

Alex Dreier knows Berlin from bitter personal experience. He escaped from the Nazi capital the day before Pearl Harbor, after serving long and well, first as the United Press and later as the NBC Berlin correspondent. He left Berlin only after German censors banned him from the air for telling too much of the truth. Dreier is a newcomer to London, having replaced Robert St. John as the NBC reporter there. But, as this article shows, he is a keen observer, quick to grasp the situation and to draw comparisons between the allied and enemy capitals.

WAR-TIME London is as different from war-time Berlin as day is from night. Here one eats food at least one thousand percent better than the stuff they call food in the swankiest Berlin hotel. After three years of war, the ersatz type of meal has yet to put in its appearance here in London. In the Reich's capital, synthetics masquerade as meat and dessert.

The Londoner dresses finer and with better taste than does the Berliner,

whose sense of dress has deteriorated as rapidly as his illusions about victory. Relatively speaking, there are enough good clothes here to satisfy the demand. Relatively speaking, what is available in the capital of the Third Reich is but a degree higher than the clothes worn by the tramps who used to plod along America's highways. That may sound like an exaggeration, but it isn't. Any one of my colleagues present with me in Berlin during the two years

preceding our entrance into the war can vouch for that statement.

Those who are inclined to imbibe here are satisfied with what is available. One so inclined in Berlin remains inclined—unless he prefers beer, (Continued on Page Facing 36)




The reply came the next day, but it looked like Verona was going to play things safe.







# HOWARD BARLOW DIRECTS PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA SUNDAY OVER CBS

Erich Korngold Presents Program of His Own Music Wed., CBS;  
English Swing Authority Reports on Status of Swing in London

FOR the first time in the career of Howard Barlow, the admired CBS conductor will lead the Philharmonic-Symphony Orchestra over a radio broadcast on November 8. His actual first appearance with the organization takes place on the previous Thursday evening, but that is a Carnegie Hall Concert for a house audience.

During his years as leader of the Columbia Broadcasting Symphony and the Columbia Concert orchestras, Mr. Barlow has been enterprising enough to present much unfamiliar music, both old and new. From the looks of his program for November 8, the same holds. For instance, he has included the overture to "Oedipus Tyrannus" by Paine and the Twenty-First Symphony of Miaskovsky, neither of which, of course, is daily-bread music.

However, he has not failed to schedule two pieces that frequently make the symphonic rounds. They are the Brahms Second Piano Concerto and the Polovetsian Dances from Borodin's "Prince Igor."

The Brahms concerto presents some interesting sidelights. In the first place, it took the German composer a good deal of time to complete the work. While he made first sketches for it at Portsach, in southern Austria, on May 6, 1878, he did not put the finishing touches to it until 1881, at Pressbaum, near Vienna.

With his usual slyness, he wrote to the Herzogenbergs, intimate friends of his, "I don't mind telling you that I have written a tiny, tiny piano concerto with a tiny, tiny wisp of a scherzo." And continuing the masquerade, he wrote to another friend, Dr. Theodor Billroth, "I am sending you some small piano pieces."

The Dr. Billroth mentioned once declared to an acquaintance, "It is always a delight to me when Brahms, after paying me a short visit, during which we have talked of different things, takes a roll out of his greatcoat pocket and says casually, 'Look at that and write me what you think of it.'"

The Second Piano Concerto was first performed under the direction of Alexander Erkel in the Redoutensaal of Budapest on November 9, 1881. The "tiny, tiny piano concerto" was enthusiastically received by the audience.

Actually this work, which Brahms clowningly dismissed so lightly, is one of large dimensions. It boasts not only the usual three movements of the classical concerto form but also an ornate scherzo, though the extra section isn't called that.

I have not made it a practise to give a technical analysis of musical com-

positions, nor shall I attempt to do so now, but it may not be amiss to give some description of the music, particularly since some readers have written in to ask for an occasional one. It makes listening more interesting with a plan of the music before them.

The first movement, allegro non troppo, in B-flat major, 4-4, announces the first theme in a sort of dialog for horn, piano and woodwind. A piano cadenza ushers in an orchestral tutti, in which the first and a second subject do quite a bit of interplaying. Brahms-like, the movement's development is lengthy and elaborate.

