Bob Hope's Assignment in Alaska
How Movies Can Best Aid the War Effort

RADIO—Right Arm of the U. S. Signal Corps

THIS is a radio war! On radio depends largely our coordination and synchronization of land, sea and air forces that will bring to America and her allies ultimate victory. To quote Major General Dawson Olmstead, chief signal officer of the Army, "At one time military communications meant carrier pigeons and wigwag with flags. But the electrons have pushed the pigeons and flags back so far that we don't talk much about them any more."

Certainly the importance of Signal Corps communication by radio cannot be overestimated for speed and efficiency. Plans, decisions and orders issued never win a battle unless those orders, based on enemy information, are finally executed on the battlefield. Signal Corps communication by radio does the job! Messages by wire, to be sure, play a vital part in modern warfare. For example: 12,000 telephone calls go into the building of one bomber. But the radio takes it up from there, does that which wires can't do—maneuver planes, tanks and ships. According to General Olmstead, "An airplane without a radio has been called a dead pigeon. A tank with defective communications, a blind horse. The man responsible for the condition of the radio which makes it possible for a bomber to reach Berlin is contributing as much to winning the war as the bombardier who drops the bombs."

"Modern mechanisms of communication de-

mand an unusual type of young American manhood. For this is a war of vacuum tubes, electrons, resistors and condensers, and a lot of other technical devices, unknown when I entered the Signal Corps."

To mention how many radio sets are now in operation in the U. S. Signal Corps is impossible, for it is a military secret, zealously guarded; but it can be revealed that for every hundred soldiers in that service there must be fifty civilians, trained in accredited technical schools, to keep them operating efficiently. To meet that need, pre-service training-courses are conducted in high schools, colleges, preparing students for jobs in installation, maintenance and operation of radio equipment. More than 250 vocational schools and colleges are conducting Signal Corps courses for an estimated number of twenty thousand trainees. In addition, many civilian schools are operated by the Corps on its own premises. Here especially the trainee learns by doing under the guidance of skilled radio mechanics.

To our way of thinking, this training is double-barreled in its results, for it not only serves to strengthen America's right arm in the present global war but forms the foundation for a future when the power of radio will play a vital part in rebuilding for peace-time living a war-torn world!

Motion Picture Producers, Directors, Writers and Actors Discussed the Subject on "The American Forum of the Air"

IN A recent broadcast of "The American Forum of the Air," the subject discussed was, "How Movies Can Best Aid the War Effort." As a secondary topic, the question, "How Indispensable Is an Actor?" was posed. To get the best-informed talent available for his discussion panel, Ted Granik, orig-

inator of the thirteen-year-old program, broadcast from the West Coast for the second time since the inception of the series. When he queried top star Rosalind Russell and Walt Disney, producer extraordinary, both agreed that some movie stars are the world's best recruiting officers, and are, there-

fore, invaluable on the job. But when Miss Russell suggested that movie shorts were the best medium of civilian instruction via the screen, Mr. Disney retorted, "Why make me do all the work?" However, that query to the contrary notwithstanding, the U. S. and Canadian governments ap-

parently agree with Miss Russell. For all Disney's characters, from Donald Duck to the Big Bad Wolf, have gone to war. In addition, a host of productions on technical subjects have been officially assigned to Disney's studio "on a basis of special equipment nowhere else available."

America's Ace Comedian Tours Northern War Zone to Bring Merriment to Fighting Men at the Front; Bob Hope's Trip With Frances Langford and Jerry Colonna Reaches Post Within Hundred Miles of Jap Positions

BOB HOPE went looking for trouble this summer. With Frances Langford and Jerry Colonna, he traveled the front-line defenses of America in Alaska and the Aleutian Islands. How much he saw and what posts he visited are military secrets, but the trio's trip carried them within a hundred miles of Jap positions.

Bob had long planned to make a personal-appearance tour of our northern Army camps. He had been set to go once, only to have his permits canceled suddenly by military authorities, for reasons the Army refuses to state. Perhaps action was flaring or great troop movements were under way.

