GUIDING GENIUS of the Pennsylvanians, "Pleasure Time"

ANYONE attempting a history of radio would be guilty of a serious error should they fail to include mention of Fred Waring. This young gentleman, still in his early forties (and looking much younger), is one of radio's most notable and talented personalities.

Fred's relationship with radio is almost as old as radio itself. His initial broadcast was made in 1920, over Station WWJ in Detroit. To that first broadcast the former leader of a fife and drums corps in Tyrone, Pennsylvania, brought his now famous Pennsylvanians, the band which he organized following his graduation from Penn State University that same year.

Today, twenty-one years later, Fred Waring is making even greater radio history with his "Pleasure Time" program (one of the most expensive programs on the air—\$20,000 per week), heard five times weekly.

The trail that Fred has traveled from his Boy Scout days in Tyrone, Pa., to the 611th broadcast (as of Oct. 27) for his current sponsor is indeed a long one. But it is a trail that has been marked with one success after another. Fred's interest in music began when he became drum major for the Boy Scout band. Later the enterprising young music-lover organized a group which he called the Scrap Iron Quartet. It came into being when Fred, his brother Tom,

Poly McClintock (still with the Waring band) and the late Fred Buck were refused admittance to Penn State's Glee Club. They decided that if they couldn't sing, then at least they could play.

Following the graduation of the Four Musketeers, they made the quartet into an octet and called the group Fred Waring's Pennsylvanians. Their reception by the public was enthusiastic. The Pennsylvanians pioneered in playing theater engagements—the first big-name band to do so. Their vaudeville tours took them across the United States several times. They followed these tours with triumphant visits to London, Berlin and Paris. Their glee-club effects, the band's comedy routines and specialty acts made them outstanding in the entertainment field. It was inevitable that they should enter radio, which they did in 1933, appearing on the Ford Show.

Today the Waring band is strictly a radio band. However, directing the Pennsylvanians is no snap for Waring. Besides, he insists upon supervising nearly all of the band's activities. In addition he is a music publisher. His music-publishing firm, called "Words and Music, Inc.," publishes glee-club arrangements for colleges and amateur groups.

This guiding genius of the Pennsylvanians believes that the best way in which to entertain the public is to give them plenty music and lots of variety features. The broadcasts, which emanate from the Vanderbilt Theater on West 48th Street, take only fifteen minutes. Following them, however, is a half-hour of music and fun which is just as entertaining as the broadcasts. This is Waring's way of acknowledging the debt which he owes to the people who often come long distances to fill all of the theater's 700-odd seats.

Because of Fred Waring's distinct flair for innovation, which has kept "Pleasure Time" among the more distinguished of radio programs, because of his sincerity, and because he is truly one of radio's "greats," MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE finds it is a distinct pleasure to present its Award of Merit to—Fred Waring.

"I know," he said, "because it took me eight years to get through grade school, and I never saw a kid that bright!" We told him the Quiz Kids WERE "that bright"; they were not tipped off or rehearsed.

They all were quite interested in Red Skelton—who has been on the air long before but not in as good a time spot. Their interest justifies a special illustrated story (now in preparation) on

the phenomenal Red, and you'll be reading it herein two weeks hence.

Surprisingly enough, last week Mrs. Gertrude Temple, mother of Shirley, started talking about radio while we were supervising the making of a natural-color cover photograph of her 13½-year-old daughter (December 6-12 issue). Said Mrs. Temple:

"You'd think the Quiz Kids were rehearsed because they are so bright, but I know better: I've seen many youngsters (not Shirley) on the movie lots and they were just as amazingly intelligent. But the clew to the genuine spontaneity of the Quiz Kids is in their readiness to be caught by trick questions which any average child would answer correctly. Their intelligence, like that of most prodigies, is lopsided."

We agreed and told her we are glad that we and Shirley are not prodigies.

NEXT WEEK, radio-war correspondent Ed Hartrich will wind up his series of war maps and articles with "Russia's Secondary War Machine" and prove that Hitler won't have the Russians off his neck just by capturing Leningrad, Odessa and even Moscow. 

