# Movie-Radio Guide APPLAUDS: MEREDITH WILLSON

COMPOSER-CONDUCTOR (and radio actor in his spare moments) at thirty-eight years of age, Meredith Willson already has twenty-five years of musical experience and accomplishment behind him. He started studying the flute when he was thirteen, appeared with John Philip Sousa as flute soloist at seventeen—and since then has marched onward steadily and relentlessly until he must be classed as one of the nation's most versatile and accomplished musicians. Last year, when the music war forced the musical theme of the Maxwell House "Coffee Time" program (of which Willson is the music director) off the air, he wrote a new one. Just a few bars of music it was, but when Bing Crosby heard them he suggested that Willson expand the theme into a complete number.

Willson did, Crosby introduced it—and the song was "You and I," the only theme song ever to become number one on radio's "Hit Parade." More recently, his second symphony, "Missions of California," was given its premiere by the Los Angeles Philharmonic Orchestra. His first symphony, "San Francisco," Will-



son conducted himself in the Bay City in 1936.

In radio, Willson has conducted such programs as the "Big Ten," "America Sings," "House of Melody," and his current "Coffee Time." In private life he is quiet and reserved, has been married for twenty-one years.

Because he is one of the nation's outstanding musicians in both classical and popular fields, because he is one of radio's outstanding personalities—and above all, because he is modest, unassuming and gentlemanly, MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE applauds—Meredith Willson.

The rank and file of the entertainment industries, we are positive after a quick survey, are not in favor of this ruling. They want to do their bits; the big-time stars in Hollywood are unanimous in this desire.

First indication of a reaction from the Army came from the lads at Camp Roberts, largest selectee training base on the West Coast. Iiked at the ruling, they declared, "Give us a radio network and we'll put on OUR OWN shows." And NBC did give the Roberts boys a time spot

# INTIMATE PHOTO STORY OF GRETA GARBO'S

GRETA GARBO is whistling these days. That's what her few intimate friends report, and they say that when Garbo whistles she's happy. Why? That's easy.

Garbo is happy, celebrating because she has just completed her fifteenth year on the Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer lot by bringing in a romantic comedy that even she, who is most critical of her own work, likes immensely.

And in it you will see a new Garbo, a new winning and very different Garbo from the Greta of old. Just to prove the point, Garbo swims, sings, dances a new rumba, skis, prepares a diet breakfast and even has a pip of a hangover. And that, friends, in one Garbo film.

It's called "The Two-Faced Woman," but the only deceit in its reels is that practised by Greta when, as Karin Borg, wife of Larry Blake (Melvyn Douglas), she masquerades as her twin sister Katharine in order to win back her hubby's wandering affections. Connie Bennett is the menace, Roland Young provides the dithers, and George Cukor directed. Cukor also directed Joan Crawford's "A Woman's Face" and Katharine Hepburn's "Philadelphia Story."

Probably the largest and most mysterious Hollywood legend is this Garbo girl. However, most of it is built on claptrap. True, Greta has a passion for privacy, is slow and careful about picking her friends, but if you are a medium judge of character and were to live in Hollywood six months, you'd soon learn that an overly large percentage of the Hollywood population is composed of dishonorable chisellers who don't know the meaning of ethics or sincerity. That's why any top celebrity must be careful.

Garbo also is innately bashful, and in her early career days had a glorious romance that ended tragically. The combination would spell seclusion to most of us, so why is Garbo such a tradition?

The Garbo at home loves animals and children—makes a hobby of adopting stray cats. Although she lounges in clothing to suit herself, she has a wardrobe of the finest apparel in the latest modes, is a close friend of Mrs. Harrison Williams, New York socialite, who is regularly listed as one of America's ten best-dressed women.

Like anyone else, Garbo often goes to movies or dines out at good but not lionized restaurants (where she might be recognized). In fact, MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE editors have frequently observed her entering the Little Bit of Sweden restaurant in West Hollywood right above this weekly's offices! She walks much, watches her diet and vitamins, plays an expert game of tennis, swims exceedingly well—even plays baseball. She reads a lot, loves classical music, of which she has a huge record library, and the tune that resonates greatest to her emotional strings is Tschaiowsky's "None But the Lonely Heart."

When Greta Garbo (Greta Gustafsson) was fourteen years old her father died, left her brother, sister and mother penniless. Her sister died in 1926. Shortly after the war broke out in Europe, Greta brought her mother and brother Sven to this country. Mother Gustafsson lives in Hollywood near Greta. Sven is employed by a bank in San Francisco.

