#### It's a Relief



**T**AKE off your shirt, Mc-Gee!

Fibber McGee sputters. The audience howls.

And rotund actor Arthur Q. Bryan, one of the airlines' most familiar figures, smiles at his script and looks very pleased with his part—that of "Ole Doc Gamble" on NBC's Fibber McGee and Molly show.

The fact is, Arthur Q. Bryan is delighted to be a member of this popular Tuesday night NBC laugh show—not only in his weekly role as the doctor but in any other characterization which Producer Cecil

Arthur Q. is particularly grateful to Producer Underwood for his practice of giving a performer opportunity to exercise his versatility.

"He always assumes that you are able to do whatever he asks you to do," Bryan explains. "He keeps an actor confident of himself and thus the actor finds himself doing a good job effortlessly."

Reviewing Arthur Q. Bryan's 20-year record of radio portrayal, however, Radio Life would add that doing a good job is somewhat of a habit of his. He is one of those amazing actors who seems to be everywhere at once, contributing to the quality of every good program on the airplanes, and doing every type of character a writer can create.

Today a familiar figure of around 240 pounds, with blondish hair and twinkling blue eyes, quick-witted, jovial and easy-going, Arthur Q. Bryan has become one of the airplanes' most popular performers with his work in the realms of drama and comedy. In the beginning, he believed he would some day be one of radio's top tenors.

#### Wanted To Be Tenor

That was in 1924. In 1929 he suddenly found himself with a position as an announcer, relegated to reading time signals because he suffered severe mike fright with his every attempt to read lines. Finally an unscheduled emergency appearance "scared the scare" out of him, and from then on he went forward into the fields of writing, producing and

acting. At one time he was doing triple-duty on over 20 dramatic shows a week!

But eighteen months of it found him desperately in need of his first vacation in eleven years. He came to Hollywood for it—and has been one of the busiest actors in west coast radio ever since.

He has kept you laughing with a parade of comic portrayals that have highlighted every leading mirth show on the coast, including those of Jack Benny, Eddie Cantor and Red Skelton. You remember him well as "Waymond W. Wadcliffe," the little man who was such a trial to Burns and Allen several seasons ago.

To every cartoon connoisseur of the cinema, Arthur Q. is dearly familiar as the voice of the busy, bewildered little hunter who gives constant chase to Bugs Bunny across the nation's movie screens.

Also, unknown to many listeners and often unappreciated by radio producers is the character comic's ability to switch to something in a serious vein. But you've heard him do it successfully with roles in such dramas as the Arch Oboler's.

At this point, being thoroughly impressed by the way-above-average ability of Arthur Q. Bryan, Radio

Life would like to raise a question. Why isn't such an actor given name billing on the shows in which he appears? Listeners have long listed as a pet peeve the policy of radio producers omitting the names of such fine supporting performers as Arthur Q. Bryan, who so consistently and vitally contribute to our radio enjoyment.

On the Fibber McGee and Molly show, the combination of Arthur Q.'s effective comedy and writer Don Quinn's ingenious pen has made the character of Doc Gamble one of the program's most popular personalities.

#### Everyone's M.D.

Doc Gamble is a familiar figure—everyone's family doctor. He knows his patients' minds as well as their anatomies, their habits as well as their pulse rates. He is wise, but he can play dumb; he has a physician's characteristic superciliousness, but also he has a child's friendliness. The most important thing about Doc Gamble is that he believes in the ultimate goodness of everyone.

The skill and insight that have made Arthur Q. one of the most widely-known and esteemed creators of comedy characterizations are shown in his appreciation and understanding of the personality of the doctor.

### "Hizzoner Back"

Good news for scores of Radio Life listeners is that Lionel Barrymore's dramatic series, "Mayor of the Town," will return to CBS Saturday, March 4. The half-hour dramatic program will be broadcast for the Coast at 6:00 p.m. Radio Life has been deluged with protests and inquiries since "Mayor of the Town" went off the air on December 29 to accommodate the Frank Sinatra show.

Formerly a Lever Brothers show, the program will have as its new sponsor the Noxema Chemical Company.

### Switchboard Swamped

When Dud Williamson, emcee of KHJ's "What's The Name of That Song," heard on Fridays from 8:30 to 9:00 p.m., told listeners to phone the Hollywood studio for tickets to the first Los Angeles show on February 4, he unwittingly started a riot.

KHJ's switchboard was flooded with calls. By 9:05 every central connection at the Hollywood telephone office was taken up; no one could call in or out via a Hollywood exchange. At 9:15 and for every fifteen minutes thereafter, KHJ went on the air with an emergency announcement, requesting that the calls cease. By 9:40 there was

still no let-up and a telephone company supervisor called to advise that the switchboard operators at the phone company were walking out in protest. Saturday morning the deluge of phone calls started all over and by mid-morning the supervisor made his last stand.

"If you don't do something to stop this," he emphasized, "we'll have to take steps ourselves. Our facilities are paralyzed; there has been nothing like it in the history of the telephone company except in time of national disaster. It's unprecedented!"

"And by the way," he added, "when you're mailing out those tickets, you better send me five."

