WERS

WERS stands for War Emergency Radio Service, originated by the combined efforts of the Federal Communications Commission and the Office of Civilian Defense. Through this service, thousands of defense councils, particularly those in target areas, can now substantially increase their usefulness for the protection of citizenry. Briefly, it's a system of two-way radio communication for the use of civilian defense in local areas. The three biggest advantages to WERS are: 1. Wide coverage to many points simultaneously, eliminating telephone chain-calling. 2. Invulnerability. Radio needs no wire or cable to operate, which fact makes it virtually impossible to put the service out of commission. 3. Through contact with moving units, WERS can reach defense forces in action, giving them constant central command so that they can be shifted without returning to the base. Small portable sending and receiving sets carried by defense forces give officers in charge a chance to direct their squads from a vantage point at any scene of disaster. Today, thousands of volunteers are busy setting up this system. Radio repair shops are being ransacked for junked sets and unused materials. It is this salvaging of existing material which puts the United States out in front as the country most ready for the rapid setting up of a fool-proof communications auxiliary—a vital service both in war and peace. 


MARRIED AND HAPPY






This was some months ago, but in a short space of time Carole feels that she has had another whole lifetime telescoped into her existence.

He's Succeeding by Way of the Meanie Route







John B. Hughes, Mutual's West Coast Commentator, Tells What That Experience Meant to Him



"PIGGY-BACK in a P-38!"

The gang around my office thought I'd lost my mind or inherited a million when I hung up the phone after the call telling me that the Army Air Force had consented to permit a few of us newsmen to ride piggy-back. For several weeks the Army has been using this technique for training pilots in these fast, fierce, fighting planes, the Lockheed Lightnings, which at last are confirmed as the most versatile all-around combat planes of the war.

Prior to the piggy-back development, cadets or graduates, after advanced training, simply climbed into a single-seat fighter and took off after ground instruction. There was no chance to fly with an instructor who knew all the flight characteristics of that particular ship. It was one reason there were too many accidents, which led to rumors that our fighters were no good, that some of them were death-traps, "suicide crates."

Two months after Jimmy Mattern and three other Lockheed test-pilots began giving piggy-back instruction, the accident index had been cut from 6.5 to 1.5, an unprecedented low. The truth is that the P-38 is as sturdy, solid, safe a ship as anyone could hope to fly, but it is so big and powerful and fast that, as one pilot said to me, "You don't have time to make more than one mistake."

Other single-seaters probably will be adapted to the piggy-back method soon. In the P-38 it was done by removing part of the radio equipment so that the passenger-student sits on a piece of the main center beam just behind the pilot's seat. But he sits a little higher than the pilot and must stoop with his head over the pilot's shoulder, his knees in the pilot's ribs, and his hands and arms anywhere he can get them out of the way. The student does get a good view of the controls and the instruments, and by twisting his neck he can see any part of the airplane, the sky and the world about him.

I rode with Jimmy Mattern, famous round-the-world flier and one-time barnstormer, now test-pilot for Lockheed. He gave me the usual training, indoctrination flight. It was a thriller from beginning to end even when we moved so fast in acrobatic dog-fight maneuvers that I couldn't be sure whether we or the world were on top.

Stunting in an airplane is nothing new, but when you're in the fastest, most powerful fighter plane in the world and there are two of you where only one is supposed to be, it's something. The extraordinary rate of climb and the speed of the P-38 are its first claims to fame, just as its twin-boom construction is its distinguishing visual feature. It has other marks of notability.

Jimmy put it through the paces that have caused

tion of how the plane could not only fly but could fight its way back from enemy territory. With only one motor we flew faster than a Japanese Zero can fly and we maneuvered up and down and both ways around.

Most airplanes have torque. That's the twisting force from the rotation of the motor or motors. A Lightning avoids torque because its twin motors rotate in opposite directions, working against each other in so far as torque is concerned. And some engineers seemed to think that when one of those motors failed the other would create a torque beyond the endurance of the plane. Instead what happens is that the rotary force of the engine has the effect of completely equalizing the plane's weight and it is as if the one good motor out on the wing had been moved into the center of the plane. The result is complete balance and perfect control.

So with only one motor we banked left and banked right, we rolled, we dived and climbed, we strafed an orange grove until I was certain I saw oranges passing above the wings. Jimmy says I didn't, but the owner of the grove shook his fist at us, and I still think I'm right. I know I got dust in my eyes.

We not only pulled out of that orange grove with a rate of climb that is a military secret but we then outfought the imaginary enemy all the way back to the field and landed—all on one motor.

In the Aleutians a Lightning pilot flew 150 miles back to his base with one engine shot away.

Down in the South Pacific, in the Coral Sea area, a P-38 camera ship with one engine disabled outran and outclimbed three pursuing groups of Zeros.

That's the plane that couldn't fly on one engine.



The demonstration I got gave me a much better understanding of why this Lockheed Lightning is rapidly becoming known as the most versatile airplane of the war. Designed originally as an interceptor, it is now being used as a pursuit, a long-range low-altitude bomber, dive bomber, ground-strafer, a reconnaissance ship with a record of photographic performance unequalled by any plane. In fact, the P-38 has been put to so many uses that one wit at the airport the other day said that the next thing they'll do is to put a box-car across those twin booms and use it for a cargo plane.