Finally, as Bob completed the filming of Samuel Goldwyn's "They Got Me Covered," with Dorothy Lamour, word came that he could go north. An Army sergeant reported to the Goldwyn studio to finger-print and photograph Bob for his permit.

It was an exciting, busy trip for Hope, Jerry and Frances. They put on shows in thirty-five camps in fourteen days. They played to thousands of soldiers—how many thousands being a military secret. From early dawn to late at night they were on the go, either performing or traveling.

The Alaska trip was Bob's greatest adventure in camp entertaining, but not his first. He's been up to his neck in all types of war activities for many months. He has toured camps far and wide. He has turned his golf feud with Bing Crosby into a gold mine for military relief funds.

Bob Hope probably won't lose touch with the Army and Navy until victory is won. His Tuesday night broadcasts this fall will come from military establishments. The benefit golf matches with Bing continue, and a date has been made for Bob to broadcast from the new Hollywood Canteen.

Our fighting men love Bob's shows and appreciate his efforts in their behalf. But Bob doesn't think he's doing them a favor. He feels that it's an honor to appear before the men who have the world's toughest job.



I WAS away from the United States for six days. Five of them I spent in the British Isles. Twice within six days I slept my way across the Atlantic.

As Sir Archibald Sinclair observed in a statement he issued on my arrival in England, the speed of my journey symbolized the speed with which U. S. armament can reach Britain. He recalled that it is only one hop from the

American factory which builds the bomber to the British airfield from which it goes into service, and that it is another and shorter hop to the German target on which it will rain its bombs.

My attention has been called to a statement made by Viscount Trenchard which I should like to pin above the desk of every ground-minded general: Any nation that neglects its air-power and declines to move with the times and free itself from the trammels of

military or naval tradition, does so at its own peril.

Air-power also means air-transport. Everything I learned during this week's brief but intensive contact abroad with the war confirms this fact. Every flying officer I met, British, American and Canadian, is crying for more and better air-transport. One of Britain's most progressive military minds sums it up in these words: "All divisions with their artillery, mortars,



That's why I want to tie 'em up now. I've got to get into the bank here to deposit this poke o' gold dust before it closes."

The upshot of the whole thing was that I stepped forward an' offered to watch the burros for the old prospec-



tor. I knew he'd be too stubborn to give in to the policeman, an' there was no sense in his gettin' into trouble. It turned out I'd heard about the old feller before—out in the desert. He was Bill

Anderson—Uncle Billy.

"I knowed our trails'd cross some day," I said, shaking his hand. "I've heard Johnny Mills an' Shorty Harris, an' all them old-timers speak o' you—"

"Say," he said, "we'll have a drink together, Old Ranger. I'll go deposit this gold in the bank, an' then we'll find some place where we can set down an' talk . . ."

Well, sir, that's just what we did. It was a warm day an' the beer hit the spot. "Gosh," I said, "that was good."

"Yeah," Uncle Billy agreed. "I was dry, too."

"How about the burros?" I asked. Uncle Billy had hitched 'em to a lamp-post outside.

"Oh," he said, "they don't drink beer."

"I mean . . . what about 'em? Reckon you'd better go out an' take a look at 'em?"

"They're all right," Uncle Billy said easily. "I tied 'em good an' secure." He turned to the bartender. "Two more beers, barkeep. Mebbe we should've invited that officer in to drink with us, but he struck me as bein' pretty onsociable." Uncle Billy took another sip of beer. "Not as ornery as the other cuss, though." He set his glass down an' looked at me. "You know," he said, "this is the second time I've been told that me an' my burros wa'n't welcome. The other time was up back o' San Bernardino,

soakin' your feet. Couldn't be a nicer campin' spot. So I made it a habit, every time I went through, to stop off there an' rest for a while. Other prospectors done the same thing. The first owner o' the ranch didn't object. He wasn't usin' that corner o' the property anyhow. 
The burros patiently moved forward toward the fence and the teamster pushed his hat back and scratched his head. "You're goin' to take 'em through thar?" he asked.