The second movement, allegro passionato, F major, 3-4, is the section of scherzo quality. Max Kalbeck was firm in the belief that this excerpt had originally been written for the composer's Violin Concerto, but later put aside. At any rate, the first theme is uttered fortissimo by the piano. Then the strings give out a second theme in tranquil mood. Next comes the trio in D major, following which the first part of the movement is repeated with much alteration.

The third movement, andante, B-flat major, 6-4, starts out with a sensuous melody, which is first announced by the cello. Another melody is introduced by the piano and clarinet in F sharp. There is some counterplay of the two tunes, but the first prevails and, finally, dominates the Coda by way of the cello, against a setting of trills and arpeggios for the piano.

The last movement, allegretto grazioso, B-flat major, 2-4, is actually a rondo of big proportions. It is founded on three themes, all of which Brahms utilizes to the nth degree.

## Delicacy Incarnate

Most of us have heard Arturo Toscanini in his readings of the massive works. His amazing technique is no news, therefore. However, some of the lesser masterpieces, certain overtures, for example, and items of like compass, have known no greater interpretation than that accorded them by the distinguished batonist. There is the overture to Wolf-Ferrari's "Secret of Suzanne," a beautiful case in point. Brief though it is, it is a charming and utterly delightful composition. The opera, "The Secret of Suzanne," is what is known as an intermezzo in one act, and it is given in opera houses in conjunction with some other work.

Besides the overture, Mr. Toscanini has devised a program for this NBC broadcast (November 8) that includes the Second Symphony of Kabalensky and the "Reformation" Symphony of Mendelssohn.

## A Return to a First Love

Erich Wolfgang Korngold, noted Austrian composer, who has been writing movie scores for Warner Bros. in Hollywood for the past five years, has taken a sabbatical from his duties there to make some appearances in the East. A child prodigy, this gifted musician wrote his first composition when he was eleven years of age. That this was no fluke was proved by his subsequent successes in his native country and abroad. He wrote scores for ballets, chamber-music pieces, songs, several operas and pieces.

Thanks to him and Max Reinhardt, a revival of Johann Strauss operettas in Berlin whirlwinded its way around the world. Up to that time (the late twenties) the only well-known operettas of the Viennese composer were "The Gypsy Baron" and "The Bat." Messrs. Korngold and Reinhardt set about improving that situation with modernized versions of the unfamiliar ones. They were tremendous hits.

Mr. Korngold is slated to conduct the Columbia concert in a program of his own music on November 11. Besides conducting, he will accompany Eileen Farrell, soprano, and Robert Nicholson, baritone, in several of his songs. Mr. Korngold's best-known composition is the opera "Die tote Stadt," which served to introduce Maria Jeritzka to this country at the Metropolitan. Marietta's song from this work will be sung by Miss Farrell, accompanied by the orchestra. Other pieces programmed include the overture to "Much Ado About Nothing," as well as several other excerpts from that suite, and some songs.

Duke Ellington rates high with Britain's fans

LEONARD FEATHER, noted English swing authority, has supplied the writer with some interesting information concerning the status of swing in London at the present time. It is presented herewith as written by Mr. Feather:

"War-time Britain likes its swing on American lines. The annual dance-band championship final took place in London, October 5, featuring for the most part strictly swing bands. London is also awaiting the 'Jazz Jamboree,' a super-jam session for which every seat was sold out forty-eight hours after it was announced in *The Melody Maker*, the world's only musical weekly.

"Many of the top British maestros are still in mufti, including such veterans as Ambrose, who broke down the color-line in his band when the shortage of musicians became acute. Jack Hylton, who used to be England's Paul Whiteman, is now a big vaudeville and band agent. Only bandleader casualty in British war-time jazz has been Ken Johnson, who was killed when a bomb fell on London's Cafe de Paris in the 1940 blitz.

"American swing records are still at a premium; disks that sell here for thirty-five cents are retailed at one dollar. Chief American favorites are Goodman, the Dorseys, Duke Ellington, Jimmie Lunceford, and more recently Harry James, Lionel Hampton and Charlie Barnet. A national poll revealed Ellington as British fans' No. 1 favorite—they still remember the sensation he caused on his British tour, when Lord Beaverbrook and the Dukes of Kent and Windsor became fervent Ellington admirers.

"The enormous American juke-box trade has no equivalent in Britain. The nickel-machines are considered impractical because there's no suitable coin. A penny isn't enough and sixpence is too much.

"American swing disks were considered unsuitable for the 'Music at Work' programs in British factories, because the music is too complicated and wouldn't stand out from the noise of machinery.

