The Editors' Note:



THE CHANGE that marriage has wrought in Deanna Durbin's acting—noted in her new picture, "It Started With Eve"—has Hollywood tongues wagging and Movie-Radio Guide editors rushing to you this week's cover portrait of Deanna, taken by Ray Jones. Turn to page 4 for the story of what's happened to Deanna

"WHATEVER happened," writes subscriber Art Hansen of Chicago, "to that investigation of the motion-picture industry Congress was making? It seems to have died a natural death."

In answer to the Windy City reader, and all others who have been watching the inquisition with interest, let's set the record straight, to wit:

1. The propaganda picture charge was hurled at the industry by a non-interventionist clique of a Senate subcommittee, not by Congress or the Senate as a whole. And that subcommittee is dominated by Senators Gerald P. Nye and D. Worth Clark, both patrons of the presidentially ambitious Senator Burton K. Wheeler.

2. The query, at press-time, had not died a natural death. It was only tabled while those busybody investigating Senators took time off to witness the World Series ball games. Anyway, how could they get their names into print while the Series was on?

There was another reason for the recess of their movie heckling. It seems that they turned up no valid evidence that the industry had any ulterior motives in making what war pictures they had, and that Nye and Clark hadn't even seen the pictures they were investigating!

Echoing the very good sentiments of the movie trade paper "Film Bulletin," it is high time that the industry talk back a bit to the Clark-Nye subcommittee and demand that the inves-

tigation be pursued to a complete terminus with the eventual clean bill of health that is bound to be the verdict.

And then, if we are not too bold, we should like to have the movie industry start its own little investigation of the United States Senate and Senators Clark, Wheeler and Nye in particular. As matters now stand, the industry is not permitted the privilege of cross-examination of its inquisitors in the current snoop-shoot.

Who Will Play the Life of LOU GEHRIG On the Screen?

NOT since the casting-days of Scarlett O'Hara for "Gone With the Wind" has Hollywood had such a scramble for a role as is going on among the male stars for the title role in the picture that will bring the life-story of Lou Gehrig, America's idol, to the screen.

Just who will wear Larrupin' Lou's number 4 Yankee shirt on the screen is unknown at the present time. Sam Goldwyn, who will produce the picture, has received letters from over 2,000 sports editors all voicing sure-minded but rabid opinions. But Mr. Goldwyn believes that Mr. Average Man fan, the guy in the bleachers, the grandstand, the box-seat, or you who have watched Lou through the years in your sport pages should all have a "say." For that reason Mr. Goldwyn has commissioned MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE to poll its readers for their choice of the actor to enact the beloved ballplayer on the screen. Selection of the Gehrig role will not be made until after this poll is taken. Every letter will be turned over to the Goldwyn studio, each letter will be considered.

Right to film the life of Gehrig was sought by several large studios, was finally signed to Goldwyn because Mrs. Gehrig was convinced that he could best interpret the life of her husband in terms of his inspiration to others. Task of writing the screen play was assigned to Paul Gallico, who attended Columbia University with Gehrig and wrote of Lou's national-pastime achievements as sports editor of the New York Daily News. Gallico's selection to do the screen play and Goldwyn's complete, unhurried search for the right man is further conviction that every detail of this film will be exact and accurate.

Fundamentally the story will em-

phasize Gehrig the man rather than Gehrig the ballplayer. It couldn't be the story of a ballplayer alone. Lou was much more than that. It will be the personal story of a great American hero whose life and career, full of courage and faith, base hits and fielding-gems—yes, even a few errors—have been an inspiration to millions.

When the ravages of a subtle but deadly form of infantile paralysis finally shunted Lou Gehrig to the bench for his final out in a New York Yankee uniform, Mayor La Guardia of New York appointed him a parole commissioner, called him one of the "finest" men who ever worked for the city. In that capacity he worked with all classes of delinquents, was so successful that soon he would have been as well known for his parole improvements as he was for his "Iron Man" role and timely base hits.

Away from the atmosphere of the ball park, which he loved with its raucous, shirt-sleeved bleacherites, its umpire-baitings, its late-inning rallies, Gehrig gave his parole job all the attention and enthusiasm he had given the New York Yankees.

