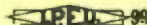

On the Sunny Side

WHEN Mark Breneman's voice booms out each morning with his hearty rendition of "Sunny Side of the Street," it sings of a story that should warm the heart of every American. Mark isn't kidding when he comes on the air with a grin; he really has a smile up his sleeve. Every time he steps up to the mike with his good morning greetings, he's smiling over the fact that radio has given another "kid brother" a break.

In the olden days across the seas, second sons didn't have a chance. The eldest was the heir to all good fortune, and those who followed were lucky to get the leavings. America isn't like that. Here it's every man for himself. So every step of the way, Tom Breneman's likeable young brother, Mark, has bid for fame on his own.

He started in radio thirteen years ago, doing local broadcasts and mainly announcing stints. In 1932, he was working at the Hollywood Roof Garden; in 1933, he emceed five shows a day with the "Penthouse Troubadours." It was that show that instilled in him the desire to be a singing emcee.

Two years ago he started giving radio-dialers a "Smile in the Morning" with his genial emceeing of an early show by that name on KFAC, during which he played records, chatted cheerfully with his listeners, and generally gave folks a "lift."

Moves to KNX

Six months ago, his program's agency head, Warren P. Fehlman, bid for a fifteen-minute spot on KNX,

with the idea of transferring the "Smile in the Morning" show to the CBS station. Meanwhile, the younger Breneman had occasion to substitute one morning for his brother, Tom, on "Breakfast at Sardi's" and at the end of the program, he led the ladies in the singing of the show's closing song. His sponsor, Mr. Fehlman, was listening in and was delightfully surprised to hear Mark's voice booming out in a most pleasing and impressive manner.

The next thing the modest Mark knew, his smile-in-the-morning show started its current series on KNX, under the title of "Sunny Side of the Street," and with a new format that was the fulfillment of one of his long-cherished dreams. No longer supplying chatter for music on recordings, Mark Breneman now brings his listeners his own delightful renditions of their favorite songs, interspersed with a bit of homespun philosophizing and pleasant reminiscing of childhood days.

Back to Childhood

He likes to bring to listeners' minds the little laugh-provoking pranks which everyone enjoyed in the care-free days of childhood—things like eating Mom's freshly-baked pie on the sly and attempting to imitate a circus clown by juggling two China plates. In this reminiscing, however, he never fails to recall as well, for the particular benefit of his younger listeners, the punishment that inevitably followed each prank.

"One of the kids in my own neighborhood was going to try my project of juggling dishes," smiles Mark. "He said he wanted to do what Mark used to do, but his mother stopped him by the reminder that he would also get what I got—a whipping!"

Born at the base of the Blue Ridge Mountains, Mark Breneman spent his

childhood there in a little town called Waynesboro, Pennsylvania, and it is those days as a youth that he chats about with his early-morning listeners, linking the pleasantries of the past with the laughs that can be found every day, if one remembers to look on the sunny side.

Smile Important Now

Especially today is such a program nice to hear. "I know there's a war on, and things aren't so pleasant," young Breneman states soberly. "I've got a twin brother 'out there' myself. But it's fun helping folks start each day with a smile!"

His friend, Mr. Fehlman, says of Mark. "He lives his show. He's actually a sort of smile-in-the-morning person." Mark credits his wife and Mr. Fehlman with keeping his confidence up when his days were darkest. "They helped me to see the sunny side then," he smiles.

Mark declares further that his wife is his best critic. Married eight years, they are finding pleasure in furnishing their home "a little at a time." Pet of their household is a black Scottie named "MacDuff," nicknamed "Duffy." Around the house, Mark likes to do some gardening and when something needs fixing, he can fix it. "But," he grins, "I don't specialize as a handy-man."

The youthful Breneman also grinned over the memory of his most embarrassing moment at the mike. It occurred when he was conducting market interviews, and apparently having about as much fun with the ladies as big brother, Tom. "I encountered a sweet little old lady at the market one morning," smiled Mark. "I called her up to the mike and asked her if she was having a good time. She replied in the affirmative, but with the most explosive swear words I've ever heard!"

New Monday Night 'Must'

Tears, Laughter, Music Combine To Make "Song Is Born" a Smash

A MAN'S heart was breaking because his son, a 20-year-old U.C. L.A. student, was fighting an incurable sickness.