The fire-power of the normal P-38 is another of its outstanding features. The four big machine-guns and cannon are mounted in a cluster in the nose and can be aimed with rifle accuracy. Due to their concentration there is no "cone of fire" as with wing-mounted armament. The "cone" feature gives a plane an effective or "ideal" range where the blast of lead meets in a (Continued on Page 63)

accidents because men didn't know how to meet sudden peculiar behavior. The accelerated stall which once was rumored to tear the tails off Lightnings was demonstrated several times while I kept my eyes on the wings, the tails and the instruments. We had accelerated stalls standing up and lying down and we lived through them because we knew what to do. That is, Jimmy knew what to do, and I learned so that next time I meet one at ten thousand feet I can call it brother rather than shy from it into a flat spin from which I might not be able to pull out before getting sand and cactus in my teeth.

When I watched the tails during an accelerated stall Jimmy said, "You won't see any vibration. Don't worry any part of this ship will stand more than you can." It did. I blacked out during a tight pull-out from a long, fast dive, but when I came to, the plane was still there and Jimmy was laughing.

Another fatal weakness of the P-38, according to the rumors of recent months, was the absolute inability of the plane to fly on one motor. The twenty-three hundred horsepower of the two Allison liquid-cooled motors is a vital fighting fact, but the half-power performance of the plane with a dead engine is almost beyond belief. With one motor cut out, as if disabled in action, Jimmy gave me a demonstra-



IF YOU are in the mood for a good hearty laugh, don't miss "The More the Merrier." It's sheer nonsense, packed with fun from the opening to the closing scene. The story is laid in crowded war-time Washington, where trying to find a place to live makes locating a needle in a haystack easy by comparison. Jean Arthur (Connie, a Government employe) starts the ball of mirth rolling when, as a patriotic gesture she decides to relieve the housing shortage by renting the spare room in her apartment. Although she wants a female tenant, Connie is compelled to accommodate industrialist Charles Coburn. From then on, much of the fun evolves from the conversations that Jean and Coburn carry on through the wall that separates their respective bedrooms. Added to that is the manner in which fine comedienne Arthur manages to switch her affections from fiance Richard Gaines to Joel McCrea, an aviation specialist whom industrialist Coburn allows to share his room in Connie's apartment. Not only does La Arthur get herself involved—and deeply—but her dilemma almost reaches the proportions of international complications. And the way Jean handles her lines is something!

"Aerial Gunner"



THIS is the picturized story of the aerial gunner in modern warfare—the triggerman on whose sighting eye and steady hands depends the life or death of the bomber. Set against the background of training-schools and battlefields, it is an authentic delineation of aerial-gunner duties. The plot of the story is not significant, for it is entirely subordinated to the fine action shots of soldiers in the making. What marks the picture worth while are the bombers and fighting men of Uncle Sam's Air Forces who play important roles. The story was filmed with the full cooperation of the U. S. Army, which made available personnel, equipment and backgrounds. Most of the shots were taken at the Aerial Gunnery School at Harlingen, Texas, and authentic training methods were photographed as part of the production set-up. Hollywood actors in the piece all do workmanlike jobs. Chester Morris (Foxy Pattis) plays the role of the cad who vindicates his shady past by giving his life to save his rival, Ben Davis (Richard Arlen). The girl interest is Peggy Lunt (Lita Ward), who is torn between the two men and their feuds. In real life, Dick Arlen is a qualified aviator who owned and operated his own private airfield before the war. When we got into the fight, Dick turned his equipment over to the Government. So Arlen feels right at home in the role of Lt. Ben Davis of the Aerial Gunner Corps.

As president of a sub-deb movie-fan club, Joan Lyons (Virginia Weidler) blossoms forth as an attractive miss whose one passion in life is her interest in movie stars. The plot of the story develops some hilarious tangles as Joan and her bosom pal, Patricia Drew (Jean Porter), lead the members into scrape after scrape in their attempts to secure the autographs of screen celebrities visiting their home town—Greer Garson, Lana Turner, Walter Pidgeon, Robert Taylor and William Powell. In fact, Joan's imagination is so fired that she almost succeeds in breaking up her own home as she sees intrigue and triangles in her dad's (Edward Arnold) friendship for his secretary (Ann Ayars). The little Weidler girl does a swell job as the leader of the movie-fan club.

HERE'S an action-packed picture which opens and closes on scenes of the Battle of Britain in September of 1940—a battle in which the Spitfires of England's air forces turned the German tide by shooting 185 Luftwaffe aircraft from the clouds, inspiring Winston Churchill's immortal remark, "Never was so much owed by so many to so few." But the real story is that of the inventor of the gallant Spitfires, one R. J. Mitchell (Leslie Howard). The story begins when a group of RAF pilots, awaiting orders to go into action, pass the time discussing aircraft and wondering who designed the Spitfire. Wing Commander Geoffrey Crisp (David Niven), flying veteran of World War I, quietly remarks that the designer was Mitchell and that he knew him well. As Crisp's story of the famous Spitfire designer unfolds, time turns back to events in 1922, when Mitchell (Howard) and his wife, Diana (Rosamund John), were picnicking on a cliff-top. Mitchell is fascinated by the actions of a gliding gull and forecasts the day when he will build a plane based on the bird's graceful flight. How that dream was realized is the story of "Spitfire."