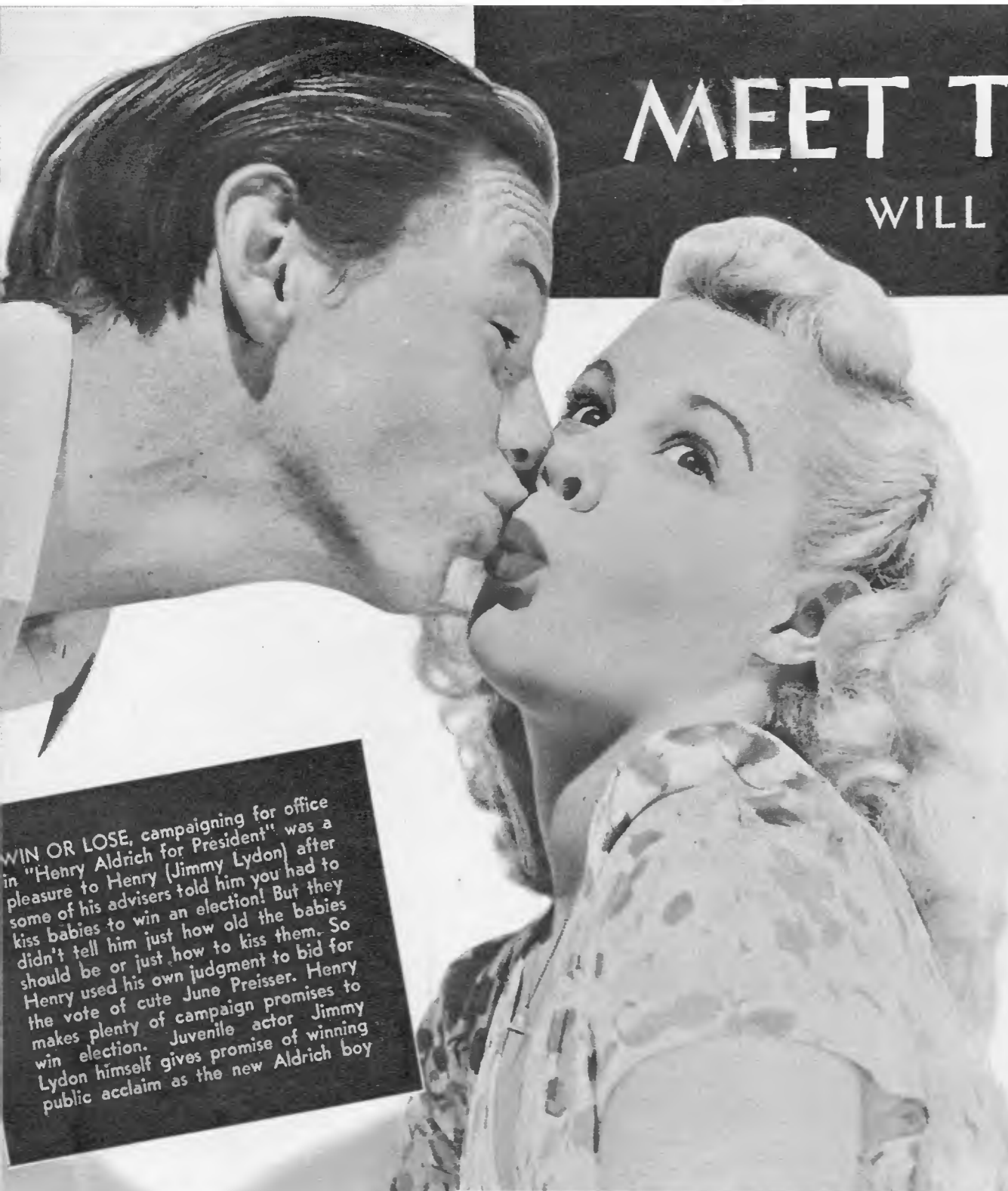

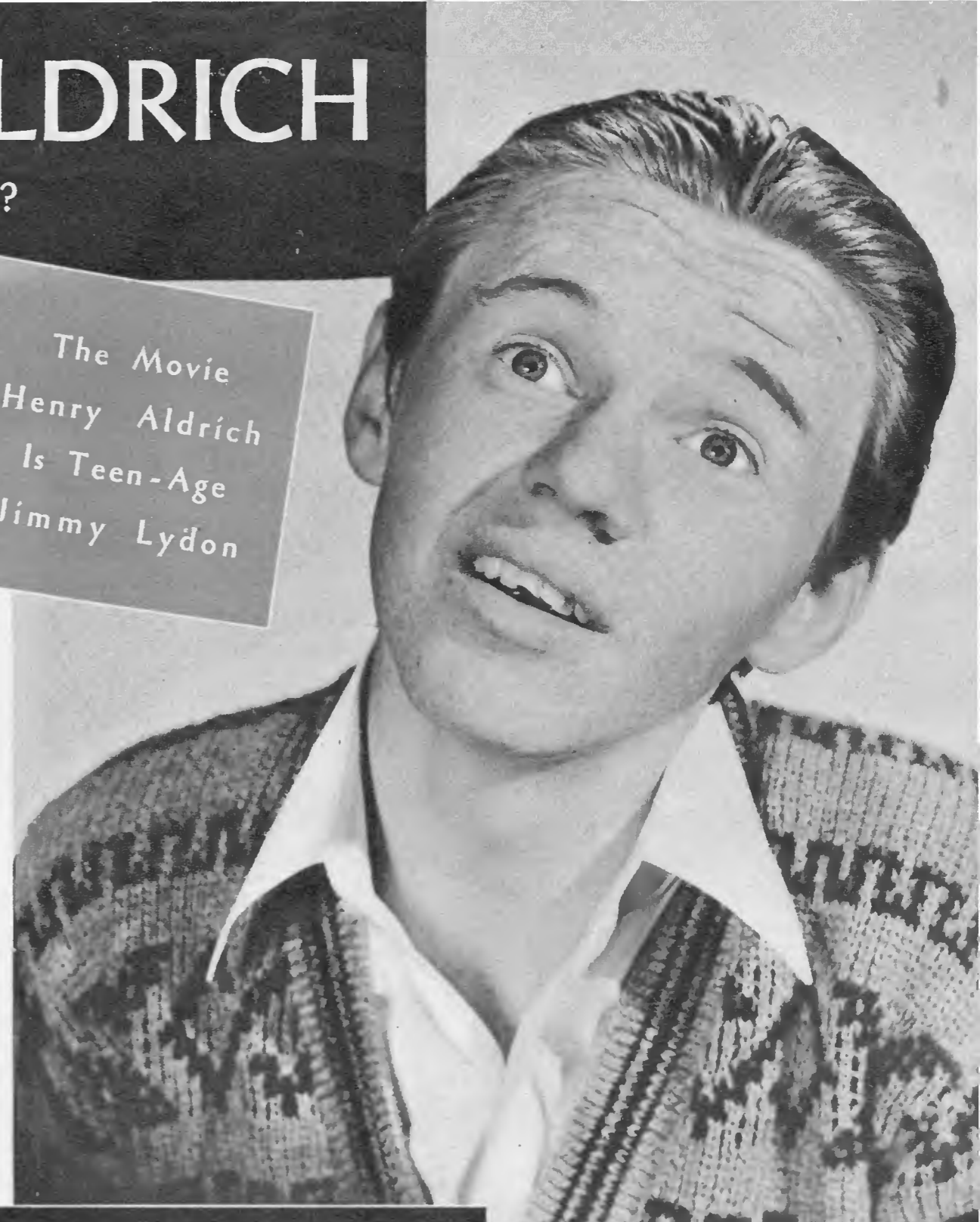

The Movie Henry Aldrich Is Teen-Age Jimmy Lydon



Born on Decoration Day in 1923 in Harrington Park, N. J., Jimmy is in the movies today because he had a practical mind. At ten he decided to become an actor because he "heard it was good dough in acting." His appearance was never such that it would make the girls' hearts beat faster. But as a typical American boy—as a Henry Aldrich—he's a standout. He has reddish-chestnut hair, stringy and unruly. His bright, quick-flashing blue eyes sparkle with real mischief. His smile is genuinely contagious. His face is splashed with freckles, looks like a field with a bumper crop of corn. After appearing in school and neighborhood plays, he wheedled his mother into taking him to New York so he could "get in on some of the easy dough." There his fresh, American-boy appearance and his natural talent earned him parts in Broadway plays and on the "Pretty Kitty Kelly" and "Believe It or Not" air shows. Finally, Paramount's New York office signed him for a featured role in "Back Door to Heaven." That was Jimmy's front door to Hollywood. He made several appearances, including a starring role in "Tom Brown's School Days." But in "Henry Aldrich for President" he really bursts forth as the juvenile who will make the most noise in Hollywood. The Aldrich Family series was Jackie Cooper's stamping-ground until he was graduated to more mature roles. Like Jackie, it seems Jimmy is a cinch for stardom in this and subsequent Aldrich films. At eighteen Jimmy is getting to be a long, lean drink of water. His typical Americanism extends to apple pie a la mode, stamp-collecting, football, basketball and Zane Grey western stories. Bob Hope is his favorite actor, Madeleine Carroll his idea of feminine glamour. —L. R.