"The BBC anti-slush campaign still has the song-publishers in a dither. Ditties banned from the British airwaves include 'Autumn Nocturne,' 'Mandy Is Two,' 'Somebody Else Is Taking My Place'—allegedly for protection of the public's feelings. Yet, ironically, another of the banned songs, 'Miss You,' is currently England's biggest sheet-music seller!"


"Reviewing Stand" Discussions Embrace Wide Range of Topics;  
School Broadcast Conference Meets in Chicago Nov. 10, 11, 12

## Educators Pool Resources

THE Association for Education by Radio is a national non-profit organization. It was founded in May, 1941, by a group of educators interested in advancing the infant art of education by radio. Spark-plug of the founding fathers was aggressive, organization-minded Harold W. Kent, whose Radio Council staff prepares programs for use in Chicago public schools. At present, Harold Kent, in addition to being the AER's president and guiding light, is a major in the War Department's Bureau of Public Relations. This is significant in view of the vital role radio is playing in the present war emergency. Kent's prewar post at the Radio Council is being held down for the duration by his able and equally aggressive assistant, George Jennings.

The first tangible sign of life in the AER was an organizing committee composed of representatives of institutions and projects active in radio-education work. This committee's job was to survey the need for such an organization. They drew up nine convincing reasons why it should exist. I won't attempt to mention all of them, but I do think the following three will illustrate in part what the AER is trying to accomplish: (1) To cooperate with other institutions and groups interested in education by radio, (2) to encourage research and experimentation and widespread dissemination of findings, and (3) to publish a news, information and idea service on a periodical basis.

In the eighteen months which have passed since it was founded, the AER

has made appreciable progress in view of the fact that the war emergency has made the going tough for a new organization. Some of its accomplishments can be measured by the work it is doing in connection with radio conferences (which, incidentally, have been the breeding-ground for most of the progress that has already been made in this field).

As a starter the AER actively participated in the thirteenth annual meeting of the Institute for Education by Radio held in Columbus, Ohio, last spring. Likewise, an extensive AER program has been planned in connection with the School Broadcast Conference, which will meet in Chicago November 10, 11 and 12. In this instance a full day has been set aside for AER activities. Furthermore, the AER is helping other organizations plan radio conferences, such as the one that is being held this week at Stephens College, Columbia, Missouri.

For these study clinics the AER has drawn up a "blueprint plan" that shows specifically how such conferences can be organized, offers suggestions and valuable tips on how to run them. This project will illustrate how the AER functions as an advisory agency. On the membership list you will find the names of most of the pioneers in the field of education by radio. Through such projects as this "blueprint plan for conferences," the AER is attempting to pool the resources of its members and make the benefits of their valuable experience available to the entire membership.

In the matter of encouraging research and experimentation, the AER is publicizing studies conducted by the various radio projects and foundations. A recent development along this line is a plan to collaborate with the National Association of Educational Broadcasters in a study of radio programs on the university and college level.

So far, the AER has published eleven issues of its journal. This periodical is serving as a medium for the exchange of ideas, for recognizing outstanding accomplishments, for keeping members posted on the latest important radio-education activities.

The membership is composed mainly of school-teachers and principals. Support has also been received from the personnel of network and radio station educational departments, as well as from representatives of institutions and projects fostering radio activities. ## The "Reviewing Stand"

Add to the list of established network programs that originated as broadcasts of a local station Mutual's Sunday morning "Reviewing Stand." Back in 1934 station WGN's director of education, Myrtle Stahl, hit upon the idea of trying a discussion broadcast that was not limited to any specific topic—a program that could lend the knowledge of an entire college faculty to any number of topics varying from "Plant Life on Mars" to "Are the Railroads Doomed?"

Northwestern University was invited to see what it could make of the idea, and the result was the series which has since been known as "Northwestern University Reviewing Stand." The program remained a local feature of WGN from October of 1934 to January, 1936, when it started as a Mutual network show on seven stations. Today it is broadcast by more than one hundred MBS outlets.

Director, moderator and long-time planner of the series was Parker Wheatley. Under his direction the program was brought from its experimental stage to the established show that it is today. Wheatley, who started with the program in 1934, continued as its director and moderator until he joined the Army last summer. His place has been taken by Dean James H. McBurney, of the Northwestern School of Speech.

