



MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE is not a publication which hops into private fights willy-nilly, but the legal battle now raging between NBC and CBS and the Federal Communications Commission is no longer a private fight. It affects every radio listener in America.

Latest counter-attack by NBC and CBS against recent commission rulings, which the networks allege would bring chaos to the broadcasting industry, is an injunction filed against the FCC which already has prevented the ordered changes from being put into effect on the initial November 15 deadline. As matters stand now, the FCC has signed a stipulation with NBC and CBS which provides that no changes must be made by either network before a hearing scheduled to take place on or before December 15.

Upon the decision handed down by a three-judge statutory court hinges the future of the fight, although, in whatever direction it eventually turns, the struggle will be long, bitter, expensive—and smelling to high heaven of politics.

The fine musical programs, inspirational religious pro-

grams, educational features, world-wide coverage of special events—all these things have been brought about principally by network coverage and network money. Why should those with a political ax to grind be allowed to interfere with the listening-pleasure of millions? There ought to be a law!

AS BABY QUEEN of Hollywood, Shirley Temple made millions in lean depression years. Now, after a year in which her future became Hollywood's biggest question, Shirley gives her answer, comes back as the twelve-year-old young-lady star of M-G-M's film, "Kathleen"



ON APRIL 23, 1929, Shirley Temple was born. At three she was given dancing-lessons. During her third lesson a talent-scout saw her, and soon she was off to fame in a series of baby burlesque comedies. When a tike of five, in 1934, she made her bow in the big league for 20th Century-Fox in "Stand Up and Cheer" with her acting and singing of "Baby, Take a Bow."

The rest of Miss Temple's history is legend. She made millions right through the depression for herself and Fox for the next six years, and then "retired"—some say to bridge the awkward age, her mother says to go to school like a normal child. Her retirement lasted about one year.

This month Shirley, a very normal young lady of twelve and a half years and a senior at the Westlake School for Girls, will be seen on the screen in her first M-G-M picture, "Kathleen," and this week, on Friday, December 5, she begins a four-week radio series called "Shirley Temple Time" over CBS stations. Those scoffers who thought Shirley was through at the ripe old age of eleven have another guess coming.

Everyone agrees that during Shirley's six big years of fame and fortune she remained a sweet, unspoiled and genuine little girl; never did she affect the characteristics of a "movie brat." And today, as Shirley approaches young womanhood, she's still as normal a young lady as you could hope to meet. She's a pretty girl, too.

When MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE was making this week's cover picture of her, Shirley actually blushed with modesty! Her mother had had to remind her to go put some powder on to take the shine off her face. "Shirley's just like the other girls," explained Mrs. Temple. "They'd go around without a bit of make-up on if they had their way."

They treated her like any other student, and if anything gave her "the works" a bit stronger.

They wanted to see if she could take it. She could, and she was in.

This fall, Shirley explained, she was asked to do an imitation at the school's senior initiation.

"They asked me," Shirley chortled with mirth and embarrassment as she related her experience, "to do an imitation of Shirley Temple singing 'The Lollypop Parade.' I could have fallen right through the floor, but I did it though, in a high, squeaky voice . . . It was fun!"

Shirley's schooldays of the past year and a half have meant very much to her. She doesn't want to miss her "exams" and has coaxed her mother to fix matters with Edward Small Productions, where Shirley is to make her next picture, so that her work won't interfere.

There's a boy friend, too. He took her to the circus a couple of months ago, and she thinks he's very nice. She won't discuss the matter, though. She knows that a good half-dozen years of boy friends must lapse before she picks the Mr. Man of her life. Anyway, she'd blush too much if you asked her about her romance.

There you have the phenomenal Shirley Temple of today, fast becoming a young lady. Don't forget to see her in "Kathleen," and listen to her singing on the air and doing Christmas playlets for the next four Fridays. You may like her better than ever.