# HOLLYWOOD CAREERS



WEEKS, MONTHS, SOMETIMES YEARS of study, practical experience are necessary to make a star—and even then only a few youngsters ever succeed. ## Everybody's Movie-Talent Test

Compiled by Sophie Rosenstein, Warner Bros. dramatic coach and test director. Try this on yourself or your sweetheart: Check square

- No. 1. Do your emotions come easily, and are they sound, thorough and not overbalanced?
  2. Are you volatile, ebullient—certainly not phlegmatic?
  3. Do you have a good imagination—a very good one?
  4. Are your senses of touch, sight, odor, taste and hearing very good—in fact, sharper than ordinary?
  5. Do you have an appreciation of character—do you like to observe and study people? (Most actors understand, like and enjoy people; hence their charities.)
  6. Do you have a good understanding stream of consciousness? In other words, can you reason out easily cause and effect, and is your brain in good, clean working order?
  7. Are you able to preserve spontaneity no matter how many times you have done the same act, read the same line, or gone through the same routine?
  8. Do you have good, sound and vital health?
  9. Are you interested in the reward of it, and not just in for the acting and creative it may bring?
  10. Do you have the all-important good sense of humor, keen appreciation of comedy?
  11. (FOR MEN ONLY.) Can you be tender, yet not "precious"; sensitive, yet not soft?
- To be a big success before the cameras you should have answered ALL questions affirmatively: a "No" to numbers 1, 2, 3, 9 or 10—any one of them—flunked you. How did you come out?

REAMS of articles have been written about the difficulty of getting a "break" toward a Hollywood career and the small percentage of those who get such breaks making good, but none of these informative stories has revealed the brutal truth, the fundamentals, the why.

To dig down and inspect the fundamentals, your reporter sought out a wise little woman—Sophie Rosenstein, in her early thirties, dramatic coach and test director at Warner Bros.

She knows her subject well, is author of "Modern Acting: A Manual," was in the University of Washington's dramatic department for ten years, staged a dozen or more commercial plays each year, then came to Hollywood for Henry Duffy's El Capitan School, staged the West Coast production of "Margin for Error," was snatched by the movie lot. "Let me tell you what I think," said Miss Rosenstein.

"In movie work the standards differ from the stage, where a flare for the theater is the only thing that counts. In pictures, performers may be interesting or exciting (1) as individuals, (2) to the camera, or (3) have perhaps one quality that stands out. This is true since versatility is not so necessary as on the stage. "I don't look for skill points—reading, memory or stage tricks—which sometimes have worse than value before the camera. Training, yes. The right kind is important. Training that has made a youngster relaxed, poised, emotionally

free, clear-thinking and able to concentrate. "At Warners I work with three groups. First, the talent brought in by scouts, perhaps ten a week. I select four and coach this group in reading for two or three weeks. Of these, probably two will be ready for an actual screen test. From the test, not more than one is generally signed to a contract, then he or she joins the third, or contract, group of students.

"We have classes twice a week, each for two hours. I try to give these youngsters enough work to keep them busy while waiting—sometimes a year or two—for their first picture casting. We discuss scenes, mull the current Broadway, conduct a question forum, even set up standards of criticism. Many pupils know little about the theater, plays, critics. Thus they learn.

"Meantime I catalog the students in their respective fields. The pupils get the two scenes that in my judgment will show off their best ability when I show them to Steve Trilling, our casting-director.

"What do I look for in a prospective contractee? Here is a test (left) that your readers can use to judge themselves as potential actors or actresses."

Sophie's closing words were: "The final test as pupils get under way is this: How seriously do they take their publicity? Are they looking for it? Overvaluing its importance? Believing in it? Frankly, if they do, they're sunk!"—E. P.

# WHAT "Millions for Defense" HAS ACCOMPLISHED

**I**F YOU have any question in your mind about Americans being the most patriotic people in the world, you should sit at my desk in the Treasury Department in Washington for just one day. The fine spirit in which everyone this country over has offered his services to make the Defense Savings Program a success has been the most gratifying experience of my career.

When United States Defense Bonds and Stamps first went on sale May 1, the Treasury Department was faced with the tremendous task of acquainting the public with all the facts of the securities. Realizing the power of radio, we approached all the country's radio stations and networks, asking their cooperation in getting our message across. At the time of writing this, 832 radio stations in the United States have written us, showing that 370,166 individual one-minute spot announcements have been broadcast since May 1. During the first three months of the drive—May, June and July—the three major networks broadcast a total of forty-four special-event programs to help the sale of bonds and stamps.

Has this gigantic radio promotion sold stamps and bonds? Well, over \$1,500,000,000 have been invested by the American people in these bonds and stamps in the past five months. Not all this sale can be accredited to the radio industry, to be sure, but we have concrete evidence that a large percentage of the investors have heard about bonds and stamps over the airways and have made their purchases as a result.

One of the most pertinent examples of this radio salesmanship is evidenced by the increase in sales throughout the country following the broadcast of any one of our three Treasury programs—"Millions for Defense," "For America We Sing" and "America Preferred." On the day following any one of these programs, sales show a decided increase, indicating conclusively the influence of radio in this vital project of helping to finance national defense.

These three Treasury Department programs probably show most vividly the unselfish spirit of cooperation which has prevailed throughout our campaign. The three programs—two donated to the Treasury by the networks and the third, "Millions for Defense," donated by a leading sponsor.

"Millions for Defense," the



super-vaudeville show, was the first to make its appearance before the radio public. Last June the Texas Company offered to give the Treasury Department for thirteen weeks one full hour weekly on CBS and to

produce at their expense (the Texas Company's) a variety show featuring the country's leading radio talent. The generous offer was accepted by the Treasury and on July 2 "Millions for Defense" made its debut, produced under the direction of a committee headed by Howard Dietz of M-G-M, William Murray of the William Morris Agency and Paul Munroe of the Buchanan and Company Advertising Agency. The series concluded on CBS September 24, at which time the Bendix Aviation Corporation offered to sponsor the programs in behalf of the Treasury for an additional thirteen weeks on NBC. The new series began on September 30 and is broadcast Tuesdays from 8:00 to 9:00 p.m. and 10:30 to 11:30 p.m. EST.

During the first thirteen weeks of "Millions for Defense," more than one hundred of the country's leading stars of stage, screen and radio gave their services as a contribution to national defense.

There is not space enough in any magazine to list all the ways in which every American—you, and you, and you—has offered to help the sale of defense bonds and stamps—aside from the actual purchase of them. For instance, many of the most popular radio programs have voluntarily undertaken a campaign to start people on the road to regular Defense Bonds and Stamps for participation on quizzes and the like. Some of these have been "Your Happy Birthday," "Vox Pop," "Truth or Consequences," "Quiz Kids," "Take It or Leave It" and "Dr. I. Q., Jr."

Everywhere you go today you hear people singing and humming "Any Bonds Today?"—Irving Berlin's song written especially for the Treasury. To date the Treasury Department has supplied 370,166 requests for copies of the song—everyone is joining hands with the "freedom man" in their wholehearted support of the Treasury Department's Defense Savings Program. To every American—to every star of stage, screen and radio—to every radio station and network—all of whom are giving so generously to the success of this program—our heartfelt thanks.

