal Roach features—short (sixty minutes) and to the point, and in this case, what a point! It is packed with laughs from chuckles to guffaws.

This Is the Story: William Tracy, drafted from his job as railroad information clerk, reports to camp and astounds Top Sergeant Joe Sawyer, the officers of his initial company and the entire officer staff of the camp with his expert knowledge of the infantry-drill regulations, which he recites perfectly and with great gusto. Amazing the officers (and disgusting his fellow selectees), he is given a sergeant's rating at once. Whereupon his fellow soldiers decide to give him a bit of trouble. He gets the trouble, and through luck overcomes it in devious laughable situations.

Verdict: "Tanks a Million" is a light, quick and entertaining comedy that gives several newcomers and a couple of old-timers good opportunities—and they all make good. It is a picture for everyone in the family—especially the family of a boy or man in the U. S. armed forces—to see and laugh at. —E. P.

There is still much fun and humor, but, because of the added seriousness of the story, this picture gets the necessary "soul" to it that will surely make the Hardy series into an American institution, if it hasn't already attained such a ranking.

This Is the Story: Andy, with a high-school diploma, is given a thirty-day trial at making his own way in New York, after which he is to choose between a business career or going to college and taking a law course. Once in New York, he finds that a big city can deal out more blows than a heavyweight boxer. Ultimately he winds up back in Carvel, but only after he has learned that "the school of hard knocks" is more than a trite phrase.

The Hardy series has always been a source of assistance to parents in reasoning with their children. This time the picture is a real godsend, as through Judge Hardy's lips a very touchy problem is brought out with logic and finesse.

Verdict: It's one of the best Hardy pictures. A "must see" for the whole family. —L. R.

DEAR Movie-Goers: On my vacation I've been able to do a bit of quiet, undisturbed thinking. One of my thoughts concerned other vacationists, many of whom have arrived in Hollywood this summer hoping to get a peep at some famous stars at work or play.

In fact, so many tourists have included Hollywood on their itinerary this summer that a new record for numbers has been established. Yet,

because there were so many movie fans who wanted to see the lots where the films come from, tourists had to be barred!

The producers have a legitimate reason for shutting out visitors. They can't make pictures and show all the fifty-five million movie-goers how they are made at the same time. Making movies is a tricky business, and many times visitors spoil "takes" or throw an actor or actress off a difficult emotional mood.

Yet I see the public's side of the question. I'd like every movie-goer to have his or her chance to visit a big lot and see pictures in the making. But, since too many folks are coming to Hollywood for that main purpose, the harsh remedy, a sign read-

ing "No Visitors Allowed" has had to be hung on the gates of all of the studios.

So went my thinking. And a bright thought came to me. How would you like to see a sixty- or ninety-minute screen feature showing stars making current screen plays—films that soon are to be released? With a good-voiced narrator, like Pete Smith, telling the story of the trip about the studios, and with this narrator interviewing stars on the sets and in their dressing-rooms, I think we'd have a swell substitute for the barred studio visits. Such a picture could be made several times a year, say in the spring, summer, fall and winter. Do you like the idea? Then say so with letters to me.

MUSIC NOTES: You may have heard Franca White sing Rachmaninoff's "Floods of Spring" on a recent "Telephone Hour" broadcast. It is doubtful, however, that you were aware that the soprano dashed off the lyrics a few hours before broadcast time. It seems that it wasn't until rehearsal time that the program officials discovered the only non-ASCAP lyrics permissible on the network were in Russian or German. It necessitated a hurried translation of a German lyric. Using this literal translation, Miss White sat down and composed a new lyric... According to Edwin McArthur, the noted young American conductor, radio is a force which makes it possible for contemporary composers to become well known in their time instead of having to wait for posterity. Score one for radio!... And speaking of contemporary composers and conductors, it reminds us that Howard Barlow is one of the few conductors who is carrying out his announced intention of plugging American music of serious nature. Most conductors somehow conveniently forget their promises in this respect, although at the time they made them they were quite loud in praise of our native music. Quite!

# Today in Radio

Bergen boosts home-town library;  
"Hap Hazard" goes to Hollywood

## RADIO VIEWS

by Martin Lewis

EVERY once in a while we are approached by persons with program ideas who state that they have been offered the opportunity of placing their show on a network on a sustaining basis. Our advice to these persons is for them to refuse such an offer and concentrate upon trying to sell the show to an agency which can get them a sponsor. Our reason for this advice is that the record shows that few sustaining programs become commercial. Frankly we are amazed at the attitude of the sponsors who still are failing to perceive commercial possibilities in sustaining network programs.