"I turned to God for comfort and understanding," he said, "and found what I was seeking. The only way I could give true thanks for that blessing was to write a hymn of praise, dedicated to the memory of my son."

And so a song was born. It was "In God We Trust" and it was sung for the first time at the 1943 Easter Sunrise Service in Hollywood Bowl. Its author was Harry Tobias, remembered for such hits as "Lonesome Old Town," "Sweet and Lovely," "Miss You," and "Wait for Me, Mary." On a recent Monday evening, Mr. Tobias appeared before the microphone in NBC's Radio City, Hollywood, to relate the touching story behind "In God We Trust."

Harry Tobias was just one of many composers to be presented on Langendorf's "Song Is Born" program. Each week there are four tunesmiths

to appear—three amateur song writers anxious to win acclaim from the listening audience, and one professional hit-maker whose behind-scenes tale of how his song was born is either narrated or dramatized.

How Entries Judged

Since the program started a few weeks ago, an average of 150 pieces of music are submitted weekly by non-professional writers. Judging the merits of the entries is a board comprised of Joe Reichman, Ferde Grofe, and NBC's Musical Director, Thomas Peluso. If a song is chosen to appear on the program, its composer wins a \$25 War Bond. After each program one selection is chosen by listeners' votes each week, and thus qualifies for the final group of thirteen songs (one for each week of the program's first series), from which the grand winner will be chosen on June 5. An accompanying box gives a list of the weekly winners to date as this goes to press. Grand winner will be published.

Idea for this fascinating program came from the show's musical director, Richard Aurandt, who said, "It first struck me ten years ago. All songs, both professional and amateur, run the gamut of life, so there is no end to the material which may be dug up for a program like ours."

Laughter, Tears

Material from amateur writers is not only plentiful; it also contains the laughter and tears to make compelling listening. Once program heads get wind of a song and clear it for plagiarism and other pitfalls,

they usually find they have a socko story equal to that of the music world's great.

For instance, on Monday night, April 17, there was an impressive spot seldom equaled on serious dramatic programs. Standing at the microphone was a dark-haired young woman named Rose Resnick. She looked like any other performer, except she wore dark glasses and she didn't hold an ordinary script in her hands. Instead, as her fingers skimmed lightly over one prepared in Braille, Rose told the audience

that she had been blind ever since she was two years old. "Don't think for a minute that keeps me from doing the things I like to do," she stated. Then she was led to the piano to perform a solo part in her original song entry, "Yours Lips Touched Mine." Listeners, gripped by the sightless girl's story and performance voted her number the winner of that week's program and thereby offered her an opportunity in the finals.