That is why this picture must necessarily be a story of Lou Gehrig the man. As a ballplayer—the Yanks' first baseman—he was no greater than numerous others in ball-diamond history, but as a man he was a standout. Therefore, Sam Goldwyn, in discussing who will play the role of Lou Gehrig on the screen, stated: "While it is unlikely that we will be able to discover an actor who is an exact physical counterpart of Lou Gehrig, I'm more concerned with the interpretation of his great human qualities and his spirit—the really important part of the story of Lou Gehrig." —L. R.







ONCE upon a time there was a gifted young songstress who came to Hollywood and made good in her first picture, "Three Smart Girls." Of course, Eddie Cantor's radio build-up of her helped, and in quick order the nation had a new celluloid idol—Deanna Durbin. She was tops in her class.

Five years passed and Deanna started growing up as adolescent girls will. Producer Joe Pasternak and director Henry Koster, of Universal Studios, were beset with trials and tribulations in their attempt to keep the Durbin formula intact yet make screen plays of the lovely young princess keep pace with added years and increasing height. But they did it well, probably reached their peak (up to now) with "One Hundred Men and a Girl."

Then their troubles began. "Spring Parade" was good, very good. But "Nice Girl?" disappointed many. And that was about the time that Princess Deanna fell in love with her Prince Charming, Vaughn Paul. The studio officials and the princess' parents didn't know what to do about it. Deanna did. She married Prince Paul in one of the loveliest, nicest and most sincere ceremonies Hollywood has had the good luck to boast about.

Right after their honeymoon, Deanna started her tenth and some think her best picture, "It Started With Eve." In it she co-stars with Charles Laughton and falls in love (for the third time on the screen) with handsome young Bob Cummings.

But that isn't the news.

The news is that right at the beginning of "It Started With Eve," Universal executives responsible for the proper presentation of Miss Durbin (pardon, Mrs. Paul) realized that all of a sudden their little princess had grown up. She was in full bloom of womanhood, and she acted and sang like it! Their troubles were over.

Charles Previn, long the musical director of her films, observed that she sang with more fulness, gave deeper feeling and expression to her lyrics. Producer Pasternak and director Koster marked that Princess Deanna was more sociable, at greater ease, less bashful, considerably more interested in the people in the cast and what went on around her. Although their princess had always been a good actress, now her performances carried the poise of a great actress!

And that is what marriage did for Deanna Dur-

bin. The physiological process that was hindering Miss Durbin in her transition from girlhood to womanhood ran its course and Deanna became the complete actress, the knowing, well-rounded songstress, a smart and comely young wife with a brand-new, one-hundred-percent personality-plus.

Shy, retiring Deanna, cheated of much of her girlhood fun by her rapid rise to fame and her fears of the added new responsibilities stardom brought, became braver. She and her husband, Vaughn Paul, began to enjoy life, make new friends. Among their best are Bob Cummings, her leading man in this and two other pictures, and his wife.

It was as if Deanna had just begun to live—and it shows up just that way in "It Started With Eve."

Another feature your reporter enjoyed about the picture is that Deanna sings five numbers with piano accompaniment only. There is none of this sudden and full orchestral accompaniment out of the nowhere when her golden throat begins to give.

Just one more word in closing: You're going to like Mrs. Vaughn Paul. Deanna the wife, the woman is swell. I promise you.

Buck Jones Cries: "Enough of These Drug Store Cowboys"

AND SHOWS HOW TO BE AN EXPERT COWPOKE WITHOUT A GUITAR

IT WAS a hot day in midsummer at his Hacienda del Charro in San Fernando Valley that Buck Jones' patience became exhausted. He had just witnessed his forty-ninth musical western, and in this one the cowpoke hero stopped in the middle of his bandit chase, pulled a guitar from his saddle's rifle-holster, and serenaded a bleached steer-skull the studio propmen had dropped conveniently on the desert right at the music cue.

"This thing," rangy veteran screen cowboy Jones exclaimed to Thomas Brady of the *New York Times*, "has gotta stop! I think I'll go back to makin' a few real western pictures so the kids won't grow up with the wrong idea that all you need to stop an Indian or a rustler is a loud voice accompanied by a hillbilly band."

The editors of *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE* scented a feud, especially after Charles (Buck) Jones returned to the screen as threatened after a two-year retirement to make the "Rough Rider" series for Monogram Studios. "Arizona Bound" was his first, "The Gunman from Bodie" is his second, and there isn't a harmonica or a sour note in a foot of them. But action—ah, the sweet, terrific action! Jones kept his six-shooter hot and his horse sopping with perspiration from start to finish.