CBS PLANS HEAVY CONCERT AND RECITAL SCHEDULE FOR THIS SEASON

Rodzinski to Direct Cleveland Orchestra in New Series; New York Philharmonic Returns Oct. 25; Wanda Landowska's Recitals to Begin Nov. 2

WHAT promises to be one of radio's most important—in the true sense of the word—series of music programs this coming season is that beginning over CBS on November 2, featuring Wanda Landowska, brilliant exponent of the harpsichord. Mme. Landowska has no peer in her field, let alone a superior, a distinction she has earned through her immense understanding of the instrument, the sheer magnificence of her playing and her encyclopedic knowledge of music.

We have heard so often the phrase "world's greatest" that it has not only lost all glamour but also all meaning, so much so that one hesitates to use it now, unless, of course, one is a circus barker. But its true essence does seem to belong to the playing of this artist, in which case the phrase surely shakes off its sawdust to hobnob once more with the elite of descriptive precision.

Mme. Landowska, a native of Warsaw, studied at the Warsaw Conservatory as well as with Michalowski, Moszkowski and Urban. She made her debut at the tender age of eleven in that city. From 1900 to 1913 she taught piano at the Schola Cantorum in Paris, and the harpsichord at the Berlin Hochschule from 1913 to 1919. Later she founded her own school at St. Leu-La-Foret, France, a place that eventually became a veritable mecca for the great in all walks of life.

Mme. Landowska's particular reverence of old music is miraculously explained in a book of hers, "La Musique Ancienne," published in 1925. In discussing the volume, Ernest Newman, noted musicologist and critic, who was then music critic of the *New York Evening Post*, found this to say:

"Mme. Landowska has spent a good deal of her life fighting the grotesque ideas that are current with regard to the harpsichord and other keyboard instruments of the past. She exposes, with delicate malice, the blunders of many of the editors and authors who have undertaken to instruct the modern world in these matters . . .

"Most people have only the vaguest idea of the differences in structure, in tone and in resource between the clavichord and the harpsichord, and between the latter and the pianoforte. The delusion is widespread that the early forte-piano, as it was called, ousted the harpsichord because among other advantages, it had a bigger tone. . . . The harpsichord was beaten by the piano not because it was an inferior instrument but because, in the first place, as Mme. Landowska says,

'the double keyboard began to be superfluous in Haydn's and Mozart's time as music gradually lost its polyphonic character,' and in the second place because of 'the great practical advantages' of the piano—'its less complicated construction, its lower price, its easier and more lasting tuning were in its favor.'"

Certainly to hear the harpsichord played as Mme. Landowska plays it is a voyage of discovery for the uninitiated. Her mastery of the instrument is such that legends have grown up about it, for with what is the most effortless ease she obtains effects that seem almost impossible. This, of course, is the purely mechanical aspect of her playing, because as an artist and interpreter of the classics she is a star of the first magnitude.

More Music in Store

CBS really launches out on a heavy concert and recital schedule this year. First and foremost is the thirteenth consecutive season of Philharmonic-Symphony broadcasts, originating in Carnegie Hall on Sunday afternoons. First of these events takes place on October 25. The Philharmonic-Symphony season actually began on October 7 with its first Sunday concert taking place on October 11. But neither the latter nor that of the following Sunday came under the CBS banner, because Arturo Toscanini, engaged to conduct the Society's first two weeks, is under contractual obligations to NBC, a fact which caused the first two Sunday programs to be wiped off the broadcast books.

Also launching out on a series of

concerts is the Cleveland Orchestra under its regular conductor, Artur Rodzinski. This orchestra performed, as you probably remember, in place of the Philharmonic-Symphony on October 11, will be heard again on October 18. But the series arranged for the Clevelanders begins on October 24, for a string of Saturday afternoon events. The orchestra is celebrating its twenty-fifth anniversary.