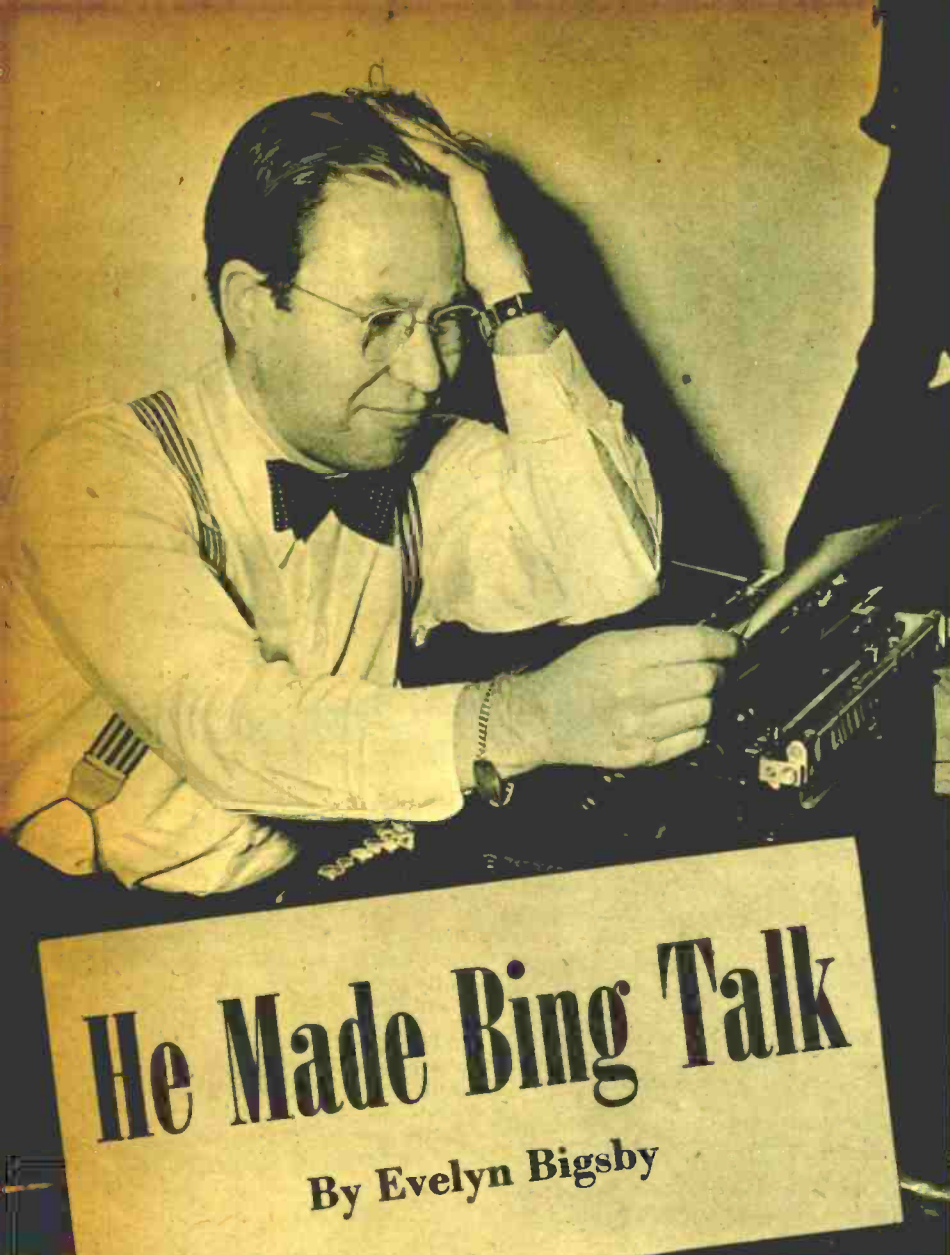

He Made Bing Talk

Writer Carroll Carroll Gives Radio Life's Readers His Own Story of "Kraft Music Hall"



◀ **CARROLL CARROLL**, who describes himself as "script carpenter" for Bing Crosby's "Kraft Music Hall," is a rapid writer, claims his first idea is always his best. "It may not be the best idea," he qualifies, "but it's the best I'll have."

EUPHONIOUSLY named Carroll Carroll, who has been Bing Crosby's writing genius for the past eight years, says he wouldn't be found *dead*, calling anyone a "star of stage and screen." "If you can't say it better, at least say it differently," he remarked about writing a radio script. He was answering Radio Life's question concerning the formula for Kraft Music Hall and brought emphasis on the point that cliches were avoided.

But underlying any successful formula that Carroll Carroll may have evolved for the Bing Crosby program, is the fact that the man with the repeating name has a serious respect for radio. He thinks radio's importance as a medium of information and entertainment is pre-eminent. "The movie audience may have an average intelligence of eleven years, but that of radio is twenty-one," he avers.

The writing for Kraft is based on this conviction. It is aimed, according to Carroll, at "the younger country club set"—young matrons who are being initiated into house-keeping and will use the sponsor's product. "We always try to be a little smarter than they are," he explained, then referring to the erudite remarks frequently sprinkled on the show, "Because a guy croons 'Sunday, Monday, or Always' is no reason he can't read a book."

"Nobody can write too well for Bing—nobody can write too well for radio," he continued. "As for pictures, there is no picture writer living who can do what the average radio writer does in the course of a week."

How He Writes

Carroll, himself, is a rapid scripter. His first idea is always the best. It may not be the best idea, but it's the best he will have.

A native of the Bronx, he attended high school in Chicago, went from there to New York and became an advertising copy writer. "I used to write ads for duvety dresses with fox trimming," he laughed. Between 1918 and 1926 this was his work; then in 1926 he started free lance writing for the New York Sunday World and magazines like the old Life, to which he contributed gags.