THE TRUTH ABOUT HOLLYWOOD'S DAFFY PARTIES



IN THE hinterlands, I know from experience, there is a vague notion in general circulation that a party in Hollywood is scented with sin, bubbling with champagne, populated by Lady Godivas riding about without their horses and something wilder than Bill Hickok. But now that I've been peeking in on them for the past four years, I beg to report that the truth is far from the rumor.

In fact, most Hollywood parties, unless managed by people like Beulah Kuh, the party girl, are usually duller than dishwater, tamer than a pet tabby cat.

This Hallowe'en MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE decided to prove the point, and sent cameramen and your reporter to three "wild" Hallowe'en parties. But they were daffy, not wild. Screwy, not sinful. That's Hollywood.

At Countess Sonia's Russian Cafe, Virginia Hill had taken over the place to host Mickey Rooney and a gang of other young movie-star friends to a Party Mart entertainment, with music by an imported Spanish rumba band and food in the Hawaiian Luau style. That is the tip-off. Get the clashing international elements Miss Hill tossed together. But everybody had harmless fun.

The costumes (see pictures) were either funny or beautiful, and Mickey Rooney (who, it develops, is a perfume-lover) stopped the show when he took a shampoo of Chanel's Russian Leather perfume. First costume prize was won by publicist Alan Gordon. Exploding caps and gadgets, plus noise-makers and gags galore, kept the party in an uproar. Weird skeletons, witches, pumpkin heads and balloons with faces painted on them glowed with luminous light from every nook and cranny. Everyone had so much fun that breakfast was served to the late-staying guests at six a.m., after which many of them drove to Palm Springs for a week-end of sun.

At Ciro's the following evening movie celebrities turned out in costume for that cafe's annual Hallowe'en party, but it was even quieter than Miss Hill's affair. Columnist Harry Crocker acted as master of ceremonies, called every one out onto the floor to do an old-fashioned square dance. He called but had no answers. It seems that Hollywoodians, chummy conversant with the rumba and la conga, didn't know the old square dance of our fathers. Only two-ton Laird Cregar knew the routine—and he did it, solo—amidst wild applause.

Edgar Bergen, who brought pretty Faye McKenzie to the Ciro's party, came dressed as a cowboy and had much fun clowning with big Billy Gilbert, costumed as a western villain. Juanita Stark, as a hat-check girl, Alan Gordon as a combination Dr. Christian-Groucho Marx, Slapsie Maxie Rosenbloom as Romeo, and Laird Cregar as a huge Cossack were among the funmakers who bobbed for apples in a tub of water or tried to catch string-suspended apples in their teeth. And, as the county weekly editor puts it, a good time was had by all.

Hallowe'en, the same night, at the West Side Tennis Club, Lee Bowman and his wife, Helene, were hosts of a party that started off with a scavenger-treasure hunt. The affair then continued as guests participated in the traditional apple-bobbing, dancing, drinking of cider and drawing for inexpensive guest prizes. It was just a good, wholesome party with no one hurt and everyone happy.

So there, described by your eye-witness and pictured by MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE's cameramen, are three typical examples of how daffy, not how wild, Hollywood parties are today. Hollywood has lived down a once bad reputation, caused mostly by the vivid imaginations of those who know little about the place. Why, in Hollywood today, they even have ice-cream socials and taffy-pulls! —E. P.





IF YOU had a million dollars would you build a tent city? Or a reasonable facsimile of an Indian jungle, stocked with real, live animals—and with a "lost city" right in the middle of it? Would you hire half a dozen sculptors to create heathen gods and goddesses? Or build a river?

Well, Mr. Alexander Korda took a million dollars and did all those things, and what's more, he expects—and will make—a profit on them. Mr. Korda is a motion-picture producer, and right now he's filming Rudyard Kipling's "The Jungle Book" with a cast headed by Sabu, the little Indian lad who made such a hit in "Elephant Boy," and Rosemary De Camp, John Qualen, Patricia O'Rourke and others.