"ONE FOOT IN HEAVEN" BEGINS A CYCLE OF



HOLLYWOOD has long been called the capital of sin, the ugly city of lax morals. More recently it has been the target of "war-monger" cries. What a master stroke of irony it would be—and perhaps a master stroke of Providence — if Hollywood now has sounded the bugle-call of a new crusade for righteousness!

Far-fetched? Perhaps. But those who have seen the new film, "One Foot in Heaven," are ready to concede that here is something of a silver-screen miracle. Churches have united in praising the picture. Official Washington, with its stormy petrels of investigation, attended the premiere of the film October 3—and found nothing to investigate but their own reactions! Every person who has seen this soul-stirring picture has come from its showing with a few extra lumps in the throat, maybe a tear-track or two on the cheek, and a better fundamental idea of the real purpose of life.

Sensing the utter need for a wholesale moral awakening throughout the nation and the world, Hollywood, storm-center of numerous probes, accusations and general public gossip, has come through with a real contribution, a contribution so great it may actually help lead the country to a saner sense of values. Premiered in Washington, D. C., the film drew a typical capital audience—many lawmakers, defense officials, representatives of foreign governments, and plain motion-picture fans.

They all dropped their duties, big and small, for a short while to see "One Foot in Heaven." They came to see—and they almost remained to pray. They did unanimously acclaim it one of the greatest inspirational films of all time.

Warners' pioneering sermon of the screen is the true story of a hard-working minister, William Spence, written by his son, Hartzell. Brilliant Fredric March, himself the son of a Presbyterian elder, brings the late Rev. William Spence, a Methodist preacher, to the screen in a superb and sensitive portrayal.

Rev. Dr. Norman Vincent Peale, pastor of the Marble Collegiate Church of New York City (Dutch Reformed), served as technical advisor. He was selected through the cooperation of the *Christian Herald* and a committee of leading Protestant clergymen from all sections of the nation.

Mrs. Spence, the preacher's widow, gave invaluable aid to March, her personal choice for the part of her husband, and Martha Scott, who portrays Mrs. Spence, in their characterizations.

The Wilshire Methodist Church of Los Angeles, where several movie marriages have been solemnized, played a role in the California sequence. Doors of the church, one of the most beautiful in the state, were opened to permit the company to work there for a full day.







A Screen Cowboy's Life
Is a Busy One

GENE AUTRY, Republic Pictures' western gold mine and in several ways one of Hollywood's biggest stars, awoke one yawning dawning recently to find a *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE* cameraman aiming at him. It was all right, for the singing cowboy had previously put his okay on such business. And business it was, not fun! The photographer sent on an assignment to get a picture story of the western star going through a typical working day was to find out that such a day for this idol of millions was a long, busy, strenuous day, the kind that could wreck the physique and nervous system of one less hardy and less serene than Autry. Gene didn't get to the top by anything but hard work and that something which caught the attention of the public. He's a true Texas sand-and-sagebrush cowboy. And ever since before he ran away with a medicine show at sixteen he has worked and liked it. After Will Rogers opined the young man would go far as a singer Gene didn't quit working. As a big movie and radio star he's still mighty busy and still loves it. So the cameraman tagged Gene as he went from his new ranch in the San Fernando Valley to the Republic Studios, where he was making scenes from "Sierra Sue." There he went to work in earnest. As you may or may not believe, acting in front of the cameras and Klieg lights all day is arduous work that taxes both the physique and the nervous system. Gene's pictures, with their abundance of action and not a few risks, are certainly no exception. But at the end of this day our photographer was all in. Cowboy Gene was still smiling, almost fresh!



Will DEANNA DURBIN Get Her Way?



MOST appropriately demonstrating the thesis of her latest Universal picture, "It Started With Eve," Deanna Durbin stamped her pretty foot down October 16 in the office of Matthew Fox, Universal Studios vice president, and demanded something which the studio refused to grant. There and then she was placed on suspension and her name was removed from the pay-roll.

Just what the pretty young bride wanted—and may or may not have gotten by now—remained undisclosed by either party, but the talk of Hollywood is that Deanna, now Mrs. Vaughn Paul, either would like to make an independent production with hubby producing or make one under her former producer, Joe Pasternak, now at M-G-M.

Paul, up until three weeks before the Durbin-Universal tiff, had been an associate producer there. He left, likewise for an undisclosed reason.