In 1932 he joined J. Walter Thompson Advertising Agency under droll

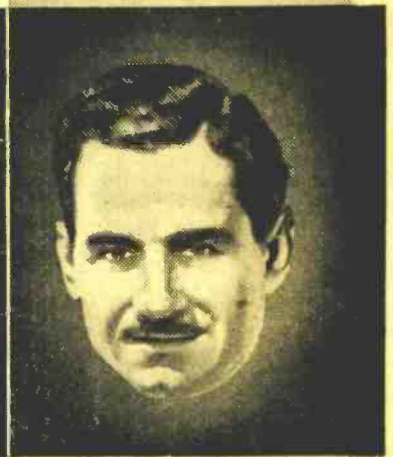

circumstances. At a party he met two gentlemen from the company. A few days later they phoned Carroll and asked if he could do seven spots for Eddie Cantor, then appearing on the Chase and Sanborn show. It was four in the afternoon and they wanted the material by the following morning. Spurred by the lush promise of fifty dollars apiece for the spots, Carroll practically knocked himself out to get them down on paper. "Fine! Wonderful!" exclaimed the agency men when they saw his work. They paid him the \$350. "I listened to the show and they didn't use a single line of mine," related Carroll.

In five or six weeks the performance was repeated. He scripted zealously, received plaudits for the work and ample remuneration. But nothing he had written was used. "I began to think these people were nuts."

After two more similar episodes, he went to the agency men. "I keep knocking out this stuff," Carroll commented, "and it keeps disappearing. I never hear it on the air. But I'd like to work for you. Will you give me a job?"

Stars in Radio

His first assignment was with Burns and Allen as writer and partial producer. Following this came work on Al Jolson's "Shell Chateau," Bert Lahr's program for Royal Gelatin, Joe Penner's and Rudy Vallee's programs, and Kraft Music Hall with Paul Whiteman. Carroll remembers many an anecdote from the early days of radio; producers running overtime and calling the next show to ask for fifteen minutes' extra time; shows ending four minutes too soon ("You've never heard so many choruses of 'Sweet Sue'," said Carroll of the orchestra number used as a bumper to take up the slack!

He even recalls an agency employe whose duty it was to release mats and whose title was "production man." One day there came a call to send a producer to the network to direct Libby's "Around the World." So little was known about the duties of a radio producer that the agency "production man" was hustled over to the studio to fill the bill. When he arrived and was asked, "Where are the scripts?" the "production man" turned radio producer, promptly asked, "What are scripts?"

Is Carpenter

From 1936 to 1938, Carroll alone wrote the Crosby show. Now he acts more in the capacity of script carpenter, building from the gags submitted by Ukie, Vic McLeod, Elon Packard, and Stanley Davidson. On the Bob Crosby show, for which he also does the supervisory work, he gives generous credit to Dave Gregory, who left the radio publicity field only a few months ago and asked Carroll to teach him to write for radio. "I taught him just a few

tricks," Carroll said modestly, going on to express his pleasure at meeting someone who sees a future in radio.

Speaking of his association with Bing, Carroll said he met him at the start of Crosby's program. "It was six months before he started calling me by my name." The writer went on to tell how both he and The Groaner like big words. "Give him something he can see himself in" emphasized the scripter. "Bing plays Bing on the air and certain things are appropriate. Every person has a cadence and when I talk to a person I try to capture that cadence"—a feat which Carroll has done with remarkable skill on the Music Hall. Spots for Bing or for guests are not written for radio. They are written to suit the person. When Mary Martin was Bing's air partner, she played the wife—a wife a little bit sharper than her husband, because Mary is a sophisticated young woman. "Trudy was made the mousy type," said Carroll, not meaning that she is actually mousy, but that she's a softer personality. "With Marilyn Maxwell, we script her as Bing's sweetheart because one imagines her better that way than as his wife. She is a ready and willing girl, but Bing is cast more in the role of a diffident wolf" concluded Carroll.

Picture actresses can't "pull rank" with Mr. Carroll. One temperamental star who demanded the script be re-written was finally brought to terms when a substitute was ordered to stand ready to take over. "When we had an hour show I used to get a lot off my chest," commented Carroll. "It was like having a column." The program writers were able to schedule a much more diversified bill of entertainment, using dramatic actors like Basil Rathbone and actresses like Fay Bainter. "Now, with only a half hour, we stick closely to comedy. For guests we engage mostly people we like—people who can get laughs," amended Carroll.