As it was originally conceived, the "Reviewing Stand" relied solely on the faculty of Northwestern for its experts. But when it was found that authorities with more personal knowledge of the subject to be discussed were frequently available, this policy was altered to include outside experts. This enabled the program's producer to bring into the discussions men who were on the spot when a matter of importance was decided, or who had actually taken part in the activities that made the news.

The aim of the "Reviewing Stand" has never been to present debates among the experts, but rather to present their views for the purpose of picturing the background of important trends that are of interest to the public. "Debating," Miss Stahl points out, "takes up a lot of valuable radio time—often for small purpose. The American public likes to form its own decisions, too."

The program is planned and executed entirely by the university. The moderator has complete control over subject-matter and speakers, confirming both with Northwestern's president. Most of the time the discussions are given over to current topics, but

once in a while a topic related to the arts or philosophy will be chosen in an effort to relieve the strain of heavy news.

The procedure in staging the program is quite simple. After a careful analysis of the news, the moderator picks a topic about three weeks in advance of the broadcast. Next, he selects from the faculty a professor who is most conversant with that subject. It often happens these days, because the topics are very specific, that the names of the three outside experts almost immediately suggest themselves. In Northwestern's files are lists of names and addresses of authorities on a vast number of subjects. Ordinarily it's a simple matter to make a selection, get in touch with the chosen experts and set the date for their appearance.

Once the participants are picked, the moderator makes an appointment for the entire discussion group to meet for a rehearsal of the subject. The purpose of this meeting is to take out the kinks which crop up in reviewing a topic, to get the experts' ideas on what questions might be asked and to round out the topic so that most of its important ramifications will be covered on the air.

Keeping a program of this nature in tune with the news of the day is a job that demands of the planners qualities closely akin to the psychic. They're especially proud of the broadcast on "Germany and Russia—Death Struggle," which fell on the day Hitler's forces marched on Russia. Better still, the subject for the Sunday preceding Pearl Harbor was "Battle Stations of the Pacific!"

# SOVIET RADIO REVEALS NAZI PLANS TO CONSCRIPT RUSSIAN LABORERS

Germans Can't Comprehend British Spirit; Berlin Reports U. S. Forces  
Controlling Teheran Air Service; New South African Station Heard

## Germans Ponder Defeat Odds

**A**CCORDING to W. A. Sinclair, speaking over the London short-wave station, the possibility of defeat is very vivid in the minds of the German populace. They cannot understand British character; can't understand why when things looked blackest for them they talk most about victory. Defeat is not a new thing for the Germans. They were beaten decisively only twenty-four years ago. Many still remember this in Germany. On the other hand the British have not been defeated as a nation for over a thousand years. The British and the Americans are not accustomed to being beaten. They believe in the inevitable triumph of principles over brute force, for this is a war of principles so far as the United Nations are concerned. It is not a war of ideals for the Germans. We hope not only to destroy our enemies but to set up governments in those countries that will allow us all to work and live together. The Germans are not fighting to destroy the British government primarily. They just want to take the British possessions. They are primarily interested in how much food, how much raw material, how much loot they can bleed from each conquered country. They care nothing for its ultimate position in the family of nations. The Germans are very self-sacrificing when it comes to their own country. They will undergo all sorts of hardship to see their country victorious, but they have no sense of responsibility for other peoples; no sense of the unity of mankind. Their policy is summed up in that declaration of Goering's that if anyone is to starve it won't be the Germans. For Germany, it is a war of material advantages. They do not have a sense of fighting for a greater sense of decency.

## Nazis Move Russian Laborers

The Soviet radio has been saying considerable about the slave labor that the Nazis are taking from occupied parts of the U. S. S. R. Universal registration of labor power has been carried out in occupied Ukrainian towns and villages. The whole population from eighteen to sixty-five years of age is subject to registration. All who refuse to register are sent to concentration camps. All registered Soviet citizens are veritable prisoners of the German authorities. During May, 1,500 Ukrainian workers and peasants—men and women, boys and girls—were dispatched to Germany daily from Kiev alone. The Hitlerite slave-owners are resolved to send to Germany by the end of this year not less than two million Soviet citizens. They are intended for hard labor in Germany to replace German workers called to the army. Orders were given not to "dally"

with those who do not wish to go to Germany. The Hitlerites are eager to get Russian and Ukrainian laborers because "they are strong and their maintenance is cheap."