The sum and substance of the disagreement is this: Deanna is losing a salary check said to exceed \$2,500 weekly and in addition a bonus of \$50,000 for each picture she makes.

She may not make a picture for any other studio or producer, according to Screen Actors Guild agreements, when under contract suspension for failure to abide by the terms. And her contract has four more years to run.

But Deanna, until recently when Abbott and Costello started rolling sevens and eights for Universal, was queen of the lot, its best money-maker. "It Started With Eve" is her tenth picture, and ten big-time box-office hits, netting Universal some \$15,000,000 and Deanna about \$200,000 a year, is the unbelievably simple story of her motion-picture career.

First predictions by critics who saw "It Started With Eve" were that marriage had improved Deanna's voice, acting, personality—made her an even greater asset to Universal.

As for Vaughn, there's a dicker on currently over a producer contract at RKO-Radio Pictures to indicate which way the wind is blowing.

Who will win? Deanna and Vaughn or Universal? The odds look stacked in the movie company's favor, and perhaps Deanna will decide to return, properly chastened and friendly-like, to work like a good little bride for dear old Universal. Or will she go ahead and take time out to have a baby? Some of the young Mrs. Paul's intimates think that Deanna may have that in the back of her mind as an alternate procedure while she is "holding out." Could be. —E. P.



wealthy spinster Joan Fontaine on a train, again later at her home town, falls in love with her and finds his feelings reciprocated. Goaded by overhearing a chance remark of her father, she accepts Grant's courtship, although she knows she shouldn't, as he is a gambler and a ne'er-do-well.

They marry despite her father's warning, have an idyllic honeymoon, and return to their dream home—expensively and tastily furnished on credit, of course. Then and there the good sense of Joan comes to the fore and she insists that he find work.

Grant does, but soon goes back to his own ways, embezzles some funds, later becomes involved in a murder.

The story reaches its climax when the reckless Grant attempts to open—or lock?—the door of the car next to his wife. The showdown would spoil the ending, which comes abruptly.

Verdict: This is an expertly enacted romantic melodrama with never a dull moment, and it is a keen, beautifully portrayed study of the psychology of a misunderstanding and suspicious wife. Hitchcock did it, which is recommendation enough. —E. P.



How Germany Can Be Invaded

By EDWIN HARTRICH

Mr. Hartrich is the only American radio reporter who has covered the war from both the Allied and German sides, as well as the Russo-Finnish war and the Far East.—The Editors.

HITLER'S victorious Germany has a soft spot which worries the Nazi generals. In 1942 or 1943 this geographical liability may cost them the war, into which they have poured all the resources of the Reich and conquered Europe. The generals know that Germany can be invaded by the Allies.

The soft spot is the likeliest invasion point, the 120-mile front door of Germany, which stretches from the Dutch border to the air base on the island of Sylt in the North Sea. Naturally this coastline is defended, both by nature and by Nazi guns and planes. The deep-water approaches to Emden, Bremen, Hamburg and the Kiel Canal

are narrow. An invasion force must be prepared to sustain heavy losses in fighting its way to the shore. But if Allied armies can gain a foothold in northwest Germany, and maintain a supply line, they can strike deep into the vitals of the German Reich through the relatively defenseless countryside.

Hitler's Germany will not cease fighting until the German people as a whole are convinced that their cause is helpless. The inability of Hitler to conquer Russia, the continued sabotage and unrest in the occupied countries, the decline in food and war stocks—all these will not break the back of German resistance. But if the Germans are faced with a fight on their home grounds, they will realize the futility of further warring in Europe.

Military strategists in both London and Washington appreciate that only

a major military defeat can crack the Nazi war machine from stem to stern. By '42 or '43 the democratic forces—and I think that the United States will be in the war then—will be powerful enough to invade the Continent of Europe.

THE Nazi generals fear an invasion of Germany. They hope that the American and British forces will dissipate or waste their strength fighting their way across the English Channel, then across occupied France, Belgium and Holland. Before they reach German territory these Allied forces have one last almost insurmountable hurdle, the Siegfried Line. The Allied forces should do the unexpected thing—because it appears to be more difficult: Invade Germany direct from the North Sea.