Then, of course, the Eastman School Symphony and the Eastman Rochester Symphony begin their radio year on October 30, with alternating Fridays assigned to the groups.

Forecasts

Among the rather unusual bits of information this reporter has come across in the past couple of days are two items of special import. The first deals with the George Gershwin "Rhapsody in Blue," which, one hears, is set for a performance by Arturo Toscanini and the NBC Symphony some time this season, with Oscar Levant to play the solo part. The second has to do with a new composition of Morton Gould's, young composer-conductor-pianist, who holds forth regularly for the MBS chain. Mr. Gould's publisher received a communication addressed to the composer. The letter read something like this: "Dear Maestro Gould, I should like to perform your new work, if that is agreeable to you." The signature was "Arturo Toscanini."

Concert Records

One of the great voices of our time, the sumptuous voice of Bruna Castagna, is heard on Columbia record 71058-D in "Ces Lettres," from Massenet's "Werther" and "Amour, Viens Aider," from Saint-Saens' "Samson et Delilah." She is accompanied by Alfredo Antonini and the Columbia Opera Orchestra.

Mme. Castagna sings in that luscious, vocally opulent way of hers. Naturally, both arias come in for a fine accounting, thanks also to the intelligent orchestra accompaniment provided.

Another worthy Columbia release is the Bartlett and Robertson performance of the waltz from Arensky's Suite No. 1 and the scherzo from the Mendelssohn "A Midsummer Night's Dream." The delicately attuned temperaments of these two artists—a situation carried over into their technique and piano styles—in general does wonders for the pieces they play on Columbia record 71398-D. The light and lilting treatment of the waltz and the fluffy delicacy of the scherzo are beautiful examples of their art.

Jerry Wald won't play songs that he doesn't like

CONTRARY to a hard and fast rule in the manufacture of dance-band maestros, Jerry Wald served no apprenticeship as a bandman at all; he started right in with the baton. He was an adept clarinetist at seven. Three years later we find him playing solos

and sitting in with orchestras on radio programs over WOR in Newark, his native city. A few years later he took the leader's position in the Weequahic High School Band, showing an early predilection for the conductor's wand.

Some time ago a friend, interested almost as much as Wald in the latter's ideas, notified the leader that he had heard a unit at the City College of Los Angeles which might be just the thing for a young batonist starting out.

These things don't happen in the movies—they're too fantastic, but they do happen in real life. Wald took the friend's advice and went on to the Coast. His powers of persuasion proved irresistible to the Los Angeles musicians, so in a few weeks Wald took over, conductorially speaking.

There were the usual rehearsals, experimental stages, and so on, in the development of the ensemble. And, as luck would have it, the college had a rehearsal hall, completely equipped with amplifying system, loudspeakers and all the other paraphernalia so dear to a budding dance organization's collective heart.

The next step was to get engagements, minor ones at first. And they came on to New York. The band opened at the Brooklyn Rosemont Ballroom. A few nights later fire broke out in the rather gaudily sumptuous place, and that was the conclusion of Greater New York stand No. 1.

However, the gods smiled on the boys, for after a few months of floundering around with pay they were offered an engagement at the Roseland Ballroom in New York proper, and the talk about the band was all to the favorable. Radio spots came along, more talk and also favorable. Signing for a few weeks' appearance at the Hotel Lincoln in New York, the Wald outfit remained there long enough to break all attendance records and to set a new one with respect to length of stay there.

One thing about Wald that a lot of song-pluggers detest is his insistence on playing only pieces he likes. He says, "If I don't like a song, it doesn't go in the books." That may or may not be a short road to success, but it has its points.

FRAZIER HUNT and Upton Close are top-notch commentators—and that is just about the only thing they have in common. It has been my pleasure in the last month to meet these two men for the first time. Some comparisons are interesting, but they must be understood as comparisons based on first impressions, not long study.