"My Friend Flicka"



"MY FRIEND FLICKA" deserves a niche among American movie classics. And 20th Century deserves a special medal of merit for making it into a Technicolor picture. For color enriches the story's background in a breath-takingly beautiful manner. And in addition to that, no movie-maker can beat a good story built around a small boy's love for a horse or a dog. We are quite willing to go on record as saying that we believe this picture will remain longer in the memory of theater-goers than many more pretentious and much-touted productions. Roddy McDowall does a fine job as the boy—a kid given to dreaming while he roams over his dad's Wyoming ranch. Low grades on his report from school rouses his father's ire, and his sense of responsibility is not kindled until his mom intercedes and persuades Dad to give him a colt of his own. The colt, a golden chestnut filly, is named "Flicka"—Swedish for little girl. Slowly the boy makes friends with the horse, who is supposed to have a loco streak in her pedigree, and it's a great day for him when he proves to his dad that Flicka can be halter-broken. But his joy is short-lived when his pet develops a limp and falls ill from a barbed-wire wound. His father's decision that Flicka must be shot brings the story to a climax and father and son to an enduring understanding.



CBS Expands Broadcast Service to Fighting Forces Abroad

THE CBS short-wave department, in cooperation with the Office of War Information and the Army Special Service Division, has announced an augmented schedule of broadcasts for American forces overseas. It consists of thirty-three and one-quarter hours of weekly broadcasts to the fighting fronts. Beamed daily from 8:15 to 11:00 a.m. to Britain, Europe and North Africa; 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon to the Middle East, and from 3:15 to 4:15 p.m. EWT to Britain, the new schedule includes a wide variety of musical, dramatic and comedy programs, as well as sports and news.

Among CBS commercial shows included in the line-up are those featuring Fred Allen, Kate Smith, Andre Kostelanetz, Guy Lombardo and Morton Gould, and "Your Hit Parade," "Major Bowes' Amateurs," "Harry James and His Music Makers."

Thirty-five programs are produced weekly by the CBS short-wave department to be relayed abroad.

In addition, programs produced and arranged by the Army's Special Service Division include: "Front Line Theater," "We Who Fight," "Yarns for Yanks," "Jubilee," "Mail Call," "Downbeat," "Are You a Genius?," "Sports." Two OWI shows produced especially for the Navy—"Liberty Party" and "Calling the Navy"—also appear in the new schedule.

WHEN Alec Templeton is through practising he likes to sit at the piano and relax. He relaxes by experimenting with the pedals, striking some chord or succession of notes and then listening to their overtones, their subtler shades, which are not always distinguishable to ordinary ears.

Often, too, he constructs some new scale, memorizes it and improvises on it all the time. In other words, Mr. Templeton's relaxation is, to all intents and purposes, a kind of research in tonal esthetics, all of which sounds most scholarly and unrelaxed. Nevertheless, the very gifted Mr. Templeton knows how to find recreation among the most esoteric fields of the musical art.

When I saw him the other day he said something very interesting about Debussy. "You know," he remarked, "there is a trick of Debussy's—maybe it is a cliché of his—to write a line of melody and augment it with a repeat or two of its last fragment, like this—" He proceeded to show me what he meant. Then he gave an illustration in words of the same technique. "It would be like uttering the line, 'He is sitting in the chair' and amplifying it with the last three words, 'in the chair, in the chair.' Do you see what I mean? The whole thing, then, would go like this: 'He is sitting in the chair—in the chair, in the chair.'"

"I know it sounds a little like Gertrude Stein and her 'pigeons on the grass, alas,' but that is the very spirit of the Debussyan melodic invention."

He played many excerpts from the French composer's piano music, vividly illustrating his thesis. It was altogether a novel experience for me, and an instructive one.

"Every composer has tricks of his own, you know," he said. "These are what properly constitute his individualism. The thing, then, is to learn these manifestations, to recognize them and to give them their proper emphasis in performance. I think I have demonstrated rather conclusively—even though I've had fun at it—that you can take a passage out of Mozart or Bach, let us say, alter the values a little and make it something quite different. Sometimes, I imagine, this is done quite unwittingly by performers, thereby recasting a work in a certain style into another totally at variance with it."

Mr. Templeton's appreciation of American popular music, from boogie-woogie to up-to-the-minute torch ballads, is rather amazing for an Englishman. His technique is so facile that he can adapt himself to the most grotesque ideas of fingering, wrist action, touch, and the like, and yet play on tirelessly. His trip-hammer left hand in boogie-woogie, for example, is a case in point.

He said quite confidently that the song *Blues in the Night* will become a classic, and he feels that way about many others. "You can't snub what some of our talented American popular writers are doing. You can't shut yourself up in that lovely little ivory tower. Where would any of the world's great music be today if there hadn't been musicians with vision, musicians who were drawn sympathetically to new

trends in composition? There is very interesting music being written today—and in the most unexpected places. We can't say for sure now whether it will live. But we can give it a chance. We can be tolerant in our attitude toward it."