So cowboy Jones was sought out at his rancho, asked a few questions and posed for a series of pictures.

"Here's my idea about songs in these new-fangled westerns," he elaborated. "The studios are usin' 'em to save money on horses, riders, Indians and ammunition. They give one of these 1941 dude cowboys a guitar, tell him to sing three songs, and the picture's over. For all the ridin' he has to do, they could use a hobby-horse.

"Now, in my old—and my new pictures," he added, "we don't ever let up on action. I see that they get as much fast movement as they did when they were silent. That's the way they ought to be, and, by the great horned toad, that's the way I'm agoin' to keep on makin' 'em!"

Buck, the late beloved Will Rogers, Hoot Gibson, the late Tom Mix and the popular Gary Cooper, according to the irritated Mr. Jones, are the only genuine cowhands to have hit the screen. Even Bill Hart started as an actor, and Bronco Billy Anderson—Buck snorted as he explained—started in vaudeville. The idea!

"Now I don't pull no rope at actors turning cowboys," Jones continued, "but they should be correct if they are going to try to play the part. They make a lot of mistakes that any real cowpoke resents, and that's misleading to the youngsters.

"This guitar business is just the biggest of 'em. I could go on—in fact, I reckon I will go on to tell you lots of other boners that a genuine cowhand never makes, because he's born and bred to the job. Let's start with the bridle. There's one right way of bridling a horse. I'll show you."

Buck did. And then he illustrated the right way to put the saddle-blanket and saddle on a horse, the only way to cinch the saddle, mount and ride. He illustrated with easy perfection the proper way to halter a horse, and—a seemingly small thing but often incorrectly done—the proper leading of a horse. He showed how chaps are usually incorrectly laced, then turned to his shootin'-iron and gave a few lessons in the gun-draw and covering of a badman.

The dude dressing of the young crop of actor-cowboys is another pet annoyance of Buck. "I'd show you the wrong kind of clothes they wear, only I don't have anything but the right duds. But I will say that the funniest error most of the lads make today is to wear a chin-strap on their sombreros. No American cowboy ever did that!"


"Where," your interviewer asked Buck, "did you first ride herd?"

"Git along, little dogie," replied Jones as he neatly flattened me with a lariat loop flipped about my right ankle, "I gotta lot of pointers when I was a kid peddling papers in front of the Claypool Hotel in Indianapolis!"





ANN MILLER'S Dance to Health



WHEN Ann Miller was an infant in Cireno, Texas, she was a sickly child. So her mother took Ann to Houston, enrolled her in dancing-school when she was three years old.

Rhythmic routines made a great change in the Texas beauty. She blossomed out into a thoroughbred. There was only one trouble. At her first solo public showing, Annie forgot her routine because of stage fright and had to be gentled back to her ballet slippers three years later. Meantime she tried her hand at piano and violin lessons, a mistake for a girl of Ann's figure. She also did a spot of radio singing, which was good for stage presence, and later she found it valuable when George White put her on the stage, and again this year when she was asked to sing in Columbia's "Time Out for Rhythm."

Mrs. Miller brought Ann to Hollywood when she was thirteen. Two years later Ann won her first picture chance in "New Faces of 1937." Now nineteen, Miss Miller has completed eight pictures, a successful Broadway show, has a figure health-cub proprietors endorse as practically perfect.

In fact Ann has become so strong that in Columbia's "Go West, Young Lady" Ann and Penny (Blondie) Singleton stage one of the screen's greatest hair-pulling slugfests ever photographed. This will radiate smiles of joy into the faces of the citizens of Texas, where they like their ladies beautiful but tolerably capable in an emergency. —E. P.



