# What's Your Verdict? ...

THE above question is prompted by the searing comments from readers which have reached our desk recently about what they consider one of the annoying features of war-time broadcasting. The general gist of the grievance is this:

Many listeners are getting tired of hearing appended to the end of the big commercial broadcasts from the various Army camps, naval bases, and flying-fields, a statement to the effect that—"The broadcasting of the Bubbles program from Camp Blank does not constitute an endorsement of its sponsored product by the War Department."

These readers believe that American radio listeners are adult enough to know that those sponsors who have taken cast and staff hither and yon to out-of-the-way spots in order to entertain soldiers, sailors and marines did not do so with the idea of getting the United States War Department to approve their corn, beans, soap, ham and toothpaste!

With the typically fair-minded viewpoint of the average American, these readers feel that the radio public should be told that broadcasts from military camps and bases generally

cost the sponsor extra line-charges for telephone wires running from several hundred to several thousands of dollars for each broadcast. Too, that those responsible for these programs, aired from military centers, are under no obligation which says that they

must give their shows there; that they do it merely for the good of the morale of America's armed forces:

To these readers, it seems pretty funny that the War Department should be so adamant against an inferred endorsement. They want to know why the War Department doesn't grow up and forget, in these grave times, a little of its red tape and brass-hat polish.

Some listeners suggested (as a common-sense substitute) that the time devoted to the "non-endorsement" announcement be given over to an appeal for funds in the Army and Navy Emergency Relief drive.

Which brings to mind columnist-commentator Raymond Clapper's sage remark, "Never overestimate the people's knowledge nor underestimate their intelligence," and the fact that it might be mulled—and profitably—by our War Production Board. What's your verdict, readers?—The Editors.