Personal Impressions

First, Frazier Hunt: Husky, raw-boned, well over six feet . . . He looks as Scotch as his ancestry, and his temperament is as midwestern as his home state . . . Yet he has a cosmopolitan poise—not smoothness, but a hearty, self-confident roughness and warmth. He's one of the few commentators who could enjoy the nickname "Spike" or the description "corn-fed mystic."

Upton Close is sharp-faced, keen-eyed, restless. His mind seems to race as he talks, seems to tackle every problem with gusto. He's easy to interview, talking well, with just a touch of ingratiation. The surface impression you get is that here is the more brilliant mind of these two but the less cautious.

Each of these men talked, at my urging, of his life and work. Here are excerpts from their stories that will give you a general background.

Roving Correspondent

Frazier Hunt: "My people crossed the mountains into the Midwest one

hundred and fifty years ago. We Hunts have no memories of lands across the seas and no loyalties abroad . . . I was born in Rock Island, Illinois, fifty-seven years ago. My mother died and we moved to a cattle ranch in Arkansas. A series of moves carried us to Indiana, where I spent my school-days. Those were fine, rich years, the last of the horse-and-buggy era . . . I went to the University of Illinois. I started work in Chicago with the City News Bureau in 1906, made my first trip to Europe the following year . . .

"I've traveled a great deal since then, but I've never gotten the prairie mud off my heels. In 1909 I went to a sugar plantation in Mexico. I married my college sweetheart and took her there, but we were run out by bandits. We came back to Illinois to run a country newspaper in Alexis.

First and Worst

"By 1913 I had begun to sell articles to New York magazines and fiction to *Collier's*. I decided I could set the world afire, so I sold the paper and moved to New York to write. I was a total flop. I went back to newspapers and worked on the old New York *Sun*. I covered Army camps and wrote the first—and probably the worst—of the books on Army life . . ."

From that point Hunt's story is history. He told how he went to Europe in 1918, joined the staff of the Chicago *Tribune*, went to Archangel, where he wrote the articles that led to the removal of American troops from this ill-advised expedition against Russia. Against orders and despite warnings that the Bolsheviks would kill him, Hunt entered Soviet Russia. Instead of death he found a ready welcome, and performed the almost impossible feat of securing an interview with Lenin. His reputation established, Hunt became a roving correspondent, traveling widely, writing constantly. In time he came to radio and presented to listeners a long series of interviews with famous people. More recently he has become a commentator roaming America to study at first-hand the work of our people at war.

Rowboat to China

Josef Washington Hall, whom you know as Upton Close, was born on a ranch in Washington state in 1894. He was raised beside the Columbia River and was, even as a child, much impressed by the manners and philosophy of the many Chinese workers in the district.

"I had a rowboat," Close told me. "People would point out to the sea and say China was that way. I planned to row over there some day. Instead, my first move was east, to George Washington University in Washington,

D. C. When I was only twenty-two I was offered the job of editing a missionary magazine in China and I took the job. When I got there the elders in charge were shocked at my youth and told me that I should learn about China first. So they sent me out as their bill collector.

Inside China

"I traveled Chinese style, wore Chinese clothes, lived in Chinese inns. In three months I learned the language—and I learned about China from the inside. Then the first World War came along and our 'allies,' the Japs, stole Shantung province under the excuse of attacking a German treaty port. We had no intelligence service there, so the State Department organized one. I was put in charge, training young Chinese students and gathering their reports. I always signed my reports 'Up Close.' A newspaper opposed to the administration of Wilson published my secret reports as the observations of 'Upton Close.' That's how I got my pen-name.

"I secured a list of heroin and morphin houses operated by the Jap army in Shantung to undermine the upper-class Chinese. This list was used by the State Department in the peace conference. The Japs were furious. The commander of the Jap forces in Shantung called me in one day and offered me five thousand yen to find Up Close for him. I agreed but pointed out that I needed a pass to travel in my search. The general gave me this pass, which made my work as Up Close a great deal easier."