## Red Bulbs Save Lives

In "London Newsreel" the little red bulbs which have been added to life-preservers in this war, and which burn for ten hours, were cited as having been the means of saving countless lives. An example was given of a ship which was torpedoed in the middle of a black night. Three life-boats got away, but in the wash of ten-foot waves one of them was overturned. Little red lights could be seen bobbing here and there as they rose and fell with the waves. It was comparatively simple to pick up the survivors in the two other boats. Only two lives were lost. These were snuffed out in the explosion. Without the red bulbs, almost all of those in the inky waters would have perished.

## NBC Short-Waves Comics

Each Saturday at 1:15 p.m. EWT, NBC short-waves the antics of Bud Abbott and Lou Costello, that fun-making combination that has made "I'm a ba-a-a-ad boy" a household expression everywhere, to our troops

overseas. With the famous comedians is Leith Stevens and his orchestra. Frequencies used for the rebroadcast are 15.15, 15.21, 17.78 megs . . . A new series of weekly programs dramatizing significant news of the world as seen from the American point of view is now being short-waved to Europe and Latin America by the English section of NBC International. The series, entitled "Fighting America," presents three outstanding news events each Friday (at 1:45 p.m. on 15.15 and 15.21, and at 11:30 p.m. on 9.67 and 11.89 megs) with a cast of from six to eight performers.

## From My Short-Wave Notebook

Excerpts from London broadcasts: The most striking thing about the Germans' line in Russia is its great length. It is even 1,500 miles longer than last winter's front . . . There is still some beer in Britain's taverns, but it is warm. There is plenty of cider . . . Signs of the times: A little boy of five sitting on the floor playing with a gas-mask and imitating a falling incendiary bomb on a small whistle . . . According to Vernon Bartlett, the situation in France is fast approaching a crisis where she must either become a slave vassal to Germany or where she must again take up arms against the Nazi hordes . . . Over

1,400 sorties by German raiders were made over Malta in one recent week . . . The fighting spirit of the British troops in Egypt is terrific. There is a new air of purpose and pep in the desert . . . A man who had labored for over fifty years as a shipwright admitted in an interview with Jan Bustle of the BBC that he was still making only slightly over \$20 a week.

A Berlin commentator stated that all air service in Teheran, Iran, has been placed under control of American forces. Further, numerous experts from America have assumed advisory and administrative positions with the Iranian government. The announcer was very emphatic in pointing out that the Iranian populace very much resented American intrusion into their affairs.

According to the Hungarian short-wave station, the capital city of Budapest has increased one hundred thousand in population since the outbreak of war.

An R. A. F. flier, guesting on the Landt's Trio's "Sing Along" program over CBS, saw the headline "Yankees Win First Tilt." "But, I say," he protested, "why should you fellows take all the credit? We're in this too." (Note: This is positively the last World Series story of the season.)







## Call for Vick Knight

**O**VER here, Johnny—here is Vick Knight, who on June 22 answered the call of the Biow Agency that handles the Philip Morris programs and "Take It or Leave It" for Eversharp. It seems that upon answering the call Vick came up with the answers to all the questions, and the \$64 question landed him the position of executive producer for the agency.

Vick is a little guy with a dynamic mind. He made his bow into this world in 1908 in Moundsville, West Virginia. His mother was a calliope player on a show-boat and his father played the drums in the band on the same boat. Vick says they didn't make the "big time," as they never played on a show-boat that went up and down the Mississippi.

Knight graduated from high school and preparatory school but didn't go to college, because his parents couldn't afford to send both him and his brother. His brother wanted to be a school-teacher, so he won the toss. Today he is a prosperous high-school principal in Prosperity, Pennsylvania.

Vick's career had its beginning on a fifty-watt station in Cleveland. He played the drums, announced, wrote and produced, and any other odd jobs that came his way. He was anxious to get to New York and would spend his vacations in the city trying to make a connection. He finally landed a job as junior production man through John Carlile, then production manager of CBS. (Carlile today is professor of radio at the University of Alabama.)

Vick stayed with CBS for thirteen months, leaving to direct the Kate Smith program under Ted Collins. He has been associated with "We, the People," Rudy Vallee, Eddie Cantor and Fred Allen. At the time he was working for Allen, the Government asked Knight to put on a series of programs called "Command Performance," which were to be short-waved to our armed forces.

Today Vick Knight is to radio what Darryl Zanuck is to the motion-picture industry.