Bing seldom makes a change in the script; now and then he asks if another line or better ending may not be substituted. "We write things for the Bob Crosby show we wouldn't dare include on Bing's," confessed the writer. "Bing is an introvert and Bob is an extrovert. That makes a difference in their material and delivery. "We put things on Bob's show that Bing would think were corny," he concluded.

The Groaner's jokes must be plausible. "No falling out of windows or one lung talking to another," Carroll said. An illustration of how accurately he grasps his performer's characteristics was given when writing for Rose Bampton. "Most opera stars on the air are pompous," he explained. Kraft Music Hall presented Miss Bampton in such a human way that even college lads warmed to her personality. Scheduled to travel to Louisiana and sing at the university there, Miss Bampton was amazed when she was wel-

comed with hullabaloo usually not accorded an opera star. She found out later that the college men, fascinated by her air appearance with Bing, had wired him: "How shall we treat Bampton?" Back came the answer: "Give her the key to the city," and that's exactly what the young men did.

Carroll may be credited with having the singer do many things against his personal wishes, like reading lines on the program. When The Groaner started on the Hall, he was indifferent to emceeing, said he was a singer and a pretty bad actor. By writing lines and expecting Bing to deliver them, Carroll has helped to bring about a Bing on the air who is as relaxed as the Bing off-air. A simple, reciprocal tribute given by Carroll was: "I've learned to take it easy from Bing. I worry, but I keep it to myself."

Carroll seems to understand certain retiring elements of Crosby's personality which many others misinterpret as high hat. Although his association with Bing is close, it is more a business relationship than a personal one.

Thursdays usually find Bing and Carroll lunching at the Derby, not in the main dining room, but out in the back, because, according to Carroll, Crosby thinks it's ostentatious for him to make a grand entrance through the center door. One of the singer's and writer's longest trips was to Spokane, when Crosby received his doctor of music degree from Gonzaga. Carroll seems to have understood Crosby when he got out at station stops, and instead of playing a star role, walked around to the back of the train and talked to the brakeman.

Carroll is a stocky man, about five feet tall, with brown hair and blue eyes. He is married and has three children, Leda, eight; Bruce, five, and a brand new son born April 11, exactly fifteen minutes from the time Carroll was born. Carroll's real name is Carroll Weinschenk, but he changed it because it was so long. At one time when he was writing in New York under the two names, Carroll Carroll and C. J. Weinschenk, one reader wrote in and remarked: "That Mr. Weinschenk is certainly writing under an assumed name!"

Serious Side of a Funny Man

I HAVE the world's worst memory," grinned Ransom Sherman, the bespectacled, bow-tied comedian who appears each week on NBC's Fibber McGee and Molly show as their friend, the theater manager, Sigmund Wellington.

Ransom Sherman is an old friend of radio-dialers, but when we asked him for an accounting of his years on the airlines, he made the immediate confession that he could never call to mind specific names and dates. In fact, one time when he found it necessary to fill out one of those ever-baffling job application forms, he looked blankly at the section requesting the applicant to print his past employment record; then promptly inserted the words, "I don't know. I just work."

Work was really the word for it, too, when he was writing and delivering six one-hour scripts a week for his popular "Club Matinee" program. It meant thirty-two pages of laugh-provoking patter each day, and sometimes he sat up until three or four o'clock in the morning, always keeping his material prepared six to eight days in advance. When he forsook the Chicago show for work on the west coast, he stacked all his scripts on the floor and found that the pile measured more than eight feet high!

Twists Tragedy

Sherman gathered inspiration for his fun-filled scripts from everyday incidents, some of which may have been a bit tragic at the time of their occurrence. He made good use of the fact that the things that make folks mad when they happen, are the things we all look back upon and laugh. He relates that he didn't think it was at all funny the night that someone threw a pie in his face, but later he used the incident for a gag.

He also liked to sit in street cars and listen to the conversations going on about him, especially on Thursdays when the cars were filled

with domestic help, taking their weekly holiday and chattering like magpies about their employers.