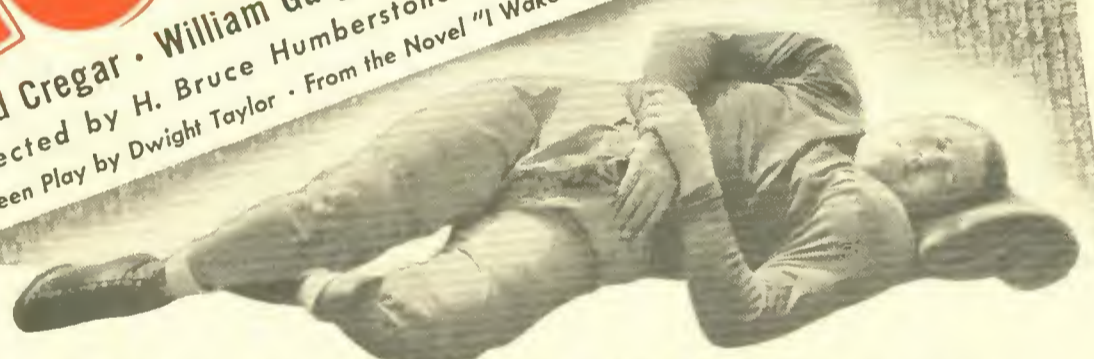

Verdict: A grand true-life-type story, with plenty of action for the young and splendid acting by ace character actors (including the two Walters), who have to step to keep youngsters Dana Andrews and Anne Baxter from stealing their scenes! Put this on your "must" list. —E. P.

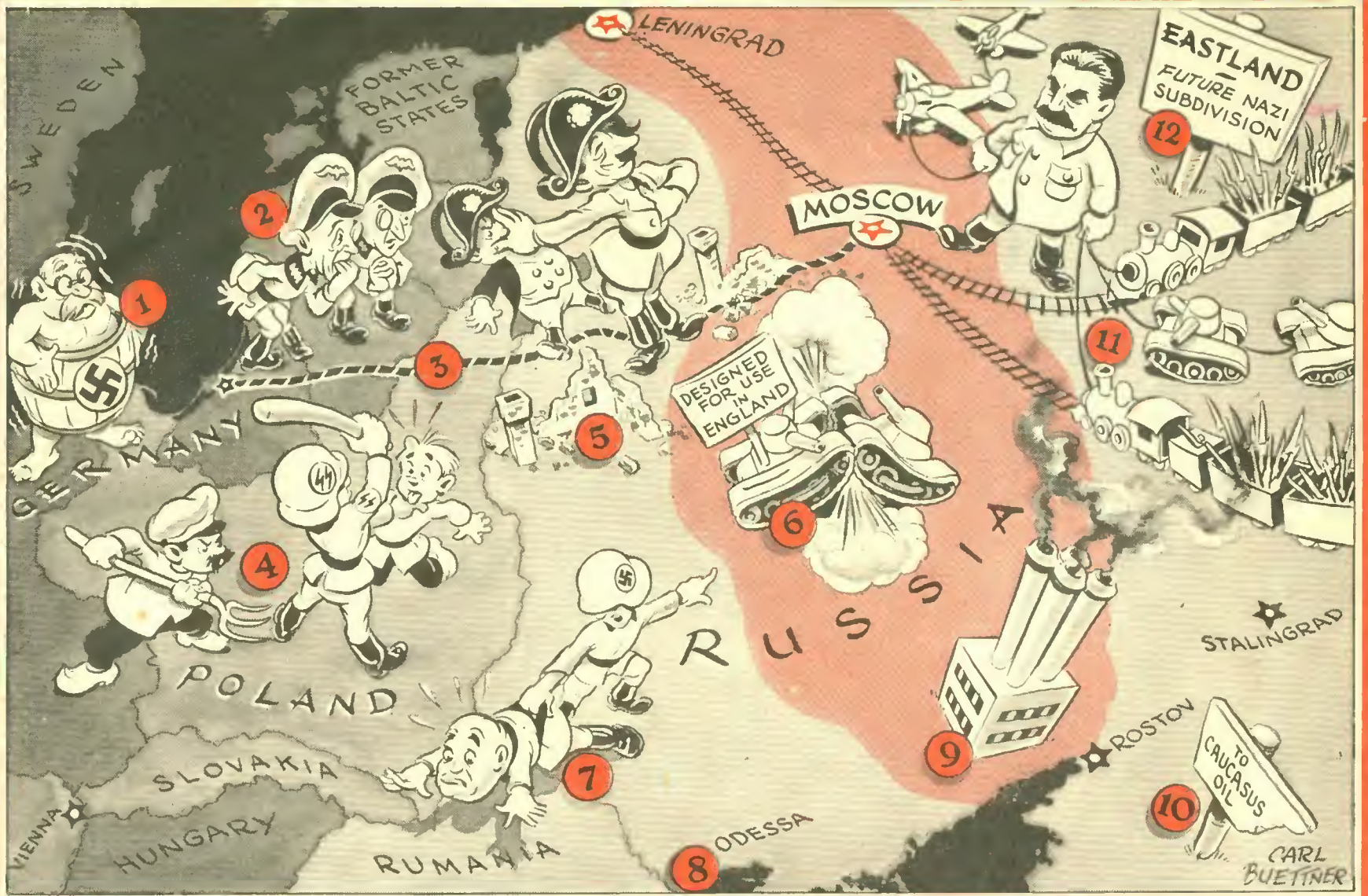

# Hitler's Tragic Victory

**A**DOLF HITLER'S war with Soviet Russia is the twice-told tale of a winner who did not know when to stop and cash in his chips. The Nazi Fuehrer has lost his war with the world on the snow-covered steppes and in the forests of "Red Russia." For this vast country is now truly "Red," stained with the blood of millions of dying and dead soldiers.

The vast battle areas, the dizzying speed of the warring machines, the frightful toll of men and equipment, the confusion of the Allies and their

"lend-lease" programs, the hysteria and propaganda from Berlin, Moscow and London—all have served to confuse the average American.

Hitler's invasion of Russia often has been compared to Napoleon's march to Moscow in 1812. Experts have pointed out quickly and easily the obvious analogy between the two little corporals who rose to conquer Europe. But the most important nugget of fact, with which we can solve this story of Russia, has been hidden from sight.

For a moment let me take you back to the early hours of a June morning in Paris, 1940. The Nazi armies have just occupied the French capital. In the historic Chateau of St. Cloud, overlooking Paris, the conqueror waits to see his prize. But Adolf Hitler does not victoriously parade down the Champs Elysees. Instead he makes a quiet pilgrimage

to Les Invalides, Napoleon's tomb on the left bank of the Seine. The Fuehrer spends forty-five minutes alone, gazing down from the balcony at the great black marble coffin below. "Hitler and Napoleon!" Two men of the people who have reshaped a continent to their own designs. The ex-Austrian house-painter feels destiny's touch. The spirit of Napoleon tosses him the baton—"Go forth and conquer!" He, he thinks, is the logical successor to the "Little Corsican" as the master of Europe.

That's where the trouble began. Hitler returned to the Chateau of St. Cloud a changed man. He knows he is the master political strategist. Now he has convinced himself that he is also the greatest military genius on the continent of Europe. It is a logical assumption, considering the string of Nazi successes.