A Hungarian, Korda formerly produced pictures in England, but transferred his activities to America on account of the war, and the way in which he has gone about making this Technicolor picture has given even Hollywood something to talk about.

The actual filming of "The Jungle Book" comes after three years of exhaustive research and preparation by Korda and his staff.

To breathe authenticity into this imaginative tale of a native boy who is stolen from his village and raised by jungle creatures who taught him their language, protected him from harm, then helped him protect his own people, producer Korda assigned his brother, Zoltan, long a resident of India and a student of its traditions and history, to the directorial chore. It was Zoltan Korda who discovered Sabu, brought him to the screen in "Elephant Boy," later in "Drums" and the "Thief of Bagdad."

To make the setting seem real, Mr. Korda's representative had to go far afield in securing materials for construction of a ten-acre jungle. Moss was shipped from Washington, grape-vines from Louisiana; mountain ferns from Oregon, bamboo from National City and Mexlco. Authentic elephant grass was provided through the state agricultural department and had to be imported from India.

Two hundred carpenters and artisans were

rushed to Sherwood Forest, forty miles from Hollywood, worked night and day for three weeks transforming the sight into "Jungle City," replete with temple, business buildings, dwellings and a river. Wells were drilled to obtain 50,000 gallons of water daily for three months to fill the river. The cost—over \$125,000 exclusive of wages.

To all corners of the United States, Canada and Mexico went representatives buying and renting two thousand monkeys, tropical birds, fifteen spotted leopards, three black panthers, twenty-five timber wolves, fifty deer, fifteen elephants, two deadly hooded cobras and scores of crocodiles, water-buffalo and water-snakes at a cost of many thousands of dollars, spending additional large sums to ship the animals to Hollywood for the film.

From Honolulu Korda imported a magnificent caribou, an extremely rare animal, for Sabu to ride in the picture. More thousands were spent for costumes purchased in India and imported to Hollywood so Technicolor cameras will record them just as they actually appear on natives. For the elaborate sequence depicting the fabulous "lost city" treasure, forty thousand large and thirty thousand small coins struck off for the Golden Gate International Exposition were purchased. Thirty thousand additional props for "The Jungle Book" came to another \$60,000.

Dizzy from spending money, Korda still had to consider the salaries of actors and actresses. These alone amounted to a staggering sum—enough to put "The Jungle Book's" budget at \$1,000,000—and more!

Finally set for action—actual filming of the picture—producer Korda still faced a great risk—that of paying out additional huge sums for time lost due to bad weather. Unlike pictures made on sound-stages, making a film on outdoor location is always a tremendous gamble. One can never tell what the weather may be.

Three years of work and a million dollars—that's what "The Jungle Book" means to Korda and his associates. To theater-goers it will mean about two hours pleasantly spent. —W. M.





The two programs which will launch the series are "Fables for Fun," modern fairy-tales, from New York, and "Ask Young America" from WLS, Chicago (NBC) . . . CBS' "Hobby Lobby," which created quite a sensation with a recent demonstration of hypnotism, will present as one of its guests this week a man who makes a hobby of psychic phenomena, as well as a builder of miniature railroads and other hobbyists . . . Arturo Toscanini will conduct the NBC Symphony Orchestra in a special concert in the interest of defense bond sales, and, for the first time, the eminent maestro and the renowned orchestra will broadcast without an audience at the concert (NBC) . . . "People's Platform" topic will be "Shall the United States Declare War?" (CBS) . . . "Chicago Theater of the Air" will present the operetta "Rio Rita," with baritone Thomas L. Thomas singing opposite soprano Marion Claire . . . Lin Yutang, famous Chinese author-philosopher, will discuss his latest book, "A Leaf in the Storm," with Harry Hansen, book reviewer for the New York World, on the "Of Men and Books" program (CBS).