Another source of comedy material which Ransom Sherman made use of were the innumerable after-dinner speeches which he has had to hear in his years as an entertainer. He and his partner finally had revenge on the so-called "guys with a message" (as Sherman terms them) by building an act that was planted at banquets all over the country. Sherman's partner would be billed as the banquet's speaker, with Rans sitting among the feasting guests, occasionally interrupting the speech with sardonic remarks.

The two of them would become embroiled in a verbal battle, with the unsuspecting guests believing it to be the real thing. Eventually, they would belligerently exchange places, with Rans mounting the speaker's platform, spouting derisively.

Is "Sour Puss"

Sober-faced and serious-minded, Sherman confesses to being "a very sour person;" then adds that he is certain those banquet speeches he has sat through are the cause of it all.

At any rate, on seeing Rans one

doesn't think of him as a comedian. He looks much more like a businessman. He often looks quite stern, and seldom smiles, but he is always saying something funny. Somber as he may appear, radio-dialers remember him well as the slightly zany host of "Crestfallen Manor" and "Grapevine Rancho."

If he has his way, however, he will continue now to limit his comedy work to his role on Fibber and Molly's program. He declares that he is through beating his brains out day and night to turn out laughs. "It isn't worth it," maintains the comedian, and he hopes to avoid doing a demanding amount of radio work.

He is very happy with his role of "Mr. Wellington," the McGees' theater-managing friend. "I like him," Sherman points out, "because he's a typical small-town guy who wants to be blase." As the somewhat pompous "Sigmund Wellington," he usually makes his entrance at 79 Wistful Vista in a grand manner; then betrays himself with an unintentional "Leave us . . ." in his conversation. The following bit of repartee took place when Wellington dropped in at the McGees and found Gildersleeve on hand (when the pneumo-

Philippines or Bust

Globe-Circling Entertainer Joe E. Brown Accepts General MacArthur's Bid To Enter the Islands the Day He Does

JOE E. BROWN is a comedian with a heart as big as his mouth.

As you probably recall, he made a stupendous entertainment tour of the South Pacific last spring, immediately after his son, Captain Don Brown, was killed. He spent three and a half months and his own money to bring a little laughter to the grim faces of the G. I. Joes in Jap-infested areas. Back home, he told the poignant story of his journey, then said, "I want to go to the boys again."

He did, just before Christmas, this time to China, India, Iran, Iraq, Arabia, Egypt, Italy, Morocco and South America. He covered 47,000 miles, played 202 shows, was gone for three months. Christmas was spent in Delhi, India. "I worked all day," he

told Radio Life. "Played two complete shows for the boys."

From India, he wrote Mrs. Brown: "The kids have just gone nuts and have eaten up every try for a laugh. Day before yesterday we landed on an 800-foot strip in Piper Cub planes and did a show on the strip way up, 3,000 feet in the mountains. You should have seen that picture. We then were driven 14 miles in three hours and forty minutes to do another show. Our night show was done with three bulbs on the planks and the lights of two jeeps. Nothing seems to hurt the laughs."

A few days later he performed at one of the hospitals. His audience was a pathetic one—half of the men were in wheel chairs or on cots.

Is Worth It

Remarking on this performance, Brown said: "A cold chill went up and down my spine as those boys lay there and laughed. The reac-

tion to that one show paid me for any and all discomfort of the trip."

His swing in the South Pacific, his trip to Egypt and Italy, plus his two-month tour of Alaska and the Aleutians in the spring of 1942 (132 performances) make Joe E. Brown the champion entertainer of our fighting men. He has played more shows than any other star and was the first big star to visit Alaska and the South Pacific. "There isn't a battle front I haven't played for," he summed up unpretentiously.

His performances have been so far-flung and so numerous that he feels repercussions every week when he emcees the radio program, "Stop or Go." It is an off-night when he doesn't bump into someone who has enjoyed one of his performances in a sub-zero hospital room or in the steam of a sweating jungle. "One kid," he recalled, "saw my show three times. In the Aleutians, in Australia, then in India. The very first night of "Stop or Go," Brown's initial contestant was a Red Cross field worker, Eileen Tyler, who herself had visited three fighting fronts during a year and a half.

Brown took one look at her, then puzzled: "Your face is familiar, Miss Tyler. Haven't we met somewhere before?"