The obstacles to such an invasion are great. An invasion force must

expose itself to submarines, mines, naval vessels and bombers for the 400-mile stretch of open water between Germany and England. The narrow approaches to Hamburg, Bremen and the Kiel Canal can be heavily fortified. However, we must assume that when the Allies are prepared to invade Europe they will have a definite air and naval superiority, at least in the North Sea. Their losses will be great, but they should be able to reach their objectives.

One invasion force should move south along the Dutch-German border, to strike at the great industrial Rhineland from the rear. Loss of the Rhineland would insure Hitler's defeat.

Another invasion force would seek to gain control of the Kiel Canal. If they can capture and then defend this vital waterway between the North Sea and the Baltic sea, the Allied

naval vessels and troop transports can be routed through this link. From Kiel they could strike at Lubeck, Stettin and Danzig. These Baltic ports have few natural defenses. A compact, fast-driving invasion army, moving south from Stettin, could cut behind Berlin and sever lines of communication with the Nazi armies in Poland and Russia.

The main Allied expeditionary force should be directed against Berlin, the cornerstone of the Reich. From Hamburg it is only 160 miles to Berlin. Double-lane motor highways and level, open country favor an invading force.

The reader by now must be asking—and quite naturally—where is the German army and what would it be doing while the Allies are invading the Vaterland? The bulk of Hitler's armies will not be able to return to the Reich to defend it, unless Hitler is willing to surrender his grip on the restless conquered nations. By '42 or

'43, Hitler's once mighty army of 8,000,000 men will have been reduced to a maximum force of 5,000,000 effectives. That is an extremely conservative figure, favoring the Germans. Hitler will be forced to detail at least 4,000,000 men to sit hard on France, Belgium, Holland, Denmark, Norway, Luxembourg, Lithuania, Latvia, Estonia, great slices of European Russia, Poland, Czechoslovakia, Italy, Roumania, Bulgaria, Yugoslavia, Greece and North Africa. The moment he withdraws any of his occupation garrisons from a conquered state, its people will spring into revolt on the

side of the Allies.

Nazi Germany is like an inflated balloon, pressing outward from its borders, and the expansion pressure holds down the neighboring states. Prick the balloon by invading Germany and the whole process is reversed.

Mr. Hartrich's seventh and concluding article of this series, appearing next week, will describe "Russia's Secondary War Machine," and tell what Russia can and will do even without Odessa, Leningrad and Moscow, should all three be captured.

Comedians' Dispute Settled

HOLLYWOOD.—Following the dismissal of a court action brought by Bob Hope against Red Skelton, Jack Douglas, a radio gagwriter, has resumed writing for comedian Skelton. Hope had sued, claiming that Douglas was under contract to him. When the case came up for trial, Hope's attorneys requested a dismissal. They said that the suit was all a misunderstanding.

Wanted—Operettas

CHICAGO.—A "Great American Operetta" is being sought by Chicago's WGN and the station is willing to pay \$10,500 in prizes to find it. Home of the "Chicago Theater of the Air" operetta series, which has proved immensely popular for several seasons, WGN is launching a contest for American authors and composers in order to give impetus to the American musical tradition. Operettas entered in the contest are to be about American things, places and people. The contest closes February 10, 1942.

WAR, DEFENSE

A Historic Coat

NEW YORK.—When Harry Flannery arrived in the United States several weeks ago from his post as CBS correspondent in Berlin, he carried a light-gray spring coat which had been at most of the world-shaking events of the last five years. The coat is the property of William L. Shirer, who left the coat in Berlin last winter, and Flannery has worn it since Shirer returned to America. Flannery also brought home for Shirer an accordion on which Shirer had only had time for three lessons before he left Berlin.

NBC vs. America First

NEW YORK.—In a statement issued October 27, Niles Trammell, president of NBC, denied the charge of the America First Committee that the networks had refused to grant the committee airtime for its rally in Madison Square Garden October 30. On the contrary, Mr. Trammell said, NBC had offered the America First Committee a half-hour over its Blue network but the offer was rejected. Mr. Trammell said that NBC had carried fifteen America First broadcasts during 1941, and that the network has extended facilities to seventy isolationists as against fifty-six on the other side. "It does not seem

right," said Trammell, "to permit your committee to assume a martyrdom which the facts do not justify."