### Kate Coming

Another visit to the west coast will be made by CBS's Kate Smith, who will begin to broadcast her variety show from here on February 25. She will air from Columbia Square, Radio Lifers who wish tickets should apply for them immediately.

Morton Downey's popular noontime broadcast emanated from the Blue Network's Hollywood studios recently and it was a treat to watch the animated little tenor deliver his delightful melo-

dies into the mike. Jimmy Lytell and his smooth music-makers, a quintet of singers, Announcer David Ross, and the very lovely Leah Ray contribute to the smooth enjoyment of the Irish balladeer's pleasant, "easy-to-listen-to" program.

During his stay here, Downey was feted with a press luncheon at the Ivar House, and over our chicken and chocolate cake we listened to his endless stories and Irish anecdotes, told as only he can tell them. For dessert the singer ordered ice cream, his favorite dish. His friends insist that he eats a quart or two of it every day.

"But I don't eat much of it any more," Downey declared. "This is the first I've had since yesterday!"

her friendliness, her informality and scintillating sense of humor.

Rosemary's life has been interesting and active. Her childhood was spent in wild, desolate sections of Arizona and Mexico where her father operated copper mines. Because of his nomadic duties, the start of her education was delayed until she was eight years old when her parents studied for master's degrees at Columbia University, and she was enrolled in the Horace Mann school there.

After her graduation from high school in Phoenix, Arizona, Rosemary visited Hawaii with her father; then returned to attend Mills College in Oakland, California, where she studied dramatics, taught for one year, and also won a master's degree in psychology.

In addition to her trip to Honolulu, she has traveled extensively in Europe and in South America. Of all the countries she has visited she considers Chile the most fascinating, adding with a smile: "I want to buy me a little typhoid-proof finca there in the Andes, and retire!"

It was when Rosemary was twelve that the acting bug bit her, but her dramatic work then was confined to Easter bunny roles and angels in pageants. Later, in college, she was the dramatic star of the campus, playing Shakespeare and Ibsen. On the stage she toured with "The Drunkard" company and had the unforgettable experience of playing "mad Agnes" too many times a day for too many months. The tour landed her in New York where she debuted on Broadway in "Merrily We Roll Along."

### Start On Air

Rosemary's radio career started with the role of Berta Larkin in "One Man's Family," and her early airplane appearances were on such programs as the "Atlantic Family" with Frank Parker; "The Goldbergs"; "Gangbusters"; and the "Columbia Workshop," followed by fine portrayals on "I Was There" and "Hollywood Playhouse."

It was about six years ago, in KNX's then-small Sunset studio, before an audience of just twelve or fifteen people, that Rosemary De Camp first created the part of "Judy" on the "Dr. Christian" program. Working from week to week with no written contract, she stayed with the show for four consecutive years, when she was forced to withdraw from the cast because of film commitments.

Known on the screen as "the girl with a hundred faces," Rosemary's initial motion picture was "Cheers for Miss Bishop," followed by such screen successes as "Hold Back the Dawn," "Yankee Doodle Dandy" and "This Is the Army." Her latest is

"The Merry Monahans" with Jack Oakie.

She has long been considered a dialectician extraordinaire—an actress with a new voice for every new role. Her friend and fellow actress, Martha Scott, recalls her (Rosemary's) initial appearance on the "Career of Alice Blair" daytime serial, on which Miss Scott was the star. "One day," remembers Martha, "a little gal came in to do an old broken-down flower woman on the show. She was just the opposite of that in appearance, but she gave such a convincing performance that she was brought back the next day to do a French manicurist. She also did this part with great finesse."

"We soon learned," continues Martha, "that she could also reel off Swedish, Hindu, Chinese, Irish, southern accents, a middlewestern accent—or any dialect you could possibly think of!" Rosemary is constantly studying people, their appearances, their mannerisms and their speech.

When Martha Scott left the air-planes for screen work, she suggested that Rosemary De Camp be the one to take over her radio role, which Rosemary did. It was Martha too, who helped her secure her first film break.

One of Rosemary De Camp's favorite radio roles was "Madame Affamee" for Arch Oboler. Called in at the last minute to substitute for Marlene Dietrich, her work was so outstanding that many did not realize that someone other than the famed star was doing the part, and Miss Dietrich herself sent the skilled young actress a gracious congratulatory telegram in appreciation. Another of Rosemary's airplane appearances that has evoked lasting comment was her role on last September's "Silver Theater" offering of "Out of This World" with Henry Hull.

Her ambition in regard to her work is someday to play Madame Curie. "Maybe when I'm 70!" she laughs.

As it is, she is happy again to be doing the feminine ingenue in radio's "Dr. Christian" stories, after a steady series of old age characterizations on the screen. Working with Jean Hersholt once more is also a pleasure, for he and his charming wife have always been so nice to her. "It was Jean," she points out, "who gave me the lovely white leather makeup kit I always carry with me."

In the past several weeks, Rosemary has been missing from the Dr. Christian cast, but she returns to her role as "Judy" Wednesday, February 23, when the show again originates from this coast. She is no longer able to travel east with the program because of the demands made upon her time by both picture commitments and the care of her home and baby.

Then Jack Sherman is your dish.


He can find your dog, dig up a washing machine, or tell you how to build an adult walker.

ute instructions for building the contraption.