We asked Vick if he had any advice for those trying to break into radio. The following was his reply: "One doesn't start in college as a senior, so why should one expect to break into radio at the top? A baseball pitcher must train in a minor league. He doesn't pitch his first game for the New York Yankees, and the small stations around the country represent the minor leagues of radio. You will find that a vast majority of the people who are successful now in all branches of radio, from engineering to the stars themselves, started on a very small scale on a very small station."




Billy Idelson, radio's Rush Gook

### Bring On the Waffles!

IF YOU'VE been cleaning out your cupboards for bigger and better scrap piles and suddenly found your favorite but overlooked waffle-iron, hang on to it! That handy utensil can very well serve its purpose in your campaign for victory by turning out appetizing and economical waffles.

Probably the nicest thing about this all-American dish is its amazingly versatile. Waffles can be eaten any time from morning to night. They are perfect for Sunday's leisurely breakfast, completely satisfying as the main course for luncheon and definitely delectable as a dinner dessert. What's more, they won't make an inroad on your sugar rations, as waffles don't require that precious commodity for the making. As perfect accompaniments you can serve corn or maple syrup, marmalade, or whipped cream.

So take the waffle-iron off that dusty shelf—clean it up or have it overhauled if necessary. And before the family has a chance to ask why they never get waffles, you can whip up a creamy batter and start your baking. And just in case you happen to be the woman who is troubled with waffles sticking to the iron, check your recipe for the amount of shortening. By varying the ingredients to call for one-fourth cup of shortening to two cups of flour, the problem is often remedied. However, if your waffles still stick, then it's a sure sign your iron has been improperly seasoned. Plug the cord into the wall and heat your iron to the baking temperature, brush the grids generously with salad oil, then close and let it cool. Be sure you discard the first baked waffle, for it will be soggy with grease. The next one should be perfect!

So fit waffles into your daily menu.

Serve plain waffles for breakfast, cheese waffles with grilled tomatoes for luncheon, and chocolate waffles for your dessert. Here's how:

#### Plain Waffles

- 2 cups sifted flour
- 2 teaspoons double-acting baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 3 egg yolks, well beaten
- 1¼ cups milk
- 5 tablespoons melted butter or other shortening
- 3 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt and sift again. Combine egg yolks and milk; add gradually to flour, beating only until smooth. Add shortening. Fold in egg whites. Bake in hot waffle-iron. Serve with butter and maple-flavored syrup. Makes four or five four-section waffles.

#### Cheese Waffles with Grilled Tomatoes

- 2 cups sifted Swans Down Cake Flour
- 2 teaspoons Calumet Baking Powder
- 3 egg yolks, well beaten
- 3 egg whites, stiffly beaten
- 1 cup milk
- ½ teaspoon salt
- 4 tablespoons melted butter
- 1 cup grated cheese.

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder and salt and sift again. Combine egg yolks, milk and butter. Add to flour, beating until smooth. Fold in egg whites and cheese. Bake in hot waffle-iron. Place a slice of grilled tomato on each section. Makes four

four-section waffles. Diced uncooked bacon may be sprinkled over batter before closing the iron.

#### Chocolate Dessert Waffles

- 1½ cups sifted cake flour
- 1½ teaspoons double-acting baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¾ cup sugar
- 2 egg yolks, well beaten
- ½ cup milk
- ½ cup melted butter
- 2 squares unsweetened chocolate melted
- ½ teaspoon vanilla
- 2 egg whites, stiffly beaten

Sift flour once, measure, add baking powder, salt and sugar, and sift again. Combine egg yolks and milk; add to flour mixture, beating until smooth. Combine butter and chocolate, add to batter and blend. Add vanilla. Fold in egg whites. Bake in hot waffle-iron. Serve hot with whipped cream, orange marmalade, or an orange sauce. Makes four four-section waffles.



huge, Gargantuan San Fernando Valley beet, with an underslung Van Dyke. Oh, yes, the beet! Well, believe it or not, it's so huge, I went out to examine it one morning and found two cops asleep on the same beet.

However, I'll never forget the time I started my bean patch. With infinite patience, from the most modest seedlings, I nurtured, weeded, watched and watered them. I practically wept over them. Finally, the bean stalks were so dense and so high that it was imperative to provide protection with barrage balloons from a new flying species recently developed in the West to wipe out the insidious *Popilla japonica* or Japanese beetle. The name of this new American-type flying-bug is B-17, or Flying Fortress.