#### ANSWER:

Adolf Hitler fondly hopes that when he sits in the Kremlin the "Bolsheviks" will come begging for peace. However, military experts know that the loss of the Russian capital is a major chapter but not the climax of the story of the war in Russia. If the Germans capture Moscow, they achieve a "prestige" victory. The Russians know this and will keep on fighting back to the Urals.

Veteran Hollywood stars Spencer Tracy and Katharine Hepburn will be guests on "Screen Guild Theater" (CBS).

### Monday, November 3

"The Bartons," radio's companion for "Tom Sawyer" and "Penrod," has finally won long-deserved sponsorship, begins its commercial run this Monday as a Monday-through-Friday sketch, and moving from NBC-Blue afternoons to NBC-Red mornings. The new series, however, will not be

heard in the central Southwest, Northwest and West Coast sections . . . To Kay Kyser, super-showman as well as leader of a brilliant band, goes the honor of launching a big new dance-music show this Monday. ### Tuesday, November 4

Una Merkel is Hollywood's latest personality to turn to regular broadcasting. The popular comedienne will be heard, beginning this Tuesday, on the NBC "Johnny Presents" program in a skit called "Nancy Bacon Reporting," dealing with a daffy sob-sister who always gets her story by hook or crook . . . The new "American Melody Hour," which began on NBC October 22, presents three outstanding singers—soprano Vivian della Chiesa, tenor Frank Munn, and baritone Conrad Thibault, and Dr. Frank Black's orchestra in all kinds of songs that America loves.

### Friday, November 7

"Gang Busters" will present the second part of the dramatization, "The Louisiana Lynx," on NBC.

## HITLER'S TRAGIC VICTORY

(Continued from Preceding Page)

The direct result of Hitler's self-induced seance with the shade of Napoleon in Les Invalides is the Russian campaign. This invasion is Adolf Hitler's own and very personal war. He planned the grand strategy, he directs the attacks from his field headquarters. He even writes his own communiques! The amateur has taken over the conduct of the campaign from the professional soldiers of the Reichswehr. "Der Fuehrer" has his own personal "general staff" which functions above, and independent of, the German Army General Staff. Hitler works with Generals Jodl and Von Halder. They map out the offensives. Then the "three Vons"—Field Marshal Von Leeb on the Leningrad front, Von Bock on the central Moscow front, and Von Rundstedt on the southern Ukraine front—receive their instructions and carry out the orders from "Corporal" Hitler.

But the fact remains that the Hitler

invasion of Russia is not progressing "according to schedule." Moscow and Leningrad, at this writing, are besieged but still in Russian hands. In his recent Sportspalast speech in Berlin, "Shades-of-Napoleon" Hitler told the Germans: "We have been mistaken in one thing. We had no idea how gigantic were the preparations of the enemy against Germany and Europe . . . and how by the skin of our teeth we escaped destruction not only of Germany but of Europe."

Substitute "I" for the editorial "we" and you find an inverted Hitler admission that as a military genius he still has a few books to read and a few more lessons to learn from Clausewitz, Napoleon, Wallenstein and others.

Nazi Germany has the greatest military machine in the world. Hitler has stripped and exhausted his country to build and maintain it on the field. He has rifled the occupied countries

of material. An apathetic and war-weary Germany, and the starving and revolting conquered countries, stand expectant and threatening at his back.

Hitler has launched an offensive he can't turn into a success regardless of the conquest of land and cities. Against him is a formidable array of opponents: Josef Stalin, the patient and brutal "Man of Steel," the "scorched earth" and the limitless geography of Russia which ever challenges the invader; the support and armaments of Great Britain and America, the continued resistance of the Soviet armies and guerrilla bands.

His proposed "New Order," or the future of a Germany-dominated Europe, which was planned in great detail, hasn't a ghost of a chance of fulfillment. Hitler has nothing to offer the conquered countries but a form of slavery. There is no promise of "free cooperation" of European states

working together for a common goal emanating from Berlin. Instead, the hysteria of the war even touches and beclouds the clear vision of the victor. For he is not accomplishing his original objectives. Now he is seeking a quick success, the "prestige victory" of capturing Moscow. He is throwing everything into one gamble.

At the same time he is sending out peace feelers to both London and Moscow. "Surrender while you still have a chance to save something from my destructive armies!" is his panicky plea to the Allies. He is claiming complete victory over the Russian armies. He is trying to fake a victory which will be a hollow thing even if he accomplishes the capture of the Red capital. For his generals are aware of one fact, even if "Shades-of-Napoleon" Hitler is still in the clouds, that they can't fuel their planes and tanks with "prestige," nor feed nor arm their weary soldiers with communiques announcing the fall of Moscow! And if Hitler goes much farther they're going to do something about it!

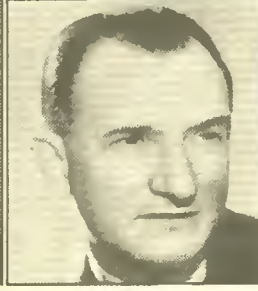

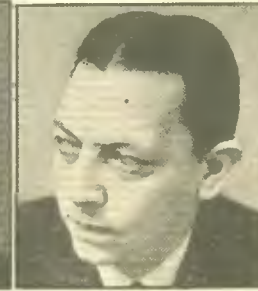

## GENERAL

### Why You Heard No Music

NEW YORK.—Recent newsmaking event was the strike of the American Federation of Musicians, often threatened and finally called Wednesday night, October 15, by James C. Petrillo, head of the musicians' union, against NBC and CBS. The issue which led to the strike was a dispute between the union and a station in Pittsburgh. The strike action was partial, confused and temporary, but while it was in force there were some unusual things heard on the air in place of the music that had been customarily heard on sustaining programs. The sudden strike call caught CBS in New York almost flat-footed—but not quite. A CBS production man rushed into the breach with a reading of the famous short story, "The Lady or the Tiger," while officials began to plan other substitute programs. The early-morning "Breakfast Club" on NBC from Chicago went through its full hour the first morning of the strike, with Don McNeill and cast members ad-libbing more than usual and vocalists singing without accom-

paniment, except on the fifteen-minute commercial portion.

### Records Get Right of Way

NEW YORK.—A ruling which NBC has adhered to firmly for years was waived November 9 when the network agreed to permit "March of Time" to include a recording of President Roosevelt's speech of some time ago to shipyard workers. Usually recordings such as this one of actual voices or events are prohibited as part of broadcasts. One notable previous exception was in 1937 when NBC broadcast a recording of the explosion and burning of the dirigible *Hindenburg* at Lakehurst, N. J.

### Who's Suing Whom?

HOLLYWOOD.—Meredith Willson was recently notified that he would be sued by Shapiro-Bernstein, music publishers in the East, for plagiarism of the tune used as the melody of "You and I," Willson's song success now at the top of the "Hit Parade." The publishers claimed the song was stolen from "New Moon," by Walter Donaldson, but Donaldson knew nothing of the proposed suit and disclaimed any thought of suit, saying the songs are not at all alike!