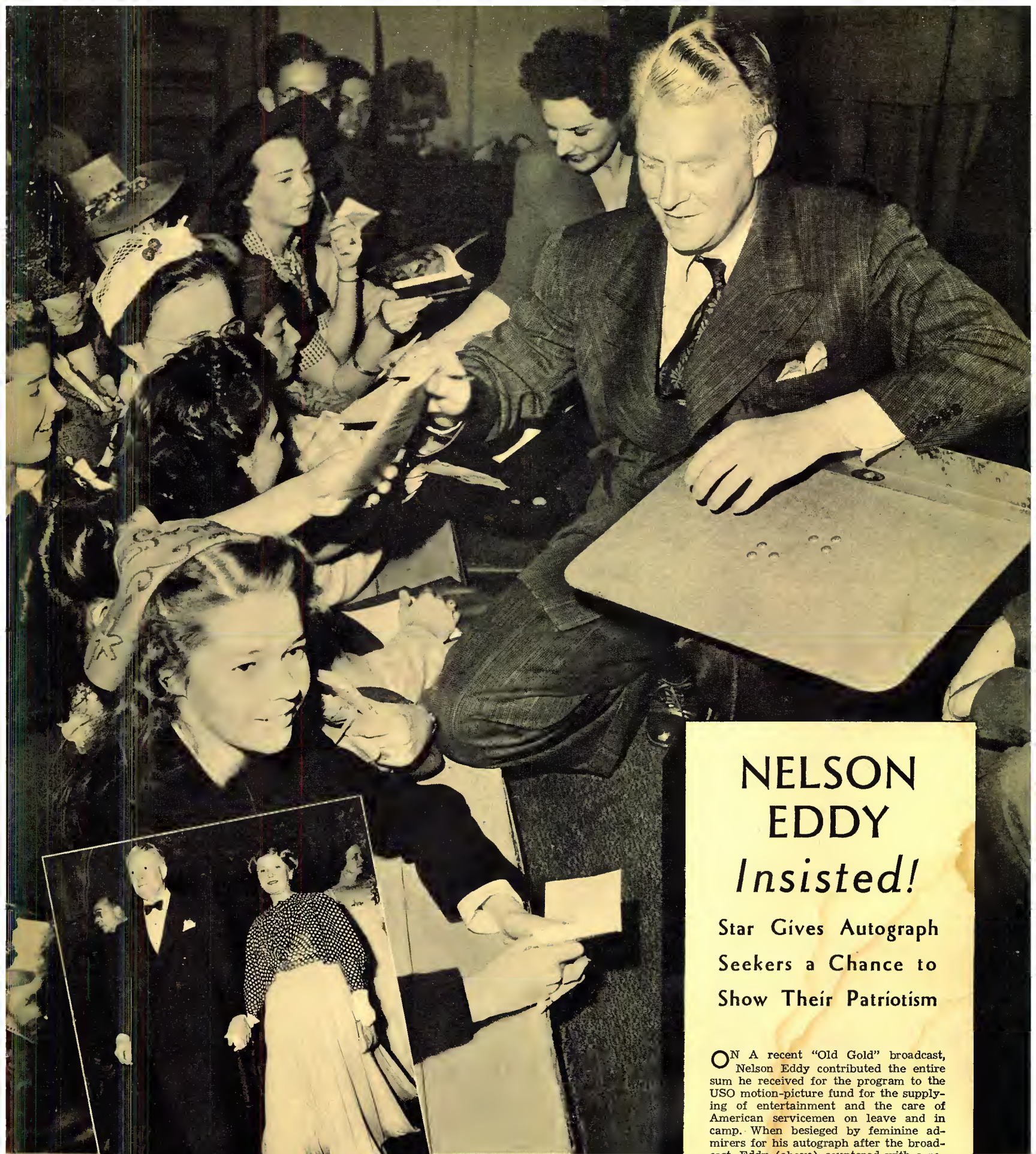

# The Innermost Secrets of CHARLIE



BY EDGAR BERGEN — THEIR FATHER

Wooden Personalities Present a Study in Contrasts as Bergen Plays Psychologist. Charlie's a Complex Individual, but Mortimer, His Rival, Is Plenty Simple. Both Appear in RKO's "Here We Go Again"

I AM the happy victim of an unusual paradox. When I meet people socially, their first question after the introduction usually runs true to a regular formula, and that is, "Tell us about Charlie." Their attitude toward me reveals about the same impersonal interest that one feels in questioning a doctor about the general condition of a very close friend. "What's he up to now?" . . . "Will he pass in school?" . . . "Who is the latest great moment in his love-life?" This is a sample of the barrage of cross-examination I am subjected to while at a party, and when the party is over I realize that I have devoted my whole evening to the discussion of Charlie McCarthy . . . and I love it.

So many persons want to know the innermost reactions of Charlie's mind to the problems of today and his plans for the future that, while I am his closest friend and advisor, I feel that one can get a truer perspective of his personality by Charlie's own observations. By his own admission, he is "A blank page in the book of knowledge . . . an unsolved problem child," and the next moment he will belie this statement with the assertion that "In all modesty, I would say that I'm hardly more than a genius."

When I remonstrate with him that if such is the case then why has he been in the eighth grade for three years, he will answer, "Bergen, I have had the same seat so long that I have claimed title to

it under squatter's right."

If questioned about his dubious methods of passing exams, Charlie will put my mind at ease with such bits of information as, "Don't worry, Bergen . . . It's all run on the honor system . . . The teacher has the honor . . . and we kids . . . the system."

When it comes to financial matters, Charlie has very definite ideas. According to him, he started wearing a monocle only because he couldn't see "eye to eye" with me on the matter of his allowance. He continually complains that he has a banana-split appetite on a bubble-gum income. His financial plight is the source of wide discussion, and I get many letters saying that I should raise