"Yes, indeed," she answered. "The last time I shook hands with you was in Sicily a few weeks ago."

Fosters Fund

Now home again for awhile, Brown is not asleep on the job of furnishing entertainment for the fighting

Americans. His All-Pacific Recreational Fund has been responsible for supplying men in the Pacific area with baseballs, softballs, basketballs, and horseshoes. "We've sent them 50,000 decks of cards," he added, "and now we're getting ready to send 10,000 decks to China." Funds to maintain the recreational project have come from the pockets of Brown and his friends and the proceeds of a baseball game or two.

"Congress," he pointed out, "is said

to have appropriated two and a half million for recreational purposes, but I believe only a half million has really been allotted. Our organization alone has sent 55 thousand dollars worth of equipment to the South Pacific."

Brown still yearns to re-visit some of the battle fronts. "You have no idea of the insatiable appetite of our boys for entertainment," he said, "and clean entertainment is far more acceptable than dirt."

Brown's current radio program has 26 weeks to run. For the present, he plans to remain at home and keep the financial wheels grinding. "The family has to eat," he observed as his mouth widened into its fabulous grin.

"But I have an invitation," he said impressively, proudly. "It's from General MacArthur. He has invited me to go into the Philippines when he does and entertain his men. I'll drop everything to do that!"

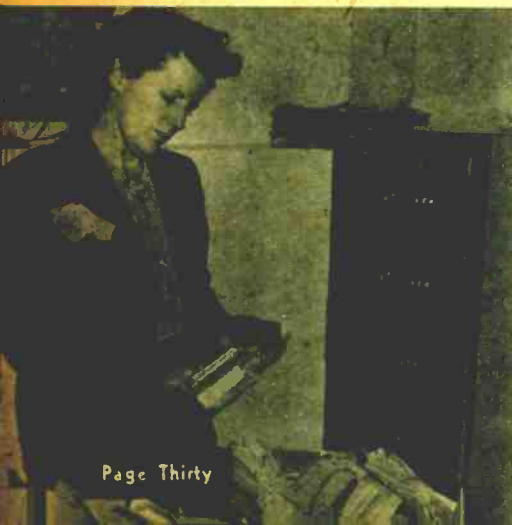

Your Kingdom for a Ticket?

Here's How to Get Ducats For Columbia Square Shows

She continued: "Silver Theater' requests have stacked up since last December. It's nip and tuck to keep up with the 'Star and the Story' requests (program starring Walter Pidgeon).

"Ticket requests for the month of March numbered 10,345. Of course when 'The Voice' is here, you can just add about 300 more a week or 1200 to the above figure. 'Take It Or Leave It' tickets are much in demand, too. When Phil Baker left for New York last time, there were 2500 unfilled requests on hand. As soon as we knew he was coming back to broadcast from here, we sent out letters, asking those who had requested tickets if they would like to see the program. Two thousand of the 2500 letters were returned with a note asking for tickets to be forwarded."

How Routine Works

Miss Horner keeps tab on what tickets to have printed and distributed. Whenever a program is set for a certain time and place, the advertising agency handling the account informs her. There are three audience auditoriums at Columbia Square: A, which seats 918, B and C which accommodate 405. Then there is the CBS Vine Street Theater holding 1046.

Usual procedure, if the studio being used is A, is to order an even 1,000 ducats printed. They cost \$175 a thousand and CBS' monthly ticket bill averages between \$480 and \$550.

The tickets, ready for distribution, arrive at CBS anywhere from a week to a month ahead. (Shows with guest stars are tardiest). Out of a thousand, 400 will probably be given to the sponsor for his special needs; three hundred will go to the agency handling the account. CBS retains the remaining 300, from which it must care for requests in the building and all mail requests.

A fairly accurate test of the pulling power of a program is how fast the tickets are dispersed, and again, how large a percentage find their way back to the ushers on the day of the

THERE ARE twenty-nine broadcasts emanating every week from Columbia Square on Sunset

Boulevard immediately west of Gowery Street. Last year for the first three months, 166,000 persons visited a CBS broadcast. But this year for the corresponding period, attendance passed 316,000. Apparently it is smart to frequent radio performances and smart people are doing it.