This, of course, was the Alec Templeton with the penetrating vision speaking, the satirist who—for the moment—chose to examine today's product with an eye to the future. He is not alone in these thoughts, naturally, but it is good for the cause to have such an articulate and believing champion.

I asked the pianist to play an excerpt or two from his *Insect Suite*, which someone had been telling me about. Mr. Templeton obliged with the final section, *Flea Fugue*, as charmingly contrived and as sprightly and imaginative a fugue as you will hear in many a day. In this music he was the fine satirist again. Just a glance at the titles of the sections is necessary to recognize his rare gift of ironic humor.

Here are the titles: I. *A Day in the Life of a Firefly*, or *Strictly Off the Record*; II. *Ode to the Bottom of a*

Bumblebee; III. *Stinkbug Goes A-Wooping*; IV. *Junebug Jive*; V. *Gnats to You*; VI. *Flea Fugue*.

Scintillating as his wit is, it was the serious Alec Templeton I remembered when I left his apartment, the Alec Templeton who labors unceasingly to perfect his interpretations of the great compositions, the Alec Templeton who sits at the piano to commune with sound, the Alec Templeton who is human and inquisitive and who is altogether sanguine about America's musical future.

In Person

Eileen Farrell, young CBS soprano, made one of her very rare public appearances at the last luncheon this season of the Philharmonic-Symphony League. The luncheon was held at the

Hotel St. Regis, New York, and a very sophisticated audience of music-lovers attended. Among the guest performers was our very talented soprano.

This first opportunity to hear Miss Farrell sans microphone naturally proved very tempting to the writer, who likes to think of himself as being one

of her first devotees. The singer didn't disappoint me. In fact, she was even better than I had hoped. Rarely does one hear such assurance in attacks of high notes, such poise, such intelligent breath-control. The young singer has come a long way since I first heard her many months ago. For all we know, the next great—but great—Verdian (and even Wagnerian) soprano may be growing right in our midst. And more power to her—vocal and in every other way.

POPULAR MUSIC

THERE were doubts in the minds of certain experts regarding the ability of one Frank Sinatra to hold the attention of a night-club audience. They were dispelled beautifully when he opened at the flashy Riobamba in New York some weeks ago.

Frank Sinatra is, first of all, a real singer. He can croon or he can sing out. He is, specifically, an interpreter who gives you the essence of a song, its meaning and music in a gracious manner. He is always aware of what the orchestra is doing in back of him, in which respect he might be classified as a considerable musician.

He does not go in for exaggeration. He phrases as beautifully and as shrewdly as a thoroughgoing instrumentalist. He makes his appeal immediately. The effect on the listener is electrical.

He was born in Hoboken, New Jersey, on December 12, 1917, of a musical family. Incidentally, Tess Gardella, well known as Aunt Jemima of radio and vaudeville fame, is an aunt of his. And an uncle, Ray Sinatra, is a musician, conductor, composer and orchestrator of superior merits.

For a time Mr. Sinatra attended Stevens Tech in Hoboken, there studying civil engineering. But one day, on a dare, he auditioned for Major Bowes, singing Cole Porter's *Night and Day*. The good Major immediately signed him up for nine months.

It was while he was regularly appearing with one of the Major's units that Bob Chester, noted bandleader, offered him a contract. Some time later Mr. Sinatra became a member of the Chester entourage.

After six months, however, another leader, Tommy Dorsey, approached the artist and successfully lured him into his own ranks. With the Dorsey band he came into extraordinary prominence. Then one day, because he felt that he should go it alone, he left Dorsey—rather regretfully nevertheless—and made his first solo appearance at the New York Paramount Theater, where he was a sensational success.

Now having conquered the worlds of radio, stage and night-clubs, he is on the point of going to Hollywood for a try at motion pictures. And, one wagers, Mr. Sinatra will conquer movies as he has conquered all else.

To all the ladies who have been listening to him via radio and who have been casting yearning sighs in his direction be it said that he is very happily married and the father of a three-year-old girl, Nancy-Sandra, who is the apple of his eye. (See photo on page 16.)

There Are None So Blind

PROOF of the inaccurate impression some persons continue to have of frequency-modulation broadcasting is seen in the following comment recently published by a New England newspaper: "Some FM stations are still on the air, but they are actually merely half-hearted ventures of big broadcast stations that operate them as a sideline."

The implication—which was obviously arrived at without bothering to check the facts—is that the war has naturally put a large number of FM stations off the air and those which remain are just drowsing along on their last legs.

The truth is exactly the opposite. Not a single FM transmitter has closed down since the war began and, even more surprising, some sixteen *additional* FM stations have started operation since Pearl Harbor. A recent survey showed that approximately three-quarters of all programming heard over the full-fidelity megacycles is planned exclusively for FM and not broadcast by the ordinary AM stations which, in many cases, own and operate them. Although FM receivers are no longer being manufactured, radio dealers in cities where FM stations operate report that many customers still try to purchase them.

Another for New York

The dial of FM sets in New York City is a busy place these days, recently augmented by still another station, giving listeners a choice of nine different FM outlets. The newcomer is W39NY, operated by the Municipal Broadcasting System—a non-profit venture run by the City of New York.