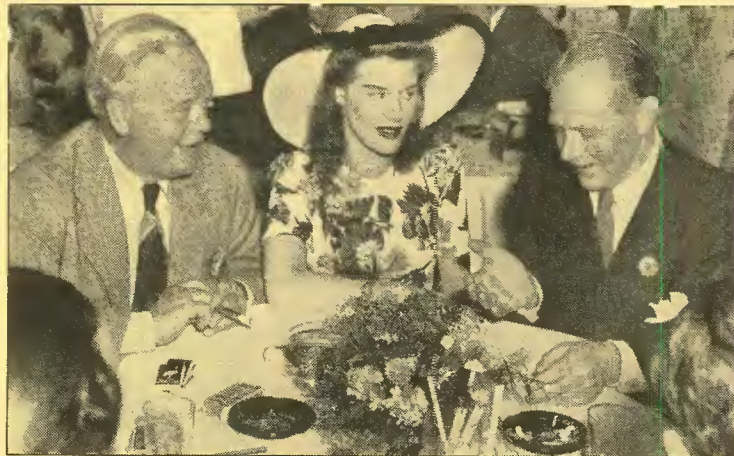

Supreme confidence that the Stars and Stripes will again fly, and soon,

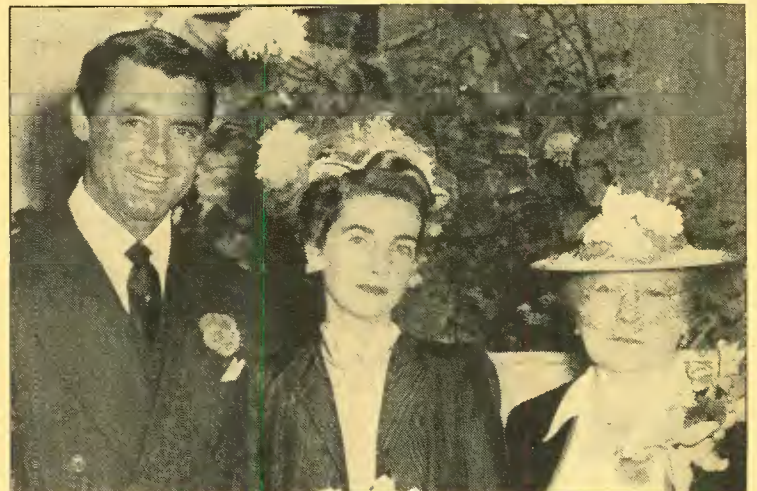

### "The Magnificent Ambersons"

**Cast:** Joseph Cotten, Dolores Costello, Anne Baxter, Tim Holt, Agnes Moorehead, Ray Collins, Erskine Sanford, Richard Bennett, Don Dillaway. An RKO release, directed and produced by Orson Welles from his screenplay based on the Pulitzer prize-winning novel by Booth Tarkington.

**Type of Picture:** An historical romance which covers the transition period from horse-drawn carriage days to motor cars.

**This Is the Story:** Tim Holt as the arrogant and stubborn scion of the wealthy Amberson family, carriage makers, interferes with the marriage of his widowed mother (Dolores Costello) and Eugene Morgan (Joseph Cotten), her girlhood sweetheart. He can't see his mother marrying again. To complicate matters, he falls in love with Morgan's daughter (Anne Baxter). But because of his meddlesome hotheaded tactics, he breaks up his own romance as well. In the meantime, the Amberson carriage business gives way to the automobile manufacturer Morgan. Complications mount to a heart-breaking peak, before Holt finally gets the jolt that makes him see where he has been absolutely wrong. Reduced to poverty, he admits his mistakes. Movie-goers who dote on dramatically happy endings will like this one especially.

**Verdict:** Orson Welles does an outstanding three-way job in filming this Tarkington novel. "The Magnificent Ambersons" is an inspired screen offering, and a definite "should see" for adult theater-goers.

### "Bambi"

# WARNERS SHUN PROFITS ON "THIS IS THE ARMY" . . . RADIO BOOSTS CANTEENS

Serial Stars Keep Dramas Rolling as Their Husbands Join the Colors; Ray Block Almost Lands in Jail; Phil Harris To Be Army Bandmaster

## WASHINGTON

By LT. COL. CURTIS MITCHELL

Gene Autry will soon be with us here in Washington, according to a report from Hollywood. Gene will not be commissioned, it is said, but will serve in the office of the Air Forces.

Early in the spring, the Army decided that it needed money for its Army Emergency Relief Fund, and an officer wrote to Autry's agent asking him to persuade Gene to devote a portion of the earnings of his rodeo to that fund. Autry replied that he would give a complete tour just for Army Emergency Relief, provided he wasn't in the Army himself. A few weeks later he arrived in Washington. I saw him then and learned that he wanted to serve in the Army. That was nothing new, of course, for Washington is full of persons, celebrities and otherwise, who are looking for commissions.

The Autry case is different, in that he didn't want a commission. The word that he joined up as an enlisted man will be good news to those who have been perturbed about the number of stars commissioned . . .

Certain phenomena of Washington have appeared in these columns from time to time. This week's subject is the Union Station and the trains to and from the South.

Union Station is a huge stone building which once was spacious and quiet as befits the capital of a great nation. Now it is a cross between Coney Island and Grand Hotel. Soldiers make the difference.

The trains pulling out for the North are filled to the last seat. I took one just the other day. Soldiers in rumpled khaki were everywhere. Some of them were colored, wearing clean, fresh uniforms which indicated they had just left some near-by camp. A few Navy men were sprinkled through the cars, wearing khaki, too, but distinguished by their different caps and collar ornaments. The appearance of a civilian was so odd that, at first sight, one had the feeling that he definitely did not belong.

As I traveled with those home-going soldiers and listened to their talk, I became proud and certain that our destiny is secure in their hands. Young men have a habit of talking about many things besides their jobs; but most of these fellows talked shop.

They were explaining maneuvers to each other, and the action of gun crews and supply outfits. They traced designs on seat cushions and pillows, and I heard words such as "tank-killers" and "high-velocity" and "logistics" . . .

It has already been remarked that a war brings out the finest impulses and instinct in many people. I have seen that proved over and over again. This is another story to prove the point: Irving Berlin's great new show, "This Is the Army," has been acclaimed by the critics as one of the greatest productions of all time. Using soldiers as entertainers, it revives some of the scenes from Berlin's original "Yip Yip Yaphank," and Berlin himself sings the same number, "Oh, How I Hate to Get Up in the Morning," that he sang in 1918. All profits, you know, if you have read these columns, go to Army Emergency Relief.