STANWYCK KNOCKS OUT CO-WORKER

BARBARA STANWYCK just can't keep out of the news! From broadcasting with her shoes off (see page 1) to dealing out a lethal wallop to a co-worker was all a part of her week's work. At least the efficient publicity staff at Goldwyn's studios saw that it was. Latest news break came when Miss Stanwyck, during a scene in "Ball of Fire," landed a haymaker on the jaw of Kathleen Howard, character actress. The blow was supposed to have enough TNT in it to put Miss Howard to sleep. Knockout or not, it was one of the best publicity gags to come out of Hollywood in some time, as pictures here show. (1) The tiff begins as Miss Howard (maid in the picture) threatens to expose Barbara as being wanted by police. (2) Unable to reason with Miss Howard, Barbara grinds her teeth, (3) lashes out with her right which (4) lands flush on Miss Howard's chin, (5) knocks her out as Barbara catches falling woman and (6) carries her off set. After the story broke, Barbara received a cable from Robert Riskin (who wrote "Meet John Doe") from London, "With a right like that we need you over here!"

REVIEW OF THE WEEK

"HOW GREEN WAS MY VALLEY"



Cast: Walter Pidgeon, Maureen O'Hara, Donald Crisp, Anna Lee, Roddy McDowall. Produced by Darryl F. Zanuck; directed by John Ford. Screen play by Philip Dunne, based on the novel by Richard Llewellyn. A 20th Century-Fox production.

Type of Picture: This is one of the finest pictures to come out of Hollywood this season. Producers have not fallen down in their transcription of the story to the screen, and readers of "How Green Was My Valley" will find deep satisfaction and enjoyment in the picture.

This is the Story: For those who have not read Richard Llewellyn's book, here is a brief idea of what it is all about: The setting is a small village in Wales, which during the course of the picture progresses from a quiet scenic spot to a village robbed of its beauty by the refuse of the coal mines. The story is told by Huw, youngest son in the Morgan family, prominent among miners. Their

social problem of injustice, shown by partiality of the mine owners to cheap labor, causes the gradual upheaval of the family roots, leaving just young Huw at home with his aging parents. His sister Angharad and the village minister, Mr. Gruffydd, love one another, but do not marry because Mr. Gruffydd does not wish her to make the necessary sacrifices which would fall to her should they wed. Instead, Angharad weds the son of the owner of the mine, goes with him to Africa. Huw grows up and joins his family at work in the mines. An explosion causes a cave-in of the mine and Huw's father is killed. It is not so much the action of this picture which makes it great. It is the theme, the presentation of the social problem of the workers, their home lives and their nobility of character.

Verdict: A great picture, skilfully presented. Roddy McDowall should attain stardom from his work. All characterizations are excellent.—C. F.

- 1—The "Burma Road," China's lifeline, via Lasho, Yunnan-fu and Chungking.
- 2—Japanese agents are secretly behind "Burma independence" movement now bothering British authorities.
- 3—The "old Moulmein Pagoda" of Kipling's "Road to Mandalay."
- 4—Thailand is swarming with Japanese "tourists," "economic missions" and "fifth columnists."
- 5 and 6—Shaded areas mark French Indo-China territory ceded to Thailand at the close of the Tokyo-engineered border war between the two countries.
- 7—Japanese air bases to bomb the "Burma Road."
- 8—Pro-Vichy French colonial government at Hanoi, completely under the thumb of Japanese invaders. French colonials are all becoming anti-Vichy because of supine surrender of the colony to the Japanese.

- 25—The "Malaria Line," a string of heavily fortified positions buried in the jungles on the border of British Malaya, and manned by thousands of tough Australian and Indian troops.
- 26—Nazi fifth columnists arrested in the Dutch East Indies are now imprisoned in a jungle concentration camp in the interior of Sumatra.
- 27—Wholesale labor troubles on the British rubber plantations at Selangor, believed to be inspired by Japanese agents.
- 28—Japanese have established colonies in the iron- and tin-mining districts on eastern Malayan coast. These may be invasion points.

Where Japan Will Attack Next

By EDWIN HARTRICH

TEN years ago a roly-poly American-born Japanese officer dynamited a section of the South Manchurian Railway. When he dropped the plunger of the detonator he also unwittingly dropped a very large and hot potato into the lap of the Mikado's army staff. Before the smoke cleared away the Japanese were accusing Chinese terrorists of the sabotage. This famous "Mukden Incident," an excuse for Japan to invade Manchuria, manufactured by Capt. Jiro Saito, grew up with the passing of time into the "China Incident." That is the quaint Japanese way of describing its life and death struggle with resurgent China.