### Saboteurs Beware!

NEW YORK.—Announcers, singers,

actors, directors and writers without their passes or employe cards were thrown into a dither October 8 when they came to work at NBC and were refused admittance by private detectives stationed at entrances. The network, fearing sabotage, had decided to bar all unauthorized persons. The measure was finally rescinded. Plans now are to simply maintain an especially strict watch over the floor where the network's control rooms are located. Pinkerton detectives will patrol the beat.

## PROGRAMS

### Martin for Boswell

HOLLYWOOD.—Connie Boswell has been granted leave from "Music Hall" to do a series of eastern stage appearances. The date of her departure is indefinite, because Mary Martin will replace Connie, and Mary doesn't know just when she can start on the program, as she is awaiting the stork.

### Hedda Introduces New Idea

HOLLYWOOD.—On October 20 Hedda Hopper began the new format of her "Hedda Hopper's Hollywood" broadcasts on CBS with the story behind the famous crossroad of Hollywood and Vine streets. Hedda now augments her motion-picture news items with anecdotes, stories and behind-the-scenes sketches of Hollywood personalities and places.

### Calling Perfect Husbands!

CHICAGO.—There *must* be a perfect husband or two somewhere, according to the wishful thinking of Uncle Walter (Tom Wallace) of "Uncle Walter's Dog House." So "Perfect Husband Night" has been introduced as a bi-monthly feature of the program. So get in line, gents—but you'd better not tell the wife that you're candidating!

### "Lum and Abner" Biggest

HOLLYWOOD.—"Lum and Abner" are heard now on over two hundred stations as both a network feature and a transcription program. This is said to be the largest group of stations carrying any regular program.

### Basketball Broadcasts

NEW YORK.—It has been learned that NBC is interested in broadcasting

Trout's baggage was stuffed with the following articles: Heavy woolen underwear, flannel pajamas, galoshes, two suits, one pair of shoes, onion and radish seeds, prepared coffee, canned butter, vitamin pills, bouillon cubes, soap, razor blades and silk stockings. The soap and silk stockings were for wives of CBS men abroad.

### Ginny Can't Sleep

HOLLYWOOD.—For several nights in a row Ginny Simms was awakened early in the morning at her home in Van Nuys, Calif., by construction crews leveling a near-by hill. A girl friend came to the rescue and invited the CBS songstress to spend a quiet night at her Beverly Hills home. Ginny accepted. Before dawn two trucks drove next door to Ginny's "retreat" and workmen started installing a furnace in the house. Ginny decided to stay at home and get used to the noise.

### British Humor

DETROIT.—Some people aver that the British have no sense of humor. However, those connected with the "Ford Sunday Evening Hour" have a different opinion. A few weeks ago Sir Thomas Beecham, the noted British conductor, learned at a control-room conference that the planned performance of Mendelssohn's "Midsummer Night's Dream" was a bit too long for the program. Walking back to the podium, Sir Thomas said in his very best British manner: "Gentlemen, Mr. Mendelssohn in composing this work made a very grave miscalculation. He wrote it three-quarters of a minute too long."

### Santa Comes Early

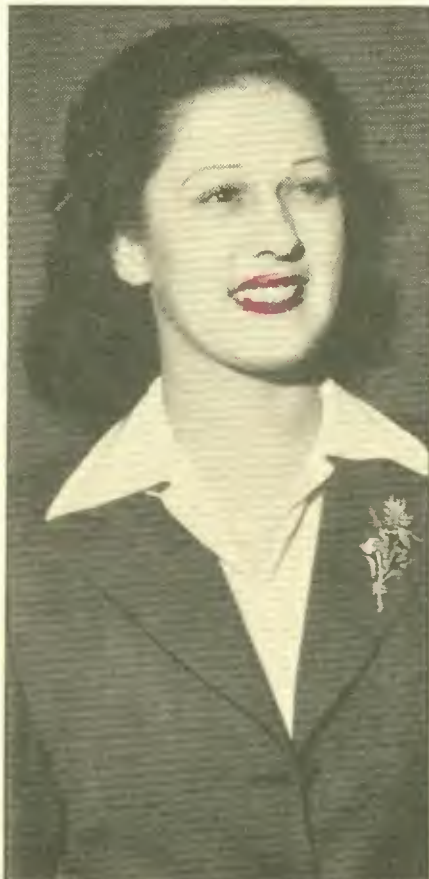

# U. S. NEEDS NEW SHORT-WAVE VOICE IN ORIENT

Berlin Blasts  
Over 30 Stations

Fake British Station  
Operated by Nazis

Jap Broadcasters

OUR government officials have at last awakened to the fact that our international broadcast service to the Orient and to Australasia is woefully inadequate. Although we have about a dozen international broadcast stations now operating in this country, only one, KGEI, licensed to General Electric, is on the West Coast. The other stations, located in the eastern part of the country, cannot serve the Orient. Distance is too great and the path through the north polar regions plays hob with transmission. It all boils down to this, that KGEI at San Francisco is virtually our only means of reaching the vast listening audiences across the Pacific, of counteracting vigorous Japanese propaganda.

In view of the present critical situa-

### Japanese Militarists Blast America

Japanese propaganda blasts aimed at this country by the Nipponese short-wave broadcasters, always blunt and undiplomatic in tone, have become increasingly abusive and threatening in trend as tension in the Pacific rises to the danger line. Tokyo's broadcasts to North America are directed to East Coast listeners daily from 6:00 to 9:30 p.m. over JLG4 (15.105) and JZJ (11.80); to West Coast listeners daily from 10:25 p.m. to 1:25 a.m. EST over JZK (15.16) and JZJ (11.80). In the Pacific transmission English news periods are broadcast at 10:30 p.m. and 12:30 a.m. EST. Also anti-democracy in tone are the English newscasts from "Radio Saigon" (11.775), Saigon, French Indo-China, radiated daily at 6:30 and 10:30 a.m. EST.

Anti-Axis are the English news broadcasts made over the Chinese National Station at Chungking. Time to XGOY (9.635) at 9:00 or at 10:00 a.m. EST. Australia, quite pro-American in sentiment, broadcasts to this country three times daily: 7:20 to 8:05 a.m. over VLG2 (9.54) and VLQ5 (9.615), for eastern United States; 10:25 to 11:10 a.m. over VLG (9.58) and 12:55 to 1:40 a.m. EST over VLG6 (15.23) and VLQ2 (11.87), for western United States.

### Nazis Seek to Blanket World

There is no use trying to kid ourselves. Nazi propaganda is very alive, very comprehensive and misses no bets in trying to influence world opinion. Whether or not it has missed the target in this country, don't think for a minute it hasn't done tremendous damage in some parts of the world. Keep pouring millions upon millions of words into listeners' ears and by force of repetition alone some seeds are bound to fall upon fertile ground. This is the theory which has prompted the German Propaganda Ministry, under the almost fiendishly clever guidance of Herr Goebbels, to build up the greatest network of international

broadcast stations the world has ever known. These stations include not only the regular Berlin transmitters but those of France, Holland, Bohemia, Poland and Belgium. I made up a huge chart last night. On it I listed all those international stations that are being used regularly by the Berlin propaganda agents. I was amazed to learn that thirty stations are being operated directly by the Germans. This is exclusive of the international stations of the other Axis partners, Italy and Japan. These thirty stations with directional antennae and powerful transmitters are sending out propaganda night and day to all corners of the earth and in every language you could imagine. That Berlin is particularly anxious to thrust its barbs into us is evident from the fact that eight different transmitters are now being used in the North American service alone. These are in operation as follows: From 4:50 to 8:00 p.m. over DJB (15.20); from 8:00 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. over DXP (6.03); from 4:50 to 11:00 p.m. over DJD (11.77), DZD (10.543), Y (9.52) and DHE4C (11.83); from 4:50 p.m. to 1:00 a.m. EST over DXJ (7.24) and DXZ (9.57).