It's no secret that few sustaining shows have ever been sold to a commercial sponsor. Fresh in everyone's memory, of course, is the wonderful advance which "Information, Please" made in going from sustaining to commercial. But for every sustaining show which has reaped the rewards coincident with commercialization,

there are dozens perhaps equally as good which have died unsung and unmourned—by the sponsors, anyway.

Current sustaining programs such as "Basin Street Chamber Music Society," the "26 by Corwin" series, "Joe and Mabel" and others just as meritorious are, in the opinion of this writer, worthy of serious consideration for sponsorship. They have built up large listening audiences and, with a larger budget to allow for "name" guest stars, they could easily become first-rate programs. As a matter of fact there are sustaining shows which do not even need larger budgets to become successful commercials.

We don't think, of course, that every sustaining show is a potential commercial program, but there does seem to be something wrong when shows with excellent ideas are passed over by sponsors for shows which are corny without measure.

**S**HORT-WAVE radio programs from the United States are more popular in Argentina than those of any other country, according to a recent listener survey made by the Latin-American division of the J. Walter Thompson Company. A total of 1,518 persons of selected ages and incomes were interviewed in forty areas of Argentina in April and May of this year.

Of the owners of short-wave sets interviewed, 23.3 percent said that they listened oftenest to the stations of the United States. Germany was next with 19.5 percent and Great Britain third with 17.4 percent of the audience. Italy had 11.3 percent. Spain and others were favored by still fewer listeners.

The survey also revealed signal strength of U. S. short-wave stations as stronger than that of European

broadcasts to Europe are on a frequency of 15.25 megs.

### About New Programs

### Peeks at Personalities

Cecil Brown, veteran member of the CBS foreign staff, has arrived in Singapore, where he will report on developments direct by trans-Pacific short-wave radio to CBS network listeners on "The World Today" programs broadcast daily at 4:45 p.m. CST over WCAB (6.06) . . . Helen Hiett, youthful NBC war correspondent, is the first woman to have the distinction of winning a National Headliner's Club award. She was cited for "the best exclusive radio reporting of a news event" during 1940, which was the story she broadcast last September on the three-day bombing of Gibraltar by Axis air fleets.

### Introducing: Georgia Henschel

According to "London Calling," Georgia Henschel and Marjorie Anderson are inevitably known in the British Broadcasting Corporation as the Heavenly Twins. They are the two women who together broke precedent in the Empire Service by joining as announcers in June, 1940.

Georgia has crowded many jobs into a short space of time, but the one she likes best is announcing. As befits the daughter of the late Sir George Henschel, the famous musician, she is a singer, but she has been a school-

mistress, organized charity balls—a thankless task, she says—organized conferences for the Institute of International Affairs, and for a time at the beginning of the war she was a land girl in Scotland.

Miss Henschel was born in a London house which had been lent to her father by Parsons, the painter—a good beginning for an artistic career. As a child she traveled a great deal in France and Holland, and for a time she lived in Freiburg im Breisgau in the Germany of pre-Hitler days. All the time she was studying and singing with her father, and in 1930 she gave a recital in London. She gave another the following year, and sang in BBC programs both in London and in Edinburgh.

Miss Henschel likes to recall the wonderful time she had when she visited the United States with her father in 1930. At Boston her father conducted the fiftieth anniversary concert of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, which he had founded in 1880. The program of the concert which her father conducted on the fiftieth anniversary was the same as that of the first concert, and there was an amazing audience and reception. After the war she hopes to visit again in this country.

### General Notes

Thousands of businessmen in Latin America depend on short-wave radio for New York stock-market quotations, according to mail received by WGeo in Schenectady, New York. This station broadcasts the complete list of stock quotations week-days at 5:00 p.m. CST on a frequency of 9.53 megacycles.



British stations were reported "very good" by 37.3 percent, "good" by 36.3 percent, "ordinary" by 24.5 percent and "bad" by 1.9 percent.

IT IS doubtful that at any time during the history of the United States have the spoken opinions of one non-office-holding citizen created a furor to equal that created by the radio addresses of Charles A. Lindbergh. Because he is a plain American citizen he is subject to the scrutiny of plain American citizens—a scrutiny that expresses itself remarkably well in the results of this MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE poll.

Examine the results of the poll, tabulated by experts, attested to by the editors. In a breakdown of the vote, all sections of the country indicated a belief in Lindbergh's sincerity—and by a good margin. Exceptions were the East South Central and the West South Central sections of the country, where only 35.3 percent and 40.4 percent regard him as sincere, according to the poll. These sections include the states of Kentucky, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Arkansas, Louisiana, Oklahoma and Texas. The East North Central states

—Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan and Wisconsin—had the greatest vote for Lindbergh's sincerity—70.3 percent.