Potato-dropper Jiro Saito also grew in the passing years. He is now a colonel at forty-two, the youngest in the Japanese army. I must borrow an underworld expression to aptly describe his special assignment. Col. Jiro Saito, originally of California, is the ace "finger man" of the Japanese army.

For the last six months he has been

working in a second-floor suite in the Continental-Palace Hotel in Saigon, French Indo-China. He has been preparing the way for the Japanese "New Order in Asia" (southern division). This "New Order in Asia"—as Shanghai wits label it—is the diplomatic way of disguising the Japanese program to grab the great British and Dutch oil, tin and rubber holdings lying on the equator.

JAPAN must move—either north against Soviet Siberia or south against the defenses of the lush and valuable colonies of the British and Dutch, for peace and the continuation of the expensive "China Incident" will only bring Japan to national exhaustion and bankruptcy. Picking a scrap with the Russians, British or Dutch will accomplish the same results, probably quicker. However, if the Japanese could stage a well-executed "blitz" campaign, the fruits of such a victory would bolster up the tottering structure of the Mikado.

At this writing the Russians were

fairly successfully defending themselves against the onslaughts of Hitler in the west and an offensive against the Soviet Siberian armies would be military hara-kiri. Besides the amount of "hit and run" loot available hardly counterbalances the probable expenditures of men and munitions.

So an advance into the steamy rich tropics is the more attractive of the possible military offensives.

The first step has been taken. Last year Japan bit off the northern half of French Indo-China. The French colonial forces were so debilitated that they could offer no resistance. Colonel Saito moved south to unoccupied Saigon. Several months ago the Japanese armies followed him. They disarmed and demobilized the famous Foreign Legion. Once in complete control they began systematically to loot the French colony, just as scientifically and thoroughly as the Nazis are looting occupied France.

The only resistance to the invaders came from an unexpected quarter—

WAR QUESTION BOX

QUESTION:

Will Japan attack the United States?

ANSWER:

If Japan and the United States tangle in the Far East, the Nipponese will spend most of the war defending their own goal line. There is almost no chance that the Mikado's navy will be able to do any fighting east of the Hawaiian Islands, if they are lucky to get that far from home bases. However, Manila and the Philippines will see action. The Japanese can attack these islands from the west, northwest, north, northeast and east. American army and navy officers in Manila worry about Japanese air raids from Formosa, 550 miles north of Manila. These same officers caution against the popular belief that an American-Japanese war would be settled in a few weeks. They believe that in the first three months the Japanese would enjoy the advantages, but after that the American superiority in naval vessels and planes would swing the tide in our favor.

WHERE JAPAN WILL ATTACK NEXT

(Continued from Preceding Page)

from the jungles. The large and very independent elephants conceived a violent dislike to the tiny Japanese soldiers. The troops were routed on numerous occasions by charging elephants. Now all the main roads in Indo-China are marked with fresh billboards and posters. The Japanese captives state: "Beware of Elephants!"

Coastal fortifications, military, air and naval bases are being rushed to completion. This French colony will be the jumping-off place for any invasion.

The next objective is Thailand, though this little state seems to be unaware that it has been tapped for membership in the "New Order in Asia." To persuade the Thai government to see the light, 100,000 Japanese soldiers are now maneuvering on the Indo-China borders. Colonel Saito has dispatched numerous "economic mis-

sions"—in reality high-pressure "fifth columnists"—to Bangkok. The Japanese colony in Bangkok has jumped from 600 to over 5,000 in less than a year.

The Oriental Axis partner has learned much of its technique from Hitler. The "New Order in Asia" is a blue-print of the Nazi "New Order in Europe" with necessary modifications for the Far East. Japanese "fifth columnists" are at work fomenting strikes in the Malaya rubber plantations and in Java. They are secretly developing and contributing to native "independence" parties in Burma, Malaya and the Dutch East Indies. Tokyo whispers softly into the ears of the unsophisticated natives: "Throw off the yoke of the white men! Asia for the Asiatics!" To the simple Malays a Japanese looks more like an "Asiatic" than does a lordly British colonial, and more friendly, too.

BRITISH Malaya hangs like a great ripe pear down from the continent of Asia. Singapore at its southern tip is the great British naval base—without a navy. Unfortunately the British

have to use their navy elsewhere, in the Mediterranean and North Atlantic. The British colonials hope in their hearts that we Americans will do the right thing, use our Pacific fleet to defend them against the Japanese.