Located atop City Hall in downtown Manhattan, W39NY has been operat-

ing daily from 2 to 5 p.m. and from 7 to 8:15 p.m. and is affiliated with WNYC, Mayor Fiorello LaGuardia's regular AM transmitter which serves the metropolis. Unlike other FM transmitters in New York—which are required to cover 8,500 square miles—W39NY confines itself to 3,900 square miles within a radius embracing all of the city's five boroughs and adjacent portions of New Jersey.

FM's Foresight

One of the biggest problems that confront FM broadcasters in these war-time days is the difficulty of replacing transmitter parts when they wear out. The most serious items are vacuum tubes. Without them, of course, modern broadcasting is impossible, for they represent the heart of all transmitting equipment. Probably more tubes are being manufactured than ever before, but the needs of the Army, Navy and other essential radio services take practically all of them.

Consequently, all broadcasting stations—whether AM or FM—are taking every precaution to coddle their equipment and tubes, making them last just as long as possible. They realize that too many breakdowns, coupled with the scarcity of replacements, may put them off the air for the duration.

Perhaps the most practical idea yet to be evolved has come from four Philadelphia stations that sought and received permission from the Federal Communications Commission to test out a time-sharing arrangement during a ninety-day trial period. It works on the same basis as car-pooling, except that they pool their transmitting facilities.

Under the system, more than fifty thousand FM listeners within Philadelphia and its suburbs are assured of continuous FM programs, eight hours daily, every week. And, if the four stations decide to make the arrangement permanent, the local audience can probably look forward to uninterrupted FM service throughout the

war, for this intelligent conservation of tubes and transmitters will cut natural operating wear fourfold.

The FM outlets participating are W49PH, W53PH, W69PH and W73PH (owned by WIP, WFIL, WCAU and WPEN, respectively). Their cooperative plan calls for one of the four to be on the air each day from 3 to 11 p.m. Each station has its own assigned day, while the remaining three days are rotated. Daily announcements over the air and in newspapers tell local listeners which station to tune for.

The FCC, commenting upon this move, has declared: "War-time necessities for conserving critical materials, electric power, transcriptions, and for making use of depleted manpower were advanced by the four petitioners as reasons. The stations are also planning to pool all their spare parts and equipment, which will be distributed to each station as the need arises. A committee of coordinators, composed of a representative from each station, is to supervise and coordinate the programs of the stations so that the public may obtain the best possible program service under present conditions."

People Are Interested

Two months ago this page carried a small item mentioning booklets on FM which had been prepared by FM Broadcasters, Inc., the national trade association of frequency-modulation stations. We have been informed by this group that the demand from readers of *MOVIE-RADIO GUIDE* for copies of the booklets was so great it has exhausted the available supply. Requests from forty-five of the forty-eight states, as well as many parts of Canada, attest to the widespread interest in FM, even among people who will not be able to enjoy it in their regions until after the war.




Bachelor's Children

"BACHELOR'S CHILDREN" (heard over CBS at 10:45 a.m. EWT and rebroadcast at 12:45 p.m. PWT) celebrates its eighth anniversary on the air September 9 of this year. Recently it was accorded the unique honor of being the only daytime serial chosen by the Coordinator of Inter-American Affairs for translation and rebroadcast in South America. Undoubtedly one reason for that is due to the fact that it portrays so simply and graphically life as it is lived in thousands of small towns in the United States, where folk still turn to the local doctor for moral guidance as well as medical advice. The keystone of the first broadcast—that of a small-town doctor whose wisdom and patience brings life's richest blessings to the folks he comes to meet and know—is still evident in the story as it is broadcast today. Charming Bess Flynn, author of "Bachelor's Children," has the knack of keeping that bright thread of service running through her story pattern and still keeping abreast of present-day happenings in the world. Miss Flynn has grown right along with her scripts. Yet she still remembers her nervous excitement eight years ago when her now popular serial was launched on the airlines; how she turned from a microphone in one studio, dropped her script, and raced across the corridor to listen to the debut of "Bachelor's Children." 


Give Red Cross Blood-Donor Service

FIGURES talk, so here are a few that tell you how every healthy American on the home front, between the ages of twenty-one and sixty, can help fight this war and win the peace. One pint of your blood can save a wounded soldier's life. In August, 1942, America's Army and Navy asked the Red Cross Blood Donor centers—eighteen in number then—for 2,500,000 pints of blood. That meant approximately 50,000 donors a week. In 1943, as this is written, the Red Cross needs 3,000,000 donors, and needs them right away. In Los Angeles alone, 3,600 are needed weekly to fill that quota. And all over America thousands are giving a pint of blood to fill the plasma banks. Other thousands are giving regularly every eight weeks, with no strain whatever on their health. In forty minutes they are back on the job. For here's what happens when you give your blood to save a life: You feel a prick in your arm as the doctor draws off the life-giving fluid, rest a few minutes after the operation, have a hot drink, and you are on your way. True, you will never know who got the blood you contributed toward winning the war. But let's just suppose that you




could; that the fighting American whose life your pint of blood saved could too. 

Bread Is Basic

NOWADAYS when housewives are so careful not to waste even one crumb of bread, it's surprising how versatile they can be when it comes to substituting non-rationed foods for rationed ones—or making foods that are scarce stretch much further. Because "waste" is a thing of the past, American women are quickly learning the knack of varying dinner dishes to suit their ration books as well as their pocket-books.