Revolution

Later Close became an adviser of Wu Pie Fu, who led the students' revolution in north China. As a colonel of horse he saw action. He also led an expedition to the scene of the Kansu earthquake, and wrote his famous article, "When the Mountains Walked," for the *National Geographic*. Typhoid struck in 1922, and Close returned to America in broken health. Political enemies confiscated his Chinese property and he landed in the United States penniless. But the *Geographic* article won him a bonus, and lectures kept him going. He turned to education for a few years, reorganizing the oriental department of the University of Washington. Tired of campus politics, he became a traveling journalist and writer, analyzing the situation in the Orient through countless articles and many books.

For a time the Japs liked him because he opposed the Oriental Exclusion Act, which he still feels was a major blunder. But in 1934 he published "The Challenge Behind the Face of Japan," which exposed the plans of the Japanese to attack Amer-

ica. The Japs promptly deported him from Manchuria.

Close was about to return to the Orient in December, 1941: The day before his plane was to leave, Pearl Harbor was bombed. So Close has remained here, carrying on with his writing and radio comments.


Some Final Words

I asked both Hunt and Close to give me some sort of summing up of the present situation as they see it. Here are their answers:

Hunt: "I am passionate about the need for a humane world. We must fight this war to its bloody conclusion, but with our American goal of a humane world always in view. This dream can come true, but it must come true in America first . . . If we can win this, then our sons will not have died in vain."

Close: "No nation has ever attained its objectives as readily as has Japan in this war. She will gain more than she bargained for—India, Australia, Siberia—if she can hold on to what she already has won. If she can hold what she has for two more years, she can never be dislodged . . . We must deal with Japan within two years, and we can only do this along the northern great circle route into the heart of Japan."

BBC'S WAR-TIME AUDIENCE ESTIMATED TO BE 200,000,000 LISTENERS

AEF in Britain Hears World Series; Agronsky and St. John Return to U. S.; Priestley Discontinues Broadcasts to Give Listeners a Change

"This Is London Calling"

IN LESS than three years the BBC has grown from a domestic concern into a vast international instrument. It is the world's largest word-factory. In addition to English, Welsh and Gaelic, the BBC broadcasts in forty-three languages, including such languages as Albanian, Bulgarian, Bengali, Chinese, Finnish, Gujerati, Hindustani, Slovak, Tamil and Thai. The total number of broadcasting hours in English in all services of the BBC for overseas reception are twenty-three hours and forty-five minutes. In addition, the BBC broadcasts foreign-language transmissions for a total of thirty-nine hours and twenty-seven minutes daily. Twenty-two English news bulletins are broadcast daily, including twelve in the Empire and North American Services; four in the European Service, and six in the Home Service. One hundred and seven news bulletins in languages other than English are broadcast daily by the BBC. Total listeners to the war-time BBC are estimated at over two hundred million.

Britain Broadcasts World Series

As host to thousands of baseball-hungry soldiers far from home, Britain took the unprecedented step of canceling peak-hour programs on its domestic network in order that special daily broadcasts from the United States covering the World Series might be available. These radio close-ups of the World Series, including resumes and play-by-play accounts of the games in their final stages, were carried directly to London on beamed commercial short-wave circuits and heard each day of play beginning at 5:15 p.m. EWT (10:15 p.m. London Time). The decision to describe the World Series within a few minutes of the close of each game follows a policy emphasized by Sir Cecil Graves, joint director general of the BBC, during a recent visit to the United States, of "giving American listeners—and particularly those in uniform—what they want to hear while on British soil." It is needless to say with what enthusiasm these broadcasts were greeted in Britain by our lads in khaki.