Sunday, December 7

A rare dramatic treat is in store for listeners to the CBS "Screen Guild Theater" program. It was inevitable that sooner or later the two most imaginative and creative figures in radio should get together in a broadcast. It happens this Sunday when Orson Welles will appear in a "Screen Guild" play especially written by Norman Corwin. The play is called "Between Americans" and embodies, as might be expected, a novel technique (CBS) . . . Errol Flynn will be the guest star on CBS' "Silver Theater" . . . "Invitation to Learning" guest will be commentator Dorothy Thompson (CBS) . . . An ex-member of the German Reichstag, Gerhart H. Benny humor clicks in England; Sportscaster Balter sues successor and sponsor

GENERAL

"Truth" Is Tops

NEW YORK.—Top favorite among all quiz programs is "Truth or Consequences," which nosed out "Information, Please" recently in a telephone survey. Both programs have seen-sawed for the past year. "Truth or Consequences" first topped all quiz programs a few months after it began its network airing. All signs indicate that it will be one of the foremost quiz programs for a long time to come.

Illinois Leads

CHICAGO.—More than four hundred applications from thirty-eight states and Canada have been received for the \$10,500 American operetta quest being conducted by Mutual's "Chicago Theater of the Air." Illinois leads in the number of persons who have entered the contest to write an operetta with American music and an American setting. New York is in second place, while Massachusetts, California and Pennsylvania are next in order. Entries for the contest do not close until January 1, 1942, and composers are given until February 10, 1942, to complete their work. Composers of the three best operettas will receive \$1,000 and the composer of the work named as the best of the three will receive an additional \$5,000. A committee of famous song-writers and music critics will judge the compositions.

Britishers Like Benny

LONDON.—Englishmen can and do appreciate American humor. At least, that seems to be indicated by reports that the biggest radio success of the current season in England is being scored by the transcribed Jack Benny programs shipped to Britain for re-broadcasting.

Sam Balter Sues

NEW YORK.—Sam Balter, sportscaster formerly heard on Mutual's "Inside of Sports," has filed suit against an advertising agency, a former sponsor and Jack Stevens, another sports commentator. Balter claims that the agency appropriated his idea for the program feature called "Once in a Lifetime," which Stevens now broadcasts. Last September Balter broke with the cigar company which was sponsoring him and went on the Don Lee network in a sustaining capacity. The sponsor then employed Stevens to replace Balter, and the "Once in a Lifetime" feature of the broadcast was continued, thus giving rise to the dispute.

Runaway Girl Collects

CHICAGO.—Because an old school chum is a regular listener to CBS' "Are You a Missing Heir?" Mrs. Helen Herrold Owen collects fourteen thousand dollars from a trust fund left by her parents. In 1935, while a high-

school student, Helen Louise Herrold, now twenty-four and married, ran away from her aunt's home, where she had lived since the death of both her parents. Her aunt didn't locate her again until the "Missing Heir" program broadcast the details of her case November 4. Ralph Seaton, an old high-school chum in Akron, Ohio, heard the broadcast and informed the program officials he had received several letters from the girl from Bradenton, Fla. Investigators traced her from Bradenton to Chicago to inform her of her inheritance.

WAR, DEFENSE

Stop Berlin Pick-ups

NEW YORK.—Unless the networks have reversed their policies by the time you read this, the suspension on pick-ups from Berlin is still in force. NBC and Mutual called a halt on short-wave broadcasts from the Nazi capital when their reporters stationed there notified them that undue censorship prevented broadcasting worthwhile news. The reporters also claimed that the Nazis had insisted they report material prepared by German propaganda agencies. It has been reliably reported—though not confirmed by NBC—that Alex Dreiser, the NBC correspondent, went so far in the effort to resist the blue-penciling as to hang a shiner on a Nazi censor's eye!

What Price Serials?