Talented Trainees

CHICAGO.—Surprised at the high caliber of talent displayed by military men appearing on the "Service with a Smile" program, emcee Garry Moore is keeping a file of contestants, ratings, with a view to helping the most talented land in the entertainment field when they complete their terms of service. Moore believes that many of the vocalists, instrumentalists, monologists and imitators he has presented on the Thursday show from military camps have real professional

possibilities in entertainment field.

Benny to Tour

HOLLYWOOD.—As soon as he completes work on his forthcoming motion picture, "To Be or Not to Be," Jack Benny expects to take his radio show on a tour. He will make appearances chiefly at Army and Navy posts. During America's participation in World War I, Benny served with the country's naval forces and it was while entertaining in the naval service that he developed his flair for comedy.

SIDELIGHTS

"Bulldog" Looks On

NEW YORK.—Members of the cast of "Bulldog Drummond" were the witnesses to a scene recently which turned out to be far more realistic than the one which they were rehearsing for that evening's broadcast. The little bit of real-life drama took place when a twenty-year-old youth tried to commit suicide by leaping from a fire-escape located on the eighth floor of Mutual's New York headquarters. However, before the youth gathered enough courage to make the leap, police moved in on him and dragged him back to safety. There was an atmosphere of real tension when the cast resumed the rehearsal of a make-believe mystery drama.

Relentless Rails

HOLLYWOOD.—Bing Crosby's voice may cause feminine hearts to stop—but it failed October 29 to stop a train! The Santa Fe Super Chief was bound for Hollywood from Chicago with the crooner aboard, when Bing's agents received word of the settle-

CHARLES BOYER stirred listeners with an inspired dramatic monolog when he appeared as guest on Eddie Cantor's "Time to Smile" October 22. He scored again with a repeat performance on "Treasury Hour" October 28. The monolog was delivered as a tribute to the Statue of Liberty, which was a gift from France, and which passed its fifty-seventh anniversary October 28. So many listeners were moved to request copies of the piece, which was written by Irving Mansfield, that Movie-Radio Guide is printing it herewith for the benefit of our readers-listeners:

"All free men worship America. This is a true civilization—where men give to others the rights they claim for themselves. So it was with the France for which the Maid of Orleans sainted herself upon the stake . . . France without her freedom is like a violin without

strings, like a poet without words. For eyes welled with tears can see nothing but dead leaves on our beloved Champs Elysees. I think of Paris, the Gardens of Versailles, the muted tinkle of wine glasses on the Rue de la Paix, of Trianon and Fontainebleau and gay Montparnasse . . . And I hear nothing but the hollow stillness and echo of music—now verboten. But France will live again! You may chain the arms of man but you cannot chain his soul. WITH Moscow's best short-wave outlet, RV96 (15.18), off the air and with news from the Soviet front at a premium it has become quite an exciting sport among monitors in our leading short-wave listening posts to pick up broadcasts from the U. S. S. R. Reception from Russia is complicated by several factors: First, there is the uncertainty of reception even from the most powerful Soviet transmitters because signals from Moscow must pass almost directly over the north magnetic pole before reaching us and this often absorbs the transmissions partially or wholly; secondly, there are the language difficulties, for Radio Center broadcasts in every language under the sun including the many different dialects of Russia itself; lastly, there

Wanted: Listeners to Jamaica Radio

According to Denis M. Gick, station manager of ZQI (4.70), the Government Broadcasting Station of Jamaica, located at 112 East Street, Kingston, this station was originally an amateur transmitter which was world-famous under the call VP5PZ. When war broke out and amateur activities were suspended the transmitter was turned over to the government and it now is on the air weekdays from 5:15 to 6:15 p.m. EST, with a power of 200 watts. The broadcasts, which feature local live talent, news, and an occasional relay from London, open with the signature tune, "Land of Hope and Glory," and close with "God Save the King."

Mr. Gick states that during last winter ZQI received a large number of reports from listeners throughout the West Indies, Central America and the eastern part of the United States and Canada. Now that we are approaching a period of the year when reception of ZQI should be greatly improved, reception reports are eagerly welcomed and those reporting will receive a personal letter and the station's qsl card.