### General Notes

The mysterious station known as "The New British Broadcasting Station" (11.99, 9.75, 7.305), supposed to be operated from Great Britain by discontented British subjects, actually controlled by the German Ministry of Propaganda, probably operating from France or perhaps Berlin, can still be heard week-days from 2:30 to 3:00 p.m., from 3:30 to 4:00, 4:30 to 5:00 p.m. and on Sundays from 11:30 a.m. to 12:00 noon, 2:30 to 3:00 p.m. and from 3:30 to 4:00 p.m. EST. Quality is poor. The station signs off with "God Save the King" . . . Spook voices that break right into the middle of both British and German short-wave programs to heckle the speakers and argue with them are causing no end of annoyance in London and Berlin.

tion in the Pacific it has been found absolutely essential that the United States augment its facilities for broadcasting to Asia. In answer to this problem a new international broadcast station to serve the Far East has been initiated through the cooperation of various broadcasters, the Defense Communications Board, the Coordinator of Information, and the Federal Communications Commission. The latter has authorized The Associated Broadcasters, Inc., licensee of standard broadcast station KSFO at San Francisco, to construct an international station there to broadcast to the Orient and Australia. For sixteen to twenty hours a day news and entertainment will be sent in English, French, Dutch, Spanish, Japanese, and possibly Chinese, Thai, Russian and Korean. Frequencies of 6.060, 9.570, 11.870, 15.350, 17.760 and 21.510 megs will be used. In some instances this will mean sharing time with other domestic international broadcast stations, such as CBS' WCBX and WCRC, New York; Westinghouse station WBOS at Hull, Mass., and World Wide Broadcasting Corporation stations WRUL and WRUW, Boston. The Coordinator of Information has arranged for delivery of a 100,000-watt transmitter from the General Electric Company to speed this new service.

Only a few days ago the wheels were also set in motion for adding another 100,000-watt international station in eastern United States. The World Wide Broadcasting group of Boston, operators of WRUL and WRUW, will control the new station's destinies.

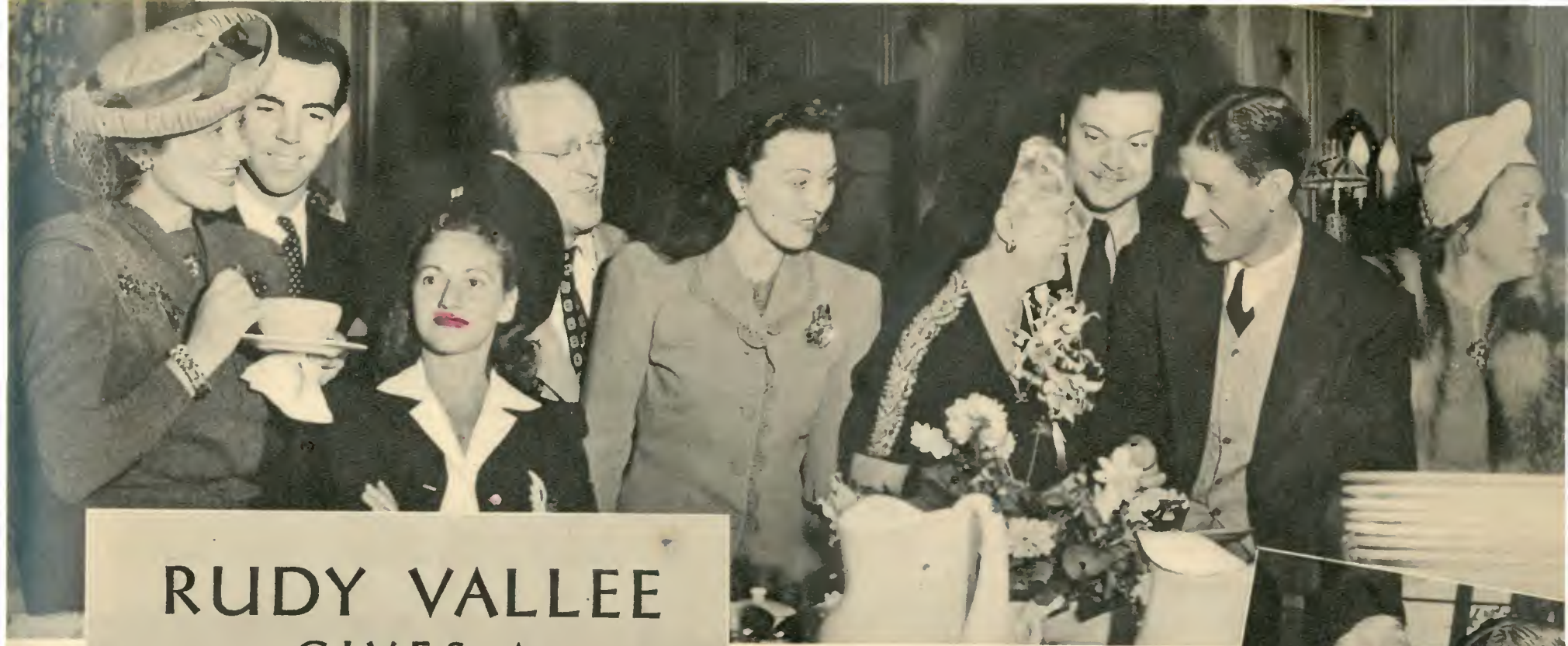

# Movie-Radio Guide Visits: The New Comedy Hit "DUFFY'S TAVERN"

ONE of the things that may happen to the unsuspecting tuner-in on a Thursday night is suddenly to find himself transported smack-dab into a Brooklyn tavern, ushered to a table by a loquacious, low-life bartender guy named Archie and entertained by celebrities who occupy neighboring tables. Like thousands of other tuners-in, he'll probably be having a good time of it at "Duffy's Tavern" every Thursday night thereafter—via CBS. For "Duffy's Tavern" is quite the most fascinating make-believe back-drop for radio humor which has yet been devised. The humorist is head-waiter Archie, whose Brooklyn accent is glamorously funny to average Americans, home-town stuff to Brooklynites themselves. Actually, Archie and his Miss Duffy are another husband-and-wife comedy team—Archie is famed radio writer Ed Gardner; his wife is stage star Shirley Booth. With the aid of John Kirby's famed Negro band and Negro comic Eddie Green, they have engineered "Duffy's Tavern" into the front ranks of radio fun shows.