The movie rights to this show were sold to Warner Bros. for a \$250,000 down payment and a fifty-fifty split of the profits. Which looked like a splendid deal all around, as it was, but Albert Warner and Jack Warner decided to do even better.

"We want to make this one of the greatest pictures," the Warner brothers said to Berlin. "We want to make this in Technicolor, and we want you to play yourself in the film. Lastly, we don't want to make a penny out of it for ourselves, but will give every cent of profit to Army Emergency Relief."

Berlin accepted. The Army accepted. You'll be seeing "This Is the Army" on your screen this autumn, and almost all you pay for admission will help some soldier's family. Before that, if plans work out, you may hear it as a regular weekly radio feature. If you do, you can know some smart and patriotic sponsor is doing his bit, too. The price per week will be \$10,000.

# CHILD PRODIGY LORIN MAAZEL CONDUCTS SUMMER SYMPHONY SATURDAY

Bernard Herrmann Conducts Concert Suite He Wrote for "All That Money Can Buy," Sun.; Maestro Jacques Renard Returns to Radio

CHILD prodigies have been leaning toward the violin in the past decade or so. We have had the Menuhins, the Riccis, the Carroll Glenns and ever so many more. There have been some pianistic prodigies, too, who have streaked across the musical heavens in the same period—Ruth Slenczynski, for one. But the child conductors have been a straggly few.

The musical highways and byways have been full of the talk of little twelve-year-old Lorin Maazel of late. This youngster is really twelve years old, already the proud possessor of several notable achievements in the batonistic line.

Of course, there is always this to be said about any child prodigy, no matter what his genre, he can't be fully matured musically in the tender years of childhood. And of course, too, there always comes up the shining example of Mozart. But the answer to that one is usually that Mozart was Mozart, and no argument.

Master Maazel has made a good impression on very thoughtful men and women. He is young, they have noted, adding that his is the assurance of the born musician. He knows, in other words, a good deal of what he conducts—not only the simple matters of notes and their orchestral presentation but also much of what the music implies, much of its inner self.

One thing about him that has earned him the admiration of many is his courage; he doesn't believe in making it easy for himself. On the contrary, he devises programs the conducting of which requires knowledge and experience and a strong authority.

We notice, for instance, that he has scheduled what might be considered light stuff for him in the "Summer Symphony" broadcast. There are the overture to "Rosamunde" by Schubert, the nocturne and scherzo from the Mendelssohn "Midsummer Night's Dream" and the overture to Wagner's "Rienzi."

Not having been exposed enough to Master Maazel's conducting, we are perfectly willing to listen further before making critical comment on it. It wouldn't do, you know, to wrap him up in some phrase of dismissal for his youth and skip on to the next topic. You see, we are one of those people who are constantly on the lookout for more Mozarts.

Franz Schubert wasn't such an olderster himself when he wrote the bulk of the music incidental to the play by Helmina von Chezy, "Rosamunde, Princess of Cyprus." The play was produced in 1823, when Schubert had

just about turned his twenty-sixth year. Unluckily, the play ran a span of two performances, in spite of the beautiful music the composer had penned. In fact, the overture was so well liked by the audience at the premiere of the play that it was encored twice. The odd thing is that the overture had been written, it is said, three years before the rest of the score, when Schubert was a young man of twenty-three.

As for "Midsummer Night's Dream," Mendelssohn was thirty-four years of age when he completed the work. But the important thing, since this is a story of youth and music, is that the overture to the same composition was finished when the author was barely seventeen years of age! And so good was it that Mendelssohn utilized it for this score, just as he had written it.

In other words, the passing of seventeen years did not make a difference, for the overture fitted the rest of the piece as snugly and properly as if all the music had been done at the same time.

Wagner wrote the libretto for his opera "Rienzi" when he was twenty-five. The music for the three acts was completed in August, 1840, when he was twenty-seven, and the overture was written the following October.

What we are trying specifically to point out is the fact that music which is to be interpreted by twelve-year-old Master Maazel was all written when the composers were well beyond that age. What he does with this music is for the listener to judge. Confidentially, we think we'll listen, too.

## Another Young Man

Bernard Herrmann is thirty-one. He is staff conductor and composer at CBS. Already several of our major symphonic organizations have presented works by him. If you saw the movie "All That Money Can Buy," then you must have heard the music that accompanied it. It was composed by Mr. Herrmann and it won for him the coveted Film Academy Award for the best original score of the year. The film, as you may remember, was based on the Stephen Vincent Benet-Douglas Moore opera, "The Devil and Daniel Webster." For reasons best known to experts in Hollywoodiana, the Moore music was replaced by Mr. Herrmann's score.