NEW YORK.—Nine years of radio scripts—torrents of words poured on mountains of pages representing a fortune to the sponsors who bought them from radio-writers—were sold by "The O'Neills" today for \$1.20. The paper goes to aid the Government, which is crusading for waste paper. Containing the homy saga that made "The O'Neills" one of radio's outstanding serials, the heaps of scripts in CBS files will be transformed into boxes carrying defense materials to Uncle Sam's Army camps and outposts. The gesture of the radio program in turning over its scripts to the drive is designed to call attention to the need for old newspapers and magazines for conversion into boxes.

Drama for Defense

NEW YORK.—In an effort to promote the sale of Defense Bonds and Stamps, the Treasury Department has appointed Elaine Sterne Carrington, one of radio's foremost script-writers, as a consultant for the Radio Division of the U. S. Treasury. Under the supervision of Mrs. Carrington (who writes "Pepper Young's Family") efforts will be made to develop short dramatic programs to plug the bonds and stamps. Top-ranking stars will enact the sketches for recordings, which will be distributed to stations throughout the country.

Later, when informed that she had actually talked with Vallee and that her jovial greeting had caused him to gulp, "Big Sis" hastily explained that she had thought the voice on the phone that of a local wag. "Why, he didn't even sound like Rudy Vallee," she said.

Lingo-Lyric Specialists

HOLLYWOOD.—Since the Merry Macs introduced the tremendously popular "Hut Sut Song," they've been besieged with copies of tunes, the lyrics of which are written in double-talk lingo. They even received one copy of a song purported to be written in Siamese double-talk. The quartet, heard now on the Monday Herbert Marshall-Bert Wheeler program, has introduced a new song called "Rose O'Day," which isn't in double-talk but does contain a smattering of ancient Gaelic in the lyrics. It is being sung by Bing Crosby and by Kate Smith and looks like another big hit.

Announcer-Impresario

NEW YORK.—Milton Cross, veteran NBC announcer who handles the Metropolitan Opera broadcasts, was one of those who enthusiastically applauded Rise Stevens' performance in the "Marriage of Figaro" at the Met recently. Rise was once a child

star on Cross' Sunday morning children's program, now in its fifteenth year on the networks. Other graduates of the show whom Cross has watched grow up include Bea Wain and Wynn Murray.

A Squawking Snooks

HOLLYWOOD.—Fanny Brice's parrot, gift of the "Coffee Time" cast, has developed into a feathered Baby Snooks. Instead of the usual "Polly wants a cracker," this bird pipes up in answer to almost any question or command with "Why, Daddy?"

Little "Big Town"

HOLLYWOOD.—A miniature model of "Big Town" has been built by a New Orleans man who visualizes the imaginary city after listening to Edward G. Robinson's CBS broadcasts each Wednesday night. Details of the replica include the *Illustrated Press* building, police headquarters, city hall and the Indian River, which runs through the mythical city. The builder wanted to give the reproduction to Robinson, but the star declined with thanks, since the model, being fourteen feet by fourteen feet, would require a lot of room.

three days. During the big flood in 1937, when she broadcast nightly appeals on behalf of the Red Cross, trucks loaded with checks, money-orders and schoolchildren's pennies rolled up to the CBS studios daily. In token of these services, she's been given enough medals to cover ten Boy Scouts, ranging from the Legion of Valor Medal—never before bestowed on a private citizen—to a diamond-studded gold badge presented by the firemen of Passaic, N. J. She's also been made an honorary member of the Tail-Waggers, the Winnebago tribe of Sioux Indians, and the American Order of Cork-Poppers. (This last honor is a bit mystifying, since the singer never drinks anything stronger than frosted chocolate.) A much-admired new feature of the last Flower Show was a big red Burpee bloom christened "The Kate Smith Sweet Pea."