Meet Major Stewart

Major Oliver Stewart, M. C., A. F. C. A veteran pilot of the last war, with twenty-six years' flying experience, he is the man who talks about the air war in BBC's transmissions to North America.

According to the *African Radio Announcer*, Major Stewart was born in 1895, educated at Cophorne School, Bradfield College and the Royal College of Music, and joined the Middlesex Regiment in 1914. In the following year he transferred to the Royal Flying Corps—predecessor of the R. A. F.—and started by ferrying new machines across the Channel to the B. E. F. in France. After a period of service with the 22nd Squadron in France on photographic and reconnaissance duties, he was posted to the 54th (Fighter) Squadron. During a year of fighting he shot down at least seven enemy aircraft and was awarded the Military Cross in the field.

His airmanship was such that he was next posted back to England for special flying duties, investigating the control properties of different aircraft types, later becoming test pilot in charge of the single-seater flight at Martlesham. Awarded the Air Force Cross for experimental flying, Stewart was granted a permanent commission in the R. A. F. at the end of the war, and was gazetted out as major in 1922. He then became aeronautical correspondent of the *Morning Post* until the death of that paper fifteen years later. He has now for some years been air correspondent of the *Observer* and the founder-editor of *Aeronautics*.

is the further handicap of trying to understand broadcasts which are cut up by code and other types of interference, much of which is believed to be maliciously engineered by the Nazis. For the average listener the best reception bet from Moscow is the 6:00 to 7:55 p.m. EST transmission, which is now broadcast on 15.23 and 15.115 megas in the 19-meter band. You will often note a very loud and disagreeable hum on the 15.115 megas channel. The writer believes this may be caused by poor wire connections between studios in Kuibishev—auxiliary capital of the U. S. S. R., where many broadcasts originate—and the transmitters near Moscow. The latter portion of the broadcast, it is believed, originates in Radio Center, Moscow, and thus usually is of better quality and intelligibility. One of the easiest ways to identify broadcasts from Moscow—whether in English or some other language—is by the voice of Moscow's famous woman announcer who has been saying, "This is Moscow (pronounced Moss-co), Radio Center Moscow, calling," for the past several years. For those venturesome listeners who like to twist the dials, here are other frequencies on which Soviet programs are being heard together with the approximate periods at which you are most likely to hear them (EST):

THIS year radio listeners will witness the greatest outpouring of fine music in the history of broadcasting. Never before have the broadcasting symphonies announced more elaborate programs. Never before have so many renowned conductors been secured for radio performances. Never before have there been so many eager listeners. It is great music's year of years.

And this is no high-pressure ballyhoo job, no pious cultural crusade. Very simply, it is a sign of the times, the product of two years of deepening war gloom. Men and women today are finding in good music a way to escape—for brief, blessed moments—from the hate and dreary ugliness of their present world. The immortal symphonies which in other times of stress have given release to the few who had access to concert-halls, now, through broadcasting, minister to millions. Today the symphonies are for everybody. Today any American can press a button on his radio and the world fades. A glorious strain bears him a million miles away from worry and despair, brings him back to reality with new strength to meet new crises.

THREE outstanding symphonic organizations have a large share in working this radio-born miracle. In them can be found a striking illustration of how completely great music has been transformed from a luxury for the few to a birthright for millions. These organizations are the one-hundred-year-old New York Philharmonic-Symphony which has adapted itself to serve a nation-wide radio audience; the new NBC Symphony, which was created by and for radio; the Philadelphia Orchestra, which is neither old nor new but representative of the best in American musical tradition.

Celebrating its hundredth anniversary this year, the Philharmonic dramatizes the gradual democratization of music. In 1842 the Philharmonic made its debut. That year it presented three concerts for New York's aristocratic upper crust. The average attendance was less than two hundred.

In 1941-42 the Philharmonic's 112 concerts at Carnegie Hall will attract capacity crowds, averaging 2,500 people. But that is normal growth.

The real story is in the nine million

radio listeners who will tune in radio's grand musical cavalcade of which the Philharmonic programs are a part.