Archie's trade-mark is his unforgivably funny treatment of the King's English. Relying upon Brooklynese lingo combined with gags and jokes, Archie is unique among radio comedy characters. No holdover from vaudeville, Archie is a genuine product of broadcasting. For this reason and because of his original, highly entertaining contribution to radio comedy, it's with a chuckle of delight MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE presents its Award of Merit to Ed "Archie" Gardner!

LISTENERS have had time to make up their minds whether or not they could accept other voices than those of William Powell and Myrna Loy as the Thin Man and his wife Nora, the characters they portrayed so appealingly on the screen. And apparently the listeners have made up their minds. They have welcomed with enthusiasm the air voices of Mr. and Mrs. Nick Charles. Even the eloquent barks and whimpers of Asta, the wire-haired terrier, seem to have the hearty approval of the public, though the role is played by a two-legged radio actor.

Since "The Thin Man" was launched as a highly successful series of mystery pictures, until the radio series "Adventures of the Thin Man" was under way a few weeks there was some apprehension by the writer, Dashiell Hammett, and his associates that the public would not accept a radio version without William Powell and Myrna Loy, the movie personalities so closely identified with the stories. Now that apprehension has been dispelled. The public approves.

When the Thin Man series finally went on the air (NBC, Wed.), the ranks of radio Thespians were combed for a pair to portray Nick and Nora Charles. Lester Damon and Claudia Morgan were chosen.

Damon has packed much professional experience into less than a decade. After attending Brown University and the Rhode Island School of Design in his native state, Les entered the theatrical profession. In 1938, after five years as a leading man on the stage, he went into radio. Since then he has played important parts in such shows as "Girl Alone," "Woman in White," "Knickerbocker Playhouse" and many others.

Claudia Morgan also has had thorough stage and radio experience. Daughter of actor Ralph Morgan and niece of comedian Frank Morgan, she has appeared with such stars as Melvyn Douglas, Burgess Meredith and Pauline Lord in over thirty plays, though she is still in her twenties.

Credit the finesse of these two fine performers, as well as the superb creativeness of author Hammett, for making the radio series another successful and solid phase of the "Thin Man" tradition. —D. M.

**G**UY LOMBARDO, who plays for "just plain people who want to hear nice, sweet tunes they can remember," has often been called the "King of Corn" by rival bandleaders. In swing-music circles "corny" means low and unworthy. Yet in the last ten years, according to an article in *Coronet*, the Lombardo band has piled up a gross income of \$5,000,000—\$2,000,000 of which was earned on the radio and another \$1,000,000 at hotels. And if that isn't enough to make the swing boys whistle, this same so-called "corny" band has placed second for the last three years in *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE's* Star of Stars Poll. The band which edged Guy out in the polls was Wayne King's, another so-called "corny" band.

The moral of this, of course, is that even so-called "corny" music can be made both popular and profitable, provided the fellows who serve it up know their jobs. Guy Lombardo's success indicates that his kind of corn, if it be that, is the superlative kind.

### J. Dorsey a Leader in Swing

Playing swing music, but doing the same excellent job in his field as Lombardo is doing in his, is Jimmy Dor-

sey. The J. Dorsey band isn't heard very often on the air, but that didn't keep them from earning a cool \$40,000 in record royalties in the first six months of this year. This, incidentally, was the largest record royalty payment ever tendered a bandleader. It is also understood that for their appearance in Paramount's "The Fleet's In," the band is to receive \$75,000. If this is true, then it will be the largest amount ever paid to a band for movie work.

All of which goes to show that regardless of what kind of music you play, the thing is to play it well. That's what all successful bandleaders have discovered.

### Bandata

The makers of Victor and Bluebird records are backing a "dance carnival" which will tour the country playing in the auditoriums of larger cities. The carnival will use the properties designed for the Madison Square Garden show of last summer. They include a huge silk "ceiling," sixty-foot palm trees, a waterfall and other equipment. Music for the carnival, which opens in Cleveland, Ohio, November 3, will be furnished by the bands of Tommy Dorsey and Shep Fields . . . The British-American Ambulance Corps' "Name Band Jubilee," originally scheduled to take place October 13 in Yankee Stadium, has been postponed to November 10. Instead of the Stadium present plans

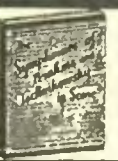

## Feminine Forum

LIPS FOR LOVELINESS

YOU know, this business of keeping ourselves looking our best and most lovely is a part of our patriotic duty. Your man, whether he be best beau or husband, and whether he comes home every night tired from a day spent wading through defense orders or comes back once a blue moon from a training-camp, wants you to meet him with a smile to charm his heart and inspire him to see this thing through!

You're a part of our national spirit. You don't just learn how to drive an ambulance and change its tires, you keep the whole nation's heart beating! You're the one who'll be "Smilin' Through," and I've some advice on how to make your smile prettier and your mouth so very lovely.

First, let's think about lips and how to make them up to perfection. Because there's a whole new trend toward being feminine, you want to get away from using so much lipstick that your mouth seems hard and painted. Last season's fad for exaggerating the size of your lips is now out. Instead, you want to make up your mouth so that it looks a part of your face and doesn't overshadow every other feature.

The best way to do this is to use a lipstick brush, very little lipstick to draw the outline and then stay well within that outline when you give the lips a heavy application of color direct from the stick. Here's the routine. First, see that the lips are entirely dry and that all previous lipstick has been removed. With the tip of your brush, which receives its color from the end of your lipstick, begin at the center of your upper lip and start to outline with a steady, even stroke in to the corners of your mouth. To see that your mouth is balanced and both arches of your upper lip identical, take an imprint of your lips on cleansing tissue. When you fill in the outline with lipstick go up and down, following the grain of your lip tissue. This will give them a natural look.

The finished job will appear a lot smoother and be less inclined to smear if you'll blot your lips with a Kleenex or dust them lightly with your face-powder. As a further safeguard against the all too common social menace, "smearitis," you'll be wise to try out the Don Juan lipsticks, which are smearless, and give you colorful lips which will not leave traces on handkerchiefs, glasses or your best beau's shirt-front.

Another sure cure for "smearitis" is the daintily scented liquid color by Princess Pat called Liptone. To use the inventor's own words about it, "Liptone is just pure color in liquid. When it is applied, there is no loose coating of ingredients left on the lips." It comes in a wide variety of shades and your lips just won't lose their color all through the busy day and social evening.

If you really have thin lips you may want them to appear fuller. With your brush, extend the natural outline of your lips slightly, so slightly that it won't look obvious and faked. Very often one's upper lip is fuller than the lower, or vice versa, and filling out the lesser lip will give your mouth and face a charming new character.

If you want your mouth to look well groomed always, you must carefully guard against letting any lipstick creep onto your teeth. This happens frequently when lipstick is carelessly applied and will certainly ruin your smile. Watch for it!

Speaking of teeth, never minimize their importance to your beauty and the charm of your smile. Use a recognized tooth-paste for brushing them night and morning, for then you can be sure that you are getting a maximum of luster and cleansing from your efforts.