If your family complains when meat isn't a prominent part of every meal, you can gradually convert them by serving tempting meatless entrees that are a treat to eat. There are many uses for bread that are a boon to the woman who has to prepare meals for her family. Enriched bread, to conform to Government regulations, contains vitamins and minerals necessary to the daily diet.

Maybe right this minute you have some bread in your box that is a little too stale for regular use. Don't throw it away. Bread can be used as the base for many different and delicious meals that your family will be delighted with. Here's a timely substitute—everybody's favorite, baked beans—made without meat but with a meat flavor that's a happy surprise.

Chop or mash three cups of cooked beans. Add a small, finely diced onion, one-half cup of milk, one beaten egg and one cup dry bread crumbs. Chopped celery is an option but flavorful addition. Salt and pepper accord-

ing to taste. Use a bit of your choice dried herbs or one teaspoon of poultry seasoning. Mix well. Shape into a loaf in a shallow pan and pour fat drippings over the top. Bake for thirty-five minutes in a moderate oven until well browned. Serve with a spicy hot tomato sauce and garnish with parsley.

Use parsley freely not only for flavor but the goodly vitamins A and C it provides.

Noodles with Bread Crumbs

- 2 cups flat noodles
 - 3 tablespoons butter or margarine
 - ¼ teaspoon salt
 - 1 cup soft enriched white bread crumbs
 - ¼ teaspoon paprika
1. Cook noodles in boiling salted water.
 2. Meanwhile melt butter or margarine in frying-pan, add bread crumbs and saute until brown, stirring frequently.
 3. Add salt and paprika.
 4. Drain noodles well, mix with bread crumbs and serve.

Baked Stuffed Tomatoes

- 1 can condensed cream of mushroom soup
- 2 cups cooked rice
- 2 or 3 tablespoons buttered bread crumbs
- 5 or 6 whole tomatoes

HAVE you ever looked in your mirror and thought you'd give almost anything to change your appearance? Maybe your hair is the cause of your dissatisfaction. Perhaps it lacks oomph in styling or in color. You can and should do something about it right away. Hair is what you make it, you know, and it's up to you alone to make it a thing of beauty to behold.

Keep in mind that the fashionable effect of a tricky coif can easily be spoiled if the hair that forms it isn't shiny and lustrous. It takes only a little time each day to pave the way to hair glamour, so it behooves all of us to benefit from constant and careful hair-grooming.

You wash your undies as often as they need it and we're of the school that says treat your hair the same. The one-time belief that hair should be washed only every two weeks or so is as "old hat" as the once-a-week bath. Wash your hair when it needs it and you can't go wrong. Oily hair usually requires weekly or bi-weekly shampoos, and dry hair needs washing every ten days or two weeks. Brushing is essential to all types of hair—the proverbial one hundred strokes are still reliable. Hair brushes were never meant to be ornamental, so make sure brushing is part of your daily regimen. Choose a brush with flexible but firm bristles that will reach the scalp when you use it.

There are very few women with normal hair. Most heads these days are either too dry or too oily. If you have desert-dry locks, your hair needs lots of lubrication to help normalize the condition. Apply hot oil to hair and scalp before each shampoo and let the oil soak in for an hour (overnight, if possible) before sudsing. Between

shampoos, apply hair pomade and brilliantine for added sheen.

Here's a tip for the girl with oily hair. When you haven't time to shampoo your hair properly, saturate a dab of cotton in witch-hazel and rub it over your hair and scalp in sections. There are many hair tonics on cosmetic counters that have drying tendencies. If you use one of them regularly it will help you overcome the oily condition.

Do you consider gray hair an impediment to charm? Don't bemoan your fate, do something to improve the situation. If you have mousey-colored or dingy gray hair, you can go to the best hairdresser you know, put yourself in capable hands and treat your dull mane to an Inecto Hair Color. Even if you do let a hair-dresser do the job for you, you must learn how to hold and flatter that hair-do she's groomed so painstakingly. Hair lacquer sprayed or smoothed on after the set is dry will help keep flyaway ends in place—helps hold curls longer, too. For bouncing pompadours and slipping curls, and to anchor flowers, ribbons and even hats, wear Grip-Tuth hair-retainers to grip them firmly. Neither brains, nor beauty, nor the intelligence she had brought stardom to Carole. She simply walked in front of a dance director in a bathing-suit, much as she had when she won second prize and an electric heater in a beauty contest two years before, and got a job dancing in a movie musical.

After that the brains were largely responsible. She was bright enough to realize that as a female Tarzan in "1,000,000 B. C." she'd become well known, even if the picture was one of the worst ever produced, which it was. At this point, the author makes his personal appearance. I met Carole for the first time somewhere in the rugged California mountains during the shooting of the picture. The press-agent had worn himself out pointing out the beauties of nature, the interesting facts about the elephants that had been shipped up from Hollywood, the million-year-old footprint he'd found that morning, but slyly had saved something for his second wind. "Now you meet Landis," he said. "Whatta torso!"