For its twenty-eight Centennial concerts on Sundays over CBS the Philharmonic will feature a distinguished group of conductors, including Leopold Stokowski, Serge Koussevitzky, Artur Rodzinski, Dimitri Mitropoulos, Fritz Busch and regular conductor John Barbirolli.

In sharp contrast to the Philharmonic is the young NBC Symphony. First full-size symphony orchestra established by and for radio in the U. S., the four-year-old organization is hailed by critics today as outstanding. Established to serve millions, it is itself a recognition of the democracy in music.

The NBC Symphony continues this season without Arturo Toscanini, who, because of ill health, declined the arduous task of conducting for a fifth season. Filling in the gap are a group of world-famed conductors, headed by Leopold Stokowski, who will each conduct a series. Among them will be Efreim Kurtz, Juan Jose Castro, Sir Ernest MacMillan, George Szell, Dean Dixon, Frank Black, Alfred Wallenstein, Fritz Reiner and Saul Caston. The concerts, now heard on Tuesday evenings, have been shortened from ninety minutes to sixty.

Concerts of the Philadelphia Orchestra, Mutual's contribution to great music on the air, are a Friday afternoon attraction. This group has broadened its audience to include radio music-lovers after forty-one years playing for Philadelphia main-liners. This season conductor Eugene Ormandy plans a full radio season, will have as guest conductors Sir Thomas Beecham and Sir Ernest MacMillan.

THESE men and their orchestras, together with smaller chamber-music groups and individual artists, are making music to drown for a few precious moments the clamor and hate of war. And not only in America, for many of their broadcasts will be sent around the world through international short-wave stations. Their music—treasure of the ages—is a spark of hope, a glimmer of beauty for a despairing world. It is a source of deep, satisfying enjoyment for all Americans who appreciate good music. Don't miss a single program!

MEET YOUR NEWS COMMENTATOR: John B. Hughes

WHILE America turns half hypnotized toward European battlefields, a voice from the Pacific Coast rings out with a persistent warning—"Don't forget the Orient!" John B. Hughes, the only national news commentator broadcasting from Japan-conscious California, knows that a small change in the delicate current situation may plunge the U. S. suddenly into war in the Far East, feeds his listeners a canny interpretation of oriental diplomatic language, plugs the importance of West Coast industry to the carrying out of America's defense program.


Commentator Hughes, known for his letter-perfect speech, never won a college degree, not even a high-school diploma. His mother, a school-teacher, and his first career, tank-town acting, are responsible for the beautiful diction noted on his broadcasts. His mother is still a teacher—in Long Beach, Calif.—still an exacting critic. The acting career is left behind, although Hughes opened his own dramatic school in Long Beach not long ago. Recently he was offered a position on the teaching staff of the University of Southern California Drama School, turned it down because he already was working fifteen hours a day on radio programs.

In the first years after his marriage Hughes' radio schedule played hob with his home life. There were odd hours, long hours, no hours—many other complicating factors. Worst of all was the time he was holding down a job on a Los Angeles station, another in Glendale, and in a Los Angeles hospital midway between the two stations his wife presented him with a daughter. Dashing from one station to the other, the proud father would pause a few minutes en route to visit his family at hours highly inconvenient to the hospital authorities. Today the Hughes home life is more orderly. They live in Hollywood, have two children, many friends, among whom their closest are the Buck Joneses. But there's still plenty of excitement as the clock strikes 4:00 a.m. in the Hughes household, as these photos, taken by *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE's* Bruce Bailey, demonstrate.

Back on the air with his old, happy gang, Benny is in rare form this fall. As usual, he is the target for jokes—Mary's heckling, Rochester's insolence, Don Wilson's horse-play and Dennis Day's naive bluntness. Jack is still plugging those ace comedy cards—a naturally humorous voice and a week-in-week-out portrayal of the cocky blowhard who invariably makes a fool of himself Pagliacci-like, exciting laughs and sympathy at the same time. He's the same old Benny.

The Jell-O gang is settled down in Hollywood now after their annual excursion to New York, where they took in the Louis-Nova fight. In Hollywood, before broadcast time Sunday nights, Jack walks into the huge Radio City studio, violin in hand, joking and fiddling everybody into a happy mood. Phil Harris follows, passing the hat

for contributions and usually collecting about fifty cents. Roly-poly Don Wilson takes over the more sensible job of introducing members of the cast. Then—On the Air.