From that music Mr. Herrmann has made a concert suite, which he will conduct at a broadcast of the "Columbia Broadcasting Symphony." The suite consists of five sections. They are, "Mr. Scratch," "A Sunday Sleigh-Ride," "Ballads of Springfield Mountain," "Miser Steven's Waltz," and "Swing Your Partners."

## Concert Records

Beethoven's Eighth Symphony, as recorded by Victor by Arturo Toscanini and the NBC Symphony, is completely in accord with the best you might expect from the noted Italian batonist. The work is a perfect gem of the symphonic art and, like a perfect gem, it has an imperishable beauty of form and essence.

Another major achievement by Victor is the performance of the Grieg A Minor Piano Concerto by Artur Rubinstein and the Philadelphia Orchestra under Eugene Ormandy's direction. For your mellower moments there is the Clemens Kraus-Vienna Philharmonic album of three Johann Strauss waltzes—"The Song of Love," the "Morning Papers" and "You and You" from "The Bat."

## POPULAR MUSIC



Jacques Renard's fumble led to a comedy formula

JACQUES RENARD, well-known maestro, comes back on the air after an absence of three years. His last appearances on the radio were on the program starring the late Joe Penner, whose "Wanna Buy a Duck?" became a household phrase.

During his sabatistical from the airlines Mr. Renard has devoted a good part of his time to making transcriptions, which in itself can amount to a full-time job. But, besides that, he has made numerous personal appearances.

We are all familiar with the duties of orchestra-leaders in contemporary sponsored shows. They double between conducting and playing foil for the comedians who are the features of such programs. Jack Benny has his Phil Harris, Charlie McCarthy his Ray Noble, Bob Hope his Skinny Ennis and now Phil Baker his Jacques Renard.

"Take It or Leave It" being the kind of show it is and Baker at his best as the ribber par-excellence, one may expect almost anything to happen during the course of the coming broadcasts—with Renard as the goat. Yet it was he who first appeared in the role of stooge orchestra-leader when he worked with Burns and Allen back in 1935.

One night he was given one line to read. He fumbled it badly, too badly for its original purposes. However, it brought the batonist forward in the light of a foil when the noted comedy team began to clown about his weight in order to cover up the slip. Certain informants insist that at that moment the popular comedy formula, which makes a bandleader a stooge, was born.

In taking over the musical assignment for "Take It or Leave It," Renard becomes reunited with Phil Baker, since they worked together previously on a show that followed the Burns and Allen series. The comic used to have himself a time kidding the maestro about his superabundant fat, all of which was taken in stride, what with this and that, a living to make and a good joke to appreciate, whether it slapped him or not.

However, it doesn't seem likely that the same sort of thing will prevail, for Renard has gone and lost a neat 100 pounds between then and now. The conductor, we'll have you know, is currently down to a sprightly 198, which should discourage harpooning.

His keen humor and clear analyses have won him hosts of listeners, White House folk among them. Earl Godwin is heard nightly on the Blue Network.

## Dreier Takes the Morning Watch

Early morning listeners are finding real pleasure in Skelly Oil's new commentator, Alex Dreier. He's a thoroughly trained foreign correspondent, and was one of the last Americans to escape from Berlin, where he was NBC's reporter before the Nazis declared war on us. His return trip to freedom was a four-continent flight by clipper. Dreier landed his first foreign job by faking a knowledge of German, but speedily learned the language in Berlin. He represented the United Press, then switched to the post of Berlin NBC correspondent. Dreier was born in Honolulu, played football at Leland Stanford University and won a degree in political science. When he fled Germany on December 6 of last year, he had to hide his notes in the coupling of a Switzerland-bound train. He had become familiar with such conspiratorial methods during his last year in Germany, when he was constantly

# LISTENERS BRAVE NAZI TERROR TO HEAR FREEDOM BROADCASTS ON SHORT WAVE

America Talks Frankly to British Allies; A. E. F. in Australia Is Rarin' to Go; Religious Station in Andes Fights for Democracy

## Germans Brave Death to Hear U. S. Broadcasts

THROUGHOUT enslaved Europe, and particularly in Germany, countless courageous patriots are secretly listening to the radio voice of America and its allies, according to members of the German section of the NBC International Division.

American short-wave broadcasters helping to destroy Germany's gigantic lie foundry have substantial evidence that their work has not been in vain, the NBC short-wave experts declare.

They are certain that, while the swastika may be seen on the front of houses in Germany, the people inside sit in terrible darkness, straining their ears to listen to the voice of freedom, to capture a breath of enlightenment, always, however, dreading the sudden approach of the Gestapo garroters.