I was impressed. Landis was a sight to behold in a leopard skin and carefully marcelled blond hair. "This is really a nutty picture," she told me. "This morning after three hours of rehearsal they lit smoke-pots all over the valley and started shooting at a cost of \$1,000 a minute. Then in walks one of these prehistoric men still wearing his bath-robe!"

At this point I became a friend. I turned a deaf ear to the usual remarks Hollywood has to make about its Cinderellas. "Body Landis" never made good with the upper crust of Movietown, which, until the war, held sway with insufferable elegance. I thoughtfully noticed that Carole was one of the very first to jump in and do her

bit when December 7 was wrenched from the calendar.

I was on the way back from New York when my plane was set down at two a.m. in Topeka, Kansas. Rumor was out that the Japs had bombed Los Angeles, and being a new father I was nearly frantic as I walked into the airport lunch-room. Carole came in a few minutes later, on her way home from a St. Louis bond rally. With a gang of ferry pilots we settled down to the company that misery loves and boarded a train limping toward Los Angeles.

At each of the hundreds of stops,

that wandering Santa Fe rattler picked up a cargo of reserves and enlisted men headed for the Coast. Landis was the queen of the train and the whole gang loved her, even to the lad who said, "My girl's better looking, but that Carole gets under your skin."

The Cinderella was beginning then to discover that whatever it was she had that brought her a movie contract, her energy and enthusiasm added to it could mean something to the morale of a fighting man. She talked with me about those boys and men on that almost endless trip, and the things she

said convinced me that whatever she had done for publicity's sake in the past, her work since has been a simple and wonderful mixture of humanity and humble patriotism.

The girl was changing. A little more than a year before, she had taken the witness stand in a divorce case against one Willis Hunt, Jr., and told the judge: "He called me a damned fool and my associates and friends in motion pictures damned fools." Then, according to newspaper accounts, she wept a little.

CAROLE LANDIS, FIGHTING WAR BRIDE

(Continued from Preceding Page)

Looking back now, she probably would admit that the husband had something there, but since the war no one can class Carole with the "damned fools," nor can they say that she has been weeping. Whatever happens now she'll take with dry eyes, and I can tell you why.

According to her own admission, Carole "swam the Atlantic." For security reasons, that's what she had to tell everyone who asked her how she got to England. What she did there is what any actress does when she visits camps. The difference is that Carole and her co-workers, Kay Francis, Martha Raye and others, were doing their bit "under fire." However, none of them want their mission considered heroic.

"The saddest thing I saw," Carole says, "was a soldier in a hospital. He was sitting on the edge of a bed, completely dressed. Suddenly we noticed that tears were streaming down his cheeks. Somebody asked him what the trouble was, and he explained that he was well but couldn't be discharged for two days more and his company was moving out that night. He'd come all the way with his gang and now that action was a few hours away was left behind."

The men, Carole will tell you, are magnificent. They want to get on with the show.

In Africa at one point she found herself huddled in a trench dug a few days before by Germans and captured by American troops in one of the early offensives. A raid was in progress, and as the bombs began to come closer a noncom asked for some songs. Carole sang everything she knew and ad-libbed the lyrics for a dozen others. "Sure, I was afraid. Most of us were. I'll never forget the nonchalant way the mess sergeant arranged for coffee and food for everybody, just as though the war were hundreds of miles away. They all seem to feel that there may be a bullet or a bomb with their number marked on it, and they are used to those moments when everything drops out of the sky.

"But they are soft, too, when it comes to things from home. One of the sad things was the discontinuing of packages from home because of need of ships for supplies. I wish thousands of people could have been with me. Perhaps if more could see how the men feel there'd be no such thing as a work slow-up. Sure, I know some things can't be avoided in war-time, but a few more ships down the ways might get these boys those packages from home. A man out there gets unreasonable hungers, like an expectant mother. Maybe he wants an automatic pencil or a pen-knife. Not just any old thing, but one from home. If he can write a letter and feel that it's on the way he can think about it coming. It keeps him in touch more than the letters which he wants badly, too. Does that sound ridiculous? It isn't. A package from home is darned important!"

I asked Carole about the rivalry between branches of the service. "That's home talk," she replied. "A man on leave will talk about how much better the Marines are than the Navy, or vice versa, but in action they're as close as a veteran basketball team. I've talked with Tommy [her husband] about it and, great as he knows the value of the Air Forces is, he says our buck private is the man we have to rely on to give the Axis the final shoving around. They all feel that way. I've seen generals sitting on their haunches surrounded by GI soldiers, eating the

same grub, swapping stories. I've seen 'little guys' limp into a dressing-station with blood-soaked uniforms, grinning, and one said to me, 'They give it to me, but I give it to them plenty first.' These are the same sort of men we see walking along our streets today. It's trite to say that anything we can do for them is little enough.

"I get sick when I hear people sit around and talk about 'who's going to get control' in labor versus management in war industry. Anybody, from a government employe to a labor leader to a plant executive, who consciously stands in the way of getting material to these men who are fighting for our lives is un-American. I'm not anybody to talk, I know, but the war is going to be won by the so-called little people. I'm convinced of that, and the slugging is not all being done on the battle-field. In one aircraft plant a quiet, earnest man of forty has invented an automatic air-clamp for a drill press. A woman figured out a blanket order system that reduced the daily number of orders from 181 to 31. Every day people like these help speed up the job and cut the red tape. Why? Because ninety percent of them have relatives on the way to the front or already there. They know that the smallest thing they can do will be multiplied by what a million others do—that's something the enemy can't stamp out. I know a handful of people who can't be bothered when it comes to raising a victory garden. They are going to get their share from the markets even if an apartment-housed war worker doesn't. Do you think it's crazy to say that Hitler might be beaten by the margin of a few rows of carrots and cabbages? I don't."