What comes out on a Benny show sounds like offhand ad-libbing. Actually, it is carefully rehearsed, product of a week's hard work, beginning immediately after a Sunday night broadcast. Writers Bill Morrow and Ed Beloin, as well as the cast, dig in, but to Jack himself is left the job of squeezing the last laugh out of every situation. His ability in that direction is legend in radio circles.

Early this year Jack celebrated his tenth air anniversary. He has good cause to celebrate. Every week he receives \$18,500 for his show—out of which the cast, writers and musicians are paid. Every week between thirty and forty million people listen to his voice. Jack Benny is a household name and he needs no introduction to **MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE** readers. These pages are presented as a photographic visit to old, well-loved friends. —J. C.



JEAN HERSHOLT: Art Collector Extraordinary

ONE doesn't ordinarily associate gentlemen of quiet, cultivated tastes with the carnival atmosphere of Hollywood. Yet there are an increasing number of such men in Hollywood today. Typical is Jean Hersholt, radio's "Dr. Christian" (Wednesday, CBS) and veteran character actor of motion pictures. As a boy in Denmark, Hersholt had a passion for art and literature that nothing—not even Hollywood—has been able to obliterate. He attended the Danish Art Academy, got sidetracked to the Danish Royal Theater and soon found himself in Danish films. For a young film actor, Hollywood was a natural destination, and that's where Hersholt went. But as his fortunes in Hollywood have risen, Hersholt's interest in the arts has grown. His home is a treasury of paintings and fine books. On its walls hang twenty-two paintings—most of them by Danish artists—valued at \$150,000. On the bookshelves of his library are five thousand volumes, including the world's largest collection of Hans Christian Andersen's works, gathered by Hersholt agents and scouts throughout the world. Currently, "Dr. Christian" is preparing a two-volume work titled "The Collected Works of Hans Christian Andersen." Another Hersholt interest is the fine art of helping his fellows. Under his presidency, the Motion Picture Relief Fund is building a luxurious home for filmdom's unfortunates.—J. C.

Bandstand Notes

ONE of the most successful orchestra-leaders is a man whose band has seldom played an engagement to which the general public has been admitted. In fact, the average music fan may never have heard of him. Yet this bandleader earns in the neighborhood of \$4,000,000 each year! Meyer Davis is the conductor of a so-called "society band." He has been at it since 1913, during which time he has furnished the music for practically all of the upper crust's social functions. A recent Newport season found Davis playing at fifty-nine out of sixty social affairs. The remaining affair had Paul Whiteman. The Davis orchestra also has the distinction of being the only American band to play for their majesties King George VI and Queen Elizabeth when the royal pair visited the United States in 1939.

Most of us are used to thinking of successful orchestra-leaders as being gentlemen whose names are known even in towns where the bands are never seen. Yet here is a bandleader who has never gone on tour, never catered to radio, never attempted to sell his band to the general public. He avoids all that, being content to work for a mere \$3,000 per night, which is his usual fee for playing at a private party.

Many hostesses, unable to afford Meyer's personal group, are glad to get an orchestra which he has trained to play in the Davis manner. The demand for these Davis-trained groups is so large that at present there are eighty-nine of them. They help Meyer to earn that \$4,000,000 a year!

Horace Heidt and his crew are invading the South for the first time in ten years. They'll no doubt get a much nicer reception than did Grant in '64! . . . Gene Krupa has been signed to appear in Sam Goldwyn's "Ball of Fire" . . . The U. S. Government has ordered 1,200 field drums, 180 bass drums and forty snare drums for immediate delivery . . . The option calls for the appearance of Crosby and the band in two more pictures within the next two years . . . ber of pairs to choose from you won't have to take time to launder them every night. The "Undikins" wardrobe is the perfect answer to your panty problem. Your needs in underclothes will vary with the type of life you live. However, a good average for slips would be around five, with three of these being serviceable "to business," "to school," "every-day" slips and two dainty dress-up slips. If your budget dictates more or less than this number, you'll still be wise to have them in that proportion.

It's a great convenience and a smart idea to have a goodly supply of panties. For daintiness you'll want to make daily changes, and if you have a num-