Trained members of the NBC International Division point out that the bootleg listeners in Germany are willing to risk imprisonment in the torture camps, the concentration hell-holes of Dachau, Sachsenhausen or Buchenwald in order to learn what is happening outside their own fetid world.

Said one NBC official: "We know our programs are getting through. Propaganda Minister Paul Joseph Goebbels would not now be promulgating sterner measures for illegal listening if our democratic radio were not reaching more and more people in Nazi-dominated countries."

Another staff member of the NBC German division declared that the people of Germany want news and facts. "We must satisfy their eagerness for this news, and we must, by the quality of our information and the attractive manner of our presentation of the news, recompense the many efforts the German people make and the many risks they take to hear us," he said.

Still another voice in the foreign division spoke up: "A single mistake can be exploited against us so far as to ruin completely all the rest. If, by making a single error, we give Goebbels the opportunity to prove that we are wrong or misled in only one question, all our news and declarations can be doubted."

"We're piercing the armor of the German people with 'spiritual ammunition,'" said another spokesman in the International Division. "We're doing it with the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth!"

## Hongkong Internment Camps

Those who have friends or relatives interned in prison camps in Hongkong may receive some consolation from learning that the reported horrible conditions in these places may have been somewhat exaggerated. Ac-

According to Tokyo Radio, Mr. Eagle, a representative of the International Red Cross now in Hongkong for the purpose of establishing a Red Cross office there, is purported to have said in an interview with the Domei News Agency that he was agreeably surprised at the conditions he found in the internment camps in Hongkong. He said that they were quite different from what had been rumored. He stated he had visited three prisons and had not only found living-conditions to be satisfactory but had found them to be the best conducted of any camps he had visited in greater east Asia.

## "We Want to Fight"

According to Martin Agronsky speaking from Australia, the morale of our doughboys in Australia is excellent. He related that the other day he visited an American military camp to get, among other things, a real old-fashioned American hamburger. He not only got four juicy hamburgers, each with a big, thick slice of onion, but a chance to talk over the table with two American boys from midwestern states. Their only complaint was a lack of excitement. They were in the ordnance department and spent most of the day wrestling guns and other equipment from one location to another. "The trouble with Australia," said a boy from Sheboygan, Wisconsin, "is

that it is too much like home once you get used to their accent. We haven't found all of this romance of foreign service. Believe it or not, we had to go to a zoo to see a kangaroo. There is just one thing most of us want to do and that is get back home as quickly as possible, but since that is impossible at this time we want to start killing Japs as soon as possible. We want to fight." "No," concluded Martin Agronsky, "there is nothing wrong with the spirit of this man's army."

## From Us to England

"New York Calling London" is a frank, invigorating discussion of America's war effort, presented especially for listeners in Britain by Maurice English, who is being described there as "the American J. B. Priestley." This feature, designed to offer a friendly and candid discussion of the gigantic common war efforts of the two great democratic powers rather than to disseminate news or "propaganda," is broadcast thrice weekly, Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays at 1:45 p.m. EWT over NBC stations WRCA (15.15), WBOS (15.21) and WNBI (17.78).

Compliments on the programs have been received from England's man in the street as well as from Prime Minister Churchill.

## Ecuador Station Joins Fight for Freedom

Ten thousand feet high in the snow-capped Andes Mountains of Ecuador nestles the picturesque city of Quito, site of short-wave station HCJB, probably the best-known broadcaster in South America. A powerful 10,000-watt transmitter, a unique antenna system and an excellent location all combine to give this station such powerful signals that it can be heard with great clarity throughout North America. Owned by American missionaries, the programs of HCJB are in the main of a semireligious nature. They are, however, so simple and inspirational that they should delight any listener, regardless of his or her religious creed. In addition to the daily devotional programs, such as "Morning in the Mountains" at 8:00 a.m., "Ecuadorian Echoes" at 6:00 p.m. and the "Friendship Hour" at 9:00 p.m. EWT, HCJB also broadcasts interesting travelogues, educational programs and excellent concerts of symphonic and native Ecuadorean music. Realizing that the fight for freedom is not limited by race, creed or nation, HCJB has also kept step with the spirit of the times by adding programs of such timely importance as "Service Night" which, broadcast on Tuesdays at 10:00 p.m. EWT, is devoted to special music, talks and features for soldiers of the United Nations in all parts of the world. On Sundays at 1:45 p.m. EWT a forty-five-minute devotional and musical program is radiated for listeners in Great Britain, while at 2:30 p.m. on the same day a special program is broadcast for English listeners in Sweden. HCJB operates simultaneously on 12,455 and a new frequency of 9.96 megs.