On Armistice Day in 1938, listeners heard her introduce "A brand-new number which I'm sure you're all gonna like." The song was "God Bless America," written twenty-one years before by one Private Irving Berlin at Camp Upton, and dragged out of an old trunk when the singer asked him to write her a patriotic number. She plugged it lustily over the air, sang it at Legion rallies, benefits and the World's Fair. There was excited talk of adopting it as our national anthem. An anonymous donor sent a small box with a crude swastika sketched on the cover, and a note saying "If you don't stop singing 'God Bless America,' you'll get this." "This" was a .38-caliber bullet. Kate displayed the rather grisly little gift with pride, and sang the *verboten* number louder than ever.

where her childish treble rang out above the entire congregation. Soon the pigtailed songbird was grabbed up eagerly to perform at Sunday school pageants and church suppers, and in 1917, when the United States entered the war, she was a featured attraction at training camps around Washington. Standing sturdily on a wooden mess-table, the eight-year-old singer rendered "Rose of No Man's Land" and "Pack Up Your Troubles" to prolonged cheers. School and the pursuit of knowledge made Kathryn yawn, and teachers winced as they wrote down the grades of her report cards. She has since explained this by saying, "I've always been suspicious of anything that required study."

After the Armistice, General Pershing presented the young singer with a medal for her contribution to soldier morale. "You must keep on singing, child," he said.

THE child did, and developed a gratifying faculty for copping all first prizes in amateur nights at local theaters. Mr. Smith watched with misgivings his daughter's growing fame as an entertainer, since it was his firm conviction that any female connected with the stage would come to a bad end. Soon after her sixteenth birthday she yielded to parental pressure and entered the George Washington Hospital to study nursing. She stuck it out for nine months, and says now that it made her nervous to tiptoe around in rubber-soled shoes, talking in hushed whispers.

One balmy spring afternoon the manager of the local Keith theater phoned Kate frantically to say that a performer due from New York hadn't shown up, and would she please fill in. Headliner on the same bill was Eddie Dowling, who had already signed a contract with Erlanger, the Broadway producer, to star in a forthcoming musical comedy. Dowling heard Kate sing and wired Erlanger: "Have terrific find for girl comedy lead in your show."

On September 20, 1926, the seventeen-year-old made her Broadway debut as Tiny Little in "Honeymoon Lane." Opening-nighters, after the first grunt of surprise, applauded wildly. The dramatic critics' notices were favorable, but inclined to playful puns: "She's immense in more ways than one." "Kate Smith literally carried weight with the opening night audience."

After a year on the road as a singing black mammy in "Hit the Deck," Kate Smith was signed at five hundred dollars a week for the comedy lead opposite Bert Lahr in "Flying High." Bouncing out on the stage in a blazing-red dress, she sang "Red Hot Chicago" and took some rowdy ad-libbing about her size and feeding habits from Lahr, who has never been famed for his subtlety. Cartoonists had a field day at the expense of her figure, and one reporter wrote that "she sat down in a chair like a giant dirigible coming to anchor."

It was tough going. Benevolent fate intervened in the shape of Ted Collins, a phonograph-recording company executive who saw "Flying High" and asked Kate to make some records. Kate, overcome at being accepted as a singer instead of a fat-girl laugh-getter, burst into tears. Collins lent her his handkerchief, listened to her grievances, and said mildly, "Forget it. I'll be your manager. All you've got to do is sing."

KATE SMITH

THE SONGBIRD OF THE SOUTH

PART I

LAST May, on the tenth anniversary of Kate Smith's first broadcast, *Variety* brought out a special issue with a banner headline: "HOMEY APPEAL WORKS OUT." It has worked out very nicely indeed—to the tune of a \$7,000-a-week contract and the title of "Radio's First Lady." Listeners to her weekly evening program, plus the five-day-a-week noon broadcasts in which she comments on anything from fifth columnists to baby robins, are modestly estimated at forty million. For an ex-student-nurse who has never taken a vocal lesson, they concede that the thirty-two-year-old singer has done right well.

The star, in person, is a broad-shouldered, muscular, 235-pound girl who can wham a golf ball to hell and gone. She walks and talks like a breezy Texan. Her schedule of seven broadcasts a week, plus rehearsals, benefit performances, and singing "God Bless America" at patriotic rallies, schools and hospitals, leaves her fit as a fiddle and bouncing with verve.