If you write in for just any kind of tickets, chances are you may be obliged at once. Main difficulty, however, is that the majority of fans have specific requests in mind. They prefer the more elaborate programs using guest stars. "In New York," pointed out CBS Ticket Chief, Muriel Horner, "people are radio minded. They like to see any radio show. In Hollywood, they're star minded. They only want to see a show if a Cary Grant or a Barbara Stanwyck is appearing."

program. On a Sinatra show, for example, the return percentage is considered high. From 450 tickets held by fans, 400 come back. But on other programs, even the much-in-demand-to-see "Command Performance," the returns often fall short.

"This isn't fair," Miss Horner exclaimed. "It keeps persons who would really like to see the performance from getting in."

Why Overprint

As an example of a program just cutting its teeth and being held in the Vine Street Theater, Miss Horner told of Show A, which has seating space for 1046, but for which 1700 tickets are printed in hopes of filling the theater comfortably.

"Show A is doing better," she said hopefully. "We are over-printing only 500 tickets this week."

Orson Welles, it appears, is catching on with studio audiences. As he does, Miss Horner is the first one to know it. Requests accelerate and returns are steadier. "Maybe people are spreading the word about his pre-show magic performance," she added.

Only occasionally does the ticket department bump into difficulty on the overprint. Miss Horner remembers that on the Monday on which gas rationing became effective, Lux Theater was scheduled to present "Random Harvest" with Greer Garson and Ronald Colman. Two thousand tickets were printed in hopes of filling the studio.

"Gas rationing didn't matter," Miss Smith recalled still awed. "Eighteen hundred people showed up. We had to turn the late arrivals away." Nor has rationing since then had any effect, as the stupendous increase of studio audiences over last year's first three months show.

"So many people are a bit flabbergasted when they are told that radio tickets are free. Many are under the impression that there is a charge," Miss Horner continued. "There are many fan clubs for other than Sinatra. For example, there is a group of ten in the afternoon and twenty in the evening (same group) that always goes to the Judy Canova show. They write in weekly with a stamped envelope for the tickets. Orson Welles, too, has a few swooner clubs. We always try to take care of these people.

Use Product?

"It is amazing how many will state in their letters that they have always used the product. I don't know if this is meant as an attempt at bribery or if it is always true. Personally, I think in most cases they mean it because they go to such ends describing the product."

Many letters arrive from over the country, one to three months in advance of show time. They come from fans who are contemplating coming

to Hollywood and would like to see CBS shows. The station replies with a very courteous letter, assuring the writer that everything possible will be done to meet the request.

"One thing I do wish people would understand," Miss Horner said wistfully. "We are always a week ahead of ourselves in distribution of tickets. Hence, when people write at the last minute, they are amazed that we have none. We MUST operate a week ahead in order to get distribution."

The accompanying list gives specific information on procedure to obtain CBS ducats. But please remember to enclose a self-addressed, stamped envelope. "And please," reminded the ticket lady, "ask your readers to put a three cent stamp on local mail."

who have appeared on "Song Is Born" have been Pinky Tomlin, who told how he happened to write "The Object of My Affection," Jack Norworth, who related the inspiration for "Take Me Out to the Ball Game," Harry Owens, famous for his "Sweet Leilani," which was written in honor of his little daughter, and who appeared to tell how he composed "Little Butch" in honor of his baby son; and Ferde Grofe, who was arranger and second pianist when George Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue" was debuted and who described the birth of this thrilling composition.

Perhaps the most nostalgic appearance, according to Producer Tom Hargis, was that of Sally Pink Stanley. She told how her brother and vaudeville partner, Henry Fink, penned the lyrics for "That's the Curse of an Aching Heart," after his girl had jilted him; how Sally and Henry asked Al Piantadosi to write music for the lyrics, and how Sally premiered the number at the Palace Theater in New York in 1912. "I sang it seriously, not burlesqued," she said. "It was an instant hit."

To climax Mrs. Stanley's spot on "A Song Is Born," she sang "That's the Curse of an Aching Heart" just as she did thirty-two years ago. Her rendition, brought bursts of applause. Then Announcer Larry Keating dug in his curiosity and came up with a fact which pleased everyone.

"He certainly did," she replied. "The girl that Henry loved so much heard the song in New York, discovered that Henry had written it, and six months later they were married."