The British colonial's attitude is: "My good fellow, it just isn't cricket if we white men don't stick together against the bloody yellow foreigners."

SINGAPORE air bases are covered with hundreds of "lease-lend" American planes. Meanwhile Singaporeans find the war exhilarating and extremely profitable—if it doesn't come any closer. They are getting fabulous prices for their tin, rubber and oil—which they sell for cold cash to America, Great Britain and other allies. They have only a basic eight percent income tax too.

The jungles north of Singapore are filled with thousands of tough Australians and Indian troops. Military experts think that Singapore's land defenses are well-nigh impregnable. The troops from India are a problem. They demand thousands of live goats which they butcher themselves. Not

ordinary goats either. The Rajputs will only eat the meat of brown-haired goats, while the Punjabs will eat only white-haired goats, etc.

While Colonel Saito gazes southward toward his goal he sneaks an occasional glance toward Manila. For in the Philippines is the only brake on the Japanese "New Order in Asia." The colonel and the admirals know full well that the United States Navy possesses the only offensive force of any striking power in the Far East capable of defeating the Japanese expansion. This American-born Japanese has a healthy respect for the fighting machine of the land of his birth. Colonel Saito and the Japanese constantly mull over in their minds the one basic question, "Can we get thar fustest with the mostest?" Until they find that answer, the Mikado is stymied.





SEVERAL days ago Lord Haw Haw, Berlin radio commentator, pulled a publicity gag that many leading United States newspapers and radio stations fell for hook, line and sinker. The stunt started with announcements broadcast over Berlin radio to the effect that Lord Haw Haw had been banned from the air. Statements of this nature were aired for several days. Then came the announcement that Lord Haw Haw would be allowed to go on the air over the Berlin station to tell his side of the story. With the build-up that it had been given, this announcement was good for space in almost all of the leading newspapers and it was also widely heralded over American radio stations. Naturally skeptical through years of experience in listening in on every imaginable

ernment's defense efforts. So a new and clever chapter was written in the history of Berlin radio tricks.

FM Radio Gains New Listeners

That radio listeners like FM radio, appreciate its remarkable fidelity and lack of background noise, can best be judged from the fact that sets are being sold as fast as they can be manufactured, this despite the fact that only a small percentage of the American listening audience can yet be reached by FM transmissions. About one thousand FM receivers are now being turned out daily, and the actual FM listening audience, it is predicted, will top one hundred thousand by Christmas. Latest notable gains in receiver distribution took place in Chicago and Los Angeles. New stations were recently opened at both of these cities. W59C, the FM outlet of WGN and the Chicago Tribune, is now on the air twelve hours daily and has also sold the largest single amount of FM air time yet in a contract with Marshall Field & Co., Chicago department store, for a full hour's program, seven days a week, for fifty-two weeks. FM listeners found no variation in their clear, unfading reception when northern lights and magnetic storms disrupted all other forms of radio recently. Washington has thus far authorized fifty-nine commercial FM transmitters. The latest construction permit went to the Commercial Radio Equipment Company of Kansas City, Missouri.

CBS "School of Air" Starts Season

CBS "School of the Air," one of the foremost educational projects on the air, this year is bigger and better than ever before. Almost every country in Latin America is participating in the school this season. Mexico, for example, is equipping every one of its more than ten thousand classrooms with radio receiving-sets to enable them to use the air-school programs. More than 260,000 copies of the teacher's manual for the fall term of CBS

"School of the Air of the Americas" are being distributed to teachers and educators in every state in the union, in Canada, Alaska, Hawaii, the Philippines and all Latin-American countries. Sixty thousand of the manuals are printed in Spanish and Portuguese. For the first time also a textbook has been prepared for use in connection with the school. Hans Christian Adamson, author of the "New Horizons" series, has written the textbook in connection with the Wednesday geography and history series. You too can enjoy the benefits of the CBS "School of the Air" by tuning in WCAB (15.27), Philadelphia, weekdays except Saturdays at 2:30 p.m. CST.

Personality Peeks

Leslie Howard, former American film star, now broadcasting regularly from London, is determined more than anything else to help in the cause of Anglo-American cooperation. He has in mind, he says, an idea for making a film beginning in the American War of Independence, with members of the same family on opposite sides, and tracing the family fortunes down the years till the present day, when the Nazi threat to democracy wipes out all former enmities and misunderstandings.