## News About the Stations

Melbourne has been conducting more tests in an endeavor to find a suitable hour and frequency for evening reception in the eastern states. The latest tests were broadcast over VLG9 (11.90) between the hours of 6:30 and 8:00 p.m. EWT . . . VLW6 (9.68), Perth, West Australia, broadcasts a detailed English news bulletin from 8:00 to 8:30 a.m. EWT, which includes Australian and New Zealand news as well as world news . . . American prisoners of war from the Philippines may be heard sending messages home occasionally at 2:20 a.m. EWT over Tokyo stations JZJ (11.80) and JZK (15.16). Other nights at the same hour American prisoners may be heard giving impromptu concerts . . . JIE3 (9.69), Taihoku, Taiwan, broadcasts the news in English at 8:30 a.m. EWT . . . Radio Saigon (11.775), Saigon, French Indo-China, broadcasts three English news periods daily: 7:30, 11:00 and 11:45 a.m. EWT.

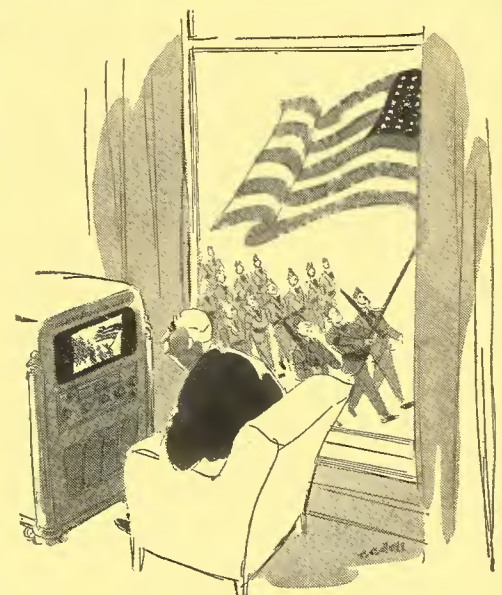

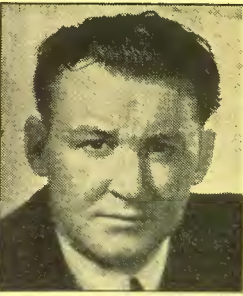

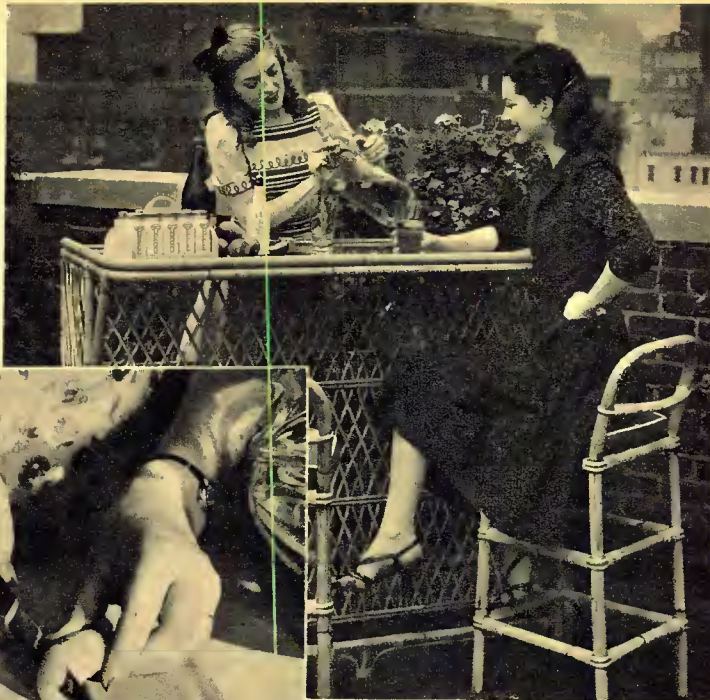

## C-O-O-L off With a C-O-O-L Drink

**B**ARFLIES ain't what they used to be—not now when a foot poised on brass points the way to milk, pop, fruit- and vegetable-juice bars. The liquid stuff they pour out of "bars" nowadays goes straight to your tummy—not your head. And bartenders are doling out a new kind of stimulating spirits—vitamins and minerals. America's "on the wagon"—imbibing bromides of nourishment and health.

Warm weather and that down-in-the-doldrums feeling you've been totting around belong to the cause-and-effect family. For excessive perspiration, spurred on by the hot summer season, results in a potent loss of vitamin C, and we experience an equal loss of energy. Citrus fruits, suppliers of said vitamin, are a "must" in your summer diet for this very reason. Lemons, in particular, are an excellent way to take nourishment along with health. And lemonade is a perfect suggestion for play or work lunch-box thermos. Vary it with the luscious all-day, all-meal beverage—

### Lemon Shake

Use the juice and grated peel of one-half lemon for each glass prepared. Add two tablespoons sugar syrup, one-half cup water, dash of angostura bitters, one-fourth cup crushed ice and one egg white, well beaten. Mix thoroughly in shaker. Pour into glass.