Shorts from the Short Waves

Signs bearing the single letters, "T. N. T.," may be seen in almost every factory in Britain. The letters mean "Today Not Tomorrow" . . . The parliamentary secretary to the Min-

istry of Supply told the following story over the London short-wave station. A meat dealer in Hull, England, having been bombed out, moved his meat market across the street and put up the following sign, "Over Here from Over There." A few weeks later the new shop was bombed and he moved back to his old location, putting up this sign, "Over Here Again." Again German bombs singled his building out. He moved across the street for the second time, opening with this sign, "Over Here from Over There Again" . . . In a recent radio speech Nazi official Ribbentrop said the Germans are counting each bomb the R. A. F. drops on Germany so that the Luftwaffe can drop the same number on Churchill . . . According to clandestine station "The Voice of Free India," no matter how many ships are built in the United States, the German naval command will see to it that many more are sunk than can possibly be built.

Personalities of Short Wave

J. B. Priestley, one of the best known and well liked of the regular speakers over the London short-wave station, is now off the air. He felt it was time the listeners had a change . . . Two of NBC's famous short-wave reporters are home. Robert St. John

has just returned from London minus thirty pounds, which he lost laboring in a British war factory by day and broadcasting and writing by night. England fears the approaching long winter nights will bring renewed German blitz raids far more terrible than anything the British have yet endured, he said. There are reports that the Nazis have developed a stratosphere bomber that drops its deadly cargoes from heights far beyond the effectiveness of British detection and anti-aircraft equipment. During the thirteen weeks he is home resting his place in London is being taken by Alex Dreier. Martin Agronsky got in from Australia the other day. He has been in the thick of things for a long time. He broadcast in Singapore until the fall of the city was imminent. The Japs got there a week after he left on an ack-ack sloop, the *Yarra*, guarding a convoy to Java. Despite two days and nights of Jap bombing of the convoy, his ship got through. He arrived in Bali the day before it fell to the Japs. He got permission to fly to Australia in a Dutch plane with Dutch soldiers being evacuated from Java. On the way they made one landing on a tiny island and found the airport covered with holes and unexploded bombs. Departing presented a choice between facing the Japs in daylight or attempting a night take-off without field lights. They voted for the night flight. At 3 a.m. they recruited a group of natives, placed a man with a candle in each bomb-crater and threaded their way off the field for an uneventful flight to Australia. For some months Agronsky has been bringing us the latest news from the Australian front. Now he is in the United States for a short rest before going to an undisclosed post.

According to Charles Leboeuf of Webster, Mass., what appears to be a clandestine Yugoslav station is being heard on approximately 11.10 megs from 2:45 to 3:00 p.m. EWT . . . "Radio Center Moscow" is being heard on a frequency of 11.83 megs, in English, from 6:48 to 7:25 p.m. EWT . . . London's Pacific transmission now starts at 2:10 a.m. EWT . . . Daily at 2:30 p.m. EWT, Berlin broadcasts a program entitled "On the Spot," which consists of an actuality "eye-witness account" of some event of the day. Reception is best over DXZ (9.57) . . . Vichy (11.845) broadcasts to North America from 4:00 to 4:45 p.m., with an English talk at 4:30 p.m. EWT . . . DHE4A (11.84), Prague, Bohemia, is now coming on the air daily at 5:00 p.m. EWT, according to John Wilson of Wilmington, Del. . . August Balbi of Los Angeles reports hearing the news in German over DXX (6.14) at 1:00 a.m. EWT.





choose the type of service most appropriate for your party. There are three ways you can carry out your buffet supper. You may use the informal style, semi-formal, or the strictly formal.

The informal service is, of course, the favorite of many, for it requires no waitresses or maid service. Your guests simply help themselves to all the food. If you use this service, set your table for one course at a time. Arrange the food in its proper sequence so your guests will not become confused as they pass around the table. Make sure the silver, beverage and napkins are the last thing your guest must pick up. When second helpings are desired, you, as the hostess, may pass the serving-dishes or let the guests once again help themselves.

But for a wee touch of dignity, use the semi-formal service. You may choose two of your nicest friends to sit at each end of the table and serve the main course, as well as dessert and beverage. In this type of service, your guests help themselves only to the relishes, breads, napkins and silver.