As to cabbages—mine are tops! These cabbages have been developed and grown so scientifically that their heads win hands down. Several years ago, I displayed them at the Pomona County Fair, and they won awards in competition with five hundred other heads. At the moment, they are on exhibition at the Smithsonian Institution in Washington in the same case with two rare craniums of Neanderthal man.

However, this is all a lot of parsley compared to my innovations in the fecund field of fertilization. Years ago, for example, the Zucchini Morgans developed leeks. For some time, the leeks started coming only sporadically, and old Uncle Rutabagas Morgan was in a quandary. His wife finally found the solution. They patched up the holes in the roof.

But let's get back to fertilization. There are any number of different formulas extant among scientific agriculturalists. Spray, top soil, powder, drip grind and pulverized are common. But the secret Morgan formula, which I am now at liberty to disclose, provides the greatest efficacy. A dash of angostura, a twist of peel, a trace of sodium bicarbonate, and all my turnip greens are hungover.

But shall we say a word about breeding. Lettuce. A short time ago, I tried an unusual experiment. First I obtained some of the finest specimens of New Jersey corn, which were sent me by my New Jersey cousin, Guernsey Morgan. This ear was interbred with an admirable selection of California lima beans—the marvelous intermarriage of the two highly bred legumes resulting in a deliciously tempting dish. It was succotash on the cob.

But let's consider my kale. Last year, I had two stacks of it won by the sweat of my own hard labor. Three days later I placed all this kale on Parsnips, running in the third at Santa Anita. Parsnips placed and I doubled my kale.

Now, perhaps I should tell you about choice kernels of corn. It, of course, was discovered among the American Indians by Pocahontas and Captain John Smith—lucky fellow. At the time, it was called maize and its fame and possibilities finally made American ears. Now I'm called Colonel Morgan, suh—dispenser of little kernels of corn—on and off the cob.

What about fruits? Just give me razzberries—I love 'em.

which is better in Berlin than in London despite the watering-down that it has undergone. In Berlin, as everywhere else in Germany, coffee is the key to all things good or bad, depending on how you look on it.

Here silk stockings, lipsticks and good pipe tobacco open the right gateways. British cigarettes are superior and the Londoner gets more per day than does the Berliner, who is allowed around twelve a week.

The streets of London day and night are crowded with more people, buses and taxis than in Berlin, but Berliners bicycle more, walk more than do the Londoners. The war-time Berliner is the rudest individual on the earth and one develops a tenacious elbow-punch from riding his street-cars or subways. The Londoner, on the other hand,

while not overpolite, is at least courteous and understanding. His unfriendliness at times is probably due to his ultra-conservative attitude. He is not at all talkative, unlike the Berliners, all of whom seemingly have been vaccinated with a phonograph-needle.

Here one can take a warm bath seven days a week. In Berlin we and the citizens could indulge in that luxury once or at the most twice a week. We obtained soap the size of a penny match-box, but much thinner, once a month. You never use it on your face—especially if you have rosy cheeks. My acute sense of smell has yet to detect the noticeable lack of soap here.

London newspapers do not relish or wade in the abusiveness and foulness of language which characterizes the press of Berlin. You can always find in the London papers the communiques of the enemy countries, but not so the Berlin papers, which, in addition, never once to my knowledge have

published an address of any of the Allied statesmen, in part or in full, expurgated or otherwise. But here, for example, the recent rantings of Hitler, Goering, Goebbels and Ribbentrop were printed nearly in full. The people in London view the government's communiques as reports of truth. The Berliners view the victories claimed by their high command as being as ersatz as the leather in their shoes and the wool in their overcoats.

The blackout is blacker in Berlin than it is in London, and so far as I have been able to judge, the London air-raid shelters are not as well built as those in Berlin, although the London underground seems to provide a better refuge than the Berlin equivalent. Compared to what the Luftwaffe has done to London, the R. A. F. has barely scratched Berlin.

The Berlin movies are Goebbels' invitation to a headache. Variety shows there lack variety and cannot be

called shows. Comedians are at a standstill. Here the reverse is the case. Berlin's night-clubs are dens of silence. Their stage shows out-corn the corniest that we have. On the other hand, London night-clubs are nothing to write home about. While there has been a complete breakdown of morals in Berlin, such a situation has not yet developed here.

As regards the war, the Berliner looks at it this way: We will probably lose, but we may win. The Londoner expresses himself in the following manner: We will win, but we do not underestimate the cleverness of the enemy nor his ruthlessness.