I've added the angostura ingredient so that your lemon drink takes on a healthy glow. Besides pointing up taste, angostura gives your wishy-washy beverages a color transfusion. If you're conserving your supply of sugar you'll be interested in knowing that syrup goes much further in drink

preparations and promises a smoother, better-mixed concoction to boot. Prepare your own supply of the sweet stuff and keep it in the cupboard for quick mixing. Fill a soda-bottle with sugar to the three-quarter level. Add a few pinches of salt to sharpen flavor. Top the grains with water and shake vigorously until the mixture is completely diluted.

With coffee supplies cut and grocers rationing on their own, a tall glass of iced coffee takes the glamour edge off "bubble in my nose" champagne. And now that it's precious stuff you'd do well to treat it with luxury respect. For patriotic reasons, as well as good home economics' sense, never buy more than a week's supply at a time. And be sure your grocer is giving you freshly ground and roasted coffee. Quality of aroma and flavor, in addition to blend, determines the ultimate goodness or "badness" of coffee. Roast and grind it yourself if you must, or market in stores that have a rapid coffee turnover. Dated containers should mark the day roasted, not delivered, so note labels carefully. Deterioration sets in immediately after roasting, regardless of packaging. "Dripped" coffee produces a better brew than other ways and means, and be careful not to let the coffee boil. Brush-scrub your coffee pot, use freshly drawn water, and follow measurements accurately. A heaping teaspoon to a cup of water is standard. And for guests' and coffee's sake, serve immediately!

Add some cloves and sticks of cinnamon to your iced coffee before serving. These spices are still available in abundance and they put zip into every sip. And if the vegetable-juice devotees in your family like theirs

zingy, a spiced tomato juice will prove torridly he-man.

### Spiced Tomato Juice

2 cups tomato juice  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp. salt  
 $\frac{1}{8}$  tsp. cayenne  
 $\frac{1}{8}$  tsp. cinnamon  
 $\frac{1}{8}$  tsp. ground cloves  
 $\frac{1}{8}$  tsp. onion, chopped fine  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  tbs. lemon juice

Add the salt, pepper, cinnamon, cloves and onion to the tomato juice. Allow to stand a few hours. Strain and chill. Add lemon juice and serve.

Encourage your youngsters to bring the gang home after ye olde swimming-hole or their expedition to the movies. Porch-swinging is as traditionally American as apple pie and it's up to you to keep it swinging. When the jitterbugs and jivers swoop home, greet them with c-o-o-l drinks. Single- or double-strawed chocolate milk shake is a teen-age favorite.

### Chocolate Mint Shake

6 tbs. prepared chocolate syrup  
 $\frac{3}{4}$  cup milk  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  tsp. peppermint extract  
 chopped ice  
 unsweetened whipped cream  
 cinnamon

Make individual servings. Combine the chocolate syrup, milk and peppermint extract and chopped ice. Shake well and pour into glasses. Top with unsweetened whipped cream, adding just a dusting of cinnamon over the cream.

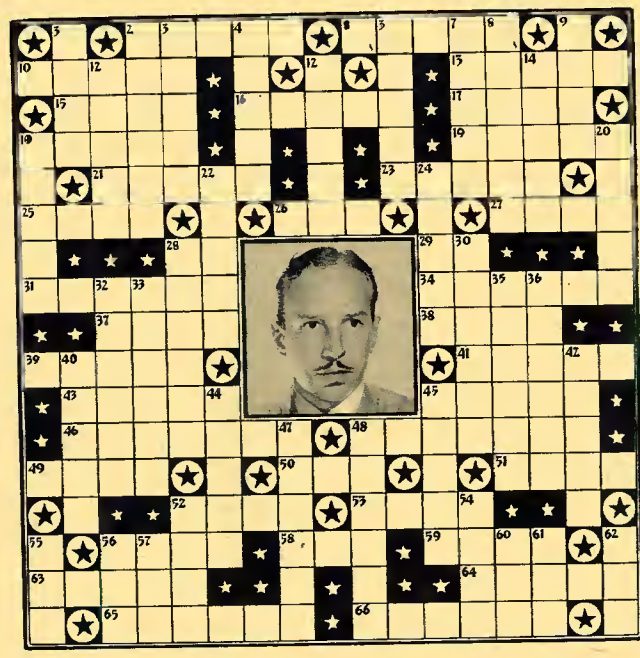