The ballots were almost evenly split on the question of which side Lindbergh would prefer to see win the war, whether he is motivated by political ambition and whether Axis honors in the past (received when he was acting in a U. S. semi-official capacity) have influenced his judgment. A majority of those voting feel that he is not qualified by his background and experience to speak on international affairs. In the realm of personal judgment, about one-third think that the defeat of England will constitute no threat to the United States and two-thirds think it will.

DESPITE spirited letters pro and con about Lindbergh, it is indicated that Americans are generally fair in their judgment of a man who may have opposite views. The South and Mountain states voted almost solidly to the effect that Lindbergh is

motivated by political ambition, and none except the East North Central, where the majority was 53.3 percent, thought Lindbergh has sufficient experience to qualify him to speak in opposition to the administration.

MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE makes no attempt to analyze this poll for its readers, preferring to let each draw his own conclusions about the results. They wish to point out, however, that Lindbergh, as well as all others speaking on international affairs, should bear in mind that they do not talk to all the people at once. This fact is indicated by many of the questions received which show that people by the score are not familiar with Lindbergh's views. The fifty questions listed on this page are most typical and most repeated among the thousands received, and most certainly will provide food for thought on the part of Lindbergh and many another individual. To our readers, thanks for a remarkable response to the poll. See page 8 for the President's Poll.

# Meet Your News Commentator: EARL GODWIN

EARL GODWIN, NBC news commentator, is a rarity—a Washington figure who is a native of the capital. Godwin was born on Capitol Hill on the site of the present Supreme Court building. The clear-voiced commentator, whose authoritative reporting from Washington is heard regularly on NBC's news round-ups and in a five-minute NBC news spot Monday through Friday mornings, is also White House correspondent for the *Washington Times-Herald* and president of the White House Correspondents Association, governing body for newspaper reporters covering the executive mansion. He gained his first Washington news experience twenty-eight years ago as a member of the Washington staff of the *Baltimore Sun*. Later he covered Congress during the first Wilson administration for the

*Washington Star*. Entering the Army during World War I, Godwin returned to Washington to act as associate editor under Arthur Brisbane on the *Washington Times*. He has covered all political campaigns from Wilson's to Franklin D. Roosevelt's.

Godwin's political reporting from Washington reflects the personality of the man. His style, unless the news is too somber, is chatty and sprightly. He's a friendly fellow himself, and enjoys telling and hearing humorous stories. His conversational style as well as his shrewd observations attract many political figures as regular listeners to his broadcasts. Godwin, moreover, is on intimate terms with many of the high officials of the government, a fact which gives invaluable support to his knowledge of the Washington scene. —D. M.







**N**O DOUBT many of you have long ago grown tired of reading about the BMI-ASCAP feud, but, before we promise that in the future we will count ten before mentioning the subject, we want to explain why ASCAP hasn't done as well as expected with the tie-up it made with Mutual. When ASCAP was not being heard on any of the networks a goodly number of the ASCAP publishers found their songs hard to sell. They had hopes of doing better when Mutual consented to sign with ASCAP. However, those hopes have not panned out. A check of the best-selling songs finds that only one ASCAP song is in that class. The reason for this oneness is plain. While a great many ASCAP songs are being played on Mutual stations, they are invariably in the form of recordings. The bands—the big bands—just aren't playing them. These bands, although they have Mutual as well as other wires, are sticking to BMI songs. But don't get the idea it's out of loyalty to dear old BMI. Not in the least. The band-leaders say that it is due to a very natural desire to economize. You see,

when a new song is published the bandleader who plays it must spend about one hundred dollars to have the tune arranged. Since if it is an ASCAP song it can be heard only on Mutual, the orchestra-leaders have avoided as much as possible the acceptance of new ASCAP tunes. They prefer to arrange those songs which can be played on all networks. And that's why ASCAP tunes are still falling short of being best-sellers, although they may undoubtedly have much merit. It is an axiom in the band business that without proper plugging by the country's leading bands no song can ever expect to get far.

### Those Juke-Box Jennies

Ever hear the expression "Juke-Box Jennie"? Well, for your information there really are girls who go by such a title. "Juke-Box Jennies" are girls who say, "What is your selection, please?" when you drop a nickel into the slot of a nickelodeon. But don't misunderstand me, the nickelodeon is not the type of juke-box seen in most places. Instead of having fifteen

What happens is this: When your nickel goes sliding down into the machine a connection is made with a telephone switchboard located in an office sometimes far removed from the place where you are standing. A light flashes on the board and immediately a girl plugs in the connection, asking you what selection you desire. When you give her the name of the record you wish to hear, she reaches behind her and picks it from a stack of records on file. The record is then placed on a turntable which is wired directly to your machine. It's as simple as all that.

## Radio Double Features