SO THIS is an actress talking—telling us what we should be doing! Actress, my eye! She's a war bride, with as much at stake as every war bride in this world, and we can end this a lot sooner if we start listening to Carole and others like her.

She's been where the bombs fall, and it's not the "right" she has to be saying something but the duty. Carole is still gay and witty and wonderful, but there's a new ironic appreciation of humor in her. At luncheon the other day she said:

"You can joke about bombs and wounds and death—when you're on the other side—because that's your racket and an American has got to laugh while he's fighting. But over here we can afford to be really grim and forget that we were ever called 'goodtime Charlies.'" Carole said that to me, and not for publication. I am double-crossing her, because it's time we civilians started believing we are on the fighting front.

Yes, I'm fond of Carole Landis. From just another Hollywood Cinderella, she's turned out to be one of the real bluebloods of the town. But it's her mother who's the real sweetheart. Mrs. Clare Ridste is still swinging a rivet machine at North American Aircraft, working a full shift. She's nearly fifty. Two companies turned down her application because she couldn't pass the physical, so she went to a doctor and took "shots" for a month so she could get by. The men Carole sang to in a trench in Africa will be glad to know that her mom is doing some war-winning on her own.

And so will Captain Tommy Wallace, who's shot down more than one Messerschmitt 109 over the Channel.

He's got a beautiful war bride and a magnificent mother-in-law!

deadly pattern. The Lightning's target pattern is constant from muzzle to the full range of power. The fire is a stream, not a spray. The men call it a "solid slugger." Proof is offered by a flight of P-38s in the Aleutians; in a single dive they shot down five Jap Zeros and one four-engined flying-boat.

The unusual wing-loading capacity makes it possible for the Lightning to carry extra fuel for long-range flights, or to carry bombs for special duty. Or this extra load may be tanks for laying smoke screens, or equipment for delivery to ground forces.

Special drop-tanks—to be cut loose when empty—have made it possible to ferry the Lightnings to distant fronts and have given the plane an effective combat range of 750 miles, just right to hit Berlin from bases in England. A new wing bracket ingeniously carries these drop-tanks, or bombs, or both in combination, such as one bomb and one tank, and thus contribute further to the versatility of the Lightning.

The Lightning is big, heavy and rugged. It has heavy armor to protect the pilot and the vital parts of the plane. Due to sub-assembly, damaged parts can easily be replaced. Much of the plane's rugged strength comes from the solid double-booms and the unique ribless wing with its double-skin, double-stress design. Flying stresses are shared by the skin and the spar of the wing. If the spar should be shot in two the skin will hold together for the flight home, and if the skin is riddled with shrapnel the spar prevents collapse of the wing and it still comes home.

A new trick of the Lightning is ac-

complished by its "maneuvering flap," a quick-acting wing-flap which increases lift with almost no effect on drag. The chief advantage of this flap is that the Lightning can use full power and speed to reach an objective at tremendous speed and then in three seconds lower this "maneuvering flap" to get more effective control and performance in the tight places while dog-fighting, dive-bombing or ground-strafting. With business done, the flap is quickly extracted and the P-38 is again the swiftest thing in the air, out-distancing pursuers on the way home.

I understand this flap was developed as the result of some unorthodox experiments by student fliers during dog-fights over the western desert. To break speed and achieve greater maneuverability they would gently use their landing flaps. Instructors called it a suicide stunt. The result is a flap made for the purpose and another quality added to the character of a plane with many personalities.

The Lightning was a mystery ship for a long time. The rumors were bad. The Army wouldn't talk. Today we know that this is the world's fastest and most versatile fighter, bomber, interceptor, camera ship and special-duty champion. I have a good idea how and why since I rode piggy-back in a P-38.

Empty the cream of mushroom soup into a saucepan and stir well. Then add the cooked rice and the centers from the tomatoes, chopped and then drained. Stuff the tomatoes with this mixture, cover with buttered bread crumbs and bake in a moderately hot (375 degrees) oven for twenty-five to thirty-five minutes.

To prepare the tomatoes, slice off stem end of tomato, scoop out the center. Sprinkle with salt and pepper and let stand for thirty minutes. Drain well before filling with the rice and mushroom mixture. This recipe (pictured on page 55) adds zest to any meal.

Liberty Eggs

- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
- 1/2 cup sliced onions
- 1/2 cup sliced green pepper
- 2 cups tomatoes
- 1 cup soft enriched white bread crumbs
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 6 hard-cooked eggs
- 6 slices buttered toast

1. Melt butter or margarine, add onions and green pepper; cook slowly until soft.

2. Add tomatoes, bread crumbs and salt; simmer gently until thick, about fifteen minutes.

3. Cut eggs in quarters and add to tomato mixture.

4. Serve on buttered toast.