However, if these two methods seem inconvenient for your large group of guests, go in for the strictly formal service. The main dishes will still be served by your friends at each end of the table, but maids should be brought in to carry the plates to your guests. This speeds up the service, for there is no confusion. Rolls, relishes, coffee, etc., are also passed to your guests by maids, and dishes are removed in the same manner.

So you see, it's really no trouble at all! Buffet suppers can be the perfect way to entertain your neglected friends. Don't postpone your party any longer. Make up your list—and go to the telephone! It's a sure way to establish your reputation as a popular hostess.

suspect some of them of being pro-German. The suspicion may be unfair but it is natural. There are all kinds of stories current in North Ireland about spies and German agents. Most of them are probably not true, but there must be enough truth to give the British authorities serious concern.

Several things I observed in Britain make me wonder whether the war has really brought a social revolution in the British Isles. Things are changing, of course. The dislocations of a great war are apt to accentuate social change and this war will accentuate such changes, but fundamentally the British are conservative. They change very slowly.

FOR a long time, the British themselves have laughed at some aspects of their class distinctions. In spite of what every good Britisher knows, that a man is a man for all that, the British still respect a title. It is a tradition and an instinct. The big industrialist does not feel that he has reached the climax of his career until he becomes Sir Arthur or Sir George. I wish we had something besides military medals and honorary college degrees with which

to link big businessmen to national service.

Government and business get on better under Churchill than under Roosevelt. I am not assessing blame or credit. I am stating a fact that is important to our war effort. But if business and government get on better in Britain than in America, workers and managers get on better in America than in Britain. The British workers seem much more class conscious than the American. Not once did the British managers and directors who showed me through their war plants exchange a friendly personal greeting with one of their workers. The men scarcely looked up as we passed. I was told afterwards that a man who is friendly with the boss becomes a suspect in his union. This would explain the absence of those familiar first-name greetings between manager and worker which are so commonplace in our own factories.

In a free country like Britain, it is not difficult to sense currents of opinion, even in war-time. The British speak their minds more freely to Americans than they did in time of peace. This is a good sign. It means that we have become better friends, who can afford to be more frank with one another. What pleases me most, as an American, is that the conservative Britisher, who liked us well enough but who was perhaps a little more con-

scious of our faults than of our virtues, takes us much more seriously now.

America's proposals and ideas about the war get much more serious consideration in Britain than was the case in the last war. The close personal relationship between Prime Minister Churchill and President Roosevelt has made an enormous difference. There was never anything like that in the last war. President Wilson had no direct contact with the leaders of Britain, and as the war continued he even lost confidence in his own ambassador in London. This time there have been repeated personal contacts between our chiefs of state. There are frequent telephone conversations between them; personal envoys move back and forth across the Atlantic as quickly as they crossed the Channel during the last war.

BUT I felt that this cooperation was only beginning. As I watched and talked with our officers, they still seemed a bit lost, a little disoriented. Most of them after all have never had an overseas trip. So many feel, so many Britishers feel, that we are a little too eager to go ahead on our own. They after all have been in the war for three years. We have been in it for only eight months. It is possible that on some things we should take their advice more than we do.

I find frequent reference in British

papers and magazines to the speeches of Vice President Wallace, Secretary of State Hull and Assistant Secretary of State Welles, in all of which the intervening period between war and peace was discussed. I remember a round-table discussion in London with half a dozen leading British public men, in which I participated, just two days before this war began. At that time, their chief, almost their only concern was the immediate formulation not so much of a war program as of a peace program. But what they are writing now has ostensibly to do with this war and not with the peace. We in America must continue to talk and write about the terms of the peace and the conditions under which the peace is to be brought about, but we cannot expect the much-bombed British, whose every hillside speaks of imminent invasion, to be as keenly interested in the issues of tomorrow. The immediate menace which they face and of which I was so conscious over there calls for all they have and all they are.

Altogether, Britain is still Britain, strong, confident and absolutely sure of victory. Let us be eternally grateful that she is our ally.