General Notes

Despite Germany's military successes on the eastern front, discontent continues to grow among the peoples in the occupied countries of western Europe. This is evinced not only by the riots and civil disturbances that find their way into news headlines but also by the ever-growing number of so-called "freedom" stations that are appearing on the air. The latest of these to be reported include: "Europe Revolutionary" (9.64), which broadcasts each night starting at 11:00 p.m., and "Radio Unconnu" (9.75), which is heard with all-French broadcasts daily beginning at 1:30 p.m. CST.

propaganda stunt, the writer felt there was something phony about the whole thing. Logic alone would warn one that if Lord Haw Haw actually had perpetrated some offense against the German Reich he would not have been allowed to tell the world about it, probably would have been secretly whisked away to a concentration camp. Nevertheless I tuned in Berlin as doubtless did thousands of other loyal Americans. It didn't take Lord Haw Haw (William Joyce) long to explain that it was not the German air he had been banned from but the American networks. According to his statement, he had cabled CBS, MBS and NBC asking for time on their networks in order that he might explain the German viewpoint on present world conditions. CBS and MBS had answered him to the effect that "they were sorry, but due to crowded schedules no time could be found for his talk." NBC had retained a stony silence, as he put it, breaching the common rules of courtesy usually found among those in the radio fraternity. The German Radio Station accorded all courtesies to correspondents of American networks, according to Lord Haw Haw, but Germany had been forbidden the right even to tell its side of the story to the United States. Lord Haw Haw—thus dramatically introduced to the American listening audience—now launched into his usual propaganda spiel, the more dangerous because it included some points which would tempt one to stop and consider even though one knew it was dictated directly by Goebbels in a clever effort to line up the American people solidly against the Gov-



Salute TO



THIS October 27 will mark the nation's most significant Navy Day since Warren Harding proclaimed the first Navy Day twenty years ago.

This year, with seventeen giant new battlewagons under construction, the U. S. is on the way to its two-ocean Navy. This year the American people have seen the Navy take over the job of patrolling thousands of miles of submarine-infested sea-lanes. This year President Roosevelt has ordered the Navy to crush Hitler's marine rattlesnakes. Navy Day, 1941, will see the fleet in shooting action to defend free America.

Civilian enthusiasm for the Navy,

always high but never higher, will be reflected in a dozen ways, not least by radio. WITH a six-times-a-week musical program scheduled to begin on November 3 over 125-odd stations of the Mutual Broadcasting System, it looks as if the program's sponsor, Coca-Cola, isn't at all worried about the possibility of swing going into a sudden eclipse. The program, which incidentally is going to cost a pretty penny, will feature top-flight name bands and their soloists in fifteen-minute shots, Mondays through Fridays at 10:15 p.m. EST. On Saturday nights the five short programs are climaxed by a full half-hour of swing, with the band whose records sold the best the week previously on the bandstand.

Feminine Forum

WINGS FOR WALKING

"YOU'RE as young as you walk," says Peggy Sage, leading authority on fashions for the feet.

Probably most of us have been walking since we were a year old, but it's surprising how few of us know how to put our best foot forward. Not only must we learn to swing from the hip, keep our heads up and our chins in but we must lean on feet that are well able to carry the burden of our weight.

If your feet tire easily, seem to drag at the end of the day and force you to "sit this one out" when your heart is dying to dance, then it's time you gave some thought to building up the strength and life of your feet. There are exercises that will help a lot and only require a few moments of your day. What's more, they will pay dividends in improved poise, carriage and the entire impression your appearance can make upon those about you.

Peggy Sage suggests you start out limbering up your metatarsals with an exercise she calls the sand-crab exercise. In summer you can do it on the beach by simply pulling sand back under your toes. In your boudoir, however, you can use cleansing tissues. Simply stand with your feet together with a tissue under each foot. Crumple up the tissue under your toes, then straighten it out and repeat six times with each foot.

The "bottle twister" is a good one to bring into play muscles you never had a chance to work on before, and when you try it you'll feel the pull on your arch and clear up your leg. All you have to do is roll each foot over a bottle for several minutes.

Besides devoting ten minutes a day to foot exercising, you'll have much

happier feet if you will get right after callouses the minute they appear.