More than one spectator at a football game has been startled out of his seat to hear an oddly familiar voice bellowing "Kill 'em! Mow 'em down!" as Radio's First Lady exhorts a plunging half-back in tones that would carry ten miles in a favorable wind. Business associates, imbued with the silly notion that a singer should pamper her voice, used to urge their high-paid star to stop hollering. They have long since come to the conclusion that she thrives on bedlam. Given a good grievance, she can roar like an outraged moose. But ordinarily she is gustily good-humored. She takes a

bustling, motherly interest in the radio technicians connected with her broadcasts, advises them how to cure chest colds with hot, greased flannel, and sends lavish amounts of flowers when their wives have babies.

As a Broadway columnist has noted, "No one in public life has more power to inspire donations than Kate Smith." She has raised \$4,000,000 for the Red Cross, another \$500,000 for the American Legion, and swelled the funds for orphanage hospitals, Community Chests, China Relief, and homeless dogs. Her public, sensing that she's genuinely concerned over "all those folks in trouble," responds with spectacular generosity. When she asked over the air for dolls to be given to needy children, listeners swamped the mails with twenty thousand dolls in

Kathryn Elizabeth Smith was born in Washington, D. C. Her mother is a descendant of General Burgoyne and her father came from Irish and German stock staunchly Americanized for several generations. (It may be this Irish-German combination which inspired a radio rival to remark tartly, "Kate Smith is what happens when an irresistible force meets an immovable object and they merge.")

As a baby she baffled her parents by refusing to talk until the advanced age of four. "Leave her alone," the family doctor advised Mrs. Smith jovially. "One of these days she'll make up for lost time." He was right. At the age of five Kathryn Elizabeth was not only prattling great guns but also causing a minor sensation among members of St. Patrick's Church,

MEET YOUR NEWS COMMENTATOR: GABRIEL HEATTER

GABRIEL HEATTER had his first day off in seven years Saturday, Oct. 11. For seven years he had been broadcasting across the board—which means seven times a week, Sunday through Saturday, day in and day out. He'd looked forward to a vacation. He wanted to do a lot of things. For instance, he hadn't been to the theater one evening during those years. He hadn't entertained guests at his home for dinner. But there were so many things to do he couldn't make up his mind, so he stayed home.

Home to Gabriel Heatter, Mutual's veteran, outstanding commentator, may be at Candlewood Lake, New York, or Freeport, Long Island, or the 60's in New York City. These pictures were taken at his Freeport home where he lives—and broadcasts—from April through October. For Gabe Heatter is one of the few radio people who broadcast at home.


Heatter's introduction to the microphone came as a result of an article he wrote for the *Nation* in answer to Norman Thomas. The article attracted wide comment, got him an invitation to broadcast. Since then his rich, dramatic voice has become familiar to millions of listeners. Using a background of years of experience as reporter and foreign correspondent, he brings to listeners a vivid, almost melodramatic picture of world affairs.

Some have listened to the impassioned philippics that go with Heatter newscasts and dubbed him the Voice of Doom. Actually, Heatter is a staunch optimist.

"I suppose," he says, "my news tickers will be showing up the usual quota of bad news, but in spite of it all, I want to be sure when I go on the air to state my sincere conviction that we are heading toward a better and brighter day; this dismal night can't last forever, and out of it all must emerge a better world."

Heatter's working day starts at 8 a.m. when he tunes in foreign broadcasts on his short-wave set. For an hour he takes notes on overseas commentaries. Then he works until noon correlating his notes. The afternoon is spent in research, writing of script. By 6 p.m. news from Europe, Asia and the U. S. is coming in heavily. Then the feverish rewrite and broadcast at 9 p.m. EST. It's twelve hours of hard work for fifteen minutes on the air!—A. M.


